Officials: Concrete pour killed 3,200 fish in river

More than 3,200 fish reportedly were killed on June 1, in a 7/10-mile stretch of the Rio Ruidoso between the second bridge and the North Loop Road bridge.

According to a news release from the New Mexico Game and Fish Department, criminal and civil action is being pursued against the owner of B&L Masonry as a result of that fish kill. "District wildlife supervisor Pat Barncastle said a preliminary investigation showed that employees of B&L Masonry received 10 yards of concrete from a ready-mix concrete truck for a retaining wall poured near, and possibly into, the river. The wet concrete may have released lethal toxicants into the river," continued the release.

"We are certain that the concrete poured into the river is what killed the fish," said fisheries biologist Miles McInnis, who did a site investigation after receiving reports from Upper Canyon residents of the hundreds of dead and dying rainbow and brown trout.

McInnis said he took counts above and below the affected area to determine the loss, and then turned the information over to the law enforcement division of Game and Fish. Their investigation is currently under way.

"We feel we're very accurate in this count," said McInnis, and Barncastle agreed. McInnis said each fish is estimated to be worth \$2 in civil value by the state, with that amount the standard civil

damage assessment in such cases.

Environmental Improvement Division (EID) staff also were called to the scene, and have begun monitoring the chemical conditions in that part of the river.

"It's pretty much back to normal," said Jim Edwards of the local EID office. He said he will continue to monitor pH and turbidity levels.

"We're continuing to stock the river," said McInnis, estimating it will take a couple of months before the river is back to normal. He said the Rio Ruidoso has traditionally provided good fishing, running over 4,000 fish per mile above the impacted area.

Barncastle said the incident began with a retaining wall construction project on the Trigger Phillips property. Retaining walls in and around the river require a village building permit and a 404B authorization obtained through the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Building Inspector Jimmy Neeley, contacted Friday, said the property owner did not have a permit to begin the construction. Neeley, upon a report from a neighbor, visited the site about 11 a.m. June 8, and "red tagged" the project, the normal procedure to call a halt to a construction project.

"I warned them verbally about building in the river," said Neeley, adding the construction crews immediately complied with his red tag and moved their equipment off the job.

Jim Wood, a biologist with the regulatory branch of the Corps of

Engineers, said he also was called to the site.

"I determined the work was a violation of Section 404," said Wood, who sent a letter to the property owner, ordering that work stop until he gathers further information. Wood said he'll determine if the work that's already been done will have to be removed or if the applicant will be eligible for authorization under Section 404.

Wood remarked that anyone planning to do any work in or around the river is required to obtain authorization through his office in Albuquerque.

Neeley noted he would have informed the applicant for a village building permit that the 404B authorization was needed before he could issue the local permit. As of Friday afternoon the project was still stopped, said Neeley.


"As far as I'm concerned, they cannot work up there until they bring plans, a current survey and a (404) Corps permit," said Neeley.

Efforts by The News to contact B&L Masonry and Trigger Phillips were unsuccessful. The telephone number listed in the local directory for the contracting company was listed as "not in service" by a telephone company recording, and the directory assistance operator said there is no new listing under that name.

Calls to the Phillips residence on Bradford Lane were unanswered; however, it was learned that Phillips is a part-time Ruidoso resident, and lives in Midland, Texas. The directory assistance operator in Midland had no listing.

Business regs meant to restrict improper merchant practices

Ruidoso merchants want to know how a new ordinance will impact the way they display their wares and do business in the village.

During a meeting Thursday at Village Hall, 10 business operators and a half dozen members of village staff exchanged information and discussed changes to the ordinance regulating business licensing and outdoor displays.

Village manager Frank Potter

stressed how a new regulation was drafted to cut down on businesses coming in and out of the village taking revenues from legitimate business operators.

But merchants wanted to know more about how that ordinance addresses outdoor displays.

"How much display are we going to be allowed?" asked an audience member.

Assistant village attorney Mike Runnels said outdoor displays are permitted on permanent businesses as long as they don't create a hazard, obstruct public right of way

or impede traffic.

"We're talking about sales from permanent buildings," said Runnels, stressing that businesses in permanent locations, with current registration and having displays that don't obstruct traffic can continue to hang merchandise outside. "Nobody's going to be cited unless they're obstructing the sidewalk," he added.

