Legislature

Hall reports on session's success

"It's a pleasure to be back home," said State Representative Ben Hall, just back from a 30-day legislative session in Santa Fe.

Guest speaker for the Federated Republican Women of Lincoln County, Hall, a Republican representing parts of Lincoln, Chaves and Eddy counties, gave a legislative report on Tuesday.

"The first thing I had a hand in was the Dena Lynn Gore bill," said Hall, pleased to announce a compromise bill made it through both houses that won't allow convicted felons out on bail while awaiting trial. Governor Garrey Carruthers signed that bill into law before the session was over.

"We did not raise taxes," remarked Hall, who described some of the funds that were allocated to Ruidoso and the area.

Representative Hall disagreed with reports that Ruidoso benefitted by about \$500,000 from the session. He said Ruidoso will receive \$250,000 as reimbursement for water defense costs. But Hall said Ruidoso will not get \$100,000 of the \$225,000 allocated to the Water Defense Association (WDA), except as it benefits through its membership in that regional water defense organization.

Village lobbyist Mike Runnels, contacted after Hall's speech, said Ruidoso can expect to use \$100,000 of the WDA funding because of an agreement reached in Santa Fe between Hubert Quintana, executive director of the WDA, and village manager Frank Potter. However, the bill utilizes the funds through the WDA.

Hall said the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport was granted \$150,000 to be used as matching funds in developing the regional air facility. The fiscal agent for the airport construction is the County of Lincoln.

"We didn't pass a gambling bill for Angel Fire," said Hall, who was against that measure.

Public employees got a raise in the governor's pay package, but only if the size of state employment is reduced, through attrition, by one percent, said Hall. Teachers got a 1.6 percent pay increase, but Hall said that raise isn't guaranteed, for when the money gets to the separate school systems, it's up to the local administration how money is spent.

Of the \$1.5 billion state budget, \$853 million goes into education, noted Hall.

"Some people say that's too much—some say it's not enough—we say that's what we have," he added.

This legislative session passed stiffer penalties for drunk drivers, that could result in a fourth or subsequent offender losing a car and spending some time in jail.

"This is enforceable," said Hall.

But the governor didn't get higher speeding fines he requested.

Hall said a bill passed to privatize some corrections facilities in hopes the agency can be run more efficiently and more cost-effectively by a private sector company. Under state management it costs \$90,000 to

construct a cell, and about \$27,000 to keep a prisoner in that cell for one year.

"We believe it can be handled on a more economic basis," said Hall, recalling how the corrections budget has mushroomed from \$20 million in 1980 to over \$100 million this year.

Hall said he doesn't expect any big changes to accompany the interstate banking bill that finally made its way through the Legislature. That issue has been before lawmakers the past few years, and finally was approved this session.

"According to bankers that wanted it, it's going to rain money," quipped Hall.

During discussions over increased costs to license vehicles, Hall said Lincoln County residents will benefit from those fees. "In the next four years the State Highway Department will spend \$40 to \$50 million in this county," said Hall. He opposed the unsuccessful attempt by the governor to take highway funds and move them into the general fund.

Hall had words of praise for fellow Republicans Governor Garrey Carruthers and Attorney General Hal Stratton.

"Hal is the only AG I've known in my political career who has had guts enough to stand up and say ... you're not obeying the law," said Hall, agreeing with Stratton's stand on retirement benefits for lawmakers.

"In the long run Garrey Carruthers is going to be one of the better governors we've had," said Hall. "He's a pleasure to work with," he added, noting that Carruthers has committed his support to helping 23 senators get elected which would give him a Republican majority in the Senate.

Hall is completing his second term in the state House.

Voters to make selections in Tues. elections

Area residents will vote on municipal offices in balloting scheduled for Tuesday, March 1.

Ruidoso voters may cast their ballots from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday in the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

Four councillors and a municipal judge will be selected in the Village of Ruidoso. Running for one two-year term on the council are Jerry Shaw, an incumbent finishing a four-year term, and Thomas B. McNeil, running as a write-in candidate.

Four men are vying for three

four-year terms on the council: Councillors J.D. James and Jess Stinson, both appointed to the present council by Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr.; former Mayor and Councillor George P. White; and former Councillor J.A. "Al" Junge.

