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Plan says rent civic center now; acquire permanent center later

A plan that proposes to rent a civic center for now and later acquire a permanent, village-owned facility received a vote of support at the Tuesday meeting of the Ruidoso Village Council.

Councillors also gave the go-ahead for a businessman to open a gameroom on Sudderth Drive and opted to call for new bids on the Upper Canyon bridge widening project because of problems with the first set of bids.

Councillors heard from Charlie Smith, who represented members of a committee that met earlier this month to consider options on the civic center issue.

The committee recommended a "two-pronged attack" that would use funds to rent an existing vacant building as a temporary center for a year or two. As that center alleviated the immediate demand, a committee would be carefully examining construction, purchase and funding options for a permanent civic center. It was noted that "a high likelihood" exists that some funding could be available from the next session of the state Legislature.

Smith said the committee, with the help of village staff, proposed four possible funding plans for the permanent center, the most conservative of which they recommended.

That funding plan estimates \$275,856 is available annually from lodgers' tax collections and the village matching funds. \$183,904 would be spent on promotion, leaving \$91,952 for the building fund. Operating costs of \$12,000 and income of \$3,000 would result in \$82,952 available for debt service.

Assuming a 15-year term, 10 percent interest and monthly payments, committee members estimated the \$82,852 could support a debt of \$643,500.

This funding plan also left intact Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce advertising funds, Convention and Visitors Bureau monies and the council-discretion section of the lodgers' tax budget.

Other funding plans compiled

but not recommended by the committee relied on those funds in varying degree, resulting in estimates as high as \$197,892 available for debt service, which would support a loan of \$1,532,500.

Smith proposed the formation of a permanent structure committee to continue the project. He estimated such a committee could prepare a complete evaluation and plan for a permanent facility by the end of the summer.

Councillor Jess Stinson spoke against spending "a ton of money" on improvements to a rental building.

Smith agreed, saying most of the expenses of a rental would be in furnishings and other additions that could be moved to the permanent facility when it's completed.

One audience member suggested the village could spend a lot less and get a center by utilizing volunteer help. Another suggested using the airport property and present facilities for outdoor events, while building a new building there. Bill Thomas, of the audience, said councillors should evaluate the need before taking any action, and shy away from recommendations from those who may have self interests.

Councillor J.A. "AJ" Junge praised the committee's plan.

"It's giving us a little breathing room," he said. "People want a civic center next Monday."

He moved to give council support of the plan, and he and his fellow councillors approved the idea unanimously.

Later in the meeting, councillors also unanimously approved the request by Jim Rodriguez for a conditional use to operate a "family-type, adult supervised" gameroom at 2808 Sudderth Drive.

Rodriguez had, earlier this month, been turned down on his request by members of the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z), who cited Rodriguez's lack of off-street parking as a principal reason for their denial.

Tuesday, Rodriguez reported he'd leased parking from the owners of a lot across the street,

next to the former Wingfield Wharf.

Councillors heard Rodriguez complain that he had done everything he'd been asked to do by village staff, only to be told three hours before opening that he had to come before P&Z and seek approval for a conditional use permit.

Police Chief Bill Newman noted the business is on a dangerous curve, and visibility is limited. He recommended a no-parking zone be established along the street in front of the business. Rodriguez agreed to the suggestion.

Businessmen Mike Seargeant and Denny Loverin said their earlier objections were based mostly on the lack of off-street parking. Loverin encouraged the council to abide by their ordinances, pointing out he was required to acquire off-street parking when Peter Piper Pizza moved into his Pinetree Square shopping center.

After some discussion of requiring a crosswalk from the parking area to the business, councillors unanimously approved the conditional use permit.

Councillors conducted an extensive discussion of bids received for improvements to the two Upper Canyon bridges.

Village attorney John Underwood said a bid from P.F. Gonzales had a total that indicated it was lowest, at \$41,909.75. But in checking the calculations of unit prices, which are multiplied by the number of units to arrive at a total, an "obvious clerical error" was found which instead computed to a total bid of more than \$3 million. Since the village is bound by the unit price, rather than the totals, the bid could not be considered the lowest, it was learned.

