Forest on fire Thursday's blaze chars 40 acres

High winds apparently caused a controlled burn to become out of control Thursday at Coal Mine Canyon near Fort Stanton Mesa, resulting in a blaze that scorched 40 acres before coming under the control of a slurry bomber and the combined forces of almost every firefighter in the county.

Suspected as the cause of the afternoon blaze are piles of slash that were being burned by Twin Mountain Rock crews working on the new road to Sierra Blanca Regional Airport, according to National Forest Service and State Forestry officials. Weather reports listed wind gusts of up to 69 miles per hour during the day.

The fire was reported about 2 p.m. to the State Forestry office in Capitan and units from all over the county responded. Crews from Twin Mountain Rock used giant bulldozers to clear a firebreak around the burning grass and forest, and mammoth Twin Mountain water tankers also were called into action, dousing the wind-fanned flames with cab-mounted nozzles.

A slurry bomber from Black Hills Aviation in Alamogordo dropped 2,000 gallons of fire retardant to help suppress the forest fire.

The blaze was declared "totally contained" by Friday, but was under observation until Friday night.

For a time, flames threatened some homes in the area, but none were damaged. The property that was burned is vacant land, and is owned by Rose Peebles, according to a spokesperson at State Forestry.

An investigation is under way by the State Forestry Division, the agency that has jurisdiction over fires on state and private land in New Mexico. The agency will take "all appropriate law enforcement action that is necessary," according to District Forester Barbara Luna.

A citation could be issued if negligence is determined as the cause of the fire. Also, the property owner may take civil action in the

Dam's no problem says village staff

"There's nothing wrong with the dam," stated village engineer Mike Davalos Friday.

Fill operations are continuing at the Grindstone Canyon Dam, in spite of a ruling by District Judge Sandra Grisham, and in spite of concerns voiced by area citizens over a white substance being carried into the Rio Ruidoso since the dam was placed in operation.

Judge Grisham enjoined the village from discharging water on the property of Rick and Jane Hall in an amount greater than the amount that is flowing into the dam from natural run-off. She ordered the village to pay the Halls \$50 a day as long as gauges show more inflow than outflow of natural run-offs.

According to village officials, the Halls received a check from the village late last week, as the outflow gauge continues to show a larger number than the inflow measuring device.

The Hall's home is within 1,000 yards of the Grindstone Canyon Dam, and the family moved after the dam filling operations began. The dam is the dam caused two ponds on their property to be filled with sand. The family is concerned with the changes in their ponds since the dam was put in operation.

Davalos confirmed those two gauges don't match right now, noting the two would only be exactly the same if the dam was watertight, with no leaks. But, since dams are never totally watertight, the village is actually losing some of its water rights along with the natural flow, explained Davalos.

"Initially I was concerned," said Davalos. "Now I'm convinced again that our dam is functioning as all other RCC (roller compacted concrete) dams," he added.

Davalos said he has done a great deal of research, and has compared Grindstone Canyon Dam operations with the operation of similar dams. He said the water being lost actually goes back into Carrizo Creek.

"The water they're (Halls) getting now is not of any harm to them," said Davalos. "I think the stream is probably as beneficial to them as it is to Carrizo Creek," he

added. Any detrimental effect experience up to now has been caused by substance, not water, noted Davalos.

'As time goes by the dam will seal' - village engineer

"The substance causing the detrimental effect to the Halls, is the very substance that will seal the dam," remarked Davalos, predicting the effect to be gone within the next six months. "As time goes by the dam will seal," he said.

Davalos noted when any dam is in operation, negligible leakage is classified at 10 gallons per minute, with the Grindstone Canyon Dam expected to leak somewhat more than that.

Davalos will visit a roller compacted concrete dam in Parachute, Colorado, the first week in May. That dam, built in 1982 or 1983, is privately owned by Exxon.

Davalos said the white substance flowing in the river has been identified as calcium carbonate. He said Boyle Engineering took samples as required by the State Engineer Office before the dam was approved for filling.

