## Council, judge hopefuls get introduction at forum

Just three days after throwing their hats into the ring for municipal offices, candidates for the Ruidoso Village Council and municipal judge met Friday for a candidates' forum and coffee at the Ruidoso Federated Woman's Club (RFWC).

Charlotte Jarratt, RFWC president, said the club was among the last to host candidates in the last municipal election and wanted to be first this time, and Friday's get-together was the first for this campaign. Jackie Rawlins invited the candidates to speak on anything to help those gathered get better acquainted, noting Friday's forum would enable people to put a face with a name.

Councillor J.D. James, a candidate for four years on the Village Council, was appointed by Mayor

Lloyd L. Davis Jr. when former councillor Rick Davis resigned last year.

"I think in the short time I've been there, I believe the people know I have the voters at heart," said James. He said he worked for 36 years and four months for Sun Oil, and was manager of administration when he retired. James now works for LaGrone Funeral Chapel, returning to the occupation he was in before entering the armed services 50 years ago.

Former mayor George P. White, a candidate for the four-year council term, told of his 25 years in this community. White said he came to Ruidoso as superintendent of schools, adding he was in the school business for 40 years.

"Budget making was my long suit," said White, who said fiscal responsibility is one of his prime interests. White said his major goal as a councillor would be to hold to

the budget throughout the year. White has been in municipal government for 12 years—six years as Ruidoso mayor and six as a councillor.

"I'm number one on the ballot," said White, noting in bigger cities that number one slot is said to be worth a 10 percent advantage.

White encouraged the small group gathered at the Woman's Club to get out and vote, and to have their friends vote. He called on Woman's Club members to provide transportation to help get more people to the polls.

"We'll take that challenge," responded Rawlins.

Councillor Jerry Shaw, completing her four years as the first woman ever elected to the Ruidoso Village Council, is the only candidate for a two-year term.

"I don't feel unopposed," said Shaw, who voiced her disappointment that more candidates aren't

running for the council. Shaw said she has tried to do the kind of job the people want, and referred to comments Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. recently made that she is perhaps the most responsive to the public of any member of the council.

"I try to do that," said Shaw, who is owner of Best Bet Magazine. She invited people to call her with any questions or problems. "I certainly will listen," she added.

Shaw said she has served over the past four years with two mayors and with 10 or 11 councillors. She also serves on the board of directors of New Mexico Municipal League.

Robert Jarvis, a candidate for municipal judge, said he has been in law enforcement for 16 years, nine of those with the Village of Ruidoso. Jarvis, who is married with two children, said he is now a private investigator and operates a

haul-it and fix-it business.

Jarvis said he studied law during his two years at Louisiana State University. He said he has learned about the legal system through life experiences that have included following some cases through all phases. Jarvis also said he learned a lot through friendship with former municipal judges Sam Nunnally and John Cupp.

"They sprinkled their judgment with compassion," said Jarvis, who recalled living in Ruidoso as a child and returning 14 years ago to make his home here.

"I'll do my best," said Jarvis, calling on the group to vote for him for judge.

Hugh Johnston, a candidate for municipal judge, served as alternate judge under Judge Cupp. As a consultant for the oil industry, Johnston and his wife and daughter have lived and traveled all over the world during the past 18 years.

Johnston said he has had a home here for the past 10 years, and he and his wife have been quite involved in the community.

Responding to discussions over the difference in pay for the judge and the council positions, Johnston said the two don't equate. "They have distinctly different purposes," said Johnston.

It was learned during the forum that the judge position has a salary of \$1,500 a month, while councillors are paid just \$250 a month. Discussions included speculation that the higher pay is one reason more candidates are seeking the judgeship than the council seats.

Johnston said the village needs a judge with the time and inclination to spend time in that office. "When people get there, they're in trouble, they need help," Johnston said it's important for Ruidoso, a tourist

looks on. Village clerk Tammie Maddox distributed numbers to the candidates for judge and the five candidates for four positions on the Ruidoso Village Council.

## Candidates draw for ballot position

Candidates in the upcoming municipal elections gathered Thursday at Village Hall to draw for places on the ballot.

Municipal Judge Billy G. Payne, now serving through an appointment by Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr., drew the top spot among seven candidates for judge. The municipal judge candidates' names will appear in the following order: Payne, David C. Greenhaw, Robert I. Jarvis, Hugh L. Johnston, Sam L. Pilgreen, Kenneth G. Shockey and Otis M. Spears.

