Warriors beat Tularosa Wildcats, 27-22

It was not easy, but the Ruidoso High School varsity football team gained its first win of the season with a 27-22 conquest of host Tularosa Friday night.

The Warriors, now 1-3 on the season, built up a 21-3 lead midway through the second quarter and

held off the pesky Wildcats in the second half.

Tularosa closed the gap to 21-16 early in the second half on a seven-yard touchdown pass off a fake field goal. The extra-point kick was good and Ruidoso led, 21-16.

Ruidoso, which ran up and down the field most of the night, scored the eventual winning touchdown on a 14-yard run by tailback Matthew

Griego with 2:54 left in the third quarter.

Griego's touchdown finished an 84-yard drive in 13 plays.

Fullback Jef Sherwood supplied much of the offense on the drive, along with tailback Jeff Schmidt.

But the biggest gain of the drive was a 17-yard dash by quarterback Michael Swanner which put the ball on the Warrior 48.

From there, the Warriors drove steadily downfield, all on running plays.

Tularosa came back to score its final touchdown on a five-yard run with 10:14 left in the final quarter.

After that, the teams traded series until Tularosa got the ball at its 38.

A long pass from quarterback Eric Gutierrez was knocked away

and Ruidoso took over, running the clock out.

Tularosa started the game's scoring with a 34-yard field goal with 6:22 left.

But after that, Ruidoso dominated most of the second half. On its first series, Ruidoso drove 65 yards in 11 plays, with senior tailback Rusty Shelton going over from the three for the touchdown.

The touchdown was the Warrior offensive unit's first of the season.

The extra-point was no good but Ruidoso had a 6-3 lead with 2:40 left in the first quarter.

The big play in the drive involved a bit of deception. Faced with a fourth-down on their 49, the Warriors set up to punt.

But Sherwood took the snap, pitched the ball to Dusty Beavers who in turn pitched the ball to Swanner.

Swanner then dashed around the left side for 21 yards to the Tularosa 30.

Ruidoso then drove in for the score on running by Shelton and Griego.

Two plays before he scored the touchdown, Shelton suffered a shoulder separation.

But even without the speedy Shelton in the lineup, Ruidoso's offense moved the ball well.

After holding the Wildcats to one first down on the next series, Ruidoso took over on its 42 and scored in four plays.

Swanner ran for 42 yards and a touchdown down the left side.

He ran over for the two-point conversion and Ruidoso had a 14-3 lead with 7:57 left in the second quarter.

The Warriors again held the Wildcats and forced them to punt.

Ruidoso took over on its 19 and drove 81 yards in nine plays for its third touchdown.

The big play in the drive was a 46-yard pass play from Swanner to split end Eric Ford which put the ball on the Tularosa 35.

Two plays later, sophomore fullback Kenny Trapp ran for 14 yards to the 19.

A pass to Jeff Arvizu netted eight yards to the 11 and two plays later Tularosa was called for a personal foul, putting the ball on the eight.

On the next play, Sherwood banged up the middle for the score. Shay Sims kicked the extra point and Ruidoso led, 21-3, with 1:52 left in the first half.

Tularosa scored its first touchdown on a long drive as the half ended. However, the extra-point was no good and Ruidoso took a 21-9 lead into the locker room.

The second half saw the Warriors score one touchdown to two for the hosts, but the big first-half edge proved to be the difference for Ruidoso.

Ruidoso finished the game with 358 yards total offense, 306 rushing and 52 passing.

Sherwood led the Warriors with 87 yards in 11 carries. Swanner added 54 yards on the ground and hit two of nine passes for 52 yards.

Tularosa had 198 yards total offense, 163 rushing and 35 passing.

"That fake off the punt seemed to settle our offense down so that we played like we can," said Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson. "It (the offense) did a lot better than it had in the previous three games."

Kirk Ryan was a standout in the secondary for the Warriors, intercepting a pass and covering well.

Now the Warriors will host Portales Friday, September 25.

WARRIOR NOTES-Swanner got the Golden Helmet award given by the coaches. Other weekly honors went to Todd Morris, offensive player; Shawn Mowdy, defensive player; and Bobby Lane, scout team player. Other games involving District 3-AAA teams saw Deming beat Parkland of El Paso, Texas, 19-0; Silver City edge Fabens, Texas, 14-13; and Coble lose to Animas, 22-12. Shelton should be back in action by the final district game Friday, October 9, at Deming.