A field of seven are seeking the job of municipal judge. They are: Municipal Judge Billy Gene Payne, appointed to the post by Mayor Davis; former Alternate Judges Hugh Johnston and Sam Pilgreen; and David Greenhaw, Robert I. Jarvis, Kenneth Shockley and Otis Spears.

Ruidoso Downs voters will cast ballots in the Tuesday election at Ruidoso Downs Village Hall, from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Seeking a four-year term as municipal judge will be incumbent Harrold Mansell, who was appointed to finish the term left open when former Judge Martin Valenzuela disappeared, and write-in candidate Joe Southard.

Running for three four-year seats on the Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees are incumbents Leonard Bergeron, Fred Bernard

and William (Bill) Smith; and candidates Alice Allison and Thurman D. Gartman.

Capitan voters may vote in the municipal elections on Tuesday, March 1, at the fairgrounds between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Voters will be asked to elect two people to the Capitan Board of Trustees. Candidates include: Norman Renfro, incumbent; James Clees; William MacVeigh; Lee York; and Darralene Stewart.

Grand jury returns 11 indictments

Assistant District Attorney Scott Key said 11 indictments were handed down on Wednesday by a Lincoln County grand jury meeting in Carrizozo.

Key listed the following indictments:

—Chris Yparrea of Alto was indicted on two counts for felony possession of a firearm and one count

of receiving stolen property.

—William Ray Gardner, 19, was indicted on one count of residential burglary and one count of felony possession of a firearm.

—Charles Franks was indicted on three counts of receiving stolen property. He also was indicted on misdemeanor charges, possession of

marijuana less than an ounce and possession of drug paraphernalia.

—Harvey Lee Jacks (Kirkpatrick), 19, of Lubbock, Texas, was indicted on two counts of residential burglary.

—Harold Wayne Perry was indicted on one count of larceny of a

firearm.

Key said the grand jury convened in response to a petition asking for an investigation of the Lincoln County Commission, attorney and manager, also will function as a normal grand jury, hearing evidence in criminal cases. That grand jury returned the indictments listed.

Downs police recover \$1,000 stereo system

A stolen stereo system valued at an estimated \$1,000 was recovered just a day and a half later by Ruidoso Downs Police Chief G.L. "Skip" Hazel.

The stereo equipment was taken from Great American Land and Cattle Company steak house at about 1 a.m. February 21, said Hazel.

Downs Officers Robert Layher

and Frank Cooper responded to the silent alarm within two minutes and "just missed" the burglars coming out the front door, said Hazel.

A tip February 23 led Hazel to an area of forest and after a 45-minute search, he discovered the missing equipment.

No suspects are yet in custody, but Hazel said he expects to make two arrests soon.

Forest Service will upgrade O-Bar-O road

Thursday's Ruidoso News report on the regular Lincoln County Commissioners meeting omitted the information that commissioners did sign a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Forest Service to upgrade County Road CO 24, also known as Forest Road No. 441 or

the road that runs past the O-Bar-O ranching headquarters.

The Forest Service will install a cattle guard and three pipe culverts and will reshape the roadway with approximately 1,500 yards of crushed aggregate from the gravel pit in Devil's Canyon.

There is no specific completion date for this work.

The appointed Road Review Committee is still in effect, and will continue to assess the road situation. A tentative date for their review has been scheduled for Monday, March 21.

Zoning map public hearing cancelled

A public hearing scheduled for Wednesday, March 2, over the proposed zoning map has been cancelled.

"We just don't have everything quite ready," said village staff member Leon Eggleston who heads the division that oversees the Planning and Zoning Department.

Eggleston said the proposed map changes no property uses, but does include zoning changes to make the

map conform to the new zoning ordinance designations and historical use of some properties. He said letters have to go out before the hearing to every property owner affected by the new map and every property owner within 100 feet of affected areas. That amounts to around 2,500 letters.

Another factor involving planning and zoning actions is that all terms on the Planning and Zoning

Commission expire with the March 1 municipal election. It's possible that group could have all possible members after the mayor makes his appointments, but it's sure the commission will have several new members because it is currently short two members due to resignations.

Eggleston said the public hearing will be rescheduled soon.

Building permits Construction rebounds a bit in January

Village building levels recovered slightly in January over a winter slump recorded in December 1987.

After hitting the lowest recorded levels in December, the value of the 11 building permits issued in January was more than triple that of the nine issued in December. January's permits totaled \$246,420—up from December's nine permits with a valuation of just \$68,302, and up significantly from last January's 11 permits valued at only \$188,943.

