## Longshot takes Silver Cup

In the biggest upset at Ruidoso Downs this season, 66-1 shot Naviaux cut down a quality field of 4-year-old sprinters in the Grade I \$138,000 Rainbow Silver Cup, winning the 440-yard dash in 21.83 seconds.

An extended week of racing begins Wednesday, June 15, when 15 divisions of 2-year-old speedsters go to the gate in the first day of Rainbow Futurity Trials. First post Wednesday, and for the remainder of the meet is 12:30 p.m. Gates open at 11:00 a.m.

Prior to Sunday, Naviaux, a 4-year-old What Luck-Victory jet colt, had not posted a victory in almost two years. His lifetime moneyline stood at \$22,624, and he

was making only his second appearance of the season.

When the dust had settled, Naviaux's owners Bobby and Margaret Whitener were in the winner's circle accepting the 1988 Rainbow Silver Cup trophy.

Naviaux broke from the outside post for the versatile reinsman Larry Payne and battled Hiclass Girl down the lane, ending up a neck in front.

"I knew the colt was good, even though he wallows in the gate," said Payne. "He's had a lot of problems, but he had surgery in the fall and he's sounder now than he's ever been before."

Naviaux's triumph was worth \$69,476 in purse money, and returned a whopping \$134.80 on each two dollar win wager. Robert H. Dimitt conditioned the

victorious longshot.

Hiclass Girl, ridden by James Lackey, broke from post position nine, next to Naviaux. A 4-year-old filly by Zevi, Hiclass Girl stuck to Naviaux's side the entire trip, but couldn't pass the winner.

With the second-place finish paying \$23,621, Hiclass Girl has amassed more than \$384,000 in lifetime earnings.

Robert Turner trains Hiclass Girl for owners Ralph and Doyle Rice of Chouteau, Oklahoma.

The highly regarded filly Will Be Easy, a Comin' Easy 4-year-old, nipped Freedom Flyer for the show. Jerry Nicodemus was in the irons for the Keeling Family Partnership and Kenneth Keeling of Huntsville, Texas. Third place prize money came to \$13,895, lifting Will Be Easy's career bankroll to \$250,000.

## Village seeks proposals by July 5 on events center

Developing an events center for the Village of Ruidoso will be a long process.

In a preliminary conference on architectural and marketing services at Village Hall Friday, planners learned that proposals are due July 5, with the village's decision due 45 days after that. And the project schedule allows 180 days for the research project once the contract is signed.

Months of discussions and many hours of meetings led the Village Council to advertise for planning,

architectural and marketing proposals.

A dozen people gathered Friday in council chambers for the pre-vendor conference.

Village manager Frank Potter said village staff began looking at available buildings after members of the public showed a great deal of interest in acquiring a facility. He said he knew, through his years as a member of the chamber of commerce board, that the village misses many opportunities for meetings and conferences because there is no large meeting facility.

"We pretty much found out we didn't know what we were doing,"

said Potter, explaining why the council advertised for proposals from experts and professionals.

Planning administrator Cleatus Richards distributed materials to the audience, and explained that bidding packets are available for a \$100 deposit.

"The basic project is considering the development of convention facilities," said Richards. He said the proposals are due no later than July 5. He detailed what should be included in those proposals, with one requirement a fee schedule of services to be provided.

Potter said a meeting will be planned for July 5, so proposals can

be listed and tabulated. The review process will begin on that date.

Proposals will be evaluated and selected according to experience, qualifications and experience of personnel, demonstrated knowledge of information pertaining to the project and cost.

The firm selected will be expected to provide a current market analysis and an analysis of market potential. Richards said the village can provide a limited amount of information obtained from the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

Based on the market analysis and projections, a determination

will be made whether to continue the project through a recommended

market strategy, according to Richards. If the council decides to go forward, then the contractor also will provide information on economic implications.

Prospective bidders were provided a list of available buildings and asked to make a site visit. The buildings listed are: airport property, True Value Hardware, old Gibson's, old Ben Franklin building, New Mexico Glass building and the old Safeway building at 400 Suderth.

In explaining the scope of the project, Richards said the village is

particularly interested in the hotel/motel support aspect.

"The city has a limited budget, so whatever dollars we spend, we want to have a long-term effect and the maximum economic impact," remarked Richards. He said some buildings have been considered as interim facilities, noting the village may not want to spend limited funds on a temporary project.

But Richards said such projects will be considered, too.

Questioned over the budget, Potter said the village currently has \$300,000 toward a facility, and matches lodgers' tax funds for the building fund each year.

## Business licensing 'moving toward more vigorous enforcement'

Getting a license to operate a business in the Village of Ruidoso isn't like it used to be.

Village manager Frank Potter and members of village staff took time last week to talk about the changes to the business license ordinance, and the impacts to local business operators.

"This won't cause any headaches to permanent residents," assured assistant village attorney Mike Rannels. "We are moving toward more vigorous enforcement," he added.

Rannels said the revamped ordinance addresses a number of

things that had been going on in an unlicensed manner over the years. That includes tent sales, flea markets, ongoing garage sales and selling from vehicles.

