## Season open with skiing 'excellent'

New Mexico skiers may have been giving thanks on Thursday for machine-made snow.

Ski Apache general manager Roy Parker said 800 skiers took advantage of the first day of skiing on Thanksgiving Day Thursday. And those skiers found four lifts and all the lower slopes open, thanks to Ski Apache's sophisticated snowmaking equipment.

"We've probably got the best skiing in the state," said Parker. He said calls to other ski resorts revealed that they, too, are awaiting the first big snowfall of the season.

Parker said his crews are still making snow everynight and grooming and "fluffing up" trails everyday. He estimated "a couple of thousand" skiers were on the mountain Friday.

"Just keep hoping snow," advised Parker.

Area ski shop owners, geared up for a big weekend, are hoping for just that—lots of natural snow. Most shop operators said business was a little slow for the season opening, but picking up on Friday.


"I think we had a pretty good day for the snow we have," said Slover Cape, owner of A-Frame Ski Rentals.

Myra Taylor of Mountain Ski Shop said business was "fair" Thursday. "There are some people skiing," said Taylor.

"They say the snow is really wonderful on the part that's open. Skiers say they are having a really good time," she added.

"The skiing was excellent," said News business manager Rolland Ramos, one of those skiers who took advantage of the uncrowded slopes on Thanksgiving Day.

## Final steps under way for airport opening Tuesday

Today is moving day for the Ruidoso Municipal Airport.

After years of work by hundreds of groups and individuals, the dream of a safer regional air field on Fort Stanton Mesa will become a reality when the first plane lands Tuesday, December 1.

"We're ready to go," said airport manager Tim Morris after the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport paving passed a final inspection by Federal Aviation Administration

officials last Wednesday. "Everything's perfect," added Morris.

He said some equipment, the tower and fuel tanks have been moved, and fuel trucks and telephones are scheduled to be relocated today. For all practical purposes airport operations will be in place at the regional facility on Fort Stanton Mesa Tuesday morning. Visitors to the old municipal airport will find a sign on the door directing them to the new airport.

Morris said temporary buildings will be in place this week for use by

airport administration and car rental agencies. He said he'll work with other airport users to get all planes moved to the new facility. Tiedown lessees will be asked to move as soon as possible, and efforts will be made to provide space for hangar users within the next few months.

"We're going to work with people," said Morris. He expects air charter operations to begin using the new airport immediately.

Plans are being formed for a grand opening celebration toward the middle of December.

## New Councillor Jess Stinson is positive about Ruidoso

"I have a positive attitude," said Councillor Jess Stinson with a big smile.

The latest appointee to the Ruidoso Village Council, Stinson took a few moments on Friday to talk about himself and his new role on the council.

And "positive" is the keyword to describe the new councillor's philosophies—he's positive that Ruidoso will grow and prosper, and he calls on village citizens to have a positive attitude.

"The bottom line would be an attitude adjustment for Ruidoso," said Stinson who foresees a future

with Ruidoso as "the resort town of New Mexico."

Stinson, a Lubbock, Texas, builder, developer and real estate broker for 22 years, moved permanently to Ruidoso five years ago. He had been visiting the area for years, and four years before his move invested in Ruidoso property. While in a family real estate business in Lubbock, Stinson served on the state legislative committee that oversees the real estate industry and was president of the Certified Residential Specialists of West Texas.

Stinson grew up in Paducah, Texas, and served in the U.S. Army for three and a half years. He farmed and ranched for nine years in the

vicinity of Rotan, Texas, before going into the real-estate business in Lubbock in 1962.

The Stinsons developed Raintree and Iris Gardens in Lubbock.

Before his appointment to the council, Stinson served on the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission, but as a Texas developer he said he had lots of experience "on the other side of that fence."

"I see some really positive things happening," said Stinson, stressing his pro-growth philosophy for Ruidoso. He said the opening of the regional airport "on time" is one indicator of the many good things in

## Minnie Miller at 91:

### 'I try to eat right, to stay healthy and to live for the Lord as best I can'

Minnie Jones Miller, who turns 91 today, has only one secret for a happy life: "Live for Jesus."

Miller, who resides in a tiny old-fashioned white frame house on Begonia Street that she and her husband moved into in 1978, was born on November 30, 1896, in the Sand Mountains in Alabama, daughter of an Irish father and Catawba Indian mother. "I had three brothers and four sisters," she remembers. "I'm the only one left from my original family."

