## Warriors lose to Sartans, 23-14

Despite one of their best efforts of the season, the Ruidoso High School varsity football team lost to visiting St. Pius, 23-14, in the Warriors' homecoming game Friday night.

Ruidoso, now 1-6 on the overall season, will return to District 3-AAA play Friday, October 23, against visiting Silver City.

The Warriors found a passing game against the Sartans and almost pulled the contest out, leading, 14-7, until late in the third quarter.

Rusty Shelton's six-yard run with 2:52 left in the third quarter gave the Warriors a 13-7 lead.

Shay Sims' extra-point kick was good and Ruidoso led, 14-7.

On the Warriors' drive, a pass from quarterback Michael Swanner to Eric Ford netted 38 yards to the St. Pius 27.

Three plays later, Swanner connected with Jeff Arvizu for 19 yards on the right side and Ruidoso had the ball on the Sartan four.

Three plays later, Shelton took it over, sweeping around the left side.

But the visitors came right back to take the lead.

St. Pius drove 53 yards in nine plays for their second touchdown.

A big play in the drive was a leaping 26-yard catch by Jeff Hancock of a George Koury pass which put the ball on the Warrior three.

On the next play, Mike Murphy ran in for the touchdown.

The Sartans lined up as if they were going to kick, but Koury took the ball and passed it to Murphy in the end zone for a two-point conversion and a 15-14 lead.

St. Pius put the game away late in the fourth quarter, driving 78 yards in 20 plays for the touchdown and a two-point conversion.

Ruidoso started the game off with a good drive, driving from its own 32 to the St. Pius 38 before giving the ball up.

The teams traded series before the Sartans hit the scoreboard first in the second quarter on a three-yard run by Lence Jorgensen.

The extra-point kick was good and St. Pius led, 7-0, with 7:46 left in the first half.

But the Warriors tied it up just before halftime.

After Kirk Ryan returned a punt to his 46, a Swanner pass fell incomplete.

On the next play, however, the junior quarterback found Ford over the middle between two defenders.

The 145-pound senior caught the ball and ran in for the touchdown.

his first of the season.

Sims' extra-point kick was good and the teams went into halftime tied, 7-7.

Despite the loss, the Warriors had their best passing game of the season.

Swanner completed eight of 14 passes for 168 yards and one touchdown.

Shelton gained 82 yards on the ground, all but one of the Warriors'

83-yard total.

Ruidoso finished with 251 yards total offense to St. Pius' 330. The Sartans had 173 yards rushing and 157 passing.

"St. Pius probably was the second best team we've played all season (after Artesia)," said Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson. "We had one of our best efforts of the year."

"Swanner and Ford both played very well on offense. Bobby Lane and Shawn Mowdy played very well on defense."

"St. Pius was a good team. They had five 10-play drives and their final drive had 20 plays, unheard of in high school."

Now the Warriors will get ready for Silver, a 7-0 district winner over

Deming Friday.

## School board discusses enrollment

The Ruidoso Board of Education considered 17 agenda items at its regular meeting Wednesday at the administration offices, including reports on current enrollment, a State Department of Education review and the transportation policy and procedure.

Enrollment in Ruidoso schools is down 72.5 students from budget projections. The .5 refers to kindergarten students, who are counted as one-half of a student, since they only attend Nob Hill for one-half day.

"Enrollment has actually increased, because we are up 50 students from the end of last year," explained Associate Superintendent Mike Gladden. "When we made the projection, we were counting on a Mesalero housing project that was in the works, and on having some Star Wars families living in the area. This didn't happen, so we're coming up short now."

"We just missed it this year, that's all there is to it," conceded Superintendent Sid Miller. "Last year, we were only one student off in our projections. This year, it's 60. You are required to project a guess, and this time we were off."

A special meeting was announced. It is set for noon Wednesday,

October 21, in the Ruidoso Middle School library to discuss the lack of enrollment, funding and the procedures that must be taken to remedy the situation. This meeting is open to the public.

