## White water whets concern, investigation

Village citizens complained last week that waters flowing down the Rio Ruidoso were carrying a white, chalky substance, apparently originating at Grindstone Canyon Dam.

In response to a number of citizens' complaints, state Environmental Improvement Division staff member Carl Stubbs took samples of the water and sent them to Santa Fe Tuesday for testing. Stubbs said he took samples at four locations.

"We sent off the worst looking samples," said Stubbs. He said he expects results of the tests back within a week or two.

Stubbs said his office monitors environmental changes and reports

to Santa Fe, noting he talked to EID staff in Santa Fe before taking the samples last week.

Stubbs said Ph tests were performed on the water during the construction of the dam.

Citizens who have contacted the EID complain that fill operations at the Grindstone Canyon Dam are causing the changes in the Rio Ruidoso.

Stubbs said the New Mexico Fish and Wildlife Department is involved in investigations over changes to the Rio Ruidoso. Local game warden Roy Hayes was unavailable for comment.

It was learned the two state environmental agencies also have been asked to investigate murky water at Bonto Lake. Stubbs said citizens complain the lake has been disturbed by road construction un-

der way in the area.

Village manager Frank Potter said last week that fill operations are continuing at Grindstone Canyon Dam. He said the water appeared to be coming out clear when he visited the dam late last week.

Potter said when an engineer from the State Engineer Office in Santa Fe visited the dam over a week ago, he cut some (drainage) holes a little bigger, causing some of the white stuff.

Village engineer Mike Davalos is scheduled to visit a dam in Parachute, Colorado, that was built by the same roller-compacted concrete process used at Grindstone. Potter said that dam has been in operation about a year now, and Davalos will be able to learn how things have gone with the opening of that facility.

## Contracts on airport wrapped up

The Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC) closed the books Wednesday on three major contracts at Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA).

The commission approved final change orders on construction contracts that left the projects \$78,208.64 under budget, according to airport engineer Earl Cook. SBAC authorized final payments to the three contractors: Bixby Electric, Tricon-Kent and Nielson's.

With construction winding down on paving, fencing and lighting contracts at the multi-million-dollar facility, commissioners are waiting for federal funding to proceed with the next phases in development.

Meantime, aircraft owners who have hangared their planes at Ruidoso Municipal Airport are pushing for definite answers over their future at SBRA. Merle Miller of the Hangar Owners Association was on hand for Wednesday's meeting with questions over the upcoming move.

The Ruidoso Village Council

took action last week to close all operations at the old airport by July 1, and Miller wanted to know what facilities will be available at the new airport for aircraft operators who own their own hangars. He wanted to know how much T-hangars and land plots will cost at SBRA.

Miller was told the large gang hangar and terminal building will be open by May 15, sunshades will be available on May 1 and rental T-hangars will be complete by June 15. It was learned that hangars are expected to rent for \$125 to \$250, depending on size, and sunshades will cost \$65 a month. Land-lease plots are expected to cost about 31 cents a square foot.

"It's going to be pretty steep," noted Miller, wondering if the Hangar Owners Association could form a corporation and enter into an agreement similar to the one between the hangar developer and the commission.

Ed Garland of Garland and Malone, the hangar developers, said his company has a 30-year ground lease, and at the end of that time the hangars will become the

property of the Village of Ruidoso. Miller reminded the commission that revenues from aircraft owners go beyond the rentals of land or T-hangars, since they purchase fuel and spend money in the village. Miller said Wednesday was the first time a figure had been mentioned for ground lease, noting it is seven times what he currently pays.

"Come back and tell us what you can pay," suggested commissioner Lloyd L. Davis Jr. "Come with a proposal," added Commissioner Ralph Dunlap.

In discussions over outstanding bills, commissioners Dunlap and John Hightower questioned a bill from the Village of Ruidoso for \$45,802.77, finally authorizing payment of \$23,196.87 instead of the higher amount Dunlap recalled when the commission agreed to pay up to \$25,000 on the airport water system, and pointed out that parts of the village invoice were for the fuel delivery system.

John Varley, acting finance director for the village, confirmed

## Father Stampley is dead at 44

Father Burdette Stampley died early Friday, after a long struggle with cancer. He was 44.