He advised councillors to reject all bids or accept the lowest "responsive" bidder, that of Hasse Contracting at \$43,682.50.

Elmer Pirelli moved to award the bid to Gonzales, despite the error. He and Stinson voted for the measure but were defeated by the remaining four councillors.

Junge moved to accept the bid of Hasse Contracting, but his effort

Condo burner

A fire at condominiums on Ski Run Road, next to the former Eagle Creek Ski Area, was called in at 2:10 p.m. Tuesday. First to arrive was Sheriff Deputy Ron Harrison, followed by Bonito, Forest Service and Ruidoso firefighters. A building of five condos was damaged beyond repair. Bonito Assistant Fire Chief D.A. Kincaid said damage is estimated at \$300,000. Three of the units were being lived in, but were unoccupied during the fire. Chief Sheriff's Deputy Rex Skellett said a state fire investigator has initially determined the fire was accidental, starting in a fireplace in the center unit.



Meeting set to push attraction of retirees

A meeting will be held at 7 p.m. Thursday, April 7, at the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center to discuss the possibility of Ruidoso and Lincoln County starting a campaign to attract retirees to the area.

The advertising committee of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce will attend the meeting to consider participation.

died for lack of a second. Stinson proposed calling for new bids, and his suggestion was approved by the council with Junge alone voting "no."

In other business, councilors: —Approved Ordinance 88-2, which reorganizes requirements for business registration and licensing, sets the process and charges for temporary, seasonal and outdoor sales, and sets a more stringent penalty for non-compliance by businesses.

Also, the measure made the animal control ordinance more restrictive: setting up a fee schedule for impoundment, licensing and confinement of animals; allowing the village to delegate authority in the issuance of licenses and collection of fees; and making it illegal for an animal to be in its keeper's premises without being contained by a fence or wall or restrained on a leash.

—Learned of a proposal to move certain village offices to the former airport terminal.

—Heard Councillor Tom McNeil report on a recent district meeting of the New Mexico Municipal League.

—Learned of a statement of disclosure by Councillor Larry Simon, who has proposed to offer police firearms training to the Ruidoso Police Department for \$1,600. Chief Newman reported the Simon training would be less expensive than other services, and the training is part of an overall training program.

Underwood said since Simon disclosed the plan, a conflict of interest does not exist.

—Learned that a well, which has been offered by McCarty Construction as a replacement for the ruined Hollywood well, does not contain selenium, as was first thought, after retesting by the state Environmental Improvement Division.

In addition, EID spokesman Jim Edwards said the well must be properly sealed before it can be used.

—Approved a request to send Street Department Superintendent Mike Beyer to the April 12-14 National Road and Street Maintenance Conference in Las Vegas, Nevada.

—Approved a request from Ruidoso Police Investigator and Crime Stoppers coordinator Lanny Maddox to place 12" by 18" Crime Stopper signs in the village heightening awareness of the program.

—Approved mayoral appointments to the following groups:

Spring ahead: Daylight saving starts Sunday

Spring ahead on Sunday and make sure your clock says 3 a.m. instead of 2 a.m., because daylight saving time is here.

The United States Congress passed legislation in July of 1986, stating that daylight saving time should take effect on the first Sunday in April, and that standard time will resume on the last Sunday in October, according to Alice

Bruin, of Rep. Joe Skeen's Roswell office.

This is a change from a later date to go into daylight saving time, and the change first went into effect last April.

So change your clocks on Sunday morning (forfeiting an hour of sleep) and prepare to "fall back" on October 30.

Furr's Safeway purchase OK'd

Furr's purchase of Safeway's 59-store El Paso Division was approved Monday by the Federal Trade Commission, according to published reports.

The sale includes the two Ruidoso Safeway stores.

The decision concludes a four-month commission review. During the review, Furr's operated the stores as an autonomous division, and under the recent decision, must continue to operate the stores separately until 12 Safeways in Texas and New Mexico are sold to the Jaynes Group.

The commission had objected to Furr's owning Safeways in the 12 towns (not including Ruidoso) since it decided a monopoly would exist.

The newly formed Jaynes Group was organized by former Safeway employees, Furr's reached an agreement with Jaynes to buy the 12 stores, but a purchase price was not disclosed.

