

Hall states position on issues before Legislature

Nearly a week into this year's 30-day legislative session, State Representative Ben Hall predicts mixed success for the program lined out on opening day by Governor Carrey Carruthers.

In that speech, Carruthers, quoting from a country and western song by Tom T. Hall, talked of proposals that will deal with "old dogs and children and watermelon wine." The governor said the session should be for "the children."

"I guess mostly what he's got on his agenda pertains to children—I don't know where he's going to get watermelon wine," laughed Hall, a

Republican serving part of Lincoln County and Eddy County. Hall said the governor's package includes fund increases for public and higher education, proposes to purchase bloodhounds for the state penitentiary and calls for a tax break for New Mexico wine growers.

"You can't put enough money out there to buy quality education," noted Hall, who isn't sure if he'll be able to support all of the Republican governor's package. "We already spend close to \$800 million on education. We put more money in education every year," he added. Hall said the quality comes from the teachers themselves, with the help of parents.

Hall favors Carruthers' plan to assign bloodhounds to help guard the state pen. "If we'd had them last July 4, we might have captured the escapees on the fifth—they were right there," recalled Hall.

Hall is adamantly opposed to the governor's plan to transfer \$19 million from the State Highway Department to Taxation and Revenue. He said legislators raised fees on motor vehicles during the last session, and accompanied that increase with a promise to repair New Mexico roads.

"If everybody's going to vote to start stealing money from the Highway Department, I'll vote to cut those fees back," said Hall. Besides fulfilling a promise to get the

roads up to par, Hall said road projects are good for the economy and create jobs.

"I already told the governor this," said Hall.

"I have problems with his DWI bill, too. I don't think I can vote for taking peoples' vehicles away from them," said Hall. "That doesn't mean I want drunks on the street," he added seriously.

Hall said he is looking into DWI legislation in other states, in hopes of coming up with a proposal of his own.

"The governor's trouble package is having a little trouble already," said Hall, adding some of the proposals of the "workfare" program have been implemented by

the Human Services Department since they don't require legislation. The plan, which includes offering vocational training, will require \$3 million in extra funding—and that will require legislative action.

"It's a good idea—I'll support it," said Hall, concerned over the cost to provide training in a state where some clients would have to be relocated to obtain vocational skills. "I'm not going to vote to empty the treasury to do it all in one year," added Hall.


Representative Barbara Casey of Chaves County is carrying a bill asking for \$480,000 for water defense. "I'll help her all I can," said Hall. That bill will ask for \$255,000 to reimburse the Village of Ruidoso for

money spent in the water case involving Rio Ruidoso water users and the Mescalero Apache Tribe, and will ask for \$225,000 for the Water Defense Association.

"I don't know what our chances are of getting Ruidoso reimbursed," said Hall, voicing concern that the bill will ask to use severance tax money. Hall said direct appropriation would be the proper way to ask for the reimbursement.

Hall said his concern is for the future parts of the case, noting that Ruidoso is a part of the Water Defense Association. "If the Legislature chose to reimburse Ruidoso

Council to vote Feb. 9 on raising own salary

Action on a proposal to increase Ruidoso Village Council members' pay by 100 percent won't take place until a public hearing on Tuesday, February 9.

Village clerk Tammie Maddox said the process began during a council meeting earlier in January, and includes publication of notice of the public hearing. She said the council will act on the proposal during its regular meeting at 6:30 p.m. February 9.

Although discussions over raising council pay from \$250 a month to \$500 a month were initiated by Councillor Jerry Shaw, the motion to go forward was made by Councillor Jess Stinson, not by Shaw as previously reported. Shaw said she seconded Stinson's motion strictly for procedural purposes.

The motion to proceed with the proposal to increase council pay passed in a three to two vote, with councillors Larry Simon and Elmer Pirelli voting no, and councillors Shaw, Stinson, and J.D. James voting yes.