Stampley was rector of the Episcopal Church of the Holy Mount since 1980. His duties there included service to congregations at the Episcopal churches in Lincoln, Glencoe and Carrizozo. Stampley was active in the Lincoln County Mental Health Association, Family Crisis Center, Lincoln County Food Bank, AA, Home Health Services, Senior Citizens Center, Ruidoso Care Inc. (a MealCare service) and the Ministerial Alliance.

Before his assignment in Ruidoso, Stampley served as vicar of St. Thomas Episcopal Mission in Dubois, Wyoming. Also, he served in the U.S. Army.

Stampley was born September 14, 1943, to U.S. Navy Commander Burdette Stampley and Bonnie Skiles Stampley in Farragut, Idaho. He was a graduate of the University of Maryland and Virginia Seminary in Alexandria, Virginia.

Stampley began his career in ministry as assistant to the rector at St. Francis Episcopal Church in

Potomac, Maryland.

He is survived by a daughter, Joey, of Greer, South Carolina; a son, John, of Greer; a sister, Bonita Stampley, of Missoula, Montana, and a brother, Victor Stampley, of Missoula.

Services were this morning at the Episcopal Church of the Holy Mount.

Memorials may be made to the Episcopal Church of the Holy Mount, designated for the Burdette Stampley Fund.


Meetings of the group are open to the public.

one \$630 item as a fixed asset in the fuel delivery system.

"We shouldn't get in a squabble at every meeting," said Davis, and Dunlap responded if the commission helps pay for the fuel system the group should receive five cents a gallon in revenues generated to help pay for the system.

Commission fiscal agent Suzanne Cox reminded the commission that state funds were authorized for \$7,387, and the commission authorized her to pay that amount to the village when state funds arrive.

Commissioners didn't pay a bill from Nielson, Inc. for rental of an office trailer, noting it is an operational item, and should be paid by the airport operator, the Village of Ruidoso.

After other regular business the commission retired into executive session to hear a report from

auditor Don Wingfield. Back in regular session, Wingfield told the commission the state Department of Finance and Administration, recognizing SBAC as a separate political entity, will require an annual audit.

In his written report, Wingfield listed 10 items included in his audit over the 18-month period that ended September 30, 1987. They include a review of grant files, vouchers, cash receipts and requests for reimbursement, and a preliminary review of Heckman and Haworth records.

His report lists a summary of federal audit guidelines, review and review of responsibilities and internal control, review with the state auditor of dates and reports; compilation of trial balances and formatting of preliminary financial statements.

In other regular business Wednesday, the commission:

—Was presented with a United States flag flown over the U.S. Capitol Building. A representative from Senator Jeff Bingaman's office was on hand to present the flag and a plaque. SBRA manager Tim Morris said the flag will be framed and hung inside the airport terminal building.

—Asked Cook for figures on upcoming engineering costs.

—Adopted a resolution regarding the Open Meetings Act.

## Commissioner Hightower seeks re-election

John Allen Hightower, life-long resident of Lincoln County, is now serving his eighth year as commissioner and has filed for re-election in the Democratic primary.

He has a family ranching operation in the Ancho area. He served 42 months in World War II, has served on many committees and boards since 1946 and presently holds seats on the Lincoln County Medical Center Board of Directors, Carrizozo Health Center Board, and the New Horizons Developmental Center Board.

Hightower attended New Mexico State University, University of New Mexico, and Cal Tech.

"My guiding principles are my intense belief in Jesus Christ as my personal savior, and, from my parents, honesty, truth, fair play and hard work," says Hightower.

"As commissioner, I take my oath of office very seriously. Commissioners are responsible for conducting the county's business as it relates to spending the tax monies," Hightower says. "It is our responsibility to assist and give guidance to the other departments of county

government as needed. Budget preparation and spending control is a tremendous responsibility.

"With cooperation by the departments, it is relatively simple. If a department head either chooses to disregard the procedures or is incompetent about the budget procedures, the task becomes almost impossible. I've seen it both ways, and I know what I'm talking about."

Hightower addresses the current county situation. "Even as hard as we try to get compliance, the audit always faults the commissioners and their office for 'lack of control' for any violation by anyone. I've been accused of 'being out to get the sheriff.' This is absolutely false. My administration has never wanted anything but to assist the sheriff in bookkeeping procedures, budget control, and to avoid lawsuits from violation of the Personnel Ordinance. I've been in many hours of executive meetings with the other commissioners, the manager, and the attorney. I've never heard a remark by any of them which could be taken in any way as an attack on the sheriff. It's always been 'how

can we remedy the situation? We have tried and very obviously, failed."

