The new regulations issued by the Environmental Improvement include a clause on recycling. According to section 301 , graph K, a landfill operator shall conduct recycling operations in a sanitary manner, confined to an area remote from the operating face
of the landfill, and in a manner which does not interfere with, or delay the operation of the landfill." And in paragraph $L$, an operator shall "remove all recyclable materials recovered from the landfill daily, or store them so as not to
create a nuisance vector harborage, or public health hazard.". Municipalities which encourage recycling in their communities strive for a 25 percent reduction of
total household waste through the removal of recyclables, said Jim Edwarda of the Ruidoso Environmen-
tal Improvement Division (EID) and a member of the environmenta group EAGLE.

## EDITORIAL

New Mexico has reason to celebrate the decision last week to allow the state to repay Texas just $\$ 14$ milion for water misappropriated from the Pecos Basin.

During the longstanding legal dispute between the two neighboring states, Texas was demanding to be reimbursedin water-water that would have to be takenfrom water rightowners throughout the basin in such amounts that it might have dried up the farming from here to the Texas border.

New Mexico never backed down, insisting that the debt be repaid with money instead of the life sustaining and limited water supplies.

And New Mexico prevailed, not only through the agreement that Texas would accept money in place of water, but also in the amount of money.

Throughout the trial, expert witnesses bandied about figures on the amount of water lost to Texas, the economic loss to that state and the economic benefit to New Mexico. Damages as high as $\$ 900$ million were claimed by Texas for New Mexico's liability for breaches of the 1949 Pecos River Compact.

We bellepve the negotiated settlement, including the $\$ 14$ million cash payment, is fair to both parties.- fj