The State Department of Education review was discussed, and Miller commented, "We have no problems with what they said." The board has to get some paperwork together to satisfy state statutes, and they are now in the process of doing this.

White Mountain Intermediate School Principal Don Weems presented a report on the school bus situation, and asked the board to approve a request for two additional buses. "We have a student overload at the Mesalero summit, and we need a special education bus," he said. The costs for these will be reimbursed by the state and will be of no cost to Ruidoso.

Teacher Jackie Branum requested permission to use the large Greyhound bus for a marine biology field trip to California, including Catalina Island, Sea World, Scripps Marine, Disneyland and the Reuben Fleet Science Institute. Each student going on the trip must be accompanied by an adult. The cost is \$350 per person.

"That's remarkably inexpensive, which you will know if you've ever taken a family to California for a

week," said Branum. The board passed her request.

This prompted board member Don Swalander to ask a question of Superintendent Miller. "I am curious about the authorization for some of the students to take a recent trip to Deming," he said. "In a time of an austere budget, how can we authorize field trips?"

Miller replied that he, personally, had authorized the trip, saying it only cost \$50 and that it did not involve an overnight stay. "These trips are invaluable to students, and I take full credit for allowing this one to happen," he replied.

Board member Lynn Willard commented, "When we are a custodian short at the middle school, and money is tight, you can't blame people if they get upset when they hear of other expenditures," he said.

"Sometimes, people will get upset at what we do," said Miller. "Education costs money, and I will take responsibility for delegating some of that money. There will always be people who are upset about decision-making. I'm sure there will be people who will be upset about future decisions as well."

The board vetoed a request from Ruidoso Downs Race Track to lease activity buses during the summer. Please see **School**, page 2A

to transport tourists to the racetrack. "I do not recommend approving this because the wear and tear it would put on the buses is not necessary. But it's up to you," Miller told the board.

Associate Superintendent Gladden spoke on drug awareness week, and said that they have booked a "big gun speaker," Tim Burns from Santa Fe, to speak this year. "I've heard him before, and he makes a very powerful presentation about the damage the brain incurs when subjected to drugs and alcohol," Gladden said.

It was decided that all staff could attend Burns' talk as an in-service, and authorized the early release of students on Wednesday, October 28. The staff program will take place from 1-4:30 p.m. that day, and there would be a public program in the high school library from 7-8:30.

"This is a high-quality speaker, one of the best," remarked Gladden. "It will be one of the best in-services we've ever had."

High school principal Tom Hansen presented his idea of scheduling an informal parent-conference day at the high school on November 6 at the end of the first nine-week scholastic period.

Students' report cards would be released to the parents, who could then confer briefly with teachers and counselors.

"Let's try it," said Miller. The board passed the request.

Board members voted to change the meeting night and time of their regular sessions from Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. to the second Tuesday of each month at 7 p.m., beginning in January 1988. ### In Full Swing

Here we are a little past half way through October, the apple month. This is written to you on October seventeenth, and the apples in the orchards are turning their full colors of crimson, scarlet, yellow and gold. These October colors harmonize with the gold and bronze of the river trees, the crimson of the woodbine, and the many-colored tapestry of the oak brush on the sides of the hills.

The weather is perfect for the ripening of the apples, with cool nights just barely at the freezing point or a little warmer. The sun brings the color and flavor into the apple while the life force wells up from the roots of the tree.

The cool nights make the flesh of the apple firm and the juice abundant and sweet.

The apple has been with us a long time—since time out of mind. There are over thirty-five thousand kinds all over the world, according to the Encyclopedia Britanica—counting

everything, little wild apples included.

Fifty or so years ago there were maybe one hundred popular varieties in the United States. There are maybe twenty-five or fifty today, that are in volume production.

Since earliest times apples have been an important element in our diet for several reasons, for one thing they are one of the most important elements in our good health. And there are more good points in the apple being discovered every year.