"We all know of one store that's got dresses hanging and you've got to duck and dodge to pass them,"

McSween 'mini-dig' set for July

The McSween dig in Lincoln will go on this summer, thanks to matching grants from Human Systems Research (HSR) and the Lincoln County Heritage Trust (LCHT).

According to David Kirkpatrick, HSR archaeological consultant, donations from various individuals over the last year prompted HSR to

approach the trust with a proposal for matching funds.

Bob Hart of LCHT affirmed the grant of matching funds which bring a total of \$3,400 to continue the dig for approximately a week.

Kirkpatrick said HSR still is under contract with the dig sponsors New Mexico Monuments, the Museum of New Mexico and LCHT. The state monuments owns the property on which the McSween dig lies. The "mini-dig," as coordinators

are calling it, will happen in late July, with the dig open during the Lincoln Pageant, the first weekend in August. Kirkpatrick said that his people, which include several volunteers, will continue the trench begun last year to find the house wall. They also plan to explore the south bank of the Rio Bonito for any debris that might have come from the McSween house.

The McSween dig began in 1986, funded solely by LCHT. This year,

for undisclosed reasons, LCHT decided it could not continue to solely finance the project, Hart said.

During the Lincoln Pageant visitors will have a chance to view and discuss the dig once again, Kirkpatrick said.

As HSR is a public non-profit organization, Kirkpatrick said that anyone wishing to make donations for the dig will receive tax-deductible receipts.

Clever Leader outsmarts field for \$88,000 Norgor Futurity win

When the bets were down, Sunday's crowd of 3,818 at Ruidoso Downs made a freshman phenomenon Silent Reflex one of the heaviest favorites of the season in the \$88,000 Norgor Futurity. But when the race was over, 10-1 shot Clever Leader, ridden by Salustio Burgos, occupied the winner's circle.

By a twist of fate, Burgos got a last minute call to ride Clever Leader after the 2-year-old colt's jockey, Bo White, suffered a shoulder injury earlier in the day.

"He was good out of the gate, but then he started to drop back, and when I hit him he dropped back more," said Burgos.

"I decided to just let him run and when he came around the turn I knew he was a winner. Every time his hooves hit the ground he

just gave more and more."

Despite the tough competition, Clever Leader's owner, W.L. Clifton Jr., of Waco, Texas, had confidence in his entry. "If you look back at this horse's charts," Clifton said, "he's gotten better the longer we've taken him."

Clever Leader, a Clever Trick-Cheerleader product, is trained by William Leach. The colt covered the 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:05 3/5. It was Clever Leader's second career

victory in five lifetime starts. The winning share of the Norgor purse, \$44,003, lifted his lifetime moneyline to more than \$52,000.

Bold Approach, who set the track record for 4 1/2 furlongs earlier in the season, found the sizzling pace established by Silent Reflex and Just Like Lace to his liking. The 2-year-old Bolductive colt came from far back and slid past them along the rail to finish second.

David Lidberg rode Bold Approach for owners Delton R. and Betty L. Dodd of Roswell, New Mexico. T.E. Davidson conditions the 2-year-old. The second-place paycheck was worth \$19,361.

Just Like Lace, who battled it out on the front end against 1-5 favorite Silent Reflex, held on for third. A Bold Gun filly, Just Like Lace also hails from T.E. Davidson's barn. The third-place cut of the purse came to \$10,560 for

owner Tommy Joe Hoyt of Powderly, Texas. Mike Lidberg was in the irons.

The rest of the 1988 Norgor Futurity field came in as follows: Silent Reflex, Itsaloom, Bold Ego Raiser, Legal Ego, Sweet Dealin, Boldico, Tricky Ego, Southern Doyle and Gent Away.

Racing resumes Thursday with a 14-race schedule, including nine divisions of Rainbow Derby trials. First post is 12:30 p.m.



Waldo W. Morgan conditioned Billy Waddell for his first training victory of the season. The horse is owned by his namesake, Billy J. Waddell, and Joe B. Bates Jr. of Odessa, Texas. The winning cut of the purse was worth \$6,585.

Imarealeasterbunny closed gamely in the middle of the track to finish second with Mike Lidberg up. T.E. Davidson trains the 5-year-old Bunny Bid mare. Davidson and Carol A. Jones of Amarillo, Texas, share ownership rights.

