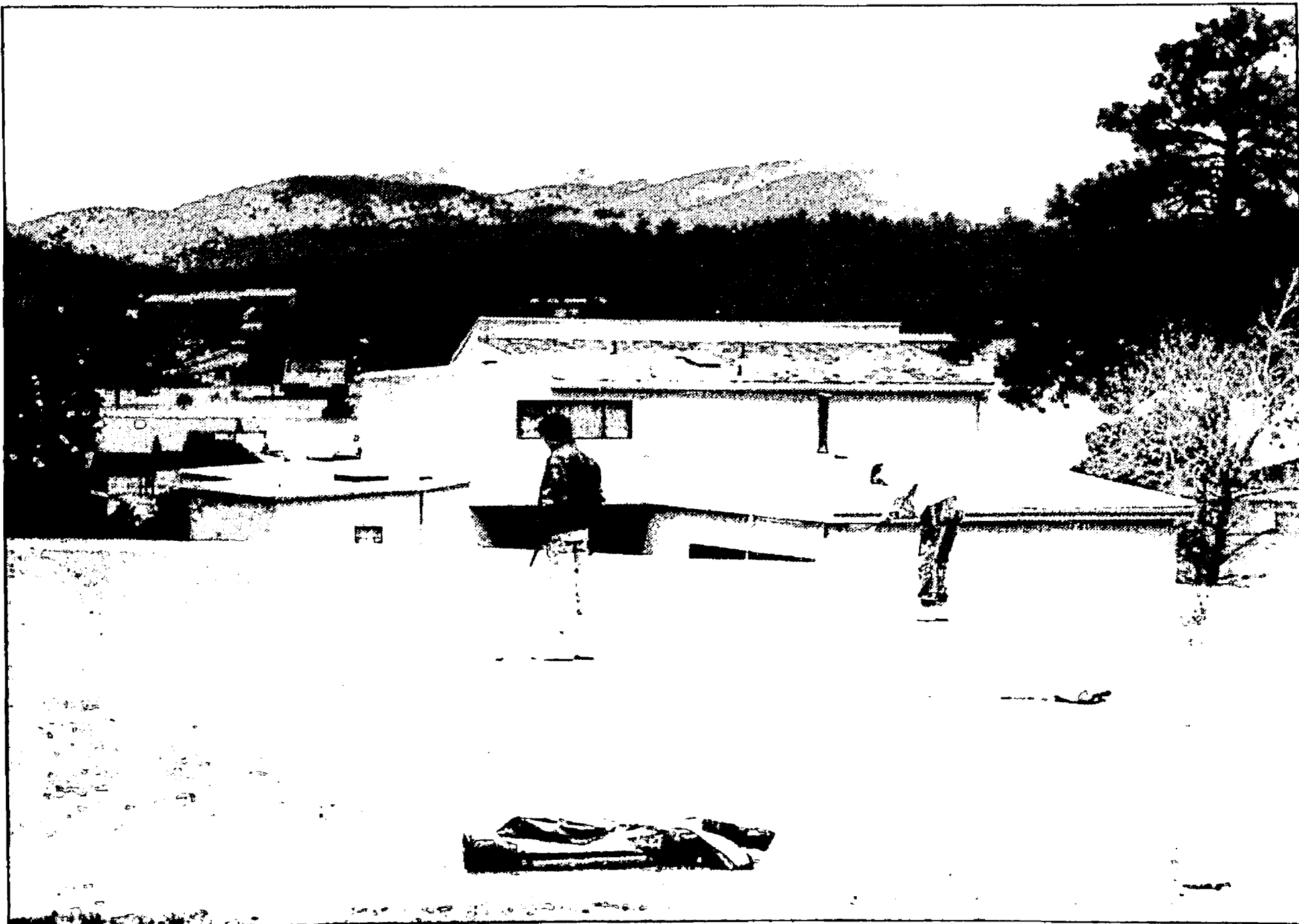

Hughes handles pooch problems

Mark Hughes has gone to the dogs ... and the cats, skunks, raccoons and assorted wildlife in the Village of Ruidoso.

Just five weeks into his job as village animal control officer, Hughes has already rounded up over 100 stray animals, and that's not counting the 45 to 50 skunks he has trapped and hauled into the forest.

A Lovington native, Hughes has lived in the Ruidoso area for the past three years. He is married and has two daughters.

