Three hurt in plane crash

Three Texas residents remain in Lincoln County Medical Center with injuries they suffered in a plane crash about 4:45 p.m. Sunday.

A Piper Cherokee, piloted by David Linehan, 28, of Fort Worth, Texas, was reportedly leaving the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA) when the accident occurred. Linehan and passengers Walter Johnson, 46, of Pelican Bay, Texas, and Lisa Jones, 24, of Azle, Texas, were injured in the crash.

New Mexico State Police Officer Steve Standridge said the airplane apparently was trying to take off, didn't have enough speed and hit the ground. The landing gear broke, and the four-seater plane skidded across Fort Stanton Road landing in some trees.

The three injured were transported by ambulance to LCMC, where they remain in good condition. A hospital spokesperson said Jones is expected to be discharged.

Hondo crash kills six

An early afternoon crash Thursday on U.S. Highway 70 left six people dead and two seriously injured.

New Mexico State Police Officer Steve Standridge said both drivers and four passengers were killed in a head-on collision at 12:55 p.m. a mile east of Hondo.

Charles Taylor, 68, of Cadiz, Kentucky, driver of a 1986 Chevrolet pickup, was killed, as was Rebecca V. Lee, 25, of Roswell, the driver of a 1981 Datsun. All passengers in the Datsun were pronounced dead at the scene: Robert E. Lee, seven months old; Orlando Ray Johnson, 14; Tammy Rene Johnson, 10; and Sherry Morgan, 12; all of Roswell.

The passengers in the pickup, Clara Taylor, 66, and Carol L. Taylor, 7, both of Cadiz, were transported to Lincoln County Medical Center with injuries they suffered in the accident. They were admitted, but a hospital spokesperson said the two requested information on their conditions not be released.

Standridge said the Taylor

vehicle was eastbound on Highway 70 when it suddenly crossed over into the path of the westbound Datsun causing the two to collide head-on. All the occupants of the small car were killed and the car was completely demolished, said

Standridge. He said none of the five were wearing seatbelts. The occupants of the pickup were wearing seatbelts, according to Standridge.

He said no citations are issued in accidents where both drivers are killed.

Village on verge of filling the dam

When Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. told village staff Tuesday to start filling the Grindstone Canyon Dam, he was doing just what the project engineer had recommended.

Although the village is still negotiating with the State Engineer Office over some measuring devices at the reservoir, the project manager for Boyle Engineering recommended last week that fill operations begin.

"This completes our program of construction monitoring and we recommend, without reservation that the Village of Ruidoso be permitted to fill their reservoir," said Fred Burns of Boyle Engineering in a letter to the State Engineer Office.

Village manager Frank Potter and attorney John Underwood told the council on Tuesday they were working to expedite final approval from the state engineer to begin filling the dam, but the mayor and

council, apparently tired of a year of delays, issued an order to go ahead and fill the dam without that final word.

Potter said he followed those orders on Wednesday, calling the operation a "test." He said water was turned on, and then turned off because of a minor problem.

Delays over filling the reservoir have been caused by changes in requirements by the state engineer. A tower that allows for taking water from various levels was included in original designs and then omitted, only to be added again as a requirement from the state.

The latest change may have been related to a staff change at the Roswell office of the state engineer. Additional stream gauging facilities were added as a requirement after the dam and tower assembly were constructed.

In a letter to Potter, Burns said he was shocked by that new requirement.

State calls for proposals on widening of Mechem

Work may soon begin on a multi-million dollar project to widen more than five miles of Mechem Drive (State Highway 37).

The State Highway Department has requested proposals for the preparation of a location/environmental study, preliminary design and final design for the construction of a four-lane highway on Mechem Drive from the intersection at Sudderth Drive for a length of 5.2 miles.

Cost estimates for the two-phase project range from \$6 to \$8 million, with the first contract scheduled to begin in May 1989, and the second in May 1990. The area from Sudderth to Mountain Drive is slated for the second phase.

