## Snow! Winter storm ices village

Old Man Winter finally arrived in the Ruidoso area late Saturday night, bringing a record snowfall and closing down schools.

All schools in Ruidoso and Capitan were closed today (Monday), December 14. In addition, Ruidoso Middle School boys A and B basketball games at Holloman scheduled for today were cancelled.

A total of 23 inches of snow was measured on the ground at 6 a.m. today by Bill Hostetter, cooperative observer for the National Weather Service.

That equals the record established April 6, 1983, according to Hostetter.

The snow began falling around 9 p.m. Saturday and has continued since then.

The Ruidoso Police Department has been busy since Saturday night, but there have been no major accidents.

"We've been busy with minor accidents and public service calls from people needing to go from one place to another," said Chief Bill Newman. "We haven't had any fatalities yet."

Ruidoso police had reported five minor accidents between midnight Saturday and midnight Sunday.

Ruidoso's roads remain open but are snowpacked and icy.

Highway 54 from Carrizozo to Tularosa is closed and Highway 380 from Capitan to Roswell may be closed, although it has not been confirmed officially.

Police are discouraging travel in Lincoln County and throughout most of the state.

The weather is expected to clear up tonight and tomorrow.

## SBRA takes off with grand opening

Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA) took off Friday when a bright yellow plane soared through the air, swooping down for a spectacular ribbon cutting, to mark the official opening of the long-awaited airfield.

A band played, balloons filled the air and the large crowd cheered as the pilot dipped the small plane to sever the red, white and blue ribbon stretched across the brand new runway.

Among a big crowd gathered to celebrate the new facility on Fort Stanton Mesa, were members of the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC), former airport commissioners and other local and county officials. Thanks were the order of the day, as everybody thanked everybody else for the years of work that resulted in a new regional airport to serve Ruidoso and most of Lincoln County.

Midland, Texas, pilot Bobby Hale read aloud a congratulatory message from Vice-President George Bush. Hale recalled flying into Ruidoso since the days when planes landed on a dirt strip, comparing that experience with landing at the new regional airport on Friday.

"That was the most satisfying sight I've ever seen—that beautiful long runway on that broad mesa," said Hale of his arrival at SBRA.

Among planes landing on Friday, was a Mesa Airlines flight that initiated regular scheduled service to Roswell, Albuquerque and Dallas/Fort Worth, Texas. Ruidoso Hondo Valley Chamber of Commerce President Barbara DiPaolo welcomed the airline, noting the chamber is entering into an agreement with Mesa for four flights daily connecting "Lincoln County to the world."

Sarah Sproule of Mesa, said the company is excited to be flying into SBRA, and pleased with the community support exhibited through the large attendance at Friday's events.

"It's going to work well for both of us," said Sproule.

SBRA manager Tim Morris thanked Helene McCoy, noting that her company, Air Ruidoso, has been serving the area through the old airport and will continue to offer service from the new facility.

SBAC Chairman Bill Karn introduced airport commissioners John Hightower, Ralph Dunlap, Lloyd L. Davis Jr., Elmer Pirelli and Jerry Shaw, noting the many others who have served on the airport planning group over the years. He introduced representatives of senators Pete Domenici and Jeff Bingaman and Congressman Joe Skeen. All three sent their best wishes.

Bingaman announced in his letter that he had placed an order for a flag flown over the U.S. Capitol on Friday, and will deliver it to SBRA the next time he visits Lincoln County.

State Representative Ben Hall, on hand for Friday's festivities, recalled standing on the airport site just a year ago for the airport groundbreaking. He said Governor Garrey Carruthers sent his regrets that he couldn't be at the opening, but was at a Border Governors Conference in Las Cruces.

Former Secretary of Transportation Elizabeth Dole, who served in the cabinet when the first major progress was made toward achieving a new regional airport, sent a mailgram offering congratulations.

Mescalero Apache Indian Tribal President Wendell Chino, a former member of the airport commission, said he was happy to be at the opening representing his people. Chino gave the tribe some credit for the new airport.

