County gives green light on airport road construction

County commissioners, at a special meeting Friday morning, authorized their engineers, Bohannon Huston, and road construction company Twin Mountain Rock, Inc., to proceed on the construction of the long-awaited Sierra Blanca Regional Airport access road, which has been held up because of litigation.

When the bids were originally let, the State Highway Department neglected to specify that the bidders include gross receipts tax in their bids, according to county officials. At that time, Twin Mountain Rock was the apparent low bidder. Because of the spec error, the project was re-bid, and again Twin Mountain Rock was apparently the low bidder.

However, competing construction firm New Mexico Neilsons, Inc. challenged the bidding procedure and filed in district court in Santa Fe, asking that the project be re-bid for a third time. Their appeal was overruled.

They then appealed to the district court in Lincoln-Otero counties, and Judge Robert M.

Doughty ruled against them last week, in his opinion, Neilson's did not file timely, and the court no longer had jurisdiction to object to the bidding procedure.

Commissioner Bill Karn made a motion to enter into a contract with Twin Mountain to begin work on the road. Twin Mountain had submitted a contract but had extended it pending the results of the litigation procedure. Commissioner Ralph Dunlap seconded, and the motion carried.

"It's been a long time coming," commented Karn. Karn thanked Representative Ben Hall for his help with the funding and the extended contract procedures.

County chairman John Hightower also commended Hall for his part in the successful contracting. "Ben's stayed on the job, and we appreciate it," Hightower said.

"The State Highway Department said, 'Whatever you all decide, they'll be right along with you,'" Hall commented from the audience. Around \$6,000,000 in grants had been tied up by the litigation.

Commissioners also signed an agreement between Lincoln County and the Fort Stanton Restoration

and Recreation Board's chairman, Sid Goodloe. The agreement gives the Fort Stanton board \$250, which comes from the county's professional fund. The money will be used to help initiate a Ranch Heritage Center in conjunction with New Mexico State University.

The commission spent the next eight hours in executive session with two members representing the Fair Labor Standards Act for the federal government. They are checking into the overtime situation in the sheriff's department, and apparently working to reach a compromise.

Also in the closed meeting were County Clerk Fran Siddens and her attorney, Dan Bryant; and County Sheriff Don Samuels and his attorneys, Michael Gross and Kathleen LeBeck, both from Albuquerque.

"It looks very promising that some of these problems can be worked out without further litigation and cost to the county," commented commissioner Dunlap on Saturday. "It's all very complicated, and confidential, but I can say that we are all talking together, in good faith."

University design class has dreams for Midtown

How about some downtown dreamin'?

A University of New Mexico upper level class, entitled Ruidoso Urban Design Course, is spending this semester doing just that—dreaming up ideas to enhance the Village of Ruidoso Midtown area.

Those ideas have been developed in a variety of drawings and projects to be on display in a public

workshop all day Saturday, March 26, in Midtown Ruidoso.

"We're looking at the whole gamut of issues," said studio instructor Steve Borbas. His class is considering everything from street furniture to the overall ambiance of the area.

Members of the class have done more than dream, putting their ideas on paper with drawings and plans. The class has also constructed a large scale model that will be on display during the work-

shop. "You can see a bunch of ideas," said Borbas, an architect and a city planner. "We want some feedback on some of these ideas as well as some original ideas from others," he added.

Borbas said members of the class visited Ruidoso about a month ago and will make one more site visit during the course.

The class took the three busiest blocks and looked at them in relation to streetscape, building style,

land use, landscape and the like, said Borbas. He said some ideas were developed along the river, as well.

Students considered a parking, colors, lighting activities, plaza and events.

"It's everything ... it's a real mixed bag," said Borbas. He said the class is made up of nine very talented students, two from Ruidoso.

"I've done this with Farmington in a somewhat different capacity,"

said Borbas, who also worked on a similar project for the Nob Hill Main Street project.

"It's very interesting for me to be dealing with these projects that don't take years and years of work," noted Borbas, enthusiastic about working with the group of bright and imaginative students.

"The trick is how to loosen it and then channel it in a sort of comprehensive direction," said Borbas, adding the challenge will be to pull ideas together into some sensible

of creativity. While Borbas teaches other classes, he said the design lab promotes a level of intensity, energy and enthusiasm not present in other classes. He described urban design as smaller than planning, but larger than architecture, while combining those resources.

Borbas invites everyone to drop in at the workshop to see what the students have done, and share ideas.

The spokesman warned that fire danger is high in the area.

