Mother nature batters Ruidoso area with wind, fire and snow

High winds Saturday contributed to a rash of grass fires in the area that started when a tree fell on a Texas-New Mexico Power Company power station at the Mescalero line.

Wind and fire gave way to snow by Sunday evening, and the Ruidoso area got a dose of ice and snow that prompted school closings and shortened schedules throughout the county. Schools in Capitan, Ruidoso and Hondo were canceled.

As firefighters from Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, the United States Forest Service, Mescalero and Bonito battled the blaze that raged down both sides of U.S. Highway 70 Saturday, area residents were evacuated from the Camelot area and mobile home parks located near the fast-moving fire.

Ruidoso Police called on volunteers to meet at the old Safeway to be driven to the scene to

help fight the fire. Dozens of Ruidoso citizens responded, bringing their own shovels and equipment to squelch the blaze.

Lincoln County Sheriff's Department Deputy Dave Pfeffer assisted with traffic control with that fire.

Ruidoso firefighters spent from 11 a.m. until about 6 p.m. at the scene of the fire that blackened a strip from the Mescalero line into the village.

A slurry bomber from Holloman Air Force Base made three swipes over the fire and extinguished the fiery blaze. Firefighters expected the blaze to require six doses of slurry, but the huge aircraft was able to stop the fire in just three drops.

About the same time the Highway 70 blaze was recorded, a large tree blew over at the corner of Carrizo Creek and Grindstone Canyon roads, causing a short power outage

through much of Ruidoso. Crewmembers from Texas-New Mexico Power Company responded quickly to the downed tree, freeing the lines and restoring power to the village.

A little grass fire at Hull Road and Cree Meadows Drive was quickly stopped late Saturday afternoon. Fire Department reports indicate electrical wires caused that fire.

A structure fire Sunday caused about \$6,000 in damages to a log cabin at 112 Lower Terrace. Fire Department reports indicate the fire started in the fireplace and then involved surrounding grass.

Firefighters spent close to an hour at the scene.

In Capitan Saturday, sparks from a welding unit were the cause of a one acre grass fire in the Hideaway Hills Subdivision. According

Engineers pull the plug on dam

Village staff and officials met recently with representatives of the State Engineer Office and agreed that the Grindstone Canyon Dam should be drained so that control joint sealant can be replaced.

Village manager Frank Potter and John Shaw, consulting engineer, said the 600 acre-feet of water in the reservoir will be released when the State Engineer concurs on the rate of release.

Shaw, who inspects the dam on a weekly basis, has recommended the water be released at a rate of six cubic feet per second (cfs), a rate he believes won't cause any physical or environmental damage

downstream. He said the drainage wasn't recommended because of safety, but because the sealant can best be installed in a dry, concrete surface.

The project is progressing with a reservation of rights, since the village expects the contractor to pay for the repair.

Since the Grindstone Canyon Dam is among the last of the first generation of roller-compacted concrete dams, the technology has continued to develop, said Shaw. He said when the dam was designed, no RCC dam designs called for the control joint sealants.

In 1986, Grindstone was one of eight RCC structures in the world. There are now RCC dams in China,

South Africa and Australia, as well as in the United States. Potter said a member of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers called him recently to discuss RCC dams, saying plans are under way to build one in Puerto Rico.

It has since been learned, as the number of RCC dams has increased to 30, that the sealant will improve the dam.

"Technology on RCC dams is changing almost daily," said Shaw. "As engineers learn more, they're improving the product," he added.

He said cracks in the dam that weren't visible in July are as wide as a half inch in cold weather since the concrete dam contracts. He said that's normal.

"Our studies show we'll have a significant decrease in seepage after we replace the sealant," said Shaw. "We will have seepage when we refill the dam," he added.

That seepage, a major concern at one point, was down to 478 gallons per minute on January 30, said Shaw.

