Assistant DA discharged after failing to dismiss

District Attorney (DA) James Weldon said Friday he terminated former assistant DA Harry Wilcox Jr. for failure to carry out his order to dismiss a case involving the United States Forest Service (USFS).

Wilcox said Friday he was terminated over an article in The News where he described a "vision" from God that led him to refuse to dismiss charges of trespassing against the USFS and two USFS employees.

"That (the vision) also contributed to it," said Weldon, stressing the termination was primarily over the prosecutor's unwillingness to carry out his order.

The case began with a citizen's arrest by Carrizozo rancher Carolyn Leitzman, and became embroiled in a jurisdictional dispute among courts. Weldon said last week the point had been made over the trespassing, and the petty misdemeanor case didn't merit the large amount of time it would take to continue.

That's when he ordered his assistant to dismiss the case.

But Wilcox sent Weldon a letter asking him to reconsider. He also described to The News a vision that came to him in a dream:

"I was standing in front of a fiery furnace. I saw three people who identified themselves as Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. They told me they had been in the fiery furnace and asked me what I was going to do ... they asked me if I would bow."

Wilcox said he woke up and read the story in the Old Testament before deciding not to dismiss the case "even though I may be cast into a fiery furnace."

While he didn't deny either his vision or his statements of last week, Wilcox said Friday he told a reporter for The El Paso Times his statements may have been misconstrued or taken out of context.

"That vision was more in line with the federal government than it was Weldon," explained Wilcox.

"I'm going to ask for a hearing to explain my side of the story," said Wilcox. He said he'll ask Weldon to think of some other form of punishment.

Weldon said Friday he'll name a new assistant later this week, adding he has two experienced people in mind for the job.

Ernie Mills will receive the Annual New Mexico Excellence in Journalism Award at a banquet and "roast" Saturday, November 21, at Cree Meadows Country Club.

Mills, one of New Mexico's foremost radio and television political analysts, is being honored for his work in the category of "Syndicated Broadcast Columnist."

Mills has been a journalist since 1949, when he was a reporter for the New York Herald. He came to New Mexico in 1957 where he continued his career. Today, Mills broadcasts three times daily throughout the state via 30 radio stations and has a half hour television program, shown on the New Mexico Public Television Network.

Mills' distinguished career includes duty as a war correspondent during Vietnam in 1968, and serving as the only acting negotiator during the New Mexico State Penitentiary riot in 1980. Mills is known for the Ernie Mills Legislative Report and the Capitol Observer, which are considered must reading for those who follow legislative and governmental activities in the State Capitol, according to a press release from the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

The chamber has created this annual award to honor

those journalists in New Mexico who have shown overall excellence in their journalistic careers. Mills is the initial recipient of this award. The statewide committee, selecting the 1988 honoree, will be named at the roast Saturday.

Zoning ordinance final? revision faces public today

After three years on the drawing board, a proposed zoning ordinance will be reviewed in a public hearing at 6:30 p.m. today (Monday), November 16, in council chambers of the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

Monday's hearing will be the final review before the zoning ordinance is considered by the Ruidoso Village Council. The meeting could be next to the last chance for members of the public to provide input.

When the zoning ordinance is adopted it will be in conjunction with a zoning map and a comprehensive plan prepared by BRW planners under a contract with the village. Planning administrator Margaret McDonald Lahey said Friday the master plan prepared for the Ruidoso Municipal Airport land may also be adopted at that time.

Members of the Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) had one last look at the zoning proposal during a workshop on Friday, and Chairman David Smith reminded the group that the proposal has been considered and reconsidered over the past few years.

"I've been in on this exact meeting ... the last revision ... about 17 times," noted Smith, in recommending commissioners "not belabor" various points of contention. Smith is the only member of the present nine-member commission who has been on P&Z through much of the drafting and review of the new zoning document.

Commissioners Robert Donaldson and Candyce Garrett were just appointed to P&Z last Tuesday, with Friday's workshop their first meeting. Lahey distributed copies of changes made at the last review session.

Commissioner John White, who has offered a list of proposed changes to the document in several past meetings, again offered his list for consideration on Friday.

"I don't know why it is that everything I recommend nobody has the time to do it, or else I'm belaboring it," complained White.

P&Z waded through the list Friday, scratching one item after another from inclusion, and learning that several of the recommendations were incorporated in Lahey's hand-out.

White preferred "planning and zoning" rather than "zoning" ordinance, but Lahey disagreed. Lahey said planning is an umbrella term, while zoning is not.

Commissioners turned thumbs down on White's suggestion to call the planning administrator the "P&Z" administrator. "I am a planner," said Lahey, adding the designation P&Z is "antiquated."

