Village begins pumping bad water back into dam

Crews began work Wednesday to pump water leaking through the Grindstone Canyon Dam back into the municipal reservoir.

Water has been leaching and percolating through the huge concrete dam at rates as high as 1,200 gallons per minute since fill operations began. The pumping plan, first recommended in May, was initiated after recent meetings with technical and environmental experts.

"Everybody said that was the thing to do," said village manager Frank Potter on Wednesday.

In a letter to Potter from Boyle Engineering Corporation, dated June 6, design engineer Fred Burns renewed his recommendation of pumping the water back into the reservoir as a temporary solution. Burns said he made that recommendation on May 13 as a practical temporary solution to the concerns of streambed coating with

precipitates caused by the discharge of water from the dam.

According to that letter, Water Department head Richard Sanchez reported at that time the village had the necessary pump and could begin pumping within the week at a cost of about \$1,000.

When questioned over the month-long delay, Potter said the village didn't have approval from the Environmental Improvement Division (EID) until a recent meeting in Santa Fe. He commented that Boyle, the company that designed and supervised the dam project, as well as recommending the pump-back, is no longer under contract with the village.

Potter said the original cost estimate was for pumping a lesser discharge back into the reservoir, and didn't include a diversion pipe that will divert some flows from the Rio Ruidoso without going through the dam. He didn't have an estimate of the cost using the big leased equipment and diverting water past the dam.

Technical reports presented to village staff recommended that diversion as a means of adding clear water into the stream system to hurry the natural cleansing process that's expected to take place once the carbon calcium saturated water is no longer pouring into Grindstone and Carrizo creeks.

In his letter, Burns said he found "no reason to believe that Grindstone Canyon Dam is unsafe." Burns also presented graphs showing the unit seepage is reducing with time.

"The wetting of the dam, along with calcification and sedimentation of cracks and pores, will continue the process of stabilization and reduction of seepage," said Burns.

He asked the village to question the EID about statements attributed to environmental representatives in The News, noting those opinions do not appear to coincide with the investigations conducted to date. A report from Industrial Water Engineering, Inc., too, ques-


tioned EID statements "purporting severe damage to the ecosystem."

According to that report, the preparer walked the Rio Ruidoso, Carrizo and Grindstone creeks, and found no indication of biological damage. "No dead fish, algae, or benthic insects were observed. Grasses, trees and shrubs near the streams did not indicate any wilting or other unstable conditions," states the report.

The bottom line, according to several technical advisers, is that as water is pumped back into the reservoir, no adverse impact is expected to the lake. The reports also stress that adverse effects to the stream system will be quickly cleared up.

A series of tests are recommended on a weekly basis, including input amounts, pH and chemical testing.

"We're out there working away," said Potter on Wednesday, noting the leakage already was diminishing.

Wreck hurts 3

Accidents on Friday and Saturday left seven people injured.

A three-vehicle crash at 5:30 p.m. Friday tied up traffic for close to an hour along Sudderth Drive from Cree Meadows Drive past Innsbrook Condominiums, and sent four people to Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC).

According to police, Mark C. Slaughter, 28, of Portales, was northbound on Sudderth near Morgan Drive when a vehicle driven by Mary A. Jennings, 72, of Ruidoso, stopped for traffic to make a left turn. Slaughter told police he was looking down and didn't see the car stop, and hit its rear.

Police said that collision caused the Jennings vehicle to slide into oncoming traffic, slamming into a southbound car driven by Marcia M. DeBorde, 34, of Ruidoso. Jennings and DeBorde, along with a passenger in the DeBorde vehicle, Marcia DeBorde, 10, and a passenger in the Slaughter vehicle, Delinda Cowie, 23, of Connecticut, were treated at LCMC.

Slaughter was cited for failure to provide proof of mandatory insurance, according to the report.

In a separate incident, reported to police at about 6 p.m. Saturday,

three people were injured.

Police said Angela C. James, 15, of Ruidoso, turned from Carrizo Canyon Road onto Sudderth Drive, when she hit a vehicle driven by Charlotte Holbert, 28, of Ruidoso.

James reportedly told police she didn't see the other car before she pulled out. Both drivers and a passenger in the James vehicle, Betty Sanchez, 15, of Ruidoso, were treated at LCMC.

Citizens comment on proposed zoning

The Ruidoso Village Council, during Tuesday's regular meeting, will again consider a proposed zoning ordinance, related maps and comprehensive plan.

