## Airport commission audit attempt called 'witch hunt'

Former airport commission administrator Fred Heckman has accused auditor Don Wingfield of being on a "witch hunt," as the two disagreed over how an audit of commission records should be accomplished.

The Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC) has contracted with Wingfield to do an audit, and the two men met Friday for Heckman to supply the records and answer questions.

Wingfield, who wants complete access to six boxes of records that were in Heckman's office until Friday, walked out after Heckman insisted the audit be accomplished by Wingfield asking questions and Heckman supplying documents and/or answers.

Those six boxes have been discussed in several meetings of the current SBAC, with members saying they want Heckman to turn the records over to the commission. But Heckman, who wants to keep them until after the audit, said he hasn't been asked by the commission for those files.

Heckman said he and members of the current Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC) are only communicating through newspaper reports. He said he has read twice in The News of efforts by the SBAC to obtain documents and files he has in his possession, but has had no direct request from the commission or its attorneys.

Although he said he was unwilling to relinquish those files until after the commission audit is completed, he handed them over late Friday afternoon to

village attorney John Underwood. That decision came after a conference with Wingfield that ended in a deadlock with the two men disagreeing over how to proceed with the audit.

Heckman is convinced the auditor should ask questions and be handed documents in his files, and Wingfield avers he must have free access to look through the files. Heckman stressed that he believes those files belong to the commission, but said he felt uncomfortable releasing them before the final audit report is issued.

"He was adamant, and I was adamant, and he walked out," said Heckman, saying he told Wingfield: "I'm not going to let you walk through those files; I still suspect a witch hunt." Heckman said he's never seen an audit conducted this way.

Wingfield, in a telephone conversation Saturday, confirmed leaving the meeting. He said he is using standard procedures, the same ones he uses when auditing the villages of Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs and Capitan, as well as Lincoln County.

In a May 11 meeting of the SBAC, Chairman Bill Karn said Heckman had denied the auditor access to commission files. Attorneys Gary Mitchell and Mike Rannels agreed to notify Heckman to turn over the files.

But Heckman, who was a member of the SBAC for more than 10 years before resigning to become the paid administrator, said he hasn't heard from the attorneys. In a letter dated September 30, 1987, Heckman told Karn that all SBAC files in his possession, dating from 1972 until he completed his contract, will

be turned over after his final bill was paid, FAA reimbursement complete and the audit finalized.

Heckman, who now spends much of his time in Albuquerque, said he arranged to meet with Wingfield and get the audit completed. Heckman and former airport commissioners Conrad Buchanan, Benny Coker and Ken Nosker waited together for over an hour to answer Wingfield's questions.

While they waited, the former commissioners wondered what Wingfield wants from Heckman. Nosker said the fiscal records are all in the hands of the county manager.

"Once you go beyond fiscal things, I don't know what he wants," said Heckman.

"Since it's a political year, I'm concerned," said Heckman, and Coker, Nosker and Buchanan all agreed they see political overtones in the audit. But all four men continued to say they have nothing to hide.

Heckman said he arrived in Ruidoso Thursday, and within a few hours he heard that county manager Suzanne Cox told the auditor to "get" Fred Heckman and Steve Sanders. Heckman said he pays attention to rumors as an indication of what people are thinking.

Quoting from a report in The News from a county budget workshop last week, Heckman said county attorney Gary Mitchell was credited with reimbursing the county twice the amount he was paid.

"It makes me think we've got an ambulance chaser out there and I'm the next accident about to happen," said Heckman.

"It's like having a pit bull on a chain," added Nosker.

Cox, contacted by telephone early today (Monday), said she and Wingfield haven't discussed the airport commission audit at all.

"I have never instructed him to 'get' anyone," added Cox, whose office has been audited by Wingfield many times under his contract as county auditor. Cox said Wingfield is the most thorough auditor she has ever encountered.

When Wingfield finally arrived at the Friday meeting, the men questioned him closely as to his instructions and the scope of his audit.