State lawmakers visit Fort Stanton

Fort Stanton Hospital and Training School had some important guests last week.

Members of the New Mexico State Legislative Finance Committee toured the facility in order to get a first-hand look at an institution their decisions will affect.

A buffet dinner was served in the dining hall, and Administrator Ervin Aldaz presented a short talk and history of the century-old compound, which had been an Indian fort, a Civil War fort, a tuberculosis sanitarium and is now a home for the developmentally disabled.

"If the profoundly retarded and developmentally disabled citizen can function anywhere else, then we don't accept him or her at Fort Stanton," explained Aldaz to the legislators. "Fort Stanton is home to people who cannot live elsewhere in society because of disabilities or anti-social outbursts."

Fort Stanton has a 155 bed capacity and averages 142 residents. It employs around 200 people, making it the largest employer in Lincoln County. Its annual budget is around \$5,000,000.

State Representative Maurice

Hobson remarked, "My colleagues in Santa Fe are often called upon to enact legislation that affects places like Fort Stanton without actually viewing or understanding what these places are like. I'm happy that they got the chance to come to Lincoln County today. It will make the situation here more real to them."

Mules may not race if support remains low

The Ninth Annual Ruidoso Downs Muleskinners Mule Races at Ruidoso Downs Race Track in mid-September may have been the last such event for this area.

"Unless something happens, that's our last one," said race organizer Melvin Means last week. Means said the Muleskinners group is ready to pass the mule races on to another organization. He said mule race veterans are willing to take on the actual races, but a new group is being sought to organize and promote the fall racing event.

Even as Means listed reasons why the Muleskinners won't be conducting another mule race, he touted this past three-day racing event as a big success. Means said 4,000 people were at the races, and 95 percent of those were from out of town. He said people and mules from seven states were counted at the races.

"We had some real good races," said Means, noting there were a number of photo finishes among the fast-hooved entries this year. But he admitted attendance was down for the annual mule races.

Tonight will be mostly cloudy with a chance of thunderstorms in the afternoon, dense fog at night. Winds will be light and variable.


Tuesday will be mostly cloudy with east-southeastern winds from five to 15 miles per hour. High will be around 63.

Crime Stoppers expands scope

"Crime Stoppers was actually started in the State of New Mexico by an Albuquerque police officer," said Ruidoso/Lincoln County Crime Stoppers (R/LCCS) president Jim Biggs Thursday.

During a regular monthly board meeting, Biggs gave a brief history of the organization for two members of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribal Council who were on hand to learn more about the international organization.

Biggs said the founder came up with Crime Stoppers as a way to pay informants from the general public for information relating to felony crimes.

"Crime Stoppers has been proven to be effective everywhere it is," said Biggs, noting that the organization is active in every state in the union. Biggs said boards are made up of private citizens and

rewards, averaging \$300, have been paid with privately donated funds.

Recent legislation allows the court to mandate restitution of Crime Stoppers rewards by the convicted criminal.

Biggs said the local program, started about five years ago with the help of the Rotary Club, has been so successful it was named Crime Stoppers of the Year program for New Mexico two years ago. Biggs credited former R/LCC president Richard Sandoval with doing much of the work to build an active and effective program.

The local program expanded about a year ago to include all of Lincoln County, and a number of people active in the community were recruited for the board, said Biggs.

"It was only natural to expand further to include Mescalero," added Biggs.

Also during Thursday's meeting, Ruidoso Police Detective Lanny

Maddox reported the Crime Stoppers line received two calls over the past month. One narcotics-related tip was passed on to the New Mexico State Police, and the second tip, relating to stolen property, is being handled, said Maddox.

He said the recent amnesty program for street signs was a positive success—giving people an opportunity to return stolen street and traffic signs.

"We even got posts back," laughed Maddox.

The jewelry listed in a recent Crime of the Week has been recovered, and an armed robbery is scheduled to be highlighted next, said Maddox. He called on law enforcement officials from area agencies to notify him of crimes they want featured on "Crime of the Week" radio and newspaper spots.