Hughes had the animal control contract in Whiteface, Texas, before moving to New Mexico. Besides his on-the-job experiences in Texas, Hughes studied wildlife biology for two years in college in Colorado.

Animal control is under the Ruidoso Police Department, with calls routed to the animal control officer by calling the police dispatch area at 257-7365. Hughes spends his days on patrol, and can be reached by his vehicle radio when dispatchers get a call regarding a

loose or a dead animal.

Hughes is scheduled to work Saturday through Wednesday, but is called in if the village receives an emergency call. The village and county animal control officers cooperate, filling in for one another on days off, to keep overtime costs down.

"It's been busy," said Hughes, who is charged with enforcing the village animal control ordinances. Although Hughes is authorized to issue citations for violations of that ordinance, both he and Police Chief Bill Newman stressed their preference for voluntary compliance.

So far, Hughes has mainly been warning pet owners that in Ruidoso animals are to be, not only licensed, but also confined or on a leash.

When Hughes picks up an animal with current tags, he tries to return it home. "If their tags are current, then it's real easy to get pets back to owners," noted Hughes.

If he is unable to locate owners, or if the animal hasn't current tags, then Hughes delivers the stray to the Humane Society of Lincoln County where it is sheltered until

owners are located, or the animal is adopted. Animals are destroyed after staying at the shelter a specified length of time.

Hughes encourages pet owners to keep their animals vaccinated, licensed and confined because of the health risks, as well as the village ordinance. Just recently Hughes has picked up a raccoon and a skunk that appeared to have rabies. He said one animal was trapped near Lookout Manor and the other in the Ponderosa Heights area.

Dogs running loose, especially those without tags, make up the biggest problem confronting Hughes in his new job.

The animal control officer also is responsible to enforce ordinances against cruelty to animals, and Hughes already has issued a citation in a case where three dogs, a cat and a pigeon were found confined in a small travel trailer.

Hughes is licensed, through the State Health Department, under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian, to dispense a tranquilizer to animals he can't catch or has reason to fear. While the drug

Five jailed on drug charges

The Lincoln County Sheriff's Department, State Police narcotics agents and Ruidoso Police executed a search warrant on Thursday, on a residence located on Papoose Trail in Ruidoso, according to Chief Deputy Sheriff Rex Skellett.

Located inside the trailer home was a clandestine lab set up for cooking methamphetamines, said Skellett.

Three males, Elmo Silva, Curtis Walker and William Stengel, all Ruidoso adults, and two females, Jennifer Walker, and Alexandria McCullough, also adults residing in Ruidoso, were arrested and booked on a charge of manufacturing and intent to distribute a controlled substance, Skellett reported.

Curtis and Jennifer Walker were also charged with child abuse.

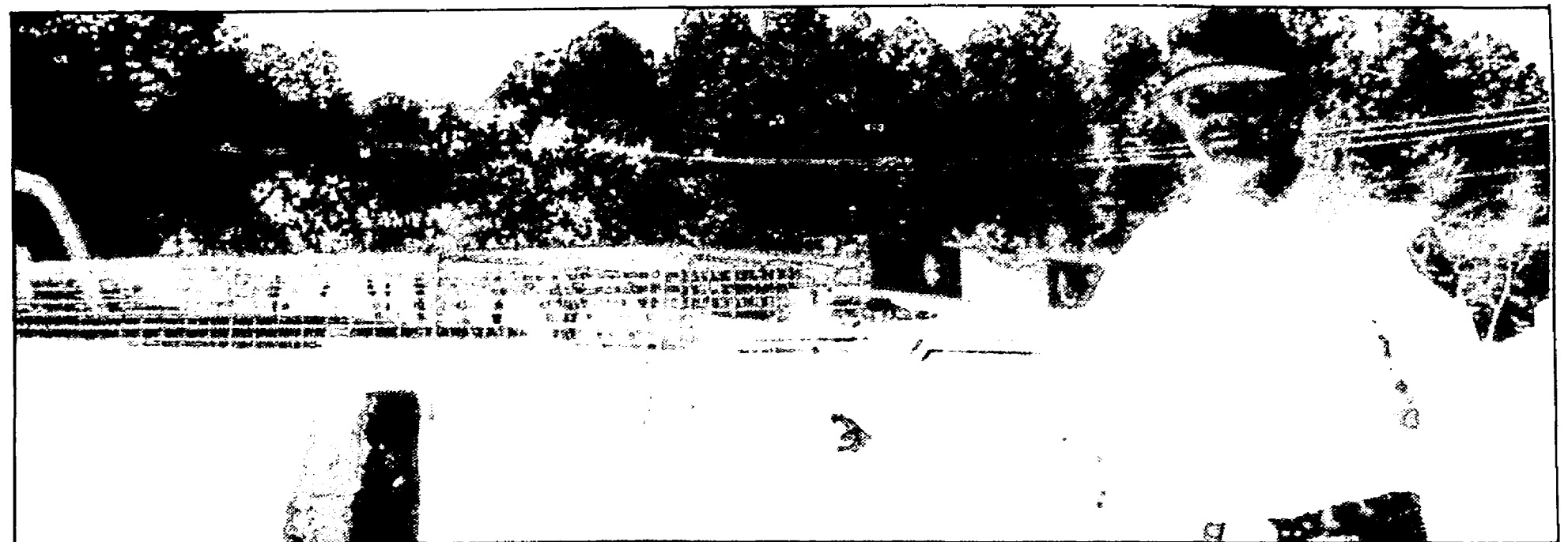
The New Mexico State Police crime lab was contacted but was

