





## Lawsuit against former sheriff is dismissed

A lawsuit filed more than a year ago by the Lincoln County Commission against a fellow elected official, Don Samuels, was dismissed Friday by District Judge Robert Doughty.

Former sheriff Samuels, instructed by his attorney not to speak until the lawsuit over overtime payments to his staff was settled, broke his silence Friday on the allegations that led to the lawsuit and cast a shadow over county politics for more than a year. (See Samuels' complete statement on page 2A.)

Michael Gross, Samuels' attorney, said the case was dismissed with prejudice, meaning it cannot be refiled. "This matter should have never been taken to court," Gross said.

Commissioners John Allen

Hightower, Bill Karn and Ralph Dunlap filed the lawsuit in January 1988, and announced it during a regular meeting. Samuels said he wasn't present for that meeting because he was hospitalized for back surgery.

Gross said he asked the present commission of Bob Hemphill, Karon Petty and Rick Simpson to file for the dismissal, and after consulting with their attorney, A.J. Ferrara, they did.

He said the former commission, former county manager Suzanne Cox and county attorney Gary Mitchell never were able to prove any of the charges they made.

"They did absolutely nothing to bring the case to a conclusion," Gross said.

Gross said Samuels was never given a forum for his side of the story as the former commissioners would not take the suit to court, to

allow Samuels to defend himself under oath, with the outcome determined by the judge.

The grand jury called to investigate the sheriff only convened and took no action as no evidence was presented, Gross said.

Cox, in a telephone interview Saturday, said the motions to dismiss the lawsuit began when the former commissioners could not get a court hearing during their administration. Ferrara tried unsuccessfully to get a hearing in a reasonable time, said Cox.

Judge Doughty set a hearing for March, after the former commission left office, so the lawsuit had become a moot point, Cox said.

Meanwhile, Samuels and all three members of the Lincoln County Commission that filed the suit were defeated in their bids for

## Video gambling bill fate is still a toss-up

Citizens of three New Mexico towns aren't just sitting back and waiting for Governor Garrey Carruthers to make up his mind about a video gambling bill passed by the State Legislature.

The bill, to allow the gaming machines in Ruidoso, Angel Fire and Taos, has been the subject of a massive lobbying campaign that includes telephone calls, letters and visits to Santa Fe.

Ted Bennett and Glover McCarty of Ruidoso delivered to the Governor's Office a petition signed by more than 3,185 people who want Carruthers to OK the bill. That petition, delivered just over a week ago, was the second that Ruidoso citizens have sent to the roundhouse.

Bud Vuicich delivered a petition with more than 2,100 signatures during the legislative session.

Although a spokesman for the governor said the governor hasn't actually asked for input on the bill, Bennett said Sunday that that is exactly what he did just by taking the office of governor.

Bennett said he and McCarty handed both petitions to Max Best, the governor's legal counsel. Ben-

nett said he also provided economic information to Best that he hopes the governor will use in deciding to sign the bill.

Proponents believe the video gambling will provide a much-needed boost to the local economy.

Bennett said Best told him that the Governor's Office logged 3,900 calls over the video gambling issue about two weeks ago. Best told Bennett that 2,900 came from Ruidoso and Lincoln County, and only a dozen callers opposed the bill.

Don Caviness, press aide for Carruthers, said last week that only about 700 people had called on the gaming issue.

Bennett said Best lined out the problems Governor Carruthers has with signing a gambling bill, and those problems range from the impact on Indian reservations to the impact on the local economy and the state's ability to regulate the industry.

Bennett said he and McCarty provided answers for all those problems.

"I think all has been done that can be done," said Bennett, still hoping the governor will sign the bill by the midnight April 7 deadline.

## MainStreet looks back, moves forward

Members of MainStreet Ruidoso looked back over the group's first year and gave themselves a pat on the back during an annual meeting last week at village hall.

"We've laid a strong foundation and we're ready to take off," said outgoing president Margaret McDonald Lahey, before turning over the reins to incoming president Herb Brunell.