"We stated our opinion that it was not a pollutant and not a danger to public health; he (State Engineer) didn't disagree," said Davalos, convinced the substance is not a danger. He said the cost to completely eliminate the material at this point would be very high.

"The dam is predictable to the point where it's performing from what happened on other dams," said Davalos, adding anything the village does now would be to satisfy downstream users.

The dam is now filled to about half its final depth, but not half its capacity, said Davalos. He said the water will spread out over a greater area as fill operations continue.

Davalos said monitoring procedures include a weekly check inside the gallery, records of daily flows and a monthly report to the State Engineer Office. Village staff also checks the instrumentation on the dam.

Morris pilots new village division

'I think this is something that is going to help the town'

When the Ruidoso Village Council established the Aviation and Transportation Division earlier this month, councillors placed the new section in the hands of airport manager Tim Morris.

While the new division presently includes just the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA), Morris said future plans extend to a whole range of transportation services.

"We're talking about adding shuttle services," said Morris. He said he and village manager Frank Potter recently attended a meeting over Title 18 federal funding for vehicles and personnel. The program is not funded at this point, but when the federal government authorizes funds, Morris said he hopes to be first in line to develop a system of transportation from the airport to the ski area, race track and village.

"We would be willing to develop with private enterprise to develop that, too," remarked Morris. His involvement, nearly from

the very beginning, in the development of the multi-million-dollar air field he now manages, has given Morris a strong background in working with federal and state agencies.

An Odessa, Texas, native, Morris is married to Judy Pollard Morris. The couple married in 1982, and Judy Morris teaches at Ruidoso Middle School.

Tim Morris first worked at the Ruidoso Municipal Airport in the summer when he was in high school.

"My family has always come to Ruidoso ... my mother came when she was a child," noted Morris.

He graduated from Texas Tech University and spent a semester teaching art in San Antonio, Texas, before stopping by Ruidoso one day and finding that then airport manager Frank Potter had a job open-

ing for a lineman. His love for Ruidoso and aviation prompted Morris to join the airport staff, where he has been ever since. He became manager in 1974 when Potter moved to Village Hall as assistant village manager.

"I've been involved with aviation since I was 13," recalled Morris. The son of a World War II Army Air Corps flyer, Morris started flying gliders when he was 13, mainly because he was too young to solo a plane. In the years between his first gliding flight, and joining the airport staff, Morris continued to fly when he could, but didn't have the opportunity to get his private pilot's license until moving permanently to Ruidoso.

For several years, Morris operated a charter business, flying other people's airplanes to supplement his income. That charter business

was put on the back burner during the development of SBRA. Morris said he became so involved with operating one airport and overseeing the development of another, that he turned in his charter certificate to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

Between high school and college, Morris traveled the United States as a professional cheerleader, working as an instructor for the National Cheerleaders Association.

"I think I gained a lot of good experience doing that," said Morris. "I learned how to deal with and work with people from all walks of life," he added. He hung up his pom poms after two years, and turned his attention to college, graduating in art education.

When asked for a demonstration of his cheerleading skills, Morris gives just a half-hearted "rah rah," but he sounds a lot like a cheerleader when talking about his profession.

"I think this is something that is going to help the town," said Morris

Fruman seeks re-election to court of appeals

Incumbent Harvey Fruman is seeking the Democratic nomination for a second term as judge, Court of Appeals.

Judge Fruman has served as appeals court judge since March 1986.

"I have established an excellent relationship of trust, respect and cooperation with my colleagues, as well as with all other appellate and trial judges in this state," said Fruman in his announcement. "My opinions provide an ample opportunity for every voter to judge my ability to analyze, reason, write and decide—abilities which are a prerequisite for this office," he added.

The Court of Appeals hears and decides issues of law arising from all state district courts and from most administrative agencies, explained Fruman. He said service on the court requires an extensive

knowledge of, and experience with, those issues, lower courts and agencies.

"Our decisions not only affect the rights, property and interests of the participants in the case decided, but also provide legal guidance to courts, attorneys and litigants in all future litigation," said Fruman.

