Village is told to end dam-caused pollution

State environmentalists have given the Village of Ruidoso until May 15 to put a stop to water quality violations caused by operations at Grindstone Canyon Dam.

"All of Grindstone Creek below the dam is dead," said Environmental Improvement Division (EID) staff member Larry Smolka in a telephone interview Thursday. He said the EID considers the situation an emergency.

Smolka said EID staff visited Ruidoso on April 25-26, and took samples and observed conditions in Grindstone and Carrizo creeks and the Rio Ruidoso. While laboratory chemical tests aren't yet complete, Smolka said the levels of acidity were nearly double accepted levels, and the team observed a coating on the bottom of the streams. That coating is disrupting the food chain, said Smolka.

Smolka said the one-mile Grindstone Creek nearest the water being released from the dam is dead, with a part of Carrizo Creek, about a mile to a mile and a half long that connects Grindstone to the Rio Ruidoso, "severely impacted." The difference in Carrizo Creek water below the dam and the

water where it is diverted into the dam is like night and day, said Smolka.

"The hardest call is where it enters the Rio Ruidoso," said Smolka, declaring the Ruidoso River slightly impacted.

"It's certainly related to the concrete in the dam," said Smolka, who couldn't speculate as to the exact composition of the material(s) covering the streambed and changing the nature of the waters. Even though chemical test results aren't yet in, the damage is evident. Quoting from Bob Dylan, Smolka said, "You don't need a weatherman to tell you which way the wind is blowing."

The EID has asked the New Mexico Fish and Game Department to evaluate the streams, but a spokesperson for that department couldn't be reached for comment.

Local EID staffer Jim Edwards said he took another sample Wednesday, noting his department wants a specific identification on the white stuff in the water. Edwards, too, is concerned over the life of the stream system.

"You can't see down into the water and see what's down there," he said.

In a letter to Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr., dated April 29, EID

revealed results of the site visit and set the May 15 deadline for village action.

"The survey team found serious violations of the numeric standards for pH and turbidity and impairment of the uses of domestic water supply and high quality coldwater fishery in Grindstone Canyon Creek, Carrizo Creek and the Rio Ruidoso," reads the letter in part.

The letter, signed by EID Director Michael J. Burkhart, goes on to notify the village that EID determined water releases from Grindstone Canyon Dam are causing the documented violations of water quality standards and impairment of designated uses. The village was told to initiate corrective measures as soon as possible, but no later than May 15.

The village also was told to develop a plan to mitigate the environmental damage already caused in the streams.

Village manager Frank Potter said he responded with a letter asking EID staff to visit Ruidoso and advise the village of possible solutions to the problems.

Meanwhile, fill operations are continuing at the dam, according to Potter.

UNM students see a redesigned Midtown

Ruidoso Village Council chambers had a whole new look Saturday as University of New Mexico (UNM) architecture and planning students took over to paper the walls and fill the room with maps, pictures and models of how Mid-

town Ruidoso could be transformed.

Ruidoso High DECA takes honors at nationals

The Ruidoso High School Chapter of the Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA) won top honors again at the National Career and Development Conference in Salt Lake City, Utah, last month.

Senior Amanda Samuels won sixth place in competition in the Pepsi Learn and Earn program for a manual which covered every marketing aspect of an "Espirit Fashion Show and Sale." Junior Chris Crowley also placed sixth for competition in the general marketing division. Amie DeAngelo represented the Ruidoso DECA for the Pepsi campaign. Junior Billie Strohmeyer also attended the conference, as a candidate for national president.

Dr. Ed Parker, Ruidoso DECA director, said he "felt good about the entire competition." The Ruidoso chapter traveled to the conference in a bus driven by Ronny Wright. The use and fuel of the bus was donated by Ruidoso Schools. Sponsors were Doyle Howell and Nadine Gartman.

"It was one of the neatest groups we've taken," commented Parker.

The Ruidoso students competed with 8,000 student delegates from all 50 states and delegates from the District of Columbia, Canada, Guam, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Samuels' manual won the Ruidoso DECA about \$750 worth of stock in PepsiCo and funds to help pay for transportation for the

group's trip to the conference. The dividends from stocks won in past years have paid for computers in the marketing classroom at Ruidoso High School.

Crowley was the only DECA student from Ruidoso and one of two students from New Mexico to receive a certificate of excellence in his field of general marketing, master employee level. He received the certificate for his high scores on a written test and two personal interviews.

