

AG, DA will review 'get rich quick' scheme

A game that promises participants \$40,000 within 13 days is not legal, according to Stephen Westheimer of the New Mexico Attorney General's office.

Westheimer, unwilling to comment further until seeing the letter that was being circulated in Ruidoso last week, confirmed in a telephone interview Friday that the game is illegal.

District Attorney Bert Atkins agreed, saying, he too, is reserving further comment until he has a copy of the game, entitled "24-hour madness dash," in his hands.

"Prepare yourself, ready, set, go!" begins the invitation to invest \$10 to make as much as \$40,000. Participants buy a package of instructions for the \$10, mail the first person on an attached list \$5, cross out that name and make a new list with all the names moving up and their own name added to the number 13 spot.

The instructions continue, with the participant cautioned to follow them step-by-step, and then: "sit back and relax. Enjoy your last 13 days of doing without. After 13 days of this leisure, you will begin to receive your \$5 checks, all 8,192 of them in the mail."

Attached to the game is a list of commonly asked questions with the answers that assure participants that the game is not a chain letter, but is instead a distribution plan.

Participants are assured that the distribution plan is not an illegal activity.

But Westheimer and Atkins aren't convinced.

The list of names included in one "24 hour madness dash" package started in Texas and ended in Ruidoso, where at least one of the packages was interrupted and sent to the AG and DA, who said they'll review the package.

Drug sting nets 16

A sting operation in Otero and Lincoln counties resulted in three indictments in Lincoln County and 13 in Otero County Thursday.

According to published reports, 60 law enforcement officers began a sweep about 6 a.m. Thursday, and by evening had arrested eight of 16 suspects named in grand jury indictments. All were charged with drug trafficking, according to reports.

District Attorney Bert Atkins was quoted as saying the New Mexico State Police began working the undercover operation last June. He said agents also bought three stolen vehicles and filed auto theft charges on five people.

Charges included 14 counts of trafficking cocaine, two counts of trafficking heroin, 12 counts of conspiracy to traffic in controlled substances, four counts of distribution of marijuana and three counts of attempted trafficking of cocaine. Officials reportedly said they did not know the total amount of drugs seized or the value.

Arrests were made by State Police officers, Otero County sheriff's officers and Border Patrol agents.

Those arrested listed their residences as Alamogordo, La Luz and Anthony; and officers were seeking others on the indictment list.

Horse racing is multi-million dollar NM industry

When R.D. Hubbard, president of Ruidoso Downs Racing, Inc., hosted a reception in Santa Fe last week, he gave state lawmakers the results of a study on the economic impact of horse racing in New Mexico.

Village of Ruidoso officials and Chamber of Commerce and Greeters representatives joined Hubbard and members of his staff for the Monday evening get-together honoring state legislators.

During the party, attended by Lieutenant Governor Jack Stahl, the speaker of the house and the president of the State Senate, Hubbard distributed copies of the independent study conducted by Albert M. Church, Ph.D. of the Bureau of Business and Economic Research at the University of New Mexico.

According to that study, completed January 30, out-of-state racing fans impacted the New Mexico economy to the tune of more than \$217 million in 1988, provided total tax revenue of \$10.9 million and equivalent employment of 5,955.

Using "new" dollars, racing fans directly spent \$82.6 million in

wagering, admissions, concessions, restaurants, lodging, shopping and associated items, that had a total economic impact of \$217.3 million.

The study compared the economic activity generated by racing to that of a new or expanding electronics plant or federal installation. The total economic impact listed for 1987 was at \$223.1 million; 1986, \$237.4 million; 1985, \$258 million

"It is immediately apparent that horse racing is a major industry in New Mexico which has large direct and indirect economic impacts," reads the report. "Also clear is that racing is not a growth industry and furthermore the advent of pari-mutuel racing in Texas and Oklahoma will compete for 'racing' dollars. What is not apparent is that

Sam Donaldson buys Chaves Canyon Ranch north of Hondo

Sam Donaldson, ABC-TV newsman, recently purchased a 7,300 acre ranch in eastern Lincoln County, formerly owned by Lincoln County Clerk Martha Proctor.

