Teen-ager charged with Katina Chavez murder

A 16-year-old San Patricio resident, Matt Surratt, was taken into custody on Friday by Sheriff Don Samuels and investigator Paul Wersich and charged with the strangulation and drowning death of Katina Chavez, who was found on February 21 in the Rio Ruidoso near her Hondo Valley home.

Surratt, a student at Hondo High School, was questioned several times by sheriff's deputies and was finally called out of school

and taken to the juvenile detention section of the Otero County Jail in Alamogordo.

According to investigator Wersich, "We have probable cause to charge him with the killing."

Surratt's mother, Mary Lee, said that she was totally shocked at her son's arrest. "Matt and Katina grew up together," she said in an interview at her small San Patricio farm. "If Katina called over here on the phone once, she called over here a million times. Matt spent all night searching for her when she was missing."

Sheriff Samuels was quoted in an Otero county newspaper as saying that he elected to place Surratt in an Otero county jail rather than releasing him to his mother's custody because he feared Surratt would be in danger in Lincoln County.

"Everyone here has been very supportive, including relatives of Katina's," said Mrs. Surratt. "This is all so new to us, nothing like this has ever happened before. My son is innocent. He is in no danger here."

Paul and Esther Chavez and

their three children, Rachel, Rebecca and Moses, live down the road from the Surratts and have known both Katina Chavez and Matt Surratt since they were small children. Paul Chavez is first cousin to Katina's mother, Yolanda, and second cousin to Katina's father, Arturo.

"We saw Matt standing near the highway at around 4 p.m. on Saturday, February 20th. He was waiting for our car to pass so he could cross. We pulled over and asked him if he wanted to go to Ruidoso with us and get something to eat,

and he said, 'No, I have to feed the animals now.'

"My son, Moses, went to pick Matt up at around 6:30 to go to a dance in Ruidoso. While they were there they visited a friend who has a police beeper, and he said that the police were looking for Moses. Moses reported in, and was asked if he had seen or given a ride to Katina that night, because she was missing. Moses said that he hadn't seen her, and Matt mentioned that he had been playing basketball with her in the afternoon.

"When they came home from the

dance around 12:30, they found out that there was a search party looking for Katina, and they both joined it and searched till about 3:30 in the morning.

"I was the adult in charge of Matt that night, and honest to God, he was as concerned as everyone else and did not act suspicious or nervous in any way. And he's not the kind of kid that could pull off something like that. If he had done something wrong, I would have been able to tell."

Grindstone Dam

Village has money to finish the job

"We'll have the money to complete Grindstone Canyon Dam without borrowing," said village manager Frank Potter last week.

Potter and village accountant John Varley averred the multi-million-dollar reservoir begun in 1983 will be completed without further debt.

"We're working on a phased construction plan," said Potter, in reviewing the project that was initiated by village officials in 1982. Potter said Ruidoso had no place to store the effluent credit earned at the rate of 700 acre-feet a year, so officials decided to build a dam to hold 1,500 acre-feet of water.

Potter said the site was selected and 44 acres were acquired from developer Don Dorman through a "friendly condemnation." That process included separate appraisals of the land by Dorman and by the village before Ruidoso paid \$5,500 an acre for the site. By the time appraisal, title search, legal and related costs were paid for the site and land for pipeline and roads, Ruidoso had spent approximately \$584,000.

"That includes everything that was spent on the land," noted Varley.

The original construction project budget was for \$8 million, but that figure has swelled since voters authorized that amount in bonds in 1983. Potter said the change in design, from earthen to roller-compacted concrete, was one factor in the bigger pricetag for the reservoir. He said studies indicated the area didn't have the correct materials for an earthen dam.

The contract was let and construction on the dam is complete, except for some measuring adjustments required by the State Engineer

"In 1986 the original bond issue was completely exhausted," said Potter. By that time the village had spent \$6.5 million on the dam. An additional \$2,850,000 revenue sales tax bond issue was accomplished in 1986 for capital water improvements, including the dam.

The dam construction finally cost the village around \$7.5 million, including over-runs of approximately \$2.25 million.

"A lot of things drove the costs of the dam up," said Potter, noting the change in design drove engineering costs up.

The next phase in developing the dam is the treatment plant and storage facility, and those items are in the design phase. Potter said the original plans called for a storage plant that holds more water than the village needs for the zone to be served by Grindstone. He said that design will be scaled down.

Varley said by the end of next year, there should be close to \$2 million available for continuing the dam project.

