

Merganser leads all the way

After being upset by Okeydokey Baby in the Kansas Futurity, Merganser turned the tables on her to capture the 25th running of the 400-yard \$422,000 Rainbow Futurity in a blistering time of 19.82.

With Jacky Martin at the helm, Merganser, a 2-year-old Duck Dance-Hug Tiny colt, left the gate in front and never looked back. Remarkably, Martin lost his whip right out of the gate and had to urge Merganser to the finish line with the palm of his right hand.

"After he false broke in the Kansas we spent hours with him in the gate," said Martin. "He was ready to run today. He was on the lead from the first jump and he ran easily the whole way."

Sunday's victory marked Martin's second Rainbow Futurity title. He won the 1984 Rainbow on board Heavenly. Martin has been at the helm in all nine of Merganser's trips to the gate, coming away with eight wins, including three in stakes races. Merganser suffered his only defeat in the Kansas Futurity.

Jack Brooks, Ruidoso Downs' leading quarter horse trainer, saddled Merganser for owners Jerry Wells and Ronald Shalz of Sulphur, Oklahoma. The win was worth \$177,497. It lifted Merganser's career earnings to more than \$313,000.

William Mills Jr.'s Super De Kas, who brought the second-fastest qualifying time into the final, closed quickly from the outside, missing the win by a nose. William Mills trains the Coup De Kas product. Larry Layton was in the irons. The second-place pay-

Odds-on favorite Okeydokey Baby, who left the gate at 4-5, found the footing slippery and came away with a third-place finish. She is owned by Jeff Hooper and the Jalapeno Racing Team II of Austin, Texas. Gary Sumpter was on board the R. Paul Hobbs-trainee. The

show was worth \$38,035.

Investigation open on hit-and-run deaths

Mescalero police are continuing their investigation into the deaths of two Mescalero boys, who were killed by a hit-and-run driver.

The bodies of the two cousins, 6-year-old Brian Whitebird and 10-year-old Patrick Blake were found near the roadside in Pena Canyon about two miles west of the Inn of the Mountain Gods.

Mark Chino, supervisory criminal investigator for the Bureau of Indian Affairs said no new leads have developed in the case; however, it was learned that the vehicle being investigated as possibly being used in the hit-and-run, may be the same vehicle in-

involved in a gas skip and theft of two 12-packs of beer from a local convenience store.

Chino said he has looked at an older model, green Chevy pick-up that was impounded near Alamogordo early last Wednesday morning.

According to police reports, a vehicle matching that description pulled into the 7-11 store on Suderth and Mechem shortly after midnight Wednesday. The driver pumped \$10 worth of gasoline, while a passenger took two 12-packs of Budweiser beer, and the two drove off.

Arrest warrants have been issued for the driver and passenger of the vehicle.

July 21 date Commission agenda set

Steve Hutson, accused of murdering his brother, will appear in magistrate court Friday, July 21.

The district attorney's office filed an open charge of murder against the 34-year-old Ruidoso man after his brother, Danny Hutson, 39, died of gunshot wounds on June 28. Ruidoso Police arrested the Steve Hutson at the family's 112 Begonia residence, and he remains in Lincoln County Jail.

Detective Mike Lovelace said police, called to the scene of the morning shooting, found the victim's body outside the backdoor, behind the carport. He said statements Steve Hutson made to officers led them to arrest him.

The Office of the Medical Investigator in Albuquerque, after performing an autopsy, reported the victim died of six gunshot wounds to the head.

The open charge is handled as a capital or first degree murder, with no bond allowed, according to Magistrate Judge Gerald Dean.

Hutson will have his preliminary hearing in Ruidoso before Magistrate Judge J.R. "Jim" Wheeler. According to state law, the judge must determine probable cause in the preliminary hearing. Judge Wheeler will hear evidence to decide if a crime was committed and if the accused could have committed that crime.

Hutson could be bound over for trial in district court, or the charges could be dismissed.

The defendant is represented by public defender Richie Askew. In a telephone interview Thursday, Askew said his client is "absolutely innocent" of the charges.

"I intend to prove it in a court of law," said Askew. Noting the open,

Hangar issue is pending

Airport commissioners, despite a closed door session Wednesday, were unable to resolve a dispute over who will pay the lease/purchase payments on hangars at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

"There hasn't been a resolution," said village attorney John Underwood, one of two legal advisers in the executive session that followed a regular meeting of the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission. County attorney Gary Mitchell, also on hand for the meeting, couldn't be reached for comment Friday.