The four men seeking the three four-year council terms drew for position, and will appear in the following order: former mayor George White, former councillor J.A. "Al" Junghe and councillors

J.D. James and Jess Stinson. Both James and Stinson have been appointed to the present council.

Councillor Jerry Shaw is unopposed in her bid for two more years on the Village Council.

Village of Ruidoso residents must be registered by February 2 to be eligible to vote in the March 1 municipal election, according to village clerk Tammie Maddox. She said the candidates may withdraw until January 12.

Write-in candidates, according to state statute, have to register to be eligible for the upcoming election. Write-ins may sign up between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Tuesday, January 19, in the village clerk's office at Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.


### SKI REPORT

## MainStreet begins with public meetings

Ruidoso will begin its participation in New Mexico MainStreet when state officials make a reconnaissance visit on Wednesday and Thursday, January 13-14.

Selected last week for the downtown revitalization program, Ruidoso task force members and citizens will have a chance to learn more about the program during activities planned on Wednesday and Thursday.

Besides a walk through the Midtown area and meetings with Ruidoso MainStreet Task Force members, state MainStreet staff will present a public meeting at 7 p.m. Wednesday, January 13, in council chambers of Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center. A second public presentation is planned for 1 p.m. Thursday.

State MainStreet officials will be guests at a reception from 5:30-6:30

p.m. Thursday, at a location to be announced.

According to an agenda for the visit, it will include a program overview, and provide locals with help and training in the areas of hiring a manager and continuing fund raising. Issues to be discussed will include establishing priorities, volunteer recruitment, leadership and other subjects.

MainStreet is a self-help

public/private partnership program. Municipalities chosen to participate are granted funds to help pay a project manager, as well as three-year resource contracts with the state office and the National Heritage Trust.

town, to have the image of a law-abiding place.

Citing his experiences "almost all over the world," Johnston said the judge's job is something he wants to do, and something he can do well.

When questioned over using community service sentencing, Johnston said it's "a very good thing" and a way for people to pay their debt while learning responsibility.

David Greenhaw, a candidate for judge, moved to Ruidoso in July and is practicing law. Greenhaw said he grew up in Martin County, Texas, received both his bachelor's and law degrees from Texas Tech University and went on to practice law in Stanton, Midland and Dallas, Texas. Greenhaw said he was elected and served as county attorney in Stanton for four and a half years.

Greenhaw, who has owned a home in Ruidoso for 11 years, said he has been on all sides in the courtroom, but has never been a judge. "I look forward to it," said Greenhaw. He promised that all people would be treated fairly if he is elected judge.

Greenhaw said he wants to have municipal court status changed to "court of record," and as an attorney would be more likely to get that accomplished.

Bill Payne, whose name will appear on the ballot as Billy Gene Payne, is serving as the appointed municipal judge. Payne said he was born in Arkansas, attended school in California, and finished college and law school in Missouri. He has three grown children.

Payne listed experience that included three years as an assistant district attorney, more than eight years as a magistrate judge,

several years as Carrizozo municipal judge and service in children's court as a referee.

In answer to questions over the connection between the administration and the judge, Payne said the mayor appointed him, but has nothing to do with the day-to-day running of the office.

"The judge is accountable to the people," said Payne, adding there has been no attempt by anyone in the administration to influence his decisions.

"The mayor does have the authority to pardon anyone from a sentence we impose," said Payne.

After the forum, during a question and answer period, Payne was asked how much time he spends in his office, and he replied about 10 hours a week.

"I am on call 24 hours a day," said Payne. "Business hasn't been too good in municipal court," he added.

Candidate Sam Pilgreen noted he'd like to see that office open from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. every day, "and the judge be there." And candidate Otis Spears noted "at that salary it can afford to be a full-time job."

Former councillor A.J. "Al" Junge, a candidate for four years on the council, told the group he is retired and has been in Ruidoso 12 to 13 years where he served on the council and as mayor pro-tem from 1982-84.

"Our council was kicked out by voters at that time—it's always been a mystery to me—but I guess the voters are always right," said Junge. "My philosophy is ... if you're going to live in a town like Ruidoso ... you ought to be willing to get in the fray, and that's what I'm doing."

When asked if he'll continue to write his "political thing," Junge answered yes, saying the publisher

of the newspaper that prints his articles said there may have to be some changes.

Sam Pilgreen, a candidate for municipal judge, said he has been in Ruidoso since 1976. He said he spent 20 years in teaching.

"No one can be the guarantor of others' destinies ... I promise to do the best I can in the position," said Pilgreen. "I will do my best," he added.