The 12 stores are in Pecos and Fort Stockton, Texas, and Alamogordo, Artesia, Clovis, Espanola, Hobbs, Las Vegas, Lovington, Portales, Roswell, and Silver City.

County dropped from civil rights lawsuit

The News has learned that Lincoln County has been dismissed with prejudice in the federal lawsuits filed by four sheriffs' employees, who claim that their civil rights have been violated in personnel actions against them.

"Dismissed with prejudice" means that the county, represented by commissioners John Allen Hightower, Ralph Dunlap and Bill Karn, manager Suzanne Cox and attorney Gary C. Mitchell, cannot again be named as defendants in this matter, according to Mitchell.

The order of dismissal has been passed to a United States district court judge for signature.

Sheriff Don Samuels, Undersheriff Rex Skellett, Sgt. Max Watson, Sgt. Oscar Villado, Lt. Paul Wersich, all of the sheriff's department, and Sgt. Herman MacArthur, who worked with the sheriff's department "at all relevant times" pertaining to the lawsuit, are still listed as defendants in the court action brought about by employees Jimmie Luna, Ronald Harrison, Orlando Montes and Lerry Bond.

The federal suit was filed in mid-February by Elizabeth E. Simpson, attorney with the firm of Luebben & Hughes, P.C. of Albuquerque.

Mitchell was pleased with the

decision to dismiss the county from the personnel liability cases.

"I originally advised the commission that we had to remain fair and impartial in these personnel matters," said Mitchell. "I told them that if we did, there could be no liability against the county board."

"As you can see, I've been proven to be correct," Mitchell said.

Mitchell and Simpson met to discuss this matter last week while Mitchell was working on a murder trial in Albuquerque.

"I think by the actions of the county commission in Lincoln, it's obvious that they did what they could to rectify the sheriff's situation," said Simpson in a phone interview Thursday morning. "They've done quite a bit to get the personnel reinstated, including filing the writ."

The federal suits could have incurred around one and a half million dollars in liability against the county, according to Mitchell. "If the commission had not given the employees fair hearings and due process, we would be looking at a tremendous liability right now," Mitchell said.

Mitchell credits the commission with their handling of the personnel actions. "Because the commissioners followed the law, it was easy to get them dismissed from

the federal suit. You can usually get your clients out of cases, when they've obeyed the law," said Mitchell.

County officials echoed Mitchell's satisfaction on their dismissal from the federal action. Commissioner Karn commented, "This proves that the commission has not discriminated against anyone's civil rights."

"I didn't think we should have been named as defendants in the first place," said Cox.

The commission filed writs of mandamus against the sheriff on January 14, ordering him to comply with personnel ordinances. This writ has not yet been heard, pending a decision by Judge Robert A. Doughty concerning a motion filed by Samuels' attorneys, Michael A. Gross of Albuquerque and Kathleen D. LeBeck, representing Risk Management Division. The motion sought to have Mitchell disqualified as county attorney in the matter of the writ, and also to order the county to pay Samuels' legal expenses.

"This dismissal of the county from the federal suits could have tremendous bearing on the county's insurance with Risk Management, because it is not costing the county a thing except for my fees," Mitchell said.

Mitchell's fees to the county in regard to this matter will, according to him, total less than \$500.

\$150 of this has already been billed.

A letter had been sent to the county manager and to the sheriff's office dated February 29 from Risk Management, the state insurance division, stating that Risk Management was "very disturbed about the number and types of Civil Rights claims" from Lincoln County, and informing the county that coverage probably will be cancelled July 1, "unless we can negotiate both coverage and price."

Taylor Henderson, a claims representative for Risk Management Division, says Mitchell's optimism about the county insurance situation is unfounded.

"No, it won't make any difference in the cancellation of the current insurance policy with Lincoln County, because, as the letter stated, adjustment still has to be made. We believe that the sheriff's department is part of the county."

Henderson further elaborated: "It wouldn't matter to us if the lawsuits were filed against a maintenance person or against the sheriff, it still costs us the same, no matter how many county personnel are involved. Our policy covers all county employees. It doesn't make any difference to us that the commission has been dismissed from the suit, as long as there is still even one county employee still named in the action."