A 1971 graduate of the University of New Mexico School of Law, Fruman has been licensed to practice law for more than 16 years. He has 10 years experience practicing in the Court of Appeals and the Supreme Court.

Fruman spend six and a half years in the attorney general's office, serving in various capacities, including director and prosecutor for both the criminal division and the economic crimes division. He served as attorney for consumer protection, financial institutions

and numerous state agencies while working for the attorney general.

Fruman conceived and developed the consumer-business arbitration program for New Mexico Better Business Bureau, served in the governor's office for three years and has served as superintendent of the state Regulation and Licensing Department. The candidate spent four years in private practice.

A veteran of the United States Army, Fruman is married and has two sons. He is 45 years old.

"I have written and participated in hundreds of civil, criminal and administrative appellate decisions," said Fruman. "It is an honor and privilege to serve on the court, and I am committed to maintaining the quality, dedication and responsiveness of the judiciary," he added.

Crimestoppers work for better communication

Ruidoso Lincoln/County Crimestoppers talked Thursday of improving communication between the program and area law enforcement agencies.

Ruidoso Police detective Lanny Maddox, liaison officer between Crimestoppers and the law enforcement community, said he needs to be informed of the disposition of cases to make recommendations on rewards. He said two telephone tips were referred to agencies other than Ruidoso Police and Crimestoppers wasn't publicly credited for resulting arrests. He said he wasn't informed of progress in the two cases, and couldn't advise the board if rewards should be authorized.

"Crimestoppers depends on the public for funds," noted Maddox, adding the program can't benefit from court-ordered restitution if the judge isn't informed the case was helped by a Crimestoppers tip.

"It's important that agencies give Crimestoppers credit—important to the program," remarked board member Dave Parks. "That's the most powerful publicity ... a solved crime," he added.

Maddox said he'll look into a Friends of Crimestoppers organization and report back.

Meanwhile the board voted to

delay paying the automatic \$500 reward on a narcotics trafficking case until some documentation is provided by the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, the agency that made the arrest. The board recommended paying a \$150 reward on a tip that resulted in an arrest by Ruidoso Downs Police. That case involved the burglary of the Great American Land and Cattle Company.

Board members, meeting at the TeePee Lounge at Ruidoso High School, also discussed a project already under way to place Crimestoppers signs in residential areas. Maddox announced the Ruidoso Noon Lions Club provided seed money for the project with a \$100 donation.

"It's going to be a deterrent to crime," said Maddox, adding he'll be soliciting more donations from businesses to pay for the signs. He reported on getting permission to place the signs on Village of Ruidoso Street Department signposts.

The board then voted to loan camera, equipment and supplies to the 12th Judicial Law Enforcement organization for a child identification project at White Sands Mall in Alamogordo.



Number five Amanda Samuels split sets with her singles opponent but fell, 6-3, 2-6, 6-4. JV player Lori Swalander played well at number


six in place of Donna Garcia but lost, 6-2, 6-1.



Warrior boys first, girls second at Artesia track meet

The Ruidoso boys and girls track teams turned in a very successful performance in Friday's Artesia track meet.

The Warriors broke three school records, qualified for the state track meet in 10 events, and brought home first and second place trophies.

Ruidoso's boys tied for first place with Lovington, compiling 74 points. Other AAA schools attending the meet were Portales, Roswell, Goddard, and New Mexico Military Institute. The meet was the first opportunity teams have had to qualify for the state meet.

Senior Rusty Shelton led the Warrior boys, setting a new school record and qualifying for the state track meet in three events.

Shelton's 15.26 performance in the 110 meter high hurdles bested

other entrants and erased a 10-year-old Ruidoso High School mark. Teammate Jason Willins trailed Shelton by only a tenth of a second, also qualifying for the state event.

Shelton's second first place finish came in the 300 meter hurdles, with a time of 40.63. The senior sprinter then teamed with Jason Willins, Chris Torres, and James Hall to finish third in the 400 meter relay in just 44.54. Both performances were state qualifying.

Also earning a spot in the state meet was James Hall, who placed third in the 400 meter dash with a record-breaking time of 51.25. Hall dashed to a first place finish in the 200 meter event, with a time of 22.89.