Wingfield said he's completing the audit commissioned in September, but said the contract wasn't approved until December. He said his audit wasn't really delayed, but was expanded to include a longer time period. He said he had no special instructions from the commission or anyone else, denying charges of a "witch hunt."

"That is an outright lie. I'm not an auditor that goes out and hangs people unless laws are broken," said Wingfield, adding he has heard no allegations. "I do my job—I write things up the way they are," insisted Wingfield.

Although he decided to turn over his files to Underwood, Heckman said he's uncomfortable giving them up, and added he could have made the auditor's job a lot easier.

"We are unable to defend ourselves," said Heckman, and Nosker responded, "We're not going to need to, we haven't done anything wrong."

## Grindstone: Suit dropped, home bought

It's official. The Village of Ruidoso will pay \$225,000 for a piece of property adjacent to the Grindstone Canyon Dam, and the property owners will drop a lawsuit they filed claiming the dam was polluting their land.

Attorneys for the Village of Ruidoso and property owners whose land neighbors the Grindstone Canyon Dam have signed a stipulated judgment. And the plaintiffs, Van and Mary Ann Brown and Richard and Jane Ann, will hand over warranty deeds and drop their case against the village.

The Halls lived, until recently, in a log home they built off Grindstone Road, on the downstream side of the municipal dam. They asked District Judge Sandra Grisham to enjoin the village from filling the dam after they discovered more water being released from the dam than the amount that would have flowed through the Grindstone Creek due to natural run-off. The Halls showed the judge how two ponds on their land had become filled with mud.


They also showed her a white substance flowing from the dam across their property.

Judge Grisham, after visiting the dam and the Hall/Brown property, enjoined the village from polluting the ponds and the stream bed. She further ordered the village to pay the Halls \$50 a day until in compliance with her order.

A trial was set in the case, but the attorneys for the village and the property owners agreed to the settlement last week. The terms of the settlement were read into the court record late last week.

The village also faces charges by the Environmental Improvement Division (EID) that the dam operations are causing violations of water quality standards and impairment of designated uses in Grindstone Canyon and Carrizo creeks and in the Rio Ruidoso. Village manager Frank Potter has asked EID to visit Ruidoso and help find a solution for those problems.

A meeting is set for this week. Meanwhile, fill operations are continuing, according to Water Department director Richard Sanchez.

## Group targets retirees

A committee of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, organized last month to promote retirement in Ruidoso, has sent out a request for proposals to two advertising agencies.

Phil Price Advertising of Lubbock, Texas, and Prime Design Advertising of Roswell have been invited to prepare and present proposed campaigns to spread the word that Ruidoso is an attractive place to retire.

Tuesday, May 31, is the day scheduled for the agencies to make their presentations at the chamber office, with Prime Design scheduled from 10 a.m. to noon and Phil Price Advertising set for 1 to 3 p.m.

The presentations will come at the end of a month-long effort by committee members of organizing and defining the goals of the group.

Committee members agreed at early meetings to be an arm of the chamber, yet maintain a separation in certain areas, such as a separate telephone number and post office box, as well as retaining the option of choosing any advertising agency, rather than being restricted to having the same agency as the chamber handle the retiree advertising campaign (presently, Phil Price Advertising handles advertising for the chamber).

Committee members hope to attract retirees to Ruidoso, both as permanent residents and as visitors who may become permanent residents in the future. An April 7 presentation by Eileen Minitier, director of the retiree services program in Roswell, which kicked off the Ruidoso retiree effort, illustrated the economic benefits Roswell has achieved from promoting itself as a place to retire. Minitier told future committee members and others gathered that evening in the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center that 103 homes have been sold in Roswell since the effort began in August 1986. Those 103 retirees, combined with 84 retirees who have rented homes, are plugging more than \$3.5 million yearly into the Roswell economy, at an estimated spendable income of \$19,000 per retiree household.

Other goals the Ruidoso group has established include providing amenities (activities, transportation, etc.) for retirees once they have relocated here, achieving the first successful retiree relocation to Ruidoso within six months, and having an average of two retiree

relocations a month within a year.