Vehicle use and pets on the loose busy Downs trustees

would be discriminatory. "I think the village is asking for trouble," he said. "We shouldn't be in the business of passing discriminatory ordinances."

"The proper remedy is you file a complaint with the village judge or district court."

Harris has denied the charges. A vacancy in the position of animal control officer initiated talk that the position could be expanded from part- to full-time. Harris suggested duties could also include maintenance of village grounds and the park when animal control calls were taken care of.

An audience member suggested the job have flexible hours, since many pet owners let animals run loose during the night, then tie up their pets during the day. Trustees voted to approve advertising for the position as a full-time job.

In other business, the trustees: —Accepted the Fire Department report, with Harris suggesting the report contain more information on

individual calls.

—Voted to issue \$430,000 in revenue bonds for street paving. A decision on which areas to pave will be made later.

—Approved Resolution 88-12, adopting the Open Meetings Act.

—Voted to designate March as Mental Retardation Month in cooperation with the National Association for Retarded Children.

—Approved Resolution 88-13, establishing a quitclaim deed on a section of village land that was traded with Texas-New Mexico Power Company when a road was straightened.

—Approved Resolution 88-14, naming the clerk and mayor as those empowered to sign for surplus property.

—Voted to hire Don Wingfield as village auditor.

—Voted to require payment of two delinquent water bills.

—Voted to allow Municipal Judge Harrold Mansell to attend a traffic safety seminar Friday, April 8.

—Voted to send Trustee Alice Allison to a Community Development Block Grant hearing to represent the village's request for funding of a community center.

—Named Trustee LeVerne Cole as the village representative to a sub-group of the Water Defense Association.

—Named Allison as trustee representative to the village Fire Department.

—Agreed to have village crews remove dirt from Nettie Bradley's fence and see if the fence straightens itself.

—Heard Ruidoso Downs Postmaster Shirlene Fitzner announce the post office will host a local art show Monday through Friday, April 4-8. Entries are due by Thursday, March 31, and an open house and judging also will be scheduled.

—Tabled discussion of a personnel matter until a closed session could be conducted.

Sheila Harris: You can do anything you want to ... one step at a time

For more than three years Sheila Harris lived in two different worlds.

With a husband and two boys at home, Harris decided in 1982 to pursue a law career. She took the LSAT in June, and entered the University of New Mexico Law School that fall. On weekdays Sheila was a student in Albuquerque, and on weekends she was a wife and mother in Ruidoso.

"It was hard," admitted Harris with a small smile. "The hardest part is the transition," she added.

Seated behind a big roll-top desk in the law firm of Harris and Harris on Sudderth Drive, Sheila Harris looked back on her decision to go back to school, and how it has affected her family.

Sheila and Ron married after graduating from the University of New Mexico. He went off to the service before coming back to earn his law degree. The young family lived for three years in Roswell, before moving to Ruidoso in 1976.

Ron hung out his shingle and Sheila took care of the office and the couple's two sons, Brian and Neil.

"It was like a little lemonade stand," laughed Sheila, recalling those early days in Ruidoso. Harris later joined the firm of Parsons, Parsons and Bryant. He and Sheila

are partners now, both preferring a small, low key firm.

In the years she was a legal secretary for her attorney husband, Sheila, who had a degree in English, realized she had an aptitude for the law. The decision to pursue a law degree was one that both Ron and Sheila agreed upon.

"It was really neat for our family, in spite of how hard it was," said Sheila. "It was good for Ron and the boys," recalls Sheila, adding the three are even closer than

they were before. "Ron was behind me all the way," she said, adding she never could have succeeded without his and their sons' support.

Sheila admits she didn't realize how hard the whole thing would be—not only the separation from her family every week, but also the very real stress and high intensity of law school.

Being a 37-year-old law student isn't that easy, either. "You feel a little inadequate ... everybody there is used to doing well," remembers

Harris, who apparently rose to that challenge.

She graduated magna cum laude from UNM Law School, finishing third in a class of over 100, with a 3.6 overall average. Harris was nominated and elected to the Order of the Cof, the top honor for students achieving the highest academic standards.

Being an achiever was nothing new to Sheila, who was the first woman to serve as president of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Com-

merce.

"I think our legal system is marvelous," remarked Sheila, explaining one of the best things about studying law was learning all about the system and process. Amid the hard work and rigorous study schedule, Sheila discovered she really likes planning and drafting documents.

"With a small general practice like this you do a little of everything," said Harris, who was admitted to the bar in 1987. Because she spent part of last year out of town with her son, Neil, who was filming a movie, the new lawyer hasn't had as much time as she'd like to practice in her new profession.

