## Storm dumps 13" at Ski Apache

## Legislature

### Two Ruidoso bills among 800

State Representative Ben Hall said the next week will be a busy one in Santa Fe.

Just over halfway through this 30-day legislative session, Hall said bills are beginning to make their way through the lengthy process that leads to the governor's desk or back to the drawing board. Hall said the Legislature has close to 800 bills to act on before the end of the session.

"Until House Bill 2 (the budget) got out of there there wasn't much going on," noted Hall, a Republican representing parts of Lincoln, Chaves and Eddy counties. That budget is headed back to the Senate before going to the governor

this week.

"If they don't change it significantly to suit the governor, he'll send it back or use his line item veto," predicted Hall.

Before time ran out on introducing legislation, two bills that could benefit the Village of Ruidoso were proposed. Hall and Senator Jim Martin offered a bill to reimburse the village for expenses in a water defense suit, and to provide further funds for the appeals process. Martin also asked the Senate to authorize \$150,000 for the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

Those measures are expected to be discussed in committee some time this week.

Amid the flurry of bills introduced last week, Hall said he discovered that one proposal included

plans to tear down two buildings at the Fort Stanton Hospital and Training Center in Lincoln County. Hall said the two buildings are the same ones in need of roof repairs that he's been trying to get funded for a couple of years.

"When I saw that (bill), I started scurrying around," said Hall. He said two state inspectors identified the buildings as in disrepair, and recommended they be demolished. But Hall said the roof repairs will solve the problems, since the old buildings are structurally sound.

"We stopped it... they're not going to be torn down," assured Hall.

Interstate banking measures are among the few that have been

## Bill would repay village for water defense

After a week of ups and downs the "on-again off-again" Village of Ruidoso water defense reimbursement bill was introduced Wednesday in the State Senate.

Local attorney Mike Runnels, village lobbyist, said a bill asking for over \$200,000 in reimbursement of water defense legal costs and \$100,000 for upcoming appeals was entered by Senator Jim Martin and four co-sponsors. He said Senate hearings may be scheduled as early as today (Monday).

"I'm going to encourage a few members of the Village Council to go up for that," said Runnels. "We will only get one hearing," he

added.

"It's a highly competitive environment," noted Runnels. He said state lawmakers have about \$13 million to disburse and close to \$50 million in requests.

A bill introduced by Representative Fred Peralta calls for establishing an ongoing fund for use in the 13 water cases under way in the state. The Water Defense Association, an organization of water right owners from Ruidoso through the Hondo Valley and into Chaves County, has joined in support of the Peralta bill.

But Runnels said the Village of Ruidoso will have to have at least \$100,000 for future appeals.

"We are making every effort to cooperate with the Water Defense

Association," he added. The Village of Ruidoso, along with Lincoln and Chaves counties, is a member of the association.

The Village of Ruidoso has been a party to the water suit involving water right owners throughout the Hondo Basin. Costs for hydrologists, expert witnesses and legal advisers have come close to \$300,000.

Runnels and village manager Frank Potter have said future capital water projects will be in danger if the village can't recover money spent on the water case. If appeals funds aren't approved, the village's future participation in the water case may be jeopardized, according to Potter.

## Police make arrests in sex abuse, burglary cases

Ruidoso police, in separate incidents last week, arrested a local entertainer accused in a child sexual abuse case, and two teenage burglary suspects who have been connected with a bizarre animal abuse case in Clovis.

Martin "Marty" Luther Davis of Alto was charged in Magistrate Court with criminal sexual contact of a minor, according to court records. Davis, free on \$10,000 bond, waived a preliminary hearing and was bound over for trial in District Court.

Detective Lanny Maddox said Davis, who lists his occupation as an unemployed entertainer, was arrested after a thorough investigation into allegations made in a complaint filed by the parent of an area youngster.

Court records charge that Davis did "unlawfully and intentionally touch the intimate parts of a 14-year-old juvenile, not being his spouse, and did use his authoritative position to coerce the child to

submit to the act."

Magistrate Judge J.R. Wheeler said the charge is a third degree felony with a possible penalty of three years in jail and/or a \$5,000 fine.

In a separate case, suspects in custody in the Chaves County Jail in connection with a Roswell burglary have been charged with two Ruidoso burglaries.

Detective Maddox said one adult and two juveniles were apprehended on December 14 in Roswell after a homeowner allegedly confronted them during a residential burglary. Some of the property reported missing from two Ruidoso residences burglarized on December 12 was recovered in the Roswell investigation.

Harvey Lee Jacks (Kirkpatrick), 19, and Shawn M. Glidewell, 17, both of Lubbock, Texas, have been charged with two counts each of residential burglary, said Maddox. He said a 15-year-old female, also of Lubbock, was allegedly involved, but no charges are pending against her at this time. Maddox said the female was listed as a runaway

prior to this incident.

The Ruidoso charges involve the December burglaries of the Thomas J. Davis residence at 103 Monica Court, and the Leonel G. White residence at 119 Lower Terrace. Maddox said art, silver and turquoise jewelry, firearms and electronics equipment with a total value of approximately \$16,000 was reported missing from those two houses.