Potter said when water was diverted into the dam, the dam leakage became a concern and the diversion was stopped. He said engineers began looking at the joint sealant several months ago, as they made their various checks. The dam is equipped with gauges that monitor intake, release, movement

Opponents wage campaign to halt golf course plan

Opponents of a proposal to develop a golf course on the old airport land came out Wednesday to air their complaints during a meeting of the Municipal Airport Planning Board.

They're continuing their campaign to stop plans by R.D. Hubbard, president of Ruidoso Downs Racing, Inc., and Jim Colbert of Jim Colbert Golf to build a golf course on the land they said belongs to the citizens of the village with a petition drive and grass roots appeal.

The petition, placed in various businesses and in the hands of several individuals, says:

"The undersigned, being residents of Ruidoso or the surrounding area, do hereby protest the use or development of public lands for private enterprise, and specifically, the proposed development of a hotel and golf course on the old airport property in Ruidoso."

During the Wednesday meeting, audience members voiced environmental concerns including those associated with the chemicals used to maintain a golf course. Gary Dise, naming a chemical he said is used on golf courses, questioned what happens when those substances travel downstream or soak into the water table. He questioned if they might end up in the Hondo Valley,

perhaps killing the apple trees.

"I'm asking the board to consider the working people," said Cleston Pritchett, calling on the planning group to concentrate on uses that will bring jobs to the village and stabilize the village economy.

"We've lost a lot of homes ... lost a lot of jobs," said Pritchett. He said the area has a five-star hotel at the Inn.

"People aren't pouring in—last weekend they had 35 rooms rented out," said Pritchett.

He also reminded the board of its offer to help find a home for the teen center located on the airport land that will have to be moved when development begins.

David Morin, commenting on the planning process, echoed Pritchett's call for a place for working people. He commended the planning group, and urged them to work for the people of Ruidoso.

Morin, who noted he has some background in planning, also recommended the board look into the environmental concerns discussed Wednesday. He said planners know that a golf course is the most extensive use of land for the most exclusive use by only a few people.

Previous meetings have been marked by the almost wholehearted agreement that a golf course/hotel

of the dam and more. The village has asked the Environmental Improvement Division to help monitor any changes as the release is under way, but Shaw doesn't predict any adverse affect on water quality. He said the water will not be contaminated water that has seeped through, but water from the lake which has a ph level of 12.

"We're in the parameter of safe water," said Potter, and Shaw stressed the water is non-toxic and completely safe.

"It's to our benefit to get the water out and do it right this time," said Potter.

Shaw said the repair will take from three to four weeks once the dam is drained, and then the water can begin to be diverted and the dam can be filled.

He said the reason he, Potter and Councillor Jess Stinson went to Santa Fe was to clarify a statement in a letter from the State Engineer Office indicating the dam should be drained in the interest of safety and protection of life and property. Potter asked the state to modify wording, since it was agreed the dam posed no threat to life or property, and is safe.

Potter and Shaw were pleased that the State Engineer and his staff agreed.

Shaw said last week that his weekly inspections include looking for any adverse structural changes.

He said he monitors pore pressure and lateral movement, goes through the gallery to look for any changes in flow and measures seepage.

He said there is no lateral movement, and the seepage is mainly in the gallery as called for in the dam designs. He said uses a graph to compare seepage with other similar dams, and that chart shows the Grindstone Canyon Dam seepage is decreasing on a per unit basis even

before the joint control sealant is installed.

"Grindstone is still a wonderful recreational area for Ruidoso," said Potter, looking forward to a full reservoir, complete with fish, geese and elk.

Even now, the dam is a real tourist attraction, said Potter. He said a number of recreational possibilities are being discussed.

"It has everything going for it," said Potter.

The art auction was a highlight with profits going to the Children's Hospital of New Mexico and CARE, Incorporated of Ruidoso.


A late-night breakfast buffet of

It's not over yet— Indians appeal ruling

As members of the Water Defense Association (WDA) were celebrating the judge's ruling in a water case involving the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe and downstream water users, attorneys for the tribe were preparing to file an appeal.