Funding for the effort is expected to come from several sources. Meetings of the Lodgers' Tax Advisory Board this month have resulted in the pledge (subject to Ruidoso Village Council approval) of \$20,000 toward the committee's advertising efforts. Chamber funds for the project have been identified. Other governmental agencies will be approached, as well as businesses in the private sector.

In addition, some funding will be achieved through participating real estate agents. In the program set up by committee members, the "Participating Realtor" must be a chamber member in good standing. Names of Participating Realtors will be drawn to establish a numerical listing. Then, as referrals from prospective retirees are generated by the retiree campaign, Participating Realtors will be assigned to each prospect in the order of the numerical listing.

In order to receive the prospect referral, the Participating Realtor must make a payment of \$50 at the time the Realtor receives the first prospect. The \$50 then entitles the Participating Realtor to receive further referrals as they are received and distributed for the remainder of the fiscal year (ending June 30, 1989).

When a referral is received, the Participating Realtor is to reply to the prospect and furnish a copy of the reply to the committee, as well as documentation of the final disposition of the referral, including whether real estate is rented or sold.

Independent of the Participating Realtors' replies to prospective retirees will be replies from the committee, which will include information on services, benefits and opportunities in the Ruidoso area. The final form of the reply, and its contents, are still to be decided.

Committee members traveled today (Monday), May 23, to Roswell to meet with Minitier and observe the operation of the Roswell retiree services program. That program operates on an annual \$76,000 budget, including \$33,500 in advertising.

After the May 31 presentations from the two advertising agencies, the committee will select an agency, and that agency will be invited to again present its retiree advertising campaign at a public meeting of the committee scheduled for 7 p.m. Thursday, June 2, at the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.


Hall said the dishwasher was destroyed, but the fire was contained in the kitchen area. Firefighters rescued a dog and a cat from the house.

## Sissy Salls, Chrises Smashed win Go Together divisions



Sissy Salls captures the first division of the Go Together Handicap Sunday at Ruidoso Downs Race Track. Sissy Salls is trained by Rickey Hill. It was Sissy Salls' first trip to the winner's circle in five starts. She covered the 350 yards in 17.75 seconds.

In his first season at Ruidoso Downs, jockey Cord Nix rode longshot Sissy Salls to victory in the hard-fought first division of Sunday's \$10,000-added Go Together Handicap, and Chrises Smashed came back from a six-month layoff to capture the second division.

Veteran Sissy Salls left the gate at odds of 11-1, hooked the speedy filly Elaina Ray and Its Called Class down the straightaway, and prevailed by a head in a blanket finish. Race favorite Strictly Wicked finished a close fifth.

Sissy Salls' first trip to the winner's circle in five starts this year earned \$6,000 in prize money for lessor H.L. Fitzgerald of Levelland, Texas. Rickey Hill trained the 6-year-old Master Salls mare. She covered the 350 yards in 17.75 seconds.

Chrises Smashed, ridden by John Weghorst, took the second division in an almost identical time of 17.79.

The 3-year-old Easily Smashed-filly ran evenly throughout, beating second-place finisher Strate And Easy by a length.

Trainer Jehu Lewis saddled Chrises Smashed for her first appearance since last November.

She now has seven wins in 12 tries, and Sunday's Go Together victory boosted her career earnings to \$236,000 for owner Dickie Vansickle.

Racing resumes at Ruidoso Downs Friday, May 27. Friday's feature event will be the Rio Grande Kindergarten Trials. The Saturday, May 28 racing card includes the \$10,000-added Barlaris Handicap and the Kansas Derby Consolation. The \$300,000 Kansas Derby is set for Sunday, May 29. A special Memorial Day racing schedule is slated for Monday, May 30, topped by the \$20,000 Memorial Day Handicap. First post each racing day is 1:00 p.m. Gates open at 11:00 a.m.

# Racing wrapup



## Merganser is top Futurity qualifier

Merganser, who went to the gate undefeated in five tries, emerged with his perfect record intact after soundly beating eight other Kansas Futurity Trial hopefuls. His winning time of 17.680 in the 350-yard sprint was the fastest of the day for the 12 trial divisions.