According to published reports, Donaldson purchased the Chaves Canyon Ranch, about two and a half miles north of Hondo, through the First National Bank of Alamogordo.

Donaldson, during an interview in Roswell, said he and his wife, Janice, plan to build a working cattle ranch. A new

ranch house is planned to replace the old one which burned.

"We're not speculating or trying to subdivide the area. We want a working ranch, not some fluff," he was quoted.

He also said he is fond of New Mexico, his native state. "Why not come back," he was quoted.

Donaldson was born in El Paso, Texas, and raised in the tiny farming community of Chamberino, northwest of El Paso in New Mexico.

His mother, Chloe Donaldson, lived in the small town until her

death last year.

Donaldson attended New Mexico Military Institute and graduated in 1951. He attended University of Texas at El Paso and graduated in 1955.

Donaldson recently left the Washington press corps after 12 years. He is planning to host a prime time new program, co-hosted by Diane Sawyer, scheduled to begin in August. Currently he co-hosts "This Week with David Brinkley," an ABC-TV news program which airs Sundays.

Wingfield Park is top choice Bentley wins contest

Wingfield Park is the name selected for Ruidoso's newest public park, located below the Grindstone Canyon Dam on land that has been called the Hall property.

Jacqueline Bentley won a \$100 savings bond for submitting the name that won the "Name that Park" contest sponsored by the Village of Ruidoso Parks and Recreation Department.

The "Name that Park" committee met last week to review the names submitted for the new village park that is located on land that was the old Wingfield Dairy before it became the home for the Hall family.

The village paid more than \$200,000 for the house and property in a settlement of a case brought by the Halls when water from the Grindstone Canyon Dam turned the streams on their property white.

With the white water cleared up and repairs under way at the dam, village staff expect the new park to be a valuable asset to village recreational facilities.

Sharon McKinney placed second in the "Name that Park" contest

with her submission of Ruidoso's Grindstone Canyon Park.

Wingfield Dairy Park, submitted by village manager Frank Potter, placed third and Grindstone Park submitted by Anne Brunell and Inn of the Rainbow Park submitted by Esther Salas tied for fourth.

The economic importance of the industry is larger than that engendered by out-of-state patron spending. Dedicated New Mexico fans would likely spend their 'racing' dollars at tracks in other states if racing were not available in New Mexico," it continues.

In the tables and charts appended to the study, Ruidoso Downs topped other state race tracks in the attendance for the past three years, with Sunland Park posting a higher number in 1985. That year Sunland had 358,287 through its gates during 90 racing days; with Ruidoso Downs attracting 316,194 in only 70 days.

Ruidoso Downs, with 69 racing days in 1988, logged 268,256 visitors and reported a handle of \$27,740,179. In 1987, the track had 287,140 visitors in 75 racing days with a season handle of \$31,600,471. Those numbers were at 297,251 fans for 87 days in 1986, with a handle of \$31,079,040.

Figures for out-of-state racing fans indicate that 35.7 percent of those visitors attend Ruidoso Downs, with 35.6 percent going to Sunland Park, 9.3 percent to the State Fair, 7.9 percent to the Downs at Santa Fe, 6.8 percent to La Mesa Park, 2.9 percent to the Downs at Albuquerque and 1.9 percent to San Juan Downs.

"The total economic impact of on- and off-track spending by out-of-state racing fans attracted to Ruidoso Downs since 1985 is \$457.4 million, said Church in his statement at the end of the report. "This is equivalent to 3,135 full-time jobs in New Mexico and the majority of this impact affects the local Ruidoso economy," he continued.

"Net wagering, concessions and admissions spending by Ruidoso Downs racing fans sustains horse racing and both the track and horsemen. This spending supports the 'backside' of the track and the goods and services purchased directly by activities related to

racing," said Church.

"The economic impact of racing extends throughout the local economy and the state's economy as additional dollars are spent off the track on food, lodging, travel and other tourist activities. Furthermore, affected businesses in turn purchase goods and services within the local economy and these activities create indirect economic impacts. The incomes of employees of all these businesses directly and indirectly engendered by horse racing are spent and this induces additional economic impacts within the local community," he concluded.