In the project description provided by the State Highway De-

partment, it is noted that because of winding, narrow and very steep grades, it appears that considerable location and alignment study will be required for the project. It is also noted that both sides of the existing right-of-way have been extensively developed and alignment adjustments will be seriously restricted.

"A minimum four lane highway is desired throughout this length of NM 37 which should be accomplished in so far as possible, within the existing 100' right-of-way," reads the project description.

During a meeting of the Ruidoso Village Council last Tuesday, village engineer Mike Davalos warned the council that the upcoming project might affect a major water main located in Mechem Drive. He said that line may have to be replaced or relocated during the highway construction project.

Airport commission

Officials explain closed-door session

Most of Wednesday's regular meeting of the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC) took place behind closed doors.

As the agenda was presented, Chairman Bill Karn said an executive session was needed, and commissioners voted unanimously to retire into closed session. Commissioner Elmer Pirelli made the motion, but after it passed, village attorney John Underwood asked Pirelli to state an exception to the Open Meetings Act in his motion. Pirelli said the executive session was needed to discuss personnel and pending litigation.

When commissioners reconvened in open session, after an hour and 15 minutes, no action was taken related to matters they had discussed, and the group made quick work of the rest of the short agenda.

When questioned later over the executive session, Karn said the

personnel matters were related to the engineering contract.

"We talked about the engineer ... what we're paying him ... about how much longer he would be on board and for what projects," said Karn. Others on hand for the executive session said the budget, a matter for open meetings, was discussed, and Karn said that was only as the budget pertains to the engineering contracts.

Chairman Karn said the engineering bill on Wednesday's agenda was for two months, and there was a concern over the special services amount. He said the commission isn't running short of funds for engineering.

Karn said the pending litigation dealt with airport agreements between users and the Village of Ruidoso and the lawsuit on the road being constructed by the county. While neither lawsuit dealt specifically with the airport commission, Karn said they were legitimate items for the closed meeting since they impact the airport project.

(Ruidoso Mayor) Lloyd Davis asked where we stood on the road and (county attorney) Gary (Mitchell) reported on that, remarked Karn.

Wednesday's meeting was the first for Village Councillor Jess Stinson who was appointed Tuesday to serve on SBAC.

In regular business Wednesday the commission:

—Authorized the fiscal agent to pay the one outstanding bill, \$49,169.23, to Leeds Hill-Herkenhoff, airport engineers.

—Authorized airport manager Tim Morris to proceed with a request for Federal Aviation Administration funding for snow removal equipment and crash-fire-rescue equipment. Morris asked the commission to send FAA a letter asking for permission to order the equipment. The cost of the equipment, \$500,400, is expected to be 90 percent funded by FAA, with the local share at about \$55,000.

—Learned from attorney Un-

derwood that the minimum standards were approved, but not yet signed. Underwood recommended they be signed.

—Heard the engineer report that current contracts are substantially complete. Engineer Earl Cook said the FAA has scheduled a final inspection next week on airfield lighting. He said the contractors are still waiting for Federal Communications Commission approval on a frequency before installing the non-directional beacon.

—Underwood said he hasn't heard from anyone planning to move their hangars to the leased space at the new airfield, and both Karn and Morris said they hadn't been contacted either. Underwood recalled discussions at a previous meeting, when it was agreed the ramp won't be paved to that area unless airport users indicate they'll be utilizing it.

Underwood urged anyone wanting to build or move a hangar to contact him, Morris or Karn as soon as possible.

Bonito Fire Department volunteers were called to the scene, as were members of White Mountain Search and Rescue. The scene of the accident was secured by search and rescue personnel until an investigator from the Federal Aviation Administration can check out the wreckage.

Standridge said the investigator was expected to arrive sometime Sunday night. The FAA investigator is expected to make a determination as to the official cause of the accident.