Commissioners discussed off-street parking regulations for residential areas, with concerns voiced over large equipment, propane trucks and horse trailers parked on residential streets. The zoning ordinance to be considered today would limit the size of trucks parked in residential neighborhoods to 5,500 pounds.

"I'm talking aesthetics," said White, whose recommendations included a proposal that no permanent off-street parking be allowed in single family residential areas. Other commissioners voiced a variety of concerns over such strict limitations. Lahey said the ban might be construed to prohibit residents from "reasonable use of property."

A variety of enforcement issues were addressed, with Lahey explaining that much of the enforcement is included in the municipal code rather than in the zoning ordinance. White asked that the municipal code be referenced throughout the zoning ordinance, but Lahey said that would be a problem because the applicable sections are scattered throughout the code.

"The public isn't going to come in and read this," noted Lahey, explaining that complaints are handled by staffers who identify the sections for the citizens.

It was finally agreed that a policy statement be drafted to explain the relationship of the zoning ordinance to the municipal code.

"Historically, one of the problems on P&Z has been passing the buck," said White, critical of the lack of enforcement. Lahey said the building inspector is the enforcement officer, while she is charged with running the Planning Department.

Commissioner Eddie Nichols disagreed with White's contention that the village, over the past five years, "hasn't had a building inspector that's doing his job." Nichols said what the building inspector does is a matter of

public record. White continued to press from monthly activity reports from the building inspector, with the rest of the commission saying information should come through the planning administrator in her monthly report. White reminded the commission of his request for a closed meeting to discuss the building inspector, and was told P&Z has no authority to go into executive session. "If we discuss personnel at a public meeting we can be sued for a violation of civil rights," added Lahey. "If you have a personnel problem you can take it to the Village Council," advised Donaldson.

White also disagreed with allowing churches, day-care centers and public buildings as conditional uses in residential areas, but the commission left those provisions in the proposal. "So anybody who builds a house here is out of his fern," noted White. As the meeting was ended, White thanked the commission for "giving consideration to a minority viewpoint." Also Friday, Lahey announced she'll be resigning as planning administrator effective December 23. She recommended P&Z ask that the next administrator have a master's degree in planning and one year's experience. She said the office also needs a full-time secretary. Copies of the proposed ordinance are available for review at Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

On Highway 37

Village reminded of state requirements

Work undertaken by village crews on State Highway 37 at the corner of Cree Meadows Drive didn't pass muster with the state inspector. Tim Basler of the State Highway Department in Roswell said he was passing through Ruidoso recently and noticed village crews building a turning lane in the northbound side of State Highway 37, which is also Mechem Drive. Although the project was on state right of way, it hadn't been authorized through the

engineering office in Roswell, said Basler. "Anytime you do improvements to a state highway you need to get permission," said Basler. Village manager Frank Potter was unavailable for comment early today (Monday), and Infrastructure Division director Becky Durham said she was on vacation when the work was undertaken. Durham said she hadn't been briefed on exactly what took place, but knew Potter had been working for

some time to improve conditions at the heavily traveled intersection. An inspection of the project revealed the lane didn't meet state specifications. Basler said it was too narrow and had almost a vertical drop-off on one side. "That was a real unsafe situation," said Basler. He said he then worked with Potter to have the turn lane redone, including drainage structures. Basler said his office is always willing to work with a municipality to get

such projects accomplished, but state roads must be constructed to state specifications. Basler said the State Highway Department takes on the responsibility and liability for the safe design of state roads. "We still have a good working relationship with the village," said Basler. He said he simply reminded Potter of State Highway Department policies.

School board moves to solve high school water leaks

The Ruidoso Board of Education voted Wednesday night to contact the architects of the high school and ask that they do something about the water leaks, particularly the bad leak in the shop building. "We are highly upset, and will have to take some action," board member Don Swalander stated. Another alternative was to initiate a lawsuit against the architects or contractors, but the board decided to approach them in a letter first. "It's been a good thing this hasn't been a rainy autumn," commented Superintendent Sid Miller. The board heard reports from the various village schools about the results of recent parent-teacher meetings. Roger Sowder, principal of Nob Hill Elementary, said he had 282 parents or guardians of the 305 kindergartners and first-graders show up for conferences. "That's 92 percent," said Sowder. "We feel as if the parents have made a very conscientious effort in this respect." White Mountain Elementary School Principal Frank Cannella reported that 92 percent of his