Hightower also addresses the county road situation. "On roads, I challenge anyone to show me a road which gives access to the Forest lands which has been closed during any of my eight years tenure. On the contrary, I claim credit for the O-Bar-0 road being open as per the court decision back in 1984. My concern for the other small tracts of public land is that there is no way to control hunters on these tracts. I am deeply committed to the public having access to Forest lands and large tracts of state and Bureau of Land Management lands.

"I am also concerned about respect for private property rights, a basic part of this free country of ours. I'll defend this principle to my last day."

In conclusion, Hightower states that the commissioners "have had some tough situations confront us in the past year and a half.

"We have met them head-on, and defended the laws of this land, the way our oath of office requires."

Memorial services are to be held on Monday, April eighteen, at eleven in the morning at the Episcopal Church of the Holy Mount for Father Burdette Stampley Jr., who was called Home by Our Lord on April fifteen.

The Reverend Anne Gaddy, with the help of The Reverend Bob Batton, will be the celebrant. And the Reverend Steve Birdwell, priest of Saint Andrews Church in Roswell, will preach the homily.

Father Stampley was born September fourteen, 1943, in Farragut, Idaho, to Naval Commander Burdette Stampley Sr., and the former Bonnie Skiles. During boyhood and youth he lived in many places across the waters including Hawaii and Germany. This experience added to his natural gift for compassion and his deep sympathy for "all sorts and conditions of mankind" as the Episcopal prayer book says.

After graduating from the University of Maryland, Father Stampley studied at the Virginia Seminary at Alexandria, Virginia. After he was ordained he served as assistant rector for Saint Francis Episcopal Church in Potomac, Maryland.

From here the mountains of his native Idaho called him back to Dubois, Wyoming, where he was vicar of Saint Thomas Episcopal Mission for a number of years. Previous to this he had served in the United States Army.

In 1981, he came to Ruidoso to become priest of the Episcopal Church in Lincoln County, holding services at The Church of the Holy Mount; Saint Anne Chapel, Glencoe; Church of Saint Mathias, Carrizozo; and House Church in Lincoln.

### A MAN OF THE MOUNTAIN

Father Stampley's favorite land of Mother Earth was the mountains. Jane Deyo, organist for Church of the Holy Mount, in remembering Father Stampley said:

"He was truly a mountain man. He loved the hills and was always happy going out on missions of help to folks in the hills around his mission in Wyoming. He was a man of great compassion."

Father Stampley often spoke of how he would at every opportunity go out into the highest hills and mountains where he felt his spirit renewed and his heart uplifted as he felt the closeness to The Lord, out in majesty and sacredness of the high lands, calling to mind the words of the psalms:

"I to the hills will lift mine eyes  
From whence cometh my help  
And also:  
"And the strength of the hills  
Is His also."

Father Stampley's compassion for all life, and his devotion knew no bounds. He was tireless and unsparing of himself in giving help in need to individual folks, as well as through his ministry in the church.

In his pickup he would bring a load of wood, cut and loaded by himself, to someone with a slim wood pile and winter coming on. He was on the watch for those who might need food, or who needed medical care.

It was his very life's blood to do acts of kindness, and to come to the aid of those in dire need, and all with a kindly smile and cheerful word, and always a special prayer to God at just the right moment.

Especially was he an inspiration to us by his courage during his long illness — by his own cheerfulness, and faith during great adversity giving all of a strength that will abide with us and serve us in our own trials always.

Father Stampley has left a permanent benediction in our lives, a fond and enduring spot in our hearts. And now we rejoice that our Lord has said to Father Stampley:

"Well done, thou good and faithful servant, Welcome into Heaven."

# Texas woman found dead Friday

The body of a Texas woman was discovered Friday morning in her car parked beside the Community United Methodist Church. Catherine Rush Ray, 57, of Lubbock, Texas, was dead on arrival at Lincoln County Medical Center, according to Ruidoso Police reports.

Potter's policy was announced the day after a Ruidoso man fell into the compactor while pushing pine needles into the hopper from the back of his pickup. The compactor was turned off when the man fell into the area where trash is dumped and later compacted.

