Fatal accidents claim two lives

Traffic accidents have claimed the lives of two area residents. Lee Ann Burch, 20, was killed Thursday and eight-year-old Molly Canning Hainer died Sunday, victims in two separate crashes.

Burch, a Fort Stanton resident, died in an early morning crash Thursday when she was thrown from her 1984 Bronco II.

According to New Mexico State Police officer Mike Howard, the vehicle left the roadway and overturned three times 3.8 miles east of Capitan on U.S. Highway 380. When Howard, state police officer Danny Kiper and Lincoln County Sheriff's deputy Larry Brinkley responded to the accident they found Burch lying beside the vehicle. Howard said there was no apparent reason for the roll-over.

Deputy medical examiner Nancy Guck pronounced Burch dead at the scene at 8:38 a.m.

Molly Canning Hainer, the eight-year-old daughter of Mike and Sally Hainer, died at 9:50 a.m. Sunday at St. Mary's Regional Hospital in Roswell as a result of injuries she received in a Saturday two-vehicle accident on U.S. 380 two miles west of Lincoln.

Seven-year-old Jody Jacoby of Capitan remains in Lincoln County Medical Center with injuries she

Municipal League leader explains districting rules

The New Mexico Municipal League met in Ruidoso last week, and the group's director took the time to explain a change in government form to be decided by Ruidoso voters on June 20.

"I do read the paper and I do understand that in Ruidoso there is some controversy," said Bill Fulginetti of the league.

He said recent legislation and

several court cases will have an effect on how the village implements a change from its current form to the proposed commission/manager form if it gets the approval of voters.

Although some communities that made the change to commission/manager didn't immediately district, they all ended up in expensive court battles and in the end had to district according to demographics. Fulginetti recom-

mended, if the voters approve a change, going ahead and implementing the new form right from the first.

"You have to district in a correct way to avoid, or at least minimize, lawsuits," said Fulginetti, naming about a half dozen cities that have spent in the hundreds of thousands of dollars in legal costs over districting. He said Lovington,

Economic development group endorses air service proposal

It was close, but no cigar, for Mountain Aviation's request for funds from the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLD).

Board members at the monthly meeting Thursday, expressed support for Mountain Aviation, Inc. owner Steve Hightower's plan to schedule commercial air service between Ruidoso and El Paso, Texas, but turned down his request for funds.

Hightower, who has requested a yearly subsidy from the Village of Ruidoso in the amount of \$116,128.79, asked the EDCLD to endorse his air service plan and also consider financial support for the air firm.

The board expressed support for the air service plan; however, several members of the board, as well as EDCLD director George Puckett, suggested the community might be better served with a guarantee plan that would allow the village to recover some of its funds

when the firm begins to make a profit.

Hightower said he is not opposed to considering other financial options.

Several members of the board said the corporation was not created to subsidize businesses before voting to endorse the basic plan for scheduled air service and turning the issue over to a newly-created transportation board, chaired by John Hall.

Governor vetoes video gambling, OKs tax relief for horse racing

The pilot video gambling bill for Ruidoso, Angel Fire and Taos is dead.

Citing a fear that the bill would also open gambling to the state's 24 Indian reservations, Governor Garry Caruthers exercised his veto power in the face of overwhelming community support from Ruidoso and Angel Fire.

The governor signed into law two other bills that affect gambling in the Ruidoso area.

Mark Doth, marketing director for Ruidoso Downs Race Track, said one bill allowed intertrack simulcasting. Ruidoso Downs Race Track can now intercept races from Sunland Park, the Downs at Albuquerque or Sante Fe and show them lo-

cally for wagering. The bet is fed into a common pool.

Doth said the bill also allows other in-state parks to accept Ruidoso's signal for wagering in their parks. He said intrastate simulcasting, sending the signal to out of state parks, has been allowed for years.

The governor also signed in a

tax reduction bill to give relief to the Downs from the pari-mutuels tax.

Rick Henson, general manager of the Downs, said the bill would improve purses for the horsemen at the Downs.

"In the past, we were taxed on a sliding scale," said Henson. "As the pari-mutuel handle rose, the state's

take was larger. Now there is a two percent tax straight across."