Distance runner Ira Sago won both the 1600 and the 3200 meter events, with times of 4:43.35 and 10:31.82, respectively. Sergio Hernandez came in third in the 800 meter event, finishing in 2:08.42.

Trailing Rusty Shelton in the 300 meter hurdles were Jason Willins, who finished third, and Clint Walker, who placed fifth.

The 1600 medley relay squad and the 1600 meter relay team earned a pair of third place finishes, while the 800 meter four-some placed fifth. Members of the medley team were Brandon Vowel, Chris Torres, Ronnie Randolph, and Daniel Martinez. The 1600 meter group was identical to the medley, with the exception of Sergio Hernandez, who replaced Daniel Martinez. 800 meter relayers were Jason Willins, Michael Swanner, Dusty Beavers, and Chris Torres.

In the field events, Chris Torres leapt 18-7 to place first in the long jump, Jason Willins took third with an 18-2 effort.

Todd Morris overcame gusty winds to place second in the javelin, with a 159-1 toss.

Ruidoso Coach Ronny Maskew praised the performances of Michael Randolph and Daniel Martinez, who ran well despite being forced to run in consecutive events.

Ruidoso's girls squad placed second in the meet, missing first by only three points. Lovington won the affair with 83 points.

Lori Walker earned a bid to the state tourney with a first in the shot and a third in the discus, with distances of 33-11.5 and 101-10, respectively. Walker's discus performance set a new Warrior record.

Other Ruidosoans qualifying for state were Ardena Commanche, second in the 3200 meter run, Chantel Bowen, third in the high jump, Donna Peso, third in the 100 meter hurdles, and Dorley Patton, who took first in the 300 meter hurdles.

Long jumper Tara Miller took

second, leaping 14-8. Jennifer Jimenez threw the discus 99-3 to place fourth.

Joellyn Commanche came in fourth in the 3200 meter run, then took third in the 1600 event. Commanche's times were 13:24.6 and 6:09.09, respectively.

In the 400 meter dash, Shala Gosdin won with a time of 63.15. Jennifer Parker finished third in 65.45 seconds.

Cindi Harrison placed second in the 800 meter run, timing 2:33.45. Missy Gosdin ran third in the 300 meter hurdles, in 52.64.

Both the 1600 medley relay team and the 1600 meter relay team took first place, timing 4:41.70 and 4:23.67, respectively. The 800 meter squad took third in

1:54.28, while the 400 relay team placed fourth, in 53.43.

1600 medley members were Tara Miller, Shala Gosdin, Tiffany Snodgrass, and Ardena Commanche, the 1600 meter team was comprised of Jennifer Parker, Tiffany Snodgrass, Trina Martin, and Shala Gosdin. The 400 meter team included Dorley Patton, Amy Thornton, Tara Miller, and Trina Martin, all but Martin ran on the 800 meter squad, joined by Missy Gosdin.

Coach Maskew was very pleased with the girls' efforts, commenting that Dorley Patton's 300 meter hurdle time was probably the best in the state.

Ruidoso now has one more meet before the district event, as they travel to Lovington this Saturday.



EDITORIAL

It's fire time in Lincoln County.

But recent rain and snow storms have moistened the forest and the danger is gone ... right?

Wrong.

Thursday, a burning pile of slash ignited the forest near Fort Stanton Mesa and within minutes raged out of control. Dozens of firefighters from nearly every fire department in the county responded and slurry bombers were called in to help douse the blaze.

Friday, forest officials continued aerial surveillance of lightning fires on the north side of the Capitan Mountains, which apparently had been smoldering since the storms of a week earlier.

Also Friday, a fire scorched grasslands in Glencoe, but that blaze was contained within an hour or so.

So the fire danger is still real. In particular, great care should be taken before burning trash or vegetation. High winds, common this time of year, are an added threat and should be carefully considered before starting any fire.

Yes, we've had some moisture in forest lands, but the danger of fire is still with us here in Lincoln County.-DJP

Eye On The Capitol

HOT PRIMARY ELECTIONS. PART I: SMALLEY'S SUCCESSOR

Remember when the Russians launched Sputnik?