"We're working on sidewalks, we're thinking about parking and we need your input," said Lahey, reviewing the past year's accomplishments that include getting organized, hiring three project managers, sponsoring a logo contest and more.

The MainStreet public-private partnership is financed through state and federal service contracts, village funds and contributions of money and services from members and individuals. This year, besides getting organized, MainStreet has been involved with facade rehabilitations of three Brunell's buildings and the Fifth Street Maul.

State director Ursula Boatright and state architect Ed Boles were on hand for the annual meeting and other activities that included a walking tour of Midtown on Friday.

The two state officials praised the Ruidoso group for the progress made during this first year. Boatright said MainStreet is active in 30 states, with more than 500 communities taking part.

She said MainStreet is a broad-based program that draws everyone that has a stake in downtown, not just downtown merchants, into working together.

After the village was accepted as a MainStreet participant last year, Boatright and Boles helped local merchants and others get started before a resource team of development professionals visited the village in June. Based upon interviews, on-site examinations and evaluation of background materials, that team provided a report to help MainStreet Ruidoso carry forward with its downtown revitalization plan.

## Clerk updates voter roll


Lincoln County Clerk Martha Proctor was so concerned over voter registration problems she discovered during February school board elections that she initiated an extensive update project.

Proctor, in a telephone interview Friday, said she was surprised by the number of complaints from a number of different voters that ranged from missing names to names listed in wrong precincts to no precinct at all.

The February elections were the first for Proctor who was elected in November and took over the County Clerk's Office on January 1.

Proctor said she notified the Secretary of State who was emphatic that her office correct the problems. With permission from the Secretary of State, the state office that oversees elections and voter registration, Proctor said her staff began checking all affidavit information and pinpointing problem registrations.

# Planning group hears objections to road extension

Bill McCarty of White Mountain Development Corporation (WMDC) opposes road development on the old airport property adjacent to WMDC and McCarty land.

Ruidoso Municipal Airport Planning Board (MAPB) Chairman Frank Kolb, during a regular meeting Wednesday, read a letter from McCarty which stating his "absolute" opposition to the proposed extension of Warrior Drive.

McCarty said the new road is not needed and is detrimental in all respects to the property. McCarty also objects to the proposed extension across the airport property.

If any property is obtained from WMDC for the extension it will be through the condemnation process, as the corporation is not interested in selling or giving away any land, the letter continued.

Kolb said he thinks McCarty is not opposed to the proposed golf course and hotel development on

the airport, just to Warrior Drive extension.

MAPB member Jerry Shaw said the road extension could be detrimental to the golf course, if it is used as a major thoroughfare. The alternate road extension would go around the golf course.

"Nothing is written on stone," Kolb said.

Village Councillor Al Junge, present at the MAPB meeting, said the opposition is a "stumbling block" to the road extension.

The board also learned that planning administrator Cleatus Richards just received information from the New Mexico State Highway Department about the feasibility of the Warrior Drive Extension.

Also Wednesday, MAPB appointed members Don Shaw and Wayne Townsend as financial agents to handle the \$2,500 seed money appropriated by the Village Council for board expenses.

Although the council suggested

one financial agent, Ruidoso village financial adviser John Varley suggested two members be appointed to provide an alternate to function in the other's absence. The members will be responsible for purchase orders and expenditures approved by the board and for monthly reports to the council.

Varley will establish a financial procedure for MAPB for purchases and other expenses.

In other business, MAPB:

—Discussed articles from the El Paso Times about the search for a college in the New Mexico towns of Deming and Taos. Both towns want colleges but are unable to finance them, the articles read. Kolb said the information reinforced opinions that a college for Ruidoso is not in the near future.

—Discussed a new Sheraton Hotel opened in Prescott, Arizona. Kolb said he talked with R.D. Hubbard and learned he is talking with hotel people in Arizona. Negotiations are continuing with Hubbard

and Colbert Golf, and a meeting is scheduled for April 7, Kolb said.

—Voiced a consensus opinion the proposed change in village government would be harmful to the development of the airport property.

—Agreed to acknowledge in writing all correspondence received by the board.