"When we were over \$400,000 a day, we would have to pay six percent tax. That's been reduced to two percent. The net result will be an increase in purse size. This year's increase off of last year's actual handles would be \$120,000. That would certainly help the horsemen

in the purse fund," Henson said. Henson said he has not yet seen a final amended signed bill.

"It is my understanding an amendment to the bill will also give us relief from a ten cents head tax for each person that entered the gate as a paid admission. We are not charging admission so we will not be charged the tax."

New county manager is on the job

"My goal is to be the best county in the state," said new Lincoln County manager Nick Pappas.

Pappas assumed the manager's duties March 27, after he was hired by Lincoln County commissioners Bob Hemphill, Rick Simpson and Karon Petty during a special meeting March 23.

"I wanted to get back into the mountains," he said.

Raised in Raton, New Mexico, Pappas, 49, graduated from the University of Utah. He is married with three sons, two at home.

He came to Lincoln County with extensive county experience. Recently, Pappas completed four years as a member of the Chaves County Commission. He was executive director of the Southeastern New Mexico Economic Development District in Roswell for 12 years and an economic development specialist with the North Central New Mexico Development District for four years.

During that time he directly worked with numerous county and municipal governments. He also gained a knowledge of state and federal laws and regulations through the various planning and development projects.

As commissioner he played a major role in establishing county investment policy, construction of two senior citizens centers, a refuge

for battered adults, road projects and the separation of Chaves County jail from the sheriff to the direct responsibility of the commission.

"County government has changed so much from roads to the complex running of county government," Pappas said in an interview in his office in the courthouse in Carrizozo.

Since he likes to see people work together, with no time or need to find fault in everything, Pappas said he plans to get county personnel to work toward the common good of the county.

"So many things can be done," he said. "I plan to start here in our own house (county manager's office.)"

Pappas has found Lincoln County exciting and unique with tremendous growth potential in certain areas. He compared Lincoln County people with those in north-eastern New Mexico.

"Problems are similar," he said. He acquired a good understanding of ranchers and business people with his economic development work.

"Lincoln County has one major commodity to sell, its natural beauty and mountains," he continued, "people want to come here."

Providing amenities while protecting the natural setting of the area must be a consideration in development plans, he said.

sustained in the crash.

According to State Police officer Danny Kiper, the Hainer child was driving a Yamaha 4-Zinger four-wheeler and the Jacoby child was a passenger.

"They were coming up out of the bar ditch onto the highway in the westbound traffic lane kind of at an angle," said Kiper. A Jeep wagoner driven by Bobby Bolton, 45, of Capitan was westbound on the highway, he said.

"They were right in front of them before there was time to blink an eye," said Kiper. He said the impact was to the front of Jeep with the four-wheeler, and the two youngsters were thrown underneath the vehicle.

Both girls were transported to Lincoln County Medical Center, where Jody Jacoby remains with multiple fractures of the left leg.

Kiper said Molly Hainer was transported immediately to Roswell where she died Sunday.

An El Paso, Texas, couple died last week in a one-vehicle accident on U.S. Highway 70 near Riverside. In Lincoln County, four people have died in traffic accidents this year, all within the last week.

In a separate accident, John Shaw, 21, of Capitan was injured Sunday when he stood up in the back of a moving pickup and fell out on the highway. Kiper said Shaw was taken by ambulance to St. Mary's in Roswell, where he was scheduled to remain overnight. Kiper said Shaw and several

other young males were seated in the back of a pickup driven by Robert Kent Shannon, 19, of Capitan. He said as the vehicle rounded a curve just north of Fort Stanton, Shaw stood up in the pickup and fell out on the pavement.

Kiper said he responded to two roll-overs this weekend that left the drivers and passengers with only minor injuries.

At a half hour past midnight Saturday, the driver of a 1977 Dodge lost control as he went around the curve at Bonito Dam. The vehicle rolled over and went down the embankment, said Kiper.

He said the driver, Wayne McElroy, 20, of Belen, and four passengers sustained only minor injuries. Kiper said campers saw the

vehicle and called police, who responded to the scene and, at first, couldn't find the driver and passengers. He said the five were found down the road from the scene.

