Accompanying the students will be the instrumental group of Dale Hoyt and Slick Graham, who play guitars, drum and banjo and have played for years in the Ruidoso area. Also accompanying will be Gary Loretto on guitar; Roger Coble, guitar; Terry Wharton, bass; James and Cindy Hobbs, from the Flying J Ranch; Roger Sowder, mandolin; Churchill Cooke, banjo and accordian and Tad Haynes on trumpet.

Cooke said Music in Our Schools Month provides a vehicle to showcase music programs and build support for music education's success and growth. Music educators believe it is important for all students to be exposed to music as part of a daily curriculum, he added.

Also performing will be members of the aerobics classes at Ruidoso Middle School, dancing to "Feelin' Alive," a song that also will be sung by fourth and fifth graders.

A \$1 donation will be accepted at the door for elementary music program expenses.

Hall isn't betting governor will sign video gaming bill

State Representative Ben Hall, just home from the 60-day session of the State Legislature, brought good news and bad news.

The good news is he was able to win approval for close to a million dollars in state funds for Lincoln County projects.

On the flip side, Hall doesn't give the video gambling bill very good odds in the governor's office.

A bill to allow video gambling in three New Mexico resort towns for a three-year test, passed the Senate and then squeaked by in the House last week. Before the clock ran out on the legislative session, the proposal was sent to Governor Gary Carruthers for his signature.

"My feeling right now is that

he's not going to sign it," said Hall. "Somebody's going to have to persuade him," he added.

Hall voted for the bill, as did Senator James Lee Martin of Socorro who represents the county in the Senate. Hall said Carruthers has vetoed every gambling bill that has hit his desk.

"He's never signed a gambling bill," he added.

Carruthers issued a call Friday for input from residents of the three municipalities included in the bill: Angel Fire, Ruidoso and Taos. Many Ruidoso residents said Friday they had called Santa Fe to ask the governor to sign the bill.

A group of Ruidoso business people have been working hard to get the measure passed this session in hopes the video gambling will

give the area economy the boost they say is needed.

The bill calls for one operator in each town to pay a \$100,000 licensing fee and place as many as 500 video gaming machines in one location. The plan is for 80 percent of the money spent by players to be returned as prizes, with the other 20 percent to go to the operator after a 20 percent state tax and all other local, state and federal taxes.

Hall, in an interview Sunday, said the Village of Ruidoso got approval for \$275,000 in general funds monies to help build a civic/events center.

Hall said the only strings attached call for the village to use the old airport land for a golf course or

Frank Potter talked of how Taos groups have worked together to spend money well and become world-renowned as a resort.

If Ruidoso Downs implements a lodgers tax, then all lodging establishments in the county, other than the Inn of the Mountain Gods, will be collecting the state-approved levy.

Petty said the idea he proposed

won't even take all the \$320,000 that will be available in the building fund by the end of June.

Member Preston Isaacs, recalling when the board discussed the race track location several years ago, said the auditorium will seat 740 people in theater style chairs. He said the race track operators are willing to remove the horse show

pavilion in the auditorium.

"You could really have a neat facility there," said Petty.

The board voted unanimously to present their plan to the Ruidoso Village Council.

Potter reported on requests before the State Legislature.

Income is down, expenses are up at LCMC in Feb.

Lincoln County Medical Center board of trustees discussed finances, monthly reports and budget at their regular monthly meeting Thursday.

LCMC administrator Steve Keller presented the financial report which showed gross income down for February 1989 as compared to February 1988. Operating expenses however, were not less in February 1989 as compared to February 1988. LCMC experienced a net operating loss of \$139,135 for February.

Keller said losses to charity cases were far lower than anticipated however.

Another large figure in operating costs was due to a heart medication, which Keller said cost more than \$2,000 a vial, with total treatment requiring two vials. The medication, known as TPA, increases survival rates and decreases hospital stays for heart attack victims, Keller said.

The medication is an example of the high cost of modern health care, Keller added.

Dr. Roger Beechie, a trustee,

said the community if fortunate to have such technology.

Keller also pointed out the expense created by the \$63,424 deposit on radiology equipment.