Also during the reception, Hubbard showed a videotape he recently had made promoting the race track and the Ruidoso area.

Roger Kennedy, Hubbard's marketing director, said last week that the company promotes Ruidoso and the Ruidoso area in all the promotional materials being used to attract racing fans to Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

Economic Development group selects ad agency

A major step toward having quality and extensive mailout material in hand to send potential industrial clients was taken, Thursday night, at a regular monthly meeting of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County.

The decision to go with the Phil Price Advertising Agency if a satisfactory price can be negotiated did not come easy, and it was not unanimous.

Three companies submitted bids for furnishing 5,000 full color large mailers and 2,000 smaller ones.

Initial bids ranged from \$17,044 from Phil Price; \$14,310, from AD-Works, and \$12,190 from G&B Graphics. The latter two are New Mexico companies.

Although Phil Price has the high bid, several board members said

the Phil Price Agency is a known factor.

The agency does work for the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce and Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

Sample printed material prepared for the EDCLC was available from each of the companies submitting bids.

Finally, board member Cindy Lynch moved that EDCLC director George Puckett work with communications committee chairman Dave McIntosh and his committee to negotiate with Phil Price for a better price without sacrificing too much quality.

Ruidoso village manager Frank Potter commented that the Phil Price people are "pretty effective in marketing."

Member Don Shaw and the chairman of EDCLC, Buddy Bundick, were somewhat critical of the material submitted by Phil

Price Agency.

The state of New Mexico has matching funds to help defray the cost of such material.

For instance, the Phil Price bid of \$17,044 contains a \$4,952 state participation figure.

The printed material involved is multi-faceted and deluxe. Full color artwork is involved.

McIntosh told the board there had been delays in getting approval of an advertising representative and time was running out.

He appealed for a decision to be made Thursday night, although, he, too, said he was concerned about the high bid by Phil Price.

In other business a budget of \$159,604 for 1989 was approved.

Some discrepancies in "cash management plans" were noted by Shaw.

"We can approve the budget generally and work on cash manage-

ment," said Shaw.

Most funds for operation come from a half-mill county levy which is expected to produce about \$144,000 this year.

Puckett outlined a preliminary marketing plan for the organization at the Thursday night meeting in the Financial Center where EDCLC is located.

The purpose of the plan, he wrote in a memorandum, "is to establish a methodology for the creation of jobs in Lincoln County that will result from a diversity of industrial sources.

Main elements of such a plan, he said, are development of community data, contacting target economic units, and structuring of solutions to economic unit problems and needs.

Various methods of contacting "economic units" were outlined including broad mailouts and then se-

lective followups.

He said economical sites and facilities must be available. He said Carrizozo has some such sites, but Ruidoso itself is lacking in sites because of pricing. Availability of qualified labor has to be a consideration. He said that in Lincoln County underemployment is more common than unemployment.

"This isn't necessarily bad," he said, considering the goals of EDCLC.

Investment capital must be available, Puckett wrote, plus availability of asset-based lending sources.

Transportation is a key factor. Concerning sites, he said a survey shows an assortment of building that could be used "but none are ideal and most are priced far in excess of amounts that would be suitable for industrial usage."

He suggests a "Ruidoso Research

Park" which will consist of approximately 50 acres for construction of masonry structures in a landscaped campus-style environment.

He suggests development of a county-wide industrial park for construction of metal buildings ranging in size from 10,000 to 100,000 square feet. Eventual construction of speculative buildings was suggested.

Representatives of Ruidoso, Capitan and Corona were at the meeting.

In his master plan, Puckett said, an on-going review of possible special projects must be made with a special eye to the smaller communities in the county. Such special projects might include, for example, recycling plants, energy conservation and other institutional projects.

\$4.5 federal lawsuit filed over '87 All American Futurity purse

A \$4.6 million federal lawsuit filed in Tulsa, Oklahoma, is asking to have the 1987 All American Futurity results overturned.