Kiper said McElroy was cited for careless driving, failure to give immediate notice of an accident and leaving the scene of an accident.

The driver of a 1986 Subaru that rolled over at 4:30 p.m. Sunday on Nogal Hill walked away with only scratches, said Kiper.

He said Melissa Marie Brown, 22, of Edgewood failed to negotiate a curve, lost control of the car and rolled it.

Kiper said Brown was cited for careless driving.

Alamogordo, Tucumcari and Las Cruces all were sued.

If the change is endorsed, the current councillors and mayor will serve until the districting and any court battles are complete, said Fulginetti in answer to one question. He said several companies are in the business of doing the studies

and research for a districting plan, since the lines have to be drawn according to a number of issues, including the Federal Voters Rights Act.

Fulginetti said the basic difference between Ruidoso's mayor/council and the proposed change is the initiative, referendum and recall provisions allowed under that change. That allows voters to

petition, by precinct, for elections over any commission action.

"They can get a petition up anytime—here in Ruidoso they'll sign anything," said Councillor Jess Stinson.

Fulginetti said Las Cruces had two recall elections last year.

The mayor is selected by commissioners rather than by the voters under the commis-

sion/manager form. "I don't think the manager situation changes," said Fulginetti, noting the village manager will have basically the same responsibilities and powers under either form.

"I don't think anything should change a form of government for a personal vendetta," commented Councillor J.D. James.

Puckett reported his findings concerning creating a venture capital club in Lincoln County. Puckett said he believes a venture capital club would bring new private enterprise into the area. He said venture capital clubs attract members by holding monthly meetings with outstanding speakers. The clubs attract entrepreneurs who, with the proper financing, could bring new industries into the area. The board authorized the chairman to pursue the idea.

Scott Shafer, vice-chairman of the board, reported on the clean-up

progress of the EPA superfund site near Carrizozo. The site, an old mine, is number two on the superfund list. Cyanide was used in the mining process. Testing four years ago determined that a small amount of the cyanide had leaked and contaminated the area.

Shafer reported that several firms had agreed to take part in cleaning up the contaminated area for a cost that might not exceed \$100,000 and might not take more than 90 days to complete.

The EPA, however, is conducting a two-year study at a cost of up to \$2 million, and will not make a decision on the clean-up until the

study is complete. Shafer said the test results may not even be accurate now because the cyanide could have dissipated during the four years since the testing and may not even exist anymore.

In expressing his concern about the time and money the EPA is expending on the site, he gave an example of a superfund site in Globe, Arizona. The EPA has, so far, spent \$20 million to study options for cleaning up the site, but has yet to begin the cleanup, according to Shafer.

In other business, Puckett

reported that the village may have an opportunity to receive up to 15 business courses for college credit through a satellite program offered through Eastern New Mexico University.

The classes would be broadcast to a specific classroom site, possibly the high school, where students would view the teacher's presentation and have a microphone to communicate with the teacher. A monitor would come into the classroom during tests. More classes, from other state universities, could be added later. The board authorized Puckett to pursue the matter.

Lincoln County-Ruidoso Extraterritorial Zoning Commission (ETZ) reorganized and filled an open position at its meeting in the Lincoln County Sub-office Thursday.

According to county manager Nick Pappas, ETZ appointed R. Mack Bell of Corona to fill the position of county representative and elected Deanna Wright, a Lincoln County representative, as chairperson.

As ETZ had not met in a long while, members discussed the commission's role and history. ETZ was established to consider zoning problems in a one-mile perimeter of county land around the Ruidoso village limits.

ETZ advises Extraterritorial

Zoning Authority members, county commissioners Rick Simpson and Karon Petty and Ruidoso representative Elmer Pirelli. The authority then makes final decisions on ETZ recommendations, said Pappas.

At the meeting Thursday, ETZ agreed to meet monthly to further organize and educate members. Pending cases and other concerns will be acted upon in the future, Pappas said.

County ETZ representatives are Ben Hall, Bill Elliott, Deanna Wright and Bell. Ruidoso representatives are Tim Hoyt, John White and Robert Donaldson.

The next ETZ meet is scheduled May 4, in the county suboffice in Ruidoso.

