Village projects, state roadwork need teamwork

Village development and future State Highway Department projects will require close coordination.

Village manager Frank Potter said the Highway Department will be spending millions on the roads in and around Ruidoso over the next five years. Meanwhile, renovation and renewal projects, including the MainStreet project, are in the works that could impact those same roads.

Potter met recently with district engineer Lou Medrano and State Representative Ben Hall to discuss village plans, including a recent application for a half million dollars in Economic Development Administration (EDA) funds. Potter said the EDA grant, earmarked for infrastructure improvements, could provide a real boost to the area economy.

Since the state has revealed plans to spend millions in the area, Potter said he wanted state officials to know of village plans. He called on Medrano to work with the village on upcoming major projects.

The State Highway Department already has funded the \$6.1 million airport access road, and work is under way.

Requests for proposals have been sought on the multi-million-dollar four-lane project on Mechem Drive (State Highway 37), with that area scheduled for paving in 1990.

Potter said the State Highway Department five-year plan includes projects on U.S. Highway 70 from Otero County to the "Y," and on through Ruidoso Downs.

With the three-year MainStreet Project just entering its first year, Potter expects the private/public partnership group to come up with plans to improve Midtown—some that could work hand-in-hand with Highway Department plans.

Bridge's neighbor disputes village plan

A project to rebuild the first Upper Canyon bridge continues to be the subject of a dispute between citizens and village staff.

After months of delays, work is set to begin soon on the bridge redesign, but Bill Rawlins, nearest neighbor to the river crossing, says village staff has reneged on an agreement over the bridge design. Village engineer Mike Davalos said, during the Ruidoso Village Council meeting Tuesday, the construction plans meet design criteria Rawlins agreed upon in meetings last fall.

Rawlins claims the engineer, village manager Frank Potter and village attorney misrepresented their plans when he traded land so the bridge could be redesigned. He said the men agreed the driving surface would be increased on the southwest corner.

But Davalos told the council the agreement was to move the guard rail by two feet, not add two feet of concrete on the southwest corner. Plans call for increasing the driving surface on the southeast corner, extending across to the northeast.

A pedestrian bridge is to be added on the west side.

Rawlins said the railing is already outside the driving surface, making it impossible to move it without adding concrete. On Thursday, he flagged the fence and showed at least two members of the council why he believes the plan Davalos described won't work.

A letter, written to Rawlins and his wife on November 12, 1987, is signed by Potter, Davalos and assistant village attorney Mike Runnels. It says:

"Upon review of the preliminary working drawings, we agree that the railing, at the southwest corner

of the first bridge, should be relocated a minimum of two feet from the entrance of the bridge, at that location.

"This design change will be incorporated in the final work plans and in the final construction of the project."

Rawlins claims the final construction plans don't incorporate the changes he was led to believe would be included.

Davalos was out of town Friday, and couldn't be reached for comment.

The contract bid was awarded Tuesday, after Upper Canyon business owners urged councillors to get on with the project, or postpone it until next fall. Councillors asked the village attorney to negotiate with the contractor on completing the bridge construction before the area's busiest season begins.

It was learned the State Highway Department funds authorized last year for the bridge redesign could be in jeopardy if the village doesn't award a contract and get the job done. Bids were solicited and rejected in March, with just one bidder offering a proposal in this second set.

Over a year ago, the Upper Canyon bridges were discussed as part of a half-million-dollar project that included three other village bridge crossings. Disputes then over the bridge design led the council to go on with the rest of the project, leaving the Upper Canyon structures out.

How, how much and where the bridge will be widened and changed continues to be an issue of disagreement.

The successful bidder is expected to begin work soon, using working plans approved by the village engineer.



No-shows pose problems for those on village committees

Being chairman of the village Parks and Recreation Board is one of the loneliest jobs in town.

Chairman James Stephens waited a half hour Thursday for members of his five-person committee to show up for the monthly meeting scheduled at 11:30 a.m. at village hall. Thursday's meeting was the first called since Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. reappointed Stephens, Walterine Hughes, Charlotte Jarratt, Lynn Willard and Betty O'Dell to the advisory board.

Senior Citizens Center director Bette Romans and Parks and Recreation Department head Daryl Obermueller, both ex officio board members, waited with Stephens for the meeting that didn't happen.

Stephens, who has been on hand for other board meetings that were cancelled for lack of a quorum, wondered aloud about the purpose of the advisory board. With no stated authority or responsibility, Stephens questioned why the village board exists.

The cancelled meeting came on the heels of comments made during Tuesday's Village Council meeting by Councillor Al Junge. Recalling a meeting of the Lodgers' Tax Advisory Board cancelled last week for lack of a quorum, Junge pointed out a recurring problem of absenteeism with village boards and committees.

