Dash For Speed first in \$204,000 Kansas Derby

Odds-on favorite Dash For Speed, last year's Rainbow Futurity champ, smashed nine other sophomore sprinters in Sunday's running of the \$204,000 Kansas Derby.

Dash For Speed, a Dash For Cash-Mighty Speedy filly, left the gate the 3-5 betting choice, broke second, but quickly gained the lead and was never headed. The 3/4

length win in 20.32, worth \$83,801, boosted the speedster's career earnings to more than \$373,000. Jockey Steve Fuller guided the filly to the wire.

Larry Keiter trains the classy 3-year-old for owners Blakeman Farms, Bob Blakeman, and Thomas H. Bradbury of Ft. Worth, Texas. It was Dash For Speed's sixth win in nine career starts. She was second in her three other tries.

Reinsman Fuller has been on board each time. "I didn't have to

push her much the first half of the Derby," said Fuller. "After that, I only hit her twice. She's one of the most responsive mares I've ever been on."

Meddlin Dash and Wicked Dash, part of a three horse entry that also included Dash S Diamond, finished second and third respectively. Like Dash For Speed, all three entry-mates were sired by Dash For Cash.

Pilot Larry Layton was on board Meddlin Dash, who finished 3/4 length in front of Wicked Dash, ridden by Luke Myles. Meddlin Dash and Wicked Dash are trained by Neil Garcia for the Estate of B.F. Phillips Jr., of Frisco, Texas.

The rest of the Kansas Derby field finished as follows:

Shayne Music Man (Lackey), Mame Smashed (A. Baldillez), Dash S Diamond (Nicodemus), Spring Action (Martin), Available Now (Tidwell), Dance Hall Maskeo (Payne), Dashing Love (Sumpter).

In the co-feature, the \$8,500 Fine Loom Handicap, Financial Aid, ridden by Richard Vaughn, survived a claim of foul to log a one-length victory in a driving finish. A 5-year-old gelding by Silver Charge, Financial Aid took the lead early in the 870-yard race and held off all comers down the lane. He is trained by Johnie Goodman Sr. for owners Frank Sayner and Jim Pirtle of Ruidoso, N.M.

Quickie Quick finished second and Runaway Bandit got up for the show.

The Ruidoso Village Council reviewed a \$10 million proposed budget Thursday.

Stressing that the proposals are still preliminary, village manager Frank Potter said the budget, down from a \$14 million budget last year, includes projections of a two and a half percent revenue decrease. The proposal also includes plans to establish a general fund reserve fund amounting to 1/12 of the budget.

Potter said the reserve fund was a goal last year, too, but was never achieved.

"We hadn't pinched pennies enough," said Potter. He told councillors the administration has reduced operating costs and salaries this year.

In efforts to get better budgetary control, Potter said he and his staff will initiate a number of policy

statements. A policy they'll establish will require a department to gain his approval before exceeding any line item.

Cuts were made in capital outlay in most proposed budgets, said Potter.

It was learned that one such cut was a \$37,000 pothole replacement machine requested by the Street Department. Councillors expressed disappointment over that cut.

"If we reach the fourth quarter and revenues are up instead of down ... those items can be put back in the budget," said acting financial director John Varley.

Varley summarized a worksheet of changes to the budget made since the last council workshop. Referring to problems in a neighboring village, Varley said case law supports the philosophy that a court should submit its budget proposal directly to the governing body for approval.

Potter said municipal courts use public funds and their budgets are considered just like any other municipal department.

It was learned during the workshop that the budget proposed by the Ruidoso Municipal Court included \$5,000 for a court information system and \$4,000 for the first year maintenance. Those items were cut from the preliminary budget.

"The court system doesn't generate enough activity to justify a computerized system," said Potter.

Varley said the budget includes a flat \$50,000 line item for legal services, with legal costs to be controlled through internal control.

Before the workshop was adjourned, Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. asked for an executive session to discuss personnel. That meeting was set for 10 a.m. Tuesday, May 31.

Wanted man arrested on fraud charge

A New York man is in Otero County Jail charged with fraudulent use of a credit card following an incident Thursday at the Ruidoso Sears catalog store.