Potter said under the old ordinance people were paying property owners for permission to set up curbside businesses in parking lots. He said that practice started during some special events, when businesses set up without a business registration. He said those business operators were in direct competition with existing, ongoing and legitimate local businesses, came in, made money and were soon gone.

Potter said he didn't even know if they reported and paid gross

receipts tax.

But Potter and his staff believe the new ordinance will take care of such problems.

"The brunt of the enforcement responsibility will fall on the planning administrator and building inspector," said Potter, admitting that some past problems were caused by a lack of enforcement rather than the ordinance. He said the Police Department, too, can issue citations for ordinance violations.

Village clerk Tammie Maddox explained that anyone wishing to do business in the Village of Ruidoso is required to apply for a business registration or license. The ordinance details what

businesses need to register and those that require licenses.

The business registration fee is \$25, and is slated to increase to \$35 on July 1. License fees range from \$25 to \$100 per day, with some business licenses issued for annual fees of from \$25 to \$100.

All annual registration fees are due each January 1, said Maddox. She said those registrations are non-transferable, so when businesses are sold, the new owner or operator is responsible for making a new application.

Businesses that require licenses rather than registration include pawnbrokers, second hand and junk shops, exhibitions, motorcycle rentals, temporary and seasonal

merchants, route food vendors, vehicles for hire, auctions and flea markets.

Planning administrator Cleatus Richards noted the new ordinance precludes daily displays of merchandise outside the business. Maddox added businesses with registrations and an ongoing operation are allowed to have three-day outdoor sales, but not continuously.

Village staff members have implemented a process for business registration/license applicants to ensure that all village codes are met. The applicant fills out a Village of Ruidoso request form. That application then makes the rounds of village departments for a review and check of zoning, fire codes,

building codes and traffic concerns and so forth.

"If someone misrepresents any part of the form, they are in violation," said Richards, noting staff will follow up on the applications.

Rannels commented the new process is expected to offer some protection from the ongoing problem of itinerant/street vendors.

Potter said it's important for business operators to know about the ordinance, since it will be enforced.

## Commission chops sheriff's budget requests

Lincoln County Sheriff Don Samuels' attempts to increase salaries for two sheriff's department personnel in the 1988-89 fiscal year budget met with no success at the Board of Lincoln County Commissioners meeting Friday.

Meeting to canvass the primary election votes, commissioners finalized the county budget with adjustment of the sheriff's department and extra money left from insurance estimates to help fund the publishing of the Ruidoso Cog Railroad project study.

Commissioners approved the final canvass of votes, which officially acknowledged the candidates who were declared Lincoln County winners on primary election night.


On the budget hearing, Samuels was present to request a larger than three percent raise for two of his secretarial staff, an additional (over the manager's estimated sheriff's budget) \$5,000 for car ex-

pense, \$30,000 in professional services, \$3,000 for uniforms, and \$6,000 for a new animal control vehicle.

After an hour of consultation with Samuels and Undersheriff Rex Skellett, commissioners John Allen Hightower, Bill Karn and Ralph Dunlap and county manager Suzanne Cox agreed that, following the manager's estimated budget, the secretarial salaries for Bettye Dean and Patsy Vallejos be kept at the three percent raise to be received by all county employees, the car expenses be kept at \$66,151, the sheriff's expense kept at \$11,500, professional services at \$900, uniforms at \$4,000 and animal control at \$8,500 to make a grand total for the Law Enforcement budget for 1988-89 at \$646,802.

The jail budget was adjusted down \$2,000 from Samuels' request for an approved total of \$232,739.

## Spend outruns field in Norgor Derby Saturday

Spend took control of the 6 furlong Norgor Derby at the top of the stretch to win the \$37,000 event going away Saturday, while Josies Super Sound held off a wave of competitors to prevail for the victory in the 400 yard, \$12,000-added Mr Kid Charge Handicap.

Ruidoso Downs' leading

thoroughbred Jockey Mike Lidberg and Spend broke from the outside post, gradually moved up around the far turn, then took off down the stretch to win the Norgor by a 2 3/4 length margin in 1:11 2/5.

A 3-year-old Draconic colt, Spend improved off of his second place finish in the Derby Trial for conditioner Cecil Crabtree. With the winning prize of \$18,622, Spend has now earned in excess of \$96,000 for owners Bob Kellerman and A.D.

Bowen of Ft. Worth.

W.L. Clifton's High Wire Acrobat, ridden by Larry Payne, also attempted some come-from-behind tactics, ending up one length ahead of Blue Hoss, the show horse. William Leach trains High Wire Acrobat, a Miswaki colt. The second-place finish was worth \$8,193.

Blue Hoss earned \$4,469 in third-place money for owners Mol-

lie B. Kelly and Lorann M. Mattox of El Paso. The Winabehn-Johnnie Blue product was ridden by Richard Bickel for trainer Charles W. Mattox.

In the co-feature, the crowd of 4,080 made Josies Super Sound the betting choice at 2-1, and the 5-year-old Super Sound Charge mare opened up a two length lead halfway down the lane. When it was all over, the favorite's lead had been sliced considerably, three


noses hit the wire, but Josies Super Sound emerged on top in front of Sissy Salls and Whata Lucky Jet.

