High-ranked 'Cats outduel Warriors

Despite moving the ball better, the Ruidoso High School varsity football team lost its District 3-AAA opener to host Deming, 23-6, Friday night.

Deming jumped off to a 10-0 first-quarter lead, and never trailed in the game.

The Wildcats took advantage of a fourth-down gamble by the Warriors on the first series of the game.

On their 32 with a four-and-three situation, the Warriors lined up and snapped the ball to Dusty Beavers.

Beavers was stopped short of the first down and Deming took over at the 31.

From there, the Wildcats scored in six plays.

Quarterback David Reyes hit Felix Holguin on a 17-yard scoring pass. It was the first of three touchdowns passes from Reyes to Holguin.

The extra point kick was good and Deming led, 7-0, with 8:17 left in the quarter.

The Warriors came back with a good drive of their own, but failed to score.

After Jef Sherwood returned the ball to the Warrior 42, Ruidoso drove to the Deming 16 before a field goal was blocked.

The big play in the drive was a 30-yard run down the right sidelines by tailback Rusty Shelton.

After the Warrior field goal was blocked, Deming could not move the ball in four plays and had to punt.

The Warriors took over on their 37 and moved the ball four yards in three plays.

On fourth down, Warrior quarterback Michael Swanner threw a pass which was incomplete and Deming took over on the Ruidoso 44.

Reyes then completed a pass to Holguin that netted 25 yards to the Warrior 19.

Deming could only gain seven

yards in three plays, but Ernie Morales then kicked a 29-yard field goal for a 10-0 Wildcat advantage.

The Wildcats added another touchdown in the second quarter on a five-yard pass from Reyes to Holguin.

The kick was wide, but Deming had a 16-0 lead at halftime.

In the third quarter, Deming drove 62 yards in six plays for its final score.

Again, it was Reyes hooking up with Holguin for a 34-yard touchdown pass. The kick was good and Deming led, 23-0.

The Warriors finally hit the scoreboard on the next series.

Ruidoso drove 82 yards in 13 plays for the touchdown.

Shelton made the touchdown on a three-yard run with 8:54 remaining in the contest.

A big play in the drive was a 14-yard pass from Swanner to tight end McCabe Turner.

A pass for the two-point conversion was no good, but the Warriors had hit the scoreboard.

Ruidoso had the edge in statistics.

Ruidoso gained 130 yards rushing and Swanner completed 10 of 24 passes for 119 yards, a 249-yard total.

Shelton led the Warrior rushing attack with 13 carries for 76 yards.

Deming had 117 yards passing and 76 yards rushing for a 193-yard total.

But Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson was not happy with the loss or the improved statistics.

"No, we're still not moving the ball consistently enough," he said.

"We're getting better, but we've got to do better on our ball-control offense."

Ruidoso also was hurt by turnovers, losing the ball four times to none for the hosts.

Now the Warriors will host their homecoming game Friday, October 16, against St. Pius.

Village officials lay down paving assessment district options

"Shall we do a paving assessment district?" was the question on the floor for a special meeting of the Ruidoso Village Council on Wednesday.

A handful of people were on hand to find out how to get their streets paved, with Pinecliff residents reminding the council that they have been waiting for paving for six years now.

But Pinecliff residents, and others living on unpaved streets, can look forward to more than a year of continuing to drive on dusty roads, according to information provided by John Wilson of Wilson and Company Engineers and Architects of Albuquerque.

Wilson presented details of establishing a paving assessment district, and said it takes from 18 months to two years to take the complicated procedure from its inception to the beginning of construction.

Wilson, whose firm has put together paving assessment districts for Albuquerque and Rio Rancho, described a process that includes a whole list of steps including engineering studies, surveys, public hearings, the bidding process and bonding.

Village engineer Mike Davalos had prepared maps showing more than 100 miles of paved streets in Ruidoso, as well as 40 miles of unpaved roads that could be considered for a paving assessment

district.

Some discussions centered on whether to include sewer construction in the process, with Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. and councilors saying it is better to install infrastructure before paving rather than going back at a future date and cutting into a paved street.

