

Group unhappy with forest management

Peter Mocho, president of the New Mexico Cattle Growers' Association, confirmed Friday that his organization is involved with various government agencies in an investigation of the U.S. Forest Service's management of the Lincoln National Forest.

But Mocho was unable to give details of the study, explaining the association's executive vice president, Denny Gentry, is handling the investigation. Mocho said Gentry was in Lincoln County on Friday for a meeting relating to the investigation; however, Gentry couldn't be located for comment.

In a telephone interview, Mocho said the association has received many complaints over problems in the Lincoln National Forest, "most of it having to do with rights of way access." He said ranchers complain that grazing permit numbers have been reduced drastically if they fail to make concessions.

"They've (U.S. Forest Service) been a little power mad down there," said Mocho. "They've been presumptive about their rights," he added.

An item in the association News Letter dated September 11 quoted Mocho as saying: "preliminary

reports indicate that the problem will point directly at an over-zealous Forest Supervisor, and at least one District Ranger." According to the News Letter report charges have ranged from coercion and extortion, to manipulation of the forest permittees organization.

"We don't even know what the allegations are," said District Ranger Steve Sams, who heads the U.S. Forest Service Smokey Bear District.

Alice Eppers, assistant to U.S. Representative Joe Skeen, said a representative from Congressman Skeen's office attended the meeting and listened to members of the Cattle Growers and the Public Lands Council, a national and state organization for permittees of Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management land. But she said Skeen staffers are not involved in a formal investigation.

Eppers said a representative from Senator Pete Domenici's staff also was a guest at the meeting.

Scott Alley of Senator Jeff Bingaman's office said she wasn't familiar with the issue, and knew of no involvement of a member of the senator's staff in an investigation.

A Lincoln County rancher, Carolyn Litzman, is most familiar with the issue. She recently placed two U.S. Forest Service employees

under citizen's arrest when she found them five miles into her posted land near Carrizozo.

Litzman, owner of the O Bar O Ranch, said she was "fed up" with the continuing trespassing by members of the Forest Service when she took the two men into custody, confiscated their vehicles, allowed them one telephone call and then hauled them into the Sheriff's Office in Carrizozo.

Charges were filed in magistrate court.

According to the Cattle Growers News Letter the Forest Service wants to condemn part of the 10,000 acre ranch to gain easier access to the Lincoln National Forest.

The Forest Service has also been in the news recently over a special permit issued to the paving contractor on the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport. That permit, discussed during a meeting of the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission, allows the contractor to obtain paving materials from a Forest Service site.

Area sand and gravel company owners, along with State Representative Ben Hall, have questioned why the Forest Service allowed the permit, saving the contractor thousands of dollars by buying from the government rather than through free enterprise.

Rams edge Warriors, 6-0

Ruidoso High School's varsity football team could not hit the scoreboard against the visiting Portales Rams Friday night and lost a hard-fought 6-0 contest.

Ruidoso, now 1-4 on the season, played excellent on defense, particularly in the second half.

But the bigger Portales line prevented the Warriors from mounting many offensive threats.

The only score of the game came in the second quarter when Portales' Ray Cordova sprinted 18 yards into the endzone for a touchdown with 9:18 left in the half.

The run for the extra point was stopped, but Portales had all the points it would need for the victory.

The Rams came back with another drive late in the second quarter, driving to the Warrior 22.

But an eight-yard loss, two incomplete passes and a two-yard loss gave the Warriors the ball back with seconds left in the half.

On the last play of the half, Warrior quarterback Michael Swanner ran 25 yards on a keeper to the Portales 44 before time ran out.

The first half was a quick one, only taking 35 minutes in actual time. There were no penalties in the first quarter, and that quickened the action.

The Warrior defense buckled down in the second half and played outstanding ball.

Ruidoso held the Rams to four yards in three plays on the opening series of the second half.

On the following series, Ruidoso

drove from its 25 to the Portales 37 before having to give the ball up on downs.

The big play in the drive was a 22-yard run by tailback Matthew Griego to the Ram 49.

On the next play, Swanner hit Jeff Arvizu with a six-yard pass to the 37.