—Directed board member Wayne Townsend to pursue the idea of a hotel-restaurant-management technical school at the proposed hotel and civic center. Discussion about Townsend's idea included the fear local employees would be crowded out of jobs, to a stable hotel staff created from the school's students. Member Earline Phillips said she agrees Ruidoso does have employee problems, but she is concerned jobs will be taken from the local people.

—Complimented the local media, including television, for interest in village activities.

"I'm trying to get it all corrected," Proctor said.

She said when a discrepancy is identified, for instance when a voter is listed in the wrong district, a card is being mailed to the voter requesting updated location information.

A large number of discrepancies occurred in the Ruidoso area, perhaps due to the larger number of voters in the village area, Proctor said.

Part of the problem might have occurred when the registration information was entered on the computer, Proctor said. Computers were changed in October 1988, during former county clerk Fran Siddens' administration.

Deputy clerk Loree Vallejos, who has worked in the clerk's office since May 1982, said the basic computer programming for registration lists changed with the addition of location and precinct numbers. Registrations were not computerized until April 1983, during Jane McSwane's term as clerk, she said.

The Clerk's Office also is cooperating with the Board of Elections appointed by the Lincoln County Commissioners in a purge of the voter registration rolls. The

purge is mandated every odd year after the general election.

The Clerk's Office mailed purge cards to 1,253 Lincoln County voters and, so far, 81 re-registration cards were returned.

Board of Election members John White, Pat Hume and Noema Page, compiled the purge list of all Lincoln County voters who did not vote in the last primary and general elections. That list was compared with the signature rosters from the elections, including absentee votes, Proctor explained.

The board will meet again soon to finalize the voter purge. Until that time, voters may re-register, change addresses, or residence locations by contacting any deputy registrar. Deputy registrars may be reached at municipal offices, most banks or by contacting the Clerk's Office in Carrizozo, 648-2394.

The next election, which will require voter registration lists and signature rosters, is the special Ruidoso municipal election in June. The clerk must provide the list and roster at least seven days before the election, Proctor said.

Voters who received the purge card or one concerning registration problems should contact the Clerk's Office soon.

re-election.

Samuels blames false charges, the lawsuit and unfavorable publicity with contributing to his defeat. He said detrimental articles about his office were on the front page when positive publicity was often overlooked or given little notice.

Samuels said his family still feels the effects of those allegations.

Problems between the Sheriff's Office, the county manager's office and county commissioners surfaced soon after the new administration took office in January 1987.

Deputies complained of not being paid overtime by the previous administration, Samuels said, explaining that overtime was limited by the county personnel ordinance in effect at that time.

"I had nothing to gain from paying overtime," said Samuels. "I received no overtime pay for myself." But Samuels said protecting the county was an overtime job, especially during crisis situations such as homicides, accidents, man-hunts and drug lab raids.

Gross credited Samuels for exhibiting professionalism in his job during his term.

"Samuels worked as hard as he could ... it was never suggested he violated any state or federal law," Gross said. "I was personally shocked they set out to destroy Don Samuels' reputation," he added.

The politics of the strained relations between the sheriff, manager, attorney and certain county commissioners surfaced during a lawsuit filed by then former deputy Jimmie Luna against Sheriff Samuels.

Under oath, Dr. Bill Harrison of Ruidoso said he discussed the difficulties with former Republican commissioner Bill Karn in a social setting with Samuels present. According to Harrison's deposition, Karn warned Samuels on May 10, 1987, that the commissioners, through Mitchell, would control the Sheriff's Office by controlling the "purse strings." He concluded it was a political ploy to take Samuels out of office.

Another witness in that case was

Ernest Joiner, owner of Lincoln County News, who had employed Mitchell for a lawsuit. Joiner summarized a conversation with Mitchell on March 1987 where he learned of a "conspiracy to discredit and make it tough for him (Samuels) to get out of office...so they could appoint someone of their own choice."

Samuels said relations between his office, the manager and the commissioners grew worse.

"I met with them (commissioners) in executive session on personnel," he said.

Communications continued to break down, leading to the commissioners' lawsuit. Beginning with the filing, Samuels refused comment.