But she's not the only one left of the family she began with her husband, Arthur S. Miller, in 1914. She is mother of three, grandmother of 10, great-grandmother of 18 and great-great-grandmother of three, "so far."

When asked what the high point of her 91 years has been, she answers without hesitation, "my marriage." It lasted 65 years, until Arthur's death in Ruidoso in 1979.

The couple met in school and married in Minnie's home. "I wore a long white satin gown, it was the prettiest thing," she recalls. For a time they lived in Brownwood, Texas, and then moved on to Sweetwater—in a covered wagon. "It took us a full week to travel the 350 miles," she remembers. "Cars were passing us by, but we made the trip by wagon. We slept in it, and everything. I can still remember the little colt that came with us, jumping in between the big horses when cars came by, then my husband would have to untangle everybody."

The family lived on a large farm for seven years, where Minnie helped cook. "I didn't know beans from buttermilk," she confesses, laughing. Later they moved to Tulia, Texas, where they farmed.

"I love farm life," she said. "I love living here, too. The First Baptist Church sends me over the Girls' Auxiliary. There's about 20 of them, I am their 'adopted Grandma.' When they come here, they laugh and sing—it's the sweetest noise." She is proud of her Adopted Grandma status. "The world is not so big that you can't help somebody," she says.

One of the highlights of her life was her 50th wedding celebration in 1964. Mrs. Miller is cheerful and energetic and doesn't appear to be 91 years old. "I guess I am, though," she says. "Look, I got a birthday card from the President and his wife. I wonder who could have sent them my name?"

She broke her leg in 1980 and now spends most of her time sitting in her rocking chair. "I still sew, though, and crochet, and I like to look at TV." The Millers had two sons, Paul and Arlis, and one daughter, Margaret Hutson. Paul was killed during World War II while in the Army. He had been taken prisoner of war on a ship outside the Philippines; the Red Cross had been removed from the ship, and U.S. forces bombed it.

Arlis lives in Durango, Colorado, and Margaret lives next-door to Minnie on Begonia Street.

While Mrs. Miller leads a good Christian life, she still finds time now and then to play Bingo at the Lion's Club—and she wins. She was trained to be a nurse in her younger days, and was also a milliner, "back when ladies wore beautiful hats."

What was the secret of her happy marriage? "We worked together," she says, emphasizing the word "together." "And we had lots of friends." She still hears from many of them, including one friend who just celebrated her 100th birthday.

"I try to eat right, to stay healthy and to live for the Lord as best I can," she offers as a recipe for life.

Mrs. Miller is chatty; she loves to talk and visit. "There are no strangers," she explains thoughtfully.

When a visitor remarks that it's hard to believe Minnie is 91, that "she doesn't look a day over 75," a blush comes to her cheeks. "Aw, go on," she says playfully.

store for Ruidoso.

## Fitzner on China trip:

### 'I have never known such hospitality before'

Shirlene Fitzner, Postmistress of the Ruidoso Downs Post Office, and her husband, Julius, retired from the Tucumcari Post Office, were among 84 people who toured China recently under the auspices of People to People, headquartered in Spokane, Washington.

Of the 84 people in the group, 62 were postmasters from all across America. The tour was sponsored by the National Association of Postmasters. The purpose of the event was to tour postal facilities and offer advice.

"This was the first time postmasters toured China, and it was very exciting," reported Fitzner. "We had to pay our own way, which was something like four or five thousand dollars apiece, and we had to take leave time. We

weren't granted any special time off. But it was worth it. I would go back in a minute."

The Fitzners toured Beijing, Nanjing, Yangzhou, Shanghai and Fuzhou on their whirlwind tour, which included stops at post offices in each city. "The neat thing is that each city was different from the rest," Fitzner recalls. "They weren't all alike. I have to say, though, that Nanjing seemed to have a special feeling of friendliness."

The Fitzners, the only people from New Mexico on the trip, visited the Great Wall of China and the main tombs in Beijing, and also the university there. "The main thing there is education, they don't specialize in sports," Fitzner explained. "To work in the post office in China, you have to have a college education." The Chinese call their post office "postal

telecommunications."

