


Rockets down Warriors

It was a lot closer, but victory still eluded the Ruidoso High School varsity football team Friday night.

The Warriors lost to visiting Goddard, 16-7, for their third defeat against no victories this season.

Ruidoso might have won the game, but mistakes and an inconsistent offense spelled doom for the Warriors.

Ruidoso led, 7-0, at halftime after senior Kirk Ryan dashed 76 yards on a punt return with 10:14 left in the second quarter.

Ryan sprinted down the sidelines and got a great block from Dusty Beavers.

Shay Sims then kicked the extra point and Ruidoso led, 7-0.

Goddard got a chance to score late in the second period when the Rockets intercepted a Michael Swanner pass and took over on the Warrior 28.

The Rockets moved to the Warrior five before they were stopped.

They attempted a field goal, but faked it. However, Warrior defensive tackle Shawn Bowdy rushed in and sacked the ballcarrier for a loss.

Ruidoso then ran the clock off until halftime.

But the second half was a different story for the Warriors.

Goddard tied the game up in the third period after a Warrior punt was blocked and the Rockets took over on the eight.

One running play netted nothing. But on the next play, Sean Gallagher swept around left end for the touchdown.

Steve Damron kicked the extra point and the score was tied, 7-7, with 7:43 left in the third quarter.

Ruidoso was held without a first down on the ensuing series and had to punt.

Goddard took over on its 25 and drove 61 yards in 10 plays to the

Warrior 14.

From there, Damron kicked a 31-yard field goal and the Rockets had the lead for good, 10-7, with 1:35 left in the third period.

Again, Ruidoso was unable to move the ball and had to punt. The Warriors held Goddard without a first down and got good field position.

From the Deming 33, tailback Rusty Shelton took a handoff, and sprinted 12 yards down the right sidelines to the 21.

But Ruidoso failed to move the ball from there and Goddard took over.

The Rockets cinched the victory when quarterback Kevin Romero threw a 46-yard pass to Perry Wakefield for a touchdown.

The Warriors appeared to be in good position for an interception, but Wakefield took the ball between two defenders and raced in for the touchdown.

The extra-point attempt failed, but Goddard had its final 16-7 advantage.

Ruidoso's offense only gained 75 yards, 51 rushing and 24 passing. The Rockets had 160 yards rushing

and 89 passing for a 249-yard total. The Warriors could not get more than one first down on any series in the game, ending up with six to Goddard's 13.

"We're still not improving as much as we want," Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson said. "We did see some bright spots on defense and the kicking game."

"We need to improve at a more rapid pace. We're not discouraged. We still think we'll have a good team by district time."

The Warriors will travel to Tularosa Friday, September 18. The Wildcats defeated Melrose, 19-0, Friday night.

School enrollment short 84 students

The Ruidoso Board of Education learned Wednesday night that school enrollment figures are well below projected numbers.

Associate Superintendent Mike Gladden announced "regretfully" that enrollment of the Ruidoso School system is 85 students below projected numbers, which represents almost \$250,000 in funding that will be lost to the system.

"I enrolled a new student today," said Texanita Cole, principal of Ruidoso Middle School. "That means we're only 84 down."

Superintendent Sid Miller said while it's "not time to panic," this is a substantial amount of funding to be concerned about. "Ruidoso schools have a history of enrollment growth for the first 40 days," he pointed out. "So chances are we will see more students enrolled in the next few weeks. However, it's unlikely that 84 new students will enroll." Miller admitted the most likely place for budget cutbacks are in salaries. "I don't want to frighten anyone," he stated. "We will look to the state for funding. There are many possibilities."

Also Wednesday, new teachers were introduced by their principals and toasted with refreshments. The board may institute a program of non-credit Adult Education classes this semester for the purpose of personal enrichment, mental growth and community awareness. A committee was formed to study the possibility. It was suggested that classes be restricted to 18 students, at \$125 each per class. Certificates of Completion would be awarded.