"I want to be a really good lawyer," said Harris, proud to be a part of the legal profession. "Most lawyers I know are honest and ethical," she added.

"I've always liked public speaking," she said, looking forward to her days in court.

Harris said one of the things her clients can expect from her is openness and good communication.

"Some people think attorneys need to be paternalistic ... know what's best for their clients," commented Harris. "I don't feel that way ... there are always emotional factors."

Harris said there's a danger that a legal adviser, caught up in the process, could forget that a particu-

lar case is going to have an impact on a person's life.

"My approach would be a presentation of alternatives ... let the client decide," said Harris. "Maybe that's because I'm a woman," she added thoughtfully.

Harris said she had a lot of mediation training, explaining that mediation is different than arbitration. In arbitration the arbiter is like a private judge, whereas a mediator has no legal power and the purpose is to help disputants work things out.

"Mediation is the thing of the future," explained Harris, noting how helpful it can be in cases involving people with ongoing relationships—like tenant/landlord disputes or divorces with children in the family.

"It's just so much cheaper and better for people," she added. Harris said courts eventually will be able to order mediation.

With her commuting behind her, and her new career ahead, Harris said she's happy to be home and has no regrets over the years invested in law school.

"You only grow by doing things you're afraid to do," said Sheila encouraging anyone with a dream to go out and pursue their goal. "You can do anything you want to do ... you just do it one step at a time," said Sheila, firmly.

Hazel said an investigation is pending, with results from Albuquerque expected in six to 10 weeks.

Crime Stoppers plan child I.D. program

Children disappear everyday in the United States, some kidnapped by a parent, never to be seen or heard from again.

Efforts to locate missing children are sometimes hampered by lack of identification.

Ruidoso/Lincoln County Crime Stoppers, as a public service, is sponsoring a Child Identification program from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, April 9, at the Sierra Mall. Infants and children up to age 14 will be fingerprinted and photographed, and an identification card made and laminated as a permanent record.

During a Crime Stoppers meeting Thursday, Lanny Maddox, liaison between the organization and the Ruidoso Police Department, predicted a huge turnout for the program. He said in past child ID programs he has fingerprinted 200 to 300 children in a day.

Also Thursday, treasurer Roy Seay said Crime Stoppers received a \$1,000 donation from a woman interested in the Katina Chavez murder case. He said the money is to be used as a reward for that case, but if it doesn't result in an arrest and bind-over, the money will remain in the Crime Stoppers treasury to be used for other cases.

Seay said the Chavez case was slated for state Crime Stoppers bulletins.

Members discussed a lack of communication among member agencies. It was decided to send written invitations asking every member agency to send a representative to the April 21 meeting.

In other regular business Thursday the group:

—Heard Maddox report on the state meeting. He said he learned

the Ruidoso/Lincoln County Crime Stoppers pays better rewards than programs in some bigger cities.

—Learned that Maddox was nominated to the state board. Seay said he wrote a letter endorsing his candidacy.

—Heard Seay report on receiving another \$500 in restitution assigned through magistrate courts. "Judge Wheeler has been upholding the state statutes regarding restitution to us ... he's been doing a super job," noted Maddox.

—Reviewed the activity report: Maddox reported 16 cases have been solved over the past year due to Crime Stoppers tips, with 11 defendants tried and convicted. He said stolen property valued at \$101,173 has been recovered and narcotics with a wholesale value of \$57,980 confiscated. Rewards totaling \$3,050 have been paid during that period.

Since the program started, 47 cases have been solved, 42 defendants tried and 39 convicted. Property valued at \$1,505,697 has been recovered and narcotics with a wholesale value of \$101,000 confiscated. Rewards totaling \$10,225 have been paid.

Maddox said the \$1 million John Lennon painting recovered in Lincoln County a couple of years ago explains the big dollar figure on property recovery.

—Approved new member Mark Silva, and accepted the resignation of Liz Groenendyk. It was decided to send a thank you letter and a plaque to Groenendyk who was praised for her work as a board member. Maddox said she obtained 12 weekend trips as prizes for the last Crime Stoppers party.

—Agreed to meet at noon, April 21, in the home economics department at Ruidoso High School.



Whitwam competes in Quadrathon

"I love to compete," said Dr. Paul Whitwam, Ruidoso's thoracic and vascular surgeon.

"I run to compete," he added. This love of running and competition has taken Whitwam to numerous marathons and other races. Yet the most unique race in which he competed was the Mount Taylor Winter Quadrathon in Grants last month.