Retired State Supreme Court Justice LaFel Oman, in a 13-page ruling, denied the tribe rights to as much as 18,000 acre feet, instead allowing current water uses of 1,372.4 acre feet annually and an additional 950 acre feet for future non-agricultural growth needs.

"The decision is fair because it provides adequate water to meet everyone's needs," said Phelps Anderson, president of the WDA. Neil Stillinger, water attorney for the Village of Ruidoso, also was happy with the decision. The village is a member of the WDA and also was a party to the suit.

But Wendell Chino, president of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, at a press conference Wednesday in Albuquerque, said the tribe will appeal. He said the ruling, if left unchallenged, would cripple the tribe's plans to develop a large agricultural operation on the northern section of the reservation. He said the operation is needed to cut into the 45 percent unemployment rate on the reservation.

"The court wants to saddle the Mescalero Apache Tribe with stagnation and this is totally unacceptable to the tribe," said Chino.

In a news conference Friday in Roswell, Anderson and WDA executive director Hubert Quintana voiced disappointment in the prospect of more litigation in the case that has been in the courts for more than 10 years.

"We're disappointed and disheartened," said Quintana.

"Mr. Chino's call for an appeal was premature," said Anderson, noting the ruling was mailed Thursday, he received his copy on Tuesday and Chino announced plans to appeal on Wednesday. Anderson said that action didn't allow enough time to fully review the 13-page document.

"WDA is determined not to allow this instant appeal to wash away the fact the ruling was both fair and reasonable," said Anderson.

Quintana said the WDA already has either spent or incurred expenses totaling \$574,000. He expects the appeal to cost about \$300,000. The WDA has raised \$378,000, and the balance of the half-million in current expenses is a deficit.

Anderson said the United States government is actually carrying the case for the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, and estimates on how much has been spent so far have been as high as \$3 million.

"We've asked for cost information and never been able to get it," said Quintana in a telephone interview Sunday.

"My single greatest concern at this time is the secrecy over the amount of federal dollars spent on the other side since 1977," said Anderson. "The only information our association has been able to see is incomplete and non-specific. Our books are open for inspection—we have no secrets," he added.

"Why are we then denied the opportunity to learn more about the untold millions spent on this case from the beginning to this point?" he asked.

Quintana disagreed the decision will cause stagnation for the tribe, noting the Mescalero Apache Indians already have been very successful in diversifying their economic base for non-agricultural uses that include the Inn of the Mountain Gods, Ski Apache and the forestry, sawmill and elk hunting operations.

"The court evidently is very concerned about the monetary interests of non-Indians. But I suggest to you, what about the monetary interests of the tribe and its members?" said Chino Wednesday, but Quintana said the tribe's attorneys successfully blocked testimony over economic impacts to people off the reservation.

"The court's ruling states in effect that the private monetary interests of individuals can defeat the promises of the U.S. in a duly ratified treaty," said Chino, who

claims a treaty was signed in 1852 establishing the Mescalero Apache Indian Reservation. Oman ruled that treaty was a peace treaty, and the reservation wasn't established until 1873.

That was the contention of all the non-Indians in the case, said Quintana. He said the water and land were reserved in 1873, not 1852. He said the United States government established another reservation near Fort Sumner in 1864, and that land wouldn't have been reserved had the 1852 action done so.

Quintana said the 1852 document was an executive order, not a peace treaty. Judge Oman called it, in his order, a peace and amity treaty.

"The court needs to further define this principal," said Chino. "We do not intend to let the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe die on the vine as envisioned by the court."

Chino said if the tribe doesn't receive more water, the entire area of Otero and Lincoln counties will be affected.

"Economic growth of Ruidoso and the surrounding area has been tied to the continuing economic growth of the tribe," said Chino.

The court found that the agricultural project planned by the tribe is not economically feasible, said Quintana.