"We could have thrown a monkey wrench ... we could have refused to relinquish our claim (to the land)," said Chino. "Mr. Fred Heckman worked for me on the reservation and learned all he could about grantsmanship ... we passed him on to you and you capitalized on it," added Chino.

Heckman, who wasn't present Friday, served on the commission and was later the paid administrator as the airport project

## Long road leads to new regional airport

The grand opening Friday of the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA) was the end of a 20-year effort to achieve a safe airport to serve Ruidoso and Lincoln County.

SBRA replaces the Ruidoso Municipal Airport, located in the heart of Ruidoso, where 17 fatal crashes were recorded during a 20-year period.

Plans to replace the municipal airport began with a 1967 airport study that led to the 1976 master plan that became the framework for the development and construction of the modern new facility on Fort Stanton Mesa.

The 20-year road leading to Friday's happy landings at the regional airport, was marked by a number of important milestones, beginning with the 1983 endorsement of the airport plan for then Governor Toney Anaya. Airport planners have said no real progress was made until Anaya got behind the project.

The state later came through with a \$1 million grant for airport development and construction.

President Ronald Reagan, in August 1985, signed the bill transferring the land on Fort Stanton Mesa to the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission. The land transfer became final on March 7, 1986. New Mexico State University gave up its claim on the land, paving the way for the new airport.

When a favorable environmental assessment document was unveiled on June 19, 1986, airport commis-

sioners were ready to go with the construction phase of the long-awaited airfield.

Groundbreaking ceremonies were conducted on October 31, 1986, and then airport administrator Fred Heckman revealed federal grants would be forthcoming for \$6.5 million.

The project began soon after the Halloween groundbreaking ceremonies, and the airport construction has broken all records since that time, according to Tex Melugin, director of the Federation of Aviation Administration Southwest Region.

Planes began landing last week on the 8,100-foot runway located on the broad Fort Stanton Mesa—surrounded by mainly undeveloped public lands, in sharp contrast to the old Ruidoso Municipal Airport located near schools, homes and businesses.

Modular buildings are located beside the state-of-the-art airfield aprons, taxiways and runway. They house airport administration, passenger facilities and car rental agencies, and will remain in place until an interim terminal is constructed.

Upcoming projects at the airport will be the installation of a federally-funded non-directional beacon, construction of crash-fire-rescue facilities and completion of a lease contract on a gang hangar, lease hangars and related facilities.

Besides private planes using the new airport, passengers are served at SBRA by two commuter airlines—Air Ruidoso and Mesa Airlines.

## Schmidt's first place leads matmen; Ruidoso hosts Roswell Wednesday

Jeff Schmidt won the 119-pound division to lead the Ruidoso High School wrestling team in its season-opener at the Las Cruces Tournament Friday and Saturday.

Ruidoso finished 10th or 11th in the 18-team tournament, but no exact team results were available.

Schmidt won four matches, the first two by pins. It was the first time a Warrior wrestler had ever won an individual title in the Las Cruces Tournament.

In the third match, he trailed an El Paso, Texas-Bowie wrestler, by a 2-0 score. With 18 seconds left,

however, Schmidt reversed the Bowie wrestler and put him down for a 5-2 victory.

In the finals, Schmidt was tied, 2-2, with a Carlsbad wrestler, but got a reversal with two seconds left to gain a 4-2 win and the title.

Other Warriors who did well were Bubba Lane, 2-2 at 155 pounds, and Peter Gwaltney, 2-2 at 98 pounds.

Scott Yeatman, a 132-pound wrestler, won his first two matches Friday but had to withdraw from the tournament to take the ACT test Saturday.

Two other Warrior wrestlers, Clint Bob and Matthew Griego, also had to withdraw from the tournament to take the ACT test. Both

wrestlers had 1-1 records when they withdrew.

"We did real well," said Warrior head coach Gerald Ames. "Especially since we had some guys who had to take the ACT test."

Ruidoso now will host AAAA-division Roswell in a dual match Wednesday, December 16. The junior varsity competition will start at 6 p.m., followed by the varsity match.