McCormick a candidate for district attorney

Michael F. McCormick announced on Sunday that he is seeking election to the office of District Attorney for the 12th Judicial District, made up of Otero and Lincoln counties.

McCormick was born in Carlsbad and reared in southeastern New Mexico, graduating in 1954 from Carlsbad High School. He is a University of New Mexico graduate and a United States Army veteran, serving two years with the 101st Airborne Division and five years in special forces reserve.

He was awarded his juris doctor degree from the University of New Mexico School of Law in 1965, and was admitted to the state bar in 1966. In 1972, McCormick was admitted to practice law before the

United States Supreme Court.

Before law school, McCormick worked for two years for the United States Department of Labor in Washington, D.C.

McCormick is deputy DA for the 12th Judicial District. His experience has included private practice in Carlsbad and Ruidoso. He was assistant DA for the Fifth Judicial District for three years, and DA from 1977 until 1985. He served as city attorney in Carlsbad from 1970 until 1977.

The candidate has been an instructor in government and criminal justice at New Mexico State University, Carlsbad Branch.

He is a member of the National District Attorney Association. He completed the Career Prosecutor Course at the National College of District Attorneys, and has served as a faculty adviser for the college.

McCormick was president of the New Mexico District Attorneys' Association from 1982-83. He is a member of the New Mexico Supreme Court's Committee on Uniform Criminal Jury Instructions and Rules of Criminal Procedure. In 1982, he was recognized by the New Mexico Supreme Court for outstanding service to the judiciary.

McCormick, his wife, Wanda, and a son reside in Ruidoso.

Objective: To further the development and use of the new airport to the benefit of all towns in Lincoln County. Today a manufacturer or a tourist-related industry will not take a second look at a com-

munity that cannot provide commercial airline service, she said. The airport has been a long and tough struggle for everyone but it is "one giant step" to progress and a brighter economic future for all of Lincoln County.

Qualification: A licensed pilot and co-owner of Franklin Airshow and Double Eagle Productions and currently serving on the Board of Directors of the International Council of Airshows.

Franklin has lived in Alto for three years. She was born and raised in Las Cruces and attended New Mexico State University. She is married to Jim Franklin of Franklin Airshow and Double Eagle Productions. She has three children, Debra Haines, 29, Artesia, Troy Davis, 27, of Albuquerque, and Kyle, 8, at home. Property owners pack P&Z zoning hearing

The most popular show in town was at the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center Monday as Ruidoso residents packed the meeting room to protest, or to comment, on proposed zoning ordinance and zoning map changes for the village.

Village officials sent letters out to all Ruidoso property owners asking for their input into the changes. People received notice whether their property would be affected by the new zoning proposals.

"We had chambers full of people for the public hearing," said planning administrator Cleatus Richards. "I don't know that we counted how many spoke. We ran the hearing for a full three hours, and people were stating opinions throughout."

According to Richards, not all speakers protested suggested zoning changes. "Many were still obtaining information," he said. "We did receive a number of protests that were handed in during the hearing period." Protests had to be written to be accepted and recorded.

As far as format goes for the public hearings, Richards said, "We generally indicated that speakers should try to restrict their opinions to five minutes if possible, but no hard position was taken."

Richards has a complete list of all subdivisions in which protest or support letters have been received. "We have made a summary and logging of all protests, and listed those by subdivision as a means of categorizing," he said.

The Planning and Zoning Commission started the public hearing

by going down that list and asking for public comments.

"After a while, we found that a number of people had come in from out of town, so we deviated from following the list in order to provide an opportunity for the out of town people to ask questions of file protests, since they had traveled a long way. We were, by the end of the day, able to accommodate all who showed up at the hearing."

There are 29 subdivisions. After these were discussed specifically, the floor was opened for general questions and comments.

Seven out of nine P&Z commissioners were in attendance. These included: Candace Garrett, David Harding, Peggy Jordan, Ellen Long, chairman Eddie Nichols, Greg Perrett, and John White. Mike Runnels was present as legal counsel.