Billed as "the ultimate challenge," the nationally advertised race attracted 350 contestants, including Whitwam. He entered in the soloist category; running, biking, skiing and snowshoeing over 50 miles in the race. He finished second in his age category with a time of five hours, 11 minutes and 15 seconds.

"That's 58 minutes better than last year," Whitwam said. His goal for this year was to take an hour off last year's time. Last year was Whitwam's first-time to compete in the Grants race, under less than desirable conditions.

"There was a white-out blizzard on the mountain, it was so cold I couldn't change my shoes," Whitwam said, reflecting on his first time in the race.

"This year the wind was blowing, but it was sunny," he added. With those conditions and additional training, he said he completed the transitions in nine minutes, contributing to his faster over-all time.

The transitions are a major part of the race. The course began in Grants with each contestant on a bicycle. The course took racers up a 2.25 percent grade for 15.1 miles, to the forest, where the road turned to gravel.

At that point, the racers changed into running shoes and began a running course that rose 4.8 percent in elevation and covered 4.9 miles. By the end of the running course, the contestants were in the snow.

The challenge continued, increasing in difficulty as the racers changed to mountaineering or cross-country skiing, all up-hill at a 12.35 percent grade for 1.9 miles.

"We had 'skins' for our skis," Whitwam explained. "These rubberized synthetic skins slipped over the skis to prevent sliding backwards," he added.

The continuous climb, especially the last 100 yards, were extremely tough. Once again, after two miles of uphill skiing, the racers changed their racing medium, from skis to snowshoes.

"I carried my snowshoes on a pack, held on with clips, so I could change very quickly," Whitwam said. He also said that his snowshoes were unusual in design. Larry Marshall, a friend of Whitwam's from Dexter, New Mexico, developed the snowshoes with aircraft grade aluminum with running shoes attached. The snowshoes were lighter weight and easier to run in than traditional

oversized snowshoes, Whitwam said.

The snowshoes segment was one mile up, then another down; the summit of the race on the summit of Mount Taylor. From the snowshoes, the racers began the transitions back to downhill skiing, then running and completed with bicycling back into town.

Whitwam said the hard winds made the downhill biking difficult.

"I had to pedal downhill," he said.

Whitwam said he was pleased with his second place win, as it was the biggest win of his racing career. The quadrathon required different training than just running races.

"I had an advantage of training at a high altitude," Whitwam noted. The altitude in Grants and up Mount Taylor are similar to Ruidoso and Sierra Blanca. Whitwam trains in bicycling, running, skiing and snowshoeing in the Ruidoso area.

Since last November, when he participated in the New York City Marathon, Whitwam trained with Dr. Saverio Sava, who is a resident doctor at the Mescalero hospital. Both doctors were looking forward to the Grants race, but Whitwam was the only entrant as Sava became ill only days before the race. Sava competed in the Grants race last year.

The race has become a vital part of activities in the city of Grants, Whitwam said. He was impressed by the cooperation and enthusiasm by all the civic groups involved in the race. He said that for every contestant there was one volunteer to help with equipment and other facets of the race. He especially respected those volunteers in the snowshoe segment as they remained on the mountain at the 10,000 foot elevation throughout the day.

The contestants stay in one inn the night before the race and enjoy a high-carbohydrate meal together. "It's a family sort of thing," said Whitwam.

The winner of this year's race completed the grueling 50-mile course in four hours and 16 minutes. Whitwam said his goal for the next year's race is to finish in five hours.

"I really enjoyed the race. It was fun in a painful sort of way," humored Whitwam. He said he also races for the health and stress benefits.

But he mainly races for the competition. "I love to compete," he concluded.







EDITORIAL



If you are a property owner in Ruidoso, you probably received a note telling you of the proposed zoning ordinance and map under consideration by village leaders.

The letters, which were mailed to all property owners, rather than just those who'll be affected by the changes, was an attempt to encourage public input, according to village administration.

And the attempt seemed to be quite successful. Extra phone lines had to be installed to handle the calls village staffers received last week.

It's important that the public input on the proposed changes continues. We'll have to live with the final draft of the zoning ordinance and map, so we should have a good deal to say as they are being formed.

If you have a concern about how the village's zoning is being designed and changed, plan to attend a public hearing of the zoning ordinance and map set for 2 p.m. Monday, March 28, at the administrative center.

It's your property, and this is your chance to have a say in how the use of that property will be governed. Attend next week's public hearing. -DJP

Eye On The Capitol

STRATTONIAN LOGIC

Picture, if you can, an array of alter egos and arms.