R/LCCS scheduled its next meeting for noon, October 15, at Schlotsky's.

Commissioners award airport road bid

The bid for the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport Road was granted Thursday at a special meeting of the Lincoln County Commissioners to Twin Mountain Rock Company, Nebraska, who submitted the low

bid of \$4,335,030.

TMR's bid was \$288,689.20 under the state engineer's estimated cost, which was \$4,623,719.20.

Other firms that bid were: Nielson Construction, Colorado,

\$4,486,952, and Corn Construction, Colorado, \$4,611,252.

The bid is awarded contingent on approval from the State Highway Department.

Former deputy unhappy with job termination

Former Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputy Ronald W. Harrison may have a second grievance hearing before the Lincoln County Personnel Board, which could take place next week.

Harrison was terminated from the Sheriff's Office last month. Sheriff Don Samuels has stated that Harrison was released based on violation of the Sheriff's Office Manual of Policies and Procedures.

Harrison, though, believes he was treated unfairly. Last week, he appeared at a grievance hearing before the county Personnel Board, but when it came time for procedures to begin, Samuels' and Harrison's representatives at the hearing quickly reached a

stalemate.

Attorney Dan Bryant represents Samuels. Attorney Elizabeth Simpson of Albuquerque represents Harrison.

During a recess, an agreement was reached in which Bryant will pass information to Simpson within five days, Simpson will respond within five days, and negotiations will take place the next five days. If the matter is not then settled, another Personnel Board hearing will be scheduled.

The board has heard three grievance hearings since its inception in 1982, all this year and all relating to employees of the Sheriff's Office.

"We hate to see it go ... mule racing gets people into town at a time when we need it," noted Means. "It really helps," he added.

But Means said the active group of people responsible for promoting and organizing the annual mule races has dwindled from 15 to just three. "It's just too much," said Means.

And the number of mules on hand for this year's mule race was down to 50. "That's partly because we

didn't have enough purse money," explained Means, who has put together seven of the nine past races.

Although mule racing is having its problems here, Means said the sport is growing more popular all the time elsewhere in the United States. He said mules race in Albuquerque at the State Fair; in Lubbock, Texas; in Nevada; and in Idaho. Mules race the same days as horses in Idaho, and do even better than the horses at the pari-mutuel windows, said Means.

With the growing popularity of mule racing in mind, as well as the importance of having the event in the area during an otherwise slow time of year, Means said the Muleskinners have placed next year's plans on hold for six months.

"The mule people really want to keep going," said Means. "If we can't get anybody to work with us, we'll disband," he added sadly.

Means calls on anyone interested in keeping the mule races going to call him, Elwood Gradine or Dave McMath.



Mescalero Apache Indians Make A Sacred Pilgrimage

As you pass through the Mescalero Apache Reservation you will see, over to the south on a point of land below a mountain, a large stone church, Saint Joseph's Mission appearing among the ancient hills like something in a dream.

It is truly a dream come true for Father Albert Braun who spent a lifetime ministering to the Mescalero Indians. He and his faithful Mescaleros built the beautiful cathedral stone by stone. It stands as a landmark from coast to coast—a monument to Father Braun.

And now Father Braun is smiling down from Heaven pleased that his beloved Mescalero Apaches have made a sacred pilgrimage to Phoenix to honor and receive the blessing of His Holiness Pope John Paul II.

Among the one hundred and seventy who made the trip were six crown dancers and seven singers under the direction of Sidney Baca. These songs and dances are prayers handed down from time out of mind; and this group sang and danced at the Tekakwitha conference Saturday night, September twelve—praying for all the Indians present and for Pope John Paul II.

Sixteen thousand Indians from all over the North American continent: Canada, Alaska and Mexico—were at the conference. A group of Mescalero women danced and sang in a circle around the crown dancers and singers, following ancient tradition.

Sidney Baca was a member of the

honor guard which escorted the pope into Memorial Coliseum Monday, September fourteen.

Keith Miller, vice president of the Mescalero Tribal Council said: "It was a tremendous honor, a dream come true. We are grateful to Pope John Paul for journeying to these regions and giving us this opportunity of a lifetime."