Classes could include computer spreadsheets, Spanish, art, and French. Interested teachers are requested to submit a proposal to the board as soon as possible.

Policy proposal 87-27 between Ruidoso and the Mescalero Apache Tribe was signed by the board. This concerns the quality of Indian education and also transportation for tribal children who attend school in Ruidoso. "We feel that we are already complying with state policies on Native American Education," explained Miller. "But we have to sign off on the policy for the record."

Board member assignments to the School/Parent council were made, and are as follows: Lamar Osbourne, White Mountain Intermediate; Stormy Edwards, Nob Hill; Lynn Willard, High School; Mike Morris, Middle School; and Don Swalander, White Mountain Elementary.

Open house schedules for various schools were also announced. White Mountain Elementary had theirs on September 10, as did White Mountain Elementary. Upcoming open houses will be: September 17, Middle School; September 22, Nob Hill and White Mountain Intermediate. All the open houses begin at 7 p.m.

Principal Cole of the middle school issued a two word construction report. "It's slow," she said.

Don Weems, White Mountain Intermediate principal, stated that the handicapped bus is currently driving 249 miles each day on its regular route, being in service from 6:25 a.m. to after 4 p.m. "The state has a mileage limit of 185 miles per day," said Weems. "And I'm kind of afraid to ask them for a new unit next year, but obviously, we're going to need one."

"This illustrates an asinine lack of consideration on the part of the state to not include transportation funding in the state budget for handicapped education," fumed Superintendent Miller. "And you can quote me. We are required to provide transportation but we're not given any help in that area."

Brett Argo, the new band leader, approached the board with an idea of selling stuffed animals to pay for a band field trip. Also in band-related action, the board voted to drop band from the fifth grade curriculum and start it in sixth grade because of the maturity of the older student, and to avoid "band burn out."

The board awarded the meat products bid to Watson Foods, Inc., and approved a budget increase to Johnson O'Malley for \$1,500 because of a shortage in the Title IV funding.

Brother Lynn and his wife, Maxine, made a trip to Alamogordo last Thursday and came back with a story that could have been a tragedy but which turned out to be a miracle with a happy ending.

"We had passed Round Mountain which we used to call 'Apache's Last Stand,' and out in the middle of the highway ahead, we saw what I thought was a bear. It turned out to be a large dog, an English sheep dog; and the cars and trucks were just missing him. Tires were screeching and horns blowing, and brakes sounding, and still the dog stayed right in the middle of the highway."

Thinking that surely the dog would get off the highway, they drove on, but looking back they saw he was still there with the cars and trucks just missing him.

This was at eleven o'clock. Four hours later on the way back they could not believe their eyes when here was the dog in exactly the same spot, and a young lady of the nearby Baca family was trying to get him off the road to give him a drink of water.

Lynn and Maxine figured that the dog had more than likely fallen out of a pickup at that spot, and was bewildered—waiting for his master to return.

How this big black and gray fellow had escaped during four hours was more than Lynn and Maxine could understand.

Anyhow, owning little Mack, the little Western Highlander, who is the pride of the household—and having been helped in finding lost pets in the past, they loaded him up and continued on to Ruidoso. He was very gentle, and seemed to understand the situation—that Lynn and Maxine would help him find his master.

At Ruidoso they came by Lynn Willard's Animal Clinic and were advised to call the newly opened

Animal Shelter. They were told that the shelter was not quite ready to take animals; but that they should go down to Mike and Allison Walstad's Kennel past Ruidoso Downs.

Here Lynn and Maxine paid a week's lodging for the big and gentle dog, and were given every assurance by Linda Seely and Judy Blakeney that they would spread the word about the dog, and if the owners were not found, they would find him a good home.

At the animal shelter, Lynn and Maxine were complimented for their timely kindness, and were told that this is exactly the kind of situation that the Humane Society had in mind in establishing the shelter, and planned to be in full operation very soon.