"I don't know if I'll vote for the increase or not," said Shaw in a Thursday telephone conversation. Shaw said she asked the village clerk to research how council

salaries can be changed after she was asked that question by others, and recalled naming the new rate as \$500 just for a number to work with.

While council pay isn't a good reason to seek office, Shaw wondered if more candidates would have declared for upcoming elections if the stipend were higher. Shaw and other candidates on hand for the sign-ups speculated that more people were seeking the office of municipal judge than the four council seats because of the higher pay. The judge is paid \$18,000 a year.

Any change in pay enacted by this present council won't go into effect until after the March 1 municipal elections. Only those elected on that date will benefit from a pay increase.

Councillor Pirelli noted the three members of the council who are seeking re-election, Shaw, James and Stinson, would be giving themselves a raise.

But Shaw said that isn't necessarily so, since five candidates filed for four slots, and the field was increased to six by a write-in candidate for the two year term.

Police arrest two on suspicion of burglary

Ruidoso Police arrested a Ruidoso man last week in connection with a January 3 burglary.

Detective Lanny Maddox said Billy Gardner, 19, is in custody at Lincoln County Jail charged with second-degree aggravated burglary. Official records indicate Gardner appeared before Magistrate Judge

J.R. "Jim" Wheeler on Wednesday, and his bond was set at \$10,000.

Maddox said property was recovered that had been missing since the Ronnie Paulger home, 224 Spruce Drive, was burglarized on January 3. Among items reported missing in that burglary were jewelry valued at \$2,850, electronic

equipment valued at \$1,450, firearms valued at \$50 and miscellaneous items bringing the total to \$5,455. A window was broken to gain entry to the home, said police.

Maddox said the investigation is continuing. In a separate incident, Maddox said a Crime Stoppers tip led police

to arrest an Alto man. Maddox said during the course of that arrest police recovered stolen property from three other burglaries.

Charlie Franks is free on \$5,000 bond after appearing before Judge Wheeler, said Maddox. Franks is charged with fourth-degree possession of stolen property.

and not give funds to the Water Defense Association, the association would be dead."

Representative Hall also is concerned over deep cuts in the economic development and tourism budgets, adding that most legislators are "upset" with that department, headed by Nick Jenkins of Carlsbad.

"That's the governor's main thing—economic development," said Hall. "But it seems like (the) Economic Development (Department) never takes anybody's suggestions and never comes forth with anything."

"Nick (Jenkins) didn't even show up for his budget hearings," said Hall.

"I'm carrying the governor's Dena Lynn Gore Bill in the house," said Hall, adding the bill that would keep convicted felons behind bars during the appeals process has a good chance of passage this session.

Hall explained the governor's plan to increase public employee salaries by three percent. He said Carruthers expects to reduce the number of state employees through attrition, and give the rest a raise without adding to the total cost.

As the session continues, Hall calls on constituents to call him at the State Capitol, 984-9530; or come by his office in Santa Fe.

"I've never claimed to be the answer to any of the world's problems—I just do the best I can," said Hall.

Pfister, 41, lives in Los Alamos, where he just completed a \$5.2 million swimming complex project, said Durham. She said the new director is married and has two children.

A member of the New Mexico, California and Nebraska parks and recreations associations, as well as the national organization, Pfister has both a bachelor's and master's degree in parks and recreation administration.

The new director served as head of the parks and recreation department in Chula Vista, California, from 1981-1985, said Durham.

Gallegos seeks seat on State Corp. Commission

New Mexico businessman Louis Gallegos has announced he is a candidate for the Democratic nomination for State Corporation Commissioner in 1988.

Gallegos, 44, currently of Santa Fe, has extensive experience in state political, business and civic activities. He said he will run a campaign based on consumer advocacy.

The Corporation Commission regulates telephone companies, railroads, transportation, pipelines and the insurance industry. It also registers and licenses corporations within the state. It houses the State Fire Marshal's Office.

"I am dedicated to public service and will be responsive to citizen

and community concerns as we face future issues at the Corporation Commission," said Gallegos.