unable to respond because of weather conditions.

The investigation is continuing by sheriff's Investigator Paul Wersich and special agents of the New Mexico State Police.

All suspects went before Judge Jim Wheeler Friday morning for their first appearance, Skellett said, and bond was set at \$20,000 each. There is no reduction of bond for any of the five. All were then transported to the Lincoln County Jail.

This alleged methamphetamine lab was discovered by the sheriff's department, Ruidoso police and the State Police narcotics division in a mobile home on Papoose Trail in Ruidoso. Five people were arrested and booked.

is approved for use, Hughes said he is still very careful when using it.

The Village of Ruidoso has a policy that precludes shooting animals except as a very last resort when a human life is threatened. Hughes is unarmed as he carries out his duties.

Another problem facing Hughes when he joined village staff, was a pack of wild dogs that already attacked and injured two deer. He said he has captured six wild dogs,

putting a stop to that problem. Two of the dogs were "absolutely vicious," and had to be put to sleep, said Hughes.

Pit bulls, while a problem in other places, apparently aren't a problem in Ruidoso. Hughes said he knew of just one call involving a pit bull, and in that case a loose dog entered a pit bull's yard. "It wasn't the pit bull's fault," said Hughes.

After chasing down dogs and cats all day, Hughes goes home to

pursue his hobby—breeding and training hunting dogs.

Chief Newman, noting he already has noticed a decrease in the number of stray animals in town, had some words of praise for the new animal control officer.

"I think the village is very fortunate to have found someone with Mark's qualifications, love of animals and ability to work with people," said Newman.

Former Lincoln County Sheriff Tom Sullivan has announced his candidacy in the Democratic primary for sheriff in the 1988 election year. Sullivan served as sheriff from 1983 through 1986.

Sullivan graduated with honors from Wayland Baptist University with a Bachelor of Science degree in criminal justice. He has over 2,000 additional classroom hours of training in law enforcement courses. Sullivan has taught law enforcement courses at five different colleges and universities as a guest instructor, and has taught at the Texas Department of Public Safety law enforcement academy and Amarillo Police Academy.

He holds an advanced and instructor's certificate in law enforcement and is a certified New Mexico peace officer.

Sullivan has over 20 years experience in law enforcement, 11 of those as an administrator. He worked for the Texas Department of Public Safety for 14 years, six years as a state trooper and eight years in the criminal investigation division. He supervised a 31-county district for the narcotics service for seven years.

Sullivan has been employed at Camp Sierra Blanca, the New Mexico Department of Corrections for the past 13 months as chief classification officer. He also served in that capacity from August of 1979 to August of 1980.

He graduated from the Southwestern Police Institute, School of Police Supervision, at the University of Texas at Dallas, and the International Association of Chiefs of Police School of Management, in Austin, Texas.

Moran takes reins as CVB director

Tracey Moran is the new director of the Convention and Visitors Bureau of Ruidoso. She began her position on March 21, replacing previous director Liz Groenendyk.

Moran has her bachelor's degree from Texas Tech, majoring in advertising and minoring in Spanish. She worked in the consumer loan department of Ruidoso State Bank as executive secretary from October 1987 until March 21.