"They tied us last year and they had a good JV team, so they could be tough," said Ames about Roswell. "I know they're strong in the upper weights."

## Warrior girl hoopsters win one game in Carlsbad weekend tournament

The Ruidoso High School girls varsity basketball team won one of three games in the Carlsbad Tournament over the weekend.

The Warriors edged Portales, 46-44, in overtime Saturday morning. Friday night Ruidoso lost to Carlsbad, 68-45, and Saturday afternoon the Warriors lost to eventual champion Bel-Air of El Paso, Texas, 65-33.

Bel-Air and Portales had 2-1 records. The Warriors and Carlsbad had 1-2 records. Bel-Air won the tournament championship based on point differential.

Carlsbad is a New Mexico AAAA-division school and Bel-Air is a Texas AAAAA-division school.

Against Portales, the score was tied, 40-40, at the end of regulation.

But the teams fought evenly until Ruidoso's Tammy Osborne hit an eight-foot jump shot with two seconds left to give the Warriors the victory.

Sophomore Tara Miller led the Warrior scoring with 18 points. Nor-

ma Murillo added nine, Osborne had eight and Sheila Reid added four.

In the opener against powerful Carlsbad, the Warriors fell behind and could never catch up.

"They were big and quick," said Warrior head coach Sergio Castanon of Carlsbad. "They played us real tough."

Miller led the Warrior scoring with 15 points. Jennifer Jimenez added 11 and Osborne scored nine.

In the finale against Bel-Air, Ruidoso had an eight-point lead early in the contest but the El Paso team roared back for the victory.

Osborne led the Warrior scoring with 13 points.

Miller added seven points and Murillo scored six.

"We learned a lot in the tournament," said Castanon. "It was a great victory over Portales."

Osborne and Miller made the all-tournament team. Miller also made the all-tournament team at Goddard earlier in the season.

Ruidoso is now 2-5 on the season. The Warriors will host Goddard and Roswell before taking a holiday

break, playing Goddard here Tuesday, December 15, and Roswell in the Warrior gymnasium on Thursday, December 17.

The junior varsity games will start at 5:30 p.m. both days with the varsity contests following.

Ruidoso lost to Goddard by four points in the opener of the Goddard Tournament. However, the Warriors were without Osborne in that contest.

"We'll have to be physical with them and play good defense," said Castanon about the Goddard game.

Roswell is an AAAA-division school, but Ruidoso defeated the Coyotes last season.

# Attorney details delays on road

"First of all, there already is a road to the airport. I don't think we need to imply that there isn't. And the county intends to maintain that road, to the best of their ability, until we get that new road constructed," explained county attorney Gary Mitchell last week, when questioned about the unfinished Fort Stanton Road, which runs from State Highway 37 to the new Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

"In fact," adds Mitchell, "much of the new road will utilize at least a portion of the old road." "Initially, we sought funding for that road, and thanks to Ben Hall and the commissioners, both the past term and the present group, we were able to get that. We hired an engineering firm, Bohannon and Houston, who did an excellent job at getting the road designed and planned, and then getting those plans to the highway department. They also made certain that we were able to obtain the funding—over six million dollars.

"The next step was the obtaining of the land. That's been done. There's one or two little problems left, but they're not holding up the construction of the project.

"The county has pushed completion of the project diligently, and finally, after we acquired the land, we had to have approval by the New Mexico State Highway Department on the plans before we let the construction bid, and they gave it approval.

"Then we went out to bid. The holdup has been in the bid process.

"The county did not prepare the bid specifications, nor did the county have anything to do with those specs, or how the bid was to be let. That is all up to the highway department and the engineers.

"The first time around, people bid on the project and in the bid specifications there was no mention of resident contractors being given a five percent preference. Really, that was required. So rather than have a big hassle about it, we rebid the project.

"Had the five percent preference been given, however, it's my opinion that probably Twin Mountain Rock, who got the bid the second time around, would have been the low bidder."