"No one ever gave a moment of thought as to what is best for our environment—a significantly reduced stream flow or no stream flow at all would have caused wide reaching negative impacts on the environment," said Anderson Friday. "The natural habitat of this entire area has been in jeopardy," he added.

"It still is," said Quintana Sunday. He said the WDA will wait and see when the appeal is filed before making further plans.

It's estimated the appeals process could take the case into the 21st century.

The WDA will meet at 7 p.m. Tuesday, February 7, in the gymnasium at Hondo High School.

to assistant fire chief Pat Huey, Ubaldo Skinner was welding Saturday when sparks ignited the dry grass.

The Capitan department, also was on standby Saturday to assist with the Highway 70 blaze.

When cold air surged into the area Sunday, it produced strong easterly winds at Carrizozo of 50 to 80 miles per hour (mph), according to meteorologist Bill Hostetter.

He said a Sheriff's deputy checked the anemometer at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport and it was recording 50 to 80 mph winds that did considerable damage in Carrizozo.

With seven inches of snowfall and minus two degree temperatures early today (Monday), Hostetter said the area is approaching records for both the snowfall and temperatures.

"It's going to be a prolonged situation," said Hostetter.

Village manager Frank Potter said he is waiting for a report from Barry Cole, emergency coordinator.

Potter praised emergency personnel and volunteers for the way they contained the fire and saved the town.

"They did a heck of a job," said Potter.

development as presented is the best course. Speakers have talked of the benefits accompanying the Hubbard plan to build the multi-million course at no cost or obligation to the village.

But Wednesday, those opposed to that plan added their feelings to the other views and applauded each other as they took turns at the microphone.

Board member Ovella Estes noted there are no magic answers.

"None of us have a magic wand or \$3 million to invest," said Estes. "We have to keep an open mind and think beyond ourselves," she added.

Another new element developed Wednesday when the board unanimously recommended the village pursue acquiring additional land. Chairman Frank Kolb said more land will be needed adjacent to the 160-acre tract, and the board agreed.

Hubbard and his group talked of placing a hotel on McCarty land adjacent to the municipal land, and it was learned Wednesday the village is expected to pursue the land acquisition.

Also Wednesday, Cleatus Richards, planning administrator,

explained how he reworked the golf course plan designed by Colbert's firm in order to find a place for a civic center. He said Colbert used inaccurate boundaries.

He reworked the Warrior Drive road through the property, and Rick Henson, Ruidoso Downs Race Track general manager who represented Hubbard Wednesday, said that could be a problem.

"First the road kind of meandered down through there and this one looks like a drag strip to Ruidoso High School," said Henson, noting that roadways, golfers and golf carts aren't compatible.

Richards said the entire property is bordered by a 50-foot easement for trails and paths dedicated to public use as required by the Master Plan.

"You keep taking more and more acreage," said Henson, adding there will be a point where the course can't be successful.

The Municipal Airport Planning Board has scheduled a public hearing at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, February 15, at Ruidoso Middle School. The group also meets at 2 p.m. Wednesday, February 8, in council chambers of Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

Weatherman recaps January conditions

January temperatures in Ruidoso were near seasonal, while precipitation was on the light side, with only three periods of minor amounts.

The total measured 0.41 inch of water equivalent which is 0.71 inch below normal. The snowfall of 2.7 inches was 6.9 inches below average and fell mainly on January 12 and 13. Traces of snow were recorded January 7, 25, 27 and 28, with light rain or freezing rain on January 4, 24 and 27.

The mean temperature for the month was 33.8 degrees or 0.4 degrees above average, while the average maximum of 48.2 degrees was 1.7 degrees below normal. The average minimum of 19.3 degrees

was 2.1 degrees above normal. The warmest temperature was 59 degrees on January 4; the coldest was 0 degrees on January 9. Minimum temperatures were below freezing on every day of the month.

Gusty winds occurred on January 4, 6, 12, 23 and 31. Some glazing or ice accumulation was recorded on January 4 and 27.