What have you got? New Mexico school districts, according to Attorney General Hal Stratton.

Stratton last week decided, "State involvement in...the functions of school districts is so pervasive as to make them alter egos and arms of the state."

The upshot: public school teachers and administrators "are state employees, and are therefore prohibited from serving in the legislature." (Attorney General Opinion No. 88-20, March 7, 1988).

What makes this Opinion so urgent: "local school boards may not pay or contract" with teachers or administrators who serve in the legislature.

If Stratton's Opinion withstands a likely lawsuit, 7 lawmakers will see their Capitol careers questioned: Senators Mike Alarid and John Pinto, and Representatives Tom Atcity, Barbara Casey, Gary Hocerar, Joe Stell and Samuel Vigil.

At the heart of the matter is this state law: "It is unlawful for any member of the legislature to receive any compensation for services performed as an officer or employee of the state, except such compensation and expense money as he is entitled to receive as a member of the legislature." (Section 2-1-3 NMSA 1978).

And what, pray tell, "compensation and expense money" may a legislator receive?

The New Mexico State Constitution (Article IV, Section 10) says they can get \$75.00 per diem and 25 cents mileage.

Then comes the kicker: legislators shall receive "no other compensation, perquisite or allowance."

Stratton cited those same words recently to throw out the legislators' retirement program. You'll see a proposed constitutional amendment on the ballot in November, to let legislators receive up to \$6,000 in retirement benefits.

But that won't solve the school administrators/teachers' dilemma.

At bottom, why prohibit public employees from serving in the legislature? Stratton's Opinion mentions the "potential for conflicts of interest where legislators who are public employees vote on their compensation for such employment."

Conflicts of interest are bad. Sounds simple enough. Let's see, however, just where Strattonian logic leads us.

Back in 1980, the equal Access to Justice Act (HB105) was introduced in the state House of Representatives. "The legislature finds," the Act declared, "that certain persons may be deterred from seeking review of, or defending against, unreasonable governmental action be-

cause of the expense involved..."

Sounds simple enough. The Act's purpose: "to diminish the deterrent effect of the expense...by providing in specified situations an award of certain fees and other costs against the state."

O.K. What were those "specified situations" and "certain fees?" "When judgment is rendered against the state of New Mexico...the court may award reasonable attorney fees and costs..."

Let's see, now: if I sue the state and win, the state pays my lawyer's bill.

I like it. However, I'm neither a lawyer nor a legislator. Hal Stratton was both at the time. He was also one of the sponsors of the Equal Access to Justice Act.

In other words, an attorney sponsored a bill that would monetarily benefit attorneys. Apparently, it's alright for lawyers to appropriate public money for themselves -- but not for teachers.

Stratton's Act died in the Senate. Nevertheless, its implications regarding "conflicts of interest" remain.

It's impossible to be alive and not have conflicts of interest. Stratton deserves credit for bringing the school employees/legislator conflict to the surface -- for it is indeed a conflict. By daring to deal with such fundamental issues, he's a "radical" in the truest meaning of the word.

Far from stopping, Stratton should pursue the conflict issue further, in all its subtle manifestations.

And now there's a better forum than a costly courtroom for doing precisely that:

Governor Carruthers wisely signed into law an Interim Legislative Reform Study Committee. The Committee will examine "outdated and archaic constitutional provisions" governing operations of the legislature, and make recommendations to the 1989 legislature.

I hope Stratton will help the Committee.

As for the school districts: we already know how many "alter egos" are out there -- 88.

We'll soon see how many arms they have.

A full exploration of the conflict of interest question would put to rest a serious quaim some people have about Stratton:

"We don't make political decisions here," he told *The Albuquerque Journal* (March 8). A complete investigation would readily prove his statement -- by not stopping at just one group of legislators, who happen to all be Democrats.

To illustrate the subtlety of the conflict of interest problem: pretend you're a state legislator. You sponsor a bill to increase

Supreme Court Justices' salaries from \$49,500 to \$55,000; Appeals Court Judges' salaries, from \$47,000 to \$52,000; and District Court Judges' salaries, from \$45,000 to \$49,300.

But in addition to being a legislator, you're also a lawyer. One day, you represent a client in one of those courts. The judge or judges are looking at you, and thinking...what?

Of course, very few people will ever have that experience. One of them, however, is Hal Stratton, who co-sponsored HB92 in 1982. That legislation created the salary increases cited above, and was signed into law (Chapter 32).

The courts are showing a growing awareness of such entanglements, and are seeking answers. But more on that later.