After December's dry spell, with no new single family residence starts, one new home permit worth \$79,626, was issued in January. Last year in January one such permit was issued, valued at \$65,735.

Commercial building remains at a standstill with no new commer-

cial permits issued last month, in December or a year ago, in January 1987.

A trend toward remodeling continued with seven residential addition/alteration permits valued at \$67,094 recorded in January. In December seven home fix-up permits were issued with a value of \$34,619, and in January 1987 the building department listed nine remodeling permits valued at \$91,627.

Commercial remodeling remains steady, with two commercial addition/alteration permits worth \$99,000 issued in January, two valued at \$33,683 issued in December and one with a valuation of \$31,581 issued in January 1987.

One foundation permit valued at \$700 was recorded in January.

- Sunny Slope, residential repair, \$14,000.
- Lakeside Estate Unit 1, garage conversion, \$2,200.
- Lakeview Estates Condo, interior commercial conversion, \$3,000.
- Forest Heights, residential repair, \$9,500.
- Ruidoso Care Center, exterior sitework, \$96,000.


Have a say in the way your village is being handled-vote in the election Tuesday.

Eye On The Capitol

(Editor's note: Tom Warson, Ph.D., has been keeping newspapers up on happenings in Santa Fe since June 1987 with his column, "Eye On The Capitol." The column is distributed to papers across the state, and now will be included as a regular feature of The Ruidoso News on the Opinion Page. Warson, whose degree is in political science, worked in Santa Fe as a legislative aide and political consultant for nearly a decade before beginning "Eye On The Capitol.")

IT WAS A DARK AND STORMY BILL
"Strike."
"Strike the words and punctuation."
"Strike all."
So read an amendment sponsored by Representative Delbert Sundberg from Los Alamos, on February 9, 1988.

The bill he wanted to amend: House Appropriations and Finance Committee Substitute for House Bill 21. If that doesn't sound dreary enough, try the core of the bill's title: "AMENDING, REPEALING AND ENACTING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978 PERTAINING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCE."

Shades of Stalinist architecture. Behind that gray facade, however, could be one of the major stories of the upcoming elections to the New Mexico State Legislature.

Over half of the entire state budget is spent on public schools. Most of the money is sent out monthly to each school district on the basis of an "equalization formula." For 1988-89, the total will be \$736 million.

Yep. That's your money. One school district, however, is more equal than others. Due to a hypothetical tax put in place in 1981, Los Alamos gets \$1,597 per member more than other districts.

House Bill 17, sponsored by Representative Max Coll, would have removed that special subsidy to Los Alamos, and distributed the money throughout the other 87 districts. The total amount of the Los Alamos subsidy: \$1,180,228.85.

HB17 would not have removed Los Alamos' privileged position entirely. The Atomic City's advantage would have fallen from \$1,597 to "only" \$1,259 more per member.

So, what does HB17 have to do with HB21, the cold and gray bill? Coll amended his Los Alamos measure into HB21. Sundberg's "strike" amendment was devised to destroy the Coll fix, and to retain the financial boon to Los Alamos - at the expense of all the other school districts.

My Feb. 1 column gave a breakdown of the additional money each school district would receive if the Coll measure became law. The amounts varied greatly - all the way from \$688.96 for Mosquero to \$361,274.39 for Albuquerque.

Obviously, the Representatives who voted against the amendment voted for more money for their districts. That's precisely what you would expect them to do - why you elected them in the first place.

And 32 of them did it. Their names: Francis Armijo (Dem., Bernalillo), Thomas Atcitty (Dem., San Juan), Glenn Briscoe (Dem., Quay, Harding, Union and Curry), Max Coll (Dem., Santa Fe), Pauline Eisenstadt (Dem., Sandoval), George Galanis (Dem., McKinley), Vincent Gallegos (Dem., Curry), Ralph Hartman (Dem., Dona Ana), Gary Hocevar (Dem., Bernalillo), Robert Johnson (Dem., Sandoval, Cibola and McKinley), Ben Lujan (Dem., Santa Fe), Fred Luna (Dem., Valencia), Roger Madalena (Dem., Sandoval and Cibola), Cisco McSorley (Dem., Bernalillo), Toby Michael (Dem., Cibola), Kelly Mora (Dem., Colfax, Mora and San Miguel), Mike Oguin (Dem., Socorro, Catron and Valencia), Al Otero (Dem., Bernalillo), Frederick Peralta (Dem., Taos), Angie Perez (Dem., Santa Fe), Kiki Saavedra (Dem., Bernalillo), Louis Sanchez (Dem., Rio Arriba), Ray Sanchez (Dem., Bernalillo), Albert Shirley (Dem., McKinley and Cibola), Dan Silva (Dem., Bernalillo), Ruben Smith (Dem., Dona Ana), Paul Taylor (Dem., Dona Ana), Al Valdez (Dem., Bernalillo), Lucky Varela (Dem., Santa Fe), Ray Vargas (Dem., Bernalillo), Sam Vigil (Dem., San Miguel and Guadalupe) and Charlie Winters (Dem., San Juan).