Action was tabled Wednesday during a public hearing, slated to be the last chance for public input into the long-awaited ordinance.

A handful of citizens were on hand for the hearing, with a dozen people speaking to the council. That

final step followed four years of meetings and hearings that started after the village hired BRW to draft a comprehensive plan and ordinance to replace the measures adopted in 1976.

After the ordinance was drafted, the new zoning designations were recorded on a proposed zoning map. Village staff then did a massive mailing, notifying every property owner in village limits of the proposed changes. More than 13,000 letters were mailed, with the response so great that three village

employees spent most of the next two weeks answering questions and helping citizens through a protest process.

The current Planning and Zoning (P&Z) Commission, after the latest redraft was completed, unanimously adopted the package and recommended it to the Village Council for adoption.

Final protests entered during Wednesday's meeting included:

Group sees big changes for 'downtown'

Downtown Ruidoso—the place to be!

Members of the Ruidoso MainStreet resource team painted a picture Wednesday of a new and revitalized Midtown—an area they recommend calling "downtown," to fit the new and improved image and surroundings that will evolve over the three-year MainStreet project.

Mexico. They are among 400 project towns in the United States.

Joncas said MainStreet projects use a comprehensive four-area approach to downtown revitalization, dividing tasks into economics, promotions, design and organization. The phased project was described Wednesday, according to summer 1988, first year and the next two-to-three year goals.

Joncas said she and other members of the team, who spent Monday through Wednesday reviewing the community, meeting and interviewing people, learned that people want to know when things are going to happen. While MainStreet is a long-term public/private partnership, she said some things will begin to happen this summer.

Boles suggested merchants buy some inexpensive benches and trash barrels for placement in the downtown area. He said that area needs some "color, softness" that could be provided through plants or the like.

"We also think you have some accidents waiting to happen," said Boles, recommending property owners and the village cooperate to eliminate the worst areas even before a major reconstruction is accomplished at some future time.

"You want downtown to be the fun spot," said Kate Joncas during a public meeting to report resource team findings and hear from village citizens. Joncas, Washington D.C. program associate with the national MainStreet office, was among a five-member group picked to visit and report on the brand new Ruidoso project.

To begin the economic restructuring, the team recommends a market profile to be gathered by merchants via a zip code survey of customers. She said business operators need to figure out what their market is, and respond to it.

Horowitz recommended some immediate projects, including a logo contest, a business directory, hospitality school and weekly clean-up projects. She suggested bringing free or low-cost entertainment into the downtown area.

"Variety is the spice of life, and you've got variety," said Boles, stressing that MainStreet does not advocate a theme in downtown.

Donna Edwards is project director for Ruidoso MainStreet.

Ruidoso and Roswell are the two newest MainStreet towns in New

Boles recommended a master plan to establish a "vision" for Ruidoso. "You definitely need some sort of reference point," remarked Borbas.

Horsemen appeal time is shortened

The ongoing legal dispute between the state Racing Commission and horsemen in New Mexico has taken a turn for the worse for the horsemen after a Friday decision by the state Supreme Court.

The high court agreed to shorten the time in which the horsemen can appeal a ruling handed down last week by the state Court of Appeals. That ruling conflicted with an ear-

lier Grants District Court decision that said the commission could not use an out-of-state lab to test racehorse urine samples, nor the results of tests conducted after purses had been paid.

After a Thursday request by the New Mexico Attorney General's Office, the Supreme Court agreed to cut from 15 to five days the time horsemen can request a rehearing

by the Court of Appeals.

Also Friday, spokesmen for the New Mexico Horsemen's Association said a meeting in Ruidoso in which horsemen discussed the possibility of pulling out of racing and boycotting the sport resulted in no boycott. Horsemen will continue to enter horses in races, the spokesmen said, who discounted the possibility of a boycott.

Aspen 'Cap winner is longshot Cost Of Peace

David Lidberg powered 14-1 shot Cost Of Peace to victory in Saturday's featured \$12,325 Aspen Handicap, a 5 1/2 furlong sprint for 3-year-old fillies.

As the field went postward, the crowd of 4263 gave Elmer Meadows' Cost Of Peace little chance to outrun the likes of Bold Serena, Scout Beauty, and Trigo Dancer. A Peace River Prince product, Cost Of Peace had popped out of form in her last try, finishing 17 lengths behind in the Norgor Derby. When the horses hit the wire, however, Cost Of Peace had earned a hard-fought 3/4 length victory.