"But I think you should give the citizens what they want," said Pinecliff resident Tom Hansen, reminding the council that the question and cost of sewer is what kept his subdivision from being successful in efforts to get paving six years ago. "We don't want it (sewer)," said Hansen.

Mayor Davis sympathized with the Pinecliff group, adding it must be assumed sewer will be needed at

some point.

"You want to put your utilities in first if there's a chance you'll put them in over the next 10 years," agreed Steve Metro of Wilson and Company.

Village manager Frank Potter asked the council to establish a policy on paving and infrastructure, and before the meeting was over Mayor Davis said action on the paving question will be taken at a future council meeting.

Mayor Davis took a moment near the end of the meeting to lambast The News, noting that the meeting wasn't being covered, apparently unaware that a reporter was in the audience until it was pointed out by some members of the audience.

"I've been working on a letter to

the editor ... they moved 20-some-odd families out of the phone company ... no editorial comment ... never has Ruidoso Natural Gas extended the line ... no editorial comment ... with people coming before the council screaming and pleading for gas extensions ... they are now extending some ... you know they're having hearings on the atrocious rates for electricity at Alto ... no editorial comment ... the county just didn't issue a bid for the road to the airport ... no editorial comment, but everything we do there's editorial comment," said Davis.

He went on to assure the audience that the council will get together on "either the most minimum or maximum" paving assessment district at the next meeting.

Evaluators give Ruidoso schools good marks

Except for some paperwork details, the Ruidoso School System passed its State Department of Education evaluation with flying colors at its exit review on Thursday.

The purpose of the four-person review is to see that the schools within each district in New Mexico comply with state law and issue citations for procedures that do not meet the statutes. The committee also issued professional evaluations, which are not mandated by law, and recognized the strengths within the system.

John Whitcamp, team leader, explained that the evaluation would be informative, enlightening and educational. "While it's our duty to talk about negative aspects of each system, let's not lose sight of the positive," Whitcamp said at the onset of the exit conference.

Each school district in New Mexico is evaluated during a three-year period, and schools are given periods of time to bring their practices up to state statutes upon being issued citations. "A school district is an enormous organizational unit of many components," Whitcamp said. "It's our task to criticize these components and to help them to comply with statutes mandated by state law."

The central office of the Ruidoso school board was cited for not having files of annual goal achievements, and for missing other documentation mandated to be on file at the office.

Superintendent of Schools Sid Miller replied to Whitcamp's citation. "That requirement is met in an informal way, though not on a

particular form of paper," he said. Whitcamp explained that citations did not infer that records were not kept, only that they are not kept in accordance with state specifications. "The issue of statutes cannot be waived," he said.

The central office was also cited as having no written management plan for managers and staff, and that files for professional staff were not kept in a specific place safe from fire and theft. The committee also could not find some health certificates, college transcripts and teaching licenses for some members of the faculty.

The committee articulated a need for more teacher's aides within the district, but acknowledged that the deadline for a request to the state has not yet come about. "We are being cautious in advance," Whitcamp explained.

In the middle school, it was pointed out that the course "Athletics" is not approved by the state of New Mexico and that the title of the course needs to be changed or that the course needs to be dropped from the program.

The high school and White Mountain Elementary were cited for needing more paperwork, particularly in terms of defining formal process needs, and developing formal written evaluations.

"I disagree with that assessment," said Superintendent Miller, "because all this paperwork would be time-consuming, and time wasted from the business of education. This sort of thing may be necessary for the legislators, but it's unnecessary for us to provide quality education. However, though I feel it is unnecessary, we will comply with state statutes."

Associate Superintendent Mike

Gladden stated, "We may have no formal paper trail, but we do get the job done."

Whitcamp reiterated that he was not criticizing the teaching processes, only the lack of paperwork.

The system was also cited for minor noncompliance in the vocational areas of the high school, such as not having area delineations clearly marked, and for improper disposal of chemicals from chemistry classes. There were also minor playground details cited at White Mountain Elementary, such as cracks in sidewalks and rough surfaces of wooden playground equipment.

Three experts evaluated various aspects of some of the Ruidoso schools after Whitcamp's initial evaluation. Nancy Mandell examined the guidance and counseling services at Nob Hill Elementary and White Mountain Intermediate.