What about the other Representatives? Leo Watchman (Dem., San Juan and McKinley) had an excused absence.

All the remaining 37 Representatives voted in favor of the Sundberg amendment. They let Los Alamos keep its million-dollar subsidy.

Two pro-amendment votes are understandable. Naturally, Delbert Sundberg voted "yes"; so did Nick Salazar, who works in Los Alamos.

So, why did the other 35 Representatives vote for the amendment - apparently against their own districts?

I'd like to ask them. I'd like to give them a chance to reply. After all, they may have very good explanations.

Unfortunately, I can't. Article IV, Section 13, of the State Constitution says that outside of their chambers, the members of the legislature "shall not be questioned... for any vote cast in either house."

There's an odd thing about the Sundberg amendment. I counted a total of 10 "strikes" in it.

Makes you wonder what kind of game was played.

It sure wasn't baseball.

Since nobody can question the 37 legislators about their votes,

only pure speculation remains.

The vote on the Sundberg amendment split along party lines. For the most part, the Democrats opposed the amendment; the Republicans favored it.

The Republicans had positive and negative reasons for siding with Sundberg.

Sundberg is a Republican. So the vote was a display of solidarity.

To get his fellow Republicans to walk the plank for him, however, you can be sure Sundberg gave something in return - a big something.

On the negative side, Republicans were teed off at Max Coll, the Los Alamos fix sponsor. Behind their anger: Coll quit the Republicans and joined the Democrats in

1983.

But there's another, more recent reason to be wrathful: Coll is Chairman of the powerful House Appropriations and Finance Committee. He has not been overly inclined to give Republicans what they want.

Coll ardently pursued the Los Alamos fix. (He later displayed a printout of the vote on his office wall). The vote on the Sundberg amendment, therefore, gave the Republicans a chance to get even.

Now, there's no such thing as a powerful committee chairman not in need of getting his nose tweaked now and then.

The question is: When do you do it?

Letters to the editor

DEAR EDITOR:
Now that the petition has been turned in and I've reread some old Letters to the Editor and articles by Al Junge, I feel it's time "for the rest of the story."

After being elected the County Commission inherited: (1) 2 attorneys under signed contracts for \$75 an hour plus one for \$37.50 for water lawsuits; (2) Cedar Creek Road unfinished even after all the road co-op money and close to \$200,000 more had been spent; (3) No money or land for a new road to the airport (Nielsons has held up your road by filing 3 protests and lawsuits to stop construction even though they were not the low bidder on either of the 2 bid numbers; (4) One attorney under another contract for over \$89,000; (5) An airport comm. that would have led to double taxation for Capitan, Ruidoso Downs and Ruidoso; (6) A shortfall of over \$200,000 in the airport comm. funds that could have stopped construction of the airport, with the exception of the road (which we're working on). All of these problems and more have been taken care of.

Al Junge in the Lincoln County News worried that county government had come to a slow walk-wrong. More capital outlay money has and will be spent for projects in Lincoln County than at any other single term of county commissioners. A new personnel policy is being drafted with input from all the other elected officials. The 1st zoning ordinance for Lincoln County is being prepared for public comment. The Fort Stanton study for other projects as well as the hospital have been presented to the public. Also your county money is safe (state law says that the county commissioners are responsible for all county funds and we have been constantly checking on your money). When I served on the Ruidoso Village Council, we also had money in Moncor - but we got ours out before it was in danger of being lost forever! These and many more projects have been started and/or finished. But let us move on

to the communication between elected officials which Mr. Junge thinks could have solved some of our current problems (I was on the Ruidoso Water Board when Mr. Junge made his water deal with Fawn Ridge, but that's another story - quite a story).