The five percent preference advantage for in-state companies is the law of the state of New Mexico.

Mitchell continued his explanation. "During the time between the first bid and the second bid, which was not a lengthy period of time at all, Neilsons' obtained an in-state contractor's license. So they, too, were entitled to a five percent preference.

"The second bid was let, and Twin Mountain Rock still bid

lower." Twin Mountain Rock, which has an in-state contractor's license, is headquartered in Nebraska.

Twin Mountain Rock's second low bid was \$4,335,030. Neilsons' second bid was \$4,496,952.

Mitchell emphasized that bid specifications are developed by the engineering firm and by the highway department. "All the county was doing was opening them, and as one partner in the project, saying 'well, we accept this bid', or whatever. After that, the highway department receives the bids and has to approve them. So it's really a partnership situation. Of course, we all have to comply with federal standards, because later on the highway department will receive some reimbursement from the federal government. So they are a partner, too.

"Neilsons' objected to the second bid on the basis that this time the bid specs did not include gross tax receipts. We had a formal hearing on that before Judge (Bill) Payne. Neilsons' is now appealed to New Mexico District Court, alleging that the bid should be overturned. We, of course, are responding. I expect within the next 90 days, the matter will be resolved."

The airport road is a little over seven miles long, and it will take a year to finish construction once it is started.

"The county let the contract to Twin Mountain Rock," explained Mitchell. "But because of the dispute, the highway department has not approved it.

"This holdup is not an unusual circumstance when it comes to these huge construction contracts. All the county has tried to do is to be as fair and impartial as we possibly can.

"Some people have brought up this gravel pit situation, implying that we have tried to force everybody not to use a gravel pit held on federal land. But when you have bids like this, you have to be fair and impartial to everyone. If one party can get inexpensive rock from a federal pit, which would cost much less money, then all the parties should be able to use it. All the companies should have the same access to that pit as anyone else.

"That's our position on it. One person shouldn't have a leg up because they know the right politician, or they belong to a certain political party, or because they contributed more money to somebody's campaign. We're not saying that anybody's done that; but when it comes to the gravel pit issue, the three county commissioners are very fair men. They're saying to Neilsons' or Twin Mountain Rock, 'if you have access to it,

all the contractors should have access to it."

Mitchell commented, "If the federal government's going to give gravel away, it should be given away fairly to everybody, including the county.

"Some people suggest we rebid it once again. Well, Twin Mountain Rock was the low bidder—twice. We have the duty to honor our bid let. But having lawsuits over this stuff is not anything unusual.

"We're willing to abide by whatever the appeals judge says. If he or she says rebid the contract, then we will rebid the contract. You know, when a company is making millions of dollars, they don't hesitate to spend a few thousand in legal fees. There's nothing extraordinary about this case."

Mitchell admits that if the bid is to be re-let, it will delay the road construction even more. "My position on the whole thing is that if they had let Suzanne Cox and the county handle the bidding, if the whole thing had come out of our offices, it wouldn't have been messed up. You know, the county gets jumped on because the road isn't done. It's not the county's fault. The contractors are arguing, and the state highway department's the one handling the bids, and the engineers—I don't mind taking the heat for something I did wrong, but we were totally innocent in this one.

"In fact, if it hadn't been for the county, we wouldn't have had any integrity in the bid process at all by now."

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Capitan Municipal School District No. 23 (herein the "Board" and the "District," respectively), in the County of Lincoln, New Mexico, has determined that a special school district election be held on February 2, 1988, pursuant to Sections 1-22-1 through 1-22-19, N.M.S.A. 1978, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 22-25-3, NMSA 1978, the Board has determined, and does hereby determine, that there should be submitted to the electorate at said special school district election, the question whether or not a property tax of \$2.00 per each \$1,000.00 of net taxable value of property allocated to the District under the Property Tax Code should be imposed for the property tax years of 1988, 1989 and 1990, for the purpose of capital improvements in the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CAPITAN MUNICIPAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 23 CONSTITUTING THE GOVERNING BOARD OF SAID DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN AND STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. On the day of February, 1988 there will be held in Capitan Municipal School District No. 23, Lincoln County, New Mexico, a special school district election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the District the question of whether or not a property tax should be imposed for the purpose of capital improvements in the District.