"There is strong care for the students that is clearly ongoing," she reported. "The restrictions placed on the staff and support staff is mainly budgetary. The library and media people continue their educational process by attending classes and workshops, and the school nurse (Pam Anderson) attempts to integrate major issues into her program."

"The spirit is there," Mandell commended the Nob Hill principal, Roger Sowder, and the faculty and staff for their activities, including spelling bees, puppet shows and carnivals, and White Mountain Intermediate principal Don Weems for his activities, including a Math Bowl. "I wish you had more financial resources," she concluded.

Mary Jane Vinella said that she was particularly impressed with

"excellent parental involvement." She also commended nurse Pam Anderson for producing and duplicating her own instructional videos with her own funds. "She has great organizational skills, and has overcome a lack of finances with talent and dedication," Vinella stated.

Vinella also added a personal note to her report. "I really enjoy Ruidoso," she said. "I love being here."

Muriel Grubbs reported on vocational problems and commendations. "The middle school and high school need written curriculums, as has been previous stated," she said. "And I know that these things will be done. The schools are clean and well-maintained, the remodeling is excellent, and there seems to be excellent teaching strategy. The high school teachers are student centered and often spend money out of their own pockets if no funds exist for them to do special projects. There is good student-teacher interaction, and a remarkably cooperative attitude on the part of everyone."

Grubbs commended Middle School principal Texanita Cole and her staff for cleaning their own rooms when custodian help was at a minimum.

"I want to mention that the hospitality we've been shown here is wonderful," she mentioned.

In conclusion, John Whitcamp stated that the Ruidoso schools are doing a fine job at educating their young people.

"Wait till you come back in three years," said Superintendent Miller. "We're going to knock your socks off."

Rape case relocated to District Court

A Ruidoso man accused of rape was bound over for trial in District Court last Wednesday in a first appearance hearing that may lead to charges of perjury for one witness, according to Harry Wilcox Jr., senior trial prosecutor for the 12th Judicial District Attorney's office. Magistrate Judge Gerald Dean,

after hearing evidence in the State versus Boyd Bartlett, bound the defendant over for trial and set his bond at \$20,000 with no 10 percent, according to official court records. Bartlett, who had remained free on bond of \$20,000, was remanded to the custody of the Lincoln County Sheriff, and was booked into the

Lincoln County Jail. The 23-year-old Bartlett will be tried in District Court, charged with criminal sexual penetration in the first degree. He is accused of raping a Hispanic woman on August 13 in Ruidoso.

Wilcox said a defense witness

testified that he was with Bartlett at the time the alleged incident happened, and said the defendant never entered his accuser's trailer. Wilcox said the witness testified under oath that he had never been convicted of a crime. That testimony may result in a charge of perjury, said Wilcox.

Few knew of cancelled gambling meeting

According to published reports, a meeting of a legislative committee scheduled in Ruidoso to discuss gambling issues was cancelled because of an apparent lack of interest.

But village and Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce officials, as well as the editor of The News, said they were never notified of the planned meeting of the Legislative Revenue Stabilization and Resources Review Committee.

State Senator Manny Aragon (Democrat from Bernalillo County), chairman of the subcommittee, reportedly said the meeting was scheduled for Ruidoso to allow people from southern New Mexico to discuss gambling issues before a legislative group.

Gloria Trujillo of the Santa Fe staff for the commission said Friday that notices were sent out to the

group's mailing list, a meeting room was reserved and the chamber was notified.

"We didn't hear of anybody that indicated an interest in testifying," said Trujillo, noting that the commission recently had a meeting "up north" where members of a number of groups spoke on gambling issues. She speculated that the northern meeting was attended by groups from all areas of the state with an interest in gambling.

But village manager Frank Potter said he was never officially notified of the commission's plans to meet in Ruidoso and discuss gambling issues. He said their only contact was to call a village secretary to reserve a meeting place.

"They didn't notify us that they were going to meet here," said chamber executive director John

Jeffers. He said he learned of the meeting from Bob Gold, formerly with the state Department of Economic Development and Tourism.