The average Ruidoso monthly snowfall total for February, compiled from 1958 to 1988, is 8.4 inches. The most February snow was in 1964, when 29 inches were recorded in Ruidoso. The least amount was in 1981 when less than one inch was recorded. In February, 1986 and 1987, Ruidoso received 20 inches each year. Four different years Ruidoso received 12 inches: in 1960, 1967, 1968 and 1973.

Sheriff reports on county activities

Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane reported several recent incidents.

Capitan resident Steven Woods was arrested January 28, and charged with DWI. Woods was out on bond on a former charge, when arrested, said McSwane.

According to official reports, he remains in the Lincoln County Jail with bond set at \$1,090.

Also on January 28, deputies responded to a call from Ski Apache, where James Haughone of Seminole, Texas, reported his skis were stolen while he was having lunch at a restaurant at the resort. The theft is still under investigation.

McSwane said a hit and run auto accident on January 28 in Hondo resulted in the arrest of 21-year-old Roswell resident Thomas Montoya. He was charged with DWI, driving with a revoked or suspended license, and reckless driving.

Montoya is free after posting \$1,700 bond, said McSwane.

No injuries resulted from the accident.

A hitch-hiker reported seeing barrels of what appeared to be an oil-based substance along Highway 54, north of Carrizozo on January 30.

The Lincoln County Sheriff's Department dispatched the State Police, who called the Environmental Improvement Division in Santa Fe. The EID Hazardous Materials team removed the barrels which were not leaking. No report has come from the EID, McSwane said.

In the February 19 edition The News reported that Richard Culhane was arrested and charged with larceny of more than \$250. McSwane told The News that Culhane was detained in the Lincoln County Jail because of his failure to appear on a previous bond.

Culhane, released on his own recognizance on the larceny charge, said the report was incorrect since he never failed to appear. McSwane confirmed Culhane's statement.

be tallied for prize drawings.



Recycling is answer for messy problem

EDCLC hires executive director

Puckett is on the job

The Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLC) has an executive director.

Organized more than one year ago, the EDCLC search committee has been in search of a director most of that time.

Thursday the board hired George Puckett.

Calling himself a "rare breed" of developer, Puckett is concerned with industrial development and with the environment.

"I want to help create jobs without cutting down one tree," he said during an interview Friday in the EDCLC office in Suite 3C of the Ruidoso Financial Center.

"I regard the environment and people as the greatest assets, and I want to make sure we protect both of those."

Puckett came from Austin, Texas, where he was involved in industrial real estate with emphasis on site location and working with corporations. He also marketed manufactured buildings in the southwest, mostly in small communities, he said.

He earned an electrical engineering degree at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas, and has a high-tech background.

He is single and has married children living in Texas.

Puckett said his first priority is to establish an action plan to organize and facilitate existing committees.

"I'm very excited about the communities in the county and the quality of life this county offers. I feel this county has tremendous possibilities for attracting quality industries," he concluded.

Recycling could eliminate more than half of all solid waste materials, according to members of Environmental Action Group Loving Earth (EAGLE).

Most people are familiar with aluminum can recycling, but may not realize that many materials, such as plastic, paper, tires and metal can be economically recycled. According to the group, Ruidoso taxpayers pay more than \$86,000 a year for transportation to dispose of the village's garbage. According to John Varley, finance director for the village, the salary budget for the sanitation department is \$249,409. Operating expenses budgeted this year are \$150,322.

Recycling just twice as much aluminum in the United States each year would cut down on air pollution caused by manufacturing by a million tons a year. More recycling also means less land needed for landfills.

New Mexico is being eyed by several states for possible landfill use. The state of Maryland is considering a site near Lordsburg for landfill use. The landfill would be 30 square miles, about the size of Santa Fe.

In the Ruidoso area, H&H Enterprises in Ruidoso Downs buys aluminum, aluminum cans, brass, copper, car batteries, radiators, and stainless steel. Howard Puckett, manager of the firm, is planning to begin buying glass soon if he can secure a glass crusher. Puckett says that Senate Bill 2, sponsored by Senator James Martin, if passed, could allow financial assistance to purchase such equipment.

