'Fact-finding mission' looks at Forest Service complaints

Spokesmen for two state departments said Thursday they are on a "fact-finding mission" looking into complaints of the management of U.S. Forest Service properties in New Mexico.

Karl Hess, range specialist with the Department of Agriculture, and Skeeter Paul, administrative assistant to the secretary of Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources, confirmed they are undertaking a study requested by Governor Gary Carruthers.

Hess said four U.S. Forest Service ranger districts, including the Smokey Bear District with headquarters in Ruidoso, are involved. However, Paul expects the study to extend throughout the entire state.

Governor Carruthers had received a number of complaints, and when in Lincoln County for Government Day he learned of more issues and problems, said Hess.

"That was the catalyst that got the whole thing going," said Hess. "We're just getting information for a report," said Paul, refuting

reports in the New Mexico Cattle Growers Association of an investigation. "It's not an investigation at all—somebody's got their wires crossed," he added.

"The governor doesn't want it called an investigation," said Paul. Hess said an investigation is under way by the Office of the Inspector General.

Hess said "large numbers of people" will be interviewed in order to identify issues before preparing a report for the governor. He said when the study was started a meeting was conducted with Jim Abbott of the U.S. Forest Service, and Smokey Bear District Ranger Steve Sams.

"Besides interviewing, we'll be examining public documents," noted Hess.

Paul said officials with the Forest Service will have the opportunity to review and comment on the report before it is handed to the governor.

Hess said one of the issues raised is the Forest Service Road policy, with some citizens alleging the federal agency, either directly or through counties, is attempting to create easements for additional ac-

cess across private lands by using condemnation procedures.

Other issues include: the distribution of range betterment funds, conflicts over boundaries caused by differences in Forest Service and other surveys and allegations that the service prefers putting roads on private rather than public lands. Issues involved also concern the closing of Forest Service roads during hunting season putting pressure on private lands and grazing allotments.

Paul said the gathering of facts began in the north end of the state and will continue down into the Guadalupe.

"We're not singling anybody out," he added.

Although no public meetings are planned during the study, Hess said any citizen may have input by calling the Department of Agriculture toll-free number, 1-800-432-3651. Callers are asked to leave a name and number, and the calls will be returned, said Hess.

He expects to be through with the study by Thanksgiving.

Search for new post office site may be over

Ruidoso Postmaster R.L. Chamberlain has refuted reports that the U.S. Postal Service is negotiating over purchasing the old True Value Hardware building behind Ruidoso State Bank on Mechem Drive.

"I don't really know a lot about it, because it's done out of Denver," said Chamberlain, adding he hasn't heard about any such plans.

The Postal Service recently announced plans to build a new main post office in Ruidoso, and made an offer on a small tract of municipal land near the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center. The Ruidoso Village Council turned

down both the original offer and a higher amended offer.

Councillors said the Postal Service offer was too low, with some members of the council voicing concern over traffic at the proposed location.

"I feel like it was a mistake," said Chamberlain, noting the offer was for \$42,000 an acre. He said the council decision may have put a stop to a new post office for the time being.

He said the Postal Service leases both the main office and Hollywood Station, and would combine the two offices in a new and bigger building.

"We're running out of boxes and we're running out of space," said Chamberlain, who recently added

some postal boxes in the lobby of the main facility. He said that brings the total of boxes to 3,000 at the main office and 800 at Hollywood Station.

Chamberlain admitted the 2,028 neighborhood boxes were added to relieve some of the pressure on the two post offices, but added most of them aren't being utilized. He hopes the replacement and improvement of some neighborhood boxes will help.

When staff members from the Postal Service Western Regional Headquarters in California made a site visit they looked at several sites, but preferred the village land, said Chamberlain.

"In my opinion it's dead," he added.

McKnight murder reward still in effect

The father of a slain Lincoln County rancher is still offering a \$5,000 reward in the nearly three-year-old murder case.