Since being elected over 1 year and two months ago, I have dropped by the Sheriff's Office and others after every commission meeting except 2 or 3 as well as going by when I was in Carrizozo at other times to see if I could be of any help whatsoever. The commissioners set up a special budget hearing for just the Sheriff's Department - it went unattended by the sheriff with no phone call or memo. The commission set up an executive session to discuss personnel with the sheriff - after waiting 45 minutes while the sheriff was in his office with no phone call or memo we adjourned. I talked with Dan Bryant, the sheriff's attorney, about setting up a meeting in Dan's office with each of the commissioners, one at a time, so the sheriff wouldn't feel at a disadvantage - to date no phone call or memo.

Since taking office in January, 1986, I have received 3 phone calls from the Sheriff's Department all on the same day dealing with uniform purchasing violations. When the Sheriff's Office obtained a \$50,000 grant and the county didn't have the \$25,000 matching funds, I went over and worked with Rex Skellett to come up with in-kind services so the Sheriff's Department could get the grant. When the sheriff came in and asked "how is the grant going to fly" Rex and I explained it. When Rick Volquardsen called about 3 past due bills (almost 2 months past due) I called and went by both the manager's and sheriff's offices and found the bills at the Sheriff's Office. Later that day the bills were sent over to the manager's office and paid. Afterwards I instructed the manager to stamp the date received by her office on the bills to keep an account of when they are

really received for payment.

One morning I had coffee with Rex Skellett after a commission meeting and suggested that just the commissioners, the sheriff, and deputies that had complaints sit down and see if we could work out the grievances. Rex said he didn't believe that was part of the commissioners' job. My reply was, "You might be right but should the sheriff lose the lawsuit filed against him and the county's insurance rates go up - the taxpayers will be paying for it forever. The money to pay the insurance comes out of the general fund and state law makes that our responsibility." No meeting was ever requested. Others outside government have tried to set up meetings - their phone calls have gone unreturned. It's nice to say you want to talk or communicate - but actions speak louder than words. Also when the county is put in jeopardy of a lawsuit that would affect the insurance and thus the county budget which state law says is my responsibility - I don't expect a cover up - I expect to be notified.

As for the minutes of the commission meetings - all that was ever asked of the clerk was to put in what really transpired. The commissioners never asked the clerk to break any law, on the contrary, state law was read 3 times during a December meeting just to ensure that there would be no misunderstanding (this was not put in the minutes of this meeting by the clerk). Also, the commissioners never asked the clerk to put anything in the minutes to make them look good - only what actually transpired. The commissioners never asked that any statement by the sheriff be removed - but mine were removed and changed by the clerk leaving the impression that the commission was not trying to communicate or work with the sheriff. But don't take my word for it or anyone else's - get a copy of the tapes of the commission meetings in December and a copy of the minutes and go home and see for yourself. Also, the commissioners

have only asked the clerk to take the minutes the same way they are done in other counties.

Shortly after the meeting between Don Samuels, Lloyd Davis, Audean Franklin and others was over and the grand jury petition was circulated, I wondered why they didn't want to wait for the March 14 District Court hearing. The county commissioners could have gone for a grand jury but we wanted a hearing in open court - not behind closed doors. We wanted the people of Lincoln County to be able to attend and hear for themselves what is happening - not be told what is happening. I will be asking that Paul Crown be allowed to tape the court hearing so that you, the public, can see and hear under oath what is really going on.

Also, the sheriff and clerk could have charged the commissioners with wrongdoing in District Court - an open court - they didn't nor have any charges been made.

Yes, the grand jury has a lot of power - the power to find no wrongdoing yet issue a biased report shortly before the primary. But I have faith in the people of Lincoln County and their heritage of justice for all. I am willing to trust in that heritage.

You have heard how many signed the petition and how fast it was presented to the judge. But recently I have been approached by more than 19 people who refused to sign it which was nice, but even more interesting is the number of people who have come up to me and said, "I signed the petition but now that I've learned more I wish I hadn't."

I can't call what is going on the 2nd Lincoln County War because I don't think I or any of the people involved in this rate a place in history anywhere near the level of significance that the Lincoln County War had. I do know one thing - Lincoln County will survive as it always has.