Ruidoso Police Detective Lanny Maddox said a man identifying himself as Lynn C. Brown, 22, entered the Ruidoso store with a black male and a white female. The three used a credit card bearing the name of Mrs. Lynn C. Jones to purchase three VCR's for a total of \$1,016.92, said Maddox.

Sears employees got the license number of the 1979 Pontiac in which the three were traveling. Police apprehended Brown and his companions in Alamogordo, and the property alleged to be stolen was recovered still in the boxes. Numerous other items also were recovered, according to police.

Brown is in the Otero County

Jail on the third degree felony charges. He also is awaiting extradition to New York.

According to police, Brown was identified as Damen Brown, a fugitive out of Albany, New York. He faces charges on two counts of robbery and one count of parole violation in Albany, according to police reports.

No charges were filed on Brown's companions.

Wednesday will be fair and warmer with westerly winds to 10-20 miles per hour.


Precipitation probabilities are: today, 0 percent; Wednesday, 0 percent; and Thursday, 0 percent.

Steppin Georgous is tops in \$35,000 Derby Consolation

Steppin Georgous, who had a troubled trip in her trial race, found smoother sailing in the \$35,000 Kansas Derby Consolation, beating stable-mate Im Steppin Easy to the finish line by a neck.

Saturday's holiday weekend crowd of 4,679 made the entry of Steppin Georgous and Im Steppin Easy the lukewarm 5-2 favorites, and the two Jack Brooks-trainees responded with a one-two finish. Jacky Martin rode the winner, a Six Fols-Steppin Lightly filly. Steppin Georgous covered the 400 yards against a headwind in 20.35.

"I thought if she broke well, she'd win the race easily," said

Martin, "but she broke poorly. She's always been a bad gate horse. She was dead last at the start, but she has so much talent she overcame that."

Steppin Georgous is owned by Jerry Wells and Ronald Shaft, of Colby, Kansas. The win was worth \$7,182. Gary Sumpter was on board second-place finisher Im Steppin Easy, owned by Jerry Wells. Im Steppin Easy earned \$5,028 for the place.

Ms Special Secret, a Special Effort filly ridden by Jerry Nicodemus, finished third. H. Don Farris saddled her for Art Shahan and the San Jose Cattle Co. of Pleasanton, Texas.

The rest of the Kansas Derby

consolation field came in as follows: Lady Pass Oak, Native Creek Six, Floozys Dash, Sailontwin, La Pryor, Lantys Gal, and Ima Dial Oak.

In the co-feature, the \$10,000-added Barlaris Handicap, Big Bold Boz continued his love affair with Ruidoso Downs by posting a two-length win over a contentious field of sprinters. The 4-year-old Bold Ego gelding posted a winning time of 1:04 2/5 for the 5 1/2 furlong trip. It was rider Mike Lidberg's third win of the day. Big Bold Boz is owned and trained by T.E. Davidson of Grant, Oklahoma.

Longshots Ruffetta and Bubbles Silverman finished second and third respectively.

Crusher Run knocks off field in Memorial Day Handicap

Crusher Run, who took last year's Pocket Coin Handicap at Ruidoso Downs, whipped a solid field of 3-year-old sprinters by 3 1/2 lengths in Monday's \$20,000 Memorial Day Handicap.

Patrick Valenzuela piloted Crusher Run to a wire-to-wire triumph in the fastest 6 furlong clocking of the young season, 1:09 4/5, 2/5 seconds off the track record.

Valenzuela and the grey gelding, by Victory Stride, set a rapid pace which proved too much to contend with for the other nine entrants. Crusher Run left the gate the 4-5 betting favorite.

The win, worth \$14,880, boosted Crusher Run's career earnings to \$128,000. He has five wins in only eight lifetime starts. Paul Smith trains the jet-fast speedster for owner Amber Branch of Lindsey, Oklahoma.

Shutup and Deal, ridden by Joe

Martinez, broke last but mustered a steady charge down the lane to finish second. E. Lee Ivey, a Ruidoso native, owns and trains the Draconic colt.

Reinsman Mike Clark, on board Hainault, tried to stalk the blistering pace laid down by Crusher Run, ran second most of the way, and held on for the show.