Ambulance report showed more expense due to major equipment repair and maintenance. The ambulance service made a total of 74 calls; 22 in the village, 11 from Mescalero, five from Ski Apache, three from the county and one other.

"It was not a good month," Keller said about February at LCMC.

The other county medical clinic: at Carrizozo and Corona, are seeing an increase of patients, Keller said, with a "remarkable" increase of patients at the Corona clinic.

"Ernie (Gonzales, Physicians' assistant for the clinics) is doing a real good job," Keller added.

LCMC is partially funded through a 3.25 mil levy on county property taxes. Those funds help defray construction and maintenance costs.

The remodeling project is nearing completion. The nurses station, radiology, and admitting are nearly

Juvenile is charged with burglaries

Ruidoso Police arrested a 17-year-old male in Albuquerque for nine days of diagnostics after appearing before District Judge Richard A. Parsons. Swenor would not release the suspect's name. Swenor said the suspect alleged-

ly burglarized Big Daddy's in Midtown in July and again March 2, and The Attic on March 14. He said Big Daddy's merchandise valued at about \$750 was recovered. Merchandise from The Attic valued at about \$3,500 was recovered. The youth also is charged with criminal trespass and is accused of living in a house on Hilltop Drive that didn't belong to him, said Swenor. He said the suspect faces larceny charges out of Las Cruces where he is accused of stealing merchandise

value at \$500 from Dillard's. In a separate incident, two 16-year-olds were picked up in Albuquerque and charged in a rash of auto burglaries around Wal-Mart, said Swenor. Ruidoso Police are still working on the March 11 case involving damage to a number of roadway and traffic signs. "We've got good tire tracks and

all the physical evidence," said Swenor. Also this weekend, late Friday or early Saturday, someone broke out the front window at the old White's store on Sudderth Drive. Stereo equipment valued at more than \$1,200 was reported missing. Swenor said an inventory of missing items isn't complete yet. A police car was involved in an accident on Sunday. Nobody was injured in the crash, but details of the accident weren't available early today (Monday).

Hondo apples are just what the Dr. ordered

An apple a day will still keep the doctor away if you're eating Hondo Valley apples. The national scare over the use of the chemical Alar on apples should not concern consumers in this area, according to apple growers in the Hondo Valley. Louis Kincaid of Hondo says he doesn't use Alar and never has. Kincaid says he knows of no one in the valley who uses the chemical. Wesley Grigsby says although he has never used the chemical, the publicity over its use elsewhere already is having an effect on his business. He says the public will have to be educated about the problem. Grigsby, owner of the White

Mountain Apple Shed, says his wholesaler has notified him he will have to indemnify the fact that he doesn't use Alar. He also will be required to carry \$500,000 product liability, about double the amount of insurance he currently carries. Grigsby said that cost is going to get passed along to consumers. Grigsby says no grower would intentionally use something that is harmful. "As a grower I'm around the pesticides—right in it. I'm not going to use something that hurts me or anyone else." He says only seven percent of growers nationally have ever used it. "We have known for four years

that we should not use it. Grocery stores notified people four years ago that they would not buy apples treated with Alar," he added. What Alar does in newer trees is promote fruit regrowth and holds fruit on trees longer. According to Grigsby there are other products on the market that do same thing. He does the same thing with thinning, using non-toxic products. He uses an acid called NAA to knock some fruit off the trees during the early stages of growth, so the apples left will be bigger and better. NAA also makes the fruit hold on longer at harvest time. Grigsby says the worst thing about the scare is that Alar was not taken off the market four years ago

when the harmful effects were discovered. It is to be taken off in 1990. He says products used by growers in the Hondo Valley are non-toxic and do not seep into the skins of the apples as Alar does. He hopes the scare is not going to make people afraid to eat apples because after the fruit is run through the processing plant, there is no chance of any residue remaining. All major chains are testing apples when the fruit is purchased so there is virtually no chance that any bad fruit will reach the store shelves.