A forum to encourage Mescalero Apache youth to seek meaningful careers was behind the Mescalero Apache Youth Career Day.

More than 275 youth attended the day at the Mescalero Community Center Wednesday, which prompted organizers to call the first-time event a success.

Students and graduates received printed information and talked with career representatives in conservation, art, computers, law, economics, the U.S. armed services, Job Corps, law enforcement, ministry and Mescalero projects such as The Inn of the Mountain Gods, Apache Timber Products and the National Fish Hatchery.

"College is not for everybody," said Bruce Klinekole, who presented careers in "using your hands."

Representatives from the University of New Mexico, New Mexico State University and New Mexico Highlands also distributed information and application forms to students.

Along with the opportunity to talk with representatives, youths participated in a Career Day essay contest with entries judged on originality, spelling and grammar. Houston Geronimo of Ruidoso High School won the contest.

Rainbow Lake developers get ready for summer season

Rainbow Lake, revitalized, remodeled and bigger and better than ever, is set to open on May 1. Ray Eidson, one of the owners, said the recreational facility on Carrizo Creek Road should be ready to go by then.

Eidson, with his wife, Mona, and partners, Susan and Mike Ruch, began work on the area last fall, and have spent more than \$350,000 in an effort to put the lake area back into shape for family entertainment.

Eidson says at least part of the area will be open by May 1. The lake close to the road has been concreted and made into what looks like a huge swimming pool for

bumper boats. The group made a deal with the village to stock village fish in the other lake. No fishing is planned at this time.

A new concept is to be offered for golf enthusiasts. Called executive golf, the small course will have 18 holes. Although the course is small, similar to miniature golf, it will not have the props of miniature golf, such as windmills and mazes.

Eidson says the sprinklers may not be installed by the May 1 opening date, but should be in place soon.

Engineer John Shaw, who is designing the mini-executive course, said he visited a similar course in San Antonio, Texas, be-

fore setting up the Rainbow Course. He said the course will offer a real challenge, including sand traps and water hazards.

And still, the course will be flexible enough for entire families to enjoy the play, he added.

Three batting cages are ready for practice—two for softball and one for baseball. The batting cages are the idea of Susan Ruch, who is active in the Lincoln County Women's Softball Association. Bumper cars are planned later.

The clubhouse will house a gameroom, gift shop and restaurant.

Taylor also offers a parts and service department that services most brands.


The Taylors are heavily involved in Crimestoppers, Inc. and Sertoma.

Carlsbad won the meet with 48 points. Other scores were: Clovis 38, Roswell 37, Las Vegas Robertson 33, Hobbs 30, Artesia 20, Goddard 20, Tucumcari 20, Ruidoso 18, NMMI16, Capitlan 11 and Portales 0.

Warrior head track coach Ronny Maskew was elated with the Warrior performance against state meet type competition.

"We had 12 performances that qualified for placement in the Warriors 10 all time bests," Maskew said.

Dusty Beavers moved into the eighth slot of the top ten in the shot put with his 44-11 1/2 heave. Beavers discus throw of 142-2 was good for the number nine all time slot. He is only six inches behind Kenny Trapp's at number eight.

"The next three track meets, ours and the two qualifying meets where there's mostly 3-AAA teams, we will do a lot of scoring and people will have a measure of how good our team is. I'm very encouraged with all of these personal bests. That's what it is all about, improving every week.

"We've made a lot of progress in field event areas," Maskew said. "Micah Whitlock is just learning to pole vault and he is at 10-6. He'll be a good point getter for us at the district meet."

"Our girls and boys relay teams both made significant improvement, but it is an area that still needs work. Chantel Bowen knocked two seconds off her time in the relays and it was only the second time she has run the event."



What puzzles me is that no Swallow messengers have appeared, and still here they are eight miles up the valley from the Vale.

Generally speaking, the temperature grows cooler as you travel up the valley. That must be a special warm spot there at the Pittman home. Or else things are a little different this year regarding temperatures in the Mountain land.

Many times this year it has been much colder down here than it has been higher up. This was especially true when the "Alaska Cannon Ball", the record cold wave, moved in from the east and we felt the very edge of it here and to the east while all to the west was not nearly as cold.

