The popular basketball star was found strangled, her body half-submerged in the Rio Ruidoso.

Lincoln County Sheriff's Department investigated, questioned dozens of people and finally charged a classmate, Matt Surratt, with the murder. However, after six months in jail, charges against Surratt were dismissed when District Judge Richard A. Parsons determined there was insufficient evidence to go forward with a trial.

Katina's father, Arturo Chavez, is frustrated over the entire situation. Just before Thanksgiving, Chavez began circulating a petition calling for a grand jury to review the murder case.

According to state law, a petition must contain 275 names of registered Lincoln County voters to be valid. As of December 12, Chavez was not sure how many names are on the several copies being circulated.

"It takes time to get names," he said. "I can't just say 'sign your name' and leave. They want me to stay and visit," said Chavez.

The petition may not be necessary, as District Judge Parsons already has convened a grand jury with juror selection to begin on January 6, 1989.

Chavez had heard of the grand jury, but was one called just for

## High winds cause power outage Sunday night

Wild weather contributed to a power outage in much of Ruidoso Sunday night.

According to Texas-New Mexico Power Company (TNMP) district manager Buddy Bundick, a transformer in the Ruidoso substation, located just off Highway 70, exploded about 9:45 p.m., leaving much of Midtown without power. Bundick said the problem was caused by wet weather.

Power was restored by TNMP crews about 10:30 p.m. Sunday.

The Ruidoso Police Department said they received no calls about problems created by the outage.

The weather continued to be a problem through the night and into Monday morning as TNMP crews were trying to locate a problem on the lines which transmit power to

Ski Apache and Buck Mountain transformers.

Bundick said the isolated location of the power lines makes it difficult to find the problem area. Power to Ski Apache has been "off and on," Bundick said.

Wet, broken limbs on the power lines can cause the lines to short-out and discontinue power, Bundick said.

Crews were working on the problem Monday morning.

Transformers on Buck Mountain, including the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department communications and television communications, were without power Monday morning, said sheriff's department spokespersons. The same lines which transmit power to Ski Apache also provide power to the transformers.





his daughter's case. Chavez said he wants answers to some questions.

"I feel I've been in the dark," Chavez said, adding the sheriff's department has avoided him, not answering his calls or giving him any reassurance the case is still being investigated.

Last Monday, Chavez questioned Lincoln County Sheriff Don Samuels about the investigation.

"We've got a polygraph test set up on someone," Samuels replied. However, Samuels added, "I can't go around saying what I'm doing."

Chavez told Samuels he has not seen any sheriff's department personnel in the valley.

"I don't want people seeing us, they need to be discreet," Samuels said. "I've been at this many years, it's the way I operate."

Chavez said he is afraid the department will not find anything out, and the situation will stay "this way forever."

"I hope not," Samuels said.

Samuels assured Chavez his department continued the murder investigation, even after Surratt was acquitted.

With two weeks left in his term as sheriff, Samuels said he will "turn over everything" to James McSwane who was elected to fill that position for the next two years.

Chavez reminded Samuels 10 months have passed since the murder.

"Everyone has a different viewpoint," Samuels said. "My ways may not be the best, but so far we've done as much as we can. A lot of people don't want to get involved."

Samuels added, "I can't force people. Somebody knows something."

He also said he is questioning people now, but he did not want to hurt the chances of finding someone. The petition and grand jury had nothing to do with the questioning and polygraph, he said.

"I'll be more than glad to present all the information to the grand jury," Samuels said.

Chavez questioned why the department did not hire "good investigators" early in the case.

"I had good investigators out there," Samuels said. "I don't run podunk investigations."

"I have a lot of pressure to know," Chavez said.

"That might be a good indication," Samuels said.

Samuels told Chavez he has only a few days in office and he is doing all he can.

"Since I've been sheriff people have started rumors that I am not doing my job. You can't believe rumors. I'll tell you the way it is, people are getting you stirred up with rumors," Samuels concluded.

"It's not easy, waiting all this time," Chavez said. "I have to keep after it."

Judge Parsons said he will not call a special, separate grand jury for the Chavez case. However, he does not have control over what inquiries will be made by the grand jury.

Judge Parsons said the grand jury may inquire into any public offense committed and eligible for trial in the county, which is not barred from prosecution by a statute of limitations and upon which no valid indictment or information has been filed.

