Have an idea for airport land? Attend meeting Tues.

Members of the public will have a chance to speak on future uses for the Ruidoso Municipal Airport land during a public hearing at the regular council meeting at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, December 8, in council chambers of the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

During previous presentations by Architectural Research Consultants (ARC), the planning firm hired to draft a master plan for the 160-acre tract, uses as varied as an amphitheater and parks to a drag strip or mud bog tract have been discussed. The consultants, after the last meetings, have drafted a master plan to be reviewed Tuesday by the council.

An executive summary of the proposed plan has been prepared and is available in the Planning Department at the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center. The Master Plan will be the subject of a workshop at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, December 8, in council chambers. That meeting, too, is open to the public. Expected to be present at the workshop are ARC staff, members of the council, airport advisory board committee members, Planning and Zoning commissioners, representatives from the Parks and Recreation Committee, the Economic Development Bureau of Lincoln County, the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce and the Convention and

Visitors Bureau. The executive summary set for discussion is divided into introduction/goals, inventory/analysis of conditions, natural conditions, man-made conditions and market assessment. The planning context established in the document includes the following notes:
—160 acres situated in the center of Ruidoso is available for reuse.

—The economic base of Ruidoso is tourism. Economic conditions within the community are subject to fluctuations.
—The Ruidoso Comprehensive Plan establishes goals, policies and implementation strategies relevant to the airport property planning.
—The Ruidoso Village Council adopted a resolution to use the airport site to broaden the economic

base of the community. Using that context, after evaluating the opportunities and constraints of the site, the planners have drafted a multi-use plan to provide a flexible land use zoning framework.

Snow removal Street Dept. proposes listing of priorities

The Village of Ruidoso Street Department is ready for snow. A policy statement will be presented to the Ruidoso Village Council on Tuesday establishing priorities for snow removal and salting when inclement weather causes village roads to become hazardous for driving. Priority is given in the proposal to school bus routes and access roads to fire stations, Emergency Medical Services headquarters and the Police Department. Snow removal equipment will be dispatched only during regular working hours unless an accumulation of four inches or more of snow occurs, according to the statement. Salt-spreading equipment will be dispatched to designated areas, day or night, when dangerous conditions exist. Areas for salting are:
—Carrizo Creek Drive hill
—Sudderth Drive at the telephone company curve
—Paradise and Sudderth intersection
—Country Club and Paradise intersection
—Sudderth and State Highway 37 intersection

—Cree Highway and State Highway 37 intersection
—Mechem Drive at Bennett's Shur-Sav hill
—D Street
—Fifth Street
—Main Road
—Paradise Canyon Road. Priority roads for snow removal are: Sudderth, Mechem, Paradise Canyon Drive, Hull Road, Gavilan Canyon Road, Cree Meadows, Country Club Drive, Country Club Road, Eagle, White Mountain Drive, Wingfield, D Street, Grindstone, Carrizo Creek Road, Warrior Drive, Main Road, Mescalero Road. Priority II roads are: Porr Avenue, Cliff Drive, Virginia Canyon, Brady Canyon, Ebarb, Perk, Flume Canyon, First Street, Grove, Fir, Shady Lane, Valencia, Mockingbird, University, College, Canyon Drive, L.L. Davis, Snowcap, McBride, Timberline, Starlight, Rim Road, Warwick C, Crown, Camelot, Excalibur and Hart. Snow removal on streets other than those listed will not be initiated until all priority I and II streets are cleared, according to the proposed policy statement.

