Manager Potter: Open lines of communication are vital to village government

"It's all in communication." Ruidoso village manager Potter said Friday communication will be the key to his management style.

Sworn into office February 24, Potter was asked in an interview Friday to talk about his first two months as village manager.

"If employees know what we want, they'll do it," said Potter, who has initiated a set of communications procedures that includes division reports, written and documented staff reports, duplicate work orders and other forms to show that needed village tasks are accomplished, and accomplished on time.

With a reduced work-force, Potter said his staff must be result-oriented.

"That work order has to be turned in with a result ... what happened," said Potter, adding he expects village staff to do the job right the first time.

Cleanliness and organization also get top priority with Potter.

"The more little detail things we do, the more pride employees are taking in what they do," he said.

A 23-year veteran of village service, Potter was "in training" for his present position during more than a dozen years as assistant village manager. He said he didn't have any big surprises when he officially took over the reins of managing the village.

"The main thing I've recognized in the last two months is if something isn't working we have to go ahead and make that change and make it work," said Potter.

An example of acting quickly to change something that isn't working quite right is Potter's recom-

mendation to the Ruidoso Village Council that the recently adopted organizational set-up be modified to make better use of the village engineer's education and expertise.

Potter said in monitoring the new system he found that the engineer, acting as a division head under the present arrangement, must spend much of his time responding to questions and complaints from members of the public. Potter has recommended a change to go into effect on May 1, that will allow the engineer time to oversee capital improvement projects and engineering contracts.

"In village government right now we have specific teams with set goals," said Potter.

Potter wants to call on the separate teams to accomplish those goals, freeing other groups to complete other tasks.

"If we're going to have a meeting, we have to come away with specific results. We can't be meeting just to meet," said Potter, whose calendar showed that he attended 23 meetings in just one month. With a team concept in force not everybody should have to attend every meeting, said Potter.

One of his first meetings was with a downtown development group.

"We found out that none of us knew what was needed," said Potter, who has since been in contact with Southeastern New Mexico Economic Development District and learned more about the Main Street Program. He also learned that the University of New Mexico did a downtown development study for Farmington.

Potter said he'll work to get such groups involved and interested in developing Ruidoso.

"We've talked about changing our image," said Potter. But changing the village image of a laid-back

resort town where visitors "will come anyway," will take a coordinated effort, said Potter.

The new manager is proud of the centralized purchasing warehouse, more comprehensive street patching procedures and better utilization of special services garbage pickup service.

But he sees many more changes in the future, not just for village staff and services, but also for his own role. Just back from the New Mexico City Managers Association meeting, Potter said municipal managers are playing a direct role in working to enhance local economies.

"They're working hand-in-hand with the business community," he said.

Potter said he'll continue to call on community people to work with village staff.

"I think the public is willing to give to the city a whole lot if we're putting out," said Potter, naming several citizens who regularly make contributions that help the village.

"Walterine Hughes has done so much ... in dollars we couldn't any more pay her than the man in the moon," said Potter, praising Hughes' efforts to maintain an area of village property near the Stage Coach Motel.

Solving the village water problems is among Potter's goals, and he has a good idea where that problem should stand in the next few years.

A student of Southwest history, Potter will put the lessons of the past to work in planning the future of Ruidoso.

"There's an old saying in history," said Potter. "You'll never know where you're going unless you know where you've been."

Going before P&Z? Check out these new regs

Ruidoso Building and Zoning Inspector Jimmy Neeley, in a letter dated April 23, detailed changes in the procedure for filing applications for Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) review.

P&Z recently reduced its twice monthly meetings to once a month. The commission meets the third Monday of each month to consider applications for variances, vacations of right of way, replats, conditional uses and commercial site development plans.

Neeley said in his letter that ap-

plications must now be submitted by noon eight working days before the regularly scheduled meeting. The previous deadline was within five working days.

Neeley said applicants may no longer "drop off" applications, but must meet with him so that he may review them for "completeness." According to the letter, Neeley's office hours are from 8-11 a.m. and by appointment.

The letter continues that applications, once the application is completed and acceptable, will be

required to submit 13 copies of the completed form.

"The final application should include: the application itself; a survey, if required; and a vicinity or location map (to aid the Commission in locating the site); and other relevant documents. Also, for replat cases, microfiche must be submitted," continues the letter.



Survey asks visitors how they learned of Ruidoso

What brings people to Ruidoso? Is it media advertising, contacts at trade shows, mail-outs?

Discussions in recent Lodgers' Tax Committee (LTC) meetings touched on how promotional and advertising efforts can be measured. Members agreed that advertising results are difficult, and often impossible, to quantify.

And Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. noted during a LTC workshop that even major advertising firms would say it is a real problem to assess the effectiveness of advertising dollars.