William Fore conditions the 1988 Aspen Handicap champion, who picked up only her second win in a dozen lifetime trips to the gate. The first place paycheck of \$7,395 lifted her career moneyline to more than \$10,000.

Mike Lidberg rated 3-1 shot Scout Beauty behind pacesetters Bold Serena and Ampaphelia, and he had the Scout Leader filly barreling down the lane to pick up second-place prize money, \$2,711. Scout Beauty is trained by Cecil Crabtree for Cleber J. and Patricia A. Massey of Abilene, Texas.

Trigo Dancer, ridden by Casey Lambert, circled the field from far back and made up ground on the outside to finish third. The Fire Dancer filly is trained by Clifford Lambert Sr. for H. Gil Moutray and Seven River Inc of Carlsbad, New Mexico.

In the race immediately preceding the feature, Tilt The Odds, ridden by Larry Payne, broke his own track record for 5 furlongs.

The 6-year-old Tilt Up horse covered the distance in 57 2/5, shaving 3/5 of a second off his September 5, 1987 record-setting performance. Cecil Crabtree trains Tilt The Odds for Fred Van Winkle of Alamogordo.






Owned and trained by E. Lee Ivey of Ruidoso, Shutup And Deal has been a model of consistency in his short career.





Gymnasts flip for top coaches at camp

Aristotle would have loved the Ruidoso Mountaintops Gymnastics Camp.

"May all your children be acrobats," said Aristotle all those centuries ago. That wish was true for parents of a gym full of children, at the camp in Ruidoso last week, directed by Coach Robyn Johnson.

Youngsters from 5 to 16 took part in the week-long camp that was a mix of gymnastics workouts, physical training and fun. Johnson gathered a diverse team of coaches and helpers from Ruidoso, Texas and Hawaii.

Coach Johnson and her assistant Moe Masters, who lead the Village of Ruidoso recreational gymnastics program, were joined by David Swalander of Kansas State University; Randy Goodall of the Class I

gymnastics team at Hanks High School in El Paso, Texas; Mike Spiller, an international coach with headquarters in Hawaii; Don Arnwine from Metro-Plex Gymnastics in Mesquite, Texas; Rachel Garrett, a former state competitor; and local dance instructor Nancy Shaver.

Swalander, a graduate of Ruidoso High School, is a veterinary medicine student at Kansas State University. A former high school wrestler, Swalander became a gymnast as a university cheerleader.

That group led gymnasts from Texas and New Mexico through five days of intensive training.

The Ruidoso camp was an all-levels camp, with athletes grouped according to individual ability, said Spiller, adding the emphasis is on all-around fitness and good strong basics.

Spiller and Arnwine took time to talk about the camp, themselves and gymnastics during an afternoon break.

Spiller has tumbled and coached all over the world, starting as a Houston, Texas, 9-year-old. He went on to compete in tumbling and trampoline. He was on the national trampoline team for four years, and was the first person to do a triple on a trampoline.

While a Marine in Vietnam, Spiller started a tumbling club for servicemen in Da Nang. He went on to coach in California, before moving back to Houston where he and a partner opened Gymnastics Association Southwest of Houston. He put a girl on the Olympics team in 1972, and over the next 10 years saw his gymnasts go on to compete in junior and senior colleges.

Spiller's gym has continued to be a headquarters for national competitors, for he sold it in 1982 to Bella Karolyi.

Spiller, after leaving his Houston program that was reaching 1,600 youngsters, coached an international exchange team that traveled throughout Europe. He coached the Swiss junior national team in Lucerne, in 1982, with three of his eight team members making the 1985 world championship team.

He is co-director of Camp Hanalike in Hawaii, and is researching cultural games from all over the world. He used some of his international games this week in Ruidoso.

Spiller continues to promote the sport of gymnastics wherever he goes, saying it is the best physical activity for youngsters, using the total mind and body. "It helps you in everything you do," said Spiller, noting the sport is progressive and requires a great deal of dedication.

Arnwine agreed, saying gymnasts learn to recognize options and use judgment. Because of the many hours required to perfect gymnastics skills, the athletes are well organized and highly motivated, said Arnwine.

"It's a pure sport," said Arnwine, adding gymnastics skills are transferable to other athletic endeavors, like skiing and tennis.

A gymnast nearly all his life, Arnwine was an original member of the Flying Matadors, a world-class tumbling team from Levelland, Texas. He started tumbling when he was 6 years old and began competing when he was 9.