Clarence Scharbauer Jr. of Midland, Texas, owns Josies Super Sound. She was in the hands of Jacky Martin and Jack Brooks, the leading quarter horse rider/trainer team at this point in the season. The win, worth \$7,395 lifted her career moneyline to \$137,000.

The veteran campaigner Sissy Salls, who has been in top form this

summer at Ruidoso, captured the place money. A 6-year-old Master Salls mare, Sissy Salls was ridden by Cord Nix for trainer Rickey Hill, and lessor H.L. Fitzgerald of Leveland, Texas.

Whata Lucky Jet, the third-place finisher, was guided to the wire by Alex Baldillez Jr. Syble Bruney trains the 5-year-old horse for owner M.C. Gist of Andrews, Texas.

## Silent Reflex impresses in Norgor Futurity trial

Freshman phenomenon Silent Reflex, who crushed eight rivals in the Riley Allison Futurity at Sunland Park May 8, burst out of the gate and didn't look back in his division of the Norgor Futurity Trials Friday, winning the 5 1/2 furlong qualifying test by 12 open lengths.

In other racing action, Elans Special triumphed in her 1988 debut, her first start since taking last year's All American Futurity. The millionaire Special Effort filly prevailed by a head, running 400 yards in 20.17 against 3-year-old allowance company.

The first three finishers in the four Norgor trial divisions held Friday qualify for the final, the \$88,000 Norgor Futurity slated for June 19.

A Staunch Avenger 2-year-old, Silent Reflex polished off the distance in 1:06 2/5 without any urging from reinsman Casey Lambert. He left the gate a prohibitive 1-5 favorite, and now has four wins in five lifetime tries. Caroline S. Dodwell trains Silent Reflex for Stepen S. Head of Dallas.

The young gelding has already amassed more than \$126,943 in career earnings.

Tricky Ego, ridden by Carlos Rivas, and Sweet Dealin with Leroy Coombs on board, finished second and third respectively.

The first Norgor division was won by Southern Doyle in 1:06 2/5, with Larry Payne at the helm. The Ballydoyle colt took the victory in a driving finish, passing race favorite Itsaloom and second-choice Bold Approach in deep stretch.

William Leach conditions Southern Doyle for Nance B. Whitehead of Menard, Texas. Bold Approach held on for the place in front of Itsaloom.

Just Like Lace captured the second division in the fastest qualifying time of the afternoon, 1:05 3/5. Leading thoroughbred pilot Mike Lidberg guided the T.E. Davidson-trained filly to the finish line for Tommy Joe Hoyt, of Powderly, Texas. Clever Leader closed with a furious stretch kick to finish second. Pace-setter Legal Ego was third.

The biggest surprise came in the third division, which was won by 14-1 shot Bold Ego Raiser. The Bold Ego colt, ridden by Gary Sumpter, covered the 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:06 3/5. Ralph W. Black Jr. trained the upsetter for owners Joe N. Kidd and Robert Leachman of El Paso. Gent Away, a 36-1 outsider was second. Boldico came in third.

### Perfect Weather For Gerald Tully Roping

These clusters of pearl and white flowers, blooming close together in their cluster atop the stalk, can be seen for miles across the way, shining in the sun, as if they were a lamp, or beacon to the traveler.

On nights of the full moon the yucca blooms catch the golden moonlight, and make you understand why the early Spaniards called them "Las Velas De Dios," (The Candles of God.)

The Yucca promises to be more beautiful this year than in many years. We have a great sense of pride and of gratefulness as we behold our glorious cluster of Yucca blooms cheering us by sunny day and moonlit night.

Let us thank The Lord for the Yucca and all the Children of Mother Earth, and for all our many blessings.

# Retiree committee picks ad agency

In a meeting on Monday, the Retirement Services Division of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce decided on an advertising agency to handle its push to relocate retirees to the Ruidoso area.

In a 5-2 vote, the RSD decided to hire the Prime Design agency, out of Roswell, over the Phil Price

However, Rick Evans, vice-chairman of the RSD, said that because of a prior contractual agreement, the Phil Price agency will be handling the design and printing of a brochure which will be part of the retiree relocation plan. Evans said because the Price agency currently handles chamber advertising, and the RSD received about \$20,000 from the chamber, they are obligated to allow the

Price agency to handle the brochure.

Roy Crocker, chairman of the RSD, said once Prime Design has been notified, talks will begin on designing a theme on which to base the campaign, and a political push will be made to obtain approximately \$20,000 in state matching funds.

John Jeffers, chamber executive director and a member of the committee, emphasized that the

RSD will have final say over the final theme and design of the campaign.

"From A to Z, this committee has total creative control," he said.

The committee will begin its campaign in October with advertisements in several national retiree-oriented magazines and newspapers, and hope to have the first retiree relocation within six months of the ads, and two per month thereafter.



# Airport gets go-ahead for commercial uses

The Sierra Blanca Regional Airport now is open for commercial business as the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) certified the facility for large aircraft.