"They're bananas if they think people down here aren't interested in gambling," said Jeffers. "People down here love gambling," he added, noting that the area has a racetrack and bingo. Jeffers recalled when "a bunch of people were arrested here for gambling."

Trujillo said Senator Aragon indicated he might schedule another meeting in southern New Mexico, but Aragon couldn't be reached for comment. Officials of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe who operate a bingo game at the Inn of the Mountain Gods also were unavailable Friday.

October is National Domestic Violence month

With October proclaimed National Domestic Violence Month, the Ruidoso Family Crisis Center (FCC) has renewed its commitment to inform Ruidoso citizens of the little-discussed but epidemic problem of spousal abuse.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation estimates that one out of two women will be physically abused at some point in their lives by men with whom they live.

As many as 20 percent of hospital emergency room visits by women are attributed to wife beating, with 70 percent of all emergency room

assault cases being wives. Those statistics, provided by the Texas Council on Family Violence, are symptoms of a national problem that extends from the home into the health care industry and into the economy of this nation.

And Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor, a member of the FCC board, has said repeatedly that the problem exists right here in Ruidoso. Domestic violence calls are the most dangerous for police officers, according to national statistics on injuries and deaths of law enforcement personnel.

FCC board members and volunteers will be providing information on domestic violence on Saturday and Sunday, October 24-25, in the Wal-Mart foyer.

Capitan place-kicker Kimmo Hintikka tied a school record with five extra point kicks. Hintikka is a foreign exchange student from Finland.


Now the Tigers will prepare for Cloudercroft Friday, October 16, in the Capitan stadium. The game will start at 4:30 p.m.



Editorial

With freedom comes responsibility.

During this bicentennial celebration for our nation's constitution, and coincidentally the 196th anniversary of the Bill of Rights, let us not forget the burden of personal accountability that is the flip side to our constitutional rights.

Most of us are quick to invoke those rights declared in the first 10 amendments, including freedoms of religion, speech and the press. But a group commissioned by the Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, has drafted the Bill of Responsibilities to remind Americans that "freedom and responsibility are mutual and inseparable." Two years of study and deliberation went into the resulting document, reprinted, in part, below:

- "1. Be fully responsible for our own actions and for the consequences of those actions.
- "2. Respect the rights and beliefs of others.
- "3. Give sympathy, understanding and help to others ...
- "4. Do our best to meet our own and our families' needs. There is no freedom without economic freedom.
- "5. Respect and obey the laws ... Liberty itself is built on a foundation of law. That foundation provides an orderly process for changing laws.
- "6. Respect the property of others, both private and public.
- "7. Share with others our appreciation of the benefits and obligations of freedom.
- "8. Participate constructively in the nation's political life.
- "9. Help freedom survive by assuming personal responsibility for its defense.
- "10. Respect the rights and meet the responsibilities on which our liberty and our democracy depends."

Yes, let's guard and protect our rights under the constitution, but let's always remember that those freedoms depend on a rational and responsible citizenry.—fj

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—They're back.

Just when you thought it was safe to venture out of the house, again, candidates bearing nominating petitions are back.

You remember them. Two years ago you couldn't go to a public place without being trampled by candidates and supporters and hired hands sticking a clipboard under your nose and asking for your signature.

In their eagerness, many of them forgot to ask the important questions such as: "Are you registered? What party? What county? Would you please sign your name the way it appears on the voter rolls?"

Many candidates had to resort to buying signatures from private firms. Some of the sheets of signatures turned out to look suspiciously like other sheets of signatures. There were challenges, lawsuits, withdrawals, disqualifications and much gnashing of teeth. And there was a bill supported by both parties which passed easily through the 1987 Legislature, putting an end to the foolishness.

When the 1985 Legislature abolished preprimary nominating conventions in order to take smoke-filled-room politics out of the nominating process, it created another monster. Candidates were required to secure nominating petition signatures from five percent of the number of voters who cast ballots in their party's last gubernatorial primary.

The requirement turned out to be excessive in statewide races. Democrats had to secure some 9,000 signatures. The Republican number was around 3,000. The new law requires three percent of the number of voters who cast ballots in their party's last gubernatorial primary.