Next week, from 3 to 5 p.m. Monday and 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. Thursday, the hearings will continue. "We will again start at beginning of the list of subdivisions and consider in detail those legal protests to the changes," said Richards. "We may have to have several continuation dates before we complete the consideration of legal protests or general comments."

It's not too late to add your input to the proposed zoning ordinances. "We will accept protest statements or comment statements throughout the course of public hearings, no matter how long it takes," explained Richards.

Interested property owners can obtain a listing of subdivisions and explanations of zoning categories from the P&Z office at Village Hall, or by calling 258-4014.

The Plant Corner

I want to use fewer botanical names for the plants and less scientific terminology to make this column more interesting to the most people. Everyone knows what a rubber tree plant is—whereas most of us have to look up what a ficus elastica, Dacora, is.

I was in the home of a friend this week. She was very concerned about her rubber tree plant, Ficus elastica, "Dacora". The new leaves were large and a healthy dark green color, perched atop long stems with no lower leaves. For immediate help, cut the stems back to one foot above the soil level. It may hurt, but go on and out.

Excessive watering is the main cause for this condition, so allow the root system to dry out a little between waterings. Rubber tree plants need a warm temperature to thrive, never below 60 degrees and very good light while remaining protected from direct sunlight.

As long as the roots are confined to a small pot, it will take 10 to 15 years to produce a reasonable rubber tree plant. But given better conditions, a good planter, 20 gallon size, with more room for root growth, development would be more rapid. I have a four year old rubber tree plant, in a ground planter. The plant had two stems and was about 24" tall when I planted it in my inside hall planter.

There is a skylight over the planter and the ceiling is 27" high, and so is the rubber tree plant. Last summer on a very warm day one stem fell and broke off. Within just a few days, four new shoots came out on the broken stem. Now there are five stems 27" tall and there are lush green leaves on all

stems. Keep the leaves dust-free with a soft cloth and distilled water. No leaf polish please! Sprangtails and spider mites are the pests to watch out for.

With proper lighting and watering, from which foliage plants get their good, frequent fertilizing is unnecessary. I use Peters 30-10-10 fertilizer. And fertilizer, it should be remembered, is not a substitute for either moisture or light. My suggested strength is to use only half the minimum suggested by the manufacturer.

My suggestion for the plant causing the concern is to add more light from underneath with a gro-lite. It should have light from above, such as a skylight, or if you don't have a skylight add a gro-lite on top of the plant, as the plant grows taller it will shade the lower leaves and smaller plants, thus the reason for the gro-lite at ground level.

If you follow the above instructions, in time you will have a lovely plant. If not, "oops, there goes another rubber tree plant."

Downs Trustees hire animal control officer

"I think I could do you all a good job," said Paul Keith, just before being named the new animal control officer for the Village of Ruidoso Downs.

Ruidoso Downs Trustees, during their Monday meeting, voted unanimously to hire Keith, who will concentrate his efforts on animal control and serve as groundskeeper for the village in the absence of animal control calls.

"I'd just appreciate the privilege," said Keith. His "pleasant disposition" and the fact that he lives within two blocks of village hall were cited as reasons in his favor as a candidate for the job.

Also during the meeting, trustees took no action on a request

by H.T. Bond, who requested to be allowed to construct a carport within a few feet of his Ruidoso Downs Heights property line.

Bond explained that his house was situated "caddy-whompus across the lot," making it difficult to make improvements within the boundaries of the lot.

But trustees explained that the only regulation restricting such construction on the lot are the subdivision restrictive covenants, over which they exercise no control.

Trustee Bill Smith read from the restrictive covenants of Ruidoso Downs Heights subdivision, which call for a vote of 75 percent of property owners on any change to the covenants. In minor cases, such as Bond's, only the written approval of all property owners within 300 feet of his lot are needed to allow the change.

Bond was told that he could obtain the names of all property owners near his home by contacting the county tax office in Carrizozo.

In other business, the trustees: —Approved a request from the Ruidoso Downs Volunteer Fire Department to send two members to a hazardous materials seminar Saturday and Sunday in Tularosa.

—Approved a request to send deputy clerk Janice Polk to a Risk Management Seminar April 7 and 8 in Albuquerque.