Strohmeyer was not successful

in her bid for national president, but was complimented because the candidates were traditionally seniors in high school. Parker said Strohmeyer conducted an extensive campaign at the conference in addition to the test and interview competition in her field of entrepreneurship. She was the only junior in the national campaign but managed to reach the finals for president. She currently is the New Mexico DECA president.

DeAngelo competed in the Pepsi Learn and Earn project in Finance

and Credit division. She placed first in New Mexico competition, but did not win nationally.

Parker said he was pleased the school was represented in the national top 10 winning positions this year, as Ruidoso had no representation in the last two years.

The Ruidoso chapter plans to meet with interested students at Capitan High School to help establish a new chapter.

Professor Steve Borbas stressed that student projects are just preliminary ideas to be considered, along with other ideas, by village and MainStreet planners. He said the student projects are master plans—not working drawings.

Borbas and the group were in Ruidoso Saturday for their third and final visit during the course, and he described how the final projects came to be. Students set out to find an image for Ruidoso, said Borbas. They studied existing conditions, identified key issues and opportunities and then divided into small groups to study transportation, land use, streetscape, promotion, gateways and plaza space.

Borbas said the exciting,

realistic project created a great deal of energy, enthusiasm and work.

Students said Midtown Ruidoso has a character and flavor all its own, sort of "wild west," dominated by the river and beautiful natural beauty. They presented plans to capitalize on those features, and enhance them with defined entryways, safe pedestrian access, a central plaza area and better connection with the river.

Bart Bowen, in describing his ideas for a plaza at Sudderth and Eagle Drive, said he believes such a plaza would become a central meeting place, become a memorable element and "bring a heart to Midtown."

Todd Pilgreen described the importance of designing some form of "gateway" at each end of Midtown,

to act as an "anchor" for the central business district. He talked of incorporating some of the mixed cultures of the users into a final design.

"So, you know when you're in the Midtown area," explained Pilgreen. Last up during the formal presentation was a description by Borbas as to how developing the students' proposals could be phased. Since the projects were so preliminary, Borbas said they had no idea as to the time or money required to implement their ideas.

He said if the village develops such a plan for Midtown, the plaza will be the most expensive, but will ultimately be the most important in fixing Ruidoso in everyone's memory.

Petition urges legalized gambling

Some area residents are calling on lawmakers to legalize gambling in New Mexico, Lincoln County and in the Village of Ruidoso.

Businessman Bud Vuicich already has more than 1,000 signatures on a petition he'll take to Governor Garrey Carruthers urging the legalization of gambling to aid the state's ailing economy.

Vuicich said with the economy going down, people moving out of town and banks foreclosing on property, it's time for the government to turn to gambling to boost the state's economy.

"We already have gambling," said Vuicich, calling on legislators to use video machines as a logical source of state revenues. He said video machines in use now don't produce any returns to the state, but if they are state-operated then the benefits would extend from the state budget down to individual

businesses and citizens.

"The economy would turn around," predicted Vuicich, noting the gaming machines would have to comply with state and federal laws.

"There are no boundaries for a disaster—we have to stop this one before it goes any further," said Vuicich, stressing the urgency of turning the local economy around. With a stronger economy, everybody's salaries, including teachers, could be increased, said Vuicich, adding the school system would have funds for school trips and other extras.

"Even the churches would have more donations," remarked Vuicich.

And in answer to those who equate gambling with the "mafia," Vuicich replies there is no problem with organized crime in areas of regulated gambling. In fact, Vuicich said there is no mafia.

"The mafia is the taxation department of the federal government—if you don't believe it, just get behind on your taxes," said

Vuicich. He also disagrees with detractors who claim gambling is a danger and temptation to poor families.

"Poor people don't gamble," said Vuicich, stressing the importance of gambling to draw tourists into town.

The lottery has brought Colorado around, said Vuicich, adding he's still doing research on the effects in other areas. But even as he looks into other areas where gambling has apparently helped, Vuicich is calling on others who agree with him to sign the petition he's placed in various businesses in town.

Vuicich owns and operates Big A Auto Parts, and a copy of the petition is available in his place of business, as well as in other places around town.

"If this can get started the whole state can go," said Vuicich enthusiastically.

Demos select delegates

Lincoln County Democrats met Thursday to select delegates to the state convention scheduled June 11 in Albuquerque.