Underwood said he couldn't comment on the dispute that was detailed in a letter he wrote last week to Mitchell. Copies of that letter were distributed to members of the Ruidoso Village Council and some staff last Tuesday.

"I'm not going to try my lawsuits through the paper," said Underwood.

According to the letter, the County of Lincoln is already past due on its first \$4,721.46 payment to Airspace Inc. for a terminal building, large hangar and auto sunshades at the regional airfield. The term of the lease agreement is eight years, according to Underwood's letter.

Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr., one of Ruidoso's three airport commissioners, said the village and county disagree on the interpretation of a joint powers agreement between the two. He said that agreement calls for arbitration to solve disputes.

Davis said the problems are not insurmountable, noting the Village of Ruidoso won't make Airspace wait for their money until the dispute is settled.

All three Lincoln County commissioners serve on the airport commission, and apparently don't believe the lease payments are a county obligation.

The multi-million dollar air facility, to replace the Ruidoso Municipal Airport, opened at the end of December to air traffic. The terminal building, with airport offices and space for sales and car rentals, opened last month.

The state-of-the-art airfield has been built with a combination of federal, state, county and local con-

Ruidoso precipitation for July so far has been 3.53 inches, 84 percent of the normal July average.




Cleaning for the glory of God

BJ Flyer captures big Rainbow Futurity consolation Saturday

W.E. Burrows' BJ Flyer went wire-to-wire to win Saturday's \$100,000 Rainbow Futurity Consolation, while 13-1 shot Jack Da Quick captured the co-feature, the \$12,000 Sierra Blanca Handicap.

Jacky Martin piloted BJ Flyer to the finish line in 20 seconds flat over a sloppy surface. A 2-year-old colt by Moon Lark, BJ Flyer left the gate at odds of 3-1 as part of an entry with Indis Lark. He kept race-favorite Faithfully at a safe distance the entire 400-yard trip.

The victory, only the second of BJ Flyer's five-race career, was worth an even \$35,000. Jack Brooks, who already appears to have a lock on the quarter horse trainer championship, saddled the

stable-mates.

Faithfully, an extremely consistent colt sired by Easy Jet, broke from the outside post, held second most of his journey, but was unable to overhaul BJ Flyer. Ridden by Billy Burress Jr. for trainer J.C. Wells of Iowa Park, Texas,

Faithfully earned a second-place paycheck worth \$16,000.

Indis Lark, another son of Moon Lark, closed ground from post position eight to get the show. Larry Payne was on board for the owner-trainer tandem of Burrows and Brooks.

In the 6-furlong Sierra Blanca Handicap, Jack Da Quick jumped out of the gate, and like BJ Flyer, was never headed.

Although he won his previous start by 4 1/2 lengths, the crowd let him go off at odds of 13-1.

Jockey Leroy Coombs was on board the 4-year-old Coup De Kas gelding, Purl L. Coombs conditions Jack Da Quick for owner Carroll W. Godwin of Denton, Texas, who collected winning prize money of \$7,260.

The 7-year-old Staff Writer mare Northern Writer, with Larry Payne up, closed gamely in the middle of the track for the place. Rick Anderson saddled the veteran sprinter for Walter F. Merrick of Sayre, Oklahoma.

Bubbles Silverman, the longest shot on the board at 17-1, picked up third-place prize money.



This is the season of great rejoicing by Mother Earth who is smiling happily, resplendent in her dress of many shades of emerald, breathing a prayer of thanks all through the Mountain World, that her children are happy and contented after receiving the life-giving crystal drops, shining as they fall from the clouds gray and white floating in the blue sky.

All this has been accomplished by our own little mountain showers. The main heavy rains that drift in from the plains to the East have not yet arrived.

The Thunder Bird.

The Rain Crow himself is about the size of a Mocking bird. He is of the Cucoo family and therefore related to our State bird, the Chaparral or Road Runner. He is easily recognized by his colorful markings. Just before a heavy rain you

will hear him calling, "Cuouu, Cwo-Koo" over and over until he calls in the rain.

Yesterday as the sky began clouding up in the early afternoon, there came a bird call from the large apricot tree out south of the house sounding like: "Kweet, Kweet, Kweet."

I did not remember having heard this call except maybe once in the while in the distance. Now this bird was very close and kept repeating his call steadily.

Soon thunder sounded just over the hill to the north west, and in five minutes was answered by a rumble and mumble from a cloud just moving in over Storm Mountain to the Southwest. Lightning flashed out into the valley ahead of both thunder clouds. Light rain began falling, and the two clouds began sending out signals louder and louder from their perch on the tops of the two hills. There they held ground as if waiting for reinforcements.