Quickie Quick, who set a new Ruidoso Downs track record for 5 1/2 furlongs this year, finished third. Pedro Benitez was in the irons for trainer Fred Danley. Quickie Quick is owned by Robert F. Haynsworth, Edwin S. Mayer Jr. and Phillip Mote of San Angelo, Texas.

In the 6 furlong Mescalero Apache Handicap, reinsman Joe

Martinez and Si A Bit stalked the pace-setters to mid-stretch, nipping Big Bold Boz by a nose at the wire. Si A Bit, a 6-year-old gelding by Nordic Prince, is trained by Charles W. Mattox for Mollie B. Kelly and Larann M. Mattox of El Paso, Texas.

First-place purse money came to \$7,035, lifting Si A Bit's career moneyline to almost \$35,000. The winning time for the six panel contest was 1:09 4/5, 2/5 seconds shy of the track record.

Last year's local sprint champion Big Bold Boz, ridden by Mike Lidberg, had company his whole journey, got a head in front 30 yards before the wire, but failed to hold off Si A Bit in the last jump. T.E. Davidson owns and trains the 4-year-old Bold Ego gelding.

Ruffetta, with Glen Murphy in the irons, held on for a third-place finish. Doyal Roberts trains the 5-year-old Sharpen Up mare for owner Lloyd Woodward of Odessa, Texas.

Water rights case judge may step down

When the ongoing water case involving water right owners throughout the Hondo Basin goes back to court, a new judge may be hearing the case.

Retired State Supreme Court Justice LaPel Oman, appointed for the L.T. Lewis adjudication, announced on May 24 he does not expect to be on the case for more than a few more days, according to the Water Defense Association (WDA) newsletter.

Justice Oman made his announcement before granting a motion by attorneys for the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe and the United States to decide the Mescalero claims before the completion of the inter sese determination of the non-Indian priorities.

According to information provided by the WDA, that organization had prevailed against the mo-

tion on two other instances.

WDA was given until August 26 to file findings and conclusions and simultaneous briefs-in-chief, and until October 14 to file simultaneous reply briefs.

Justice Oman is expected to decide the Mescalero rights by the end of the year, according to WDA.

Further phases of the trial will not resume until after those matters are completed.

WDA, made up of individuals and municipalities with water rights throughout the stream system, is objecting to claims by the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe to as much as 18,000-acre-feet in additional water rights.

Members of WDA, on May 22, elected a new slate of officers. Members of the board of directors include: Leonard McCutcheon,

Jenny Ortiz and Dub Williams—Rio Ruidoso; David Lee, Fred Pfingsten and Lincoln McTeigue—Rio Bonito; Phelps Anderson, Gloria Mendiola and Dr. Walter Hopkins—Rio Hondo; Tom McNeil—Village of Ruidoso; LeVerne Cole—Village of Ruidoso Downs; Benny Coker—Village of Capitan; Robert Owen—City of Roswell; and Ralph Dunlap—Lincoln County.





said Runnels. "You don't want a flea market atmosphere around Ruidoso," he added. "It's not so much that we think it's attractive; it's effective," said shop owner Mac McDougal. Runnels contrasted displaying outdoors with selling from outdoors, such as sales from parking lots and tents. Potter said the problem village staff encountered, mainly through complaints from members of the public, was people setting up in parking lots or selling from vehicles. He said the regulation was drafted to put a stop to itinerant businesses coming in for the weekend and leaving without registering or paying local fees or state taxes, not to hamper local business operations.

"We had people zipping in and out of here and they were carrying megabucks out of town," said Potter, noting that practice isn't so easy now. He said itinerant merchants must pay a \$100 fee for their first day of business, and \$25 a day for the next five days. He said they must then start over, with their fees computing to about the cost of renting a building for a month. The first business owner affected by the new regulations did just that—he rented a building and registered as a permanent business, said Potter.

Describing changes in the economy that led to the adoption of the stricter ordinance, Potter said there were 1,050 registered businesses in the village in 1983, and just 676 in 1988. Add to that a number of vacant buildings, noted Potter. "We decided to try to get a hand-

le on some of these things," said Potter. With the new ordinance operators must have a bona fide business registration with a specific address.

"City hall is very pro-business," said Potter. During a meeting of the Ruidoso Village Council last week, Runnels put everyone on notice that the business registration ordinance will be enforced. That's why merchants wanted to know, not only what the ordinance says, but what it means.