According to airport manager Tim Morris, FAA issued the certification on June 1, allowing the airport to accept heavier aircraft such as DC 10s and 737s. The certification was the first to be given to the new airports in the FAA southwest district, Morris said.

The certification is based upon a review of an operations manual, which Morris said took him and his staff months to compile, and on-site tours by FAA officials. The operations manual lists emergency response and basic operating procedures. Morris said FAA also was

using new rules for certification and Sierra Blanca Regional Airport is the first to come under these new rules.

Morris presented the certificate to the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission, which met in Ruidoso Village Hall Wednesday.

SBAC also approved the agreement that the Village of Ruidoso will have the option to purchase aircraft sunshades. The sunshades will be constructed with funds from a \$500,000 FAA grant agreement with SBAC, the village of Ruidoso and Lincoln County Commissioners.

The grant was approved last month and was signed at the Wednesday meeting. Lincoln County Commissioners also approved the

grant Wednesday. The funds also will finance construction of security fencing and lighting, paving of taxiways and an equipment maintenance building at the new airport.







The overall budget was adjusted five ways, said Cox. In traffic control the ending balance for 1987-88 was carried over to the 1988-89 budget, the road department would have a cash balance adjusted dependent if anticipated revenues are received by June 30, the funding of the Cog Railway study with \$1,000 from the manager's professional services line item and \$500 from the planning and zoning budget and an adjustment to fund a bailiff for the district court with money coming from a possible surplus on insurance.

Commissioners approved the \$9,034,732 budget for 1988-89.

Other funding requests, which were denied, were made by the Ruidoso Ironhorse Railway, the Retirement Services Division of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, the Ruidoso Care Center and Home Health Care Services.

Commissioners agreed that since so many funds were spent on the cog railway study, (approximately \$40,000 from the state of New Mexico and various private interests) that the additional money to help finance the publishing of the study could benefit the county. The Ironhorse study, which was not funded, is promoting the construction of a narrow gauge modernized steam-look railroad to run on a route similar to the cog railway.

County Clerk Fran Siddens once again requested \$30,000 for legal services in the professional services line item of her 1988-89 budget. She claimed she was frugal in her department expenses this year to cover the large legal fees (\$10,000+) accrued on her behalf.

Siddens claimed the June 1 Supreme Court decision did not settle the issue of who is to pay the fees accrued until the decision to have the District Attorney represent the officials. She requested commissioners approve payment by July 1.

Cox told Siddens that commissioners could make no decisions until their respective attorneys could meet. Siddens replied to commissioners that her Motion to Compel will be heard August 15 in district court.

Cox said the attorneys would try for a settlement before the court date.

Hightower told Siddens that the county would not pay the legal fees until the "court says so."

"You are tying up the budget for a new clerk, I cannot obligate a new clerk's budget, it is not ethical," Siddens said.

The Sierra Blanca Airport Access Road project received approval for change orders concerning the drains, subdrains and excavation. The project is listed for completion by late October. The schedule calls for paving to begin by July 20 and end in mid-September.

When completed the road will be

designated as state Highway 214, as approved by commissioners at the Friday meeting. Road 214 will begin at Highway 380 at the Fort Stanton turnoff, continue past the airport to Highway 48 in Alto, down Highway 48 to Gavilan Canyon. Gavilan will become Road 214 until it joins Highway 70 in Ruidoso.

The county will trade Gavilan Road for the new access road and what is now the rest of Road 214 that runs from the airport turnoff on the Fort Stanton Mesa to Highway 70 at Glencoe or Devil's Canyon. The designation of State Road 214 will occur at the completion of the access road.

In other business commissioners:

—Approved the transfer of ownership of the liquor license of Riverside Lounge to Bonnie and Glenn McDaniel.

—Approved Planning and Zoning recommendations: the final plat for Pine Creek Estates Subdivision, preliminary road acceptance for Raven Ridge Subdivision, replat of Lot 4, Block Y of West Cedar Subdivision, amendment to the disclosure statement for Mountain Lakes Subdivision and the road width variance and design change for Vera Cruz Subdivision contingent to receiving affidavits from all lot owners stating approval of the roads.

—Awarded bids for 100 tons scrap iron to BC Pipe and Steel for \$2,003, 1982 Dodge Truck to Means Motor Supply for \$425, 1965 Broom Broce to Borderland Steel for \$1,121, an International backhoe to Kent Jones for \$3,341 and a Caterpillar to McCarty Construction for \$15,000.

—Reappointed Kay Dennis, Caroline Cantrell and Rich Sealey to the Lodgers' Tax Committee for two-year terms.

—Approved the projects for the New Mexico State Highway Cooperative Program for the Fort Stanton Road, the Fort Stanton Mesa Road and the Transwestern Road, a school bus route.

—Approved the legal fee agreement with A.J. Ferrara as attorney for the Board of Commissioners not to exceed three years nor the sum of \$20,000.

—Tabled the request for office space for a juvenile probation officer by District Judge Richard Parsons until space can be arranged.

—Approved a \$3,000 purchase agreement with the Village of Carrizozo for the IBM computer equipment no longer needed by the county when the new computer equipment is installed.