According to published reports, the case is the first of its kind, and was initiated because the winner, Elans Special, was disqualified after lab tests indicated the All American winner was drugged.

Doyle Rice, a Pryor, Oklahoma, horse owner whose filly placed second in the \$2 million race, wants to recover the difference of \$656,500 between the first and second place purses as actual damages. Naming as defendants the owner of Elans Special, Dr. Lindsay Burbank of

Leesburg, Florida, and the horse's trainer, John Buchanan, of Fort Worth, Texas; Rice is also asking for \$4 million in punitive damages. According to the federal court filing, Rice claims the owner and trainer knowingly entered the drugged horse in the race.

The New Mexico Racing Commission ruled in January 1988 that Elans Special, the first filly to win the race in 10 years, was drugged twice before the All American Futurity.

Carl Hughes, the Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, attorney representing Rice, told reporters the 1987 New Mexico testing pro-

cess required officials to wait several weeks after a race for final test results to indicate the presence of drugs in horses.

The commission said last year that Elans Special tested positive for the stimulant Oxymorphone before the August trials and again before the September 7 All American race. Elans Special won both the trial and the Futurity.

The New Mexico Legislature, in the current 60-day session, is dealing with several bills over the horse race industry. One bill would limit the statute of limitations over unfavorable drug tests.

Rillito trip to leave from Ruidoso

A luxury bus to transport Ruidoso residents to the Rillito Park Race Track in Tucson, Arizona, March 31, will leave from Ruidoso and not Albuquerque as indicated in a previous news

story. Some 42 seats are available for the trip, March 31 through April 2.

Ruidoso Downs Days will be

in evidence both April 1 and 2 at the Tucson track.

Reservations for the trip can be made through the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce.

Chairman Bob Hemphill refutes rumors over Cox's resignation

Lincoln County Commission Chairman Bob Hemphill, in a telephone interview Friday, refuted a variety of rumors circulating over the resignation of former Lincoln County manager Suzanne Cox.

"I'm telling everybody she resigned and we accepted it," Hemphill concluded, after saying there is no substance to a variety of

questions being raised over that resignation.

Cox, who served as county manager for more than six years, offered her resignation on December 31, just before the new commission took office. Hemphill said newly-elected commissioners Karon Petty and Rick Simpson didn't accept that resignation, however they did advertise the manager's position, saying they wanted to hire their

own staff.

When Cox offered to resign on February 20, commissioners accepted.

Commissioners currently are reviewing 20 applications they received for the manager's job. Hemphill said four will be selected and interviewed at a closed session meeting to be called in the near future.

Eastern New Mexico University is offering the institute for anyone interested in writing science fiction, and participants may earn up to two academic credit hours, although it isn't mandatory to register for college credit to take part in the weekend event.

Williamson, winner of the Hugo and Nebula Grand Master awards, and author of 70 stories and 43

novels, will be joined by authors Walter Jon Williams and Robert Vardeman for the institute sessions as well as two public sessions funded by the New Mexico Humanities Council. The science fiction writers will speak at 7 p.m. Friday, March 10 and at 3 p.m. Sunday March 12, at the Ruidoso Public Library. The public is invited to those two sessions, which are offered free of charge.

Also taking part in the institute will be Ellen Dalton, fiction editor for *Omni* magazine and Dr. Patrice Caldwell, dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences at

ENMU. Caldwell has published articles on science fiction and taught writing courses.

State monuments to give state residents a break

Lincoln State Monument is among the five in New Mexico to participate in a reduced-rate program.

According to a Museum of New Mexico news release, New Mexico State Monuments, as of Sunday, March 5, will charge a reduced Sunday adult admission rate of \$1 for New Mexico residents with proof of address.

Normal admission fees are \$2 for adults and \$1 for children. The children's fees remain unchanged.

The monuments are open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily (except for selected state holidays) May 1 through September 15, and from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. the remainder of the year.

New Mexico State Monuments include Lincoln State Monument, site of Lincoln County War and the exploits of Billy the Kid; Fort Sumner, an Indian detention facility run by the U.S. Army in the 1860s; Fort Selden, north of Las Cruces, a frontier fort established in 1865; Jemez State Monument, near Jemez Springs, an ancient Indian ruin and Spanish mission church

and Coronado State Monument, west of Bernalillo, locale of the ruins of the Kuaau Pueblo.