Potter said he's looking at similar projects phased in by other municipalities as he considers the options for completing the Grindstone Canyon Dam project. "We're getting some ideas more than anything," he remarked.

Besides providing a place to store the village's effluent credit and assuring adequate water supplies as population expands, the reservoir may be an added attraction for visitors and locals. Potter said the village has land beside the dam for a park, and he expects the reservoir to be used for recreation.

Final steps are under way to comply with final engineering requirements before the gate is opened and water begins flowing into the dam.

Ether Chavez commented, "I don't feel that he's the guilty party. This is a double nightmare for us. First we lose Katina, and now they accuse Matt of killing her and take him away."

Ether described both young people. "I love them both very much. Katina was a really good kid, outgoing, friendly. She was always running, she was very athletic. And Matt, he is a big teddy bear. Sometimes he would be here watching TV with my kids, and I'd kiss my

kids goodbye and then I'd say, 'Matt, want me to kiss you goodbye?' and he would say 'Oh, no, my Mom already did that when I left my house.'"

"Matt was scared of water," said Moses Chavez, 16. "He had something wrong with his inner ear, and if he got water in it, it hurt real bad. He waded in the river, but he never swam. There's no way he could have drowned Katina. No way. He can't even swim."

Rachel Chavez, 17, was a cheerleader with Katina last year at

Hondo High School. "Matt didn't do it," she commented flatly. "He took care of his animals and his new puppy and he wouldn't fight even when you tried to provoke him."

Rebecca Chavez, 15, said, "I saw Matt when he was standing beside the highway that Saturday, and he was wet only from the knees down. It was in the paper that he was wet all over his lower body, but that wasn't true, and I even had my glasses on and everything. I saw him real clearly."

Surratt's attorney, Gary C.

Mitchell, stated, "There's not a soul around here whose heart doesn't go out to the Chavez family at this time. But this boy didn't do it, and everyone I've talked to has indicated that they support the Surratt family just as they support the Chavezs."

Mary Lee Surratt and Matt's elderly grandfather are taking over Matt's chores while he is in prison. "I didn't realize until he was gone how much I relied on him," she said. "He took care of everything around here."

Village researchers purchase of community center

Ruidoso citizens want a community center.

At least that's the general consensus, said village manager Frank Potter last Thursday.

Potter said he and accountant

John Varley have been researching legal ramifications of acquiring a facility and comparing the benefits of buying or building.

If the village does buy, then an appraisal is needed before negotiations can begin, said Potter, who was asked by the Village Council to look into the possibilities.

"We'll ask the council for direction," said Potter. "We would be in violation of the Bateman Act if we negotiated with the owners," he added.

Potter said attorney Mike Runnels has researched legal questions, and Varley has done the finance for a report they'll give the council on

Tuesday. A report during the last council meeting over the possibility of purchasing the old Gibson's building prompted the council to authorize Potter to look into the matter.

"Our attitude is it can be done if you follow the proper steps," said Potter.

The saga continues in commission vs. sheriff, clerk

The already complex situation between Lincoln County Commissioners, the sheriff, and the county clerk has become even more complex with four motions filed in the 12th Judicial District Court, Division II, on March 1 by Daniel A. Bryant. He is a partner in the law firm of Parsons & Bryant, and attorney for Sheriff Don Samuels and Clerk Fran Siddens in the matter of the writs of mandamus filed against them by mandamus on January 28.

The writs, filed by county attorney Gary C. Mitchell, compel Samuels and Siddens to comply with county ordinances, rules and regulations concerning the fulfillment of their elected positions.

The new motions state: 1) That the writ proceeding is not heard until the petitions allocate funds for representation of the respondents; and, 2) that the petitioners' counsel, Gary Mitchell, be disqualified to represent the county in the writ matter.

Both of these motions were filed for Samuels and for Siddens, bringing the total number of motions to four.

In the first writ, attorney Bryant alleges that the petitioners (commissioners) have used and continue to use Mitchell as an attorney at the expense of the county; that the respondents, both county officials, have been sued by petitioners for acts performed in the course and scope of their employment with the county; that the petitioners have failed and refused to provide the

sheriff with a budget line item for paying legal expenses.

Also, that the petitioners have refused and continue to refuse to allocate funds to provide legal representation to respondent despite the fact that they have frozen \$34,000 of the sheriff's department capital outlay budget for the purposes of paying legal fees.