Emergency Medical Services personnel had to go into the compactor to render aid, and later transported the victim to Lincoln County Medical Center.

"There's no reason for people in village limits to use the compactor," remarked Potter. He said the special pick-up is always available by calling 257-4090, and the municipal landfill is open to the public at no charge.


## Missing a peacock?







## Barrows open Magic Touch Massage Therapy

Dan and Karen Barrow are partners in life, and are now also partners in a new massage therapy business in midtown Ruidoso.

Magic Touch Massage Therapy, upstairs from J. Roberts at 2608-B Sudderth, opened in the fall and is becoming a very successful business venture.

The space the Barrows' business occupies is sunny and decorated in turquoise, peach and mauve, with soothing paintings on the wall and creamy white carpeting and furniture. Acoustic guitar music fills the rooms, and the atmosphere is calm and reassuring.

Dan Barrow, who does the actual massage therapy, says that he found his current occupation "by a strange twist of fate."

"David and Juanita Moran asked me to videotape the massage classes at Health Matters Therapy and Education Center," says Dan Barrow. "I thought that, since I would be there all the time anyway, I might as well learn about massage therapy, and so I signed up to take the course."

Barrow had previously learned first aid, and had considered taking emergency medical training in order to become an EMT. "I had learned to do back rubs, things like that, because I've always been interested in touch. But I never considered massage as a profession until I took the classes," he says.

Prior to opening the business, Barrow worked in construction with his brother.

Since then, he has become a fer-

vent advocate of massage therapy. "I love it. I was born to do this," he says enthusiastically.

Barrow took 500 hours of classes and training during his six-month learning session, and received certification in October. In New Mexico, massage therapists do not have to be licensed, but Texas requires registration, and Barrow has completed the Texas certification process.

He would like to study and specialize in neuromuscular therapy. "Being a massage therapist is a whole new way of life for me," he says. "I feel stronger as a person in every way—physically, psychologically, spiritually and emotionally."

"As I give more and more massages, I realize how people can alter their lives in positive ways. The more this happens to me, the more I want it to happen to everyone."

"He's following his own advice," Karen Barrow notes.

Karen defines herself as an entrepreneurial-type person. "I've always wanted to do some sort of positive business-related work for a living," she says. "I'm really a 'people person,' so I take care of the business aspect of Magic Touch, and leave the massage to Dan."

Karen admits to having learned a lot about the many benefits of massage. "It's so relaxing. I didn't know that I would enjoy receiving structured touch as much as I do, but I find that it has so many healthful aspects. Besides relaxing

you and feeling good, it unblocks a lot of stress, and improves your circulation and lymph systems."

## Zoning ordinance hearing scheduled for Wednesday

Public hearings being conducted at Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center will pave the way for adoption of a new zoning ordinance and map that have been on the drawing board for over three years. The Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) is in the midst of a series of public hearings over the new ordinance and map, with the next hearing scheduled from 6:30-9:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 20, in council chambers of Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

than three years ago to draft a comprehensive plan, transportation plan, zoning ordinance and map. After that group completed its job, a string of Planning and Zoning Commissions and planning administrators have reviewed, rewritten and reworked the documents and map.

The whole process was delayed at one time when it was discovered, through a court case, that the land use map was adopted in place of the zoning map, in 1976.

Before the recent public hearings began, the village notified every property owner in the village, by first class mail, of the upcoming rezoning. Since the form letters warned of a change in zoning within 100 feet of each property owner, the mailing resulted in hundreds of telephone calls and visits to Village Hall.

Village staff confirmed that 13,000 letters were sent, while only about 2,500 properties were changed or within the 100-foot notification zone. Richards and division director Leon Eggleston contend the over-notification was a good thing.

The proposed map is on display in council chambers of Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center, and copies of the proposed ordinance may be reviewed.

"I think we're moving through it quite well," said planning administrator Cleatus Richards. He said during early hearings the commission was able to review all protests over subdivisions and is now reviewing the text of the proposed ordinance.

He said hearings will be scheduled to complete the planning group's review, before making recommendations to the Ruidoso Village Council. Richards said preliminary ideas on recommendations have been developed, but final recommendations probably won't be discussed until early May.