Candidate Otis Spears said he's been in Ruidoso for 10 years. A retired school superintendent, Spears said he received his bachelor's, master's and almost a doctorate from Texas Tech University. He said he spent 35 years in education and four years in the armed services.

"My knowledge of law is limited, but my ability to learn isn't," said Spears, promising to "do my darnedest" to be a good judge.

Councillor Jess Stinson, appointed by Mayor Davis when Councillor Ray Dean Carpenter resigned, said he is a Realtor, builder and developer, having moved to Ruidoso from Lubbock, Texas, where he spent 25 years. Before his appointment to the council, Stinson served on the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission.

Stinson said there are a number of programs going in the village that need to be continued. He said he supports the proposed master plan, the Main Street project and Eagle Creek wells.

"I plan to vote my convictions ... not necessarily anyone else's," said Stinson, who remarked that he is single. "... so people won't think I'm running around on my wife," he laughed.

Jarratt reminded candidates and the audience of the straw vote to be taken from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. Wednesday, January 13, at the Woman's Club.

## Education topic of legislators' forum

A hundred or so members of the public met some of their legislators at Ruidoso High School Thursday night to hear their representatives answer the questions they had.

While most of the questions were education-related, there were no restrictions on what members of the audience would ask.

Legislators included: Senator James Martin, Representative Ben Hall, Representative Toots Green, Representative Maurice Hobson and Senator William P. Vandergriff. Former Representative Mickie McGuire was the moderator.

Teachers and others concerned with education in Ruidoso prepared a list of eight questions in advance for the panel to look over. After these questions were read, members of the audience were allowed to ask questions.

Panelists were invited to answer any questions they wished to. Some did not answer all of them, and some elaborated on different parts of different questions. Often, the panelists skipped from question to question, making it difficult at times to follow the train of thought.

Mickie Reynolds asked a question concerning the need for schoolchildren to sell candy and other items to make money for the schools.

Representative Toots Green answered that, in her opinion, it's traditional for children to have money-making projects. "We have a tough situation to face. New things are always coming up, and we have to tighten our reliance on state money until it's clear how much New Mexico has to spend," she said.

Later in the program, Reynolds again stated that she felt that selling M&Ms to buy volleyballs was more than she was willing to have her children do. "I've got three children in the system," Reynolds explained, "and they've never had to do as much individual fundraising before as they have to do now."

Representative Ben Hall answered her question the second time. "I have a daughter in band, and she is always raising money for band functions. You simply cannot expect the state to fund all the activities and projects you wish your children to participate in as part of their education," he stated.

In answer to a question by Ruidoso School Board member Dr. Lynn Willard, regarding House Memorial 46, and the proposed loss of local school's autonomy, Hall answered: "I think all legislators believe school boards should have total

autonomy. I don't believe anything will change in this regard."

Representative Maurice Hobson stated that for the past two years, more than 50% of the entire state budget has gone toward education. "Education is a priority item in the state, but the legislature has to be careful with its spending. As far as autonomy of local school boards go, the best government is the government closest to the people."

Hobson stated that he feels that we are seeing real progress in raising educational standards in the state of New Mexico.

In answer to a question on the future of student activity time being cut in the new state legislative sessions, Hobson and the others on the panel agreed that, in their opinions, the 10 day activities allowance for high school students would "undoubtedly" not be changed.

Senator Vandergriff, Otero County, often declined to use a microphone and so much of what he said was inaudible to most of the audience. He did, however, use amplification to talk about the state education budget.

"State dollars are finite," he said, pointing out that New Mexico ranks 43rd out of 50 states in tax revenues generated by its residents. "Even though we are 43rd in the country, we are second only to Alaska in the percentage of the budget spent on education. We do have quality education here, and I don't agree that we have lost, or are about to lose, local autonomy at the school board level."

A question was asked by a man who stated that he had scrimped and saved all his life, and as a result of his personal responsibility, his children were not qualified for loans or financial assistance for college. He asked what the panel thought of that.

"Aid programs have federal guidelines," remarked Hobson. "When the good old U.S.A. began to subsidize things, they left out the middle class. I believe we need to return to everybody taking care of their own. I wish I could tell you why this country is cutting middle American out of subsidies. We all have to keep working to make it better."

board and your administrators. The money you get from the state is student driven, and you are down in enrollment.

"Your school board has a very tough task, to estimate next year's enrollment. It's just a 'guesstimate,' really. We can't protect you financially if you don't have the students." Hobson stated that the New Mexico school system, under SB 106, is a national model for student funding.