Results of a mini-survey conducted Friday through Sunday with the help of 10 lodging establishments indicate most

visitors to Ruidoso this past weekend had been here before.

The unscientific sampling, completed on perhaps the slowest weekend of the year, did track with a previous survey showing most visitors to Ruidoso learn of the area by word-of-mouth.

Village clerk/finance director Leon Eggleston, during last week's LTC workshop, reminded the group of that survey, completed several years ago, in which motel operators found that few of their customers mentioned media advertising.

Nearly all visitors questioned in last weekend's survey were returning to the area, but six respondents were in Ruidoso for the first time. Several were "just passing through," but of those in Ruidoso for relaxation all had heard of the area from friends and relatives.

A training meeting at Swiss Chalet Inn brought a group into town—mostly from this area, mainly Las Cruces and El Paso, Texas.

Visitors to Carrizo Lodge over the weekend included guests of High Sierra and Rancho Ruidoso.

Business trips, pleasure and horse racing were listed as reasons for stopovers in Ruidoso.

Many people had not only visited Ruidoso, but had been coming for years. One visitor to High Country Lodge said he has visited Ruidoso for 45 years—ever since he came with his family as a three-year-old.

"I really think we can sell the town," said Joan Bailey of Storybook Cabin, whose customers this weekend all had been here before and all had learned of Ruidoso from friends.

Two lodging establishments

couldn't be reached for their results Sunday.

Lodgers participating in the mini-survey included the Swiss Chalet, Ruidoso Inn, Super 8, Stewart Motel, Ruidoso Lodge, Storybook Cabins, Carrizo Lodge, the Cro's Nest, Cree Manor Inn and High Country Lodge.

The mini-survey shows that once that first visit is made to the Ruidoso area, visitors apparently come back over and over and tell their friends.

But how can those other people, those who have never visited the Ruidoso area and haven't even heard of its many and varied attractions, be reached?

The questionnaire seemed to raise more questions than it answered.

It is truly a mansion, built by Lineol Jr. himself (known also as Tom) who is a chip off the old block. Like his father, he can do most anything to which he turns his hand.

I have never been honored at a more heart-warming gathering; and ever since I got home, there has been a sense of uplift and gratefulness cheering me; and I know this greatly beloved couple will treasure this day always.

All the seven children were there—for the first time that all were together at one time in thirty-one years.

horse feed," says Lineol. So they moved down in spring to a branch near the spring. They liked the place and made up their minds to settle in the area.

Sarah was born July 14, 1914, in Canadian, Texas, to Robert A. Preston and the former Eastie Inez Taylor. She spent her girlhood around Elida on a ranch. After their marriage Lineol and Sarah lived a while near Cloudcroft; then in 1954 they moved to what was then High Mesa owned by Jesse Harris. Here they ranched and farmed. Lineol raised good crops of all kinds of produce dry farming.

"Ruidoso is the first city we have lived in," Sarah says. "Always before we had lived in the country."

When asked how she liked the big city of Ruidoso, she turned the joke back like a tennis ball.

"It's too big for me," she said. She went on to say that she and Lineol are happy in Ruidoso and would live nowhere else.

I forgot to tell of the wedding cake, and the yellow roses worn by Lineol and Sarah. Their daughter, Nancy Richardson, made the cake, cone-shaped, six feet tall, made of five different cakes with a little bride and groom on the top.



Warrior athletes who took fourth were Tara Miller in the long jump (14-4), Lee in the 200 meters (28.0), the 1,600-meter medley relay team (4:52.34) and the 1,600-meter relay team (4:34.49).

Martin, Snodgrass, Patton and Sheila Gosdin made up the 1,600-meter relay. Martin, Thornton, Gosdin and Harrison made up the medley relay team.

Lori Walker took fifth in the shot put (29-9), Chantel Bowen was fifth in the high jump (4-8) and fifth in the 100-meter hurdles (17.85), and the 400-meter relay team of Patton, Martin, Thornton and Lee ran a 52.48 for fifth.

"I think we'll do better next week," said Warrior head girls coach Jim Hofstad. "And I think we'll do a lot better at district."

Ruidoso will compete in the Lovington Invitational Friday, May 1. The meet will be an afternoon-evening competition.







Inside the Capitol by Fred McCaffrey

SANTA FE—State aircraft will log lots of miles with Garrey Carruthers aboard while he's our governor. There is little doubt that he is, and plans to remain, a "man on the go."

This week, for instance, he spent Tuesday in Las Vegas, accompanied by a group of his Cabinet members. This is one in a series of visits outside the capital city he plans, for purposes of getting better acquainted with local people and local problems. He aims at making two such trips every month he is in office, he tells us.