## Youths blamed for 'rash' of crimes

"We've had a rash of juveniles committing crimes," said Detective Mike Lovelace of the Ruidoso Police Department.

Ruidoso Police have arrested 30 juveniles in the past 30 days, according to police records. Children involved in the incidents have ranged from 7 to 17 years old. All the young offenders were turned over to juvenile authorities, said police.

Children's Probation Office, in its monthly report, showed that 36 juveniles were referred during May, for 85 offenses and 64 delinquent acts. That's way over most months. For instance in April, 10 juveniles were referred on 12 offenses and 11

delinquent acts; and in March the number of juveniles was nine for 15 offenses and 14 delinquent acts.

Detective Lanny Maddox said he arrested four local youths last week and solved several burglaries reported in 1987.

Maddox said he obtained statements from two 15-year-old males and two 17-year-old males, and charged the two 15-year-olds and one 17-year-old with burglary and one 17-year-old with larceny.

Maddox said a police investigation developed evidence that prompted him to call in the suspects. All four confessed, said Maddox.

He said some missing property was recovered.

In a separate incident, five El Paso, Texas, youths were arrested

in Ruidoso when police received information the vehicle they were in had been reported stolen from El Paso.

One 12-year-old female, a 16-year-old female, a 16-year-old male and two 17-year-old males were taken to the juvenile detention center in Carrizozo, according to police. All but the 12-year-old have been released to parents or guardians. Police said the 12-year-old girl is a ward of the State of California.

According to police, property reported missing from a Ruidoso cabin was recovered.

Other cases involving area youth have included five incidents where juveniles were charged with "allowing self to be served."

A 7-year-old was charged with breaking and entering.

An 8-year-old is charged with breaking and entering.

A 10-year-old was charged with breaking and entering, and a different 10-year-old was charged with burglary.

One 11-year-old was charged with criminal damage to property, and two different 11-year-olds were charged in two separate burglary cases.

A 12-year-old was charged with criminal trespass.

A 13-year-old was charged with two counts of burglary.

One 14-year-old and one 17-year-old have been charged with larceny.

A 17-year-old was arrested on a contempt warrant.

## Car removed from lake

An undisclosed Ruidoso juvenile had a wet ride Sunday morning as she and her 1981 Subaru sedan found themselves in the Grindstone Canyon Reservoir.

According to Ruidoso Police reports, the immersed car was reported by passersby at the reservoir Sunday at 10:53 a.m. Police responded and had the car pulled out by 11:30 a.m. also on Sunday.

According to Ruidoso police officer Robert Achterberg the juvenile was driving around the reservoir at 4 a.m. Sunday. He said the driver

stated she saw the water but was unable to stop. The car skidded 60 feet before impacting the water then floated out 30 more feet before sinking.

Achterberg declined to give the juvenile's name or the citations charged. He did say that "many open alcohol containers" were present in the car.

Achterberg warns everyone not to drive into the dam area now as it is still private property. He added that the gates are scheduled to be replaced to keep people out.

## Forest Service issues fire use restrictions

The Lincoln National Forest has issued a campfire and smoking restriction effective today (Monday), June 13.

Steve Makowski, of the Smokey Bear Ranger Station, said the restriction means that open fires will be allowed only in designated campgrounds, and they must be within a fire ring. He also said that smoking must be done within an enclosed vehicle, a designated

campground or in an area where grass and debris have been cleared down to dirt in a three-foot diameter circle. Propane stoves will be allowed.

Makowski said that the restriction will be in effect until the forest receives "a significant amount of rain that covers the general area," which could be until the rainy season in mid-July.

An account has been established at Ruidoso State Bank to help defray medical expenses of Joe Winfield, the son of area residents Junior and Winnie Winfield.

Joe Winfield is in the Ruidoso Care Center, according to his father.

## Committees report at Economic Dev. Corp. meeting

The Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County held a combined general membership and board meeting Thursday night.

The meeting was held to provide information from each of the corporation's committees, and to allow general members to ask questions about the operations of the committees.

Ronnie Paulger, chairman of the budget committee, reported that to date, the EDC had \$28,992.71 in its account.

He said that the EDC has "taken a real conservative position" in its expenditures, and that ultimately the corporation will hire a full-time budget director and secretary which will cost approximately \$47,500 in salary. He also said that expenditures are expected to reach \$18,000 for travel and advertising, \$7,985 for printing costs, and \$5,000 for necessary office equipment.

Paulger explained that the EDC includes every community in Lincoln County, plus the Lincoln County Commissioners and the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce as members.

He said the EDC had run into some problems when it went to each community and asked for a certain percentage of its budget to be given to the corporation. So the

Lincoln County Commissioners helped the EDC come up with an alternate solution, which was to request passage of a one half mil levy, he said.

If the levy passes, homeowners will pay an additional tax of 50 cents for every \$1,000 of appraised property value. For example, if a property is valued at \$20,000, the tax increase would be \$10.

"The proof is going to be in the pudding," he said, explaining that because the levy is subject to yearly approval, he feels that the EDC shouldn't have any problem getting re-funded if it shows that it is doing something, and has results to show each year.