In the sixth race, the Ruidoso Downs track record for 5 1/2 furlongs fell to Frosty Freeze, a 4-year-old filly by It's Freezing.

Frosty Freeze, ridden by Casey Lambert, ran the distance in 1:03 2/5, breaking Shen's 1986 track standard of 1:03 3/5. Favorite Lightfoot Lil waged a neck and neck battle with Frosty Freeze down the lane, but Frosty Freeze prevailed. H. Don Farris, a champion quarter horse trainer, owns and trains the new record holder.

A Memorial Day crowd of 3,592 found the Twin-Trifecta elusive once again. The Twin-Tri carryover

is now \$42,588.

Racing fans will have a chance to shoot for it all next Friday, June 3, when racing resumes with the Rainbow Silver Cup Trials and the Norgor Derby Trials.

Freshmen take over Saturday,

June 4, with the running of the Rio Grande Kindergarten Futurity and the Kansas Futurity consolation. On Sunday, June 5, the fastest 2-year-olds in the country compete in the \$600,000 Kansas Futurity, the first leg of quarter horse racing's Triple Crown.

Christian Leader fastest in Rio Grande Kindergarten trials

Christian Leader flew down the stretch like an express train to post the fastest Rio Grande Kindergarten Futurity Trial time Friday, covering 5 furlongs in 59 4/5. Masked Parade, William Hugh and Fly Dragoness were also victorious in three other trial divisions.

Christian Leader, a Gaelic Christian filly, was given a skillful ride by jockey Mike Clark. He stalked the field to the top of the lane, made up six lengths on frontrunners D.B.'s Leader and Loose Lips Cash, and blew by them to log a 3/4 length victory. The filly is trained by Alberto Dominguez for owners Carol and Frank Tisdale III of El Paso, Texas.

Loose Lips Cash held on to finish second. My Shake was third. The top two finishers in each of the four divisions advance to the June 4 final, with two remaining qualifiers selected at random from the four third place finishers.

Fly Dragoness, a filly by Full Choke, also ran an impressive trial race. Like Christian Leader, the youngster launched a blistering stretch run, winning by 2 1/4 lengths in 1:00 1/5. The Doyal Roberts Sr. trainee is leased by Jacqueline Spencer of Alto, to Fletcher H. Hall, Jr. Glen Murphy was in the irons for his third win of the day. Miss Yea was second and Wise Blade held on for the show.

Salusito Burgos rode William Hugh to victory in the 2nd trial division. The Brave Lad colt, trained by Fred Danley, nosed out Pinons Charmin for the win in 1:00 3/5. William Hugh is owned by Tom Williams and William Stradley of

Hobbs, N.M. Favorite Scout Stuff finished third.

Masked Parade, a speedy freshman by Masked Native, took the opening Rio Grande trial in 1:00 4/5. Mike Lidberg piloted Masked Parade to a two length

decision over Roseta and longshot Fearless Ace. Cecil Crabtree trained the colt for owner Cleber J. Massey of Abilene, Texas.





Mrs. Mary Kelley's home, right there just down from the Ruidoso State Bank, was the scene of great rejoicing, all last weekend, as her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren gathered to wish her a happy birthday.

Mary was born May twenty-seventh, 1913, in Portales to Jesse Allison and the former Maud Brown. Her parents were ranching people, and Mary lived the life of a ranch girl.

"I loved every minute of my ranch life," Mary remembers. "I was happy riding horseback, and doing all kinds of ranch work, I love horses and cattle, especially Hereford cattle."

As a member of a ranch family, Mary saw a great deal of the state of New Mexico, having lived in Portales, Hope, Artesia, Lovington,

Dusty, Hot Springs, Tularosa, Alto, and Alamogordo.

More than fifty years ago, after all these travels she arrived in Ruidoso, and found the home of her dreams.

Late in January of 1936, Mary and her husband, Grover Lewallen, left Delight, Arkansas, in an old Ford car carrying their belongings.

"The weather was fair for that time of year through Texas," says Mary. "So we slept out by the side of the road, as folks often did those days. What we didn't know until later was that one of the worst storms in the history of the country was following right behind us. Cattle and horses were freezing to death. We arrived in Ruidoso on the twenty-eighth of January 1936. The weather was still warm and mild the day we arrived, but the next morning there was two feet of snow."