State agency will help collect child support

Many single parents in New Mexico are raising their children without any financial support from the parent who is absent. Most of them are mothers and many are on public assistance programs such as Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC). According to the Income Support Division of New Mexico Human Services Department (HSD), about half the absent parents could provide support and save the government millions in public assistance. In Ruidoso, parents with problems getting child support should

contact the child support enforcement office in Las Cruces. Richard Perry recently assumed duties as county office manager. Perry is a former county manager in Roswell. He has worked for HSD 12 years. The Las Cruces office serves the counties of Lincoln, Doña Ana, Luna, Grant, Socorro, Hidalgo, Otero, Sierra and Catron. "Delinquent child support payments are a very serious problem in this region," Perry says. According to Perry, at present, there are 124 active AFDC cases in Lincoln County. The primary reason for those cases is absent parents not providing support. In at

least 25 percent of those cases, the parent is under court order to provide support. When a parent receives AFDC funding, the Child Support Enforcement Division (CSED) is assigned rights to any support received by the absent parent. Parents who have a problem with child support, but who are not eligible for AFDC are still eligible to receive help from the CSED, but are required to pay certain fees for the assistance. In Lincoln County in 1988, the HSD collected \$46,699 of child support for single parents, according to Tricia McKenna, of the state HSD

office in Santa Fe. \$13.3 million was collected in the state. Support does not have to have been court-ordered in order to get help from CSED. McKenna stresses that a mother does not have to have been married to request help. CSED will help a mother establish paternity and then help her get a court order for support. McKenna said the office would like to get the message out that if a parent thinks he or she is owed support they should contact the CSED in Las Cruces. They may write to CSED, 750 North Motel Blvd., Las Cruces or call 1-524-6020.

Doctors advise a review of shot records

Measles epidemics in Texas and California may put anyone traveling into those areas at risk, according to a news release provided by Family Practice Associates. Anyone traveling to Houston, Lubbock, Monahans, Odessa, San Angelo, Texas, or Los Angeles, California, is encouraged to review the immunization records of their families. "If your children or you are younger than 33 years old and you plan to travel to these cities, the New Mexico Department of Health and Environment recommends you review your measles immunity," reads the release. Doctors Arlene Brown and Michael Spence, family physicians, will review shot records at no charge. Problems delay licensing for Ruidoso Downs Race Track

A bureaucratic quagmire centered around the racing commission's inability to afford a background check of Fort Worth, Texas, multi-millionaire R.D. Hubbard, has left Hubbard without a permanent license to operate the Ruidoso Downs Race Track, according to published reports. Hubbard paid \$2.6 million in cash and assumed \$9 million in debts last summer to acquire the financially strapped racetrack. The state said it was not

satisfied with information on Hubbard provided by other state agencies, but claims it has no money to conduct a thorough investigation into Hubbard's background. In addition to the routine background check, the commission has special concerns because of Hubbard's ties to concessionaire Delaware North, the successor company to Emprise Corporation of Buffalo, New York, according to reports. Hubbard said in an interview that he was willing to answer any

questions the commission might have. Both Hubbard and Sam Gifford, vice president of Delaware North, said they welcome thorough investigations and that past problems of Delaware North had been rectified. State Racing Commission executive secretary Tom Golder was quoted as saying it would cost \$43,000 to conduct the investigation. He said the commission doesn't have the funds.

Lincoln County also got \$142,000 for the Water Defense Association, \$10,000 for Fort Stanton Cemetery, \$100,000 to renovate an abandoned building at Fort Stanton Hospital and Training Center and \$360,000 to upgrade the water system at Camp Sierra Blanca.

Old Lincoln was included in an appropriation to the Cultural Affairs Division to redo a building in the historic town. "We didn't have to raise any taxes—we stayed within recurring revenues," said Hall. He said legislators included in the budget signed by Governor Caruthers enough funding for

teachers to get a five percent pay increase. While legislators included the money, the local school boards make out each school district budget, said Hall. As of Sunday, the governor had signed about 100 bills and vetoed 14, said Hall. He said as many as 200 bills are in the Governor's Office awaiting his signature or veto.

Annual ski race helps Handicapped Skiers

Question: What has six legs, four skis and three smiling faces?

Answer: The winning team at the twelfth Annual Handicapped-Businessperson Championship ski race.

Handicapped racer Kevin Taylor of Ft. Stanton and his Ruidoso business teammates Gary Lynch and Ted Durham claimed victory at the March 8 race. They had the fastest combined times after two heats, defeating twenty other three-person teams.