students' parents showed up for their conferences. "These conferences are one of the most positive things about the school system," said Cannella. "It's a good chance for the exchange of ideas and concerns." White Mountain Intermediate Principal Don Weems had an 88 percent turnout, which is 264 parents of 300 students. "I have to say, I really appreciate local businesses giving these parents time out to attend the conferences," Weems stated. There was no parent-teacher conference at the Middle School, since the students there have many teachers every day. However, principal Texanita Cole said that she would be studying High School principal Tom Hansen's results of his newly instituted idea of having parents show up at an Open House, without appointment, to pick up their child's report card and chat with the teachers. Hansen said that his experimental parent-teacher conference open house was "a very positive experience. But if we do this again next year, we are going to have to schedule breaks for the teachers. I saw some of them still carrying

their sack lunches around with them at four p.m." Hansen said although there were no appointments made between parents and teachers, there seemed to be a steady flow, and "it paced itself beautifully." He reported that he had a 55-60 percent visitation rate, and that he would like to do it again at report card time after the third nine-week school period. "I've heard some very good and appreciative comments about this open house," stated Associate Superintendent Michael Gladden. The school ski program at Ski Apache has been moved from Wednesday to Tuesday, at the request of the ski resort. "Wednesday is, essentially, the weekend to their employees," explained Superintendent Miller. "Tuesday is the end of the weekend, and Thursday is the beginning of the weekend for them, so they asked us if we could switch to enable their people to take time off." The board approved the change. Pam Anderson, school nurse, made a presentation concerning her library of films and videos that she has acquired. "Some of the films are on hygiene," she reported. "Occasionally we will get

a report of a child who does not understand the importance of cleanliness. Then it's beneficial to show the entire class a film on hygiene, rather than single out one or two children." "Sounds like you're really cleaning up," quipped board member Swalander. Anderson stated that there are some "eye opening" situations in the high school this year, including young people who have had epileptic and diabetic seizures in class. "We need video resources to help the teachers understand these situations, since I am a half-time person and cannot be in more than one place at once," she said. Anderson, who was singled out for her conscientiousness by the State Department of Education evaluators last month, was thanked by the board for her presentation. Don Weems presented a paper suggesting how to make the busing system safer and more efficient based on his exit conference with Gilbert Perea last month. The board also accepted the resignation of James Hofstad, High School Special Education instructor, effective in December.

Mule races back on with help from Lions

The Ruidoso Valley Noon Lions Club will co-sponsor the mule races in 1988 with the Ruidoso Downs Muleskinners. After it was announced earlier this year that plans for a 1988 mule race were questionable due to lack of support, the Noon Lions opted to take on the project with the Muleskinners. It will be the eighth year the races are run in the Ruidoso area. Events include mule races, miniature races, balloon busts and other contests involving the long-eared speedsters.

With the Lions' help, the Muleskinners are expecting bigger and better races and greater attendance. The Ruidoso High School chapter of the Distributive Education Club of America (DECA) and the Ruidoso Shrine Club will continue their roles in the event. Proceeds from the mule races go to charity, with the Lions' sight conservation, drug awareness programs, youth activities and scholarships benefiting next year. The race tentatively has been scheduled for the weekend after Labor Day.

Swenor gives police overview at Oct. meeting of AARP

Six minutes is the maximum amount of time it takes for Ruidoso police to respond to an emergency call, according to Sgt. Dick Swenor, speaker for the October meeting of the Lincoln County Chapter of the American Association of Retired Persons. Sgt. Swenor, formerly chief of police in Ruidoso, introduced the new chief of police, William (Bill) Newman, who recently moved here from Dallas, Texas. The 12 uniformed patrol officers of the Ruidoso police cover a jurisdiction of 40 square miles and are on call for a 12,000-15,000 service population in the area. They also cover 220 miles of roadway, according to Sgt. Swenor. Domestic problems constitute the biggest number of police calls in Ruidoso, Swenor stated, but the police are always available for any emergency, and citizens should not hesitate to call. The Ruidoso police have a 30 per-

cent success rating in solving local burglaries, as compared to a 20-21 percent success rate nationwide, Swenor said, emphasizing that knowing your household inventory is helpful in case of robbery. He also stressed that citizens should call the police when observing suspicious actions and not try to take care of situations themselves. Swenor stated that harassing phone calls are a felony in the state of New Mexico and should be reported to the police. During the business meeting, the date for the next meeting was set for Tuesday, November 24. A report from the nominating committee named the following officers-elect: President, Don Services; Vice-President, Virginia Meyer; Secretary, Sally Avery; and Treasurer, Katie Sue Harmon. Bill Rawlins announced that the next "55 Alive-Safe Driving Session" will be offered November 16 and 17 from 10-noon and 1-3 p.m.