"Prior to construction of the dam and appurtenances, we reviewed the State Engineer's requirements relative to accounting for surface flows on the natural drainage above the dam, which, after all, is only 742 acres," said Burns in his letter. "Accordingly, we constructed a weir upstream of the dam on the main

stem of Grindstone Creek. The weir was sized to meter flows from rain storm events of up to 100 year frequency," he continued.

The agreement then was to factor flows in accordance with the relative total drainage area to metered drainage area. But, in spite of Burns' and the village's understanding of the agreement, further metering devices have been re-

quired. Potter said those gauges have been ordered, and village staff will install them as soon as they arrive.

Meanwhile, some members of the Village Council are concerned that water is being lost as the Rio Ruidoso flows downstream, past the 1,500 acre-foot area waiting to become a reservoir.

Helping hands

Council considers options on convention center

"We've looked at this in-depth," said village manager Frank Potter before reporting Tuesday on issues surrounding the acquisition of a civic center.

Potter presented legal information on acquisition of real property provided by attorney Mike Runnels, as well as figures on available funding and suggested policies for the council's consideration.

A report presented last month by Charlie Smith, on behalf of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, prompted village leaders to take a close look at acquiring a multi-purpose facility. Smith presented drawings, diagrams and narrative over the acquisition of the Gibson's building, and his presentation was supported by the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County.

Smith and his group looked at Gibson's, True Value, New Mexico Glass and the terminal building at the old municipal airport.

During that same meeting, Councillor Jerry Shaw, since defeated in her bid for re-election to the council, asked the council to request proposals on using the airport terminal for the basis of a center. She said during her four years on the council she was told over and over to wait until the airport property was vacated before acquiring a civic center.

Neither presentation prompted any action from the council, and Potter's report was the next step. That, too, led councillors to delay taking any action, instead asking Potter to meet with groups interested in a municipal center.

A meeting is scheduled for 9 a.m. today (Monday), March 14.

During Tuesday's meeting Potter and accountant John Varley presented the following information:

METHOD OF ACQUISITION

Since the village is not currently in a cash position to make an outright purchase, this option was not considered.

Legality of other financing options, unfortunately, leaves only some form of lease-

purchase—through a bank, or an owner.

The Lodgers' Tax Act provides that a municipality may use a portion of tax proceeds to establish, operate, construct, purchase or otherwise acquire such facilities.

Village staff recommended at least one appraisal be made available of all suitable existing structures. Potter said owners could be asked to submit appraisals if they want their property to be considered.

AVAILABLE FUNDING

State statutes require the village

spend at least half of lodgers' tax collected on advertising.

A village ordinance requires the village to match lodgers' tax collections 100 percent with two-thirds of the match to go into a building fund for a municipal or civic center. That fund currently contains \$275,856.

An analysis shows the village can afford \$90,000 a year in lease-purchase payments—or a financed principle of about \$700,000 for 15 years at 10 percent, or \$800,000 for 20 years at 10 percent.

Village staff said it might be unwise to obligate the entire amount

in payments because some repair and upkeep would be necessary.

Calculations provided show that if advertising and promotion amounts remain at the present level and the village match remains at two-thirds to the building fund, the village has \$643,500 available over a 15-year term with monthly payments. If 100 percent of the village match is placed in the building fund, and advertising and promotion remains at the present level, then \$1,068,700 is available over the next 15 years.

To increase funding available for a building, it was noted the amount of money put into advertising would be decreased. If one-third of lodgers' tax collections were put in the building fund, then \$1,364,800 would be available over the next 15 years; and if half the taxes go into the building, then \$1,532,500 would be available over that period.

"You can't put into it the hope that such a project would increase your occupancy tax, but I assume it would," commented Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. on Tuesday.

POLICIES THE COUNCIL SHOULD CONSIDER: (from the report)

1. Rent, lease, lease-purchase or outright purchase.
2. Build or buy.
3. Request proposals from those in the community who can furnish the desired facilities, and if so how should the proposal be structured if acquisition of an existing structure is selected?
4. Who makes improvements on existing structure?
5. Should lodgers' tax bonds be issued, or lease purchase be used?
6. Should current allocations to building fund be used, or modified?
7. If a deficit occurs, how will it be paid?
8. Who will operate, the village or a contractor? Who pays operational deficits?