Dorothy Smith, of the Research Committee, reported that her committee has been working to put together resource and labor information about the county, which will include information about energy, water, gross receipts, and other relevant community information.

She said her committee has asked the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology in Socorro to provide county resource information, and New Mexico State University in Las Cruces to provide labor statistics for the county.

A suggestion was made by one of the members that labor information could possibly also be obtained from the Robert O. Anderson School of Management at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque.

Dr. William A. Harrison, of the Communications Committee, reported that his committee was busy formulating two brochures for the EDC. The main thrust of their work, he said, is going toward the publication of a high quality packet that can be sent to key personnel of businesses that show a genuine interest in coming to New Mexico. He said that since the packets will cost approximately \$4 to produce, only sincere inquiries will be sent a packet.

"This isn't something you are going to find at the local grocery store," Harrison said.

He did say, however, that a "throw-away" pamphlet will be produced for placement in typical high traffic areas in Ruidoso.

He also asked for donations of photographs depicting Lincoln County for the packet.

Roy Seay, of the Business Expansion and Retention Committee, announced that his committee members will be making a drive to visit existing businesses, which is a requirement for accreditation in Santa Fe.

The existing business "is the bird in the hand," he said, adding that during the visits, the business owners will be given a packet containing an EDC membership application.

The committee has made 15 calls so far, and hopes to make 25 more by the end of the month, he

said. Finally, the Prospect/Contact committee, chaired by Don Shaw, announced that its purpose was "to seek out businesses that will increase the economic activity in Lincoln County."

Shaw said that the committee has already initiated out-of-state business contacts, and will begin to visit some of the companies soon.

He also said that a big part of his time has been spent on getting that EDC ready for state certification.

Some of the requirements for state certification, he said, are the adoption of a development and business expansion program, the gathering and compiling of community information and the recruitment of out-of-state industries.


The EDC has been placed on the state's prospect mailing list, which means that once a week, Shaw receives a list of businesses that have shown interest in relocating to the state.

This list is a real asset, he said, because in the past, Lincoln County seems to have been neglected by the big business.

"Lincoln County has been the orphan child of the state of New Mexico," he said, adding that the list will enable the county to contact businesses that may not have otherwise had a chance to hear about Lincoln County.

## Eye On The Capitol

### "HOW MUCH IS ENOUGH?"

Not enough. The candidate was in a huff. The KOAT(TV7)-Zia Research Associates poll showed him losing badly.

You only polled 250 people, he complained. That's not enough.

The proverbial question: how much is enough?

Tom Rehfeld, President of Zia, notes the question of sample size boils down to three factors:

- (1) the degree of confidence required
- (2) the degree of precision sought
- (3) the consequences of the decisions that might be made based on the results.

Let's say the candidate got 25% of the vote, and that we polled 200 people. How sure are we that 25% is "right"?

A technical question.

This is the technical answer:

The formula for determining the error margin is the square root of  $p$  times  $(100 - p)$  over the number of people polled. Here  $p = 25$ ,  $(100 - p)$  is 75, and  $N$  is 200.

What you end up with is the number, 3.06186. That's your plus-or-minus margin of error at a confidence level of 68%.

In plain old English: suppose there were 100 polling firms, and each did a poll on our friend, using a sample of 200. 68 of the 100 polls would show him within plus-or-minus 3.06186 of 25%, or somewhere between 22% to 28%.

Only 68% confident? As Rehfeld notes, you can increase that to 95% simply by doubling the margin of error, roughly to plus-or-minus 6%. That means if the 100 polling companies did their thing, 95 of them would show the candidate at 25% plus-or-minus 6%, or between 19% to 31%.

Beware: that's all theory. How does it come out in practice?

George Gallup, the father of modern polling, said

it is essential to distinguish between theory and practice. Probability tables are based upon mathematical theory. In actual survey work, these tables prove an important guide, but they can't be applied too literally...

The theoretical error...can be used only as a guide. The expected errors in most surveys are usually somewhat larger. (George Gallup, *The Sophisticated Poll Watcher's Guide*, Princeton Opinion Press, 1976, pp. 68, 71).

Oh, oh. You mean the plus-or-minus 6% error margin noted above is really too small?

Is the complaining candidate right?

The theory noted above assumes the 200 people were polled at random. That means everyone had an equal chance of being polled, and each selection of a person was independent of any other person. Thus, it would be possible (although not probable) that everyone polled lived

in one precinct.

There are ways of reducing the margin below what random sampling allows. Gallup mentions one: "In actual survey practice, sample design elements tend to reduce the range of error as does stratification" (p. 71).

Zia stratifies its statewide sample geographically. Grant County Republicans, for example, are 1% of all Republicans. The May, Zia statewide survey of Republicans was 300. 1% of 300 = 3 surveys of Grant County Republicans. Because of stratification in the sample design, that quantity of 3 wasn't left to pure chance, as in a random survey.

Back to our friend, the candidate, and his complaint. Wouldn't increasing the sample size improve the accuracy of the poll? Yes, but not as much as he'd like to think.

George Gallup did an experiment in the 1930's on the National Recovery Act:

Survey results were tabulated as the ballots from all areas of the U.S. were returned. The figures below are those actually obtained as each lot of new ballots was tabulated.