Saturday, twelve more Futurity Trial divisions went postward, and Ruidoso Downs simulcast the Preakness Stakes. Horses who posted the five fastest times of Friday's trials, and those posting the five fastest times Saturday, advance to the June 5th running of the \$600,000 Kansas Futurity.

A 2-year-old colt by Duck Dance, Merganser has now established himself as an early favorite for the June 5th classic. Rider Jacky Martin was in the irons for Merganser's impressive trial victory. The freshman speedster, purchased at last year's All American Futurity Sale for \$9,000, has already earned \$130,000 in prize money for owners Jerry Wells and Ronald Shalz of Sulphur, Oklahoma. Merganser is trained by Jack Brooks.

Faithfully, an Easy Jet colt trained by Roy Barrington, ran the second-fastest qualifying time of the day, sprinting down the straightaway in 17.975. Roy Barrington saddled the 2-year-old for J.C. Wells of Iowa Park, Texas.


Billy Burress Jr. guided the colt to a half-length victory.

The day's third-fastest time belonged to Zitatejan, a 7-1 shot who had won the only other start of her career. A filly by Zevi, Zitatejan broke in front for jockey Larry Layton and was never headed. She won by a length in 18.030. Zitatejan is owned by C.R. Potts of Mansfield, Texas, and trained by R. Paul Hobbs.

Easy Lady Oak, who finished second to Faithfully in the fourth trial division, was the only non-winner of the day to qualify. Her time of 18.045 was good enough to earn her and jockey Bo White a spot in the Kansas Futurity. Peggy Dube trains the Easy Dozen filly for Gene H. Lorent of Franklin, Texas.

The fifth qualifier of the day was Random Ryon, who took the 11th division of the trials in 18.075. Random Ryon, ridden by Gary Sumpter, won by a neck in a driving finish to beat out 10-1 shot Dark Scott. T.E. Davidson saddled the Windy Ryon colt for Tommy Joe Hoyt of Powderly, Texas.

Qualifiers for the Kansas Futurity consolation were By Gosh By Golly (18.080), Brilliantly (18.095), Dark Scott (18.110), Sailin Star (18.160), and Rainbows Stake (18.170).

## Power Effort leads Saturday's Kansas Futurity qualifiers

Power Effort, a 2-year-old colt by 1981 Triple Crown winner Special Effort, posted the best time of the second and final day of Kansas Futurity trials Saturday. Four other freshmen speedsters joined five qualifiers from Friday's trials to round out the field for the June 5th running of the \$600,000 Kansas Futurity.

Reinsman Jacky Martin guided Power Effort down the straightaway in a time of 17.715 for the 350-yard dash. Power Effort's win was one of three on the day for Martin and trainer Jack Brooks. Jacqueline Spencer, of Alto, owns the chestnut gelding, whose qualifying time was second only to Merganser, Friday's fastest qualifier.

Okaydokey Baby, leased by Austin, Texas' Jalapeno Racing Team, won the 24th and final trial division in 17.765, the second-fastest qualifying time of the day. Gary Sumpter piloted the 2-year-old filly to a two-length win—her third in four career starts. The R. Paul Hobbs trainee now has lifetime earnings of \$20,000.

Jockey Larry Payne teamed with trainer Robert H. Dimitt to bring Blushing Indian home in the


third-fastest qualifying time of the day, 17.800. The Make-Em Blush filly broke quickly, established a two-length lead at the halfway point, and won handily by three lengths. She is trained by Robert Dimitt for owners Bobby and Margaret Whitener of Republic, Missouri.

My Dash, a 2-year-old Dash For Cash filly, won the 22nd trial division in 17.820, the fourth-fastest time of the day. She finished a neck in front of Sweet Relief to give Jacky Martin and Jack Brooks their rider-trainer hat-trick. With the trial victory, My Dash has won three of five lifetime starts, and over \$25,000 in prize money for lessee Liese Gullikson of Lawton, Oklahoma.