He is president and founder of Political Planning Association, a political consulting firm. Gallegos formerly owned the Uteco and Logan Park Marina at Ute Lake State Park in Logan, and from 1976-1981 owned and operated his own insurance firm. The candidate also has worked as a placement officer with the Northern New Mexico Community College.

In addition, Gallegos has extensive experience as a district election compliance officer with the Bureau of Elections in the Office of Secretary of State. From 1970 to 1976 he served on the New Mexico

Motion Picture Commission which is responsible for bringing the movie industry to the state.

Born in Tucumcari, Gallegos was raised on a ranch in nearby Logan. His father was a prominent rancher in eastern New Mexico.

Gallegos is a graduate of Logan High School and attended New Mexico State University in Las Cruces.

Active in community affairs, Gallegos is a former member of the board of the Tucumcari-Quay County Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Quay County Fair Board.


He is a long-time active member and worker in the Democratic Party, and is a former member of

the State Democratic Central Committee. He served as New Mexico Young Democrats National Committeeman from 1968-1972.

Gallegos is married to the former Bea Munoz of Anthony. They have seven children and three grandchildren.

The position Gallegos seeks is a six-year term now held by John Elliott who is expected to retire at the end of 1988.


"My concern will always be the public welfare," said Gallegos. "I can assure all citizens that my only loyalty will be to the public interest."

Birthday of Robert Burns

This is being sent to you just after high noon on January twenty-three and will reach you January twenty-five, the birthday of the Scotch poet, Robert Burns, who was born on this date, 1759, in Alloway, Scotland.

On New Year's Eve, every year one of his songs is sung throughout the world:

"Should Auld acquaintance be forgot,
And never brought to Mind?
Should auld acquaintance be forgot,
And Days of auld lang syne?"

"Auld lang syne" is early scottish for, "Old days of long since" or "The Good Old Days"

This song gives us a good send off into the new year, as we "bring back to mind" the treasured memories of other days.

As a boy on the farm, he became known as "The Singing Plough Boy." His reverence of all life, his love of nature, his compassion for his fellow man overflowed within his heart, and he would sing out verses of songs and poems which became beloved throughout the world. His works are eternal in their value—more full of inspiration for us as the years go by.

One of his most famous poems is "To a Field Mouse" in which he apologizes to a Field Mouse for overturning his winter home with his plough:

"I'm truly sorry man's dominion
Has broken Nature's social union,
And justifies that ill opinion

Which rakes thee startle
At me, thy poor earth-born companion,
And fellow mortal."

As we fondly remember the birthday of the singing plough boy, let us wish a happy birthday to one of his birthday mates, Miss Tommie Sue Dunnahoo, of Roswell. Miss Dunnahoo has many of the gifts of the immortal Burns. And we wish her many happy returns of the day and all God's blessings.

Warriors drop games to Alamo, Portales in weekend hoop action

The incomplete Ruidoso High School boys basketball squad fell to two powerful teams in non-district action this weekend.

Top scorer Kirk Ryan, the hub of the Warrior team, injured an ankle in practice Thursday and watched both games from the stands.

Quad A Alamogordo handed the visiting Warriors a 107-35 defeat Friday evening. Without Ryan's 30-point prowess, Ruidoso was overpowered by the always tough Tigers.

Sophomore Kenny Trapp led the Warriors with eight points, while Sigurd Schmitz, Ira Sago and Cliff Sears each added six.

At home Saturday night, a textbook Portales press forced Warrior turnovers and dismantled their

offense.

Chris Long provided all of the Ruidoso scoring in the first quarter, sinking six, but the junior cager failed to spark his teammates. Guest Tony Willis hit several three-pointers, leading the Rams into the locker room with a 51-12 half-time lead.

The Warriors showed a brief period of intensity following the intermission, but it was short-lived. Sophomore Ira Sago's hustling defense forced the Rams to turn the ball over, but Ruidoso couldn't capitalize. With five key players in foul trouble, Warrior defenders and rebounders were forced to play cautiously and they trailed, 74-19, at the third-quarter recess.