First 500	54.9%
First 1,000	53.9%
First 5,000	55.4%
First 10,000	55.4%
First 30,000	55.5%

From these results it can be seen that if only 500 ballots had been received, the figures would have differed little from the final result. In fact, the greatest differences found in the whole series is only 1.6 percentage points from the final result. (P.70)

Or, as Tom Rehfeld puts it, "When they do a blood test, they don't take out all the blood. Only a small amount is needed."

I fear our candidate friend discovered that fact on election night. They only took a little. But it must have felt like a lot.

On the other side of the coin, big surveys don't always yield accurate results.

In 1936, *The Literary Digest* mailed out 10,000,000 post card ballots, or to about one family in three. 2,376,523 people returned them.

The *Digest* poll was on the upcoming presidential election. The results of the two million responses? Landon whipped Roosevelt, 57% to 43%.

Prior to the election, George Gallup wrote a newspaper article, contending the *Digest's* methodology and results were wrong. The *Digest* was outraged: "Our fine

statistical friend (George Gallup) should be advised that the *Digest* would carry on with those old fashioned methods that have produced correct forecasts exactly one hundred percent of the time."

The actual 1936 election results: 62.5% for Roosevelt.

"The failure of polls to have the winning candidate ahead in final results," Gallup wrote, "is seldom due to the failure of the poll to include enough persons in its sample. Other factors are likely to prove to be far more important..." (p.67).

We provide shelter, have an on-going counseling program for victims, and through generous contributions from the community, are able to fill a need for victims of domestic violence.

Since April 1987, we have operated as a satellite program under the Refuge, a similar group from Roswell. We chose to do this only for insurance coverage reasons. Aside from insurance, our program was securely in place and operating, well before this merge. Long before our association with Roswell, we had become a model for programs throughout the state, because of dedicated volunteers, a willing police department, and various concerned entities.

We have, as of May 1988,

dropped all affiliations with Roswell, as well as their local coordinator. We chose to do this as we felt we needed more decision-making ability in such matters as labor costs vs. client care and community education.

We have our core of volunteers in place and actively on duty. We are using the same number (257-7365) which goes into the Police Department and is dispatched from there. All procedures will remain the same.


I feel that this step we took is a very positive one for our community. We live here in Lincoln County, our concerns are here; we feel we can better judge and fill the needs of victims of domestic violence here - as opposed to a distant board and shelter 70 miles away.

Lastly, we feel that the monies and services people so graciously extend to this program, should remain here, with the people it was intended for.

I am, at this time, thanking the entire community for past support of this program and am asking for continued support of this locally run and funded program.

The following is the 1988-89 Budget Message:  
**1988-89 BUDGET MESSAGE**

**I. FISCAL YEAR 1987-88**

The 1987-88 budget for Lincoln County was the largest budget managed in the history of the county. We met our financial goals and, even in a time of low interest rates, earned the amount of interest we had projected on county monies.

The overall budget for 1987-88 was \$14,524,631. The General Fund expenses totalled \$2,227,136. Road Fund Monies in 1987-88 totalled \$779,085.

There were two large projects implemented and completed by the county in the 1987-88 budget period. \$3,421,300 was funded and disbursed for completion of the Alto Paving Assessment District. This was the result of a cooperative effort between the Alto District and the County Commission. The Commission directed that as many jobs as possible be awarded to county residents, and that materials be purchased within the county whenever possible.

The Sierra Blanca Access Road construction was started in this fiscal year. \$6,455,000 was funded for the project. The Commission was instrumental in securing a \$6,000,000 construction grant to fund the airport. Once again, local labor and materials were used and proceeds therefrom were cycled into the local economy.

We received State and Federal funding to complete the following road work: Cedar Creek; County Roads B018, B019 and B020 (in the Hondo area); County Road E031 near Corona; Oscuro Road leading to White Sands Missile Range; Transwestern Road; and Eldridge Road. These were cooperative agreements with the State of New Mexico, and Lincoln County has been reimbursed \$193,690.92. In addition, there is another \$50,000 the county stands to receive through these co-op agreements.

The county worked during this budgetary period to see the completion of the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport project, which totalled \$8,384,000 in funding. The county had to pass a 1 mil levy to secure matching funds for a Federal grant, and Commissioners specified that any monies collected through this levy but not needed for the Airport would then be used for courthouse improvements. This excess totals approximately \$70,000, which has been reflected in the 1988-89 budget.

It is worth mentioning that the Commission has the option to continue this 1 mil levy into the 1988-89 tax period, but declined to do so.

During fiscal year 1987-88, Lincoln County received a Historical Grant Study (a Community Block Grant) for \$25,000 to consider restoration possibilities for Ft. Stanton. Commissioners specified that any planning must take into account the function of the Ft. Stanton Hospital and Training Center already utilizing the grounds and facilities.

A Land Use Plan was started this year to provide for orderly growth in the county. This plan is still being designed and will be instrumental in the economic development of Lincoln County.

During 1987-88, Commissioners helped to restore the Human Services and Food Stamps office to the county, also providing office space for the New Mexico Health and Environment Department here. This service saves needy people a 100+ mile round trip to Roswell or Alamogordo to implement their human service needs.