The council is expected to consider these, and other, options during an upcoming meeting.

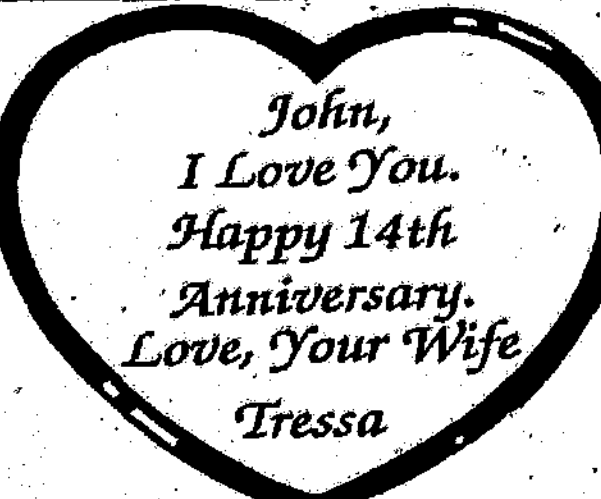

KNUTE ROCKNE'S BIRTHDAY

WIN ONE FOR THE GIPPER

March four was the one hundredth anniversary of the birth of Knute Rockne, beloved legendary football coach of Notre Dame, born on this date in Norway in 1888.

The Lubbock Avalanche Journal ran an editorial about Rockne entitled "Coach Rockne still undefeated," giving a brief review of Rockne's career and pointing out that a special U. S. Postage stamp will be issued by the postal service at South Bend, Indiana, on March nine. Among those present will be President Reagan.

When the thoughts of Americans turn to football, they turn first to Knute Rockne. Coaching at Notre Dame from 1918 to 1931, he not only developed winning teams, but also earned the lifelong love and devotion of his players, the students of Notre Dame, and the entire athletic world. He taught character to his players, instilling them the elements of honorable men and good citizens. He was a true builder of men.

One of Rockne's star players was George Gipp, nicknamed "The Gipper." In the motion picture "Knute Rockne, All American," featuring Rockne's remark during half-time to the team to "win one for The Gipper" — Pat O'Brien played Knute Rockne, and President Reagan played George Gipp.

For those of you who might not reach back with your memory to 1940, it might be good to review a little of the background of the legendary Knute Rockne, football coach of Notre Dame from 1918 to 1931, whose one hundredth birthday anniversary was reached on March four.

"Knute Rockne, All American," the 1940 movie starring Pat O'Brien as Rockne and President Ronald Reagan as George Gipp was an all-time favorite, in America and worldwide.

The movie features the Army - Notre Dame game of 1928. Army led six to zero at the half, and at half time Rockne told his men of an incident of eight years before.

George Gipp, a former Notre Dame star player, much admired throughout the athletic world, lay dying. By his bedside was his coach, Rockne, who was like a father to all his players.

George Gipp, affectionately known as "The Gipper," told Rockne: "I've got to go, Rock. It's all right. I'm not afraid. Some time, Rock, when the team is up against it, when things are wrong and the breaks are beating the boys, tell them to go out there with all they've got and win just one for The Gipper."

I don't know where I'll be then.

Rock. But I'll know about it, and I'll be happy."

This inspired the Notre Dame players so that they went out the second half and won 12 to 6.

PRESIDENT REAGAN ATTENDS CEREMONY

President Ronald Reagan was present at a ceremony held March nine at Notre Dame University where he dedicated a commemorative stamp in honor of Knute Rockne, and said:

"Most of all the Rockne legend means this, that on and off the field, it is faith that makes the difference, it is faith that makes great things happen."

Of his role in the 1940 motion picture, President Reagan said:

"Playing the role of George Gipp was a young actor's dream. And playing in a film about Knute Rockne was more than that."