Finishing second was Larry Brock, a double amputee, and his business teammates Greg Cary and Mike Steed. All are from Ruidoso.

Roswell handicapped racer David Barwick finished third with his business team, David Wilson and Preston Isaacs of Ruidoso.

Fourth place was awarded the team of Alamogordo skiers Katrina Gould from the New Mexico School for the Visually Handicapped and businessmen D.B. Adams of Capitan and Ronnie Hemphill of Ruidoso.

"This race is held in conjunction with a silent auction, the chief fundraiser for the Ski Apache Handicapped Skiers' Association (SAHSA), said director Diana Person. Proceeds from the auction, as well as race entry fees, defray costs of the specialized equipment needed by the handicapped skiers.

One such piece of specialized equipment is the outrigger, a crutch with a cuff around the forearm and a small ski attached to the bottom.

"Each businessperson is required to ski on one ski with both feet tied together and using two outriggers instead of poles. This is called three-tracking," said Person. "Although all the business racers were skiers, about half of them had not skied three-track before the race. That's why we hold the race on East Easy (a less difficult slope)

so nobody will hurt themselves."

To add to the suspense and fun, the three-person teams were formed the night before the race by drawing names out of a hat, said Person. "Teams were mixed with both men and women, with experienced skiers and not-so-experienced, with veteran racers and first time racers. Everyone ran in an open class."

Although the business people were required to race "three-track, handicapped racers raced according to their disability.

"We had blind racers, developmentally disabled, single and double amputees and those with cerebral palsy and spina bifida, said Person. Their abilities ranged from first year skiers to a member of the U.S. Disabled Ski Team who has raced internationally, Robert Strohline, was seriously injured during a qualifying race for the National Handicapped Ski Championships in Colorado in January.

"He's recovered completely and his doctor released him to ski the day before our race," said Person.

Trophies were awarded the first four handicapped finishers.

"We used to give the businesspersons trophies also, but a few years ago they said instead of trophies, they'd rather the money go for the kids' equipment," said Person proudly.







Ardena Comanche sets school record in 800M run

An inexperienced but talented Ruidoso Warrior track team left the Carlsbad meet last Saturday with good thoughts for the future and one Warrior with a new school record.

"We saw a lot of improvement over many performances," said head coach Ronny Maskew.

Ardena Comanche broke Cindi Harrison's 800M run record of 2:33.9. Comanche set the new record at 2:31.6. Comanche now holds three school records; 800M, 1600M and 3200M.

"The relay teams were new, their first run. The 400M relay team ran a faster race than our state champions several years ago at the same point in time."

"We had some spots we know we have to smooth out, but it was a pretty good day."

Participating teams were Carlsbad, Roswell, Lovington, Hobbs, Goddard and Ruidoso.

Dusty Beavers heaved the discus 129-5 to place fourth. Ricky Brazell threw the plate 93-3 and Shane Barnett chucked the disc 91-2.

In the shot put, Beavers managed a 41-6 heave, but didn't place.

Chris Torres led the Warriors in the broad jump with a leap of 18-1. Michael Swanner was second at 17-10 and Jose Marquez 16-6.

In the javelin toss, sophomore Steve Dankert topped the Warriors with a throw of 152-9, good for third place. Swanner was close with 151-4 for fourth place and Ryan Wright was good for 107-2.

The Warriors didn't clear the opening height on the pole vault. Vaulter James Atwood, new to the Warrior track program as of Tuesday, did not make the trip.

Junior Ira Sago showed some distance talent when he ran the 3200M run in 10:28.9 seconds for second place. Sago beat his Odessa time by nearly 30 seconds.

Freshman Nick Nanz finished the race in 11:18 for sixth place.

In the 1600M, Nanz was the head Warrior at 5:13.67. John Sal-

cido, also a freshman, finished in 6:05.49 and Randy Cox improved his personal best to 6:18.8.

In the 400M, Louis Jimenez covered the distance in 58:01.

Sago topped the Warrior runners in the 800M at 2:04.2 for second place in the meet. Sago improved his time over last week by two seconds.

Jason Keller finished at 2:12.8 which is a great time for the freshman.