Sidney Baca said, "I would have been happy just to see the pope at a distance. To be selected as one of seven on the front row, and to shake his hand—this was something to treasure always. Just to look at him you can tell John II is a sacred man."

Sister Juanita Little said: "It was a rare and precious honor to be in the presence of Pope John Paul II, and to pray with the thousands of Indians. One Indian from the Pima tribe blessed the Pope and gave him a sacred Eagle feather."

Saying that the Indian people hold Pope John Paul II in great veneration and sacred honor, Sister Juanita Little described in traditional Apache eloquence of deep sincerity her experience of sharing a moment in the Holy Father's presence, "Just before Pope John Paul II was to enter the coliseum accompanied by the honor guard, there fell a hush of silence over the thousands of Indians as if they were holding their breath. It was so still and quiet that the atmosphere was just vibrating with expectation.

"When he entered there shone around him a glow, an aura of holiness. It was a special gift to be close to him and to shake his hand. When I held his hand and looked in-

to his eyes—so large and luminous with a sacred look—I became lost for a moment in an eternity of deep spiritual benediction. It was a powerful moment—a blessing that will remain with me always, a profound and precious experience in my life.


"Pope John Paul told us to hold fast to our traditions which have served us well in the past, and to share them with the rest of the world. He comforted us, inspired us, strengthened our faith. We will always be grateful to Pope John Paul II."

So our Mescalero friends and neighbors have returned from their pilgrimage bearing the eternal message from the Holy Father of the brotherhood of man under the fatherhood of God. And we all share this blessing, and we thank Pope John Paul II for his second visit among us. We thank God for the treasured blessings of Pope John Paul II among us and throughout the world.

I have just received word from Allison Walstad at Hondo Valley Kennels that a good home has been found for the dog. We will tell more of this in the next column.



Ruidoso High School's varsity volleyball team will begin District 3-AAA action at Silver High School Tuesday, September 22, with some added confidence.

The Warriors took sixth in the tough Roswell Tournament Saturday, winning one of three matches.

Their victory was a three-game 15-11, 15-11, 15-11 win over the Silver Colts.


Tigers belt Hagerman for first win





Treats at Covered Wagon for 7 years

The variety and value of the inventory at The Covered Wagon, 2528 Sudderth, covers a lot of ground.

You can purchase pencils and pens, earrings, bracelets, concho belts, squash blossom necklaces, cuckoo clocks, Austrian crystal, mandalas, sand paintings, thimbles, knives, kachinas, ceramic pet bowls, etched mirrors, tiles, pewter, hummingbird feeders, greeting cards, keychains, Spanish fans, bolo ties, Black Hills gold jewelry and Mattie Crenshaw's handmade bandana dresses.

"We got a little bit of everything," co-owner Ralph Treat admits modestly. Treat bought the place from his step-father, Paul Mayer, now 96 years old, in 1980. Mayer started the store in 1935.

Prior to their relocation to Ruidoso, Ralph and Marion Treat lived in El Paso, where he ran a furniture store and she worked in real estate. Between them they have six daughters, 10 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

"Running this store is a real challenge," says Marion. "All we think about is the store. We sell a

little of everything, small souvenirs and high-quality goods." For example, they have pencils that say "New Mexico" on them for 60 cents, and a 5-piece turquoise and silver jewelry set by Navajo artist Victor Begay for \$3,000. Toy drums made by Cherokee Indians go for around three dollars, and pottery by Jemez Pueblo artist Joseph Gachupin can run around \$400 per pot.

Marion Treat laughs. "The other day a woman came into the store and said 'I'd like to buy a concho belt, made of silver, something really nice.' So I took her over to our best line of conchos and she picked out a real pretty one. 'I'll take this one,' she said. I said, 'This belt is four-fifty,' and she said 'Fine.' I walked over to the register and rang it up, and she handed me a five-dollar bill."

"I said, 'No, this is four hundred and fifty dollars, not four dollars and fifty cents.' And she sort of jumped and said 'My goodness, I had no idea the price of silver had gone so high.'"

The Covered Wagon is distinguished by the porcelain life-sized statues of a Native American couple that sit outside the shop. The Treats call them Jo and Moe. "People take their pictures all the time,

put their kids in their laps, they're a very popular landmark," explains Ralph Treat.