Then the sky darkened and the rain increased, as the two clouds moved towards one another, and then they met right over the middle of the valley. Lightning flashed blue and red and gold, and the thunder roared and boomed. This battle of the sky lasted a half hour, and it has been a long time since I have seen this much lightning or heard this much thunder.

Now I cannot help but wonder if the bird who called before the thunderstorm broke was the Thunder Bird.

It is now one thirty in the afternoon of July sixteen, and the East wind has begun rippling the American Flag toward the West. Maybe this is the beginning of the big rains.

Family crisis center works to aid victims of family violence

Family Crisis Center of South Central New Mexico is working to aid victims of domestic violence.

Volunteers are on call 24 hours a day through a telephone line answered at the Ruidoso Police Department, 257-7365. The advocates are trained in listening skills, and maintain a list of resources available to victims of domestic or spousal abuse.

Judge Richard A. Parsons, Presbyterian minister Winston Presnall, Dr. Arlene Brown and Ruidoso Police Sergeant Richard Swenor were guest speakers during a two-day training workshop that ended Saturday. The four, along with volunteer coordinator Debbie Russell, introduced members of the class to the myths and facts about

the growing problem of violence among family members.

They introduced the new volunteers to the religious, medical and legal issues involved in the complex problem.

Swenor explained how the Ruidoso Police and the Family Crisis Center volunteers work together to provide emergency help for victims.

Judge Parsons explained the protective order, a civil tool available to victims. The State Legislature created the protective order, and mandated that police officers carry the necessary forms and inform victims of the process.

Parsons said he can rule on a number of issues when a protective

order is filed in his court, but stressed that he cannot give legal advice to the people appearing in district court.

Dr. Brown advised the new advocates on how to deal with victims who need medical attention.

The Reverend Presnall explained how religion enters into how victims and others view the problem.

The new advocates will join a small group of over volunteers active in the Family Crisis Center.





tributions, with the bulk of funding from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

During Wednesday's meeting plans were discussed for security fencing and lighting and for a crash-fire-rescue building to be built with a half-million dollar FAA grant. That project will be on a 90 percent federal and 10 percent local agreement.

In spite of several disputes between the village and county over the regional airfield, airport manager Tim Morris said traffic counts continue to be up. He said airport users are pleased with the new airport.

But, according to Albuquerque attorney William H. Carpenter, at least one pilot is not so happy with the new facility. Carpenter, contacted by telephone, said he wrote the village a letter notifying councilors of a possible claim under New Mexico's tort liability law.

That claim is related to an accident at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport, said Carpenter. He said the village charged his client \$700 to move the airplane after it crashed across the road from the airport.

Carpenter was unwilling to discuss details of the letter he sent on behalf of a Texas man.

possibly capital, charge, Askew said he doesn't believe the state is going to be able to prove premeditation in this case.

Hutson, who hasn't made a statement since his arrest, agreed on Thursday to an interview at the jail with The News. Askew intervened, advising his client not to speak, and canceled the meeting.

The two unemployed men lived at the Ruidoso residence with their mother. According to police, the victim had a history of mental problems.

The Hutson murder is the first in the village since last year's double slaying in Midtown.

Constance Schiller and Joseph "Jose" Jiminez, two Ruidoso hairdressers, both died July 8 after a quick, but violent, encounter in front of Something Special, 2204 Sudderth Drive.

"We don't know who stabbed who first," said deputy medical examiner Jim Stover, who pronounced the two dead at the scene. That mystery has never been solved, although the Office of the Medical Examiner confirmed that both died of stab wounds.

A pair of scissors, a comb and a knife were taken as evidence at the scene.

Police and court reports indicate past troubles between the 43-year-old Schiller and the 41-year-old Jiminez who were at one time partners in Mr. Joseph's The Mane Place, 925 Sudderth Drive.

Schiller was working on July 3, at the hair salon at Something Special. According to witnesses, Jiminez came to the shop and the two argued.

By the time police were called to the scene both Schiller and Jiminez had suffered the fatal wounds.



The findings made headlines. Public school administrators always refer in writing to the test as "NMHSCE." The next time you see those people, ask them to pronounce it for you.

Where NMHSCE was born/hatched:

The 1986 New Mexico Public School Reform Act required in the Public School Code 22-2-3.4.D that, starting with students entering the ninth grade in 1986-87, "no student shall receive a high school diploma who has not passed a state competency examination in the subject areas of reading, English, math, science, and social science."