"I also did ads and public relations there," she says. One of her biggest accomplishments at the bank was conceptualizing, creating, initiating and implementing the "Light Up a Life" Christmas fundraising project for the needy of Lincoln County.

"I thought it would be good if we could raise around \$2,500," she says. "But we actually raised over \$4,500. It was a very successful project."

Prior to working at the bank, Moran worked with the Phil Price Advertising Agency in Lubbock, Texas. That agency is the advertising agency that is now under contract with the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

Moran will be working hard to promote Ruidoso as a convention

center. "That's my primary responsibility," she says. She is currently developing a convention packet in cooperation with the ad agency. "These will be distributed through the mail, through trade shows, and to all convention bidders."

She is also making a personal inventory of facilities in Ruidoso that would be suitable for groups of people, such as lodging facilities and restaurants.

"We're not just after big companies," Moran says. "We want to promote tourism to individuals, too."

Among conventioners on the calendar for Ruidoso in the upcoming months are the New Mexico Bar Association, The New Mexico Automotive Dealers, and the Elks Club Golf Tourney.

Moran's parents, in Lubbock, Texas, are family therapists. When Moran's not working, she is playing racquetball at the RAC or horseback riding, and, she admits, she does a "little sketching."

"I am open to hear all ideas and suggestions of how to make the CVB a success," says Moran. "I think that each year it exists, it will get stronger. Sometimes people want immediate results, but as I see the bureau, it is something that will build as time goes on."

Sheriff Don Samuels announced his candidacy for re-election as Lincoln County Sheriff.

Since taking office, Samuels has become a certified New Mexico law enforcement officer.

He is a veteran of the Vietnam War, and served as Commander of the American Legion in 1980 and 1981.

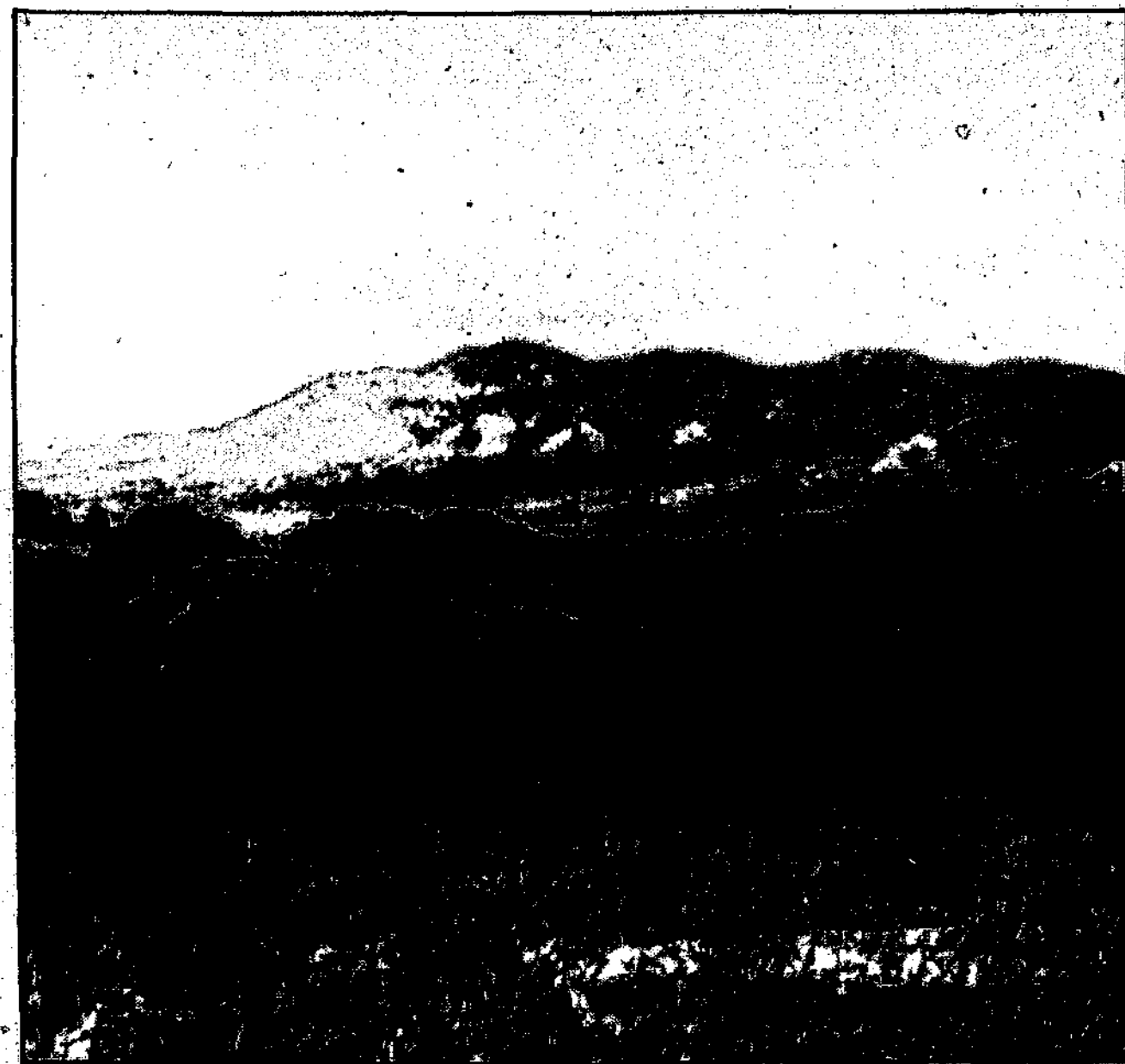
Simpson enjoys all outdoor activities, including hunting, fishing and roping.