Beijing, which used to be called Peking, is a large city with tall buildings. "You've never seen so many bicycles in one place," said Fitzner. "We went to the opera there. I've never seen anything like it—the voices, the costumes. It was grand."

Yangzhou is a small town, and when the visitors arrived at the post office, the employees lined up and waved flags to greet them. "One of the women in our group brought along some balloons with the puppy 'love stamp' on them," Fitzner said. "The Chinese just loved those."

The group traveled by air, and the trip took around 15 hours. Once in China the visitors used other means of public transportation, like trains and a ferry boat, which took them across the Yangtze River. "It's huge, you can't see the other

side. Just like going across the wide Missouri," Fitzner commented.

They went to Buddhist temples, an acrobat show, and got to watch a little Chinese television. "They had exercise programs on," said Fitzner. "Tai chi and karate are popular martial arts in China."

The Fitzners bought presents for their friends and family, mainly jade, ivory and lacquerware.

The postal employees were given commemorative envelopes and stamps by the Chinese, and also Chinese mailbags. "At our final banquet, one Chinese postmaster remarked, 'I have never seen as many smiling Americans before,'" Fitzner remembered. "We were given a standing ovation. But you know, we were welcomed everywhere. Everyone we met was nice and friendly, and interested in us. I have never known such hospitality before."

## Mid School students to match wits across nation

Ruidoso students will pit their academic skills against those of students throughout the nation in the National Knowledge Master Open academic contest on Wednesday, December 2.

A team of seventh-, eighth- and ninth-graders will face 200 challenging questions from all curriculum areas using a special com-

puter disk that enables teams to compete from their home sites, without the expense and disruption of traveling to a contest. Students' scores are compiled by the computer based on speed and accuracy.

Academic coaches Jackie Branum, Lindy Lott, Diorly Stierwalt, Mike Crocker and Dean Hood expect their students will do even

better this year than last, when Ruidoso took second in the state, and placed in the upper half of the nation. Last year was the first time for Ruidoso students to take part in the National Knowledge Master Open.

More than 2,000 schools are expected to enter the upcoming contest. Last April's eighth edition of

the event involved some 27,000 students in 1,896 schools spread over all 50 states and Canada.

Results of the Knowledge Master Open are tabulated into national, state and enrollment-size rankings by Academic Hallmarks, the software publisher that coordinates the event.

## Mescalero court to hear claims by candidate Via

A request to nullify the November 3 election in Mescalero will be heard Wednesday, December 9, by the Mescalero Election Board.

Joseph Via, a candidate for the office of president, protested the election soon after results were tabulated. He lost the vote to incumbent President Wendell Chino, 537-290.

Via alleges the election took place under incorrect polling hours and other irregularities in the voting process.

Election Board Chairperson Elizabeth LaPaz notified Via in a letter that the hearing will take place at 1:30 p.m. in the community center, at which time Via "will be given an opportunity to present a

factual basis of (his) claim."

The Election Board will meet after the hearing to review the facts, but LaPaz did not specify when the board will issue its written finding, other than assuring Via a prompt delivery of the ruling.

To an assertion by LaPaz that the board's decision is final according to tribal law, Via responded in a letter: "My willingness to participate in the hearing must not be misconstrued as an agreement on my part as to the Mescalero Election Board's interpretation of the pertinent provisions of the tribal code."

Via served on the Mescalero Tribal Council for eight years.

## Highway cycle accident injures Roswell students

Two New Mexico Military Institute students were injured Tuesday when the motorcycle they were riding slid through the "Y" on U.S. Highway 70.

Police said Paul Schmidt, 19, of River Falls, Wisconsin, was westbound on Highway 70 on a 1984 Honda when the traffic light changed from yellow to red. He applied the rear brakes, which reportedly "locked up" causing the vehicle to go down and slide for 60 feet across the intersection.

Schmidt told police he was unfamiliar with the road and didn't know about the upcoming traffic signal. He said the glare of the sun made it difficult to see the light, so he attempted to shield his eyes with

one hand, and discovered the light was turning red.

The statements of a passenger, Matthew Mitsui, 19, of Hawaii, and a witness, Jeff Fuller, were essentially the same as the driver's, according to police.

Medical aid was rendered at the scene by Emergency Medical Services, and both Schmidt and Mitsui were transported by ambulance to Lincoln County Medical Center where they were treated and released, according to a hospital spokesman.