'Harvey' wins best play at RLT's Betty Awards

When Harvey hears how many awards his story won at Ruidoso Little Theatre's third annual Betty Awards, the big white Pookah, who is said to look a lot like a rabbit, will wish he could have been there. "Harvey" took the best play award, with the production's director and stars winning both Betty Awards and People's Choice honors during the presentations Saturday at Cree Meadows Country Club. The evening was the closest thing to the Academy Awards that Ruidoso has ever seen—with duos of presenters decked out in formal attire handing out the special awards, Betty Awards and People's Choice selections. "And the winner is ..." was accountant Dick Mound's cue to present the presenters with sealed envelopes containing the names of the winners. "We're gathered here tonight to honor each other ... to give ourselves a little pat on the back," said master of ceremonies Dan Barrow. "And we are here tonight so that we can reach out into the future and attain things that we have not yet attained," he added. Sandy Knox, president of RLT, won best director for "Harvey," with "Melody Hall" director David Hall named runner-up. Betty Awards for best actor and best actress went to Al Radtke and Shirley Bruski, both for their roles in "Harvey." Tied for best supporting actor were Roger Sowder for "Harvey," and Jett Crouse for "Melody Hall." Sandy Knox was named best supporting actress for her performance in "Last of the Red Hot Lovers." While Betty Awards are selected by secret ballot among those who have seen every RLT production of a season and worked in some capacity on at least one play, People's Choice awards are by vote of those who have seen all but one play in the season. People's Choice winners, along with "Harvey" for best play, are Shirley Bruski, best actress; Dan Barrow, best actor; Sandy Knox, best director; Roger Sowder, best supporting actor; and Karen Wharton Barrow, best supporting actress. Legislative Study Committee forms in concern over schools

A Legislative Study Committee has been formed within the Ruidoso school system, representing concern with issues that affect students and the public in Ruidoso and New Mexico.

The group will hold a Legislative Forum meeting at the Elk's Lodge at 7 p.m. Tuesday, December 15. The purpose of this meeting is to encourage voters to meet with legislators to create an exchange of ideas.

According to Legislative Study Committee spokesperson Phyllis T. Morgan, Santa Fe legislators enact laws that affect everyone's lives. Educators are particularly concerned about the lack of funding of bills enacted in 1986. This lack of funding has created hardships on all school districts in New Mexico, and Ruidoso is no exception.

The study committee encourages attendance at their forum, and participation in the question/answer segment of the program.

Morgan stresses that this is a chance to make one's opinions

known. Anyone with concerns about class sizes, excessive paperwork and loss of faculty and staff salaries should be present at next Tuesday's meeting.

Refreshments will be served following the forum.

Some, but not all, of the issues discussed will include:

—An anticipated enrollment increase in the state of 4,569 students

—A recommended increase in public school support of \$56.1 million

—Continued implementation of most features of public school reform

—Sufficient funds for a three percent salary increase for all school employees, to be distributed by local boards of education

—Inflationary adjustments for insurance, supplies and utilities totalling \$17.7 million

—Projected loss of credits of \$7 million

These figures come from a letter dated November 19, 1987, from the State Board of Education.

Ryan's three-point shots key as Warriors top NMMI

Ruidoso High School's boys varsity basketball team can be thankful the three-point shot is used in New Mexico this season.

Ruidoso edged host New Mexico Military Institute (NMMI), 54-53, in the season-opener Friday night as senior Kirk Ryan scored 35 points. He got six three-point baskets in the process.

In order for a field goal to be a three-pointer, the shot must be at least 19 feet, nine inches from the basket.

This is the first season New Mexico has had the three-point play and it worked to Ruidoso's advantage Friday night.

NMMI had taken a 53-48 edge late in the final quarter before Ryan closed the gap.

The 5-11 senior then hit a three-pointer and was fouled in the process.

Ryan made the free throw and Ruidoso was down by one, 53-52.

NMMI could not convert and the Warriors brought the ball down court. Ryan again was fouled and was given a one-and-one situation.

Ryan made the first one, giving him a second shot. He also made the second one cleanly and Ruidoso had a one-point lead.

NMMI then brought the ball down and called time out.

The Colts tried two shots but missed, the last one bouncing off the rim as the game ended.

The Colts started to pull ahead slightly in the third quarter.


NMMI took a 38-31 lead late in the third period before Ruidoso's Cliff Sears hit a bucket to make the score 35-33 at the quarter break.

Editorial

Christmas is a time when friends and neighbors pull together for the common good. One way of doing a great deal for the community during the time between now and Christmas is easy—shop locally for Christmas.

The effect of shopping in Ruidoso for Christmas can only be estimated, with calculations of how many times a locally spent dollar "rolls over" in the community set at about seven times. That means a dollar spent on a toy may then be paid to a store employee, then spent on groceries, then paid to a grocery store employee, then spent again, and so on until at some point the dollar leaves the community.

It is the rolling over that magnifies the amount of benefit created by spending locally.

By spending a dollar at a neighbor's business, it may enable the neighbor to come back and spend the same dollar at your business.