Allison Walstad said that they would keep the dog until September eighteen trying in various ways to find the owner; and that after that they would begin finding a good home for the dog. Allison also said that the dedication and hard work, and the response of the people to the Animal Shelter project made her proud of this community and grateful to be a resident here. She said that this incident of the big black and grey English sheep dog was very timely—that soon the Animal Shelter would be open to care for similar situations. She extended her appreciation to Lynn and Maxine for their help to the helpless dog in need.

Maxine said, "I appreciate what the folks at the Hondo Valley Kennels are doing; because I know how anxious I would be if one of our dogs became lost. And I am grateful to hear the Ruidoso Animal Shelter will be open soon."

Seckler is author of 'Ruidoso Countryside'

Like most writers, Herb Seckler considers himself to be a curmudgeon. "I'm not really a writer," he growls endearingly. "I just like history. I know how to do

research. I like to play with the word processor. But writing? Bah."

Regardless of his own opinion, Seckler is a writer of some note and has recently published a charming and colorful history of the Ruidoso area called "Ruidoso Countryside: The Early Days."

"My friend Jim Blume pointed out to me that there was no real guidebook for the area, in terms of what people would see while out driving around. All the history is in the big, fat books that visitors haven't the time nor inclination to read. So, I thought, 'well, I like to hear all the crazy stories from around here, maybe I should write it all down.'"

Seckler's real love is politics, and he describes himself as "the last of the old liberals." He has his master of arts degree from St. Mary's in San Antonio in History and Political Science, and following 21 years in the Air Force as a navigator, Seckler worked for five years as a military historian.

"You know what they say," says

Seckler. "Military history is to history what military music is to music."

He was born in 1921 in a place he won't disclose—"stuff like that's not important," he says—and has spent a lot of time in California. He has lived for the past 12 years in Bent with his wife, Lenore, who is the postmistress at the Bent Post Office. ("I made the sign you see on the highway," Seckler proudly claims.) Herb and Lenore have five grown children, most of whom live in or around Albuquerque.

"I'd never live in Albuquerque," said Seckler thoughtfully. "Too many people, and I don't really like people too much. I'd never move from where I live now, never."

"If I have a writing strength, it's being able to extract what's good from a body of material, and discard what isn't so good."

In Seckler's book he covers history and anecdotes from Alto, Hondo, Lincoln, Fort Stanton, White Oaks, Capitan, the Mescalero Apache Reservation, Tularosa,

Three Rivers, Cloudcroft, La Luz, White Sands and Alamogordo.

"I just wrote down folklore and colorful stories, things that interested me. To be honest, I didn't have any intention of being truthful. I wanted to be entertaining. But I heard that one of the Storm brothers, a genuine old-timer, came into the Aspen Tree and bought up a handful of my books. 'This is real accurate,' he told the clerk. That made me laugh, though I was almost insulted, because if I had known I was being 'accurate' I would have changed things."

Among other legends spun in "Ruidoso Countryside," Seckler describes the ghosts of the Mayberry Family at Bonto City, the Tularosa Ditch War, Billy the Kid lore, and several train robberies. When complimented on his style, he shrugs, as if writing a popular book is no big deal. "I would like to try fiction, but I don't think I'd be too good at it," he admits. "I just don't have any imagination."

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—The chairman of the Legislature's tax committee thinks the time has come to channel the money we have been spending on porkbarrel projects into filling the gap created by the revenue loss from the big extractive industries.

Sen. Eddie Lopez, chairman of the Legislature's Interim Revenue Stabilization and Resources Review Committee, a euphemism for "tax" so we won't know they're even thinking about such things, says the rainy day is here. The Legislature established the severance tax permanent fund to take care of lost revenue when our rich mineral resources would no longer provide the revenue. Nine years after creating the fund, the Legislature closed the door on ever tapping its principal.