Just the same, Mary knew her wandering days were over, and that she was home at last.

The same year that she arrived here she started her home laundry which is a landmark in the city, still going strong.

"I enjoy my work more every day after these fifty years," Mary says. "I have met so many wonderful people. Ruidoso people are as fine as you can find anywhere, and Ruidoso is the best place to live in the world. The Lord has been good to me. I have been greatly blessed."

We congratulate Mary at arriving at this important milestone along life's pathway, still young, and a great inspiration to all of us with her cheerful and helpful ways. We are thankful for the blessing this Christian lady brings to our life. May God bless Mary Kelley always.





Crimestoppers plan to distribute signs

Ruidoso-Lincoln County Crimestoppers members saw a sample Thursday of a neighborhood sign they hope to place on street signs throughout the county.

Detective Lanny Maddox, liaison between Ruidoso Police and Crimestoppers, reported progress on acquiring funds to purchase the signs, and displayed the prototype of a yellow sign with black writing with red on the graphics. The metal signs, reminding citizens that Crimestoppers pays case rewards for tips on crimes, will show the Crimestoppers telephone number.

Ruidoso Valley Noon Lions Club kicked off the sign fund drive with a donation last month, and Maddox said he has presented programs for several other organizations that have indicated they'll help with the project. Cost of the signs is \$10 each for up to 100, and drops to \$9 each for orders of more than 100.

Although the group has established a special fund to purchase the signs, it was agreed Thursday that funds from the general treasury could be used if donations fall short of the amount needed to get the better price. President Jim Biggs noted the signs will promote Crimestoppers.

Donations from individuals are also being solicited, and Maddox said they may be sent to him at the Ruidoso Police Department. He said checks to the sign fund should be so designated.

Also Thursday, Maddox an-

nounced that Mark Silva had resigned. The board elected Howard Davis to replace Silva.

Biggs asked Maddox to explain what happened on a case discussed last month at Crimestoppers. In that case, the board had authorized a \$500 reward for a case handled through the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, stipulating that information be provided on the dispensation of the case.

Maddox said he learned the suspect was indicted by the grand jury, but not convicted. Crimestoppers rewards are paid on cases resulting in grand jury indictments, whether a conviction results or not.

At that last meeting the membership discussed communication problems among various agencies that caused the difficulty Maddox had in following the case. Board member Dave Parks asked Maddox if Sheriff Don Samuels contacted him and apologized.

"I met with Samuels. He apologized for the lack of communication and said he would keep us updated," said Maddox, adding that he also spoke with Ruidoso Downs Police Chief Skip Hazel about a similar problem.

"He (Hazel) said he would keep us informed," said Maddox.

During his official report, Maddox said the Crimestoppers line received three calls last month—one referral and two calls over prior incidents. He said one \$150 reward is pending.

Clerk loses representation

Lincoln County Clerk Fran Siddens will find one less legal representative sitting at the June 1 New Mexico Supreme Court hearing in Santa Fe.

The New Mexico Association of Counties (NMAC) had told Siddens that retired Supreme Court Judge H. Vern Payne would represent her as amicus curiae, or friend of the court.

Siddens said she attended the May 13 Board of Trustees meeting of the New Mexico Association of Counties and presented her side of the lawsuit involved with the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners. Siddens, who is a member of the NMAC board of trustees, was told then that Payne would represent her.

Today, (Tuesday), Donna Smith, director of NMAC, told The News that Payne would not act as amicus curiae because NMAC lacked funds and Payne saw a possible conflict of interest. Smith added that NMAC could possibly represent Siddens at a later hearing.

Lincoln County manager Suzanne Cox responded to the decision that neither she nor the county commissioners knew that Siddens was appealing to the NMAC board of trustees. Cox said she was pleased that NMAC decided not to have Payne represent Siddens.

In a telephone interview Friday, Siddens said she asked to be on the NMAC board of trustees meeting to explain the ramifications of Judge Robert M. Doughty's opinion. She was unavailable for comment Tuesday morning.

Dedication is important to Downs Chief Hazel

Improving racetrack traffic is one of the major priorities this year for the Ruidoso Downs Police Department, said Chief G.L. "Skip" Hazel.