"The reduced Sunday rate has been highly successful at the Museum of New Mexico's Santa Fe museums," said Thomas Caperton, director of the New Mexico State Monuments. "The monuments' adoption of the rate will enable New Mexico residents to more economically enjoy the historic attractions available in their own backyard."

Also in Lincoln, the Lincoln County Historical Society's Dr. Wood's House, which formerly was open at no charge, will be included in the one-ticket admission system initiated last year by the Lincoln County Heritage Trust and the New Mexico State Monuments. The ticket last year was \$4 for adults.

After much consideration, the society officers decided to accept the proposal, presented by the Trust, to be included in the admission.

Formerly, volunteers kept the house open on a limited basis. However, with the admission charge,

the house will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily from Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day.

The society plans to continue with volunteer help giving craft demonstrations, bread baking, growing a vegetable garden and performing musicals on Sunday afternoons.

According to Lincoln State Monuments ranger Jack Rigney, Tunstall Store is open on weekends, but the old Lincoln Courthouse currently is being equipped with bathrooms and an interpretive display. The courthouse will open in early June, and all other historic buildings will be open during the same hours and days as Dr. Wood's House.

The price of the single ticket, which admits visitors into all New Mexico State Monument Lincoln buildings, Trust properties and Dr. Wood's House will be approved by the museum board of directors this spring, Rigney said.

The Museum of New Mexico administers all New Mexico State Monuments.

EDCLC gears up to provide information

Two Ruidoso men have agreed to head committees to assist the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLC) in providing information to prospective industrial clients.

Buddy Bundick, chairman of EDCLC, said John Hall has agreed to chair a transportation committee.

Banker Jack Foster will chair a finance committee which will include banker Ronnie Paulger, EDCLC board member, as a member.

Four men have agreed to serve on a sites and facilities committee which has yet to have a chairman. Members are Dwight Andrews, Tim Collins, Rod Adamson and Hal Sims.

New member Don Donahue was

named to the communications committee.

The transportation committee has been charged with assessing the current transportation facilities available within Lincoln County including motor freight, air cargo, rail, piggyback.

The committee will define short- and long-term needs and all aspects of transportation to and from the county. Another goal is to establish an action plan for possible solutions to transportation needs including legislative action.

The sites and facilities committee will inventory all available sites and buildings that may be suitable for light manufacturing needs. Every community in the county will be surveyed.

The finance committee will gather data on all currently available financing sources for the attraction of manufacturing enterprises and obtain applications for each source and catalog requirements for successful applications.

Another duty will be to study the feasibility of establishing a venture capital club and devise an action plan for implementation.

George Puckett, director of the EDCLC, says he knows of a Santa Fe man who has established venture capital clubs across the United States.

The EDCLC board of directors in a monthly meeting, Thursday night, approved the idea of bringing the man to Ruidoso for a presentation to the board.

High school principal Tom Hansen stopped by the other day for a little chat and every time I see him I'm reminded of Teddy Roosevelt who also had a grand moustache.

One of my favorite Roosevelt stories came from a party with granddaughter Alice Roosevelt who visited the cast of "Old Four Eyes," an outdoor pageant near Medora, North Dakota, an area Teddy frequented a few years back.

The story, and I can only paraphrase, began with a reporter asking Roosevelt about his battle at San Juan Hill.

Roosevelt replied that his cavalry members were the true heroes and should get all the credit.

"The men showed no fear," Teddy boastfully said. "I looked behind me and there they were, charging up the hill."

High school sports is a highly-profiled activity in small communities like Ruidoso. We get to know all these kids. They become like family.

Athletes and athletic feats are traditionally profiled because of interest and action. That doesn't mean new traditions can't be formed and new interest stimulated.

The Ruidoso News has a reporter, Doris Cherry, who is assigned to the schools beat and will cover any accomplishments or activities of students at the school.