Senate Bill 2 calls for all communities in the state to take recycling measures. It provides for economic and technical assistance to aid in implementing these measures. Puckett would also like to recycle newspaper if it is eco-

nomically feasible. In 1984 paper recycling programs in nine industrial countries spared a million acres of trees, according to EAGLE.

Puckett gives some hints for area residents who want to begin recycling: Aluminum cans, foil and pie pans, etc. may be kept together. Other aluminum, such as storm doors and old lawn chairs, is evaluated separately and at this time is bringing an average of 30 cents a pound. This week Puckett is paying 47 cents a pound for under 50 lbs. of cans and 50 cents for more than 50 pounds. Clean stainless steel is bringing about four cents a pound.

Recyclers should take time to separate the stainless steel from other materials. Dirty stainless steel is accepted but brings only half as much money. Puckett says much recycling is "hinging" on Senate Bill 2. If the bill passes, communities will either have to start their own recycling plants or contract to private firms. This will make recycling easier for the public and, probably, more profitable. H&H Enterprises is located on East Hwy 70 in Ruidoso Downs.

White Sands Recycling in Alamogordo buys glass, newspaper, cardboard, and plastic containers, as well as aluminum cans, scrap metal, etc. Stephanie Baca, of that firm says that newspaper brings one cent a pound. They would appreciate recyclers bundling the newspapers with string.

Clear glass bottles and jars need to be separated from colored glass, according to Baca. Glass also brings one cent a pound.

Plastic containers, such as milk containers, vegetable oil bottles, and bleach bottles bring three cents a pound. They do not take 2-liter soft drink bottles.

At this time they are paying 58 cents a pound for aluminum cans.

County residents fund \$81,000 budget

When some county residents opened property tax bills last fall, they noted a brand new charge.

A one mill levy, classified under the Upper Hondo Soil and Water Conservation District (UHSWCD), was tacked onto bills for all properties in the district not located in municipalities. (The mill levy is \$1 per taxable \$1,000 value of property, with the taxable value one-third the assessed value.)

Voters passed a referendum in 1985, allowing the one mill to be levied on all properties outside of the municipalities of Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs and Capitan. The levy is allowed by state law with the approval of voters.

Never charged before 1988, the tax was imposed to cover operational costs of the Soil and Water Conservation office in Carrizozo and to operate district programs.

The district has a volunteer board and two full-time employees, Carrizozo district supervisor Howard Harke and secretary Sue Stearns.

Stearns handles the paperwork for the UHSWCD and the Carrizozo Soil and Water Conservation District. She sends a newsletter to members of both districts. The office also handles the Resource, Conservation and Development (RC&D) programs.

Before 1988, UHSWCD received enough federal and other funds to operate the office and programs, but cutbacks in 1988 led the board to implement the levy. Harke said the mill levy was a necessity.

There is a move in the state legislature to make the mill levy subject to annual revision, he said. However, interpretation of the law is in dispute the current legislation.

The UHSWCD board of supervisors, Chairperson Shirley Goodloe and members Clem Weindorf of Hondo, Ernest McDaniel of Glencoe, John Cooper of Tinnie, Fred Pfingston of Lincoln and Sonny Sanchez of San Patricio, budgeted about \$5,000 for 1988.

The process for establishing the charge was complicated and required the Lincoln County Treasurer's Office to compile legal descriptions of properties within district boundaries.

"We never collected funds before, we didn't realized how much we would collect," Harke said.

The first estimated budget for 1989 was \$15,000. Seeing the need for more funds, the board asked the county commissioners and county treasurer to impose the levy.

Estimating the mill will generate about \$76,000, they revised that budget in November. The budget adopted totals \$81,430.