It was 1957. Also that year, Ike was sworn into office. Ike Eisenhower as president, Ike Smalley as state senator.

Ike Smalley lasted longer. Two weeks ago, the 83-year-old Deming resident announced he won't be returning to the State Legislature.

"The Bear" said his legs are weak. Maybe, it's because his shoes are big. Somebody now must try to fill them.

Here are the 2 Deming candidates for the position Ike Smalley kept for over 30 years. District 35 includes Sierra, Luna and Hidalgo counties.

Claude Edward Leyendecker lives in Deming. He is a retired banker, "among other things." He still serves as chairman of the board of United Bank at Mimbres Valley.

"Friends and associates" encouraged him to run. "There are still a lot of things that can get done."

Leyendecker served on the City Council for two terms. He was mayor pro tem for one term. In 1969, he was chairman of the Constitutional Convention. During his first gubernatorial term, Bruce King appointed Leyendecker to the State Fair Commission.

"I'm qualified, tried and proven," he says, as a businessman and politician. "I have the reputation of being a doer."

Leyendecker speaks highly of Smalley, but "my approach is altogether different."

The district has a large number of senior citizens, and they are a major interest of Leyendecker -- "being one myself." Also, having been "active in agriculture" as a farmer/rancher, he would make development of that economic sector another top priority.

Leyendecker is a past president of the New Mexico Bankers Association. Not surprisingly, he views interstate banking as a "step in the right direction...We need to put out a green light to industry."

The bordering states "all surpass us in economic growth," even though Leyendecker believes New Mexico has better transportation, weather, tax base and other factors. To compete with them successfully, "We're going to have to explore other ways."

The talk in the Capitol is that Republicans think they can win Senate District 35, and are targeting extra time and money on it. Leyendecker fervently says, "We Democrats are bound and determined to hold this seat." Nevertheless, Republicans like

him, Leyendecker says. "I'm somewhat right of center."

John Smith also is a Democratic candidate. He is a state resident.

"I just sort of grew up with it," he says of politics. At the tender age of 7, "I worked for Truman." He has helped numerous other campaigns, and was chairman of the Luna County Democratic Party.

Smith has been especially active as a recruiter of candidates: "We've got to have conscientious people running for office." His efforts paid off in 1982, when Democrats took all the Luna County offices, except County Clerk (won by the indomitable Teresa Hand).

His work in property appraisal involves Smith in all three counties in the district. In explaining his top legislative priority, he gave me the following figures: only 19% of all property in Sierra is deeded land. The rest is federal or state. In Luna, 70% is federal/state; in Sierra, 81%.

"The bottom line: We don't have a lot of ways to generate funds." Federal PILT money -- payments in lieu of taxes -- doesn't fill the gap. "It keeps being threatened. Yes' today, 'no' tomorrow." In that scenario, long range plans are impossible.

Metropolitan people "don't understand rural areas. We've got special problems." Smith cited the state Mortgage Finance Authority as an example. Its programs aren't designed for small rural areas: "We just can't compete" for Authority funds which help people buy homes at low interest rates. "Most of that money by default goes ... where the economy is thriving."

Smith boils it down this way: "Do we want to keep rural America alive?" In his view, this emphasis distinguishes him from Claude Leyendecker, who Smith thinks is "in the banking network" and "does what Albuquerque says."

Nevertheless, he emphasized, "I'm going to support whoever prevails in the Democratic primary."

Ike Smalley has indicated he will endorse a candidate in the June 7th primary. "There is one person here who has no self interests and has an honest desire to help the area," he told *The Albuquerque Journal* (March 30).

Smalley will identify the candidate soon.

Luna County political insiders tell me that individual is John Smith. Smith wouldn't confirm that speculation. However, he said of Smalley, "I've helped him with his campaigns. I hope he supports me."

Next: the Republican challengers.


We, and the parents of all children, try to instill in our children the danger of talking to strangers. We as adults need to be aware that we are the offenders when we begin conversations with children we do