In the 200M dash, freshman Jose Marquez sprinted for a 23.9 time in the preliminaries and won third place in the finals.

Ricky Brazell came in fourth in the finals of the 200M although he had the best Warrior time in the preliminaries at 23.6.6. Chris Torres was a slender foot behind at 23.72.

Torres topped the blue and gold in the 100M dash 11.70. It was almost a dead heat with Marquez who finished at 11.74.

The Warrior team of Sago, Marquez, Torres and Brazell ran the 400M relay in 45:45, good for fifth place. That bettered the Odessa run by 2.5 seconds.

In the 800M relay, the Warrior team of Torres, Marquez, Victor Alonso and Brazell tripped the ribbon at 1:37.51, good for another fifth place.

The Warriors 1600M relay team of Whitlock, Keller, Jimenez and Alonso finished fifth with a time of 4:01.96.

The Warrior girls fared much better than the boys in the team scoring with 37 points. The meet's co-champs Roswell and Carlsbad scored 66 points each.

Warrior sprinter Rachelle Holstein didn't make the trip because of a pulled muscle. The winning times of the 100M and 200M were greater than Holstein's times at Odessa last week.

Jennifer Jimenez grabbed third place in the discus with a throw of 96.7. Charlotte Tallman could have hit the pitcher's mound with her 59-9 toss, but Dona Samuels would have been short at 52-2.

Jimenez shoved the shot 29-4 in-

ches for a fifth place slot. Tallman hit the 23.2 mark.

Amy Wishard led the Warrior girls in the broad jump with a leap of 13-3. Norma Murillo was five inches behind at 12-8 and Adell Caranta four inches less at 12-4.

Chantel Bowen cleared 4-10 in the high jump for fourth place.

Joelynn Comanche grabbed a second place in the 3200M run with a 12:58.5 time. Freshman Luisa Tam was fifth with a time of 13:17.

Comanche took top meet honors with a first place in the 1600M run with a time of 6:02.43.

In the 400M, freshman Amy Wishard ran 65.79, good for fourth place. Freshman Catrina Gabaldon was four seconds behind at 69.97.

Ardena Comanche ran the 800M in the school record time of 2:31.6 for second place, 7 seconds off of her Odessa time.

Missy Gosdin ran the 200M in 29.04. Marcie Stokes was two seconds behind at 31.75.

Freshman Natasha Mulqueen ran the 100M in 13.73. Linda Hankins was a second later at 14.78 and Yvette Maldonado was a split hair behind Hankins at 14.91.

Linder Rad carried the Warrior weight in the 100M hurdles, finishing at 17.90. Freshman Betsy Cull ran a respectable 19.85 and freshman Becky Benson 23.21.

In the 300M hurdles, Gosdin ran 53.63, good for third place. Cull crossed the line at 63.0 and Benson hit the wire at 66.52.

The girls were running great in the 400M relay, but dropped the baton for a disqualification.

The 800M relay team of Caranta, Murillo, Mulqueen and Wishard snatched a fourth place for a meet time of 1:55.7.

In the 1600M medley relay, the team of Murillo, Stokes, Caranta, and Tams finished fifth with a time of 5:12.69.

The 1600M relay followed and the Warrior team of Jennifer Parker, Wishard, Ardena Comanche and Gosdin ran a fast 4:27.19 for third place, the best of all Warrior relay teams.

Texan Ragsdale named AD and head football coach

tion. He coached the varsity line and was head baseball coach.

Ragsdale is a graduate of Western New Mexico University at Silver City and holds a bachelor's degree in physical education. He also has a master's degree in guidance and counseling and has completed Texas requirements for an administrative certificate.

Kerrville is in the heart of Texas football country. This Class 4-AAAA football district is considered by many to be the toughest in the state. In 1983, Ragsdale was appointed head football coach and athletic director at Tivy High School in the Kerrville district. He held this position until the Fall of 1987 when he asked to be relieved due to a life-threatening illness of one of his children. At the time, he felt he was unable to spend as much time with his son as he needed and, at the same time, do justice to the high school football program. The following year, he was appointed assistant principal of Tivy High School at the request of the high school administration

and many of the faculty.

The next year, Ragsdale was appointed assistant principal of Peterson Middle School at the request of the superintendent who wanted a discipline program at Peterson similar to the one at Tivy High School.