Another thing, the apple is easy to store through the winter without too much trouble. In the old days folks stored them in little dug-outs on the farm, between layers of straw. Or in barrels or boxes, again with layers of clean straw in between.

A very good way to store apples is in wooden boxes or crates which will allow air to circulate among the apples. An apple breathes, and does best in a cool dry room, with the temperature cool but not freezing.

The main varieties grown in the valleys on the slopes of the White Mountain are: Red Delicious, Golden Delicious, Stayment Winesap, Jonathan and Rome Beauty.

The Red Delicious of the most recent plantings are descended from the original Stark's Delicious, which became the leading eating apple years ago.

Several years ago Stark's Brothers of Louisiana, Missouri, developed the Double Red Delicious, and later the Double Red feature was developed in other varieties.

Let us begin with the Double Red Delicious. This is the favorite eating apple. In the orchards it is coming into full flavor and ripeness, turning dark crimson and maroon, almost purple. The flavor matches the color in its richness, something all its own, reminding you faintly of a red or purple grape. These favorites are sending their flavor out into the air in the form of a sweet aroma which gives you almost a taste of the apple as you approach the orchard. Besides eating out of the hand, this apple does well in pies, and salads.

### The Golden Delicious

Like so many others the Golden Delicious appeared all by itself on a hillside, and became one of the world favorites. It is golden yellow with a pink blush when in full ripeness. The flavor slightly resembles that of a pear.

The Golden is a wonderful all-purpose apple, good pies, applesauce, cobbler and eating out of the hand.

All apples are good to the taste and good for you. There is just enough difference in the flavor so that there are plenty of favorite apples to go around.

Next time around or so we will go into the Jonathan, Winesap, and Rome Beauty, and maybe touch upon some old favorites like Pearmain, Arkansas Black, and Black Twig.

Meanwhile let us be grateful to Our Lord for these glorious October days.

## Wreck injures Downs police officer

Ruidoso Downs Police officer David Hightower remains in stable condition at Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) with injuries he sustained when his police unit overturned Sunday.

New Mexico State Police officer Steve Standridge said Hightower, 29, was eastbound on Gavilan Canyon Road driving a 1983 Chevrolet police unit when he failed to negotiate a curve, lost control and collided with the mountain causing the unit to roll over. Standridge said Hightower was heading into Ruidoso Downs in response to a call.

Hightower was taken to LCMC by ambulance, according to reports. Standridge said his investigation is continuing.

In a separate incident late Saturday, a 1980 Plymouth overturned on Brady Canyon Drive. The 15-year-old driver, Jesse W. Neeley of Ruidoso, was uninjured after his car flipped near 329 Brady Canyon Drive, according to the accident report.

Police said Neeley was eastbound on Brady Canyon Drive about 11:37 p.m., traveling at a "high rate of speed" when he lost control causing his car to leave the road, flip and

land on its side. Neeley was cited for careless driving and mandatory seatbelt violation, according to the report.

Police records indicate other accidents were reported just after midnight today (Monday), October 19, at White Mountain and L.L. Davis drives; 2:20 p.m. Sunday, near The Paddock; and 12:50 p.m. Friday.

An ambulance call to Alto Lake was logged about 3:15 p.m. Sunday, but details weren't available on the incident where a subject was reportedly suspended on a cliff.







Anyone who doubted the quality of Ruidoso High School's varsity volleyball team before Saturday's match with visiting Deming should not have any doubts now.

The undefeated Warriors came back, not once, but three times, in taking a five-game victory over the Wildcats.

Ruidoso won 8-15, 15-9, 7-15, 15-8, 15-12, to raise its district record to 5-0, two games ahead of the Wildcats.

But when the match started out, it looked like there would be a two-way tie for the district lead at the end of the match.

However, the Warriors came back well in the second game.

Deming took a 7-0 lead and looked like it would be an easy winner.

But the Warriors came back to outscore Deming, 8-1, for an 9-8 score.