The grand jury may inquire into the condition of every person imprisoned in the county not lawfully committed by a court and not in-

dicted or informed against.

The grand jury also may inquire into the condition and management of every public jail or prison in the county.

The panel may review matters relating to alleged violations of all laws of New Mexico which would be grounds for removal or suspension of public officers and/or employees, and may return accusations against any public person upon showing probable cause.

Parsons stressed the grand jury was not called for one specific item. He listed several past special grand juries, including the McKnight panel and the jury that investigated the Lincoln County Commission.

"People think the district judge conducts the grand jury inquiries, we don't, we just convene and give instructions," he said.

The grand jury is impaneled for 90 days, and during that time the district attorney or New Mexico Attorney General can present "anything" to them, Parsons said. However, judgments must be based on "credible evidence."

The statutes of limitation on capital offenses are 15 years on a felony which might result in a sentence of death or life in prison and also 15 years for first degree felony.

District Attorney Bert Atkins said he is "obligated" and "bothered by ethical canon" not to comment about what he will present to the grand jury.

"I intend to use the grand jury to the fullest extent to obtain indictments," Atkins said.

He added he plans to be very "involved" with the grand jury and probably will be present during some of the proceedings.

Santa Cops is heading into the final stages of this year's efforts to provide Christmas food and toys for the needy in Lincoln County.


Christmas baskets are set to be delivered on Thursday and Friday, December 22-23, so donations are needed at Santa's Workshop by Thursday.

Donations may be delivered to the Ruidoso Police Department or left in receptacles at schools and grocery stores.


Santa Cops added the following to its list of elves and helpers this year:

These words are the English translation of an old German song sung all over the world around Christmas time. The Christmas tree custom originated in the Nordic countries and was introduced into the rest of Europe and into this country by the early German settlers.

This is being sent to you two hours after high noon on December 15, and all the vales in a world of white and gray and many evergreen hues.

Since early morning the wind has been bringing in tiny round bits of fine frozen mist, so that the pines, cedars and bare river trees are all powdered in pure white under a sky of solid gray.

You can easily see how our ancestors away to the northland, brought the young evergreens into the Christmas celebration. Take today, the young piñon trees all up and down the vale delight your eye as they are decorated with these tiny beads of frozen mist which

sparkle and sing in the dreamy half light under the thin clouds overhead.

### A Natural Born Christmas Tree

Time was here in Lincoln County, say 50 or 60 years ago, that you could take your pick of any Christmas tree; Douglas fir, spruce, white pine were the customary Christmas trees. The piñon was overlooked in the search for the perfect Christmas tree.

Nowadays, since we've tried to save the spruce, hemlock, balsam and fir, the piñon tree has come into its own and has become very popular as a Christmas tree.

The piñon is in a class by itself among cone-bearing evergreens. In its early life—until it reaches a height of say 8 or 10 feet—it keeps the typical conical form of a Christmas tree. Then, as it grows older, it begins branching out to become the tree with the spreading bushy top which is a landmark throughout all New Mexico. Thus it is that the piñon spends the first years of its

life forming itself into a Christmas tree especially for us.

All the other coniferous evergreens keep the same shape all life long, finally growing into giant Christmas trees.

It turns out that the piñon doesn't have to take a back seat to any tree as a Christmas tree. Its branches are strong, able to hold the weight of decorations or lights without too much bending. And they have great vitality, staying fresh and green for quite awhile. Also, it has a very fragrant aroma that reminds you you are at home in New Mexico.

This reminds me of some words that came running through my mind years ago:

Light in my heart in step,  
I climb the mountainside  
Before the sun had shown its gold

Into this snowy vale,  
Going from pine to spruce to fir,  
Looking for the perfect Christmas tree.

All morning long I searched and then

Down near the house I chose  
A humble little piñon tree  
Waiting there all year for me.

Let us keep looking for someone to help have a good Christmas, and let us rejoice as the birthday of our infant savior draws ever near.



## Warriors open wrestling season at Cruces tourney

### Coach Ames looks forward to a good year

The Wrestling Warriors were among 28 teams, nearly all AAAA caliber, that participated in the prestigious Las Cruces Tournament recently.

The Warriors didn't fare too well at this early season tournament. All the more reason to observe what Coach Gerald Ames had to say about each of the Warriors. Ames is confident of the talent on the squad and fans have the opportunity to witness week-by-week improvement in wrestling technique by the different weight classes.