The Lodgers' Tax Advisory Board, plagued for months by an inability to attain a quorum for its monthly meetings, was unable to meet when just two of five members, Rick Roessler and Bobby Parsons, showed up for the organizational meeting.

Junge said attendance requirements should be established, with new members appointed to replace people unable to attend regular meetings.

Three new members, Roessler, Parsons and Ann Evans were appointed to the lodgers' tax group on March 29. Mike Warren and Hank Evaro are continuing as members. One of the new members told Junge he cancelled a trip to be in town for the regular meeting.

The Lodgers' Tax Advisory Board is scheduled to meet the third Wednesday of each month.

While the Parks and Recreation Board was established by village ordinance, the Lodgers' Tax Advisory Board is mandated by state statutes. The village has other advisory groups, some that meet on a regular basis, and others that meet to accomplish a stated purpose.

The Planning and Zoning Commission meets at 2 p.m. the first and third Mondays. That nine-member group also has a history of problems as members resign, leaving the group with too few members to attain a quorum. Formerly a seven-member commission, P&Z was increased in size to alleviate the problem.

The Cemetery Board and the Personnel Board meet as needed, and the Library Board meets once a month, according to village clerk Tammie Maddox.

The Economic Development Board hasn't established a regular meeting time. Past meetings, before James was appointed chairman, apparently took place unannounced. While meeting times weren't posted or published, the board meetings were referred to in council meetings by then chairman Jerry Shaw.

Firemen battle mobile home fire

Ruidoso firefighters spent three hours Saturday at a mobile home fire on College Drive.

Kortney Hall, Fire Department spokesperson, said four Ruidoso units and one Forest Service unit were dispatched to the scene about 10 a.m. She said more than 20 firefighters fought the blaze.

The interior of the unoccupied structure was completely gutted. The name of the property owner and an estimate of damage weren't available early today (Monday).

Downs trustees take next step on street paving

Ruidoso Downs Trustees learned during their meeting April 25 that about half of the municipal bonds being issued to finance street paving in the village have been "pre-sold," and the \$430,000 expected in proceeds from the bonds will be available in 35-40 days.

Albuquerque underwriter John Archuleta reported to the trustees that banks in this area, too, have been given the opportunity to purchase the bonds.

The money generated by sale of the bonds will be used for street paving in the village, although no announcement has been made yet of which streets will be paved.

In other business, the trustees:
—Approved Resolution 88-4, pledging a portion of the municipal gross receipts taxes to repayment of the street paving bonds.

—Approved Resolution 88-3, adopting the new municipal code book.

—Approved a request from Grant Vaughan of Newman Outdoor Advertising to increase the amount of signage on a billboard beside Highway 70, contingent upon the company first applying for a sign permit.

—Tabled a request for a street light on upper A Street until trustees can inspect the site at night.

—Heard Mayor J.C. "Jake" Harris read a letter of commendation from State Police Officer Steve Standridge praising the efforts of fire department members Jeff Fuller and Humberto Maldonado during a recent emergency. Also, it was learned each fire department member will receive a reprint of a Michael Hurd painting in thanks for the department's response to a fire near Hurd's San Patricio property.

—Approved the lowest bid, about \$2,100, for replacement in the jail of a sink and commode with a stainless steel single unit.

—Conducted an executive session to discuss personnel.

Plane damaged in high winds landing

High winds, with gusts clocked at 60 knots, contributed to an incident, in which a small plane was damaged, at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA) late Sunday afternoon.

Tim Morris, head of the Transportation and Aviation Division, said Travis Hicks of Ruidoso Downs was landing his single-engine Bonanza at the regional airfield

when gusting winds interrupted the aircraft's progress. The plane left the runway when the wind side-loaded the landing gear and collapsed the nose gear.

Hicks was alone in the plane and wasn't injured.

Morris said the Federal Aviation Administration classifies the mishap as an "incident."

High, gusting winds had airport

personnel on the alert all day Sunday. Morris said gusts were clocked at 60 knots about the time Hicks attempted to land.

Morris closed the airport about 4 p.m., and the facility remained closed until this morning (Monday). He said his general policy is to close the airfield when winds reach 60 to 70 knots.

Wheatley a candidate for county assessor

Joe Wheatley, Republican candidate for the office of Lincoln County assessor, thinks it is time for a change of leadership.

He advocates encouraging the assessor's staff to contribute ideas toward improvement of service and to get additional training provided for by the state.

"I want to, in some way, reward dedicated employees and even do little things that mean a lot, such as observing employees' birthdays and anniversaries. High employee morale translates into much better service to taxpayers and better productivity," Wheatley says.

The opening of a branch, or sub-office in the Ruidoso area is long overdue, Wheatley feels. The residents of the Hondo Valley, Ruidoso Downs, Ruidoso and Alto are now being forced to travel long distances and to make long-distance phone calls to reach the assessor's office, he says.