Keep the community in mind when spending money for Christmas this season—let's all pull together for the common good.—DJP

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—Attorney General Hal Stratton has won another battle in his never-ending quest to shape up state government.

Stratton feels that previous attorneys general have too often relied on advice given by their predecessors to allow illegal practices to continue rather than make a politically unpopular decision. Thus, he has taken on judicial retirement, state advertising practices, bonding practices and a host of other dragons that need slaying.

His most recent victory was a decision by state District Judge Bruce Kaufman denying the state Board of Public Accountancy the use of an uncommissioned attorney to represent it in a suit that Stratton filed against the board.

State law provides that the attorney general is the sole officer entitled to represent the state in litigation. The attorney general can issue a special assistant attorney general commission to a state agency attorney or any private attorney, if he so desires. But it also allows him not to do it and Stratton has been refusing to allow state agencies to hire their own attorney to fight the attorney general's office in court.

Stratton feels it is bad public policy to have state attorneys litigating against each other on taxpayers' money. It is much less expensive to have someone in state government make the final decision. That "someone," according to Stratton, is the attorney general.

Three former attorneys general have already disagreed. So has former Assistant Attorney General Dick Bosson, an unsuccessful challenger to Jeff Bingaman in the 1978 attorney general primary election.

In a newspaper column Bosson asserts that no public official should pretend to have the ultimate answer on truth. "That's why we have the court system," Bosson says, "and the right to choose a lawyer, to guarantee representation of one's views before our courts, is at the core of anyone's definition of what due process is all about."

Stratton contends that although he is denying a state agency the use of a lawyer, the private citizens, who stand to benefit from a board's decision have every right to hire a lawyer at their own expense.

Bosson asserts this is a subtle Reaganism designed to make courts available only to those who can afford them. He contends the cost of litigation and endless appeals by state attorneys would be unreasonable. He says it is a case of citizens'

own tax dollars being used against them.

Of course, the accountancy board victory is not the big one Stratton is looking for. The victory Stratton wants is over the Public Employees Retirement Board and it begins with barring it from using its own attorney.

Stratton wants the PERA annuitants who will benefit from the PERA board decisions to pay for the defense against the attorney general's suit.

Stratton says he has looked but has not been able to find instances in which a prior attorney general has provided an agency with a state-financed lawyer to litigate against the attorney general.

Bosson says that ignorance is "reprehensible." He cites two instances in which former Attorney General Tony Anaya allowed then Alcoholic Beverage Control Director Carlos Jaramillo and state School Superintendent Leonard DeLayo to use their own independent counsel to settle their differences with him in court.

Bosson also cites a case in which former Attorney General Paul Bardacke permitted state auditor Al Romero to hire private counsel to litigate against the state over differing interpretations of bonding statutes.

Bosson concludes by advising the PERA board to "hire the best lawyer you can find and stand up for your rights in court. My bet is that no judge I know will stand in your way."

That was before the accountancy board decision. There are those who think the PERA situation might be different enough to warrant a different judicial decision. From where I sit, that looks like an awfully optimistic outlook.

It would be wisest for all concerned to try the legislative route first. The Legislature has the power to approve private counsel for state agencies and has done so in the past. Legislative action would provide the most definitive answers and it is free.

Legislative action would also be the best route for PERA board members, whom Stratton says should be worried about their personal liability for the actions they have taken as board members.

If the Legislature doesn't want to start the precedent of agencies shopping around if they can't get the advice they want from the attorney general, it might consider providing reimbursement of legal expenses to citizens who are sued by the attorney general and win.



Air Ruidoso announces expanded flight schedule

Air Ruidoso Ltd. has announced daily scheduled service from Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA) to Albuquerque, Alamogordo and El Paso, Texas, beginning Thursday, December 10.

"This schedule complements the Mesa schedule," noted Air Ruidoso owner and operator Helene McCoy.

The locally owned air service recently received certification through the Federal Aviation Administration that allows the company to publish an unlimited number of scheduled flights. The new schedule will be included in the

national directory and will be in travel agents' computers after Wednesday, December 16, said McCoy.