Roswell resident Joe McKnight said Friday that he purchased a newspaper advertisement last week as a reminder to citizens of his offer to pay for information in the Thomas P. "Cotton" and Judy McKnight slayings.

"It's been a good while," said McKnight. "I just thought it might be a little encouragement," he added.

McKnight offers \$5,000 for infor-

mation leading to the arrest and conviction of party or parties guilty of the murder of his son and daughter-in-law. He asks informants to contact the New Mexico State Police, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office or the Lincoln County district attorney.

More than a year has passed since McKnight first offered the reward in the execution-style slaying that sparked a jurisdictional dispute that ended in the New Mexico Supreme Court.

Former Lincoln County Sheriff Tom Sullivan, 12th Judicial District Attorney James Weldon, members of the New Mexico State Police and District Judge Richard A. Parsons

have voiced differing views over various aspects of the unsolved case.

McKnight also has differed with the former sheriff, as well as with his son, Pancho McKnight, and relatives of his slain daughter-in-law. But all the principals have continued to expect a solution in the old double murder.

"I know there's somebody out there that knows something," said the elder McKnight Friday. He is convinced more than one person was involved, and hopes his reward will entice somebody to come forward with information on his son's murderers.

Chili Cookoff money reported missing

Cash proceeds from the Chili Cookoff, intended to benefit needy children in Lincoln County, disappeared about 6:15 p.m. Saturday.

"Somebody apparently grabbed a bag containing between \$2,000 and \$3,000 in cash," said Ruidoso Police detective Mike Lovelace early today (Monday). He said a brown Ruidoso State Bank bag inside a red CNN/WTBS tote bag was reported missing from a rock building used as headquarters for cookoff judges. Lovelace said Sonya Crown, wife

of cookoff organizer Paul Crown, noticed the bag was missing, and called the police after the area was thoroughly searched.

"I've talked to lots of people and nobody saw anything," said Lovelace, asking for anyone who may have seen anything to call him at 257-7365.

Funds raised were for the Lincoln County Needy Children's Fund to be distributed through the New Mexico Department of Human Services. Lovelace said this would

have been the first time Lincoln County children would have had the benefit of such a fund.

Lovelace said Crown told him the cookoff, the best he's ever coordinated, may already have deposited enough money to pay expenses.

"If he (Crown) doesn't have any money for the children's fund, he said he'll give out of his own pocket," noted Lovelace.

The police investigation is continuing, he added.

SADD founder to speak at state convention

Robert Anastas, founder and executive director of Students Against Driving Drunk (SADD), will be the keynote speaker when the Ruidoso SADD chapter hosts a state convention Friday and Saturday, October 9-10.

Anastas, an educator and alcohol counselor, will speak at 7:30 p.m. Friday, October 9, in the Ruidoso High School gymnasium. The speech is free, and open to the public. Donations will be accepted at the door to help defray the chapter's cost in bringing Anastas to Ruidoso.

Anastas has a long list of awards and accomplishments, including a "Teacher of the Year" award given by the Massachusetts Teachers Association, the Distinguished Service Award of the United States Department of Health and Human Services and the Alumni Achievement Award given by his alma mater, American International College.

At American International College in Springfield, Massachusetts, Anastas was an All-American in football and hockey. He earned his master's degree from Worcester State College, Worcester, Massachusetts.

As SADD executive director, Anastas crisscrosses the country on his campaign to end deaths due to drinking and driving.

In a letter introducing the SADD handbook, Anastas says: "Since we have uncovered how death has been

camouflaged for you because of lack of communication between you and your parents and because of peer pressure, you have responded in a positive way, whether you attend large city schools or small schools in rural America.

"SADD is making a difference because you are making a difference. The number of teens killed on our highways is decreasing. Still, there is much to be done."

Anastas will tell Friday's audience about his game plan of how to continue the fight against what he calls "the number one killer facing" this generation—drinking and driving.

"We would like to invite all surrounding communities, as well as the students, teachers, parents, civic and religious leaders and merchants to hear Mr. Anastas," said RHS teacher and SADD sponsor Gerald Ames.