The teams traded points before the Warriors finally tied the score with Shannon Lee serving.

Ruidoso then scored two points for a 12-10 lead before Deming made it 12-11.

The Warriors took a 13-11 lead,

Deming, cutting it to 13-12 before Ruidoso gained a 14-12 lead.

Mikki Roller then served the final and winning point, as Warrior fans burst onto the court to congratulate the team.

Despite the victory, Warrior head coach Pixie Arthur was not happy with the way her team played.

"I think it might have been the worst we've played all season," Arthur said. "But I guess because we are the better team, we were still able to win despite playing so poorly."

"I thought Shannon Lee played pretty well overall. But the key was the team was able to suck it up from inside and win as a team."



## Inside the Capitol

**SANTA FE**—The Secretary of State's office reports numerous requests for nomination petitions.

Because it is not necessary to identify one's self by name or by office sought when obtaining a petition form, there is no way for nosy people like political columnists to determine who all these people are. The following is a partial list of people who have expressed interest or names that have been thrown around.

**U. S. Senate:** Incumbent Jeff Bingaman will seek re-election. All three congressmen have announced that they will not contest the first-term senator.

This does not mean Bingaman's run will be easy, however. At least four very serious Republican candidates are lining up at the starting gate to provide a challenge. None have held statewide office so all suffer a lack of name recognition in most parts of the state.

Senate Republican Floor Leader Bill Valentine was the first to formally announce. Since late June, he has been stumping the state trying to drum up crowds and support. He has attended a high-powered candidates' school and is sporting a new wardrobe and new eyeglasses and has shed his moustache.

Despite prodding his fellow Republicans with stories about the million-dollar war chest Bingaman has already amassed, Valentine has raised only a very modest campaign fund. If nothing else, his statewide visits should have helped him touch

bases with his fellow Republican senators and mend any fences that might have needed tending as a result of a reported effort to elect a new floorleader last summer.

The next candidate in the senate race was Rick Montoya, in early September. Montoya resigned his position as an assistant secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior in late July to return to his native Las Cruces.

Montoya incurred some early anger from top Republican politicians when he held a fund-raiser immediately following his farewell reception. The letterhead stationery used for the reception invitation looked much like that used for the fund-raising invitation except that it contained additional names of some top Republicans who didn't appreciate the possibility of being confused as campaign supporters.

Montoya's career path has somewhat paralleled that of Gov. Garrey Carruthers and it appears he plans to continue the similarities. He has borrowed the "can do" phrase from Carruthers' campaigns and has secured the campaign support of James Watt.

With virtually no name recognition, Montoya's only hope is that in a crowded field of Albuquerque candidates, a minority from southern New Mexico might pick up enough following to win the necessary plurality. Realistically, to have any chance Montoya must have one other item Carruthers possessed—first position on the primary election

ballot. In the 1986 primaries, the first position meant victory for all but one candidate in Democrat and Republican statewide offices.

Next into the senate race was Albuquerque businessman Corky Morris on September 30. Morris is a former state Republican Party chairman, state Reagan-Bush campaign chairman and Bernalillo County Commissioner. Morris' 20 years of party service should be of great help to him with fellow Republicans throughout New Mexico.

Long identified with the conservative wing of the party, Morris should be able to expect some strong loyal support from that faction. Jack Stahl and Hal Stratton, both outspoken members of the Republican right, ran successful campaigns in 1986 so the outlook could be bright for Morris.

In his three campaigns for Bernalillo County Commissioner, he ran as James P. "Corky" Morris. A campaign consultant has likely told him that the nickname could be helpful in a crowded race to gain easier name recognition. Maybe it makes a conservative Republican look a little less stuffy, also.

Morris, Stahl and Pete Domenici were all three good friends and fraternity brothers at the University of New Mexico in the mid-50s. All three went by nicknames back then. I'll resist the temptation, just now, to reveal the names the latter two dropped when they made the decision to run for office.