Midway through the fourth period, four Warriors were benched with five fouls. Reserve Logan Stirman drew several fouls in the

closing minutes, and halted a Ram fast-break. The final tally favored the visitors, 94-29.

Ram Collins Hilliard led all scorers with 15; Chris Long sank eight to pace Ruidoso. Portales' Tony Willis, one of the state's leading scorers, was stifled with only 14. Warrior head basketball coach Gene Segura admitted that Ruidoso showed some promise and is confident they will be ready for their district opener next Friday in Deming.

"When we get Kirk (Ryan) back, we'll be a better ballclub," said Segura.

The 5-9 Warriors travel to Tularosa Tuesday night. Having beaten the Wildcats earlier this year, Ruidoso will be looking for another win in preparation for the 1988 District 3-AAA season.

Parker graduated from Capitan High School in 1983. Since graduating last spring, he has been doing statistical work for a lumber company in Arkansas.



Girl hoopsters lose by 2 Friday; drop game at Cobre gym Saturday

A last-second basket cancelled a hard-fought effort by the Ruidoso High School girls varsity basketball team in their 53-51 loss to Socorro Friday night in the Warrior gym.

The Ruidoso squad battled back from 10-point deficits three times, finally tying the score with 50 seconds left in the game, but were unable to take advantage of opportunities and come away with a win.

The Ruidoso Warriors traded baskets with the Socorro team early in the game, ending the first quarter in a 9-9 tie.

The visitors scored eight unanswered points early in the second quarter, building a 17-9 lead. The Warriors faded to 10-point deficits twice in the second quarter, but both times managed to come back and cut Socorro's lead.

At the half, Socorro still led, 28-21.

The Warriors returned for third quarter play with renewed vigor, quickly closing the gap to just a point at 28-27. Socorro again pulled ahead, maintaining a 42-35 lead by the end of the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter, the Warriors gained ground slowly, then with just 1:36 left in the contest, Tara Miller stole the ball and scored, bringing the score to just a one-point margin, 50-49.

Ruidoso had a chance to take the lead when a foul and a technical foul were called on the visitors. But all three ensuing shots were unsuccessful. Ruidoso tied the score at 51-51, but Socorro gained possession of the ball. With 37 seconds left, they passed the ball around for 35 seconds, then with two seconds left, the visitors scored, winning the game.

"We had an outstanding effort Friday," said Coach Sergio Castanon. He pointed to the failure to convert on free throws as a key element in the loss. Ruidoso was 7

of 27 attempts at the free-throw line.

With the Ruidoso players "drained emotionally and physically" after the loss, according to Castanon, the team did not fare well in Saturday's game against Cobre. The Warriors lost on the hosts' court, 70-42.


High scorers for Ruidoso in the Socorro game were Tara Miller with 21; Norma Murillo, 12; and Tammy Osborne, 9.

Murillo and Ardena Commanche did an outstanding job on the boards.


Against Cobre, Miller had 14; Jennifer Jimenez, 6; and Sheila Reid, 5.

Two Warrior matmen place in Carlsbad tourney

Two Ruidoso High School wrestlers placed in weekend competition at the Carlsbad Invitation wrestling tournament.

Wrestler Jeff Schmidt took second place in 114-pound action, and Bubba Lane was fourth in 155-pound competition.

Coach Gerald Ames said the tournament was "probably the toughest" his wrestlers had faced, with teams from schools much larger than Ruidoso dominating most weight classes.

Las Cruces was first in the tournament, followed by host Carlsbad. Los Lunas was third, Bowie of El Paso, Texas, was fourth, Eastwood of El Paso was fifth and Caprock of Amarillo, Texas, was sixth.

Ruidoso finished 12th of 18 teams.

In the 134-pound weight class, Ruidoso wrestler Scott Yeatman faced a field that included eight wrestlers with 16-3 records or better. Yeatman entered the tournament with a 15-1 record and finished fifth or sixth with a 3-2 record, said Ames.