County Chairman Mike Runnels, who will chair the state convention, announced he and county vice chairperson CeCe Griffin are automatic delegates, and the county convention delegates then elected 14 more delegates and 14 alternates—half men and half women, in accordance with party rules.

Runnels said delegates will have the chance to declare their choice for president at the convention, noting if anyone from Lincoln County wants to attend the national convention that election will depend on their presidential choice. Supporters of front-runners Michael Dukakis and Jesse Jackson have the best chance of being elected national delegates, said Runnels.

Super delegates to the state convention will include Senator Jeff Bingaman, who has announced he

supports Massachusetts Governor Michael Dukakis as the Democratic nominee for president.

Discussions over upcoming primary races prompted former county chairman Gary Mitchell to warn of a candidate on the Democratic ticket who didn't know whether he was a Democrat or a Republican until he filed his declaration in the county clerk's office.

Jerry Shaw announced she'll run as a write-in candidate for county commission in a race where the Republican nominee would otherwise be unopposed.

Precinct 14 Democrats announced they're hosting a "Come Home, Democrats" party on May 16 at Cree Meadows Country Club. Representative Ray Sanchez, speaker of the New Mexico House of Representatives, will be the guest speaker, and candidates in the Democratic primary will have a chance to speak.

All county Democrats are invited, said Shaw.

Former Ruidosoan charged in Washington murder

A former Ruidoso resident is facing murder charges in Spokane, Washington.

Gregory Allen Rowley, 26, is jailed without bond in Spokane, charged in the February 24, 1987, slaying of 32-year-old David L. Ritchey, a carrier for the Spokesman Review, a Spokane newspaper, according to Spokane Police.

Detective Jim Lundgren, of the major crimes division of the Spokane Police, said Rowley apparently lived in Ruidoso from 1983 until 1986, when he moved to

Washington.

Lundgren confirmed reports that Ritchey's partially nude and bloodied body was found in a high school parking lot. He apparently was bludgeoned and sodomized with a blunt instrument.

Lundgren said Ritchey's murder remained a mystery until April 28. Rowley was arrested and charged on April 29, said Lundgren.

Spokane Police, testing a brand-new automated fingerprinting identification system, scanned unidentified latent prints recovered

from scenes of unsolved crimes. That piece of equipment puts out a list of possible suspects for further checks by a fingerprint specialist.

Lundgren said they got a hit on the Ritchey case, and the specialist confirmed a match on Rowley's prints before the suspect was picked up at his Spokane home. A print recovered at the scene of the Ritchey murder reportedly matched Rowley's fingerprints.

Rowley was fingerprinted when he was arrested in April, charged with third degree malicious mis-

chief on a complaint filed by his former wife, Jeannette Keohane. Bill Morlin, a reporter for the Spokesman Review, said Rowley reportedly smashed his fist into the windshield of Keohane's car.

According to Ruidoso Police, the suspect doesn't have an arrest record here in the village. Lundgren said the suspect had a traffic violation in Georgia.

Rowley is being held without bond, but a preliminary hearing hasn't been scheduled, said Lundgren.

Baudino gets nine years in beating death

A man convicted of beating another man to death last October on the Storm Ranch near Glencoe has been sentenced to nine years in jail.

While the defendant's attorney was pleased with the court decision, the victim's family was disappointed to learn defendant John Richard Baudino may be free in about three years.

"It was a fair deal," said defense attorney Gary Mitchell.

"It just doesn't seem like justice," said the victim's mother, Rosalie Colson, in a telephone interview last week. "I just don't want him out in three and a half

years to do this to somebody else's son," said Colson.

Baudino, 26, entered a guilty plea to a second degree murder charge, possession of marijuana with intent to distribute (a fourth degree felony), and admitted to being an habitual offender, according to Assistant District Attorney (ADA) Scot Key.

The court sentenced Baudino to nine years on the murder charge, 18 months on the drug offense and a year for being an habitual offender, with the jail time to run concurrently on all three counts, said Key. The court, after hearing evidence and arguments of counsel, found mitigating circumstances and suspended three years of

Baudino's sentence with a two-year mandatory parole.

Baudino also faces legal problems in Missouri, and District Judge Richard A. Parsons ruled any incarceration imposed through his court is to run concurrently with possible Missouri jail time.