Schmidt was cited for no drivers license in possession and failure to show proof of mandatory insurance, said police.




Governor Garrey Carruthers recently announced the appointment of Dr. Terry T. Marquardt of Ruidoso to the state Board of Optometry.

## Editorial

The success of this winter's ski season, to some extent, is under the control of each of us.

## Inside the Capitol by Jay Miller

**SANTA FE**—Rep. Leonard Sheffield's change in party registration from Democrat to Republican evens the score at 2-2 in recent legislative switches.

Sheffield chose Gov. Garrey Carruthers' Government Day in Alamogordo on Nov. 18 to both announce the switch and to ceremonially execute the paperwork to effect the change as Carruthers looked on.

Sheffield says his philosophy and values fit more comfortably into the Republican party and he is right. His son Larry served alongside him for two terms as a Republican Representative from Las Cruces. In spite of the party affiliation difference, the two seldom split their votes.

Larry gave up his seat to move back home to Alamogordo and help out his father in a thriving furniture business. Possibly Larry had some influence on Dad's decision to make the party switch.

Sheffield should have no problem being reelected as a Republican. His major problem had been getting through the Democrat primary election. In the 1986 primary, Sheffield prevailed by two votes after a recount.

The party switch will have no effect upon control of the House of Representatives since Sheffield was one of the "coalition Democrats," who voted with the Republicans on selection of the House Speaker.

It was Rep. Max Coll who got this spate of party switcheroos started back in January of 1983. A former Republican Representative from Roswell in the early 1970s, Coll twice ran successfully as a Republican in heavily Democrat Santa Fe County in the early 1980s.

As the 1983 Legislature was about to convene, it appeared that there would be an even split between Democrats and a Republican-Democrat coalition for organization of the House of Representatives. Coll chose that time to announce his switch from Republican to Democrat.

As with Sheffield, Coll made his announcement in the presence of the newly-elected governor—Tony Anaya. Coll's wife had worked hard in Anaya's election campaign and had been rewarded with a position as the environmental advisor on Anaya's staff, so Anaya and Coll were reasonably close.

Max was rewarded by the Democrats with the chairmanship of the powerful House Taxation and Revenue Committee. Many Santa Fe County Democrats were not quite as excited about welcoming Max with open arms. They mounted a stiff

challenge in the 1984 primary election.

Republican opposition to Coll was fierce in both 1984 and 1986. The GOP knew that in addition to Coll winning that seat as a Republican, Frank Bond had also represented that district as a Republican.

Max had done a big favor for the GOP in the 1982 legislative reapportionment. He belonged to the coalition which controlled the House at that time, so he could design his new district to make Republican victories a bit easier in the future.

The result was an intriguing hourglass-shaped district which snakes through downtown Santa Fe to grab the city's two silk-stocking areas in the North Hills and southeast subdivisions.

The other two party switches were in the evenly-divided Senate since that body was last elected. Sen. Les Houston made the change following his election as President Pro Tem by a Republican-Democrat coalition.

Senate Democrats were not inclined to treat Houston too nicely following his defection, so Les came out of the closet and made himself an official Republican. That gave the GOP a 22-20 edge in the Senate but it didn't change control since the Republicans already had it.

That change came a year later, in 1986, when four Senate Republicans sided with Democrats in ousting Houston and returning Sen. Ike Smalley to the Pro Tem position.

The resultant ostracizing of these four Senators by their party leadership caused one of them, Bill Vandergriff of Alamogordo to change his registration to Democrat later that year.

The other three Republican Senators—Jim Martin of Socorro, John Budagher of Albuquerque and Jack Morgan of Farmington—continued to vote with the Democrats on organizational matters but have remained in the Republican party.

That could change before long as rumor has it that Jim Martin is considering the switch. Martin was recently excluded from a Republican caucus, which was choosing a floor leader to replace U.S. Senate candidate, Bill Valentine.

Martin arrived at the caucus with proxies to cast for Budagher and Morgan. Although Senate Republicans have been tight-lipped about what happened behind closed doors, apparently the three were willing to support Houston for floor leader but not for President Pro Tem.

That reluctance was enough to oust Martin from the caucus and, according to Martin, from all future caucuses.