The Ruidoso High School varsity volleyball team's competition in the state AAA-division tournament came to a quick end Friday morning when the Warriors lost to Kirtland Central in three games at Roswell High School.

Kirtland Central won the quarter-final match, 15-13, 15-11, 15-5. It went on to lose to eventual champion Goddard in three games in the semi-finals.

The loss was almost as frustrating for Ruidoso as the five-game loss to Deming in the District 3-AAA title match last week.

The first game was close all the way with neither team having more than a two-point lead until the end.

Senior Shannon Lee and Amy Richardson supplied some excellent spiking in the match as Ruidoso took 12-10 and then, 13-11, leads.

But then the consistent Kirtland

Central squad scored four straight points for the game victory.

The Warriors came on strong in the early part of the second game, determined to even the score.

Despite the loss, Arthur is optimistic about the Warriors' future. And with good reason.

Tidmore, also a junior, was named on the honorable mention list.

"The majority of our players are returning next season," Arthur remarked. "And they will have good playoff experience."

"We should be strong next season. The kids are hungry. We should have a lot of depth. I was really pleased with the play of Amy

Richardson. She's only a sophomore." The Warriors finished the season with an 11-7 overall record. The Warriors were 7-1 in district regular-season action.


Senior Clint Bob was the leading Warrior runner, finishing 28th.

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—I'm going way out on a limb and predicting that George Bush will win the New Mexico Republican primary election seven months hence and will proceed from there to win his party's nomination for the presidency.

Bush has many factors going for him at this point. He got an early start despite having to put his campaign on hold during the Iran-Contra hearings.

He is well organized both nationally and in New Mexico. He is the best organized candidate in the state for either party's presidential primary. With people in his corner such as Colin McMillan, Aubrey Cookman, Rep. Manuel Lujan and Rep. Joe Skeen, Bush is off and running.

The vice-president has already been to New Mexico to raise money and meet many of his volunteers. He is well ahead of his opposition nationally in the all-important fundraising game.

Bush is an experienced campaigner, having given Ronald Reagan a tough race in 1980. Some of Reagan's backers still haven't forgiven Bush for some of his comments such as the voodoo economics controversy, but most have been very impressed with Bush's loyalty to the president.

Reagan's "11th Commandment" efforts to keep the Republican presidential candidates from beating on each other should work to Bush's advantage more than any other candidate if, in fact, the efforts do work. The first Republican debate among the presidential candidates was a lively affair with everyone but Bob Dole getting in their licks.

Bush's attacks were in self defense but they were most effective, especially in responding to some of Pierre dePont's barbs.

Reagan also benefits personally if the other candidates lay off Bush since the veep is in the position of defending the administration.

The vice-president, as a candidate, is able to combine business with campaigning. The line between where one starts and the other stops always seems to be hazy enough to lead to arguments but little else.

History is also on the vice-president's side. Every time this century that a vice-president has wanted to make a run for the presidency, his party, whichever it be, has always been willing to oblige by giving him the nomination. That might work even more strongly in

Bush's favor with such a big field of candidates.

On the negative side of the ledger, Bush faces some possible dangerous pitfalls. Everyone targets the front-runner and the first Republican presidential debate was a perfect example.

In uncharacteristic style, Dole appeared to be the peacemaker and tension reliever. As the second strongest in the race, Dole may have felt he could let the other four candidates go after Bush and remain somewhat above it all, himself. Or, maybe he was just relieved he wasn't the one on the hot seat.

Since Alexander Haig is leading a rather successful effort to make toughness the major campaign issue this year, Dole needs to worry that his performance isn't seen as too laid back.

Haig has been brutal to Bush on the toughness issue. He turned the "loyalty to the president" virtue, which Bush proudly drove home to a cheering audience, around on the vice-president by offering that loyalty is not always telling the boss what he wants to hear.

But the sharpest attack by Haig was when he found a way to get the wimp issue before the audience.

Haig opposes the prospective treaty to ban intermediate weapons. Bush accused him of supporting the same idea in 1982.

Haig replied, "If you recall, I fought it like the bloody death but I never heard a wimp out of you."

The wimp issue is Bush's biggest problem. If it catches on, he's in trouble. The veep also must guard against a major blunder that could come from trying to appear too much of a macho man.

If Bush doesn't stumble badly and if there are no Iran-Contra surprises, his superior organization and money should prevail in the New Mexico primary and at the Republican National Convention, next summer.

I am still not predicting a Bush victory in the general election a year from now. It is still too early. The Democrat candidates still have a long way to go before we even know the front-runner. Either party is capable of choosing a candidate who will self-destruct.

And history has not been as favorable to vice-presidents in general elections. How many can you name who have succeeded directly to the presidency through the elective process?