The student who crafts a great chair in shop, wins a spelling bee, paints a fine picture, stands out among his or her peers for some reason deserves recognition as much as the accomplishments of our athletes.

Coaches are used to dealing with the press and provide statistics and information for stories. They know the importance of gate receipts to the school. That kind of demand doesn't follow all school activity.

Principal Tom Hansen said

he is aware of a publicity gap in certain areas of student accomplishment and has moved to appoint journalist teacher John Ussery to fill that gap next school season.

The job is made difficult because input demands effort and a degree of altruism. That combination seldom exists.

Some parents may think recognition from school will come automatically through some organized process. That's not always true. Few schools have a budget for their own PR department that would aggressively pursue the interests of all students.

The squeaky wheel still gets the grease. Recognition in the newspaper often comes through the demand of a special interest group or the request of one single person. Thinking an article will appear is not an action step. There is always a phone call, letter or personal contact behind that person, place or thing keeps appearing in the newspaper.

Winning has a way of pumping the old ego to new heights.

Many years ago when Ara Parseghian began his reign at Notre Dame, the Irish were playing in a downpour on the field. In the distance loomed the famous mosaic on the building dubbed by many as "touchdown Jesus." Gridiron miracles were common at Notre Dame so when the tackle ran to Parseghian's side and asked him to stop the rain, he looked at his assistant coach and said, "Think I could?"

The Irish won the national title for Ara that year and spirits were running high the following year when another torrential rain hit the playing field during a game and another player ran to Parseghian and asked him to make it stop.

Parseghian looked at that same assistant coach and said, "Think I should?"

The Sun Country section of the Professional Golf Association of America met last week at Cree Meadows for the semi-annual business meeting.


Nearly all of the state's golf professionals were at the meeting headed by the executive board of



Other presentations were more specific such as Native American Linguistic Factors by Christine Sims of Zuni Schools; Speech/Language Evaluation, using it for better programming and Early Childhood Language Development by Paul Lindberg, speech/language pathologist.

Ski Apache Handicapped Skiers program is going strong

Ski Apache is blessed with bright winter sunshine, plenty of snow and the Ski Apache Handicapped Skiers Association (SAHSA).

Born of an idea to help injured Vietnam veterans adjust to their physical disabilities, the non-profit organization has grown in its 13 years to encompass any disabled person who has a desire to learn to ski.

Director Diana Person oversees the more than 60 volunteer instructors who work with more than 600 individuals with various handicaps.

Handicapped individuals can learn a sense of belonging and gain confidence they can do things, that perhaps others cannot.

Skiing helps individuals with various handicaps, including Cerebral Palsy, brain damage, mental retardation and stroke, said Person. There are SAHSA members who are blind or deaf, amputees or paraplegics, victims of spina bifida or polio victims.

Most of all, the handicapped individual gains a sense of fun from learning to ski.

The program has grown at Ski Apache from a small shed to house the special equipment to the current handicapped-equipped facility.

Ski Apache manager Roy Parker has been supportive of the program

since its inception, Person said.

Ski Apache provides the facility and free lift tickets for children 18 years old and under and half-price tickets for those more than 18. All the specialized equipment and instruction are provided by the association; all at no cost to the handicapped individual.

The equipment is very expensive, as only a few companies make the specialized skis, sleds and poles or outriggers as they are known in the handicapped program.

In the 13 years, Person has supervised the training of skiers participating in world class handicapped skiing competitions, Class A national champion racers in the Blind and Amputee category and Special Olympics racers.

The program relies on donated funds. To raise these funds, a silent auction is planned from 6-9 p.m. Tuesday, March 7, at Cree Meadows Restaurant.

"We have a lot of neat things (for the auction)," Person said.

Scheduled to be auctioned are golfing items, art work, clothing, lodging, ski items and a great deal of miscellaneous items, with something for everybody, she added.

Tickets for a season pass (next year) will be sold at the door that night, until the drawing after the auction.

Tickets also can be obtained from Person or any other association member by calling 336-4416 at Ski Apache.