The public also is invited to seminars planned for Saturday, October 9, at Carrizo Lodge. Sessions will begin at 9 a.m. and be repeated every half hour, explained Ruidoso SADD president Arnie DeAngelo. Seminar speakers will include Emergency Medical Services personnel, Magistrate Judge J.R. "Jim" Wheeler, New Mexico State Police officer Steve Standridge and James Hopper, M.D.

"We can never give up in our effort to educate the public that drinking and driving kills," stressed Ames.

Rape suspect turns himself in

The 23-year-old suspect in an August 13 rape case turned himself in at the Lincoln County Jail on Wednesday, according to official reports.

Boyd Bartlett, named in an arrest warrant issued by Magistrate Judge J.R. "Jim" Wheeler, surrendered Wednesday, and appeared before Magistrate Judge Gerald Dean in Carrizozo. The defense attorney asked to have Judge Wheeler excused, and the case was transferred to District Court, according to court records.

Bartlett is charged with criminal sexual penetration in the first degree. Judge Dean said he set

bond at \$20,000, but Bartlett remained in custody as of Friday.

The victim, a married woman with a small child, was at her family's summer home when the suspect allegedly came to the door and asked if her husband was at home, according to Harry G. Wilcox Jr., senior trial prosecutor for the 12th Judicial District Attorney's office. In an interview on September 8, Wilcox said the intruder called the woman's husband, who wasn't at home, by name.

"That's when he allegedly pulled a knife and forced his way in," said Wilcox.

The Mountain World Fondly Welcomes Beloved October

October first, of this month so dear to the heart of the mountain country, awakened to a clear golden sunrise. The morning sun rising over Sunrise Mountain set the pinons and cedars on top aglow with fiery colors of purple, crimson and rose all mingled with the sun's own pure light.

Under a sky of pure deep October blue, the earliest colors of orange, sunlight yellow, and amber shone on high all up the steep mountainsides among the oak brush. New tints of crimson and purple had appeared just in time to celebrate the arrival of the month of autumn colors.

voice of the pinon birds singing their October chorus, these beloved mountains will abide in your heart forever.

October Evening

On the late evening of October first, all of a sudden over the hill to the northwest there sounded a low boom of thunder, and here came a light shower. A rainbow appeared in the eastern sky and a sun dog or two directly overhead.

The sun, already down behind the western hill, shone into a cloud of falling rain, high in the sky to the northwest. The cloud was very thin and light so that the streamers of rain appeared like showers of sparkling gold—a giant waterfall of sunset-colored cloud water.

After a minute or two the streamers of lighted rain stopped falling and remained in the cloud like golden curtains at the gates of Heaven. 





The Tiger gridders will open district play Saturday, October 10, in a 2 p.m. game against visiting Reserve.





The Ruidoso High School boys cross-country team finished fourth in a meet in Carlsbad Saturday.



"Their times improved a great deal," said Warrior coach Ronny Maskeu. "They ran well and are looking forward to their next meet."


The Warriors' meet for next week is undetermined. Ruidoso will have its own invitational Thursday, October 22.


Randall is very active in Rotary Club, especially the foreign exchange program. "It's so worthwhile, participating in expanding people's horizons through travel and new experiences."



In the woodcarving category, Rick Hall of Ruidoso took 1st place for deep relief carvings.


Lisa A. Nolen and her horse, Schuyler Bid Bar, took many ribbons in the pinto category, in-







Editorial

Autumn is here, and in Ruidoso, that means people will be stoking up the fireplace, starting to burn the wood that was gathered during the summer, adding a touch of cheery mountain warmth to the home.

But breaking out the firewood and having fireplace fires also can mean the beginning of a problem that could lead to a chimney fire.

Every fall, a few homes are threatened by chimney fires. Sometimes they're caught early enough, a few times they have spread, consuming the whole house.