Take how today the wind is right straight out of the North, with a cold breath all through the vale. Night after night here lately the temperature has dropped down to near freezing. This is all to the good, in holding back the fruit

blooms, but just a little cold for the swallows.

However, although the Pittman residence is located in a warm spot, it is surely the home of two warm-hearted folks who love the mountains and all God's creatures. The swallow and other of Mother Earth's Children know this. The swallows are omens of good fortune; and surely Jim and Susan are two of the happiest people you could find anywhere.

Teen pregnancy plagues New Mexico youth

An alarming number of Ruidoso teens experience an abrupt end to childhood each year when they discover they are pregnant.

New Mexico has the seventh highest teen birthrate in the United States. More than 2,500 school-age girls get pregnant each year, resulting in nearly 1,700 births among girls 10 to 17 years old. When births to girls 18 and 19 years old are added in, the rate jumps to more than 4,000 each year, according to the state Health and Environment Department.

Ruidoso, with approximately six pregnant girls in high school now (one middle school student has been pregnant this year), has not been immune to the problem.

Denise Hawthorne, Ruidoso High School counselor, says in the three years she has been at the school approximately 12 girls have become pregnant. None has married, according to Hawthorne. Very few consider abortion to be an option.

Almost all pregnant young girls in the village keep their babies, according to Dr. William A. Harrison, Ruidoso obstetrician. Harrison says he believes moral pressures against abortion are stronger than in the past. Also, because families are more readily accepting the pregnancies than in the past, few girls give up the children for adoption.

Hawthorne says that one girl this year gave her child up for adoption. She moved, with her parents, from Texas, specifically to allow her time to have the baby away from the people she knew in Texas. She moved back soon after she gave up the child.

Hawthorne says RHS has sex education classes for freshmen and sophomores each spring, in which she is very explicit about the different methods of birth control. She feels students are not embarrassed to talk to her concerning the subject. Many come to her office to ask questions about birth control.

Almost all pregnant young girls in the village keep their babies, according to Dr. William A. Harrison.

When a pregnant student comes to her office, Hawthorne says she doesn't preach. It's too late for that. She tells her the options—abortion, adoption or keeping the baby. There are many good maternity homes in the state, Hawthorne says.

If the girl decides to keep the baby, as most do, Hawthorne puts her in touch with the county health department and the Women, Infants and Children program. Then she tells her that they must tell her parents.

"At first, they're going to be angry and disappointed," she tells them. "Give them a week and they are going to know this is real and they will accept it and help you," she tells the girls. In the three years she's been at the school, all parents of pregnant girls have been supportive. "I haven't seen one abandoned girl."

She always offers to help the girl break the news to the parents, but so far, has not been taken up on the offer.

Hawthorne says in her sex education classes, she

warns girls that she has not met a young male yet, who'll marry the girl, if she gets pregnant.

"It's not so much that they abandon the girl. You just can't expect a 16- or 17-year-old boy to want to stop his life and get married and support a family."

Hawthorne says although the school is very supportive of its pregnant students, they don't want to give the impression that they approve of the situations. They try to downplay the situations.

"Showers are not allowed," she added. Tom Hansen, principal, says he and the other officials do everything possible to keep young pregnant girls and mothers in school. Attendance rules are bent and girls are even allowed to do schoolwork at home and just check in once a week, Hansen says.

"I would tell any girl considering having sex that it's just not worth it," says a pregnant teen.

One girl, who recently discovered she's pregnant, verified that Hansen had been very eager to help her stay in school. Jody (not her real name) plans to finish high school in an alternative school in one of the larger New Mexico cities. She and her boyfriend will be living with relatives and plan to marry soon, they say. At 18, she's older than most pregnant girls in Ruidoso, but that didn't help her feel any less upset when she discovered her pregnancy.

Although they had discussed marriage in the future, Jody says she should be making college preparations now, instead of preparing to take care of a child.

"I would tell any girl considering having sex that it's just not worth it," she says. Jody says she couldn't take the pill.

Teresa Luna, public health nurse for Lincoln

County, says it takes about three months for the body to get used to birth control pills. During those three months, many girls experience minor problems that cause them to believe they shouldn't take the pill, Luna says. If a girl will wait out the three months to let her body adjust, most of the time she will have no more problems, Luna says.