The auction will feature hors d'oeuvres compliments of Dan Kelley and Cree Meadows Restaurant and a no-host bar. Teams for the business persons handicapped ski race, at 11 a.m. Wednesday, March 8, at Ski Apache, will be named Tuesday night.

Anyone may buy a team for \$50, Tuesday night, Person continued.

Sixty persons have signed up for the race Wednesday. Each team will consist of two business people and one handicapped skier. Twenty teams will compete during the race.

There is no cost to watch the race at Ski Apache beginning at 11 a.m. Wednesday.

Self-confidence, a feeling of gracefulness and a sense of belonging; all are part of the sense of accomplishment handicapped persons develop with the skiing program.

For Person the fun and accomplishment come with helping the handicapped. "I love it, it gives back to me everything I give."

Person and members of the association board invite others to have a part in the successful program by supporting the fundraisers next week.



Just imagine making that run with just one leg, or without being able to see. Sounds pretty tough, doesn't it?



Person and her volunteers attest to the self-confidence and feeling of accomplishment these athletes gain from learning to ski.

Ski Apache provides a building and free or reduced price lift tickets. The rest of the program is funded with donations. The needs are great since the special equipment for handicapped skiers is very expensive.

Letters to the editor

DEAR EDITOR:

I am incensed and outraged by the uninformed and highly prejudicial comments of State Representative Ben Hall as quoted in The Ruidoso News of February 27, 1989, in regards to the local controversy over the proposal to construct a golf course on the old municipal airport property. I can no longer stand by and allow the continued propagation of misrepresentations and false allegations to go unchallenged.

Who told you, Mr. Hall, that this was a battle of golf course vs 160-acre park? I personally know of no one who is fully informed about the contents of the Master Plan for that property who has ever said they want a "3 million dollar play park."

It is not an issue of golf course vs. park. Proponents of the golf course proposal are trying to perpetuate the gross misrepresentation that all opponents want a 160-acre park. This is wrong. What opponents want is the implementation of the Master Plan which calls for use of the land to diversify the economy and stabilize the seasonal nature of the area's economy. I am for progress, new opportunities and new jobs. That is exactly why I am strongly opposed to the golf course proposal. Another golf course will not broaden our economic base, nor will it diversify our economy. It would simply be another golf course, but with cheaper rates. An-

other golf course will do nothing to help alleviate the tremendously seasonal nature of business in Ruidoso. And as for employment opportunities, give me a break! How many people does a golf course employ? A handful at best. And what type of jobs? Grounds keepers, caddies and hamburger flippers? Possibly these are job opportunities to aspire to in a state where only 3 to 4 students out of 100 starting school this year can be expected to attain a college degree.

People have lauded the high school communications class for their letters to the editor. I found their letters only perpetuated the myth that this is a golf course vs. a 160-acre park issue. How many of these students took the time to get the facts by reading the Master Plan? How many other people who have taken the time to write letters to the editor supporting the golf course proposal and lambasting the alleged "park supporters" have bothered to take the time to read the Master Plan? Based on what I've seen, very few people have bothered to go beyond the local newspaper for information.

I challenge those of you who have not read the Plan to do so before you attack those who support its implementation. It is available at the front desk of the public library as well as at City Hall.

The Master Plan was adopted by the Village Council in October of

1987. At the public hearings preceding its adoption, the consultants who prepared the plan stated that the single-use option was the least desirable of all the options presented (and a 140-acre golf course is little more than a single use option.)

The plan called for the establishment of a board to oversee the planning and development of the site and to "initiate marketing efforts." The reality is that the board was not appointed until 14 months later and before they could even take the first recommended step of finding a better name for the land than the old municipal airport property, they have been bogged down by the first unsolicited single-use proposal. And instead of taking the language in the plan on page 81 at face value to "Initiate Marketing Efforts," they have decided to sit back and only review proposals handed to them. They are not going to actively solicit any proposals.

Folks, I don't know about you, but I feel this is a real disservice to the public. I liked Marion Warfield's analogy made at the public hearing. She likened Ruidoso to a 16-year-old girl who has never even dated being asked by the first guy who comes along to get married. Yeah sure, why not!