Section 2. The Voting District for this election, defined by the precincts consolidated therein, shall be as follows: Voting District No. 1, General Election Precincts 1, Polling Place Capitan Fair Grounds, in addition, there will be an Absentee Voter District established, as described in Section 7 herein.

Section 3. The polls for said election will be open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election.

Section 4. At such election, the following question shall be submitted to such qualified, registered electors of the District:

PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TAX QUESTION Shall the Board of Education of Capitan Municipal School District No. 23, County of Lincoln, New Mexico be authorized to impose a property tax of \$2.00 per each \$1,000.00 of net taxable value of the property allocated to such District under the Property Tax Code for the property tax years of 1988, 1989 and 1990 for the purpose of the following capital improvements in the District, i.e., erecting, remodeling, making additions to providing equipment for or furnishing public school buildings, purchasing or improving public school grounds, and maintenance of public school buildings or public school grounds, exclusive of salary expenses of employees of the District?

Section 5. The tax question submitted to the electorate shall be in addition to any tax imposed to pay debt service on any bonds or for any other purpose. Such capital improvements tax is authorized pursuant to the Public School Capital Improvements Act, i.e., Sections 22-25-1 through 22-25-10 NMSA 1978 (being Chapter 5, Laws of New Mexico, 1975 Special Session, as amended and

supplemented).

Section 6. A person is qualified elector of the District if he or she is a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age on the day of the election and resident of the District on the day of the election. In order to vote, qualified electors of the District must have previously registered with County Clerk of Lincoln County in accordance with law. Any qualified elector of the District who is not now registered and who wishes to vote at such special election should register during regular office hours at the office of the County Clerk of Lincoln County, at the County Courthouse in Capitan, New Mexico, or at the office of any deputy registration officer appointed by the County Clerk of Lincoln County (including the municipal clerk of all municipalities in Lincoln County) prior to 5:00 p.m. on January 5, 1988, being the twenty-eighth day immediately preceding this special school election.

Section 7. Absentee voting will be permitted in the manner authorized by Section 1-22-19, NMSA 1978 and Section 1-6-1, NMSA 1978 et seq., provided that qualified electors may also vote absentee in person at the office of the Lincoln County Clerk during the regular hours and days of business from 8:00 a.m., January 8, 1988, being the twenty-fifth day preceding the election, until 5:00 p.m., January 23, 1988, being the Friday immediately prior to the date of the election. Absentee ballots shall be printed at least 20 days prior to the date of the election.

Section 8. Voting shall be by voting machine, except for absentee voting which shall be by paper ballot. At least one voting machine shall be used at the polling place for each precinct.

Section 9. This Resolution and Proclamation shall be filed with the Lincoln County Clerk on or before December 14, 1987, and shall thereafter be published in English and in Spanish in the Ruidoso News, a newspaper having general circulation in the District, once per week for four consecutive weeks, the first publication to occur on December 14, 1987, being a date at least 50 days before the date of the election.

made such giant strides as receiving the land, getting a favorable environmental statement and over gaining more than \$8 million in state and federal funds.

Former Lieutenant Governor Mike Rannels spoken on behalf of those in former Governor Toney Anaya's administration when the state granted \$1 million to the airport project.

"We were proud to be a part of making this airport a reality," said Rannels.

SBRA manager Tim Morris, former chairman of the airport commission, introduced Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and State Aviation Department officials and staff. Morris said without the help of Tex Melugin, director of the FAA Southwest region office Lincoln County wouldn't have the new facility.

Melugin responded by saying he has been involved in a great many airport projects, but "never seen one as unique as this project." He said it took a lot of cooperation from a lot of people.

"And, Chief, by golly, I'm sure glad you went along with this project," said Melugin, looking at President Chino, who nodded and smiled.

While it took a long time to get the

SBRA project going, Melugin said the commission broke records once construction was under way.