While coaching at Tivy, Ragsdale took a team that was small in numbers and small in size and developed them into one of the top teams in the district. In the fall of 1987, his first year as assistant principal, the team that Ragsdale developed was the state AAAA semi-finalist. They repeated as state semi-finalists in 1988.

The staff and administration at Tivy gave Ragsdale much of the credit for the success of this team.

While at Tivy, Ragsdale originated the Hill Country Football Clinic and wrote a computer scouting program for the school. He also wrote a scope and sequence curriculum for the Kerrville independent school district in health and physical education. He shared in the development of the Tivy at-risk program for students who were in danger of dropping out. He developed the first coaches handbook for the district in 1983. While at Tivy, Ragsdale assisted 12 high school football players in getting college football scholarships.

He originated the Tivy High School and Peterson Middle School discipline management plan. Ragsdale has also had a lot of success in his efforts as a track coach in that many of his athletes have qualified for the state.

Ragsdale coached Hobbs for three years before going to Kerrville. He was an assistant coach in football and track in Hobbs. He also served as chairman of the North Central steering committee prior to the North Central visiting team's arrival. This position is considered to be one of the most responsible and demanding jobs a teacher can be asked to do.

Ragsdale coached in Roswell for four years prior to going to Hobbs. While in Roswell, he was assistant football coach and at the age of 24, was named head football coach. He also served as track coach and wrestling coach during his tenure

at Goddard.

While in high school, Ragsdale was selected as an all-state football player in 1967 and was an all-district football and baseball player in 1968. He was in the National Honor Society and the student council while in high school. He was chosen as a boys' state delegate and attended college on an academic scholarship. While in college he was selected for the NAIA honorable mention All American football team in 1971 and was a NAIA all district 7 center in 1971.

Ragsdale was philosophic in his approach to coaching.

"Loyalty is a must for all the coaches on my staff," he said. "That loyalty must extend to the players, the school and the community. Athletics is a means to an end. It should never replace or compete with the ultimate purpose of education."

Ragsdale is an advocate of positive thinking.

"Praise equals performance, the more praise an athlete gets the better he performs," he said. "The athletes should like what they are

doing. It is our job as coaches to not ever turn anyone off."

Ragsdale is married and has three children. His wife, Cheryl, is a registered nurse. He is a member of the Methodist church and teaches Sunday school.

Ragsdale's son has overcome his illness and the new coach is anxious to get back to coaching.

Dusty Skellett gave Oscar Breage a great game but lost the match in two tie breakers 7-6, 7-6.


The girls won their meet with NMMI, declared a scrimmage, through default. NMMI could not field enough players.

They took turns paying tribute to Cox, who served as Lincoln County manager for more than six years, calling her dedicated, and completely honest and crediting her with keeping the county out of trouble.

Members of the audience who spoke Saturday included county attorney Gary Mitchell, county road superintendent Tommy Hall and Betty Schrecengost.

"I never took so many orders from one woman," joked Mitchell. "Suzanne is very religious and is always telling me to mend my ways," said Mitchell. "So I started reading the Bible and realized after the first chapter of Genesis that God didn't have Suzanne Cox working for him at that time. Otherwise, He would have created the world in a 40-hour work week," he continued.

Former Lincoln County sheriff

Tom Sullivan and County Treasurer Shirley Goodloe praised Cox for the help she provided newly-elected officials.

Cox read aloud a letter she received from Senator Jeff Bingaman. She thanked the many who gathered to pay her tribute, and returned the praise for the people she has worked with in the county, especially the commissioners.

"I felt we worked as a team for the betterment of the county," said Cox. "And never have I worked with men of such high caliber," she added.

"I love all of you, and I pray God's blessings on all of you," she concluded.

EDITORIAL

The video gambling bill that passed the State Senate early last week and just squeaked by in the House on Thursday may not contain the magic cure for economic ills that plague Ruidoso.

But, this isn't a perfect world, and we haven't yet found any quick and painless, much less magic, answer to the sluggish economic trends that rippled into New Mexico after the West Texas oil bust.