—Approved a request from Police Chief Skip Hazel to lease, then purchase a 1987 Ford Bronco from Shamaley Ford, the lowest of two bidders. The vehicle, at a cost of \$13,911.88, will be purchased when Law Enforcement Funds for next year are received. A second vehicle also will be purchased then.

—Accepted the bid of \$305.90

from The Insurance Center for accident insurance for the fire department.

—Informed property owner Mrs. Robert Dominguez that a lot she has for sale in the former Armstrong Tract, on which a prospective buyer hopes to place a mobile home, is not restricted by village zoning, but may be guided by restrictive covenants.

—Suggested the water department conduct tests on water lines, rather than the fire department. Trustees were informed this already is being arranged.

—Heard Nettie Bradley thank village crews for removing dirt from a fence on her property. She had earlier requested the dirt be removed.

—Conducted an executive session to discuss pending litigation.

Tracksters are tops at Alfalfa capitol meet



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

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

All 16 major winners qualify to



NEW MEXICO'S LADY LEGISLATORS: PART II
Representative Pauline Eisenstadt. Democrat, Sandoval. First elected in 1984; beat Republican Donald Doench by 287 votes. Business woman. Chairman of the House Rules Committee and member of the House Judiciary Committee. Also, elected by Democrat House Representatives as Majority Caucus Chairwoman.

Eisenstadt is "very interested in assisting other women" in getting started in politics. "Get your feet wet", she advises them, on precinct-level politics and other people's campaigns. "Women need to be in the pipeline."

She was assigned to Appropriations her first term. It's a "good training ground." Nevertheless, Eisenstadt is still "very concerned about children's issues", and doesn't believe women should avoid them. "Men wouldn't pay attention to those issues", which remain very important and might be neglected.

Eisenstadt finds in politics, "There's discrimination only in this sense: the public holds women to a higher test" regarding their record, competency, etc.

"Politics is still a man's game", she says; however, "I feel it's changing."

Now, the standard question: as Chairman of Rules, how would she like to be called? Madame Chairperson? Madame Chairwoman? "They can call me whatever they want, as long as I'm in charge," Eisenstadt quipped. "Boss" does very nicely.

Any future political ambitions? "All the options are open."

Representative Toots Green. Republican, Otero. First elected in 1984; defeated incumbent Democrat, George Fettingner.

Manages a credit union. Member of the Judiciary Committee and Transportation Committee.

What advice would she offer would-be Lady Legislators? "Go for it. We need women in the Legislature."

George Fettingner was a veritable institution in Santa Fe—the smartest legislator in the state, politicians often remarked. He was a member of the Republican/conservative Democrat coalition, so there was no reason for Green to look forward to white-knuckled Republican support.

"Everybody said it'd be good name identification exposure", but hastened to add she couldn't win. All the bad predictions only inspired Green. "It was a challenge. I was determined I was going to win."

She knocked on doors. "I ran as a candidate, not as a woman", she emphasized. "It's what I can do as

a person that counts." Besides hard work and determination, Green believes a key to the election was her straightforward approach: "I asked people several times to vote for me. People like to be asked."

Green received the committee assignments she wanted. Judiciary was her top priority because "I'm very interested in the prison situation." Too much money and the Duran Consent Decree are her major objections to how the State Pen operates now.

Future political goals? "I like the House. It would be fun to be a committee chairman."

Representative Mary Lambert. Republican, Bernalillo. First elected in 1980, by defeating incumbent Republican, Ruby Appelman.

Business woman. Member of the Taxation and Revenue Committee and the Labor Committee.

Ruby Appelman had been one of three dissident Republicans who supported the House Democrat leadership. That fact colored Lambert's first election substantially.

What advice would she offer a woman opposing a woman? Lambert believes that in her race against Appelman, "It didn't make any difference." In general, however, "Don't get petty. Stick to the issues."

What about House committee assignments? Both Speakers, Gene Samberson of the Republican/conservative Democrat coalition, and Ray Sanchez of the "Loyalist" Democrats, "have been fair." As for assigning women according to preconceived notions of where they "should" go: "We are given a choice." Far from being stuck with them, some women's first choices are education, health and children-oriented committees, because "they feel they know something about those issues."