The fifth-fastest time of the day belonged to another Dash For Cash product, Project Cash, who qualified for the Kansas Futurity in 17.860. Alex Baldillez Jr. rode the Iris Buchanan-trained colt to an impressive three-length victory for owners Lindsey Burbank and John Douglas of Leesburg, Florida. Project Cash is undefeated in his first two trips to the gate.

Saturday's qualifiers for the Kansas Futurity consolation were: Sweet Relief, Prosperous, Rime, Super De Kas, and Dasha Dimple.

# Schools offer Montessori to 3 levels

To cultivate a child's natural desire to learn, by allowing children to learn by choice and by helping them to perfect their natural tools for learning, is the goal of Montessori Education, which is offered to Ruidoso parents of toddlers to third-graders at three separate schools.

The Toddler House is on Meander Drive and the directress is Libby Beechie. The Toddler House is for children 18 months to three years with the limit of 12 children. Completing her first year with the school, Beechie found that the response was "real good."

She described the toddler program as a "hands-on experience" with nothing academic. The children are given the freedom to explore their world.

Dr. Maria Montessori, founder of the Montessori schools, wrote that the time from birth to three years is the most important in one's life. She emphasized that the hand is the chief teacher of the child. All the equipment in a Montessori classroom allows the child to use the hands for learning.

When visiting the Toddler House, one first notices that everything is scaled to the toddler's size. Each room contains small tables, furniture, bright colors and beautiful things. Beechie's philosophy

reflects the Montessori philosophy that fostering independence fosters self-confidence and a built-in success.

Beechie trained at a Montessori Society Training Center in Boulder, Colorado. Her assistant is Mimi Smith.

Beechie plans to have a special summer program this June and July with a limit of 12 toddlers.

The Toddler House school meets at 9-12 a.m. and Beechie can be contacted at 257-5880 for more information.

The Starlite school was founded in 1984 by Shaula Cull. The school, which takes three- to six-year-olds, is based on the Montessori Philosophy of allowing the child to develop at his/her own rate with no competition and limited adult supervision. The school environment is a small, home-like establishment for up to 18 children per class. Presently Cull offers a morning class and an afternoon class. The classroom is divided into Learning Centers from which the children are free to choose a wide variety of activities: snack preparation, art, sewing, puzzles, math, writing, reading, science, music, geography, sensorial activities and manipulatives.

The Starlite school follows the public school scheduling with vacations and end of school.

Cull received her bachelor of science and masters degrees, a Montessori Teaching Diploma from

an American Montessori Training Center and is experienced in elementary and preschool education. For more information about schedules and the school in general call 257-2255.

The Sierra Montessori School meets at St. Eleanor's Catholic Church and is geared toward children in kindergarten to third grade.

Following the Montessori philosophy, directress Patty White said the program is self-paced in each different area of learning. The learning materials are more manipulative than abstract, such as the use of beads to teach addition and multiplication.

White is registered with the state of New Mexico and affiliated with the American Montessori Society. She was trained at the Dallas Montessori Teacher Training Center.

The children at Sierra School visit the public library weekly and go on field trips, such as the visit to Mesalero where they learned traditional dances.

White stated her class has "freedom within limits." She guides the children to other course materials if she sees there is little or no challenge in the material the child selects.

Sierra School has morning and all-day classes. Anyone interested in the fall enrollment can call White at 257-6907 after 3 p.m.







## Goodloe seeks re-election as treasurer

Shirley A. Goodloe has announced her candidacy for re-election as Lincoln County Treasurer. A member of the Federated Republican Women of Lincoln County, she is unopposed in the Republican primary.

"I have taken my oath of office very seriously," she said. "As investment officer for the county, it is my duty to account for Lincoln County's money at the direction of the Board of Finance. All money available to be invested is done so on a pro rata basis among all lending institutions in the county in accordance with the laws mandated by the state.

"Our office policy is to deposit daily receipts within 24 hours, even during the busy tax season," she added. "This has resulted in the county earning more interest on investments, even though the interest rates are very low at this time."