"We're trying to get the package to the council as quickly as possible," said Richards. The council will then schedule a public hearing before acting on the proposals. A planning firm was hired more



If you don't think the Republican Convention will be hotter than the Democratic National Convention in Atlanta, you haven't been to New Orleans in the summertime.

Vice President George Bush has the nomination wrapped up. 1,139 delegates are needed. Bush has over 800.

So have Kansas Senator Bob Dole; California Governor George Deukmejian; Governors Tom Kean of New Jersey and James Thompson of Illinois; ex-Governors Richard Thornburgh of Pennsylvania and Lamar Alexander of Tennessee; and Representative Jack Kemp of New York. Another promising prospect: Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor. (Paul Wieck, *The Albuquerque Journal*, April 3).

You can be there when it all happens, drinking Lemon Coke with Blanche and Stella, or playing Spit In the Ocean with Stanley and Mitch.

But how? How do you get to be a Republican Delegate?

You have to be careful to dive where the deep pool is.

Step 1. Ask Elena Sanchez of the Republican Party of New Mexico to send you the delegate "Tool Kit." Their address: P.O. Box 36900, 1930 San Pedro, N.E., Albuquerque, New Mexico 87176.

Step 2. In the Kit is a "Declaration of Self-Nomination" to be a delegate or alternate. You must

\*be a registered Republican as of May 10, 1988.

\*pledge either to a presidential candidate or to be uncommitted.

\*declare if you wish to be either an At-Large delegate or a Congressional District delegate. You cannot be both.

\*return your "Declaration" to the State Republican Chairman before 5:00 Friday, June 10, 1988.

\*agree to pay all your New Orleans expenses. The Party can't bankroll you; however, private financial assistance is allowed.

I have to admit. I love to be waited on.

In New Orleans, State Law (1-8-60 NMSA 1978) makes the Delegation Chairman cast the first presidential nomination ballot vote according to the vote percentage each presidential candidate received in the June 8th primary. There's a 15% threshold a candidate must reach to get any delegates; the same is true for "uncommitted" delegates.

Now, you're on your way to New Orleans, right?

That just goes to show you, Blanche. You never know what's coming.

Wrong. A Republican State Convention will occur July 9, at the Marriott Hotel in Albuquerque. That's when and where New Mexico's 26 delegates will be selected.

The process involves 4 conventions on the same day:

(1) Three Congressional District Conventions will be held simultaneously to select 3 delegates and 3 alternates from each District. Total: 9 delegates, 9 alternates.

(2) The other 17 delegates and 17 alternates will be at-large, and selected at the State Convention Main Session held after the District conventions.

There's some obscure meaning in this, but I fail to catch...

In each convention, caucuses for the presidential candidates create a roster of names of candidates arranged in the descending order of votes received. The caucus voting is done from preprinted ballots bearing the names of self-nominated candidates.

A Board of Judges "then select, by rigid rules and conditions, from each Roster" the delegates and alternates.

You...are not the gentleman I was expecting. You're not Shep Huntley.

Delegates and alternates will be apportioned according to the percentage of the vote the various candidates (also "uncommitted") receive in the 1988 primary.

In New Orleans, you and George Bush will discover there is indeed a streetcar named "Desire."

Whoever you are, I've always depended upon the kindness of strangers.

If you're a newcomer to politics, you'll discover at the statewide convention on July 9, a fundamental truth about politics everywhere:

Something is wrong at Grindstone Canyon Dam.

A Ruidoso family, living just downstream from Grindstone Canyon Dam, has had to move because of the pollution in their ponds. They fear for their children's safety.

Further downstream from the dam, the white chalky substance in the water's flow is encrusting the creek bed, turning rock, tree root and aquatic plant an eerie green- and blue-tinged white.

Further downhill, the polluted Grindstone water invades the clear Carrizo Creek, turning it, too, into a milky mess.

At the Rio Ruidoso, the white substance is absorbed into the much broader river's flow, but its influence is still there.

It is there, in the water, and it is a problem. Some people get their drinking water from the river after it mixes with Carrizo Creek.

Something's wrong, and even if the flow from the dam were shut off or properly filtered now, the damage already done may be something we'll regret for a long time.

But by Friday afternoon, the white mess was still coming from the dam.

It must be corrected, and it must be corrected now. —DJP