"We were potentially good," said Ames. "The fact is, the football program just ended and we're out of shape for wrestling so there are a few problems that have to be solved."

"Traditionally, we compete very well with the AAAA teams and we will again. We've got the talent, it's just going to take us awhile to put it together."

"The team is young this year," he said, "nearly all sophomores and juniors. It's such a highly skilled sport it takes several years to reach that upper level of competition. With this young team, we are just reaching those levels this year."

"There's been a change in the weight classes this year. There are now 13 weight classes. The committee has eliminated the 98-pound weight class, preferring to start at 103."

A national study suggests most male students in high school weigh between 120-152 pounds.

James Atwood at 103 wrestled twice, losing a close first match to Las Cruces 9-12. Atwood lost his second match to Carlsbad, the team to beat for the Warriors, in a toss-up match, 7-6.

"Atwood could have won either of those matches," said the coach. "It was just a case of two days practice."

Henry Kayitah at 112-pound class lost his first match 1-8 against El Paso Parkland. Kayitah was pinned in his second match with El Paso Eastwood, traditionally the toughest team in El Paso.

The Warriors were without a wrestler for the 119-pound class this week.

Eric Collins wrestled the 125-pound class. Eric wrestled Mike Madrid from Silver City. Eric was pinned in the first period with the match 5-7. Collins won his second match against Carlsbad, 9-7. Finally, he was pinned in a tied match against Jefferson High School in El Paso. He was pinned, according to the coach, because he made the same mistake twice.

"Eric brings his knees too close to his head, when he does that he gets into trouble. We're working on correcting the problem," Ames said.

Mario Portillo, a sophomore fairly new to the program with plenty of potential, won 14-10 against Andres High School in El Paso. Portillo was pinned at the end of his second match against Austin High School. In his third match Mario was pinned by Irving of El Paso.


"Mario has a lot of heart, but he has to practice on his technique, the talent is there."

Alfred Rue, 145-pound weight class, had never wrestled before his match against Deming. Neither wrestler scored points the first quarter. In the second period, Rue's lack of experience tired him and he was finally pinned near the end of the second period.

Rue's second match was against Parkland. Rue led that match 5-2, but was pinned in the second quarter.

"We are impressed with Rue's strength. As the season progresses, Alfred will become better and better. I'm confident of that."

Albert Flores, 152 pounds, is a good sophomore wrestler. In his

first match against Andres High School, Albert led 2-0 into the second period when he was pinned. In his second match against Austin, two seconds remained in the match when he was pinned.

"Albert has to learn how to shoot in and get his points. He's a good wrestler and he's coming along fast, but he just hasn't scored points well. He needs a lot of mat work."

Jesse Guardiola, 161-pound class, was ahead 11-5 in his match, but after three minutes, succumbed to exhaustion and was pinned. In

his second match against Las Cruces, Guardiola was ahead 6-0 before he became tired. With 13 seconds left in the match, Jesse was pinned.

"Jesse's only problem is that he got tired. He's been in football and is not in wrestling shape. I'm not sure he is going to be in shape for our Roswell match. He's not ready to go six minutes. Jesse will be one of our better athletes before the season ends. He's tough and powerful with great technique, a very aggressive wrestler."

Pete Baca wrestled in the 171-pound weight class although he weighs less than 160. Baca lost his first match to Jeff Hanks, 5-0. His second match against Ralph Jefferson he won, 9-6. Baca won his third match against Onate, 6-3. Baca met Hanks for a second time through the double elimination tournament and was pinned.

"Baca was 12 pounds lighter than the wrestlers in this class. He showed good strength and was a real surprise to us."

David Stevenson, 189-pound

class, met a Las Cruces wrestler in his first match and was pinned in the first period. Stevenson's second match against Onate, Stevenson had his wrestler on his back, leading 5-2 when he was reversed and pinned.

"David is very strong. He needs more work."

"Our team will become stronger as the football players work their way in. It's taken five years to get our program to the competitive level. We're turning the corner."



# Downs trustees hear from track manager

The Ruidoso Downs board of trustees met in regular session last Monday, December 12, at the Municipal Building.