In Schmidt's championship match, he was upset by a Carlsbad wrestler, 7-2. Schmidt had battled his way into the championship round by defeating a Santa Fe wrestler in the final eight seconds of a semi-final match with a four-point attack that put him ahead, 8-5.

Lane lost, to the eventual champion in Bowie, in quarter-final action. In the battle for third place, Lane led a Carlsbad wrestler by four points, but, in the final sec-

onds of the match, was outscored to lose by one point.

Other Warriors with winning records were Eric Collins, 119 pounds, 3-2; and Peter Gwaltney, 98, 3-2. Freshman 128-pounder Mario Portillo finished 1-2.

Others competing from Ruidoso were Henry Kaytah, 105 pounds; Jesse Neeley, 138; Pete Baca, 145;

Jesse Guardiola, 167; Charles Smith, 185; and Mike Chavez, heavyweight.

The wrestlers will put on an exhibition match Tuesday night at the Ruidoso Care Center and will continue competition Saturday with a tournament of their own in the Warrior gym.

The Ruidoso Tournament will

begin at 10 a.m. Saturday, January 30, with finals beginning at 5:30 or 6 p.m. Teams expected to compete include St. Michael's, Carlsbad, Carlsbad junior varsity, Austin of El Paso, Jefferson of El Paso, New Mexico Military Institute, Roswell, Goddard and wrestlers from the School for the Visually Handicapped in Alamogordo.



Halladay gets behind the wheel as a model motorist

Blair Halladay has a houseful of cars—he admits he may have as many as 50 or 60 vehicles in his home on Reservoir Road.

Halladay, who recently retired as a department head for the Village of Ruidoso, spends his spare time making scale model cars, and has a good assortment of his creations on display in the family home. Two glass door cases, each filled and topped with models of cars, trucks and trains, grace the dining room. And other models are displayed in cases in the living room.

"You do them ... you put them away ... and kind of forget them," said Halladay, tracking down his favorite—a 1934 Rolls-Royce. He carefully picked up the tiny, but intricately detailed scale model, to show off the interior.

Halladay said he got interested in model cars eight or 10 years ago when his children were doing them. Sitting at a paper-covered table, covered with the tiny tools of the model car trade, Halladay smiled when asked if his hobby doesn't take a lot of patience.

"It's tedious sometimes ... and frustrating," said Halladay, obviously able to overcome those problems as he has continued to build model cars since his retirement.

"You get disturbed and disgusted sometime—then you come back to it," said Halladay.

"I don't mess with it much in the summer," said Halladay, who recalls really getting started when he got bored during bad weather. And his varied assortment of cars of all colors and types bears witness to lots of bad weather over the past 10 years. Halladay said a small model takes about a week from start to finish.

"I didn't ever intend to go at it to this degree," admitted Halladay. "You go through a hobby shop and say, 'I'll do this one ...'"

But, Halladay said, he's finding it harder and harder to find one he hasn't already made.

Among the model cars on display is a metal model of a 1932 Chevrolet touring car. Halladay points

out the way doors open and close on one model, and points out the moveable steering wheel on another. His index finger covers the steering wheel, emphasizing the tiny pieces he has fitted together to form the sleek little vehicles.

Halladay has a few larger models—one red car that is over a foot long dwarfs the other models. That one the crafter made because of its size, and he admitted the larger ones are easier to put together.

On another shelf is a model train, and on another an intricately detailed Coca Cola truck surrounded by cases of tiny little Coke bottles. Halladay also has a scale model automobile transport truck, filled with his minute model cars.


"I'm more interested in classics than later models," said Halladay. He pointed out an old Packard, and told of seeing that same model in the Harris Museum in Reno, Nevada.

With plenty of snow on the ground, and more time on his hands than in past years, Halladay expects to continue adding to his collection. When asked what's next, Halladay brought out the boxes of minute plastic parts that he'll form into more brightly-painted, correct down to the last detail model cars.