"I am really offended when you indicate to us that we are not doing our job," voiced Senator Martin. "We are doing the very best we can with the revenue we have to work with."

The question was asked if the legislators planned to put the repeal of SB 106 on the ballot this year.

"The public drives us," said Ben Hall. "And if they want us to kill it, we would consider it. But first I think they should understand what they're talking about, and I don't think most people do. The state paid all of 1987 this year except for the \$2,200 teacher pay increase, which was a local issue. In my opinion, Senate Bill 106 has not harmed any school district in the state, and it has helped most of them greatly."

"I don't hear anybody talking about repealing SB 106, I hear of people refining it," Rep. Hobson stated. "The students' test scores keep going up, and teachers are making more money."

This statement drew laughter from the audience.

"You know, our wonderful windfall is gone," Hobson continued. "And the Feds are famous for backing out of deals. The money must come from someplace, and I hope it's not from your hide."

Rep. Hall commented: "Senate Bill 106 is not responsible for you selling M&Ms."

Rep. Toots Green made an interesting statement concerning public attitudes toward teachers. "I have lived with a teacher for over 30 years, and I know how hard you all work," she said. "But the general public is under the impression that teachers work from 8 to 3, 180 days per year, and that they are generally well-paid for what they do."

"When you start talking about repealing SB 106, you might keep in mind that we will probably be more understanding in the legislature to your situation than the voters of New Mexico will be."

Superintendent of Schools Sid Miller hastened to explain that no one in the school system is asking for a repeal of SB 106, and that, speaking for the teachers, they realize it's a good thing.

## Building permits hit winter slump

Building permit figures for December paint a grim picture for the area construction industry, with new building at a standstill and overall figures dropping to the lowest recorded level for the Village of Ruidoso.

Just nine permits were issued in December, and they were all for residential and commercial remodeling projects. The total of those permits was reported as \$68,302. Building permits already fell last month to a six-year low of \$150,468 for the 13 permits issued in November. Last year, in December 1986, the village issued 13 permits in all categories, and those permits were valued at \$324,844—nearly five times the December 1987 total valuation.

December's sluggish building left the year-end total at 267 permits valued at \$6,423,083. Year-end totals have shown steady declines over the past three years, with 337 permits worth \$11,733,991 issued during 1986; 578 permits worth \$22,822,239 issued in 1985; 580 permits valued at \$40,412,970 issued in 1984; 361 permits at \$23,652,452 in 1983; 469 permits at \$27,520,682 in 1982 and 541 permits at \$23,117,785 in 1981.

Despite December's figures, village building inspector Jimmy Neeley is optimistic about 1988.

"I think we'll have a busy spring and summer," said Neeley. "I've met some contractors who are pricing jobs," he added.

No new single family home permits were issued in December. In November the village saw two new homes valued at \$83,737 started;

and last year in December two new houses valued at \$197,540 were started.

No new commercial building permits were issued—continuing a yearlong slump in that category. Just two new commercial buildings have been started this year in Ruidoso—Alto Golf and Country Club and a commercial storage unit owned by Ronald Mills in Hudson Subdivision.

Residential remodeling permits accounted for seven of the nine redo permits issued in December. They had an estimated value of \$34,618. In November eight residential remodeling permits valued at \$55,731, and in December 1986, five permits worth \$17,795 were issued in that category.

Two commercial fix-up permits were issued in December, and they had a pricetag of \$33,683. In November two commercial redo permits worth just \$4,000 were issued, but last year, in December 1986, the village saw five commercial alteration permits issued for a total of \$53,829.



## Ruidoso boys fall to Wildcats, Artesia

Ruidoso High School's boys varsity basketball team got a double dose of District 4-AAA basketball over the weekend as the Warriors lost to Lovington and Artesia.

Lovington defeated the Warriors, 73-31, Friday night on the Wildcats' court. Saturday Ruidoso fell to visiting Artesia, 93-49.

It was the Warriors' fifth defeat against District 4-AAA teams this season. The only Warrior victory over a District 4-AAA team was the season opener against New Mexico Military Institute (NMMI).

Ruidoso, now 4-6 on the season, will travel to Artesia Friday, January 15, and host NMMI Saturday, January 16.

"Against Lovington, we were playing well for a quarter and a half," said Warrior head coach Gene Segura. "We were working on our game plan, but then we came down and turned the ball over six straight times."

"Artesia was stronger than we thought they would be. But we didn't play well against them. We try to get the ball inside on offense, but our inside game just hasn't materialized yet."