Following is the new schedule (point of departure to destination, departure time, arrival time):

El Paso to SBRA, 6:30 a.m., 7 a.m.;
SBRA to Albuquerque, 7:15 a.m., 8 a.m.;
Albuquerque to SBRA, 8:30 a.m., 9:15 a.m.;
SBRA to El Paso, 9:30 a.m., 10 a.m.;
Alamogordo to SBRA, 2:15

p.m., 2:35 p.m.;
SBRA to Albuquerque, 3:30 p.m., 4:15 p.m.;
Albuquerque to SBRA, 5:15 p.m., 5:55 p.m.;
SBRA to El Paso, 6:10 p.m., 6:40 p.m.

McCoy said the schedule was established to meet the needs of locals as well as tourists. She said Air Ruidoso remains flexible and will provide the kinds of service needed to meet the needs of the Ruidoso traveler.

"You can easily go to Albuquerque for the day with this schedule,"

said McCoy. Future expansion may include direct flight to Phoenix and Tucson, Arizona, noted McCoy.

Air Ruidoso has established affordable fares, said McCoy, noting that prices vary from \$35 to \$49 (plus applicable taxes) on the current flights.

McCoy, encouraging travelers to utilize the service, stresses the shared benefits of supporting the local economy.

"Your support and cooperation can be a tremendous investment in the future of Ruidoso's economy," said McCoy.

Air Ruidoso has offices at the Ruidoso Financial Center, Suite G-3, and has plans to acquire counter space at the SBRA. Air Ruidoso may be reached at 258-4900.

Mescalero tribe members won't get expected \$500

A November 30 letter from Mescalero Apache Tribe President Wendell Chino informed more than 2,000 tribal members that they would not each receive an expected \$500 dividend due to insufficient funds, according to a published report.

A dividend of \$1,000 was to be paid to tribal members in two payments, November 19 and December 11, by order of a resolution passed by the Tribal Council.

Dividends are generated, usually once a year, for tribal members from interest on investments. Since no regular payment schedule is in place, payments are made according to petitions presented to the tribal government.

Chino said tribal councillors who voted for the resolution endangered the tribe's future by promising dividends it cannot afford, according to the report.

This is being sent to you just after high noon on December five, and if it weren't for the bare branches of the river trees and the large and small apricot trees, you would think this was a day in spring.

There is a gentle west wind humming Christmas messages over the meadows and strumming carol chords through its harps, the river trees.

The golden sun is trimmed in a wide circle of white light as it beams through very light clouds. The temperature in the shade is sixty-six, and would be up in the seventies if the sky were clear. And yet, with all the summery weather and with no snow in sight, and the mellow west wind carrying the warmth of the desert basking in the sun away across the mountain.

The snow birds, who moved in two weeks ago, waited around for the snow. Then just before noon I was walking toward a clump of cedars on the little field west of the house, and out from the branches swaying in the wind appeared two flashes of purest shining blue, touched with crimson red and snowy white, as two western bluebirds, with their mates, flew up from their cedar wind shelter and then lit on some other cedars close by, warbling their little chirping songs.

The western bluebird is a true American, with his silken coat of dark rich blue, his vest of crimson red and pure white. At first sight of this little bird friend, after long absence, you can feel your heart within you give a little leap of joy. For he is the bird of happiness.

The all American colors of these little messengers of good will are especially pure and bright this year, and this is surely a good omen for all of us.

Surely the western bluebird is proud of his colors, and he dearly loves the American flag. Sometimes when the breeze is light you will see him on the tip top of the flag pole singing his little notes while the colors—matching his own—ripple below. The flag pole sways in the wind giving the little singer a rock-a-bye ride.

Now the wind picks up its pace and the bluebird flies from his perch atop the flag pole and lights in his bluebird tree near by, a beloved lit-

tle American emblem among the soft green of the cedar branches.

There are three main bluebirds: the eastern bluebird, colored almost exactly the same as the western, and the mountain bluebird of many shades of light blue. The mountain and western blue birds are favorite citizens of all the White Mountain country.

Birds are little messengers from Heaven. And the bluebirds are little spirit creatures. Today they bring back the days when they sat on the REA wires in front of the house and sang down to our Mother, and she would answer back up to them:

"Mother's darling!" Today during this spring day in December, both the red, white and blue western bluebird and the all blue mountain bluebird are here today close around the house, bringing me fond messages from our Mother in Heaven.








Photo study in grids and bars