Morris served as Domenici's campaign manager when Pete ran unsuccessfully for governor against Bruce King in 1970. Since then, Morris moved a bit to the right in the GOP and is no longer counted in Domenici's camp.

Although unannounced, Morris has been traveling the state since last spring rounding up supporters. He appears to be the best organized and best staffed of the senate challengers and has very likely raised the most bucks.

The final candidate, who has told everyone who asks he has firm intentions of running, is District Attorney Steve Schiff from Albuquerque. Schiff wants to get through the 1988 Legislature without being classified as a candidate. He is banking on his access to the Albuquerque media as being the plus to give him a boost over the other challengers.

## Editorial

The Ruidoso Village Council lost a voice of reason when Ray Dean Carpenter resigned Tuesday.

Carpenter, elected in March 1984, was nearing the end of his first four-year term when he submitted his resignation letter to the mayor. He said as Grand Master of Masons of New Mexico he is "finding it more difficult to devote the time necessary to remain an effective councillor." Carpenter was among the first six-member council elected, after a referendum initiated the increased size and a whole new election. He was the fourth-highest vote-getter with 567.

For the past three and a half years, Carpenter has taken his place at the very end of the council table, to the mayor's far right. He has been an advocate for the orderly process of going about the business of government. When discussions over pending action turned into never-ending merry-go-rounds; Carpenter was prone to say, "I call for the question," getting the show back on the road.

That commitment to an orderly government led Carpenter more than once to call for strict adherence to village policies—from personnel rules and regulations to guidelines for timeshare booths. He was quick to stand up for village staff, and unyielding in his refusal to expose personnel matters in a public forum.

A fiscal conservative, Carpenter's was the voice that always asked, "do we have the money?" when a proposed purchase or expenditure was up for consideration. When it came time to cut the budget, the non-sense Carpenter was the one that took out his red pencil and said "let's cut" this and this and this.

Never one for quick decisions, Carpenter was the councillor most likely to call for tabling action if all the information wasn't available for review, or setting an early morning workshop to iron out a problem as speedily as possible.

One didn't have to agree with Councillor Carpenter's stands on issues before the village governing body to appreciate his integrity and stability. He has been willing to stand up for his beliefs, whether in the minority or majority on a given issue.

The council table had one empty chair on Tuesday, and the council was diminished by the loss of a clear-headed and logical member.

Councillor Carpenter will be missed.—fj

Being first certainly must feel good—I've seen it in the eyes of long-distance runners as they burst across the finish line, breaking the ribbon.

I've photographed a fisher holding up the "longest fish" and a hunter with the head of a deer with the "most points." It's important

for the world to know about a personal achievement in whatever area of skill.

Even reading can be measured. When I was a kid, my mom's first question after the first day of school was always: "Are you in the 'top' reading group?" I'd answer, smugly, "Of course."

I plead guilty to a small streak of that competitive spirit—I hope it's not an obsession. But, sometimes I wonder—like when I challenged Gary Brown to photograph the same subject I did, so we could submit both pictures and let Darrell use "the best."

Or when we're making our list of assignments for an upcoming edition, and I feel compelled to make my list the "longest."

My best friend, a coach and naturally competitive, recalled that when her second child was born she had high hopes of having the "first baby" of that year. That little girl made it into the world just after midnight of a January 2, but her mom was watching that clock and striving for first.

When I learned that members of my daughter's school choir must all learn 100 songs this school year, my first words were: "Get busy Bethany, I sure want you to be first." But Bethany, not sharing my compulsion, smiled sweetly and answered, "Oh, yeah?"

So, what's my point? I guess I'm trying to remind myself and lots of others out there with high hopes and healthy expectations that it's nice to be first, but somebody has to be second.

There's something to be said for giving it all you've got and doing your very best, just for your own satisfaction, and not for any blue ribbon or other prize.

Let's not be obsessed with winning for the sake of winning.