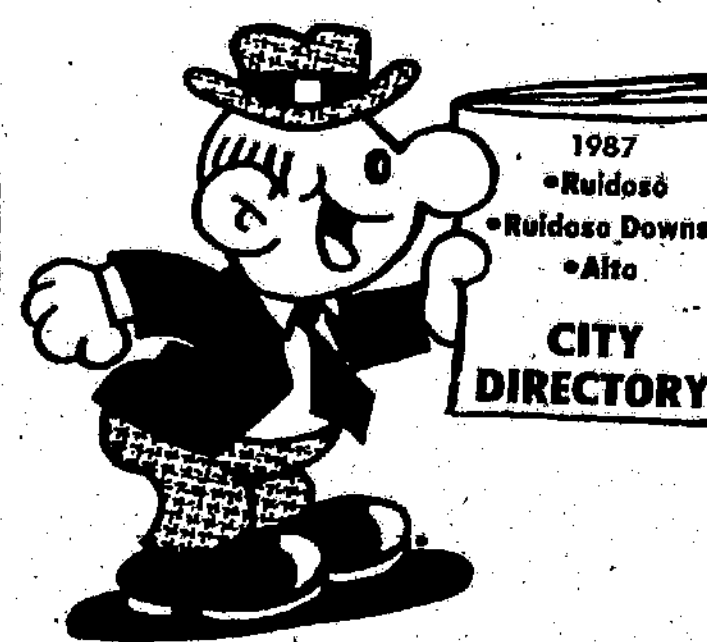

News from the Convention & Visitors Bureau

with Tracey Moran

(Editor's note: The following article begins a regular feature of The Ruidoso News, offering readers a look into the workings of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce and Convention & Visitors Bureau, from the perspective of Bureau director Tracey Moran.)

So many times, we hear individuals speak of the constant need for a strong and consistent tourism/convention industry in Ruidoso. Although this industry is very diverse and unpredictable, Ruidoso has done a favorable job of promoting itself to visitors in the past. This year, advertising and promotion have also been well received and promise to continue in a positive direction at a fast pace.

The actual advertising and promotion of Ruidoso is one of the numerous responsibilities of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce through the Conventions & Visitors Bureau. The following article was written in hopes of better communicating the general advertising and promotional process that these two organizations undertake for our area.

The fiscal year for promotional dollars to be spent on Ruidoso begins each year on July 1st and ends June 30th. Unknown to some, the advertising budget originates from

a 3% Occupancy Tax collected each time a guest spends the night in a local lodging establishment. As specified in the contract between the Chamber of Commerce and the Village of Ruidoso, 75% of this Occupancy Tax is remitted to the Conventions & Visitors Bureau specifically for its advertising and promotion budget.

With these available dollars, the process begins. An Advertising Committee is selected and approved by the Chamber's Board of Directors each year, and is overseen by the Vice President of Advertising/Promotion. It is the responsibility of the committee to seek out an advertising agency which will best suit Ruidoso's promotional needs with marketing strategies, creative ideas, and media placement. (Since July of 1987, the agency has been Phil Price Advertising, Inc. Recently, the agency received three advertising industry awards specifically for the Ruidoso campaign.)