Jacks and Glidewell were formally arrested at the Chaves County Jail after Maddox traveled to Roswell and interviewed them with their attorney present. Detective Maddox said charges are pending in Lubbock and Clovis against the two suspects.

Maddox said police investigations indicate the two males and the female traveled to Lubbock from Ruidoso, and then went to Clovis where they allegedly visited the zoo. Maddox said the suspects allegedly strangled a Cockatoo and broke the arms of one or more monkeys by pretending to feed them and pulling their arms through the fence.

Police reports indicate some zoo animals were kidnapped, and rescued from a motel room after the suspects were taken into custody.

After conferring with (Assistant District Attorney) Scott Key, it is our recommendation to run sentencing concurrent with Clovis and Lubbock," noted Maddox.

In an unrelated case, Maddox and Detective Mike Lovelace arrested Chris Yparrea of Alto on Friday. Yparrea was charged with being a felon in possession of firearms, and is free on \$2,500 bond, said Maddox.

As part of an ongoing investigation, Ruidoso police officers and Lincoln County Sheriff's deputies Ron Harrison and Gilbert Sambrano arrested Yparrea at his Gavilan Canyon residence. Harrison and Sambrano transported the suspect to Lincoln County Jail.

Maddox said Yparrea, already free on bond in a separate case filed by the Sheriff's office, was released to his attorney.

passed thus far, said Hall, who voted for both the interstate banking and savings and loans proposals. "Everybody thinks its inevitable," said Hall, who said none of the bankers in his district had contacted him this session.

The Dena Lynn Gore Bill, one of Hall's major bills this session, has been passed, and should be on the

governor's desk this week. "I'm sure he'll sign it," said Hall.

Both the lottery and sweepstakes proposals have been killed, said Hall.

Hall said it isn't too unusual, or surprising, that most of the governor's bills are still in committees. "There's always a lot of bargaining going on," he noted.

Pay raises, averaging three per-

cent, for all public employees are in the budget bill that is up for further discussions in the Senate, and Hall said he isn't sure what they'll do with it.

Hall predicts a full week and long hours ahead as lawmakers look to finishing their work before the clock runs out on this legislative session.

# Two injured in wreck of Subaru

Snow-packed roads contributed to a flurry of accidents on Thursday, most without injuries. But two women were transported by ambulance to Lincoln County Medical Center as a result of injuries they received in a two-car crash at 12:55 p.m. Thursday.

Londa Allen, 19, of Ruidoso Downs, and Donna Strickland, 39, of Ruidoso, both were treated and

released after the 1987 Subaru Allen was driving collided with the 1983 Subaru in which Strickland was riding. Linda J. Phillips, 27, of Alto was the driver of the 1983 Subaru.

According to the report filed by Ruidoso Police Officer Richard Swenor, Phillips was westbound and Allen was eastbound on Wingfield near the backdoor of the Mid-

town 7-11. The Allen vehicle reportedly lost traction upon braking on the snowpacked road, slid across center and struck the Phillips vehicle almost directly head-on.

Swenor said both vehicles were damaged extensively.

Allen was cited for no drivers license in possession, said police.

# Organization pools law enforcement agencies' efforts

A multi-agency cooperative program for the 12th Judicial District Target Offender Program had its organizational meeting last week.

"I anticipate some really good results from it," said Ruidoso Police Chief William Newman describing the program designed to aid in the dissemination of area intelligence. He credited Lincoln County Chief Deputy Sheriff Rex Skellett with initiating the multi-agency task force.

Ruidoso Police Department is

the host agency for the project. According to a news release provided by Chief Newman, the following agencies have been asked to join with Ruidoso in the endeavor: Lincoln County and Otero County sheriff's offices; New Mexico State Police; Alamogordo Department of Public Safety; Bureau of Indian Affairs; U.S. Border Patrol; the 12th Judicial District Attorney's Office; and the Ruidoso Downs, Tularosa, Carrizozo, Holloman Air Force Base, Cloudercroft, and Capitan po-

lice departments.

"This multi-agency task force will be the first of its kind within the 12th Judicial District," said Newman.

He said the group will meet once a month, and provide monthly newsletters with intelligence information on area fugitives and crimes.

Newman said most of the members sent representatives to last week's orientation.

# After-school program offers kids an option

Ruidoso's after-school care program for "latch key children" has been in effect for the past week.

"We had 80 initial responses," said project director Karen Tillman. "But the size of the groups will probably vary from day to day."

"Latch key children" refers to children who arrive home from school before their parent or parents arrive home from work.

The program is assisted by a grant from the state, and there is a small charge for children's participation in the program, which runs on school days from 3-5:30 p.m. at Nob Hill School, White Mountain Elementary and White Mountain Intermediate.

The program offers a snack, an hour or so of homework time, and an hour of enrichment activities.

"This is not a tutoring program,

or a babysitting program. It is supervised and within an academic framework," said Tillman. "We want the children to have fun, but it's not 'playtime.'"