Gross admitted Samuels' silence was damaging in the election.

"We felt it was not professional to fight the charges in the newspapers," Gross said, adding anybody can file a lawsuit and make all kinds of allegations.

The commissioners, Mitchell and Cox were able to gain public sentiment against Samuels without having to go to court, Gross said.

"If this is the way a county wants to run itself, the voters should know," he added.

Both Samuels and his attorney point to the citizens and taxpayers as the losers in this case. Samuels said the attorneys' fees alone could have paid the overtime or the salary of an additional law enforcement officer.

"I felt I did an excellent job," Samuels said and pointed out the large percentage of votes in the election which placed him in the Sheriff's Office.

If the allegations continue, Samuels said he will consider a lawsuit against the commissioners, Mitchell and Cox.

"There definitely was cause for filing (the lawsuit)," Cox said, recalling problems in purchasing, compensation time (overtime) and budget in the Sheriff's Office that ultimately were the responsibility of the commissioners who sit as the Board of Finance for the county.

Judge Doughty and former commissioner Hightower were unavailable for comment.

# Billy the Kid remains a mystery

Who really was Henry McCarty, alias William Bonney, alias Billy the Kid?

Officials representing the Lincoln County Heritage Trust, internationally-known forensic anthropologist Clyde Snow and computer expert Dr. Tom Kyle from Los Alamos National Laboratory will meet Wednesday to begin a project which the Trust hopes will narrow the probabilities of the answer to the Billy the Kid question.

Trust executive director Gary Miller and trust historian Bob Hart will meet with Kyle, other Los Alamos experts and Snow to establish a workable agenda for the project which Trust officials estimate will take three years.

Snow established an agenda for different stages of the historical re-

search, said Hart in a telephone interview Friday. The agenda includes research by a contract historian, who will evaluate, by traditional means, the Billy the Kid photos assembled over the last year. Those photos deemed unauthentic will be evaluated again by a committee of historical experts, Hart continued.

Members of the committee include Robert Utley of Santa Fe, who wrote the book *High Noon in Lincoln* and another book on Billy due to be released in September; Dr. Phil Rasch, of Ojai, California, foremost expert on Billy; Herman Weisner of Organ, New Mexico, also a noted authority on the Kid; Leon Metz of El Paso, an authority on guns and Dr. Don Lavash of Albuquerque.

The only undisputed photo of Billy, a tintype taken in 1879, out-

side a saloon in Fort Sumner and owned by the trust, was copied and enhanced by the labs for Snow to study any minor features like a mole or skin blemishes, scars or patterns of freckles, Hart continued.

The trust acquired the photo in 1986 from descendants of a man who received the photo from Billy himself.

Because of extensive publicity about the authentic photo and the research project, other information and photos have come to the Trust. Among other photos are two that may be Billy the Kid.

One is from a private collection in Las Vegas, a portrait of a boy 16 or 17 years old and the other is from a San Francisco family which shows two boys, one standing, the other sitting. The photos and any others purported to be of the Kid

will be studied to determine authenticity.

Once the photos are evaluated and narrowed to a few possible authentic ones, they will be examined and enhanced by Los Alamos computers. The enhanced photos will be compared with the enhanced authentic copies of Billy.

Snow, a forensic expert from Norman, Oklahoma, is a part-time Ruidoso resident and recently was inducted into the New Mexico Military Institute Hall of Fame.

He is famous for his involvement in major national and international forensic projects including examination of remains and photos from Little Big Horn massacre in Montana, Nazi war criminal Josef Mengele and the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

The team, advocating the same approach used nationwide for MainStreet towns, provided success criteria that includes all groups and individuals working together, hiring and supporting a full-time project manager and using the four-point MainStreet approach. That is: organization, design, promotion and economic restructuring.


The local MainStreet board took that information and put it to work during the past year. When the project manager resigned before the organizational functions were completed, the board hired Mary Maul to serve in that position.

Boatright praised Maul, calling her an excellent project director and complimenting her on her enthusiasm and hard work.