But Swanner lost eight yards in the next two plays and the Warriors had to punt.

Neither team mounted a good drive the rest of the third quarter, but the Warriors had their chances in the final quarter.

Ruidoso drove to the Portales 35 early in the final quarter before giving the ball up.

After stopping the Rams on the next series, the Warriors got the ball when Sean Moore blocked a Portales punt.

From the Portales 44, Swanner hit Arvizu with a pass which the senior split end caught on the Portales 30 and ran down to the three before he was tackled.

However, the officials ruled Arvizu stepped out of bounds on the 25 for a 19-yard pickup.

But four running plays netted just seven yards and Portales took over. Ruidoso had one last chance to score late in the game.

Ruidoso drove to the Portales 30, getting a crucial 14-yard pass completion from Swanner to Eric Ford which gave the Warriors a first down.

On the next play, however, Swanner's pass was tipped and intercepted by a Portales player, ending the Warriors' last threat.

Both Griego and fullback Jef


Sherwood ran well for the Warriors. "I felt the defense played excellent in the second half," said Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson. "We stopped them pretty much in the second half."

"But we didn't play with a whole lot of intensity in any aspect of the game in the first half."

The Warriors will have a bye this week before opening District 3-AAA action at Deming Friday, October 9.

"Deming is tough (they're unbeaten)," said Henderson. "But we feel like we're capable of beating Deming and we're looking forward to that game."

WARRIOR NOTES-In other games involving District 3-AAA teams over the weekend, Deming crushed Clint, Texas, 35-6; Silver lost to Mayfield, 28-0; Cobre lost to Lordsburg, 22-21; and Socorro won by Los Lunas, 8-6.

Three indicted by grand jury

A Lincoln County grand jury, meeting in Carrizozo Thursday, handed down indictments naming three individuals, according to Harry Wilcox, Jr., senior trial prosecutor for the 12th Judicial District Attorney's office.

Wilcox said the grand jury heard evidence and issued "true bills" in cases involving Adolfo Alex Garcia, of Ruidoso; Darren L. Pauley, Albuquerque; and Milton Norris Farus, Ruidoso.

"If a jury does return a 'no bill' then I won't be able to comment on a case at all," said Wilcox, unwilling to discuss at least two other

cases that had been scheduled for review on Thursday.

Wilcox said Farus was named in indictments alleging two counts of criminal sexual contact of a minor, a third-degree felony. Both counts allege the contact to be with a victim 12 years of age or younger, according to Wilcox.

He said he'll ask for an arrest warrant in the Farus case.

Garcia was indicted on three counts stemming from a head-on collision that left two Oklahoma people dead. Charges include vehicular homicide, a third-degree felony carrying a maximum penal-

ty of a \$5,000 fine and/or three years in the penitentiary; improper passing; and no insurance, said Wilcox. He said a traffic misdemeanor carries a maximum penalty of 90 days in jail.

The grand jury indicted Pauley on one count of unlawful taking of a motor vehicle, a fourth-degree felony; and a count of larceny over \$100 but less than \$250, a misdemeanor with a maximum penalty of one year in jail and/or \$500 fine, said Wilcox.

Another grand jury session is scheduled for Monday, October 5, said Wilcox.

Domenici backs airport fire funding by feds

Senator Pete Domenici is working with Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC) members to clear the way to obtain federal funding for fire protection at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA). Domenici announced last week he has urged the Federal Aviation Ad-

ministration (FAA) to take action that would permit federally funded on-site fire protection at the regional air field under construction on Fort Stanton Mesa.

He has asked FAA to waive its fire protection funding eligibility requirement that an airport have scheduled service using aircraft

that carry at least 30 passengers.

"All the commuter services in New Mexico use planes seating fewer than 30 passengers," said Domenici in his announcement. "As a result, I am requesting that the FAA waive SBRA this waiver so it can receive fire protection funds," he continued.

Stabbing autopsies released

Autopsies on the bodies of two people who died on July 3 in Ruidoso indicated the two died as a result of stab wounds.

Steve Nunez, deputy medical investigator with the New Mexico Office of the Medical Investigator, said Thursday the autopsy report on Stance J. Schiller lists a stab wound to the chest as the cause of her death, and homicide as the manner of death.