"Isn't it way past time that we make it more convenient for at

least 75 percent of the taxpayers of Lincoln County?" Wheatley asks.

Wheatley states that the proposal for a sub-office in Ruidoso has received enthusiastic support from the two county commissioners for the Ruidoso-Hondo area.

Up-to-date property appraisals, throughout Lincoln County, would ensure more equitable taxes for all and would substantially enhance the stature and service of the assessor's office, Wheatley states.

Since no Democrat is running for the assessor's office, Wheatley encourages all Republican voters to provide him the opportunity to make some needed improvements.

"If elected, you can expect me to visit your farm or ranch, place of business, and residence. I will not be sitting in the office all the time," Wheatley says.

Wheatley has worked in the assessor's office for almost four years. Prior to that he worked four years as a new accounts supervisor, real estate appraiser and loan officer in Los Angeles, California, and three years as a real estate appraiser in Las Vegas, Nevada.

In addition to his appraisal experience, Wheatley taught and coached in the Ysleta School District for 15 years.

Raised in West Texas, Wheatley spent many summers in his youth working in Ruidoso, so is familiar with the area.

In summary, Wheatley says, "Unlike one of the other candidates who works in another county office, I know what needs to be done for my own office. And as for the other candidate, like I said at the beginning, it is time for a change of leadership in the assessor's office."

Page seeks re-election as county probate judge

John Watt "Jack" Page has filed for re-election as Probate Judge of Lincoln County, in the Republican primary. He feels well qualified for the position due to experience, extensive study, and attendance at all judicial education courses offered in compliance with New Mexico law.

Prior to 1987, there were no requirements for a probate judge to have any judicial education; nor were any schools available to prepare a candidate to hold that position. However, upon being elected to his first term, Page said he did extensive lobbying to correct that situation. The State Supreme Court has since made it a requirement that any one elected as probate judge must attend a school prior to taking office and must complete additional training each year thereafter.

Page, a graduate of Texas A & M University, with a B.S. and masters degree, served over six years in the Armed Forces during WWII including three years in North Africa and Italy and subsequently retired as a major.

Page and his wife, Noema, moved to the home they built in Rancho Ruidoso Subdivision in 1981, following their retirement from the Ysleta Independent School District in El Paso, Texas. He has

served as a teacher and administrator for 32 years, retiring as an associate superintendent.

The Lincoln County Board of Commissioners recently appointed Page to the New Mexico Association of Counties Board of Directors. He is vice-president of the Ruidoso Shrine Club, and has served as vice-chairman of the Lincoln County Republican Party and on the County and State Central Committees.





doubles match.



News from the Convention & Visitors Bureau with Tracey Moran

As I mentioned in my last column, this article will highlight the development of specific creative ideas and strategies used to promote Ruidoso.

Above all, a strong creative platform is essential to the success of any advertising campaign. Regardless of whether the advertiser is a small company, a larger corporation, or an entire community, it must have an advantage over its competitors.

Ruidoso's advantage, or unique selling proposition, is that it is truly the "Year Round Playground of the Southwest." That single phrase distinguishes every season for everyone. Additionally, the phrase clearly identifies our geographic target, the Southwest.

Sometimes advertising campaigns must dare to be different in order to project a product to the forefront. The creative team responsible for developing Ruidoso's new advertising campaign discussed possible concepts and ideas using the theme, "Year Round Playground of the Southwest." Concepts were given to two focus groups of 10. These individuals were between the ages of 24

and 50 years old, and they corresponded with the target market profile that research suggested would be most beneficial to reach.

"On The Run To Ruidoso" ranked the highest in concept choices. "It offers excitement and flexibility of meaning...to the skier, it says ski runs; to the race enthusiast, fast tracks; to the vacationer, a run to Ruidoso is an escape to the mountains." Not only is the phrase immediately catchy, but it had a higher recall value when the focus groups were recontacted several days later to see if they could remember their theme selection.

Ruidoso has many attractions to offer visitors. Therefore, it is not surprising that the individuals who participated in the research focus groups perceived Ruidoso to be a community with more than one image. Additional brainstorming by the creative team produced the idea of combining more than one image into some portions of the overall campaign.

This approach was taken in order to give it a new creative flair. Therefore a double meaning headline was given to each ad. For ex-

ample, a photo of a downhill ski run could be accompanied by the headline "Race Track" as long as a smaller horse racing photo was also used. In reverse, a large photo of horses breaking from the gates was given the "Ski Run" headline, and was combined with a smaller and more descriptive photo of downhill skiing. The effect of these ads, used in peak season, provides visual stimulation and causes the reader to "doubletake." Additionally, large and distinct photos were used due to their ability to create a more favorable quality image.

Upon completing the creative elements within the Ruidoso campaign, the next step was to implement the concept in various types of media during the next two-year period. Some of the recommended media types include the following; consumer magazine ads, a consumer poster, special promotion and advertorial ads, bumper stickers, brochures, a newsletter/calendar format, outdoor billboards, and radio spots.