Through combined efforts, the committee and the agency then select primary and secondary geographic markets. Additionally at this time, demographics (characteristics of populations used to identify markets), media, and budget figures are chosen which will best fit Ruidoso's needs. The next step for the agency is to prepare a detailed

annual budget and media plan. This annual media plan should include specific media used (radio, television, newspaper, magazine, etc.) and the dates these advertisements will actually run.

Monthly committee meetings are held, with the agency in attendance, in order to accurately monitor the previously agreed upon marketing plan. Additionally, new marketing ideas and directions are discussed as well as revisions of the existing plan.

This year the committee's direction is easing into a more western geographic market, which includes Albuquerque, Tucson, Phoenix and Southern California. These markets are being targeted in addition to our more traditional markets of Austin/San Antonio, Dallas/Fort Worth, and El Paso. Less emphasis is being placed upon the West Texas area because of increasing local interest in the western part of the United States.

Next in this series of articles, we will cover more specific creative ideas and media used this year for the advertising and promotion of Ruidoso.

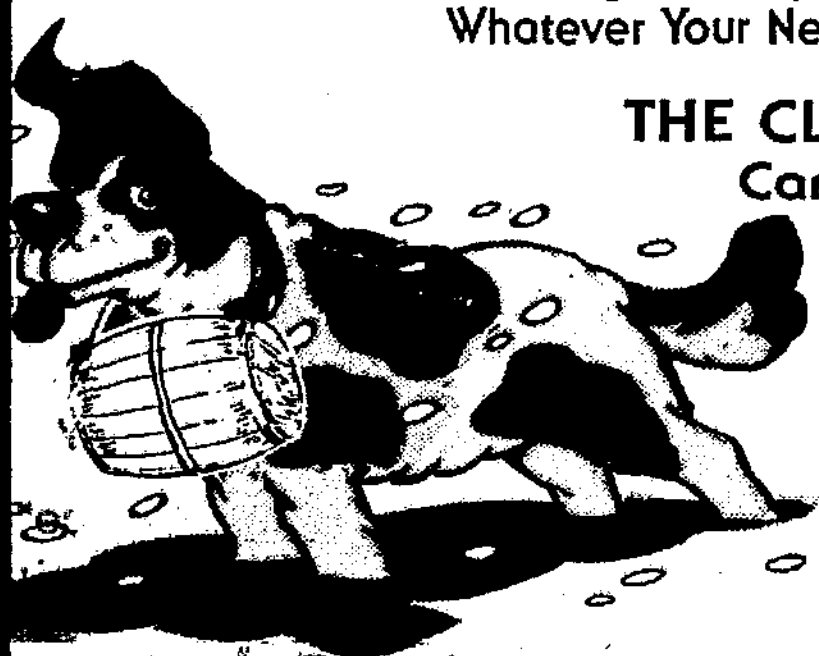

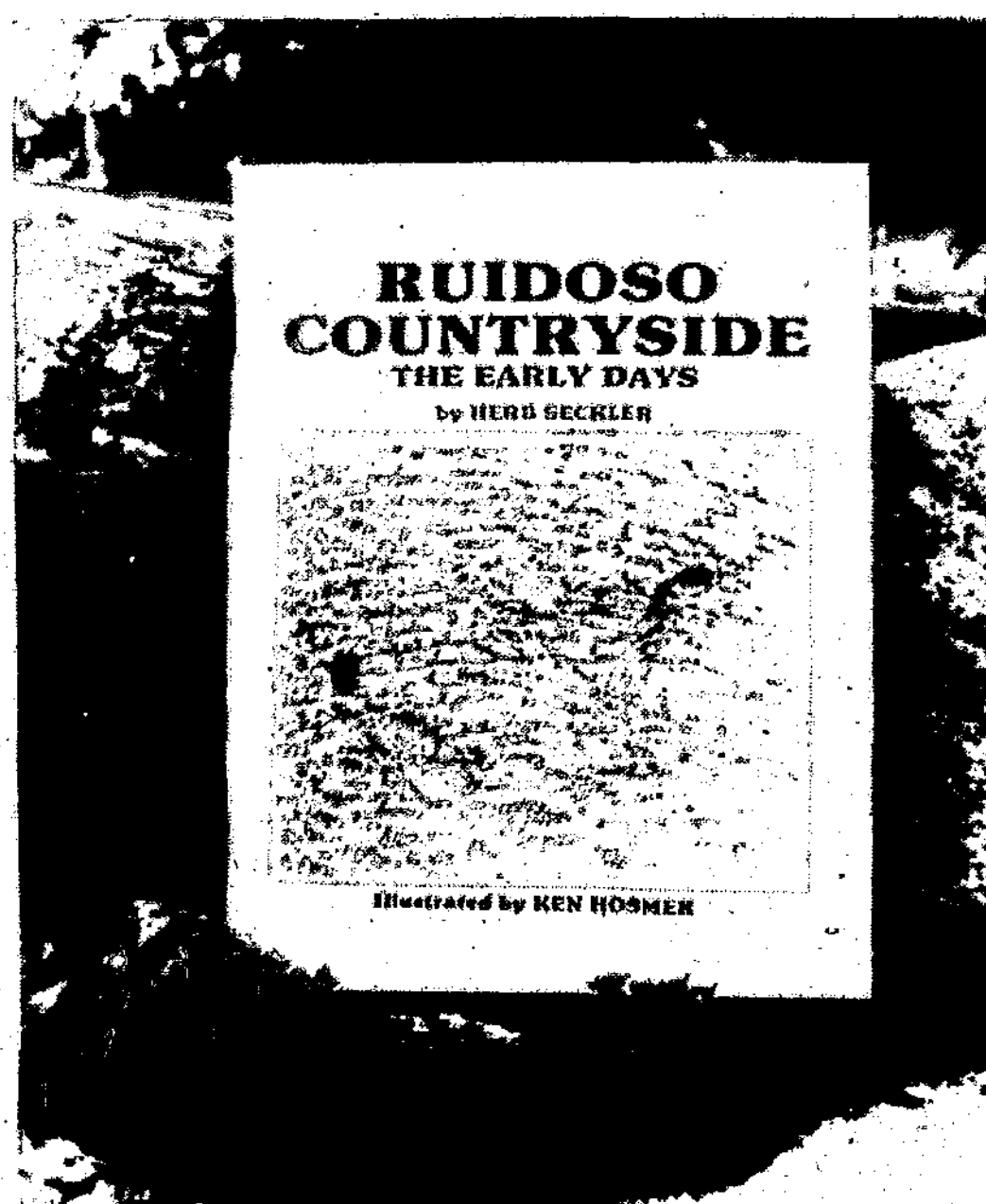

Eye On The Capitol

NEW MEXICO'S LADY LEGISLATORS: PART III

Representative Mary Thompson, Republican, Dona Ana, first elected in 1980: defeated Democrat Linda Parr by 28 votes. Parr in turn had beaten the incumbent, Bud Hettiga, in the Democrat primary.