Also, that as a result of the commissioners' failure to allocate funds, the sheriff does not have counsel to represent him, other than at his own personal expense, although the next item listed in the sheriff's motions admits that one of his attorneys, Michael A. Gross of Albuquerque, has been retained by Samuels and is being paid for by State Risk Management Division, the county's insurance agency.

Samuels is also being represented by Bryant, and attorney Kathleen D. Lebeck of Albuquerque.

Among other items in the first motion is the allegation that the commissioners, who are in charge of the budget for the county, are at-

tempting to deprive the sheriff and clerk of their right to full and complete representation as provided by law.

Because of these allegations, the motions ask a stay of proceedings be entered until funds are allocated for the county to pay for legal representation of Samuels and Siddens.

The second motion, concerning the disqualification of attorney Mitchell as the commission's lawyer concerning action around the writs, alleges:

That the county attorney has a duty to represent Lincoln County as a body politic and has an inherent conflict of interest which disqualifies him from acting as personal counsel for the commissioners in an action against the sheriff and clerk.

Also, that the county attorney has publicly admitted that in the event of a dispute between public officials, he is to act in a "neutral position" according to a newspaper article dated November 25, 1987.

Also, that the county attorney

has not acted in a neutral position and instead has decided to act on behalf of the commissioners against the sheriff and clerk.

Also, that the county attorney has acted as counsel to the sheriff in matters related to the petition in this case.

According to the motions filed by Bryant, there is a direct conflict of interest present, as defined in and prohibited by Rule 16-107 of the Rules of Professional Conduct, a rule promulgated by the state Supreme Court, meaning that once you've represented somebody, you shouldn't turn against them, according to Bryant.

"We think that it's improper to have the county attorney advise county officials and then sue them," said Bryant. He quoted from two state statutes he feels pertain to this matter, including:

36-1-18, which states that attorneys will represent the county before the commission, and advise all county and state officials whenever required.

31-1-19, which states that a

county commission may contract with a private attorney to provide that representation.

Lincoln County has paid Bryant a total of \$3,450.56 thus far to represent the sheriff in personnel disputes, and he has submitted more bills to the county that are yet unpaid but have been authorized, totalling \$565.39 for Samuels, coming out of the professional services line item in his budget. Does this make him, in effect, the sheriff's attorney?

"No, it does not," Bryant answered, admitting that the reasons are "real complicated" as to why this is not so.

Bryant's office has also billed Clerk Fran Siddens for \$1,218.14 for legal services. Siddens has turned the bill over to the commission for payment, explaining in a memo that, as she does not have a line item in her budget to cover this, she would like it paid from the county's general fund. Commissioners have not yet ruled on this billing.

According to Mitchell, these new motions filed are "ridiculous."

Sheriff and clerk answer charges in writs

Sheriff Don Samuels and County Clerk Fran Siddens, through attorney Daniel A. Bryant, filed their answers to the writs of mandamus charges in Twelfth District Court Tuesday.

These papers contain responses to allegations stated in the writs, which were filed on January 14 by county attorney Gary Mitchell un-

der the direction of Lincoln County Commissioners.

Samuels' answer denies 16 of the 45 paragraphs in the writ against him, and denies 10 of the charges. He partly denies and partly admits another 19 paragraphs.

Among Samuels' denials are that he has failed to comply with any ordinances or regulations of the county.

Siddens lists 11 affirmations in

her answer, stating that the county commission has no statutory authority to dictate to the county clerk the specific manner in which she will keep minutes, and she also states that the county commissioners "desire to violate the laws of the State of New Mexico and create a situation, through this proceeding, wherein they are able to pervert, distort and alter the substance of their discussions at prior county commission meetings."

The writs of mandamus, ordering Samuels and Siddens to comply with state statute in terms of their positions, were to be heard before Judge Robert M. Doughty on Monday, March 14. However, because of four new motions filed by Bryant in his clients' behalf, the newer motions will be heard instead on that date.







Eye On The Capitol

HOUSE SEATS IN PRIMARY TROUBLE

Thinking of running for the State Legislature?

If so, April 5th is D-day. D as in "Deadline."

That's when would-be lawmakers rush like lemmings to the Capitol to file their papers to get on the June 7th primary ballot.

Outside the Secretary of State's office, in the fourth floor hallway, a steady din goes on all day. Fascinated folks murmur and point at the constantly-changing blackboards on which candidates' names appear in chalk.