He said an autopsy report for Jose S. Jimenez lists two stab wounds to the chest as causing his death, with the manner of death undetermined.

Jim Stover, Lincoln County deputy medical examiner, said a homicide finding means somebody else stabbed Schiller.

"Undetermined means they don't know if somebody else stabbed him (Jimenez) or he stabbed himself," said Stover.

The two were fatally stabbed during an argument in front of Something Special, 2204 Sudderth

Drive, according to official reports. Jimenez was 41 and Schiller was 43.

Witnesses told police that Jimenez entered Something Special, where Schiller worked, and the two went out front where they had an argument and "scuffle."

Ruidoso Police were called at 7:10 p.m. and by the time they arrived the two subjects were reportedly lying on the lawn, having suffered "multiple stab wounds." Police said the two were transported to Lincoln County Medical Center where Schiller was pronounced dead at 7:29 p.m. and Jimenez was declared dead at 8:55 p.m.

"We don't know who stabbed who first," commented Stover in July.

The Lincoln County Sheriff's Office (LCSO), the lead agency in the case, has apparently continued its investigation. Neither Sheriff Don Samuels nor LCSO investigator Paul Wersich could be reached for comment.

Right on time, on the morning of the twenty-third of September, the glorious season of fall arrived in the Mountain World bringing a radiant smile to the face of Mother Earth.

Without being in a hurry to push summer out of the picture, the Season of the Harvest came in with a calm and peaceful cheerfulness, with touches of its own colors near and distant, high and low.





Improvement made to Care Center

Some changes are being made to the physical structure of the Ruidoso Care Center.

The Center, owned by Horizon Health Care of Albuquerque, has put on a new red roof. Construction was finished in August, and the cost was \$20,000.

The Care Center presently houses 60 residents, and they have room for about 25 more at this time.

Their next project is a total interior refurbishment, according to Administrator Patsy Fox. This refurbishment will include new wallpaper, paint and new draperies in the patient rooms, dining hall, offices and nurse's station. Also in the plans will be kitchen floor cover-

ings and a new social services office.

The color scheme will be aquas, peach, tans, browns and green. "We called in an interior decorator," explained Fox. "The new look will be real pretty."

This is the first interior refurbishing since the Center's start in 1980. Physical plant supervisor Tim Reither is working with Fox on the renovation.

"We're going to do a little reconstruction, enlarge the patient lobby and put in a fireplace," said Reither. The interior upgrading will cost \$165,000, and will be completed by the end of December.

The next stage for the Care Center's improvements will be an exterior renovation, costing around \$200,000. This will include painting

and landscaping, a partial road built around the facility, fence work, and a new patio. "Exterior work should begin at the end of winter, and hopefully will be completed by the end of March," said Reither.







Warrior spikers edged by Portales in five games

Ruidoso High School's varsity volleyball team pushed powerful Portales to the edge before losing in five games Saturday in the Warrior gymnasium.

The third game saw Ruidoso jump off to a 5-2 lead, but the Rams came back with four straight points for a 6-5 lead.

Ruidoso grabbed a 9-6 lead before Portales scored seven straight points for a 13-9 edge.

The Warriors closed to within three points at 14-11 before the Rams got the game-cinching point.

Ruidoso forced a fifth and final game with a 15-12 victory in the fourth game.

The Warriors' Dari Stierwalt

highlighted the fourth game with some excellent spiking.

The final game saw the visitors take a 4-1 advantage and lead from then on.

Ruidoso closed to within one point twice after that, but the Rams clinched the match victory with nine straight points.


"Yes, I feel it was our best effort of the season," Arthur said. "It was a real team effort."


What's a person to do on Sundays with the National Football League strike on (as of this writing)?

Editorial

The changing of police chiefs is a tremendously important event in a small town.

The process of changing one chief for another can be done properly, or botched in a big way. Whether good or bad is up to those handling the change—a town's elected officials.

Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor announced his resignation in mid July, to be effective October 15.

The Ruidoso Village Council, the group that will confirm or reject Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr.'s selection from a field of candidates, will meet Tuesday night for their last meeting of September. They will meet just once again (October 13) before the chief steps down.