The bill would establish video gambling for a three-year test-period for three New Mexico resort towns (Angel Fire, Ruidoso and Taos) to install one location each with up to 500 video gaming machines. The bill authorizes each municipality to choose an operator who would pay a \$100,000 licensing fee to the state.

Using Angel Fire figures, bill proponents say the 500 machines will take in \$80 million when used for a 365-day period. The bill calls for 80 percent of the coins to be paid to players as prizes and 20 percent to go to the operator. The operator would pay a 20 percent state tax right off the top, plus other gross receipts and applicable state and federal taxes.




Ruidoso's economy needs a shot-in-the-arm, and we've all seen that vacationers are drawn to areas where there is something to do, and one of the things lots of folks like to do is gamble. That's part of the fun for horse racing fans.

We believe the estimated \$16 million local share of the video operation is just what the doctor ordered to make those Ruidoso cash registers start ringing at lodging establishments, restaurants and shops.

Governor Garrey Carruthers, while not sold on expanding gambling further in New Mexico, put out a call last week to hear from constituents in Ruidoso, Angel Fire and Taos, the three resorts targeted for the test project. He asked people to call his office at 827-3000 to voice opinions on the gambling bill.

We urge Ruidoso citizens to make their views known by calling the Governor's Office. We made our call.

We believe Governor Carruthers should sign the video gambling bill into law for the three-year test period.-fj

Capitol Comments

My Pal Jimmie Martinez...

...is a Santa Fe groceryman who was just elected to the local school board, the first board member from outside the education or legal or real estate professions in a long time.

Jimmie made a very perceptive comment the other evening when I stopped in to buy milk.

He said one reason so many of

our high school graduates can't read is that reading is not one of the credits the kids have to have to graduate.

"All of their accreditation is based on courses they take in high school," Jimmie said. "As long as they can bluff their way through so many English, science and math credits, they can graduate. We ought to be requiring them to have

'reading credits' from back in elementary school."

I think Jimmie's on to something...

The State Senate, Meanwhile...

...Sliced in half the appropriation in the 1989-90 General Appropriations Act for remedial programs in grades 1-6. We shouldn't worry, though.

In the first place the money is appropriated uncategorically. The earmarking is just theoretical, and in fact there's plenty of money to cover the costs of the increased remedial programs.

And in the second place, those new remedial courses, which were

mandated by the 1986 Public School Reform Act, are built into the state funding formula, so the local districts will get the money according to their needs.

Let's hope the local districts will be honest with themselves, their students and the parents about the true scope of need for reading remedial courses in their elementary schools. A few years of catching up on basics could save a lot of kids (and their families) a lot of grief later on...

As For The Other School Reforms...

...Mandated to go into effect next year—well, the Legislature put

them off again. The districts got another year of grace on downsizing pupil-teacher ratios in the lower grades and high school English classes, and on reducing the amount of non-instructional duties teachers have to perform.

But, hey, look at it this way: at least the mandates weren't repealed, which is something many local districts, the State School Boards Association and the State Department of Education were all lobbying to achieve.

And the Legislature did enact an interesting little measure carried by Senate Majority Whip Tim Jennings, D-Chaves.

Senate Bill 765, assuming it gets

the governor's signature (by no means a safe assumption), will add weights to the public school funding formula beginning with the 1990-91 school year to pay for the class size requirements.

It works like this: beginning that year, school districts will get from 1.3 to 1.5 formula units for each fulltime kindergarten student and from 1.1 to 1.3 units for each first grade student, thus automatically adding extra dollars to that district's state distribution.

That money, Jennings says, would pay for the extra teachers and teachers' aides needed to lower the class sizes.

On The Record...

I spend a lot of time at meetings ... taking careful notes as various folks speak their pieces.

While members of various boards and commissions are talking, sometimes even "speechifying," I'm listening carefully and writing down what they say. That's what reporters do.

Strange as it may seem, I really enjoy meetings ... watching the various personalities interacting, and observing how people work out differences and a consensus is reached. I take the task of covering the news very seriously.

That's why hearing of a possible misquote gets me very upset, as it does the other members of The News staff. Nobody's perfect, and as much as I write, it's always possible to make a mistake. So, I check it out immediately, when somebody says there's a mistake in a story.