Depending on the traffic flow, on the east- and west-bound lanes of Highway 70, getting into and out of the track should be smooth.

"We're going to do it the easiest and safest way we know how," said Hazel.

He also said drivers on Highway 70 can expect a short wait during high out-flow times at the track while officers block off traffic intermittently to let racetrack goers out.

In other news at the department, Hazel said they have acquired a new Ford Bronco II four-wheel-drive for patrolling purposes. Hazel is hoping for one more vehicle, but is not sure if he wants another four-wheel-drive or a passenger car.

Hazel is encouraging his men to get away from high-speed chases.

"That's what the radios are for," he said. "It's just endangering my men and other people."

Hazel feels that pursuits can be stopped most effectively by utilizing radios to call ahead of the offender and getting units from Ruidoso, the county, and State Police if neces-

sary. The chief will also be working to increase the size of his force. He currently has only five men on duty, with one more due to come in soon from the police academy.

He said he would ultimately like to get his force up to at least eight men so he can have two men on each shift.

However, Hazel feels that his men are doing a great job. Even at the latest hours, help is no more than about four minutes away, said Hazel.

"I can verify that because I've been called out of bed at three in the morning and made it there that quick," Hazel said. "And I don't go anywhere without my handheld (radio) or my pager."

Hazel said working on a small force can get pretty tiring. He said he and his men have been accused of being over-dedicated to their jobs, but not by choice. Because of the small size of the force, Hazel has to be on 24-hour call.

His men are on a type of 24-hour call as well. Although the chief doesn't force them to stay in town on their days off, a lot of them do, in case something comes up.

"Every one of my guys, even the dispatchers, are good people," Hazel said.

"And sometimes the wives can say that we're over-dedicated."

Lodgers' tax has funded a wide array of events over years

Every time a visitor stays at a Ruidoso lodging establishment, three cents of each dollar spent goes to the lodgers' tax fund. These funds go to promote various tourist-related projects.

The Ruidoso Village Council will consider, at their 7 p.m. meeting Tuesday, seven different projects that the Lodgers' Tax Advisory Board proposed funding with the 1988-89 lodgers' tax collections. The Advisory Board members are appointed by the village mayor and are from lodging businesses with one member a non-lodging business person.

The council will consider funding the Wursthfest and Chili Cook-off, which are fall events, softball tournaments, which are summer events and the All-Sports Festival, a spring event. In addition to these events, the lodgers' tax funds may finance the promotion of the retirement campaign and the Ruidoso Convention and Visitors Bureau, which is headquartered in the

Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

This year's proposed events occur in spring, summer and fall.

In past years, the funding has moved from expenditures primarily for advertising to the actual promotion of specific events. In the 1983-84 budget, lodgers' tax funds were used for promoting trade shows, Mexico advertising, the Art Festival, Aspen Festival and the Motorcycle Festival. The remaining funds were used for Sun Country dues, which is a regional promotional organization, council approved advertising, the routine printing and mailing costs as well as media advertising. The budget that year totaled \$159,235, with actual collections at \$148,415.34.

The budget for 1984-85 reflected a shift toward the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce taking charge of promoting such projects as the trade shows and the Art Festival. Funding for those projects was paid to the chamber as well as contractual services and mailing costs. Media advertising for the Art Festival also was paid to the cham-

ber. Chamber related activities were the Aspen Festival, the Pro-Ski Race, printing, fall and winter advertising and spring and summer advertising.

Projects which were not chamber sponsored that year and which were funded from the lodgers' tax contingency funds were the Mule Races, Golden Years activities and Spirit of Ruidoso activities. Media advertising for the Motorcycle Festival was an individual line item in the budget. The budget for 1984-85 was \$149,700 and \$132,728.43 was collected.

The budget for 1985-86 reflected a change in the projects funded by the lodgers' tax money. The promotion of the Art Festival no longer was financed by lodgers' tax, but was taken by the chamber entirely. The only activity funded by lodgers' tax was the Aspen Fest.

All other funds from the \$125,969.04 total were for media advertising, printing and mailing costs.