If the child qualifies for the lunch program, the after-school time is free of charge. If the child qualifies for reduced lunch, the cost to the parents is \$1 per day. If the child does not qualify for these programs, the charge is \$3 per day, and if a parent needs to occasionally leave their child, it will cost \$5 per day.

After-school groups are limited to 15 children. "We want them to have a small, intimate setting," Tillman explained.


paced by Marvin Yuzos, who sank 24. Darrell Yellowcloud and Kenny Blazer each hit 14 for the Rebels.

## EDITORIAL

Are we ready to give our elected officials a 100 percent pay increase?

Maybe it depends on whether we think of Ruidoso Village Councillors as employees or as public servants, when considering whether to raise their \$250 a month salary to \$500 a month.

If we think of them as employees, then the proposed increase is astronomically large. If you aren't convinced of this, just step into your employer's office and ask that your salary be doubled. Not likely, is it?


If we think of village councillors as public servants, then we certainly expect them to have a grasp on what's happening in the community they serve. Who in Ruidoso has received a raise of any kind in the last two years? Tough economic times have caused many businesses in town to reduce staff, not give people raises.

Indeed, even the village has experienced a great deal of belt-tightening - last week village manager Frank Potter pointed out that the Street Department is operating with 12 employees ... they used to have two dozen workers.

If councillors believe they have \$18,000 extra to spend (the amount that would be added to their annual salary), perhaps hiring an extra Street Department employee or two would be more like "public service."

We encourage village residents to attend the council meeting, set for 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 9, at the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center, and give councillors their opinion of the pay increase. Councillors will discuss the proposal then, and we urge them to defeat it.

In Ruidoso, whether they are to be considered as employees or public servants, it's the only reasonable step councillors can take.-DJP

SANTA FE-When will the Duke City's Homeless Union arrive at the Capitol?

The question has been circulating through the RoundHouse for a week. It began when some of the Albuquerque homeless organized and began making demands on the city fathers.

After meeting with some success at that level, a plan was hatched to journey up to the Capitol City and do some lobbying.

My sources indicate that organizers ran into some difficulty at this point. In order to lobby it is necessary to register with the state.

Until two years ago that would have been no problem but the 1986 Legislature passed some amendments to the Lobbyist Regulation Act that included a \$25 per person registration fee.

I understand that union organizers contacted state officials to arrange a waiver of the fee on the grounds that the homeless should be considered a special case since they aren't exactly flush.

The argument is that the impoverished cannot be deprived of access to the lobbying process. To do so would be unconstitutional and subject to court action.

A challenge to New Mexico's stiff filing fees, required of all candidates overturned that statute in 1969. Party nominating conventions and petition signatures were a result of the successful court action.

Supporters of the homeless cause reason that a similar suit could be brought against a required fee for lobbying.

State officials replied that current statutes do not provide for waivers under any circumstances and that they would be liable for not enforcing the law if they looked the other way.

You can be certain that there would be those who would not look the other way. And many of them would be legislators, judging from comments heard in the corridors of the Capitol this past week.

I also understand that union organizers were warned against challenging the law by lobbying without the proper registration. "Otherwise, the homeless might find themselves a home real quick-in jail," said one of the state officials.

It looks as though the first step

may have to be seeking a change in the lobbyist registration fee requirements.

We may have found our answer as to why the homeless lobby has not arrived on the Capitol doorstep.

You may remember the efforts of former U.S. Senator Dennis Chavez's daughters to convince the U.S. Postal Service to issue a stamp in memory of "El Senador."

The plan was to have the stamp issued in 1992, the 500th anniversary of the discovery of the Americas. A massive celebration involving Portugal, Spain and Western Hemisphere nations is being planned.

Chavez's daughters, Gloria Tristani and Ymelda Dixon of Albuquerque, thought it appropriate for our nation to honor its first Hispanic U.S. Senator and the highest-ranking Hispanic in our federal government for over 30 years at that time and in that way.

I requested letters in support of Sen. Chavez be written to the Citizen's Stamp Advisory Committee. Many of you wrote and it was appreciated by all concerned.

Since I am an educator, I decided to write the university professor and school superintendent on the committee a personal letter.

Last week the letter addressed to John Sawyer III, Superintendent of Schools, Kingwood, Texas, was returned to me-six weeks after mailing. It had made it to Kingwood but the Post Office couldn't find the superintendent of schools.

I hate to say it, Gloria and Ymelda, but the "Postal Service" may be an insurmountable obstacle.

One of the letters for Sen. Chavez came from Nancy Haynes of Artesia. She says she would like to see Sen. Chavez honored for outstanding service to New Mexico and his nation...but not because he was Hispanic.

"Sen. Chavez did not use his race as a stepping stone to greatness. He used intelligence, long hours, a bent back and sturdy legs, twinkling eyes, and a heart that showed...some people call that work."

"One's race and relationship to God are ever a part of us but education we draw from other men. Sen. Chavez was a great American."