A girl of any age can get birth control pills from the health department, free of charge, and with complete confidentiality, Luna says. Hawthorne tells students seeking birth control that they can contact the health office. Luna says she sees approximately 10 teens each month who want to begin taking the pill.

Luna says the confidentiality law puts her in a position of being torn between loyalties. As a mother, she knows how parents feel when they want to know if a child is on the pill. She doesn't let that affect the way she upholds the law. She has had quite a few parents come in to question her about their daughters. She tells them nothing.

Hawthorne, in the sex education sessions, explains the other forms of birth control. She also explains to the boys during the co-educational classes about their responsibility to use birth control.

"I really believe that the schools are being depended on by the parents to educate their kids on birth control," she says. "A lot of kids can't talk to their parents about birth control." Hawthorne says either they can't communicate with their parents, they don't have a close relationship with their parents or they are embarrassed and don't want their parents to know they're having sex.

Hawthorne says she hasn't seen one girl who got pregnant on purpose or is happy about the pregnancy.

"They all think, 'this can't happen to me,'" she says.

Jacque and Gerre (not their real names) are young mothers who would have soon graduated from RHS if they had not quit school. Although both plan to eventually take the GED-test and go on for further

training, now they work part-time at a local food business, Jacque says she never thought she would get pregnant, but she and her boyfriend had discussed marriage and children, so she felt they would marry and raise the child.

"They all think, 'this can't happen to me,'" says Hawthorne.

She was shocked when he accused her of having sexual relations with other men. She was also shocked by the reaction of his parents. She had become friends with them and thought they would encourage the boyfriend to marry her and welcome her into their family.

Instead, they supported their son and turned their back on her. As a result, they won't know their beautiful granddaughter.

"In the long run, it turned out that I didn't really love him," Jacque says. "You're too immature at that age to know what love is," she says. She's matured a lot in the 18 months since.

Both Jacque and Gerre say they learned about sex from kids at school. They were afraid to talk to their mothers. Both say they probably would have used birth control if their mothers had discussed it with them.

Gerre attended school for more than a year after her baby was born. She says eventually the pressure became too great to take care of the baby, shuffling her between relatives while she went to school and she and other relatives worked.

Gerre says she considered an abortion and even went so far as to go to a clinic with the child's father. The two of them never really dated, Gerre says. It was something that happened only once, but once was enough to cause the pregnancy. They didn't have quite enough money for the abortion, Gerre says, so the boy gave her the money and told her to keep it so she could go back when she had enough. She couldn't bring herself to go back.

Jacque's parents took her to an abortion clinic, but she couldn't go through with it. "I felt it was terribly wrong. I didn't want to kill my child."

Jody, Jacque and Gerre all echoed the belief that abortion is only right in the case of rape or a medical emergency.

Jacque says she's very thankful that she has her little girl. She just wishes she could have had her five to ten years later.

Reflecting on her pregnancy, she says she was emotionally upset the entire time and even contemplated suicide at one point. She had terrible guilt feelings. Now she also thinks about the possibility that she could have contracted AIDS.

Jacque knows what she'll tell her daughter about being sexually active, when the time comes. She'll say, "I don't want you to and here's what can happen if you do. But if you're going to (and I'm not giving my consent) at least come to me and talk to me about birth control and protection against diseases."

If her daughter comes to her and tells her about a special guy she's been seeing, she'll say, "I know you think you're in love, but he's worth giving up what you'll have to give up."

"I think sexuality is a God-given gift, to be shared by a 'man and woman' who honestly care about each other." She emphasized "man and woman."

"Not when you're a teeny bopper," she says. At 18, she thinks she's still not mature enough to know what real love is, but she's matured decades past her peers, some of whom may soon find out the hard way, like Jacque, what love ISN'T.

Life goes on for teen mothers

Having a baby makes goals much more difficult for single teens to obtain, but the will to succeed can win out, according to Deidre (not her real name), a young Ruidoso woman who was a teen-age mother 12 years ago.

Although she lived with the father awhile, she never considered marrying him. She loved him at the time, but knew he would never make a good hus-

band and father.