Goodloe says she has made every effort to perform her duties as county treasurer in full compliance with state statutes. Monthly reports are prepared and submitted by the 10th of each month, as required by the Department of Finance and Administration of the state. Her office is also in full compliance with all recommendations of the county auditor from the most recent audit.

"All treasurer's records have been computerized and we are working on new computer programs which will add more efficiency to the work of the office," she said. "Our communication with the public has improved because additional

phone lines have been installed. We also strive to respond to all mail inquiries as soon as possible."

Goodloe said the workload in her office has increased 25 percent since the addition of the Alto Paving Assessment District. "Even with the additional work, we have not asked for an increase in staff," she said. She noted that Lincoln County is the first county in the state to have a paving assessment district and the treasurer's office was responsible for designing the collection program for the project.

"The treasurer's office is a working office," Goodloe stated, and listed some of the duties: distributing tax money collected each month to school districts, municipalities, state levies to the state and special districts such as sanitation districts and soil and water conservation districts; investing available money; and working with title and real estate companies on special tax problems. "Currently we are addressing the problems that occur each year involving finance compa-

ny tax payments. One of our major functions is the accurate accounting for all county receipts and disbursements.

"The banks and savings and loans in the county are prompt in mailing end of the month statements and other documents to us so we can close on time each month in order to prepare the monthly report. We have certainly appreciated this cooperation," Goodloe said.

Goodloe has been a resident of Lincoln County for 32 years and says that living in this area has been one of the blessings of her life.

"It has been a pleasure to serve the people of Lincoln County. They are wonderful, caring people who are good friends and neighbors. I appreciate the opportunity the voters have given me to hold this office and if re-elected, I will perform my duties as I have during this term of office."

Goodloe has been involved in ranching all her life and is active in many ranching oriented organizations: New Mexico Cattle Growers, New Mexico CowBelles, Society for Range Management, Corriente CowBelles, Lincoln County Fair Board, Lincoln County Farm and Livestock Bureau, Upper Hondo Soil and Water Conservation District, American Quarter Horse Association, National Cutting Horse Association and American Nation Cattlewomen.

She is active in community activities, school activities and is a member of the Christ Community Fellowship Church in Capitan.

## Weather fair means street repair

Road crews, for both village and state projects, are taking advantage of warm weather to improve streets in Ruidoso and the surrounding area.

Routine maintenance is under way in and around the village, and one major highway project is nearly half finished between Nogal and Carrizozo.

Mike Beyer, head of the village Street Department said his crews recently improved streets in White Mountain, Eagle, North and Country Club subdivisions. The department, using 60 percent state funds and 40 percent local monies, has repaired and overlaid Black Forest Road, Virginia Canyon, Paradise Canyon and Country Club drives.

Beyer said the total cost of the projects was \$73,352.

Village crews also are doing earth work for the T-hangar area at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport

and minor grading for the road to the Grindstone Canyon Dam, said Beyer.

A number of projects are planned for next year, if the budget permits. Included in future plans are overlaying the rest of Country Club Drive, widening Apache Trail and reconstruction of Timberline, Snowcap, McBride and Black Forest roads.

Beyer said he also plans to pave the entrance to the new airport terminal building, pave the T-hangar area and stripe a number of village streets.

The State Highway Department is midway through a major \$1.5 million project east of the junction of state roads 380 and 54, according to District II Engineer Lou Medrano. The project is being accomplished with 100 percent State Highway Department funds.

The Wylie Corporation of Albuquerque has the contract on replacing 7.7 miles of paving using a complete recycling process. Medrano

said the contractor, with a hot-mix plant at the site, will take up the old surface and recycle the materials. The road is scheduled to be paved and have a friction course added, said Medrano.

The 130-day contract started in January, and is scheduled to be completed in mid-summer, said Medrano.

The State Highway Department also is doing some routine blade patching and refinishing in the county, said Medrano.