In June, reality will strike. Many legislative officeseekers will run over the cliff, and fall on the rocks below.

Many, but not all - or even most.

Let's look at the state House of Representatives elections.

In 1986, the Democrats failed to field a candidate in 11 of the 70 House districts. So, if you want to run as a Democrat in one of those areas, you'll probably get a free ride on June 7th.

Years from now, you can take out the dusty election returns book and proudly note to your grandchildren that you were the Democrat Party's nominee that year.

Just be sure not to flip the pages too far - to the general election, where you got your head handed to you in a basket by your Republican opponent.

The Republicans, incidentally, had even more primary no-shows. In 18 districts, they didn't run a single candidate.

For the most part, the parties are only bowing to the inevitable. Certain districts are so heavily weighted toward Democrats or Republicans, that floating a candidate against the tide only wastes scarce resources.

But what happened in the districts where the parties actually ran somebody?

Often, the results weren't much different from running nobody.

In 1986, the Democrats ran only one candidate in 46 districts; the Republicans, in 44. For those primaries, then, again there was no contest.

You're starting to get the picture.

When you look at the House primaries that were actually fought, get ready for another disappointment: many of those contests were mismatches. In 1986, 8 Democrat and 3 Republican primary battles were won by more than 300 votes.

Before continuing, a little reality therapy: There's not point in taking seriously those primaries in which the winner doesn't have a serious chance of winning the November general election.

Now, after all that screening, a few specks of gold appear at the bottom of the pan.

Here are the districts to watch, based on the 1986 results. The winner, incidentally, is the incumbent Representative.

I. Primaries won by fewer than 100 votes:

- A. Democrats.
 1. Leonard Sheffield 689; Mariano Torrez 687 (Otero).
 2. Francis Armijo 695; Felix Nunez 650 (Bernalillo).
 3. Ray Vargas 813; Albert Gurule 734 (Bernalillo).
- B. Republicans. No cases.

II. Primaries won by 100-300 votes:

- A. Democrats.
 1. Dan Silva 746; Robert Aragon 576; Charlotte Mock 157 (Bernalillo).
 2. Lucky Varela 1,247; Steve Flance 1,056; Froggy Fernandez 1,050; Bruno Castellano 539 (Santa Fe).
 3. Al Valdez 880; Raymond Salas 600 (Bernalillo).
 4. Roger Madalena 978; Stephen Parker 729 (Cibola and Sandoval).
- B. Republicans.

If the 1984 results are used, more districts can be added to the list:

I. Primaries won by less than 100 votes:

- A. Democrats.
 1. George Galanis 986; George Kozeliski 905; Sam Ray, Sr. 726 (McKinley).
- B. Republicans.
 1. Ben Hall 451; David Barrett 450; Fred Collins 258 (Chaves, Eddy and Lincoln).
 2. Richard Cheney 445; Thomas Taylor 439 (San Juan).
 3. Pat Baca 404; David Dorso 336 (Bernalillo).

II. Primaries won by 100-300 votes:

- A. Democrats.
 1. Thomas Atcitty 709; Omer Farnsworth 439 (San Juan).
- B. Republicans. No cases.

So, a meager 9 Democrat and 5 Republican primaries are toss-ups. The statement isn't entirely true. Surprises always occur: (1) Past election results don't necessarily predict the future. In 1984, for example, Felix Nunez trounced his nearest opponent by 845 votes. Looking at that figure, who would have thought that in 1986, Nunez would narrowly lose to Armijo?

(2) The uncontested races are politically uncharted territory. Incumbents accustomed to free rides often are easy pickings for aggressive newcomers.

We'll know a lot more on April 5th.

That's the same day, incidentally, that Prime Minister Winston Churchill, D-Day leader and one of the great world statesmen, left office.

Since 1979, control of the House has alternated between the Democrats and a Republican/conservative Democrat coalition. Would any of the primary election results be likely to affect the House leadership?

At the top of the list should be

the Sheffield/Torrez district. Representative Sheffield, however, saw the writing on the wall, and changed his party affiliation to Republican.

Assuming both men run again, and Torrez remains a Democrat, the face-off will occur in the November general election.

"Loyalist" Democrats regarded Robert Aragon as a closet coalition Democrat. They viewed his defeat in 1986 by Dan Silva as a loss of one seat for the coalition.

But Robert Aragon has won and lost before. Don't be surprised if he runs again.

Some "Loyalist" Democrats also view Al Valdez as an undependable ally, and may field a candidate against him.