Future political goals? Lambert "definitely" will not try for the State Senate. She'll run for reelection to the House this year, "then reassess." She has pondered running for Mayor of Albuquerque and for Secretary of State.

As for legislative priorities, "I don't introduce a lot of bills...We have too many laws [already]." She prefers to help constituents solve problems: "to me, that's more important."

Representative Angie Perez. Democrat, Santa Fe. First elected in 1986. The former Santa Fe County Clerk, Perez defeated two men in the Democrat primary by a large margin.

Presently, Perez is establishing a secretarial service. Member of the House Voters and Elections Committee and the House

Education Committee.

Her advice to women who are thinking of running for the State Legislature: "You have to have the support of your family." Perez stressed how helpful her husband was. "He's been the key to my success."

In the Legislature, she received the committee assignments she wanted. The Education Committee was particularly important to her "because of my concern for kids."

Perez's legislative priorities: "human needs." In the 1988 session, she sponsored bills on Medicaid prenatal care and domestic violence victims. She served on the interim Human Needs and Services and Aids Impact Study Committee.

State employees "are an important part of my district." She supports their demands for better salaries, and opposes Governor Carruthers' performance-based pay plan: "Morale is amazingly low."

Perez also puts a top priority on repairing roads in the rural portion of her district.

In the 1987 60-day session, Perez had the best floor attendance record of all 70 House Representatives. She had only 3 unexcused absences and 5 excused absences. I asked if her 1988 record was as excellent.

"Yes, definitely", Perez replied. Sometimes she had to attend her House committee meetings. "Otherwise, I was there."

Senator Helen Steele. Republican, Dona Ana. First elected in 1984; defeated Democrat Olivia Nevarez Rothschild by 38 votes for a vacant seat.

Business woman. Member of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Senate Education Committee and the Committees' Committee.

"Running for office is an educational opportunity that few people

take", Steele observed. Once you take the plunge and announce as a candidate, "People come at you from a totally different direction."

She hopes more women will run for the State Legislature. "We do need the female balance." Are there any important differences? "I find that women are tougher on a lot of issues...and more conservative about money."

Steele likes and respects the other Lady Legislators. "They have the courage of their convictions. If we shake hands on a vote, I know I can count on them."

Was she put on the Education Committee because she is female? Steele doesn't think so. Rather, the Senate leadership "knew I was conservative", and could be counted on "to make the tough vote."

Unlike some of the other Lady Legislators, she "gets satisfaction from carrying legislation." Her priorities include law enforcement measures, drug bills, a highway relief route, water, tourism and economic development.

A major policy philosophy: "I don't like taxes." Steele prefers user fees as a means to pay for government services.

What about her political future? "the best thing you can do is have immediate goals." In that regard, she will definitely run for reelection this year.

Given her narrow margin of victory in 1984, the Democrats have "targeted" Steele's Senate seat. Is it a toss-up district? "Not any more," she answered immediately. In the 1984 election, the Democrat-to-Republican registration ratio was 2.25 to 1. In December of 1987, the ratio had fallen to 1.92 to 1.

"I'm going to run like I'm 10 points behind and not an incumbent." Steele says the Democrats' determination to beat her only gives her encouragement: "Opposition is good for the soul."

Hopefuls for elective office may sign up Tuesday, April 5, to compete in June Primaries and then on to the November general elections.

The offices of treasurer, sheriff, clerk, assessor, commissioner (all three districts) and probate judge will be up for grabs in Lincoln County, and candidates may sign up at the courthouse in Carrizozo.

The district attorney's seat will be open in the Twelfth Judicial District (which includes Lincoln County). Candidates must sign up in Santa Fe.

State Representative seats are to be filled in District 52 (precincts 2, 3, 4, 5 and 12 in Lincoln County), District 56 (precincts 11, 13, 14, 15, 16 and 17) and District 57 (precinct 1). Candidates are to sign up in Santa Fe.

State Senate District 39, including Lincoln County, also will be contested. Again, candidates are to sign up in Santa Fe.

Of course, we'll also be electing a U.S. representative and senator for this area this year.

Hours for signing up Tuesday are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