For Democrats that number is 3,276 signatures. For Republicans it is 2,673. The 3 to 1 differential between party requirements was narrowed because of an unusual one-man Democratic primary election in 1986 and an equally unusual six-way race among the Republicans.

The gates opened for collection of signatures on October 1 but there is good news. Not only are fewer signatures now required, there are fewer statewide races. The Secretary of State's office reported very few requests for petitions on opening day, October 1.

The only statewide offices we will vote for this year are U.S. Senate, Corporation Commission, Supreme Court and Court of Appeals. Add to this a congressional race in each district, a state senate and house race in each district and a state education board race in four of the ten districts and that's it for races with a state focus.

Candidates who run statewide and congressional candidates have five months to collect their signatures, which are due March 1, 1988. All other candidates, including legislative, have another month, until April 5.

Several Democrats have announced their interest in succeeding long-time Corporation Commissioner John Elliot for a six-year term. Recently, Elliot has been known to get mad at some of the companies being regulated by the commission and threatened to run again. The statewide offices which are on the ballot this year happen to be those for which an incumbent can run for reelection so Elliot could carry out his threat.

Supreme Court Justice Mary Walters has not yet announced whether she intends to run for another eight-year term. Mary was bothered by a health problem but has made a literally miraculous recovery so may decide to try it again. In the meantime, District Judge Petra Jimenez Maes of Santa Fe has announced her intent to run for the seat.

Court of Appeals Judge Harvey Fruman must run for the seat to which he was appointed by Toney Anaya shortly before the end of Toney's administration. That is also an eight-year term.

The 1987 Legislature also made another statutory change designed to make life better for us voters. The deadline to register to vote has been moved up from six weeks before the primary and general elections to four weeks before. This makes the dates May 10 for the June 7 primary and October 11 for the November 8 general election.

It is comforting to know that Nominating Petition II will not be as horrifying as the previous version. This is one case in which the sequel is going to be better than the original.






Nature splashes the area with Autumn colors


Fading shrubbery and pale green evergreens decorate a drying brown trunk and limb, the last remains of a felled tree at the Grindstone Canyon Dam.



Darkroom work is his specialty

Most of the time, Richard Montgomery is in the dark ... and he's happy about it.

But being in the dark is what being a darkroom technician-photo expert is all about. Just ask Richard.

He's been prowling the black recesses of photo darkrooms of one type or another for a long time. Montgomery got his introduction to photography and darkroom work while serving in the U.S. Navy in 1969-1973. Aboard the destroyer tender Yellowstone, Montgomery was assigned to the pressroom as a lithographer, but when the ship was at sea, the presses weren't running so the photographer-to-be had a chance to spend some time with the ship's photo crew.

They'd shoot photos of new officers on the Yellowstone, and take to the skies for aerial reconnaissance photography.

Soon after he left the deck of the Yellowstone for the last time, Montgomery was visiting Ruidoso and found himself checking out the equipment at Ruidoso Printing out of curiosity. One thing led to another and soon Montgomery was back at the printing trade, helping Charlie McClellan and H.B. Flanagan print up programs for the racetrack.

Whether shooting negatives for a press run, or shooting photo negatives, Montgomery kept his hand in the craft of making images with light.

In the early 1980s, Montgomery became a pressman at The Ruidoso News, and again spent a lot of time in the dark, learning more and more about proper exposure, chemicals and processing. He returned to Ruidoso Printing, then decided he was ready for a change.

Montgomery started with Art's Photographic in June 1986, and that's where he's been ever since. Montgomery completed an intensive training program with Art's in El Paso, Texas, and describes himself as a lab technician now. He speaks of his work more as something he enjoys than as just a job.

At Art's, Richard and Arlene Covrig run the show. They offer color print and slide processing, black-and-white processing and copy work, among a wide array of other services. A portrait studio at Art's, in the Gazebo Shopping Center, enables the duo to handle just about any type of portrait work, from families to passports.

The two also do freelance assignments, such as weddings. Special orders, too, are no problem.

"I've been around this stuff, photography, for so long," Montgomery says while air-dusting a negative before printing. "I've always liked it."

He pauses from his work to step into a back room.

Soon, a machine whirs, and a photograph appears. Richard smiles.

"I've always been in the darkroom."