Recalling a time when Bob White of the State Aviation Department got him to fly into the Ruidoso Municipal Airport, Melugin said the area went from the worst to the best airfield.

Morris also introduced White, and Judith Espinosa, who was a member of the Anaya administration who supported the replacement airport.


"There are so many people who need to be thanked, obviously we're going to miss some," noted Ruidoso Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr., naming former councillors who visited Washington D.C. to keep the airport project on track. He thanked Chino and Heckman "for getting the money out of those folks."

Karn thanked the many people who wrote letters and made telephone calls to help persuade lawmakers of the need to replace the airport located in the middle of Ruidoso.

"I hope you're going to see this airport become the number two used airport in the State of New Mexico," said Karn in closing the official ceremony.

The celebration continued with a cake and drinks at the airport, and a reception Friday evening at Ruidoso Financial Center.





## Inside the Capitol

**SANTA FE**—As predicted, reports are starting to come in about snafus in the implementation of the new performance-based pay plan for state employees.

No doubt about it—paying state employees what they are worth, and giving raises to those who provide us taxpayers more for our money, is a capital idea. The problem is that some jobs are hard to measure by objective criteria.

We all know who the best employees are in any workplace with which we are familiar. The rub comes when we try to prove it, because any two people's ideas about who is a quality employee just seem to differ.

I recently heard from a group of employees with the Human Services Department in southeastern New Mexico. They have been told that their professional development plan evaluation scores must be lowered by 10 percent across-the-board because they are too high in comparison with HSD employees in the rest of the state, especially in Santa Fe.

It seems the Santa Fe brass think the supervisors in southeastern New Mexico have been too generous in their evaluations. The employees think they are just that much better at serving the needs of their clients.

These employees are incensed at having busted their tails doing a bang-up job and then getting knocked down by a bunch of bureaucrats in Santa Fe they have never even seen. The distressing aspect of this whole mess is that neither side in this standoff can prove its point.

Normally, a reasonable person would think it best to let the process work as well as it can instead of monkeying around with the system after it has already started to operate. But in this case, the golden rule takes over—those in control of the gold are changing the rules so the Santa Fe employees in the head office don't get mad about a disproportionate share of the loot going south.

At last report, none of the HSD employees in southeastern New Mexico are signing the forms on which they are asked to agree to having their scores lowered. At this point, they don't know whether it is going to make any difference because, if Santa Fe can make the rules, it can change the rules.

The state Personnel Office is in charge of implementing this merit pay idea. The personnel folks evidently gave some general guidelines to each department in state government and let them design their own plan to fit their own

needs.

This delegation to the departments is more of the decentralizing pattern which has characterized the state personnel function since the beginning of the Garrey Carruthers administration even though administration officials deny it. If each department develops its own procedures for implementing the performance pay plans, they also have to take the flak when there are problems. Not a bad idea.

Evidently, many departments have chosen to give half their employees a performance-based pay raise. This means many employees don't know whether their evaluation score qualifies them for merit pay, yet, because they have to wait to see what the median score is. That means the big howls are still to be heard from those departments. Many of these employees' fears are currently being allayed, however, by supervisors who are assuring them that if they don't get performance raises this year, it will be their turn, next year.

Over at the Highway Department, employees do not yet know whether their performance evaluation scores qualify them for a pay hike but already there are reports of two supervisors who have been punched out by employees who were unhappy about their ratings.

It's a dangerous business but someone has to do it in order to assure that the good employees are the ones who get the raises.

Thank goodness. The National Geographic put out a supplement on the West Indies last month. Now I can see where my old buddy Fred McCaffrey, the former writer of this column, is hanging his hat.

He is in the independent nation of St. Christopher and Nevis. He is living on the island of St. Kitts, which is the local nickname, down there, for St. Christopher. It is such an accepted nickname that it appears on the island's postage stamps.

It is not well-enough accepted, however, for the U. S. Postal service to recognize it. When mailing anything to Fred and Jan, you must remember the correct name of the nation.