Most of the time notes and tape recordings show that reporters are accurate. I guess speakers are so

busy speaking, they often don't listen to what they're saying. If our notes are correct, then we forget the whole thing with no hard feelings.

But, once in a while reporters find they've made a mistake. In that case, we clarify or correct the misinformation or misquote as soon as possible. And we vow to try harder.

Recently I had a strange experience that began with my quoting Rick Evans, a member of the Municipal Airport Planning Board. In three subsequent meetings, Evans made speeches calling on the media to be more careful, saying he had been misquoted.

It all started with talk about the amount of old airport land needed for a golf course. Members of the board have worried that giving up the whole tract for the golf course development will not leave a spot for future developments of a hotel/convention center and a civic

center.

Here's a small part of what Evans said as recorded at the first meeting: "... we have a lot of folks in this town that are for this project and a lot of folks that are against it ... because we're basically giving up the entire asset. And we really are, we're at least giving up 90 percent of it.

"The school system in this town is going to benefit as much from this or benefit equally from this effort, assuming the economic benefits come around, as what everyone else is; their enrollment's going to go up, their funding's going to go up, they have a vested interest in the economic development of the town.

"I would like to raise the question ... if the school would be willing to dedicate not only land for this road extension but also land that could be utilized for fairway so that we can retain additional acreage on this west side that could be used for other public purposes.

"There's some economics behind that ... If we retain enough land over there, at some point the value of that land could be tremendous—20, 30, 50 years from now, just by virtue of the improvements that can go on.

"I think the more land we can retain ... (we) would be advised to

look at doing that now.

"And I think we should consider asking the school to become our partner in this venture to some extent.

"...They've got tremendous amounts of unused land out there, more than enough for their needs for many, many years. And I think we ought to see if they would look at joining us in this effort. If they could give up 20 acres over there, we could add 20 plus the convention site plus the jogging trails, we could have 40 to 60 acres of land over there that we could retain for the benefit of the public...

"I think we should ask them for land in addition to just road easements," said Evans.

Now, here's what was published in The News: "Board member Rick Evans, noting the development will benefit the schools as well as the village, suggested the village should ask the school to become partners in the venture and give up about 20 acres of land for the development and/or road extension easements."

Evans, in three subsequent speeches, questioned the report, especially the use of the 20-acre figure. That's OK, but by the time he was through at least 200 people were wondering why the "media" couldn't get the facts straight.

I covered the first meeting, another reporter covered the first and third "misquote" speeches and yet another reporter was on hand for the second "misquote" speech.

This is what we at The News do when someone questions a story:

1. I check my notes, or ask the reporter who wrote the story to check his/her notes.

2. If the questioner has contacted us, we listen to what they have to say, tell them what our notes show and work out a plan. If we find, by our notes and (sometimes) the tape recording, that the speaker said what we quoted, then we shake hands, part friendly and forget the whole thing. If we find that we have made a mistake, we print a clarification or correction as soon as possible.

3. If, as in the most recent "saga," we aren't contacted, but only hear the complaint through a speech or even through the grapevine, we still check our notes. If we find there was a misquote, we contact the speaker and come up with a clarification. If we find that the quote or story was correct and aren't contacted personally by the questioner, then we just forget it.

We have to figure the speaker knew what he/she said. And, because we have notes, we know that we know what was said.

And, that's what was so weird about my airport board report. Evans continued to complain, but he didn't call me.

"Misquote speech 1:" I checked my notes ... everything was cool.

"Misquote speech 2:" I asked the planning administrator to check the audio tape of the meeting ... it matched my notes. Let's just forget it.

"Misquote speech 3:" I borrowed a videotape of the meeting ... it matched the audio, it matched my notes and it matched my story. It was getting hard to forget.

The word was out through three meetings, through a videotape and all over town that my reporting was inaccurate. Could we expect "misquote speech 4?"

And so I called Rick. We've been friends for long enough that I was still perplexed over why he hadn't called me about the "misquote." I told him just what I've told you.


"There's really no problem, Frankie," said Rick. He assured me he had no hard feelings about the problems he saw in the reports.

No, he didn't want to listen to the tape, but assured me he had no antagonism about the "inaccuracies" and was ready to forget the whole thing...