Homemaker. Member of the Taxation and Revenue Committee and the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

Thompson says she ran for office because she was "frustrated" by a lack of responsiveness. "I decided to take a shot at it."

Thompson, Steele, Dominguez, Tucker, Hansen, Linard: Dona Ana definitely has produced a large number of Lady Legislators in recent years. Why?

"We've got a bunch of reasoning voters down here," Thompson says. "They've got to be sold every election." Due to no tradition of unthinking allegiance to political incumbents, "There's more of an opportunity to break in."

She had no problem regarding committee assignments. Energy was "the committee I asked for." Thompson feels a major reason for not being type-cast is her own attitude: "I've made a real point of not being labeled as a female legislator."

Thompson was co-Whip for the House Republicans. She later became Minority Floor Leader. "In our party," she remarked, "a legislator is a legislator."

Among her legislative priorities in 1988, was a proposed constitutional amendment providing for a legislators' retirement program. The leadership, however, concluded "the voter wouldn't understand" her proposal, so it passed another measure that merely caps benefits to \$6,000 per year. Thompson believes her version was "actuarially sound" because it had a formula for contributions and benefits.

Any political ambitions? If Congressman Joe Skeen had run against Senator Jeff Bingaman, Thompson might have campaigned for the vacant Skeen seat.

Representative Lynn Tytler, Republican, Bernalillo. First elected in 1982 to a vacant seat. Defeated James Gilman in the primary, and was unopposed in the general election.