Rick Henson, general manager of the Ruidoso Downs Race Track, addressed the board stating the improvements that were being made at the race track. Henson told the board that he had 100 dumpsters and a truck. Henson said he would be happy to meet with the mayor or the board to discuss the possibility of an arrangement that would be beneficial to the race track and the village of Ruidoso Downs. Mayor Jake Harris stated that he would be happy to meet with Henson to discuss the matter.

Mayor Harris read the proclamation from Governor Garrey Carruthers declaring January 6, 1989, as New Mexico Day. The proclamation is celebrating New Mexico's 77th birthday. Trustee Webb moved to adopt the proclamation and the motion carried unanimously.

Oscar Hoffer brought his water bills for the board to review. Hoffer stated that the last water bill he received was too costly in comparison with his previous bills. The board decided to replace Hoffer's water meter and to test the defective meter for several months to

determine whether the meter was faulty and the amount of water used. At the end of the test period, a determination will be made on water bill adjustment.

Part-time Judge Harrold Mansell stated that he had a problem with the way the snow grader distributed the snow on his street. Mayor Harris said the snow was

usually pushed off the streets to the side of the road which created a driveway nuisance for home owners. Harris said the new effort was to distribute the snow on both sides of the street and in the middle when necessary to prevent blocking driveways.

Mansell said there were two signs at the All American Park that

should not be there. One sign read, "No Trespassing," the other sign read, "Not responsible for accidents."

Mayor Harris stated the signs would be removed.

Mansell said the 15 MPH speed zones posted were not legal. Harris said the state would be contacted regarding the speed zones.

# Santa Fe case names local bank officer

A lawsuit filed in Santa Fe December 12, names Ralph Petty, president of The Bank of Ruidoso and Ben A. Lanford of Albuquerque, and claims they defrauded a Santa Fe bank.

According to published reports, the two are accused of defrauding the Bank of Santa Fe through a real estate transaction that was negotiated when Petty was president of that bank and Lanford was co-chairman of the board of directors.

The suit, filed by bank attorney John W. Boyd in district court in Santa Fe, alleges the two secured a lease from a branch bank for a building in which Petty and his former wife, Gayle Petty, own a half interest. The Bank of Santa Fe claims in the suit that Petty's interest in the property was not disclosed to anyone during negotiations.

The bank claims in the suit that Petty sold a quarter interest in the property to Lanford for \$200,000, with the two concealing the transaction from other officers of the bank.

The Bank of Santa Fe asks the court to award damages, order an accounting of all profits made by the defendants through the lease and the ownership of the property and to put profits made through the transaction into a trust fund for the bank. The plaintiff also asks the court to order a new lease and award punitive damages.

Petty couldn't be reached for comment early today (Monday).

## Reporter's Round

Christmas is only a few days away.

Usually, I have my house decorated (with big help from my kids Chris and Lily and a little help from little Kate) by the first part of December.

This year I'm a little slow. Just the lights have been put up and a few Christmas cards.

Our family has decided not to cut Christmas trees, as we preferred to keep those little things alive on our land. Living in a small house, we also had little or no room for a tree.

One of the favorite things at my house is to decorate our three-foot-tall jade plant. This Cherry family tradition started a few years ago, when the plant was somewhat smaller.

Not knowing where to put a Christmas tree, and not really wanting to kill a living tree by cutting it and displaying it for just a short period of time, the kids decided the jade plant was the answer.

So the kids decorated the jade plant, with all the little twinkling lights and balls that would go on a "real" Christmas tree.

One thing that has always bothered me about Christmas, even when very young, are all the forlorn, tossed-out Christmas trees after the holidays. I always wanted to take them home.

Those poor, once-living trees that still had tinsel hanging on, tossed into garbage cans, thrown out along the roads.

Discarded trees are not useful for firewood or even kindling. Trying to burn an entire tree is asking for problems, it would burn so quickly and hotly a possible flue fire could happen.

When I was young and doing club projects, my conservation project was to create a wildlife break. To accomplish the break, the project book suggested collecting discarded Christmas trees and placing them in an eroding arroyo.

The placement not only kept the arroyo (or gully) from eroding further, but provided shelter to little animals which live in the area.

The project was much more fun than just tossing the "unwanted" memory of Christmas into the trash to be tossed into the garbage dump.

Back to cutting living trees. If I add up cutting a tree for every year we've lived on our property, it would amount to 10 trees. Best to plant trees rather than cut them, I thought.