This week is Fire Prevention Week. Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs Firefighters will be visiting the schools, spreading the word of safety precautions that can be taken to avoid fires. Adults, as well as schoolchildren, would be well to remind themselves of the techniques of fire prevention.

To that end, we offer the following list of steps that can help prevent chimney fires, courtesy of the Cooperative Extension Service at New Mexico State University.

—Never start a fire with volatile liquids or newspapers, because these materials can produce flames and temperatures capable of igniting creosote (a collection of volatile oils and tar that can condense along the sides and top of the chimney vent if a fire is not hot enough).

—Reduce creosote deposits by burning dry wood in a hot, small fire, refueling often with smaller amounts of wood.

—Never burn wet or green wood. Burning off the excess water loses heat and builds creosote.

—Burn dry hardwoods such as ash, birch, hickory, maple and oak to reduce the chance of creosote deposits.

The autumn is truly enjoyed with a warm fireplace fire. Take a few steps to ensure the fireplace fire is a safe fire.—DJP

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—Escorted by an armada of airplanes and armed helicopters, the King and Queen of Spain set down at a ball field near the Santa Fe Plaza and began a whirlwind tour of their former Royal City, the Capitol of New Spain.

The crowds were enthusiastic but small because of the previously announced tight security. The authorities had apparently worried about 432 Basques someone had counted in the state of New Mexico doing something unmannerly to the royal couple. When it became evident all the Basques were busy tending their sheep near Willard or running their successful architectural firms or nuclear medicine conglomerates, tensions eased and Their Highnesses were allowed to mingle with the masses.

There were, of course, still the big men in black suits, white shirts, dark ties, dark glasses, and wires sticking out of their ears trying to look like NFL defensive linemen spending their idle time during the strike sightseeing in Santa Fe. Surely, they would never have been noticed except for the times they started carrying on conversations with the large rings on their little fingers.

They were joined occasionally by their leader, who looked like a combination Indiana Jones and Al Capone in a gray fedora and trench coat with lots of funny bulges in it.

The King and Queen were truly gracious, friendly and down to earth despite what the Secret Service might have liked. They insisted on strolling through the crowds, shaking hands and talking with locals and surprised tourists.

On two occasions, Queen Sophia broke away from the King and security forces to do her own thing. Once was to speak with Larry Tapia, a lobbyist and activist for the handicapped whom she saw sitting in his wheelchair on the other side of the street.

On another occasion, she quietly disappeared at the Museum of International Folk Art to buy \$400 of jewelry at the gift shop. This did not have any adverse effect on their schedule, since \$400 can be spent very quickly in Santa Fe.

One of the few downers to the en-

tire day was the absence and bruised feelings on the part of the Santa Fe city fathers. In San Antonio, Mayor Henry Cisneros shared much of the limelight with the King as his official host. The mayor was also the host in San Francisco.

Santa Fe's Mayor Sam Pick received an invitation to one of the events along with a city councilor not politically aligned with Pick. Otherwise, city officials were apparently snubbed.

Bob Dales, the Governor's Chief of International Affairs and Protocol, explained that the decision to work through Gov. Carruthers was made somewhere in the Spanish hierarchy. No one knew or would say whether the choice was due to Carruthers being the highest ranking official in the village or if the Honorary Spanish Consul Arturo Ortega, a high shot Republican, had made the decision as many suspected.

Mayor Pick made the choice to stay home and nurse his ailing back which is still recovering from a disc operation three weeks ago. He was represented by Mayor Pro Tem Phil Griego, who voiced the city's objection that the King had actually come to see the former Spanish Capitol rather than the state as a whole.

Juan Carlos' final and only formal remarks of the day should have soothed the Santa Fe ego a bit. He termed the city "a center of cultural attraction of the highest magnitude in the United States" and one in which "we still feel the pulse of our history."

Carruthers' media relations office performed admirably throughout the weeks of planning and the big day itself. The following morning, Press Secretary Mike Cook wasn't quite ready to relax until he found out how high New Mexico's airspace extends so he would know when to quit worrying.