Runnels explained if a business owner doesn't have a permanent building and a permanent business, that person won't be able to open up shop from a truck in a parking lot or on the streets. Anyone doing business in the village will be expected to make application at village hall.

Fire report lists 3 fires in May

The Ruidoso Fire Department responded to two structure fires and one dumpster fire during the month of May. According to a report prepared by Fire Chief Virgil Reynolds, village property owners suffered an estimated \$50,000 in losses from fires. Property loss outside the village limits was listed at \$5,000. Village firefighters responded to a total of 22 calls, including four smoke calls and two accidents with injuries. They reportedly spent a total of 45 man hours in service. Fire Department personnel spent 35 hours in training, seven hours conducting school fire drills and 12 hours doing inspections, during May. Reynolds reported his department has a three-minute response time within village limits.






Judge Cupp remembered in FOP presentation







Eye On The Capitol

"Election Review: Finding Big Mo"

Who is Big Mo? The week before the election, The Albuquerque Tribune raised the issue. Reporter Scott Sandlin wrote on page one: "Senate and congressional candidates in New Mexico this year are finding it hard to tether an elusive prey: The Big Mo. Momentum. A mandate from the people. Everybody wants it.

Nobody seems to have it, polls indicate. There were some bewildering poll results for the Democratic primary in the first congressional district:

Albuquerque Journal (April 19-24) Baca 22%, Udall 11%, Madrid 16%, Gallegos 7%, Undecided 27%.

KOAT-Zia (April 27-May 2) Baca 17% Udall 8%, Madrid 17%, Gallegos 7%, Undecided 32%.

KOAT-Zia (mid-May) Baca 15%, Udall 16%, Madrid 14%, Gallegos 10%, Undecided 26%.

KGGM (mid-May/post Zia) Baca 13%, Udall 13%, Madrid 12%, Gallegos 6%, Undecided 37%.

Journal (May 25-June 1) Baca 19%, Udall 15%, Madrid 14%, Gallegos 7%, Undecided 31%.

KOAT-Zia (May 31-June 6) Baca 23%, Udall 15%, Madrid 19%, Gallegos 7%, Undecided 17%.

On May 3, I presented the earliest KOAT-Zia poll on TV, and noted the percentages were misleading. As Eye on The Capitol observed a week later (May 10):

"Percentages in polls for primaries can be exceedingly deceptive. . . In 1984, the Democrat primary for Lujan's seat had a turnout of 42,000 people. The [Zia] poll put Lenton Mairy at 9%, or 8% behind Baca and Madrid.

8% sounds insurmountable. Translated into actual people, however, it's only 3,360. A traffic jam in Baca's or Madrid's support area can make that difference dissolve in a few hours."

I also stated on KOAT that the undecideds were high in people aged 65 and over. Whoever carries that group, I argued, will win. Eye on The Capitol repeated that position on May 10.

Soon after that, Tom Udall began a saturated media campaign in which he focused on crime, a major preoccupation of the elderly. Another Udall TV ad featured Claude Pepper, U.S. Representative and well-known advocate for senior citizens.

The mid-May Zia poll confirmed that Udall's appeals to people 65 and over were paying off. "Tom Udall shows a dramatic rise since the Zia April 27-May 2 poll," I noted in a May 25th report to KOAT. "His media blitz apparently is working. . . Udall's strength is that he runs better among Anglos, and people 65 and over (20%). . .

Our [first] survey showed the 65-plus group was especially worried about crime. Udall's TV ad on drugs may have been especially effective in the regard." That night, KOAT reported most of those findings over the air.

Our final Zia poll in June showed the continuing success of Udall's effort to convert the elderly. Among people 65 and over, Udall was now receiving 28% of their vote, compared to 15% overall.

"The age and ethnic characteristics of the 'undecideds,' I wrote in a June 6th report to KOAT, "are closer to Udall's base of supporters [i.e., Anglos and people over 65]. Consequently, when they decide, he will get a disproportionate share of them."

Here are the final unofficial results for all ten Democratic contenders:

Tom Udall: 13,966
Jim Baca: 11,703
Patricia Madrid: 11,170
Steve Gallegos: 8,620
Lenton Mairy: 4,522
Manny Garcia: 2,161
Steven Kramer: 1,030
Alan Reed: 770
William Orona: 423

Udall won with 25% of the vote. Compare that to the 15% for him shown in the KOAT-Zia June pre-election poll. How did he manage to rise 10%?