The Village of Ruidoso has applied for more than a \$1 million in grants to be used for infra-structure improvements, including new sidewalks, in Midtown.

Meanwhile, MainStreet is working on several projects that will have an immediate impact on the village.

Members are working on banners and sponsoring a bench project to improve the looks of the downtown area.

## Samuels makes a statement

Following is the complete text of a written statement provided by former sheriff Don Samuels.

"It has been more than one year since the Writ of Mandamus was filed against me and I have been waiting to go to trial to disprove the allegations made against me.

"The writ was dismissed with prejudice on Friday, March 31. The dismissal leads me to believe the former commissioners and attorney Gary Mitchell accomplished their goal (to damage my reputation in order to keep me from being re-elected.)

"Through this entire ordeal, upon advice of my attorneys, I have not commented and, now that I will not have my day in court, I would like to take this opportunity to inform the people of Lincoln County that the charges against me were unfounded and untrue and simply a political weapon.

"I believe that my reputation has been severely damaged. My family and I have suffered immeasurably because of this and it is wrong for anybody to go through such duress. I hope from this, people will learn that anybody can file any suit

without there being merits to it.

"Please realize the allegations made against me were never proved to be true.

"I believe that I was one of the best sheriffs that Lincoln County has ever had, and the actual statistics during my administration would confirm my accomplishments as sheriff.

"It is my opinion that if any of the charges against me had been true, the commissioners and Gary Mitchell would have been anxious to go to court as soon as the writ was filed. But common sense now tells me that the former commissioners and Gary Mitchell never intended to go to trial.

"The suits against Fran Siddens and me (actions taken by the former commissioners and Gary Mitchell) have cost the taxpayers thousands of dollars needlessly.

"I am at this time consulting my attorneys about filing suit against the former commissioners, Gary Mitchell and Suzanne Cox for bringing an unfounded suit against me, which severely damaged my reputation.


Lynch says Rutten will be dealing with all aspects of real estate, including residential and commercial property.

Spence is a member of Family Practice Associates in Sierra Professional Center.


The New Mexico Cooperative Extension Service and the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department are sponsoring a small business energy assistance service this spring.

cal assistance and on-site energy audits for small businesses in this and other pilot communities around New Mexico.



## Woman's Club calls on manufacturers to use recycled materials in packaging

The Ruidoso Federated Woman's Club is taking part in a state environmental program sponsored by the New Mexico Federation of Women's Clubs.

Woman's Club president Jackie Rawlins said members of the local group are participating in a letter writing campaign urging consumer product companies to display the paper recycling symbol in their products packaged in high quality recycled paperboard.

Recycled paperboard is manufactured from 100 percent wastepaper, including newspaper, corrugated boxes and computer printout paper; and is used to produce more than 50 percent of all cartons found in grocery stores. These range from packages containing rice, cookies, pasta and cereal to laundry detergent, aluminum foil and more.

Rawlins said, since recycled paperboard is an excellent "end use" for all the wastepaper that's


collected, it's essential that manufacturers and consumers work together to increase awareness about its many advantages.

The General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC), the parent organization of the state and local clubs, became a champion of the paper recycling symbol in 1979. The federation, between 1980 and 1984, adopted "Shopping for the Symbol of the 80s" as an official conservation project.

The GFWC has a half million members and will celebrate its centennial in 1990.

A conservation event is being planned at 10 a.m. Wednesday, April 12, in the 43 Furr's Supermarkets in New Mexico.

On that day, all NMFWC members will be able to identify the shelf space under products packaged in recycled paperboard with stickers reading, "This product packaged in recycled paperboard."

The Ruidoso Warriors track and field team turned in another handful of personal bests at Artesia Saturday when the Warriors competed against 16 New Mexico high schools.

Head track coach Ronny Maskew was very happy with the effort of the spring break team and praised the personal bests of many

tracksters.

Ira Sago was a double winner in both the 800-meter in 2:02.53 and 1600-meter run in 4:52.71. Both were Sago's personal bests.

Senior Dusty Beavers had a personal best in the discus on all three of his tosses. His longest throw, good for second, was 144.10.