Thursday evening, Carruthers talked to the Homebuilders in Albuquerque; and today, he is first in Roswell, then in Las Cruces, and later in Gallup. He talks on economic matters at the first of those locations, lunches with Rotarians at the second, and at the third attends a chille fest, proceeds of which will go to restore the governor's residence in

Santa Fe to more liveable conditions. Saturday, he talks to teachers in Hobbs at lunch, and then heads for Hanover, which is outside Silver City, to address a Grant county Republican dinner.

There's no rest on Sunday. He speaks in Albuquerque at noon that day, and then comes home for a reception in Santa Fe.

Even when he's in our city here, he gets out of his office frequently, as his daily schedule shows. This week, he toured the Highway Department general offices on Monday, the Department of Corrections on Wednesday and the Natural Resources Department on Thursday. These drop-in visits are designed to give him a better acquaintance with the people who do the daily work of government.

Many who have studied the work of governors in New Mexico observe that those who were most successful

spent less than half their time in their offices in the capitol. Carruthers appears to be aiming at being on the road at least as much as any of his outstanding predecessors have been.

Republican insiders tell us the reason Carruthers is being booked at so many party affairs is not simply the fact that the GOP is proud of him and the position he occupies.

"Frankly," one of them says, "we just haven't been drawing crowds of any size anywhere unless the Governor is on the program."

That seems to suggest that party members, having worked long and lustily to get Carruthers his new job, may be tending to slack off and rest a little. With membership spread as thin throughout our populace as theirs is, that could be fatal, especially coming at a time when Democrats seem to be doing some early organizing to get ready for 1988's elections.

Look for Democrats next year to target certain races.


With the entire state Senate up for election at that time, they have been studying election returns to find Republican soft spots. In McKinley county, for instance, Senator Smitty Eoff, a Republican stalwart, beat Gary Tomada in 1984 by something

under 500 votes. In Bernalillo county, Senator Wendel Cosner falls into that same category of slim-margin victory. So does Marvin Watts over Lou Whitlock in Eddy county, and Ellen Steele over Olivia Rothschild in Dona Ana county.

Democrats, on the other hand, have only one Senate seat that falls into that category. It's the one now held by Senator Fernando Macias in Dona Ana County, which they believe they will have to scramble to hold.

In a Senate now divided 21 to 21, Democrats would be elated to pick off even one of the GOP's weaker members. If they did an effective job of electioneering, they should be able to do that. In point of fact, all but three Senatorial districts (the seats held by Jack Morgan in San Juan county, and by Victor Marshall and Jim Caudell in Bernalillo county) have more registered Democratic voters than Republican ones. Given a good slate of candidates, Democrats ought to dominate the Senate every year.

New Mexicans should not miss the fact that federal judge Juan Burciaga had to order certain staffers in our Department of Human Services, in words almost as blunt as this, to stop faking their records to make their performances look better than they actually are.

Another near miss?

Skid marks tell the tale of a dangerous situation at the "Y."

After travelling hundreds of miles on Highway 70 with no stops, truckers often are surprised by the stop light at the "Y," as evidenced by line after line of skid marks.

Eventually, a major accident will happen, perhaps with loss of life.

But if the skid marks are treated as a sign of things to come, preventative steps can be taken now to prevent such a tragedy.

Presently, unnoticeably small signs announce the upcoming signal. Larger signs with flashing lights east and west of the "Y" could much more effectively warn travellers of the traffic light.

Often, traffic control measures are taken only after a deadly indication of their need has occurred.

Perhaps in this case, skid marks alone will spark preventative action.—DJP


Assessment.







Porter meters work of meter readers

Steve Porter may be the only person in Ruidoso who knows where every village water meter is located. That's close to 7,000 water meters.

Water Department customer services foreman Porter supervises two full-time meter readers who track down and record readings for monthly customer billings on every water connection in the village.

"I've read every meter in town so I know where they all are," noted Porter, who spent two years on the meter reading crew before being named supervisor nearly two years ago.

Currently 6,570 water units are metered and 6,708 bills mailed from the Water Department each month. Porter said the meter readers, Virgil Reynolds Jr. and Paula Giarratano, have a certain number of meters to read each week since the Water Department is on a four-week cycle billing system.

While weather is a factor in reading water meters, since they are located underground, Porter said he and his crews try to read each one every month.

"We do the best we can," said Porter.

But if customer billings reflect higher than normal usage, Porter often does rechecks. He said he gets work orders from the Water Department every day and goes out on rechecks, reconnects and disconnects.

Porter expects to be particularly busy during the next few weeks as the opening of the race track brings a lot of new people into town.

And that's what he likes best about his job.

"I get to meet a lot of new people," said Porter.