Before NMHSCE, there was The High School Proficiency Exam. The problem was that students could fail it, and still graduate. And as for the students who passed, they excitedly looked forward to...a gold star on their diploma. The resemblance to brushing your teeth did not go unnoticed by numerous legislators, who from time-to-time came after the Proficiency Exam with fangs bared.

Tenth-grade students in February were NMHSCE's first victims. The ones who passed, escaped. Those who didn't are fortunate indeed; they get to retake NMHSCE in the eleventh and twelfth grades.

I started stalking NMHSCE after reading this headline in *The Albuquerque Journal* (June 24): "Test Trips 31% of Sophomores. Anglo Students Score Higher Than Minorities."

Wait a second. Is the bottle half empty or half full? We could just as truthfully say that 69% of the sophomores passed a test that logically could be intended for seniors. Perhaps the test is too easy.

I marched over to the Department of Education Building across from the Capitol. Could I get a copy of the infamous NMHSCE? Bud Hall, of the Department's Evaluation, Testing, and Data Management in Room 124, humored me. The test questions were secret, he said. However, he provided me with information about the results.

NMHSCE consists of 150 multiple-choice questions and 1 essay, in the areas of reading, English, math, science and social science. To pass the test, a student must pass all five areas or "subtests."

Of the 17,653 students tested, here's what happened:

All subtests, Number 12,099,

Percent 68.5%
Four subtests, Number 2,745,
Percent 15.5%
Three subtests, Number 1,299,
Percent 7.4%
Two subtests, Number 707,
Percent 4.2%
One subtest, Number 423,
Percent 2.4%
No subtests, Number 350,
Percent 2.0%

Unless my eyes are deceiving me, 84% of all sophomores are either already through the gate, or about to be. Less than 10% (those who passed two subtests and worse), or 1,500 kids in the entire New Mexico sophomore class, are in trouble.

What about the ethnic issue? The percentages of Anglos who passed ranged from 94%-96% on the subtests; for Hispanics, from 83%-88%; for Blacks, 81%-87%; for Indians, from 76%-85%.

The question is, why? Let's go where *The Journal* feared to tread, beyond ethnicity and race.

"We're looking at the Socio-Economic Status factor," Bud Hall said. SES is shorthand for poor and everything that goes with it. He noted one item is especially important: "The key factor is language skills." Where the main language spoken at home is English, test scores are about the same.

There are other complicating factors. I suspect that to some extent, what is really being measured is the difference in tenth-grade instruction around New Mexico.

Indians, for example are concentrated in McKinley and San Juan. How did all students--Anglos and Black, Spanish and Indian--attending schools in those counties compare to students elsewhere? Maybe, the low scores obtained by Indians are partly due to where, not who, they are.

The real problem may be that certain school districts are not getting the job done. That simple fact shouldn't be lost in other concerns.

Finally, the fact that over two-thirds of all sophomores passed NMHSCE should not be an automatic cause for rejoicing. It's not enough to find that the bottle is half-full.

We need to go further, and ask: full of what? ***

New Mexico isn't alone in such problems. This headline was in *Denver's Rocky Mountain News*: "Denver Schools' Test Scores Rising. Blacks, Hispanics Still Lag Far Behind." The article stressed that there were vast differences among scores for students, according to which school they attended. For example, "The most impressive scores in the district came from Knight Elementary School. In capitalization and math concepts, only







Anybody who has spent any significant amount of time at the Ruidoso Downs Racetrack is sure to recognize Hazel Shaw.

Her friendly smile has graced the pari-mutuel windows at the track for 34 years, and at the rate she's going, she may well be there for another 34 years.

Her customers have included everybody from city folk to farmers to rich Texans to celebrities such as Audie Murphy, Walter Matthau and Alexis Smith.

Shaw started with the track in 1954 at a \$2 window, and has moved her way to the \$50 window where she has been, with her inseparable partner - Dorothy Koyk, for 25 years.

"Oh, but it's nothing like it used to be," she adds, remembering a time when thousand-dollar bets at her window were the norm, rather than the exception.

Since the fall of the economy in West Texas, things have fallen off somewhat at the track,

But she still has her regular customers.

"People like to come to this track," she said, noting the friendliness of the people at the track. "They come here to have a good time. Some of these guys that are making \$2 and \$4 bets used to be the ones betting \$200 and \$300."

"But I like it here," she says, throwing a quick glance over at Koyk, who is whizzing her fingers over the keys, while a customer counts out his bet money. "I enjoy it or I wouldn't have stayed here this long."