It includes: \$3,200 for per diem and mileage; \$1,200, building maintenance; \$3,000, a storage building; \$1,000, utilities; \$350, building insurance; \$650, dues; \$1,400, youth education; \$250, awards; \$200, election; and \$150, soil stewardship.

Additional budget items include: \$50, postage; \$750, office equipment and supplies; \$175, advertising; \$500, audit; \$300, bonding; \$12,000, secretary's salary; \$3,280,

county collection fee; \$1,000, legal fees.

Other items are: \$5,000, conservation incentive project; \$20,000, the urban and residential conservation incentive project; \$20,000, brush control projects; \$1,500, controlled fire program; \$5,000, reserve (for dams and property acquisition) and \$475, miscellaneous.

UHSWCD was organized July, 1941, and includes more than a million acres of Lincoln County, mostly ranch land with a small amount of farming areas. Ranchers and farmers typically receive the most assistance from the districts in the form of brush control and irrigation projects.

However, small, suburban landowners may be eligible for some programs.

District staff inspects all proposed subdivisions for possible problems and makes recommendations to the county Planning and Zoning Commission.

Soil surveys are available, by request, to home builders or buyers to determine whether land proposed for construction is suitable with no problems associated with soil types or slope.

Other projects eligible for financial assistance from UHSWCD on residential and urban land include a whole series that range from erosion control to revegetation and planting. More projects include streambank protection and beautification, windbreaks and others. Information on eligible projects is

available at the Carrizozo office.

Any land use problems may also be referred to the soil office in Carrizozo. A review team inspects problems and potential eligible project areas.

Until federal funds become more available, or legislative mandates change the current process of funding the districts, property owners living outside of county municipalities can expect to find the one mill levy tacked onto the property tax bills each November, according to Harke.





Care Inc. served 2,442 meals last year, makes plans for 1989

Ruidoso Meal Care, Inc. held its annual meeting Wednesday at the Home Health Services of Lincoln County offices. After Verna Adams, president, called the meeting to order, Jack Muhn, treasurer reported on the financial status of the group. Muhn reported that although the group has little funds to spare after paying December bills, a fundraiser planned for Friday and Saturday by the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce should bring in some funds. Adams then gave a brief history of the organization, saying the group was formed in May 1986. It was begun entirely through donations, with a \$3,000 contribution from Lincoln County. Care, Inc. is a non-profit organization, and contributions are tax-deductible. The group serves approximately five meals twice a week at the center. Another big accomplishment in 1988, according to Adams, is the building of a storage cabinet at the

Senior Citizens Center where meals are served. A big priority this year is to begin delivering meals at least three times a week to the elderly and other homebound people, rather than twice as in the past. Adams pointed out that for many recipients the Meal Care meals are the only balanced meals they receive. A financial boost may be needed before this can be implemented. Currently volunteers deliver to 16-18 people twice a week, making total recipients approximately 22. The Lincoln County Medical Center cafeteria prepares the meals under the direction of dietician Nancy Berg. The hospital has informed the group that prices for the meals will probably increase soon since current prices hardly cover costs. Meal recipients are asked to pay according to ability. The full payment rate is \$2.50 per meal. Last year, out of 2,440 meals served, 852 were full payment, with 502 being free meals and the others being partial payment.

Total meal costs in 1988 were \$5,124 with meal revenue being only \$3,125.50. Donations and fundraisers must cover the remaining costs. The group voted on new board members and officers for 1989. Board members are Verna Adams, Ann Gaddy, Kathy Barnett, Dick Whitwam, Danny Garcia, Barbara Dickinson, and Jack Muhn. Adams remains president, and Kathy Barnett was elected vice president, with Barbara Dickinson as secretary and Jack Muhn, treasurer. The board will meet Monday, February 13 to discuss the budget and goals for this year.





The racer explodes from the starting gate, slices through the flag-draped course, and flashes across the finish. A medal winner!
Olympics? No, it's NASTAR day at Ski Apache. An ordinary citizen skier has been transformed—at least for the moment—into a RACER.