Chantel Bowen brought home a first place when she cleared the bars in the high jump at 5.2 for her

Rickey Brazell ran his fastest 100-meter and 200-meter to date. Brazell covered the 100M in 11.46, good for fifth place, and his 200M was in 23.33, a third place finish.

"Rickey is showing a lot of improvement in a very small period of time and we're expecting a lot out of Rickey in the next few weeks," Maskew said.

Shala Gosdin turned in her best 300-meter hurdle performance of the year, high stepping the wood gates at 51.41 to capture a second place.

Freshman Becky Benson ran the same 300M in 59.3 which beat her previous best by seven seconds, an outstanding feat for Benson.

"The girls 400M and 800M relays ran their best time of the year. Like the boys, because of spring break, both relay teams were put together at the last minute," Maskew said.

The longest long jump of the Warriors was by Swanner at 17.10. Chris Torres toes were a bit too long and he scratched three times.

Both Warrior pole vaulters, Joseph Ponce De Leon and Whitlock cleared 9.6, but both topped the bar at 10, a mark they consistently pass in practice.

Torres finished behind Brazell in the 100M with a 11.83 dash and the 200M with a 23.97.

Victor Alonso covered the lap plus in the 400M with a time of 58.22. Louis Jimenez was right beside him with a 58.28.

Nick Nanz was the chief Warrior in the 3200-meter with a 11:48 run.

## Downs trustees discuss legal fees

In a short session Monday, Ruidoso Downs trustees narrowly approved March payment for village counsel Richard Hawthorne of Hawthorne and Hawthorne.

After Trustee Alice Allison made a motion to pay all March bills, Trustee Bill Smith made an amendment to the motion to pay all accounts except that of Hawthorne and Hawthorne. Richard Hawthorne, counsel for the village, wasn't present.

In a 4-3 vote, Smith and trustees Wilma Webb and C.L. "Bones" Wright voted for the defeated amendment, which would have withheld payment to Hawthorne. Several members of the board, in recent weeks, have expressed a desire to seek other counsel.

Smith also questioned the payment of schooling for Bobby

Zamora, village water technician. Zamora must attend school each year to keep certification, according to Janice Pope, village clerk.

In other action, Ron McWhorter, a resident of a sub-division in the village, requested a variance to build a garage. McWhorter, who wants to build his garage between five and 10 feet from the property line, was under the impression that village zoning required 10 feet between buildings and the property lines.

Mayor Jake Harris informed McWhorter that village zoning requires only five feet. The subdivision covenants require 10 feet between structures and the property line, but Harris informed McWhorter that the village has no jurisdiction over covenants and as far as the village is concerned, McWhorter is free to build. Several members of the audience, there to

protest the construction, argued that the village should have control.

In other regular business, the trustees:

—Approved Police Chief Skip Hazel's request to move part-time employee, Phil Provence to full time.

—Awarded certificate of appreciation to Orlando Montez, Bobby Angermiller and Bob Layher for saving the life of a heart attack victim several months ago.

—Accepted Fowler Electric's bid to put new wiring in the municipal building.

—Voted not to accept any bids, for reroofing the municipal building after Smith reported he had inspected the roof and found it to be in good shape.

## Chamber board considers Spectacular Airshow booth

Board of Directors of the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce met Wednesday to discuss several issues including the recent advertising promotion and possible participation in the Spectacular Air Show in Roswell.

Roy Crocker, chairman of the Retirees Services Division, reported that response to the advertising campaign, which targeted several newspapers and three magazines,

has been good. Of the three magazines, Crocker said "Retired Officers" has brought the most response for the least money.

So far, the chamber has received information requests from more than 1,300 individuals or groups. The biggest response has been from California.

The board also discussed the method of payment to be used for services rendered by Price Advertising Agency. The chamber plans to get a grant from the state

to pay for most of the advertising, but Crocker reported that it is his understanding the chamber must submit canceled checks to the state before the grant money can be released.