Arnwine, who attended Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas, said he started coaching to get through college. He operated "satellite programs" in a number of little West Texas towns.

Former coach of the Pecos Valley Gymnastics team in Roswell, Arnwine spent last year working in Ne-

vada at Flips Gymnastics and Gymnastics Nevada. He said he worked with some of the top athletes in the nation in that big gym.

His Roswell team included the 1986 Class IV and II compulsories state champions, as well as the Class III optionals champion.

Arnwine said he's working with some strong athletes in the Mesquite gym where he now coaches.

While Spiller and Arnwine spend their time coaching these days, the two still have it when it comes to gymnastics.

As the grand finale to the Mountaintops Camp, Spiller and Arnwine performed for the campers and their parents. Spiller, in a red leotard and purple tights, clowning as world-renowned gymnast, "Krispy Filled-up," while Arnwine cracked the whip as Krispy's Russian coach, Boris.

Johnson said she is making plans now for a winter gymnastics camp, and both Spiller and Arnwine said they'll be back.



White Mountain Development Corporation, questioned why a plot of land near White Mountain schools declared commercial by a district judge, was changed to planned unit development (PUD) on the proposed map. Collins recalled when Bill McCarty, owner of White Mountain Development, went to court over the zoning on that property.

"We have never considered it anything but commercial ... we've been to court once, and we'll go back to court," said Collins.

P&Z Chairman Robert Donaldson said there was "quite a bit of public input against commercial" in that area, and stressed the flexibility available through PUD zoning.

"Bill (McCarty) doesn't want PUD, he wants what the courts have ruled," said Collins.

Bill McCarty Construction Co., also represented by Collins, asked for an industrial designation along Carrizo Canyon Road. Collins said the area already is being used industrially, but P&Z Chairman Donaldson said the commission wants to see that change over time.

"That's a primary entry point ... we're a tourist town," noted Donaldson, reminding Collins that current uses can continue as non-conforming uses. The new ordinance also allows for property owners with non-conforming uses to expand, repair and upgrade their operations.

Later in the meeting a property owner complained about the industrial uses already under way in that area.

Collins said another client, Cal Skaggs, is protesting plans to designate his property in Snowflake Ridge as Planned Unit Development (PUD). He said time and money already was expended on the current zoning.

"Citizens disagreed over the best zoning for Hamilton Terrace Subdivision, Block 4 properties. Attorney Charles Hawthorne, on be-

half of Mrs. T.A. McCarty, objected to a commercial designation on lot 2D. Hawthorne said his client owns two residential lots, 2A and 2C, with an easement providing the only access to 2D.

In the same area, Mrs. Leo Brown said her son, Michael Brown, wants Lot 2B to remain commercial, rather than being changed to residential as proposed.

Later in the meeting, Gary Lynch, speaking for the new owner of Lot 2D, said his client already is operating a business on the lot, believing it is commercial.

—Don Eckland, owner of Ruidoso Signs, expressed concern over parts of the sign ordinance, noting professionally prepared billboards should not be eliminated. According to the ordinance, billboards will be phased out over the next five years.

Advertising firm representatives also protested plans to abolish billboards.

"This is not Alamogordo or Roswell," said Donaldson, adding other resort towns have even more restrictive sign ordinances. "You will not see these kind of signs in Aspen or Vail," said Donaldson.

—Bill Cornelius, Ralph Gary and Robert Beauvais, in separate testimony, asked the council to leave their commercial property zoned for commercial use. The three own separate properties slated to be rezoned residential.

—Mary Mitchell Trimble pled with the council to leave the Sierra Blanca Cabins property, across the street from her home, residential. She told of surveying the town and finding an abundance of empty commercial buildings. By leaving the property zoned residential, the cabins can continue, but a different commercial enterprise would be precluded.

"I certainly don't want something over there that's tacky," said Trimble.

"I suggest you buy that property," remarked Councillor Tom

McNeil. The Planning and Zoning Commission, the group most involved throughout the entire process, already has conducted a series of public hearings, making some changes before recommending the finished product.

The stop-and-go nature of the entire process has been further complicated by changes in personnel, village officials and staff. BRW was placed under contract in 1984. Mayor George White was in office, and long-time village manager Jim Hine was still heading village staff.

Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr., along with six councillors elected since the process began, is now serving the village. And Frank Potter, former assistant manager, is now the village manager.