Of course, the 15%-figure could have been wrong. Please note, however, that the last four polls had Udall at about that amount. It's unlikely (although possible) that all four surveys were wrong.

"First, as I've indicated, Udall grabbed a disproportionate share of the 17% undecideds when they made up their minds. But I doubt he took over half of them.

He didn't have to. There was another, unforeseen source of Udall support.

"Eye on election day defined an "average" turnout as the average for the 6 elections from 1976-85. For the Democrats, that was 49%, or 51,596 for the first congressional district race.

In actuality, 56,092 Democrats voted, or 4,496 over the average. A disproportionate share of those 9% extra voters descended from the Albuquerque Heights: college-educated Anglos. They were the same group that put Schiff over the top in the Republican congressional primary.

That's how it was done: extra turnout and a healthy chunk of the undecideds.

Well, there it is. The Tribune's elusive prey, tethered.

The Big Mo.

As in Mo Udall.

Tom Udall now has experienced both the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat.

In 1982, he ran against Bill Richardson, George Perez and Roberto Mondragon in the Democratic primary for the newly-created northern congressional seat. Udall came in dead last, and failed to carry any of the 15 counties in the district.

EDITORIAL

How do we stand, as a community, on economic development?

It seems there is a broad base of support for the thought of diversifying the economy. The suggestion of attracting a college, corporate training center or small industry to Ruidoso brings nods of agreement from most residents. And the thought of bringing prosperity all across the county, as well, seems to excite us. Yes, let's not rely totally on the tourist dollar. Let's insulate ourselves from that trade's often extreme ups and downs.

So what are we going to do?

Groups have formed. Some have revved their engines only to sputter out when the real work of economic development arises. But another, the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLO), seems to be running just fine, so far. They were incorporated in February 1987, and spent the first year of their existence gaining membership and getting organized.

They have not yet brought any permanent economic development to the county. Indeed, they still are getting themselves organized ... and funded beyond membership fees. They've amassed a volunteer group of 80 people, a wide base of membership, and some of the most energetic and persistent leaders we've seen. The machine of economic development seems to be ready, awaiting financial fuel.

And so we come to the real hill-to-climb, that of getting enough dollars to make an idea into a reality. Paid staffmembers, office costs, printing expenses, etc., now are necessary.

Where do you suppose the dollars will come from? EDCLC leaders formed a plan to be funded from each governing body in the county. Their first fund-raising stop was their last, though, as the Lincoln County Commissioners told them they had no money in the budget to offer. But Chairman Hightower suggested another source ... a commission-option mil levy.

Commissioners insisted on resolutions of support from area governing bodies, which have been collected with little opposition. June 28, they will make a decision on the levy, expected to raise \$120,000 in a year, but costing most homeowners just \$10 to \$20 a year in increased property taxes.

We've been nodding our heads for a long time at the notion of economic development. Now we have a chance to make it happen, if we're willing to part with a few dollars a year. Call your commissioner and urge his support of the mil levy. It's time we take a stand on economic development.-DJP

WRITE IT AND REAP!

Writing a classified ad that gets results—whether it be for real estate, employment, announcements, transportation, or merchandise—is easy if you follow the guidelines below.

1. Give the reader specific information. Pretend you are someone reading the classifieds. What would you like to know about the item, service or job you are advertising? Be sure to add details such as color, size, condition, brand name, age, features and benefits. Be accurate! Don't embellish your ad with misleading information. Stick to the facts and reap the rewards!
2. Include the price. Don't waste your time or a potential buyer's time. If you advertise the price of the item or service you offer, the people who respond to your ad will be those who are genuinely interested. Surveys show that readers are more interested in those items and services they know are within their price range.
3. Avoid abbreviations. Don't make a potential customer work too hard. Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in kitchen) or WDW (white slide wall tires) and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.
4. Include phone number and specify hours. Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call. Surveys show that even if a person is very interested in your item or service, he or she will not call back after the first attempt. Stay near the phone during the hours you indicate you will be available. Don't risk missing a sale!
5. Run on consecutive days. Your ad will not get results if people don't see it! Therefore, it is important to set up a consistent and consecutive ad schedule with your telephone salesperson or outside sales representative. Run your ad for at least one week. Remember, you can cancel your ad as soon as you get the desired results!