The Master Plan states there is a "severe lack of community and recreational facilities" in Ruidoso. It suggests the land provides an op-

portunity to create a community focus that is lacking and at the same time upgrade Ruidoso's image.

This town has been allowed to become nothing but a big commercial strip development in the mountains. The built environment of Ruidoso projects a very negative image. It is poorly planned and even more poorly regulated.

I have heard the word "trashy" used to describe Ruidoso more than once. This 160-acre of publicly owned land offers the last opportunity to centralize and consolidate those community and recreational facilities we so sorely lack and at the same time allow the opportunity to explore the many other possibilities and developments that could also occur on that land. In so doing this could provide Ruidoso with a community focal point and a highly upgraded image. Approving the golf course development slams the door shut on all future opportunities.

Mr. Hubbard could most help himself and Ruidoso by building the proposed golf course on other available land in the area and allowing the old municipal airport property the opportunity to have its vast potential fully explored and realized as has been set out in the Master Plan.

DEAR EDITOR:

I am writing this letter in response to a letter that was mailed out by Mayor Harris of Ruidoso Downs to all the land owners between the eastern city limits of the Downs to Biscuit Hill. In his letter he stated that Circle B had a nitrate level of 6.44 in their water. He also pinpointed another business in the area as having an 8.2

nitrate level in their water.

I would like to point out to the public who received these letters that the 6.44 nitrate level of Circle B was taken in 1981, the Mayor passed over the most recent test of 1.27 nitrate level taken in November of 1986. The tests are only required every four (4) years. The other business I referred to had their test run by a lab that is no longer in business. Suspecting an

error or for other reasons the 8.2 test was run again 6 weeks later in 1983 and showed to be at a 0.74 nitrate level. (The maximum level allowed is 10.0) Again the Mayor conveniently bypassed the more recent and lower levels of nitrate tests. Why he did this when he was supposedly presenting true facts to the people of the area is beyond me.

I will admit that the Ruidoso

Downs water tests of 0.29 are good, but I would also like to say that we could not find that particular reading in the records. Ruidoso Downs does have good test results, but again their highest levels were not mentioned in the annexation letter as on our business and the other mentioned business.

There Is A Subtle, But Telling Footnote...

To the impact of the hundreds of New Mexicans who came to the state Capitol last week in support of the "March for Hope: Journey for Jovita."

The footnote is this: the police couldn't stop grinning.

You know how stonemaced they try to be, especially standing security in a public place and with a large crowd. Well, there were officers there from the New Mexico State Police and the Santa Fe Po-

lice and when they saw the size of that crowd, they couldn't stop grinning at each other.

There could be no more subtle measure of how fatigued and stressed and sickened these officers are by the carnage wreaked on New Mexico's streets and roads by drunken driving. They're the ones who must try to make sense of smoking wreckage and broken and bleeding bodies.

I said something to this effect to a State Police lieutenant standing stiffly at the Capitol's front door

and his eyes—for a brief moment his eyes looked back at some sights I hope I never have to see. And then the shutter came down again, and he just said with quiet understatement: "It does get old."

I Hope I Never Need...

The kind of courage Marcie Christie and Kathleen Vega summoned up to talk so simply and so nakedly about their pain. Kathleen is the mother of Jovita Vega, her three-month-old daughter killed in the drunken driving wreck in Gallup January 14 that sparked the march. Marcie is the drunken driver's ex-wife.

It takes an incredible courage to stand in front of hundreds of people in an imposing room like the state Senate chambers and just say what you feel without being self-

conscious about your vulnerability and the tears running down your face.

And their emotional bravery did some good. That day, the House Taxation and Revenue Committee gave the bill for an extra liquor excise tax in McKinley County its first friendly hearing.

And the next day, the Senate passed a bill that would give us all a local option to close drive-up liquor store windows in our counties by referendum.

Now they've got to get the bill through the House. It will be a rough passage, by its sponsors' estimation. It will take courage for the state representatives to stand up to the liquor industry and vote for that bill.

It will take about a thimbleful of the courage of Marcie Christie and Kathleen Vega.