A few years ago, someone tried to kidnap Moe. "This guy picked him up and started to carry him off down the block," Ralph remembers. "There was a customer in the shop, a stranger, and I said, 'Hey, watch the store' and took off after the thief. Chased him all the way to the parking lot. He had a big knife, and he said, 'You can't keep this man chained up like that, it's unconstitutional.' When I finally returned to the store, the customer was still there, mindin' the business."

Last year Ralph was badly injured in a car accident. He had gone to pick up a pizza and never returned, and when Marion went to look for him she discovered the scene of the accident. "My back is still bad, and I have some amnesia, I don't remember the accident at all. I was in the hospital for a long time," says Ralph.

"That was the most expensive pizza we've ever had," Marion quips.

"When is the Covered Wagon open?" "Eight days a week," says Ralph Treat.

What do the Treats do for fun? They go to gift shows.

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—The Capital City is anxiously readying itself for a visit from the King and Queen of Spain.

On the night of September 29, a dinner for 320 people will be held to honor the royalty at the opulent Eldorado Hotel. It will be hosted by Gov. Carruthers and other state dignitaries.

According to the governor, somewhere in the neighborhood of 20 million people want to attend. Rather than take the chance of offending anyone, Robert Dales, who is heading up the governor's preparations for the visit, decided to conduct a lottery to select those who will attend.

In candid remarks at a press conference the day the lottery was announced, Gov. Carruthers admitted he would have preferred to "suck it up" and make a decision on who should be invited even though it would mean pressure and criticism from those who didn't make the elite list.

This is exactly the option which former Governor Bruce King's staff took when the Spanish monarch planned his last visit to our state in 1981. King's staff prepared an invitation list and were ready to take the heat when Juan Carlos had to cancel his trip due to a political crisis back home which threatened to become a full-blown coup.

None of us at the press conference thought to ask Carruthers about the irony between his veto of a lottery bill following the last regular legislative session and the lottery solution being used for the present problem.

Carruthers said he wished there were a bigger location to host the dinner in Santa Fe. The Santa Fe Convention Center will hold twice as many guests, but the catering situation at that facility is enough to scare away anyone worried about offending a foreign head of state.

The other factor causing the necessity for a short invitation list is the cumbersome sizes of the king's entourage and the security force which will be necessary. The entourage will include about 35 Spanish government officials. It sounds as though Juan Carlos needs to be cautious that he leave someone behind to run the country lest he cause himself the same problem he encountered when he planned his 1981 trip.

The security force for this visit is bound to be heavier than that which guarded Princess Anne and Prince Charles on their separate visits to New Mexico in the early 1980s. Both of these members of British royalty were travelling light except for their security force which was bolstered by dozens of Secret Service agents, state police and Santa Fe officers.

Most of the security agents mingled through the crowd, wearing business suits and looking inconspicuous except for having wires sticking out of their ears, wearing curious lapel pins which indicated who they worked for and whether they were authorized to carry a concealed weapon and conducting strange conversations with their coat sleeves.

The lottery solution is already beginning to cause the Carrutherses a multitude of difficulties. People worried about not getting their names drawn are questioning the credibility of the drawing. Efforts to convince the public that the slips of paper will be kept in a mayonnaise jar on Funk and Wagnall's front porch and will be drawn by a bunch of high school students watched by an accountant have thus far proved useless in dissipating applicant's fears that the names have already been selected.

Letters were mailed to over 6000 people notifying them of the lottery. Those interested are supposed to tear off a slip and return it. One legislator wondered how he would find out if his name had been drawn since there wasn't a place on the slip to put one's address. Maybe this is one of those drawings in which you must be present to win.

The wish of Juan Carlos that the guest list be predominantly Hispanic has caused Attorney General Hal Stratton to jump into the action and declare the request "clearly discriminatory." Expect to hear much more on this.

Carruthers said he is greatly surprised at the tremendous interest in the Hispanic community about seeing the Spanish royalty. He said he suspected only the Pope would attract greater attention and he wasn't too sure about that. Had the Pontiff come to our state, I can guarantee the governor would have gotten his answer.