New signs are being posted to reflect correct highway numbers and coincide with a new computer base, said Medrano. He said the State Highway Department will issue new state highway maps within the next few weeks to reflect the new numbers.

Medrano said new maps will be available from the State Highway Department; P.O. Box 1457; Santa Fe NM 87501.

## Private detective hired in Chavez murder

The family of Katina Chavez, who was found dead this spring in San Patricio, has retained the services of private investigator Manuel Lopez to find the person or persons responsible for the girl's death.

Lopez is known in New Mexico and Mexico for his successful investigations of such cases as the 1977 murder of Frank Chavez, owner of the Owl Bar in San Antonio, New

Mexico; the kidnapping of three grandchildren of State Senator Mike Alarid in 1979; and numerous cases recovering stolen property.

According to material provided by Lopez, Thomas Esquibel, district attorney of the 13th Judicial District, said of the private investigator, "During my term as district attorney, Mr. Lopez has undertaken and successfully handled several major cases where other in-

vestigators have failed. I have a high regard for his ability, honesty and perseverance."

A \$1,000 reward was established recently for any information leading to the indictment of any person or persons involved in the Chavez murder. Informants may call the district attorney at 648-2383 or family members at 653-4090 and 258-4065.

## EDITORIAL

When the Village of Ruidoso opened the valves at Grindstone Dam, it was like signing a check for \$225,000, and signing a death certificate for two creeks.

As the water began filling the lakebed behind the dam, flowing down Grindstone Creek, and entering Carrizo Creek, the damage was quick to follow.

Before long, the water downstream of the dam was white with impurities flowing from the upstream side of the dam. Something was obviously wrong, but the dam kept filling, and the damage continued.

Soon, ponds on property adjacent to the dam were contaminated with the white water, and the polluted water continued depositing its white baggage on the stream floors.

The plants in the streambed are dying. When they are dead, insect life will move elsewhere, or die, as will the fish in the Grindstone and Carrizo creeks. Then, the creeks will be dead.

Meanwhile, the village was taken to court over the damage to the adjacent property and an out-of-court settlement was reached in which the village will purchase the adjacent property for \$225,000.

So on one hand, we have a dam filling with precious water ... a need we've long wanted to meet. But on the other hand, we don't have \$225,000 and we don't have anything but a memory in the creeks downstream of the dam.

Couldn't we have had both?-DJF

## Eye On The Capitol

### THE OLD AND THE RESTLESS

What do horse racing and public education have in common? You cynics out there - hold your tongues.

In a KOAT-TV opinion poll conducted April 27 - May 2, Zia Research Associates asked about racing and education. The sample consisted of 300 Democrats and 300 Republicans statewide, who indicated they were going to vote in the June 7 primary elections.

The sample was weighted to reflect the 1.7 ratio of Democrats to Republicans. The margin of error for a 300 sample is plus-or-minus 4%, at a 95% level of confidence.

The folks were asked, "Do you believe that horse races run in New Mexico are generally honest or generally dishonest?"

The results:  
44% said dishonest.  
31% said honest.  
23% weren't sure.  
2% refused to answer.

Hispanics are more likely than the norm to say "honest." The same is true of people under the age of 44, with under 6 years of residency and earning between \$25,000 - \$40,000.

People who are 45 years old and over are higher in saying "dishonest," as are residents of 7 - 10 years and earning either less than \$15,000 or over \$40,000. Skepticism also is higher in Bernalillo County and in the northern congressional district (Richardson's turf).

The new and the young: That, in a nutshell, is the support base for the racing industry. As residency and age increase, faith in clean racing drops off. Also, the closer they live to racing (Bernalillo and the North), the more dubious people become.

I don't know about contempt. But familiarity apparently breeds distrust.

Horse racing is presently one of two hot topics in New Mexico. The other is public education.

The KOAT-Zia poll asked, "Would you support a salary increase for public school teachers if it meant a tax increase?" The question was worded that way because past experience shows that almost everybody wants teachers to get more money. The question is, are they willing to pay for it?

The results:  
67% favored a tax increase.  
26% were opposed.  
7% were undecided or refused.