If that is the case, according to Crocker, the chamber will need to borrow funds to pay the advertising agency in order to have a canceled check to present to the state. The board voted to give Roy Crocker authority to seek a loan, but only if it is found that the state will not ac-

cept an affidavit of services rendered.

Don Shaw reported the Roswell group responsible for the annual airshow wants to make the project a regional one, and is seeking participation from Ruidoso. Shaw said the airshow netted approximately \$80,000 the first year.

The chamber would need to contribute about \$1,500 toward a "chalet" representing Ruidoso. The "chalet" would be similar to a tent with booths promoting Ruidoso.

The board voted to support the idea, contingent upon whether other Ruidoso groups decide to contribute.

Also, office manager Sunny Hirschfield reported the Legislative Appreciation Reception is planned for April 17 at Swiss Chalet. State Senator James Lee Martin and representatives Ben Hall, Richard Knowles and Paul Harrington will be honored.

In other regular business, the board:

—Learned that walk-ins, calls and mail to the chamber office have doubled and, in the case of walk-ins, nearly tripled since last year.

—Heard that Roy Crocker has received many requests for cost of living information and is trying to compile comparisons with other areas.

—Learned of Rotary Club plans to put poles at the "Y" for groups and organizations to hang banners announcing specific events.



## EDITORIAL

Governor Garrey Carruthers on Thursday took two positive steps to help solve the mounting problem over what to do with this nation's trash.

Carruthers issued an executive order banning any further landfills until after next year's legislative session and another order calling on state agencies to begin recycling their garbage by 1990.

While some legislators criticized the governor, calling his action on landfills too little, too late, the order still sends a clear message to other states that we in New Mexico do not intend to become a dumpsite for our neighbors' trash.

Over the next year state officials should do a thorough study of landfills and come up with a carefully crafted set of rules and regulations to safeguard our open spaces that are being eyed so jealously by our more populous states.

The second order signed Thursday by Governor Carruthers sets the stage for state agencies to take the lead in this state in the responsible handling of garbage. It's a start.

New Mexico is telling the rest of the world that we don't want their trash and setting an example by getting serious about recycling our own trash.—fj

## On The Record...

If you're trying to promote Ruidoso, and entice visitors to visit this area, you're not alone.

The most interesting thing about the Idea Fair Tuesday was seeing the displays of brochures and advertising materials being used to get the message out about this community.

The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce and the Convention and Visitors Bureau did a good job of getting the word out about the Idea Fair, for Cree Meadows Restaurant was filled with locals out to have a good time while learning more about promotion.

Deanna Davis, marketing director at The Inn of the Mountain Gods, and Laura Doth of the Ruidoso Downs Race Track marketing staff shared their ideas and techniques for promoting those two major economic enterprises. Idea Fair participants talked about the various markets where they are concentrating promotional efforts—from Texas to Arizona to Mexico.

It was pretty obvious that lots of

Ruidoso business owners and operators are intent on establishing this little village as a resort center.

After reading an editorial entitled "Keep price tags off our culture" published in The Taos News on March 23, I identified a new market for our efforts.

Editorial writer Bryan Welch praised Taos Pueblo for providing the rest of that community with a model by closing its gates to tourists for a month.

"By closing their gates to tourists for a month, Pueblo leaders restored the quiet of their homes. More significantly, the closure was a strong gesture indicating that the Pueblo will maintain its identity in spite of its growing popularity with visitors from all over the world.

"In effect, the Pueblo turned away a lot of money. And that's what Taos may have to do if its identity is to be preserved," wrote Welch.

The editorial continues by noting that Santa Fe is, increasingly, a storefront, and commenting on the loss of meaning of "chile, piñon,

adobe and even religious symbols."

"Perhaps our neighbors to the south could reclaim the true sense of value embodied in those cornerstones of our cultures, but to do so they would have to forget the economic prestige symbolized by New Mexican cuisine, art and jewelry.

"In Taos, our cultural icons are still more than symbols. They are still cornerstones of our lives," continues Welch.

"In order to keep our sense of culture and our sense of place—in effect, our identity—we would have to turn away some investors with profitable schemes to change our community. We might have to discourage some development aimed at attracting more tourists. Some of our possessions need signs hung on them reading: Not For Sale."