Against Artesia, the Warriors stayed close to the speedy Bulldogs in the first quarter, trailing, 23-17, at the end of the opening period.


Senior Kirk Ryan kept the Warriors close with some hot shooting, but Ruidoso was unable to adjust to the Bulldogs' fast break and press.

The Warriors fell behind, 40-28, at halftime.

Ruidoso fell further behind in the third period as the Warriors hit a cold spell.

## Schmidt, Yeatman lead Warriors; Ruidoso to host Goddard Tuesday

Jeff Schmidt and Scott Yeatman led the Ruidoso High School wrestling team to seventh place in the Bowie Tournament in El Paso, Texas, over the weekend.

Schmidt took first in the 114-pound division and Yeatman was second in the 134-pound division as Ruidoso was impressive in the 24-team tournament.

Ruidoso scored 117 points. Silver City won the team crown with 209 points and Carlsbad was second with 179 points.

Eastwood of El Paso had 172 points for third place, Las Cruces had 153 points and Gadsden had 119 points.

Schmidt won the 114-pound division when he defeated Silver City's Sean Grizwald, 8-4, in the finale.

The Warrior wrestler had a 4-0 record in the tournament to raise his seasonal record to 24-1. It was Grizwald's first defeat of the season.

Schmidt continued his domination over Grizwald. He beat the Colt wrestler for the District 3-AAA crown last season.

"Jeff's just too quick for him," said Warrior head coach Gerald Ames. "Jeff led all the way in the match."

"Grizwald is a good wrestler but Jeff is a lot better."

Yeatman had a 3-1 record in the tournament. He lost to a wrestler from Bowie, 7-3, in the championship match.

Yeatman is now 14-1 on the season.

Other Warriors who placed were Dusty Beavers, fourth at 187 pounds; and Bubba Lane, fifth at 187 pounds.

Beavers was 3-2 in the tourna-

ment and Lane was 5-2 in the tournament.

Matthew Griego, 1-2 at 140 pounds; Pete Baca, 1-2 at 147 pounds; and Charles Smith, 1-2 at 167 pounds, also did well for Ruidoso.

"We did a lot better than I expected," Ames said. "Probably two or three times better. We wrestled real well. Our technique was good."

Now the Warriors will host Goddard Tuesday, January 12.

There will be a junior varsity match at 6 p.m., followed by the varsity competition.

"Goddard is tough," Ames commented. "They beat Roswell, NMMI (New Mexico Military Institute) and the Carlsbad junior varsity over the weekend."

The Goddard match will be the last home dual match for Ruidoso. The Warriors will host their invitational Saturday, January 30.

Shane Barnett led the Braves with 10 points.





You've got to be out of your mind if you "support your new airport" in its present condition! The entire project seems to have been mishandled and lives are being put at risk. The road to this so-called "airport" is not only rough and difficult to drive in dry weather, it is impossible and impassable during winter weather. There are no markers along the "unplowed" roadway to warn of ditches or embankments. The directional signs are the size of envelopes and for some reason painted white...perhaps to match the snow? As for the "airport" itself...it is nothing more than a paved landing strip! There is no terminal, not even a small shack to huddle inside. There are two porta-jons sitting in a snow bank. One is tilted so far over it could only be used standing up, so it must be the "mens?" There is an office building that is sometimes closed, sometimes open, with two employees inside doing "something." When a pilot calls for weather conditions, the scientific response is to put them on hold while the employee looks out the door and reports what he thinks he is seeing. I could not, for the life of me, find even a windsock!

But the worst is yet to come. Are you aware of the fact that not only is there no control tower, there is also no fire equipment, fireman or fire truck out there?? I did not even see a fire extinguisher. People of

Ruidoso...this is supposed to be our pride and joy! This is what we are hoping will "turn our economy around." Everyone is pushing the project "Downtown USA" and it's a good project to push...but this so-called "airport" is going to cause enormous problems for residents and tourist alike. I love Ruidoso, I am a resident here, I own a business here. I don't want something horrible to happen to any of you...or your loved ones...or our visitors.