In more recent years, the lodgers' tax funds began to finance

the promotion of more activities. From the 1986-87 budget of \$150,000, contingency funds financed the promotion of the Volksmarch, bicycle races and the Texas Appreciation Day. Also taken from the contingency funds was council approved advertising in the form of Ruidoso pins. The rest of the budget that year went to contractual services with the chamber, printing and Sun Country dues.

The 1987-88 budget was identical to the prior year with contingency funds going to the Volksmarch, bicycle races, Texas Appreciation Day and the Ruidoso pins. The remaining funds went to contractual services with the chamber, Sun Country dues and printing costs.

This year's activities will be from spring to fall.

Chamber director John Jeffers said he is impressed with this year's varied projects. He said the projects seem to reflect a positive change in community attitudes toward the promotional activities that bring people to Ruidoso.



THE DRUG DANGER: A NEW APPROACH

Drug Ballot?
It sure fooled me. I thought I'd seen every kind of ballot.

Then Senator Pete Domenici's "Drug Ballot" arrived last week in the mail.

The "Ballot" is a mailer in which the senator explains the Omnibus Anti-Drug Abuse Act. "This is legislation we must make the law of the land!"

The bill's main features:
*\$1.5 billion "to help beef up local anti-drug law enforcement."
*\$300 million to drug agencies to hire 3,500 more anti-drug agents.

*Fund the President's Media Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention "to get the right message to the public...that drugs are NOT a harmless personal habit."
*It has "new money to help the users kick the habit through treatment centers."
*Allows "vessel inspections on the high seas."
*If calls for additional prison construction to hold the drug runners we capture.

*Gives "special help to foreign nations that halt the growing of crops used to make drugs."
*More money for Coast Guard and customs interdiction, as well as \$75 million for four more aerostat planes.

"Please let me know what you think," the senator urges.
O.K., if you insist...

The Omnibus Act is very timely in this election year: "Should we lay down the law to drug pushers?" it asks/answers.

Very timely, and very expensive. "This is a war we can't afford to lose," the mailer declares.

It could also be a war we can't afford to win.

There is a solution out there, that the Federal Government isn't discussing. "Too many smugglers and bureaucrats would lose their jobs. Most of the burglars would have no reason to burgle. Worst of all, the government would take in revenues, instead of spending them."

You already know what I have in mind.

Or do you?
No, I'm not recommending the legalization of cocaine. What I am recommending is that we search out new solutions.

Nowhere is that option included in the Omnibus Act.

But where can you find new solutions? Look at other lands, such as England and the Netherlands.

No, they haven't found the answer either. Our solution is something they don't have at present.

But a combination of them and us could produce it.

The research wouldn't just compare national laws. It would also examine real-life situations existing apart from the legal ones.

I've lived in several of them. Guanajuato, Mexico, 1965. Pharmacies sold anything to anybody. Well, almost. You had to have the money.

But everybody knows Benzadrine or opium can't be sold without a doctor's prescription, even in Mexico. And let me assure you: the words on the boxes containing the drugs faithfully recorded that fact.

The incredible thing about it: nobody cared. To abuse something, you have to care about it.

I guess I'd better add: Guanajuato is a university town.

I also lived in Columbia. Cocaine was seldom discussed. It would have been the equivalent of carrying on a conversation about chewing gum.

As with marijuana in Mexico, most Colombian males have tried cocaine and don't like it. End of story.

The Domenici mailer exposes the root of the problem: "we must root out the demand for drugs."

Now you're talking. Why do North Americans take so many drugs? If you can answer that question, you can solve the problem.

And a good starting place is to look at the very cure this society -- this mailer -- proposes:

We must mobilize our communications skills to get the word to everyone: "Drugs are a dead end." Key to this effort is passing the major new anti-drug law I mentioned earlier.

A big dose of pr, plus 3,500 anti-drug agents: there you have it. Propaganda and police.

People who take drugs are making a statement about the quality of life in this country. I'm not sure which came first, the drug problem or the nature of the "solutions" designed to correct it.

Come to think of it, I am sure.

Some interesting statistics in the Domenici mailer worth repeating:

1 in every 6 high school seniors has tried cocaine.

1 in 13 high school seniors uses cocaine monthly.

1 in 13 high school seniors has tried crack.

1 in 10 Americans uses an illicit drug at least once a month.