Meet John Redigar, ten-year NASTAR veteran. He races to refine his personal skiing.

"He's a consistent medalist," said Kathryn Campbell, race official. The Pecos, Texas, native just grins as he lines up in the starting gate.

Nearby waits Susan Landin, anticipating her second try of the day.

"This is my first NASTAR race," she confides. Why did she start NASTAR after skiing for five years? "We have friends from Minnesota skiing with us today," replies the Las Cruces native. "They race NASTAR all the time so my husband suggested I race too. So here I am—it's fun!"

Ed Andrews of Fort Worth, Texas, agrees. He's chasing a gold medal too. Today he has a bronze.

"Hey, I'll try again next time." He's been racing NASTAR for five years.

What makes NASTAR racing unique and appealing is that John, Susan, Ed and the others don't race against each other; they race against the clock. Their times are handicapped according to their age and sex then compared with the pacesetter's time.

Racing Director Rick Zarndt and Campbell are Ski Apache pacesetters. Earlier in the season they raced against a US Ski Team member who is the national pacesetter. So, in effect, a citizen racer is really comparing his or her performance to a US Ski Team racer. Depending on how close a citizen racer comes to the pacesetter's time adjusted for age and sex, he or she can win a gold, silver or bronze medal. On this particular Sunday, Zarndt said about 60 percent of the skiers racing were winning medals.

NASTAR stands for National Standard Race, a program in which Ski Apache participates along with hundreds of ski areas in the country.

Skiers of all ages and abilities participate. They don't have to belong to a racing team or have special training to enjoy the thrill of running gates. This day about 25 skiers ranging from kids to middle-agers tried their skill on the giant slalom course which is set up on Smokey Bear run, a lower mountain slope.





By the middle of the afternoon, several bronzes, a few silvers and two golds were earned. The medals, which are pins measuring about one inch by one and one-half inches, turned up on jackets, sweaters, even headbands, testifying that an ordinary skier knew, for a few moments, the "thrill of victory."

NASTAR is from 11 a.m. until 2 p.m. every Wednesday and Sunday at Ski Apache. Cost is \$5 for two rounds; \$1 for each additional run.

Sign up at the Ski School Desk before 11 a.m. on race day, at the starting gate after 11 a.m.

LCMC gets a new face

Drastic changes await visitors and patients at Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC).

The county-owned facility has been transformed—from a new exterior face to additional labs and refurbished lobby with new paint and windows throughout. And the project is continuing.

LCMC administrator Steve Keller and supervisor of construction Eloy Candelaria last week led a tour of the construction project in progress.

As work continues on new admitting offices just off the new lobby, those services are being temporarily provided in several small rooms and in the LCMC chapel. Keller said the chapel will again be a chapel after admitting moves into the new offices. Until the new offices are complete,

patients are directed to check in at the rooms.

Other changes in that wing of LCMC include alterations to restrooms to conform to handicapped access standards. The present entrance to the Pink Shop will be closed and a new entrance off the new lobby will be opened.

The new entrance is the first change noticed by visitors, who enter a lobby that features wall coverings with charcoal gray and soft mauve and blue tones, terra cotta floor tiles, and a view of the expanded (soon to be open) admitting offices. New furniture, manufactured by Herman Miller Company, and carpeting will be installed after the remodeling project is totally finished.


Herman Miller furnishings also are featured in the new lab. Candelaria said the furnishings are the "Cadillac" of furniture, but with

an excellent, extended warranty, LCMC will experience cost-savings in the long run.

New double-paned windows were installed before winter and savings on heating were immediately realized, said Keller. New paint, in shades of light and dark peach, still goes on throughout the facility.

And the 1948 entrance, used since last fall, is now gone, Keller said. All evidence of the entrance has been removed and the exterior finished to match. The concrete walkway to the entrance was removed and the lawn will be reseeded.

The new C-Arm X-Ray, purchased on recent approval of the Lincoln County Commissioners, has been installed in surgery, where it is most often used, Keller said.