Do you know how you board a so-called airlines out there? You drive out on the field, sit in your car and wait for the plane or the pilot to arrive. Then, as happened on December 23rd, you watch your loved one fly up into snow, wind and gusts of more than 40 miles an hour because the pilot said he "thought he could make it, but it would be the ride of his life." It was! On the 28th, my loved one flew into El Paso to return to Ruidoso. The weather was bad. I called Ruidoso Airlines to see if they would land here at Sierra Blanca. I was told by the lady that there was no problem, the strip was clear of snow and everything was fine. I drove out with my son's truck to leave for him and found unplowed roads, two to three foot drifts, blowing snow, the strip was buried under ice and not one person was anywhere to be found! I returned home and called Ruidoso Airlines to inform them of the problem. I called from 2pm to 7pm and all I got

was a very polite young boy who said the plane was going to land either at Carrizozo, Alamogordo or maybe had not taken off at all. There was no other person to talk to.

Do you have any idea what this does to a mother? (Fortunately, my son had been intelligent enough NOT to fly with Ruidoso Airlines at all!) I do not know where all those other people are that were on the plane or if they are still out there somewhere, as no one ever bothered to return ANY of my calls.

Please, please, will someone do something out there before we have a tragedy on our hands? I am talking about lives here, not councilmen or officers or who did what to whom. Just correct the problems! We need the airport. We do not need a towerless icy landing strip, unoccupied, out of communication, without shelter, without transportation, on a road that should be condemned. Ruidoso is one of the most beautiful villages in America. Let's keep that beautiful, safe image of Ruidoso in America's mind. This so-called airport needs the attention of the FAA. I, for one, plan to let them know what is really going on here before tragedy hits. I hope you will, too. Please, please, somebody, do something!

## Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—Lt. Gov. Jack Stahl has been sharpening his sword in preparation for being the businessmen's knight in shining armor. But now he can't find any dragons to slay.

Gov. Garrey Carruthers and Stahl ran on a platform which included the good Republican plank of deregulation. Everybody knows this world has too many regulations—especially state government regulations.

On the campaign trail, Stahl and Carruthers received a lot of support for their promises to lighten the yolk of oppressive regulations from around the necks of beleaguered businessmen.

Immediately following their election, Carruthers appointed Stahl chief minister of deregulation—a post Stahl enthusiastically accepted. Here was his big chance to bash all those overregulating bureaucrats.

Stahl was commissioned to head a task force to gather information on state regulatory activities and goals; to advise the administration on regulatory relief targets; and to assist in developing regulatory relief implementation strategies.

The project is called RARE—Reduce All Regulatory Excesses. It involves a task force named by the governor and chaired by the Lt. Governor, with the purpose of providing public input and recommendations to the regulatory relief effort of the administration.

Surprisingly, with all the gripes over the years about too much regulation and no relief, the RARE Task Force has been underwhelmed with response from the business community.

Stahl has developed some explanations for the disappearance of the regulatory dragons. First, he feels changes in climate may have destroyed their food supply, causing them to gradually die out...Oh, no, that was his explanation about dinosaurs.

First, he feels there is no constituency for deregulation. Bureaucrats in charge of regulation don't want to reduce them because that would mean fewer jobs. The people businesses hire to deal with the world of regulation don't want them reduced for the same reason.

Second, he feels houses don't know how to use the tools provided by deregulation. He says that's why he's going to develop a regulation forcing you to report overregulation.

may feel that if regulations are reduced, it could encourage more competition to get into the business—so it might be safer to just leave things the way they are.

When Hoyt Pattison represented Curry County in the House of Representatives, he came up with a novel idea for monitoring and controlling regulations.

He introduced bills on at least two occasions which would have required state agencies to file their rules and regulations not only with the state Records Center, but also with the Legislature.

The regulations would then be referred to appropriate legislative committees for review and veto, if the committee felt the regulation was not consistent with the intent of the law it was designed to implement.

Legislative committees could also veto regulations if they felt them to be excessive or just plain not needed.

For some reason, even though many of us thought it was a good idea, the bills never gained much of a following.

Now, come on, excessive regulations. We know you're out there hiding somewhere. You always rear your ugly heads at the most inopportune times and we wish we could be rid of all of you. But now that we have our big chance, we can't find you. We can't even remember for sure what you looked like.

Anyway, there is currently a big push underway to get as much input as possible in the days remaining before the 30-day session.

Lt. Governor Stahl would like you to communicate your comments and suggestions on regulatory relief needs, efficiency and cost reduction to his office.

You can write directly to Jack Stahl, Lt. Governor, State Capitol Building, Room 421, Santa Fe 87503.

This may be your last chance. Act before it is too late.

Each of you must know of at least one excessive regulation you can report to Stahl's secret police. You can be sure of this. If you don't report overregulation voluntarily, Stahl's secret police will be going to develop a regulation forcing you to report overregulation.