Marketing Director. Member of the Education Committee and Voters and Elections Committee.

"Think through your personal motivations," Tytler tells would-be Lady Legislators. Victory on elec-

tion night means a lot of time later away from home and family.

In her elections, Tytler had no problem receiving endorsements. She "doesn't like putting the arm on people for money." Nevertheless, the dollars have been there for her campaigns.

Like Reps. Pat Baca and Pauline Eisenstadt, Tytler was assigned to Appropriations. Speaker Sanchez "didn't know me," she jokes. Even so, "I don't think being female had anything to do with it." Tytler later served as Vice Chairman of Appropriations, when Gene Samberson became Speaker.

Fiscal matters were her top priority for the first 4 years. While they are still important, she sees her main role now as "carefully scrutinizing bills...with attention to detail." On the House floor, she frequently asks tough questions: "I read the bills extremely carefully" -- as many an unhappy sponsor of legislation has discovered.

As for her own law-making priorities, "I never carried a lot of legislation." She is, however, a major opponent of the tobacco industry, and sponsored the Clean Indoor Air Act and tobacco tax increases.

Tytler is frequently mentioned in political circles as a candidate for everything from U.S. Senate to Lieutenant Governor. "Other people seem to have political ambitions for me...I want to do a good job where I am."

How long that will be depends on the balance of "enjoyment versus hassle." Whenever the scales tip too far toward the latter...

What would she like most to accomplish in public office? Find a "magic potion" to get voters more involved.

"Otherwise, we will get the government we deserve."

What conclusions can be drawn about New Mexico's Lady Legislators?

"I think you'll find," Representative Armijo said, "We're all a little different."

They are indeed very different people, but with a common problem. Legislative power comes with seniority. Senator Donisthorpe is moving up, but 15 men are ahead of her. So are Representatives Thompson and Lambert -- but 18 men were there first.

As Mary Beth King, the Las Vegas Optic staffer, would say: "Anyway, you get the idea."

From 1912 - 1988, there has been a total of 71 Lady Legislators in New Mexico. Only 8 were State Senators.

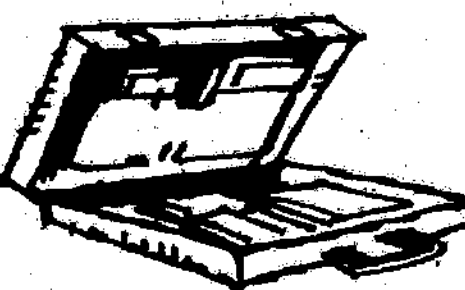

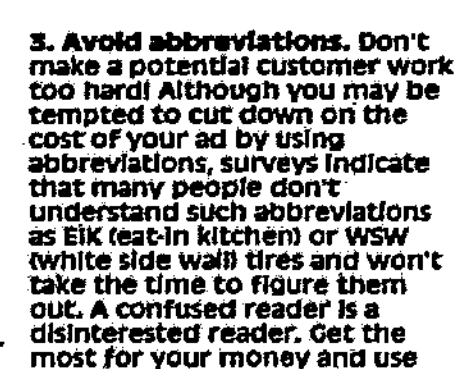

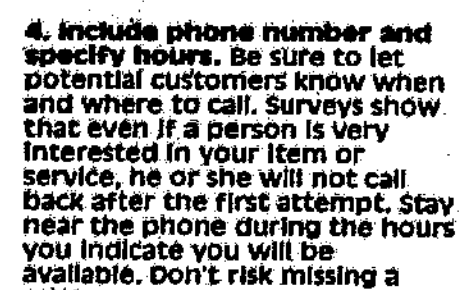
1. Give the reader specific information. Pretend you are someone reading the classifieds. What would you like to know about the item or service you are advertising? 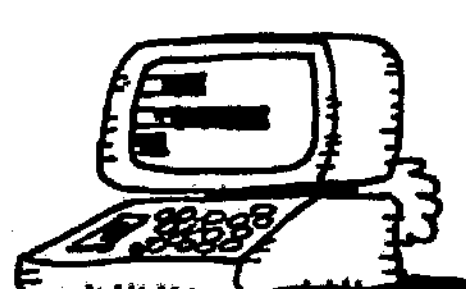

3. Avoid abbreviations. Don't make a potential customer work too hard! Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in kitchen) or WSW (white side wall tires and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.



4. Include phone number and specify hours. Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call.