The county received \$33,552 in the form of an Emergency Medical Service Grant to help facilitate our ambulance system. The county now supports seven ambulances and is a model system throughout the State of New Mexico. We have purchased a new advanced life support system for the vehicle serving the west side of Lincoln County.

Commissioners have allowed county EMS personnel to travel to other counties and provide assistance for them to upgrade their own systems to our standards.

The Commission is working on and supporting the possibility of the Farm and Ranch Heritage Center being established at Ft. Stanton. \$2500 has been allocated in the 88-89 budget for this purpose. Commissioners feel that the Heritage Center could promote tourism and also preserve the county's historical legacy, thus serving the dual purpose of providing recreational activity and also providing education to Lincoln County visitors and residents alike. The county was awarded a State and Federal grant to upgrade the Fairground Rodeo Area during the 87-88 fiscal year. The amount was \$10,000.

Applied for Federal EDA Grant for the Sierra Blanca Airport water system in the amount of \$1,406,585. Matching funds for this will come from an appropriation from the Legislature.

The county also purchased a larger computer system than it had previously, to better accommodate record keeping. The new computer cost the same as the previous one, but will be less costly to maintain and has a much larger storage capacity.

Commissioners worked with Steve Keller of the Lincoln County Medical Center in order to disburse funds for the hospital that were raised through a previous mill levy. This mill levy is for capital improvements for the hospital.

The Board of Finance and the Lincoln County Treasurer worked together towards investing all county monies in accounts and reaping maximum interest on these funds. All monies were secured according to State statutes.

Lincoln County has been involved in several lawsuits with respect to water rights. Commissioners provided funding to protect the county's interest in the El Paso and Mescalero water suits, being cognizant of the fact that water is an essential resource to the county's economic development and the quality of life and livelihood of its residents.

As a point of information, because these figures are not clear in the budget print-outs, I would like to report on fees paid to Gary C. Mitchell, acting as Lincoln County Attorney during the 1987-88 fiscal year. Mr. Mitchell was paid:

- \$21,395.00 for county business
  - \$22,629.64 for litigation
  - \$11,158.70 for the Mescalero Water Lawsuit, with a portion of this figure being paid to expert witnesses
  - \$55,183.34 TOTAL paid to Mitchell in 1987-88
- However, we expect recovery for the cases Mr. Mitchell has represented us in. The 1987-88 total for this is:
- \$ 2,257.65 Miscellaneous litigation settlements
  - \$80,000.00 Forthcoming tax settlement
  - \$50,000.00 Forthcoming settlements
  - \$132,257.00 TOTAL Settlements

These figures show that, after Mr. Mitchell has been paid for his services, the county is approximately \$77,073.66 ahead.

Also provided in the 1987-88 budget under State and Federal regulations was courses offered to county employees for their benefits, such as use of hazardous materials, etc. A safety program was implemented and courses have been, and are being, offered to employees. Recent courses include Defensive Driving and CPR.

**II. FISCAL YEAR 1988-89**

The 1988-89 Budget requests are made by the Elected Officials, Department Heads and other Agencies and relay a message of the needs of the office they represent.

In this proposed budget, a 3% salary increase was included for all employees.

The 1 mil levy was passed last year to help secure a Federal grant for the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport, and will not be continued in 1988-89, by mandate of the Lincoln County Commissioners. Part of the mil levy will be used to repair one of the courthouse boilers, and replace another.

The largest increases in expenditures for the 1988-89 budget is in the lines of insurance costs and telephone bills.

Lincoln County will receive Federal and State funds for a new position and expenses for a Civil Defense Hazmat Emergency Medical Services Director. This position was created to comply with State and Federal mandates.

Another new position was recommended by the county Planning and Zoning Commission to hire an Enforcement Officer-Building Inspector to ensure compliance of proposed county building ordinances. As of July 1, 1988, the State of New Mexico will no longer provide building inspection and enforcement, and this responsibility will be incurred by the county.

The county Planning and Zoning Commission is currently working on a County Land Use Plan that will be implemented during the 1988-89 budgetary period. The Enforcement Officer-Building Inspector position will be partially funded from fees collected for building inspection.

Road projects funded for the 1988-89 fiscal year include: Ft. Stanton Road; The upper end of Transwestern Road; and replacement of the Picacho Bridge and the Glencoe Bridge.

Not all requests from individuals and organizations were included in the 1988-89 budget. These requests were listed in a memorandum dated 12 May, 1988. If Commissioners wish to fund any or all of these requests, cuts will have to be made from various departments to do so.

This budget as presented gives Commissioners, Elected Officials and Department Heads the maximum amount that can be expended in 1988-89. I'm pleased to report that we have not had to cut back any employees, and that the budget does show a slight growth.

There is a 5.4% growth in funds budgeted for the General Fund. The 1987-88 budget required \$2,227,136; the 1988-89 budget calls for \$2,347,376.

The Road Fund has also been increased, by 7.5%. The 1987-88 budget showed \$779,085 for roads. The 1988-89 budget lists \$838,140.