Beware: Past experience shows that people are more liberal with their pocket books over the phone than in the voting booth. Nevertheless, the 67%-figure is high enough

to indicate that if the measure were on the ballot as a referendum, it would pass.

I should also add that 67% is not surprising: I've been asking the same question for almost a decade and the results have always been high.

People aged 44 or less are more likely than the norm to favor a tax increase for teachers. So are people with less than 6 years of residency in New Mexico, who are earning over \$25,000 and college graduates.

Sound familiar? People 45 and older are more inclined to oppose a tax increase. The same is true of New Mexicans with over 10 years of residency, with some high school and some college, earning less than \$15,000 and living in eastside counties.

Public school teachers, it turns out, have the same support base as the horse racing industry: the new and the young. A third question puts a frame around the findings. Attorney General Hal Stratton is suing some state lawmakers, arguing that public school employees are state employees, hence ineligible to be legislators.

The KOAT-Zia poll asked, "Do you think public school employees should be allowed to be state legislators?"

The results:

58% answered "yes."  
33% answered "no."  
3% said it didn't matter.  
6% were undecided.

Again, those who said "yes" were higher among people under 44, with under 2 years of residency, college graduates, people earning over \$25,000.

The nay-sayers were higher among people over 45, with over 10 years of residency, and with some college education.

The inescapable conclusion: Cynicism about public education and horse racing grows with age and residency. What better way can there possibly be of showing that both are enduring problems?

Of course, some will argue that skepticism grows with age and residency everywhere - that it is literally a fact of life.

But even they cannot deny that other states are different in at least one respect.

They don't call themselves "The Land of Enchantment."

The young and the new also emerged as a separate group when the question was asked: "If state government is faced with a choice of increasing taxes or decreasing services, which would you prefer?"

The young and the new came down more in favor of increasing taxes, along with college graduates and Democrats.

## Letters to the editor

### DEAR EDITOR:

A few months ago I learned that the pipe that is to deliver water from the new wells to Grindstone reservoir for distribution to our homes is composed of portland cement and ASBESTOS. This material is known as TRANSITE.

Here is a reprint from the Nov. issue of Readers Digest, 1986, "Woodstock New York residents were told by their county health department not to drink or cook with their city water because it is highly contaminated with asbestos fibers leaching from old water pipes."

Our city manager told me that a large percentage of the water pipe now in use in Ruidoso is transite pipe. He said that when a leak occurs and repairs are made that some of the fibers crumble and may be flushed into the water supply. Some asbestos fibers are so small that a special filter is required to remove them, and this equipment does not remove all of them.

I feel that I may be more acquainted with the dangers of asbestos than the average person since I have worked with asbestos products for many years, beginning in 1948. The reason I am so concerned about the asbestos problem is that I have become afflicted with ASBESTOSIS. A great percentage of my lungs have become clogged with the material and there is no way it can be removed. When asbestos fibers invade the body they are there to stay, and may develop into Mesothelioma, a very deadly

type of cancer. Asbestos is a very vicious and insidious material, especially so since the diseases it causes may not become evident for so many years after exposure, even 20 years. Another reason for my concern is that my family, including my daughter and granddaughter are at risk, because they live in Ruidoso.

Mr. Jim Edwards, of the Field Health Office told me that the Federal E.P.A. office in Fort Worth, Texas, told him that the asbestos manufacturers have ten more years in which to sell their deadly products. SHADES OF ANN GORSUCH.

I do not know the effects of asbestos which may be introduced into other parts of our bodies, but I think we should inform ourselves before our village becomes a ghost town.

If you have become alarmed by these few words of warning you may want to read these two books on the subject, "Outrageous Misconduct" by Paul Brodeur. "Asbestos- Medical and Legal Aspects," by Barry Castleman.

If you have a heart problem or become violent when angry I suggest you do not read these books.

Could the "White" water flowing from the new dam be contaminated by asbestos fibers being flushed into the lake through the transite pipe which supplies the water going into the lake?