The court further asked the Department of Corrections to address Baudino's drug problem, leaving the location where the defendant serves his time to the discretion of the corrections departments of New Mexico and Missouri.

Baudino, who pled guilty in the October 13 beating death of 30-year-old Brent Colson, was originally charged with first degree murder, and could have faced the

death penalty. Harry Wilcox Jr., serving as assistant district attorney at the time, said last November he would ask for the death penalty in the case.

But Baudino's attorney, Mitchell, disagreed with Wilcox, noting with no aggravating circumstances the case was not a death penalty case. "My client claims self defense and he's totally innocent," said Mitchell in a story published November 5, 1987, in The News.

Before Baudino entered his plea, Wilcox was no longer working for the 12th Judicial District, with ADA Key the third man to fill that position during this particular case.

Mitchell said the final decree came after a joint plea bargain.

EID warns of lead in Mexican pottery

The New Mexico Health and Environment Department (EID) has found high concentrations of lead in certain pieces of pottery imported from Mexico.

Jim Edwards of the Ruidoso EID office said anyone who has used imported Mexican crockery for food or drink is urged to bring the crockery to his office located on the lower level of the Ruidoso Financial Center. He said EID staff will identify pots believed to match the pottery with dangerous lead levels.

EID is working closely with the Health Services Division to see that New Mexicans who may have been exposed to high levels of lead are offered free blood lead tests.

Symptoms of lead poisoning can include gastrointestinal and neurological disturbances, mental retardation and death.

The lead-contaminated pottery came from stock at the Coyote Pottery Company in Rancho de Taos, Casa Madrid in Hobbs, Casa Adelito in Las Cruces and Covarrubias Imports in Alamogordo. HED cautions consumers that it may have been sold by other distributors

in the state as well.

According to Garth Graves of the EID, 10 types of Mexican crockery sold at those four shops showed test levels of lead content in excess of the two-to-seven parts per million (ppm) test levels allowed by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. Tests performed at HED's Scientific Laboratory Division showed that some pieces contained test levels of lead as high as 6,000 ppm, the highest concentrations ever found in pottery imported from Mexico, according to FDA officials.

According to an EID news release, the FDA is urging persons possessing any Mexican pottery to destroy it, mark it indelibly for non-food/drink purposes only, or drill a hole in the bottom of each piece so that it cannot be used for food or drink. Eating food cooked or stored in lead-contaminated pottery has resulted in lead poisoning in other states and countries.

Edwards said pottery makers have been notified, and asked to render the suspect crockery unusable for food or drink.



In doubles competition, Candace Makowski and Cassie McIntosh missed state competition by only two points, falling 5-7, 7-6, 7-6.


Dusty Skellett and Eric Collins won their first match 6-0, 6-1, but were edged in the semi-finals 6-2, 7-6, 6-1.

Number two girls singles player Mikki Roller won in the first round 6-0, 6-4, but fell to Goddard's


Shannon Murphy in semi-final play.





Distance runner Ira Sago won first in the 3200 meter run and second in the 1600. Daniel Martinez placed fourth in the 3200.



Eye On The Capitol

HOT PRIMARIES: DEAN MARTIN, FORTUNE COOKIES AND CRIMESTOPPERS

Is the State Senate "Going Back to Houston?"

Politicians across New Mexico are asking that question.

Not Houston, Texas, but Les Houston, State Senator from Albuquerque.

Houston heads the senate Republicans who control the senate. Let's see, that means...

But Houston has opposition in the Republican Primary. (No Democrats are running).

"I did it the hard way; the right way."

"I started out as a private with a 9th grade education," Richard Broder told me. "I retired as a major with a master's degree."

He has been a New Mexico resident for 15 years.

Broder was in the army infantry, and served two years in Vietnam. His M.A. is in Management and Human Relations. He probably needs both, as the owner of two "Fortune Cookie" restaurants.

What's wrong with Les Houston? "He's a special interest-type guy with the horsemen." Broder also objects to "people who change parties in the middle of a term." (Houston was elected as a Democrat in 1984, then changed to a Republican).

Broder says of his campaign, "I'm going to try to do it with people and not with money...I'm fifty years old and I still have some faith."

"I have no big organizations behind me." Door-to-door work plus dedicated supporters will make up the difference. "Thank God, I've got some good friends."

Part of Broder's "message":

*Public education is "the Number 1 priority." Money from a state lottery not connected with racetracks would help fund it.