Yet, the council agenda for Tuesday night includes no mention of a discussion of candidates for chief, nor the appointment of one.

This is troublesome for two reasons. If the council waits until the October 13 meeting to name a chief, the new head of police will have just one day to work with the present chief before shouldering the substantial responsibilities the job entails. Even if Swenor remains with the force as a lower-ranking officer, as he has said he will, it is unfair and unprofessional to expect him to spend time smoothing the path for his successor after his resignation becomes effective.

Secondly, leaving the discussion of the decision to the last minute keeps the entire decision-making process away from public attention. Our elected officials will be choosing another public official whose role will very much affect the public. The process by which that person is chosen should be done before the public.

The choice of a new chief of police is a big step for any community. We encourage the council and mayor to make every effort to ensure the decision is a good one, and to open the discussion to the public Tuesday night.—DJP

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—Did you ever wonder who decides what picture will go on commemorative postage stamps?

The answer is—a committee. That makes sense considering that there appears to be no rhyme or reason to the choice of subject matter. The hard thing to believe is the amount of time put into the task and how far in advance the decisions are made.

Some time ago, Gloria Chavez Tristani and Ymelda Chavez Dixon began an effort to promote the issuance of a postage stamp in honor of their father, former U. S. Senator Dennis Chavez. They wanted the stamp to be issued next spring during the centennial celebration of the Senator's birth on April 8, 1888.

The sisters have now learned that all stamps were decided upon for 1988 and 1989 before they ever got started. The current plan is to get approval for a stamp to be issued at a later date but with an announcement being made next April.

Since the stamp can't be issued on the Senator's 100th birthday, his daughters are suggesting that a very appropriate year for issuance, because of Chavez' Hispanic heritage, would be 1992 to coincide with the 500th anniversary of the discovery of America.

What a great idea! I can think of no one better than New Mexico's Sen. Chavez to be the first Hispanic so honored by our country.

Chavez was a man of many firsts. He was the first Hispanic and the first native New Mexican elected to the U. S. Senate. He is the first and only New Mexican to have a statue in the U. S. Capitol Building. For more than thirty years he was the highest ranked Hispanic in the federal government. He served New Mexico as a U. S. Senator longer than anyone else ever has.

Since his death in 1962, many people have used many words to describe the Senator: My word is courage.

Born in a home with a dirt floor and too poor to ever go to high school, Chavez worked until he was able to obtain admittance to the prestigious Georgetown Law School at the age of 30.

At the time of his death he was

Chairman of the Senate Public Works Committee which made the decisions on federal aid for dams, highways and federal buildings. Of even more importance to New Mexico was his chairmanship of the Defense Appropriations Subcommittee, which handled 60 percent of the federal budget. New Mexico's many defense installations were due in no small part to the influence of Chavez.

Besides his 31 years in our nation's Capitol, Chavez spent seven years in the New Mexico Legislature. The accomplishment in which he took the greatest pride during those years was his introduction of the first bill to provide free textbooks to the school children of New Mexico.

In my mind, Chavez's greatest first, one which required unbelievable courage, is not an accomplishment a person often hears about when the conversation turns to the Senator.

It was 1950 and the height of the McCarthyism era. Demagogues with no regard for truth or constitutional principals were indulging in widespread character assassination. It was a time of hysteria, when nothing but political jeopardy could attend those who aligned themselves against these forces. Few were the voices crying out against this vicious trend.

On May 12, 1950, one such voice did speak out. Dennis Chavez rose on the Senate floor and said, "I should like to be remembered as the man who raised a voice—and I devoutly hope not a voice in the wilderness—at a time in the history of this body when we seem bent upon placing limitations on the freedom of the individual."

Chavez proceeded to denounce McCarthy's favorite witness, Louis Budenz, for his "dubious testimony" and to chastise him for doing so under the "shield and cloak" of the Catholic Church.

Many of Chavez's colleagues felt this was the beginning of the end of McCarthyism. Because of the Senator's leadership, others dared speak out. As one of those senate colleagues characterized it, "Senator Chavez's contribution to restoring the American heritage that day can never be measured."