Paul Davis was head of the P&Z Department when BRW was hired. As work has progressed toward the new ordinance and related materials, P&Z has been headed by Sandy Hall, Margaret Lahey and the current planning administrator, Cleatus Richards.

The P&Z Commission, too, has seen many changes over the past four years. The present nine-member group has just eight members. They include: Robert Donaldson, chairman; Ellen Long, vice-chairman and secretary; and members David Harding, Candace Garrett, Greg Pertest, Eddie Nichols, John White and Peggy Jordan.

Humane Society urges cat adoptions

If you may be thinking of giving a kitten a home, now is the perfect time, said Randy Basche, director of the Humane Society of Lincoln County.

June is National Adopt-A-Cat month, which is being sponsored by Nine Lives.

With each adoption, the Humane Society is giving away a Nine Lives packet containing a booklet on how to care for your cat, coupons for cat food, and a document certifying that the owner has been adopted by his cat.

Basche said that he has about 60 kittens up for adoption, all products of unwanted litters. All of the kittens have had their Parvo and distemper shots, and have been spayed or neutered, he added.

Distemper is a highly contagious, airborne disease that affects young animals. Basche said because the shelter runs on such a tight budget, the only way to deal with animals who come down with distemper is to euthanize them (put them to sleep).

Because the distemper shots take five to 10 days to take effect, Basche said that he could avoid having to put a lot of animals to sleep if owners would bring in their animals, let him give them their shots and then take the animals back home for 10 days before returning the animals to be put up for adoption.

By following this procedure, Basche said, the animal is assured of not being exposed to the virus from the other animals in the shelter, and is virtually assured of being adopted.

He said another way to assure

adoption, and to cut down on the adoption fee, is to have the animal spayed or neutered before bringing it into the shelter.

The shelter will not release an animal for adoption unless it has been spayed or neutered, Basche said, which is a national Humane Society policy that has cut the euthanasia rate from 15 million to seven million in animal shelters around the country.

In a span of 10 years, a single female dog can account for over 7,000 descendants, Basche said.

Adoption fees for all animals are \$12.50 for adoption, \$7.50 for the rabies shot, neutering a male animal is \$18 and the spay fee for females is \$35. The total comes to \$38 for a male animal and \$55 for a female.


He said as cruel as it may sound, he would much rather euthanize an

unspayed or unneutered animal, than let one go for free, because in the long run he feels that it will save him from taking a lot of lives that are unwanted anyway.

Basche said many times people can't understand why the adoption fees are so high. He explained that the shelter only keeps \$12.50 of the actual fee. The rest goes to pay for the animal's shots and to veterinarians for the cost of the spay or neuter.

"Dogs and cats have become such a disposable animal," Basche said, adding that the bare necessities of caring for a dog or cat runs about \$250 a year.

"If someone can't afford a \$60 adoption fee, they sure can't afford the \$250 a year to take care of one," he said. "In the case of a male dog, they can be getting a 15 to 20 year companion for \$60."





Eye On The Capitol

"Election Review: More Legislative Winners Speak"
Les Houston, Albuquerque attorney and leader of the Republicans in the State Senate, told me in May: "I'm very individualistic, I guess."

Politicians across New Mexico were watching Houston's election. He faced two opponents. This was the first time Houston had run in the Republican primary. In 1984, he was elected as a Democrat, and changed parties shortly thereafter.

There was no Democratic primary in Senate District 19, which means Houston will automatically be returning to Santa Fe. "The whole campaign," Houston told me last week, "was aimed at smearing me." Somebody "stole 20 of my big signs. That irritated me. That element hadn't been in this district before."

How did Houston win? "We put out a lot of material." 8 different mailers addressed specific issues. "I was very candid with the voters...I didn't ignore the horse racing issue, but tackled it head-on." Houston's opponents charged his representation as an attorney for horsemen constituted a conflict of interest.

Also during the campaign, Houston was quick to go on the offensive. "They felt I'd sit around and not respond—that they were immune from pot-shots."

Why such a heated campaign? Houston charged that one of his opponents, Richard Broder, was a foil for Senate Democrats—a "surrogate candidate"—who got carried away with their own tavern talk and wishful thinking: "They rode him hard and put him up wet."

Broder was endorsed by Albuquerque Journal. "The Journal has opposed me in every election," Houston said. "They hurt their credibility. It's a joke."

In the end, Houston says he received about 60% of the vote—"about 200 more votes than my two opponents combined."