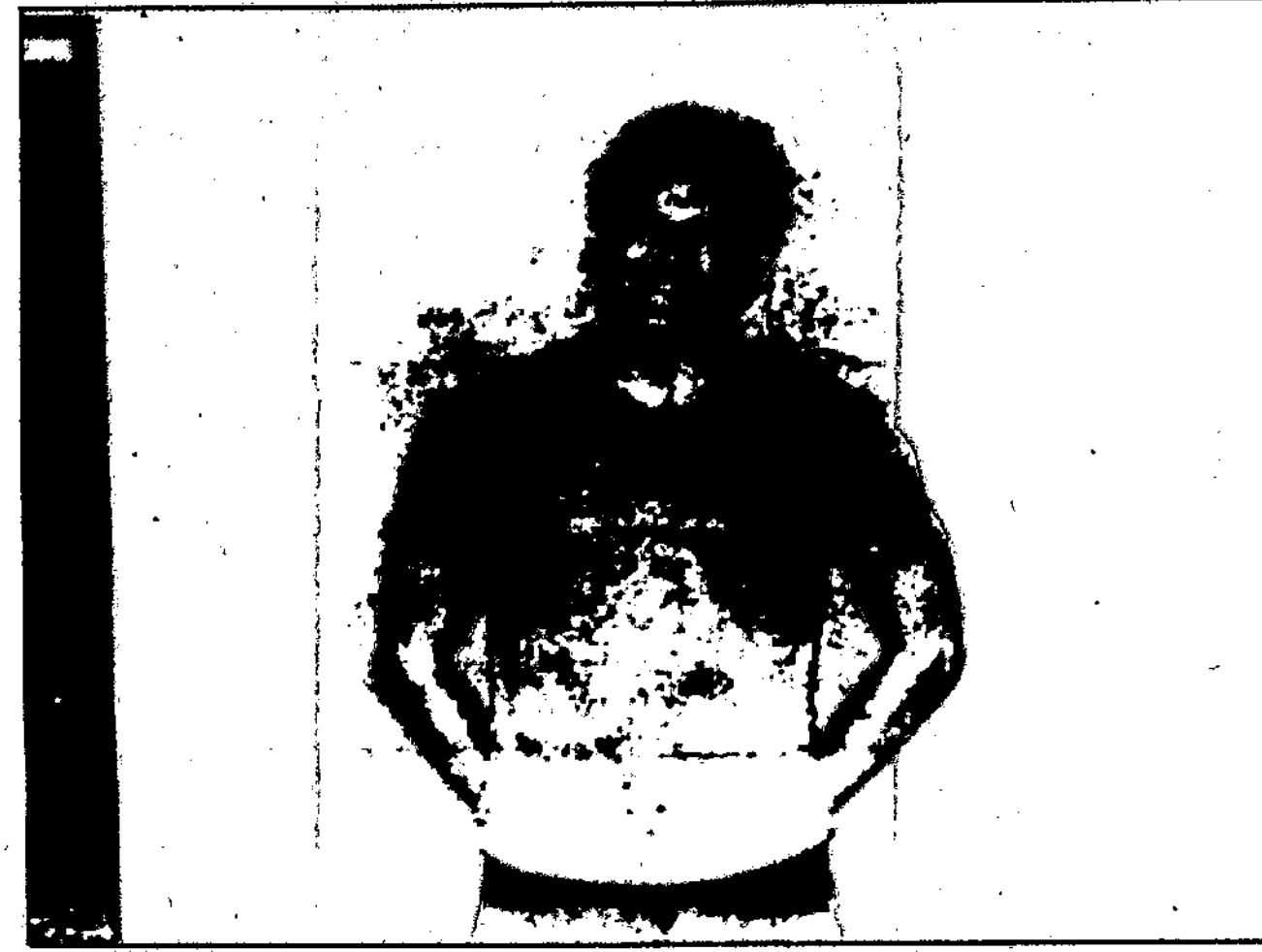

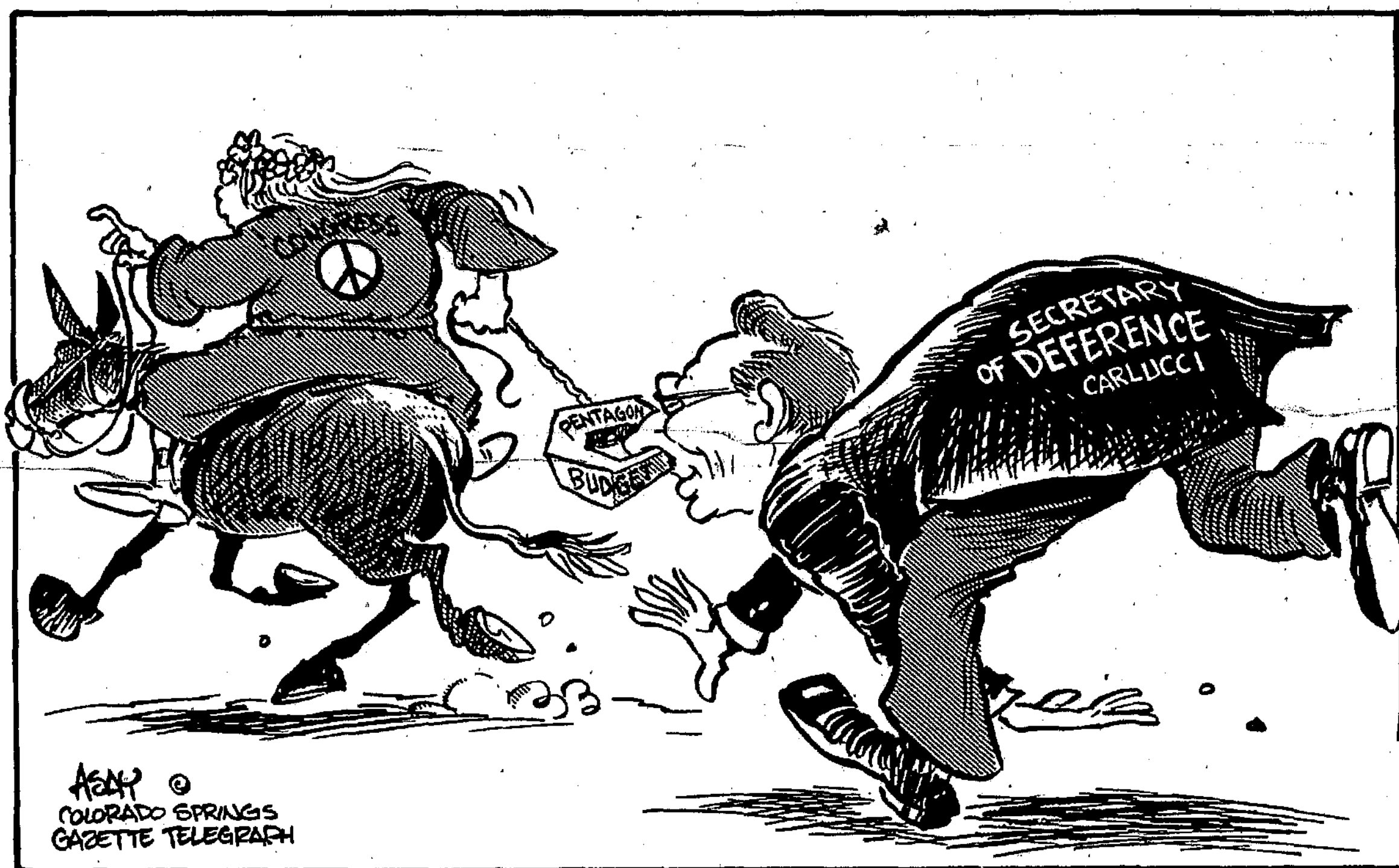

CARRUTHERS OPENS LEGISLATURE'S JACK-IN-THE-BOX

Governor Carruthers' prayer was answered.