His only problem these days is finding a place to put his four-wheeled creations.



SANTA FE-The session is only a few days along and some of us are already missing a couple of the crusty old landmarks, who are absent from the halls of the Legislature for the first time in many years.

True, when they were here most of us did a lot of complaining about curmudgeonly columnist Fred McCaffrey and Legislative Council Service director Clay Buchanan. And, goodness knows, there was plenty to complain about.

A great many of us got quite a chuckle out of Fred's column but only after first determining that we had safely dodged another bullet and Fred had saved us the agony of making us the subject of his diatribe that day.

And then there is Clay Buchanan, who has been striking fear into the hearts of legislators, lobbyists and innocent bystanders since long before the present Capitol Building became a reality in 1967.

Quite by accident, according to Fred, he fell into bad company and started doing what made us all love him here--writing a column telling it like it is.

Fred and Jan are now renting a very small house on a neighboring island, while waiting for their worldly possessions to arrive from that unfriendly government and trying to decide where they go from here.

For a brief moment, we thought we might see Fred back for the 1988 Legislature. A letter arrived last week from Fred. It was mailed from the state of Washington.

Sam Fields, a long-time lobbyist for El Paso Natural Gas, had been trying for years to convince the Legislative Council Service to buy some flags New Mexico can be proud of. Sam finally had to take up a collection to buy one himself.

In quest of knowledge, I spent quite a bit of time today staring at my editor, Darrell Pehr, trying to distinguish his aura. I squinted like crazy, and Darrell did his part by trying to project the most colorful aura he could (I thought he was simply holding his breath and crossing his eyes, but he swears he was projecting.) For a second there I thought I saw something, but when I un-squinted, it turned out to be some of his hair sticking up at an unusual angle.

At any rate, this book does have some interesting things to say about color.

There are seven colors, according to Ms. Ann, and these are the colors in the rainbow. Red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet are their names. Black and white are primary neutral colors, gray and beige are secondary neutral colors.

Almost every piece of clothing I own is black, white, gray or beige. "These four colors never bring results," cautions Ms. Ann. "They only enhance."

More paragraphs later, she writes: "People who predominantly wear the red family of colors ... often put their feet in their

mouths." (Should it be "put their feet in their mouths?"). This doesn't sound like something to strive for to me! Then I checked and found that I am wearing a red colored long-underwear top under my beige chamomile shirt. Aha. It will go back under the bed as soon as I get home.

A lot of this color stuff has to do with wearing certain colors for physical healing or help. Red, for example, energizes and stimulates the bloodstream; people who wear orange often have back problems; yellow is good for the respiratory and heart region; green is good for muscular strength; blue relates to the nervous system; violet is used--really, this is what it says--as a treatment for increasing and building the activity of the spleen.

I looked, to no avail, to find Ms. Ann's recommendation as to what to wear for chronic car problems. I found nothing. Obviously, she doesn't deal with really important color issues.

This color stuff reminds me, for some reason, that when I was in high school, a friend of mine finally got the horse she had always wanted for Christmas. "What color is it?" I asked Cyndi. "Black and white," she replied. "Black, with white spots?" I questioned, imagining a pinto. "No, black with white skin," explained Cyndi, realistically describing her aging pet.

There is a section on home decorating. My own decorating scheme runs heavily toward the "cardboard box" motif. There's that beige color, again! I used to justify keeping all my possessions in liquor boxes as being "industrial chic" when I lived in the city. Now I just tell people that I keep all my things packed in case I'm run out of town on a rail.

I found it interesting that Ms. Ann recommends yellow and green for bathroom decor. Yellow and green? Imagine standing before the mirror and having those colors reflect back on your face. That would be much too realistic for me. I prefer pink. When you look at yourself in a pink bathroom, you have a nice healthy glow and it keeps your blood pressure down. I don't need a book to tell me that pink bathrooms are better for your health.

Ms. Ann does claim, by the way, that "yellow promotes regularity, which is very important in all our lives." I have no argument with that.