When Deidre finished high school in Albuquerque, she applied for federal grants for college and all the aide she could get to support her daughter. She and her baby moved to Las Cruces, alone, where she graduated from New Mexico State University five and one-half years later.

Deidre got more than an education in Las Cruces. She married her husband just before

graduation. Six years later, Deidre is expecting her third child. Their family includes the daughter, now almost a teenager, and a young son.

"A girl can accomplish anything she sets her mind to," Deidre says. She certainly doesn't recommend having a child at the age she did, but if it happens, the opportunity to reach prior goals still exists.

She's living proof.

WIC helps pregnant women, infants and young children

The Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) is available for pregnant women and mothers who meet the income requirements.

Jan LaRue, director of the Lincoln County program, urges all pregnant women to check into what the program has to offer. The program can be especially helpful to pregnant teen-agers who might not be aware of the special nutritional treatment their bodies need during pregnancy.

WIC is federally funded and state administered. The goal of WIC is to make sure each baby is born weighing at least five and one-half pounds at birth.

LaRue sees 400 to 500 people (women and children) per month in Lincoln County. The WIC program covers pregnant women and children up to 4 and one-half years old. LaRue says many nutritional problems can be corrected through education. Participants must attend educational instruction in exchange

for receiving WIC vouchers for obtaining food, including juices, eggs, cereal, beans, peanut butter, milk and cheese.

LaRue says she feels too many young people today don't get enough affection and reinforcement at home and therefore must go elsewhere to obtain it. She feels this causes some young people to begin sexual relations earlier than they might otherwise begin. Parents are tired and have their jobs on their minds, she believes. Therefore, children don't have the support of a united family front that many once had.

Denise Hawthorne, counselor at Ruidoso High School, reinforces this theory. She says in her three years at the school, the majority of pregnant teens come from broken homes or homes where there is conflict between the parents and children.

Once a girl is pregnant, WIC can at least help her to have a healthier pregnancy and increase the chances of the delivery being problem-free.

The WIC program is administered from the Lincoln County Sub-office, near Ruidoso Village Hall, off of Cree Meadows Drive. The telephone number is 258-3252.






"It's our most valuable asset..."

This letter is a comment on Mr. Bill Mershon's letter printed in your March 30th issue.

My wife and I purchased a home to be our permanent residence in September, 1987.

Being conscious as to what our utility bills would be I went to the Otero Electric Coop Office and asked what the previous high billing for my home had been and was told that the high was about \$326 for one winter month.

A little high, I thought, but with budgeting we could make it.

To ensure the best rate for my dollar I called for an inspection of my home by Otero Electric.

They obliged and sent Wayne McGee (Director of Member Services) to my home to check its ener-

gy features: double-pane windows, zoned electric heat, R-11 insulation, ceiling fans for heat distribution, heavy woven drapes to contain heat, two fireplaces for additional warmth.

He advised that the house appeared well-planned to conserve energy.

Then the electric bills started to roll in - imagine my dismay when they reached monthly highs of \$589.28 for December-January and \$476.41 for January-February! And this during a time that we had a death in the family and were out of state for two weeks!

Think of how stupid I felt when I realized that the previous high of \$325.00 was for the prior owners' short ski trip, as he was not a full-time resident!

I raced to the phone to call Wayne McGee again. He came as soon as possible with assistant Joe Gesting, and then after another round through the house we discovered the culprit. It's those darn appliances that make life a little easier - the range, oven, dishwasher, disposal, washer and dryer; and that other electric bandit, the hot water heater.

We were immediately given advice on, as Mr. Mershon said, "the ability to control the electrical capacity for a given facility is one of the advantages of our current rate design."

We learned that these appliances were not to make our lives easier. They were not to be trusted to ever work two at a time (example: range and dishwasher or

washer and dryer) because they would then trigger the demand and cause the meter to start adding dollars to electric bill at a dizzying rate.

So, Mr. Mershon, when you say that 95 percent of your users are happy because of the "advantages of your rate design," I must take exception to that statement.

In September of 1988 I installed both propane heat and water heater at some expense, but it seems small when faced with bills such as I had during the fall and winter of 1987-88.