Media strategies and specific media placement will be the topic of next month's Convention and Visitors Bureau article.



Eye On The Capitol

HOT PRIMARY ELECTIONS: TO STEAL FROM STEELE

Question: Where's the hottest state senate election?

Answer: Dona Ana County.

The incumbent is a Republican, Ellen Steele. In 1984, she defeated a Democrat, Olivia Nevarez Rothschild, by 38 votes.

1988 is a watershed year for the senate. The party that wins in November will control the upcoming senate reappointment.

Steele's opponent will be the winner of the June 7 Democratic primary. Here are the 2 candidates.

Lionel Cajen Fietze is a resident of Las Cruces. He is a retired federal government employee from White Sands. Fietze graduated from New Mexico State University, with a B.S. degree in management and engineering.

Several years ago, he ran for the City Council. "I got sick, and really couldn't campaign." Prior to that attempt, he gave money to various state candidates, but was "not actively involved in politics. I felt I was under the Hatch Act."

The upshot: This year's senate race is his first time out in partisan politics.

What makes Fietze run? "I kept hearing how inefficient [Steele] was."

Steele told me the senate Republican leadership put her on the Senate Education Committee because she "could be counted on to make the tough vote." Fietze stands that statement on its head: "Educators are aiming for Steele," he told me. "She was against their pay raise."

Fietze's position on teachers' pay: "They should hinge it to the federal COLA [Cost of Living Adjustment] for social security, and get it out of politics."

Another major goal is to remove the gross receipts tax from sales at retail grocery stores. "Poor people don't make enough money" to file state income taxes; hence, they never got the rebates killed by the 1988 Legislature.

Of his primary race, Fietze says: "It's going to be low key. I can't see blowing a wad of money."

I told him I thought the Republicans were going to put a top priority on assisting Steele, financially and otherwise. "This is what I've heard," he said. "How effective it is, we don't know." He attributes the Steele win to the 1984 Reagan landslide: "You could see the trend." If he wins the primary, Fietze plans to wage "a guerrilla-type war."

Fietze raises alfalfa and chile. What kind of chile?

"Mild. That's what the cannery wanted, so that's what we're growing."

Mary Jane Garcia is Fietze's

Democratic primary opponent. A resident of the village of Dona Ana, she and her 5 sisters own Victoria's Night Club. "It's like the Bull Ring," she says, a Santa Fe restaurant/bar near the Capitol.

Unlike Fietze, Garcia has been very actively involved in Democratic campaigns since 1975. Apodaca, King, Anaya, Bingaman: she worked for all of them, including running many of their campaigns in Dona Ana County.

Garcia has a masters in anthropology from NMSU. Not surprisingly, historic preservation is a major item on her agenda. She wants to put Dona Ana Village in the National Register as a Historic District, so it can't be annexed. "The fear of the people is...the city could tear down the adobes and put up [shopping] malls."

The problem of population growth, however, isn't limited to the village. "Farmland is being lost to subdivisions." Garcia is particularly worried about high density cesspools. "We could end up with contaminated water." A specific solution: "Mobile homes belong in nice trailer parks."

Education is another major priority. "In order to have competent educators, we need to pay them adequately. In my area, they're working for peanuts."

If she is Steele's opponent, Garcia's campaign will be highly visible. "What Ellen [Steele] may not know is I have a lot of Republican friends...My dad's family was all Republican." In the works: a Republican for Mary Jane Garcia Committee.

Garcia thinks Steele won on the gun control issue. "She hit Olivia with it the last week." Unlike Rothschild, Garcia is against gun control. Garcia was in Vietnam from 1966-72.

"I would call myself 'moderate,'" she concluded. "Neither extreme is good."

Given her narrow win in 1984, Senator Steele has good reason to think the Democrats have targeted her district for special attention. "I'm going to run like I was 10 points behind and not an incumbent," she told me. "Opposition is good for the soul."

But are the Democrats really pouring on the support? Neither Fietze nor Garcia indicated that was the case so far. "I wish somebody would call me regarding Democratic Party targeting," Garcia told me. I asked her about communications from either Sam Pick or Ray Powell, the past and present State Democratic Party Chairman: "I haven't heard from anybody like that."

Understandably, political party organizations usually stay neutral in primaries, then back their

nominees' campaigns in the general elections. That may explain the State Democratic Party's behavior in the Fietze/Garcia race.

Then again, the State Democratic party may be asleep at the switch. Along with neutrality in the primaries, that, too, is a customary posture for that organi-

zation to assume.

One thing is certain: the Republicans won't be caught napping -- not in this senate race. "The money thing is what did us in last time," Garcia noted.

All sources agree that Steele's political mailings were particularly effective.