Or unanswered — as the case may be.

Last month the governor said he prayed for House Bill 2, "because it doesn't stand a prayer of becoming law."

House Bill 2 was undeniably THE bill of the session: the 172-page General Appropriation Act to fund State Government. Carruthers was referring to the version passed on February 3 by the Democrat-controlled House of Representatives.

Here's what happened after Carruthers knelt in humble supplication:

The bill went to the Republican-dominated Senate. Five days later, that chamber passed HB2 — after tacking on 17 pages of amendments to the House version.

Naturally, the House refused to accept the Senate amendments; naturally, the Senate wouldn't back down.

The impasse forced the creation of a "conference committee," consisting of four Representatives and four Senators, who met behind locked doors to iron out the differences.

On February 13, the conferees emerged, bleary-eyed and with severe cases of writer's cramp. The Senators had hung onto most of their amendments: 72 stuck, 62 were struck. But more importantly, the conferees had added...16 pages of their own amendments.

Next stop: the House and Senate floors. Again, the time-honored script was followed: Both chambers adopted the conference committee's "Report" by voice votes.

That adoption sent the bill to its final destination: Governor Carruthers, the man of prayer.

What would he do? \$1.5 billion was at stake.

The State Constitution (Article IV, Section 22) gave him four options:

1. Do nothing. Bills presented to the governor in the last three days of the session are vetoed if he doesn't sign them. This is the famous "pocket veto."

2. Sign the bill. HB2 was a gigantic Jack-in-the-box, chock full of strings, springs and wires put in by Carruthers' Democrat opponents in the House of Representatives. Given that fact, to have signed the bill and walked away would have left a serious slash in the governor's power.

3. Veto the bill. Had Carruthers vetoed HB2 in its entirety, a special session would have been required to patch up the disagreements. Not practical — or necessary.

4. Line-item veto the bill. Governor Carruthers has what President Reagan wants: the ability to veto parts of a bill without vetoing

the complete bill.

The governor's power comes from the State Constitution: "The governor may...disapprove any part or parts, item or items, or any bill appropriating money, and such parts or items shall be void unless passed over his veto..."

And so, on February 17th, Carruthers gave his response: five pages of line-item vetoes.

That put the ball back in the House, where HB2 originated.

The unhappy House's two options:

1. Override the line-item vetoes. To be successful, veto override attempts, according to the Constitution, must be "approved by two-thirds of the members present and voting in each house..."

Well, two-thirds was unlikely in either chamber.

2. Take the line-item vetoes to the Supreme Court, and get them declared illegal.

Last week, state legislators sued — as predicted by Eye of the Capitol on January 22. We'll say more soon about the legal case.

But what about bills presented to the governor prior to the last three days? That's what happened with HB2.

In such cases, there's a "pocket signature." The Constitution says any early-arrival bill "not returned by the governor within three days, Sunday excepted...shall become a law whether signed by him or not, unless the legislature by adjournment prevent such return."

Most Governors regard pocketing bills as cowardly. So, I doubt doing nothing was ever a serious option for Governor Carruthers.

In the meantime, Democrats are belittling the ballyhooed success of Governor Carruthers in the 1988 session, by saying he didn't ask for much in the first place.

Are they right?

No.

The press and the politicians are looking in the wrong place.

Some of Carruthers' line-item vetoes in HB2 reveal his priorities. And that's why those vetoes are of continuing importance.

The Legislature had to jump quickly if it wanted to fight the governor's line-item vetoes in court. Here's why:

On July 1, 1988, State Government will start spending the bulk of HB2's \$1.5 billion. You can imagine the situation if the Legislature waited until millions were gone. Returns and retorts, refunds and reprisals: The whole affair would turn into, in former Governor King's words, a box of Pandoras.

The upshot: For a lawsuit to be taken seriously by the Supreme Court, the Legislature had to move now.

Or not at all.