Tom Overstreet summed up this way: "Very seldom can you run against two incumbents in the same race."

Bill Vandergriff is the incumbent Otero senator. In 1984, Vandergriff won the election as a Republican; then he switched parties.

The June 7 election was the first time Vandergriff ran in the Democratic party's primary. He is the only incumbent state legislator in New Mexico who lost a primary.

Overstreet will face Republican Maurice Hobson in the November general election. Hobson is the "second incumbent" because he is presently a state representative. He is abandoning his house seat after 17 years, to make the senate bid.

Hobson is expected to receive

prime support from Governor Caruthers and the Republican Party, in what Eye on The Capitol reported as the "Number 1 Republican target" in all of the state legislative elections.

Overstreet said the key to his victory was "a hard-working campaign committee. That's a true story." He singled out his 75-year old mother-in-law, Polly Teel, for action above and beyond the call of duty. "She broke her arm, going door-to-door. But she continued to campaign for me."

Vandergriff hasn't called him, Overstreet says. But John Mobbs, the third candidate in the race, congratulated Overstreet over the radio. "We get along fine," Overstreet remarked.

State Senator Caleb Chandler defeated Wandel Massey in the Democratic primary in Curry County. "That worked out pretty well in spite of The Albuquerque Journal," Chandler joked. The Duke City daily had printed several unfavorable articles about Chandler's ties to the ethanol industry.

Eye on The Capitol (May 11) saw a similarity between Chandler's struggle and the Biblical story of Caleb versus the Anakites—giants who were trying to retain control over Caleb's territory.

"It was a pretty tough election," Chandler noted, "due to all the dirty politics."

Why weren't the Albuquerque Anakites victorious?

Chandler says Curry County folks "keep up with what's going on. They know first hand, and don't have to take anybody's word for it." In Albuquerque, the situation is different: "People don't know their senators." Hence, it's easier for the media to "hoodwink" the voters.

Chandler says that Massey told the Clovis newspaper "he'd support me. But I haven't heard anything from him personally."

Chandler's opponent in November's general election is Republican Walter Bradley.

"I'm a frustrated archaeologist," Mary Guffey told me last month.

She certainly is not a frustrated candidate.

On June 7, Guffey defeated Dago Ruiz for the Republican nomination in Albuquerque's westside, petroglyph senate district.

"I really don't know if it was the endorsement of the two newspapers [The Albuquerque Tribune and The Albuquerque Journal]."

Guffey described Ruiz as "nice and friendly. He called and congratulated me...He was strong south of the freeway; I was strong north of it."

Their only campaign difference on issues: Ruiz wanted more money for the Albuquerque Public School District. "I think \$257 mil-

lion is a lot of money," Guffey said. "It isn't getting down to the students."

This senate seat is presently held by Republican Joseph Carraro, who ran and lost to Bill Valentine in the primary for United States

Senator. In November, Guffey will face Democrat Martin Chavez, who is regarded in political circles as a tough opponent.

"I've been told this seat is a lost cause," Guffey remarked. "I don't know where they get that."

DEAR EDITOR:

As a visiting math educator and a member of several professional organizations, I would like to comment on two articles in your June 16th issue.

First, I disagree with the recommendation made by Capitan Principal Larry DeWees when he recommended that Geometry be dropped from the new mathematics curriculum. As a mathematics teacher, I feel that every statement deserves a reason, a process I learned when I took Geometry. Geometry allows a person to think critically and creatively. The process is necessary in building a lawyer and thinker (problem solver). It should also be noted that Geometry is a discipline that schools are expected to deliver. Colleges will be expecting successful students to have completed Geometry. If Capitan students don't have the opportunity to take Geometry, they will be put at a disadvantage. I encourage the Capitan School Board to rethink their position of dropping Geometry from their math curriculum.

Second, I am disturbed by Ms. Denise Hawthorne's statement,

"she concluded the testing be limited to college bound students to keep the score averages higher as the school is judged by these scores."

I dare anyone to predict which students are college bound at the sophomore level. I worry about the criteria that the Ruidoso School Board will use to predict which students will be college bound and allowed to take the ACT. Will it depend on money? sex? color? race?

I recommend that the Ruidoso School Board encourage as many students as possible to take college preparatory classes and the ACT instead of discouraging students by not allowing them to take the ACT. All students have the right to compare themselves against other students that desire to attend college.


Don't use the ACT average as your only measure of success. I suggest you compile the number of your students that attend and complete their college education. This will be more reliable.