Maybe we should post a sign outside the locked doors of Taos and Taos Pueblo: Visit beautiful Lincoln County.

No, we're not for sale, but we're certainly adept at maintaining our identity while welcoming visitors to the area.

The Inn of the Mountain Gods and Ski Apache, two enterprises of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, have done nothing to diminish the heritage of the Mescalero people. On the contrary, those economic developments make it possible for members of the tribe to remain in their homelands and work to support their families.

That's not to say that Taos Pueblo shouldn't have taken the one-month sabbatical from tourists and visitors, for their environment and set-up is certainly different from the Mescalero Apache Indian Reservation.

The Taos editorial writer, noting that by posting the "Not For Sale" sign, Taos would turn away money, asked "which is the greater price to pay?"

I'm not sure, but I am sure that Ruidoso, apparently unlike our neighbor to the north, is searching for an economic boost just to maintain present village services and amenities.

Meanwhile, I saw on the news that a group of travel agents visited Albuquerque this week to learn more about that city. Albuquerque, too, is seeking those elusive tourist dollars.

Several travel advisers said that travelers are looking for something different, and New Mexico (and Albuquerque) have that something different to offer.

"But people don't know you're here," said one tour guide leader. "You need to promote your state," said another.

And then there's the Economic Development and Tourism Department. That's the state agency charged with promoting the land of enchantment, and that has me

worried.

Not too long ago I was handed a copy of the beautiful, slick publication, "Destination...New Mexico, 'Tour Manual," published by the tourism department.

The full-color cover, the beautiful pictures and the top-quality paper really had me impressed.

And then, I read a few pages of the 139-page book.

This is what the gorgeous book had to say about Ruidoso under its community profile:

"The Spaniards called it "The Little Town by the Pretty River," a serene, pastoral name that may have suited it when they settled there in the early 1850s. But within a few years it was changed in honor of President Lincoln.

"Because so much of old Lincoln town remains, it has been preserved as a historic district and is a state monument administered by the Museum of New Mexico.

Eight miles west of Lincoln is Capitan, and Smokey Bear Historical State Park."

And that, with its inaccuracies, is the description of Ruidoso.

Among the annual events listed are ski races, chamber events, Old Lincoln Days, the Lincoln County Fair and the All-American Futurity. That's good. But right there in the midst of those real events is a listing for an annual film festival that never got off the ground and the Summer Festival

which hasn't been active for the past two years.

Well, nobody's perfect. But I had to wonder who furnished the information. Nobody seems to know.

Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce executive director John Jeffers said he wasn't contacted, nor was the Convention and Visitors Bureau or members of the Village of Ruidoso staff.

Jeffers said his office didn't even know about deadlines for the publication, and, apparently, nobody in Ruidoso was given the opportunity to proof the copy.


If we want to promote our state, seems like we should work together to do it right.

# 'Plant Lady' Sally Black lives in a veritable jungle



Banana trees growing to the ceiling, sometimes with fruit ready to pick; ficus, rubber plants—an interior jungle in Lincoln County. And where is this indoor jungle? In Sally Black's Lincoln home. Black, who writes the weekly Plant Corner in The Ruidoso News, loves plants, and exhibits her knowledge of them in her column.

"I only write about what I know about," Black said as she welcomed this reporter into her spacious home. Every space is filled with plants, from the common Philodendron (sometimes called ivy) to exotic banana trees and Christmas Cactus. In Black's home, rubber trees reach for the ceiling, and a Ficus tree is now flattening at the top of

the 25-foot ceiling. From the terra cotta floor, the house is a maze of jungle plants with huge leaves and trunks. Her secret? Light! The ceiling of her home is translucent fiberglass, giving all the plants all the light they want and need. Black said she spends four hours a week watering her jungle—once a week—on Mondays.

Black's plants do not stop at the front door, her exterior gardens are planted with flowers which will provide brilliant color in her large lawn. The river is just down a set of steps. Tulips are just beginning to open with the promise of many flowers during the spring, summer and fall.