*"The free enterprise system at its best is what I'd like to promote."

"I'm very individualistic, I guess."

Les Houston is also an attorney. "Clients are our specialty."

Why did he switch to Republican?

Houston concluded the Democratic Party structure "had been captured by the extreme groups...I was not welcome." He notes of his 1982 campaign for governor, "Less than 2% of Democrats participated [in their ward meetings]. Anaya got 60% of the votes at the convention."

There were also philosophical problems. "I had been a Democrat all my life" -- but a conservative one. Programs to help people must give them "the ability to reciprocate," he believes. Otherwise, their "feeling of self-worth is destroyed...I care enough to say 'no'."

I reminded him of a 1979 bill he sponsored: when homes with old, low mortgage rates are sold, financial institutions must pass on the old rates to new buyers. "I'm prouder of that bill than anything," Houston said.

Some Houston priorities: *SB106 "is probably the best public school reform in the U.S." He wants to provide after-school and weekend programs "for kids who need the help."

*a literacy program for adults.

*a workmans comp fund. "We want to look at it some more." Houston doesn't rule out a state government fund.

*"What I consider myself: a progressive conservative."

James D. McDaniel is a community counselor for the City of Albuquerque's Neighborhood Crime Prevention Unit. Before that, he was a field investigator for the Albuquerque Police Department. Also, he has had his "hands in and out" of small business since 1972.

McDaniel took college classes at the University of Albuquerque.

In 1984, he ran for the Republican nomination for State Corporation Commissioner, but lost to Wray Simmons. The next year, McDaniel campaigned unsuccessfully for the Albuquerque School Board. "I'm a glutton for punishment," he jokes.

Why run now? "It's very upsetting...Nothing seems to get accomplished in Santa Fe...We're just putting bandaids on things."

Some concerns:

*We need to "seriously look at" a state lottery to help fund education. Higher teachers' pay "would be one of my priorities."

*"A lot of money is being wasted."

*Community participation cuts crime. "We have really nothing going on locally, except Crimestoppers."

Would Senator McDaniel support the Republican leadership? "I'd be representing both Republicans and Democrats in my district," McDaniel says. Usually, he would vote with the Republicans -- but "I wouldn't vote that way on everything; I'd basically be looking at the bill."

Why didn't the Democrats bother to field a candidate?

District 19 is the second most Republican senate district in the state. It has 6,730 registered Republicans to only 5,255 Democrats. That's a Democrat-to-Republican ratio on only .78, versus the statewide ratio of 1.71.

(Senator Victor Marshall's district, also in Albuquerque, is the most Republican. Its ratio is .59).

Actually, Houston thinks the Democrats did indeed field a candi-

date. His name is Richard Broder.

Houston told me that Governor Toney Anaya appointed Broder to the state Mortgage Finance Authority. He also said that in 1987, Broder appeared in an anti-Right-To-Work TV ad in which Representative Ray Sanchez, House Speaker and prominent Democrat, also appeared. Houston further states that Broder was a registered Independent (decline-to-state) until June 6, 1987. At that time, and at the Democrats' urging, Broder changed to Republican.

It's a battle for control of the

senate," Houston told me. And he thinks the Democrats believe their "surrogate candidate" will win: "We're going to beat Les Houston!" he overheard a prominent Democratic senator jubilantly exclaim.

James McDaniel's wife, Jannie, was the Republican nominee for Secretary of State in 1986. She lost to Democrat Rebecca Vigil by 5,000 votes.

But Jannie McDaniel is back. This year, she is the Republican nominee for the State Corporation Commission.

If speeding is a problem, do we close the highways?

And what if the policeman, whose responsibility it is to patrol the highway, has a flat tire? Then should we close the highway, since he cannot adequately respond to lawbreakers?

Of course not.

But the governor and the state Racing Commission have considered closing racetracks around New Mexico, because drugging horses is a problem; and they may continue suspending the payment of purses, because the method of enforcement has experienced a "flat tire." The "flat tire" is a dispute, in which some argue that drug testing cannot be done out-of-state, while others say it can.

In the meantime, a statewide industry, employing thousands of people (most of whom are quite removed from the actual business of drugging or not drugging a racehorse), is threatened.

Yes, some horses are illegally drugged, and the state should continue in its efforts to curb the abuse. But we believe a blanket approach of enforcement to a specific problem will smother what is overwhelmingly a legitimate industry.-DJP