The interest earned by the fund is already being used to fund the daily operation of state government so the only "rainy day" alternative left is to divert the flow of money into the fund. About half of the money raised from severance taxes is being used to retire bonds issued during past years to fund building and community assistance projects across the state. The remainder goes into the severance tax permanent fund.

Lopez, a Santa Fe Democrat, says it may be time to quit building "monuments" to the governor and legislators around the state and use the money to prevent another tax increase for beleaguered counties, municipalities, schools and state government.

The Lopez plan would essentially double the usable money income from severance taxes. The severance tax bonds currently being sold pledge that there will be twice as much income from severance taxes as will be necessary to retire the bonds. This means that for every dollar that goes into paying off a bond, another dollar goes into the severance tax permanent fund to bolster the bond retirement dollar and give New Mexico a better bond rating.

If the money being used to pay off bonds were used for anything else, there wouldn't be the need for a cushion. This doubles the available revenue to get us through lean times. It also means that there is no money going into the severance tax permanent fund to increase its corpus.

Look for this whole issue to be a major battle in the next legislative session. Some legislators will be upset by not having any more porkbarrel money available. Others will be upset about no more money going into the state's second piggy bank, the severance tax permanent fund.

Chances for passage may not be great. Gov. Carruthers is feeling confident about New Mexico's general fund tax revenues for next fiscal year. He cites the Persian Gulf crisis as probably raising oil prices. He is also upbeat about higher livestock prices helping the agriculture economy. So it looks like there may not be the pressure on general fund revenues that there have been the past five years.

Carruthers might not be adverse to seeing some diversion of severance tax money into the revenue stabilization fund he is so interested in creating in order to assure no further tax increases.

If no severance tax revenue is used to fund porkbarrel projects, are there any other sources of money to provide the "goodies" legislators would like to take home in the election year immediately following the 1988 Legislature?

There are two. Any general fund money projected to be left over next June 30 as a result of the improved economic conditions could be used to fund special projects. Carruthers would like this money for his revenue stabilization fund, although governors have been known to enjoy taking credit for public works projects.

There is also the availability of a statewide bond issue. If it is kept small, it will not increase taxes since previously issued bonds are being retired every year. If it is big enough for all legislators to get a project for their district, look for a voter revolt at the polls in November 1988.

Watch for some fireworks at the next meeting of the legislative tax committee. After hearing that Gov. Carruthers was touting his economic development plan, committee chairman Eddie Lopez put the governor's economic development people on the agenda for an unveiling of the program. When he received an answer that the plan was only in its initial development stages, Lopez told them they will be on the agenda, anyway.

But seriously, studies have shown that school teacher's attitudes toward students can be affected by names. For instance, little boys called Harry tended to make lower marks than their counterparts named John.


And I believe it. So if you get the chance to name a kid, be careful. And if your own name doesn't fit—change it.

McDonald's has come a long way from the days when it was open from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. and served up burgers for 15 cents.

Today the menu is enlarged and so are the hours. Ruidoso's McDonald's, which has been in existence for about four years, opens at 6:30 a.m. and doesn't close till 10 p.m.—midnight on Fridays and Saturdays.

Breakfasts have become big business. According to second manager Felix Hernandez, the fast food restaurant dishes up around 300 breakfasts per morning.

"Our big rush is lunch," Hernandez reports. "Because of the middle school, the place is packed from about 11:15 to 1."

There are three workshifts at McDonald's and various employees work various hours. There are around 36 employees at the Ruidoso franchise, mostly young people.

Food preparation is mechanical; everything is in measured units and pre-packaged portions. The breakfast shift goes smoothly under the eye of Hernandez and swing manager Yovanne Lucero.

"Half of our business is through the drive-up window," explains Hernandez. "That makes things easier for people who are on the go." Ease and quick facilitation of food is what fast food restaurants are all about. And why not get served without leaving your car? You deserve a break today.

Behind the scenes is where the action is. The breakfast crew somehow manages to be able to do four actions at once and still offer service with a smile.