So, in past years I've tried different ways to have that evergreen smell in the house, without cutting and thus killing a tree.

One of my favorite ways is to take pruning clippers and snip full-needed branches from a BIG piñon tree. Gathered and tied the branches can resemble a tree.

Take the branches and put them in a weighted bucket (with rocks in it) and fill with water until the ends of the branches are covered.

Then decorate. The same branches can be tied together to form a wreath, or tied onto a rope for a garland to drape over the windows.

All of this with little or no cost. Of course, one could use pine tree branches, or any other evergreen tree.

Decorations do not have to come from the store. In past years, our trees have had paper chains, aluminum foil balls and stars, popcorn chains, cranberry chains, the children's Christmas drawings (which all school children bring home at this time of year), cut-out Christmas cards from years past and so on.

So an empty pocketbook or adverse feelings about killing trees should not stop anyone from having a touch of Christmas in their home.

Another way to have the real tree is to either purchase or transplant a living tree. A potted tree does take a little more effort, as its needs are different from a cut tree.

First of all, don't keep the living tree inside the heated house too long. Two weeks is the limit, from everything I've read. Also if the tree is brought into the house from outside, it must go through a transition period.

The transition is to place the tree in a cool place such as an enclosed porch or garage for a few days, until the tree adjusts to the warmer climate. Then bring it into the house, away from all heat sources, including very sunny windows.

Keep the soil watered, but like Sally says, not soggy wet.

When returning the tree to outdoors after Christmas, take the same steps of transition.

A potted tree can last for years if cared for properly, and can get very large. Some people put the pot (or barrel or whatever) on a platform with wheels, or put handles to carry the plant, as they can get very heavy.

Potted trees can be expensive from the nursery. If you have a green thumb, you can dig one and pot it. However, dig one on private property only after permission is obtained.

Forest Service policy on digging trees is unknown to me, but this time of year, the ground can be too

cold to dig, anyway. However you get your Christmas greenery, let the children decorate also. Much of Christmas is for them, so let them hang the ornaments and put up the tinsel as well as hang the stockings for dear old Santa to fill.



## Letters to the editor

DEAR EDITOR:

On October 3, the Humane Society of the United States launched a nationwide campaign to spread a message that you should be ashamed to wear fur. The goal of the "Shame of Fur" campaign is to make the wearing of fur garments socially unacceptable. At this time of year, when fur coats are a common sight in Ruidoso, it's questionable as to how many of these status seeking people know the origins for their "gorgeous" furs!

People are simply unaware of the horrible suffering on which the fur trade is based. Perhaps the most successful myth the fur industry has perpetuated is that fur coats originated from animals raised on "ranches" are a humane alternative to those from animals who were trapped in the wild. When, in fact, fur ranching is just as cruel as trapping!

In 1986 5.2 million wild animals were killed for their fur on American ranches. Many creatures who, in the wild, would have a range of several square miles, find themselves trapped for life in tiny wire mesh cages ("ranches") in which they can barely turn around!

"Ranchers" often kill small animals, such as minks and chinchillas, by breaking their necks manually or with mechanical devices. Another killing method is to gas the animals with carbon monoxide or carbon dioxide which can sometimes result in the animals dying slowly or reviving under the shock of being skinned!

Electrocution is a preferred

method of execution for larger animals such as foxes. The fox is forced to bite on a copper cable while a metal screw-driver-like object is forced into the animal's rectum. The "rancher" steps on an electrical switch sending electrical shocks through the animal. (It takes up to 18 foxes to make one fur coat!) So much for the excuse that it's okay to wear ranch raised furs!

As for animals trapped in the wild, did you know that 17 million animals including wolves, foxes, coyotes, raccoons, bobcats and beavers were trapped in the U.S. in 1986? In fact, the U.S. is the world's largest exporter of pelts - virtually all of them trapped animals! Most of these animals were caught in the infamous leghold trap, an instrument so torturous it has been banned in more than 65 countries. The tremendous force with which the trap slams down on the paw or leg of the animal can be likened to a car door being slammed on a child's hand crushing it for up to 2 weeks!

If the animal survives in the trap for that long it is only to face an even more grisly death by being beaten, suffocated, or drowned. And would you believe that commercial trapping of animals for their fur is encouraged and widely practiced in our national wildlife "refuges" and parks?!

All this agony - all this waste - for what? You should be ashamed to wear fur!!




