Village is involved in court cases

The Village of Ruidoso is the plaintiff in a District Court case filed recently by Hitomi S. Greening and Billie P. Smith.

The two Ruidoso citizens are asking for relief and damages, accusing the village of a number of actions involving the development and platting of lots 1-5, Block 1, First Addition of Cree Meadows Heights.

According to the case filing, the Village of Ruidoso has declared the property an illegal subdivision, and the plaintiffs claim the village is attempting to force them to complete improvements and utilities and the municipality refuses to complete them.

Greening and Smith are asking District Judge Richard A. Parsons to declare the subdivision legal to rule they may sell the property and to tell the village it has a duty to complete all improvements and install utility facilities.

Greening's husband, John Greening, has appeared before the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission and the Ruidoso Village

Computers recruited in the search for the real Billy the Kid

Billy the Kid.

He was the stuff legends are made of, a notorious gunslinger who history books claimed died an early death in wild New Mexico.

But who was Billy the Kid...really?

Famous forensic scientist Clyde Snow, Los Alamos National Laboratory researcher Thomas Kyle and representatives from the Lincoln County Heritage Trust met last Wednesday in White Rock (near Los Alamos) to take the next step of a project which might offer some possible answers.

Scientists will examine and compare vintage photos alleged to be of Billy the Kid using the latest in computer photo enhancement capabilities. And as Kyle showed those gathered in White Rock, the computer will be a valuable tool in the determination process.

All the photos, including two most recently obtained by the Trust, will be compared to the enhanced copy of the Trust's authenticated Billy the Kid photo. It shows the Kid leaning on his rifle with the drunken smile, taken in Fort Sumner in 1879.

According to Trust historian Bob Hart, the photos are a part of the Billy the Kid legend, independent of the true historical character.

"We have latched onto Billy as an anti-establishment person, good gone wrong...to homicidal individual, but essentially on the side of good," Hart said.

As the experiment progresses, Hart said results will shed light on controversial claims that Pat Garrett did not kill Billy the Kid in Fort Sumner and he survived to die of old age.

The final product of the project—a Billy the Kid exhibit—is expected to take two to three years to complete.

And although the mystery may not be solved, the legend might take on an accuracy with little left to the imagination.

Lodgers tax group wants changes in the way its funds are allocated

Lodgers Tax Advisory Board met Thursday, April 6, at Village Hall to discuss a proposal that member Mike Warren then presented to the Ruidoso Village Council the following Tuesday.

The board is scheduled to meet at 1:30 p.m. the third Wednesday of each month, and the media was not notified of the special meeting. No reporters were present. According to Weber, village clerk Tammie Maddox placed a notice on the bulletin board at Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

In an interview Thursday, Weber said the board discussed a plan to turn over to the Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) an additional portion of the 25 percent of funds the board has been using to fund requests by non-profit groups. According to previous years, the amount would be approximately \$37,000.

Weber said that in the past, LTAB funded advertising and promotions for Ruidoso groups or businesses planning activities in the area. Groups getting funding approval secured advertising agencies or other needed agencies to do promotional work.

Weber said if the village councilors approve the plan, the CVB would handle the funds and would oversee the publicity of events through the advertising agency they use. In this way, a group wanting funds for publicity would get "professional" assistance through the CVB, Weber said.

The CVB, according to Weber, would probably get Phil Price Advertising Agency to design a basic layout, with a Ruidoso logo. Each individual event to be publicized would use the same basic design, with room for some uniqueness and variety, he said.

The Price Agency is the company under contract with the Chamber of

Commerce. Since the CVB can get advertising work done at a lower cost than individuals, Weber predicted that more promotions can be done for less money than in the past. He estimated the CVB could have as much as \$6,000 left at the end of the year, while giving as much service to clients as the LTAB has been giving.

The LTAB will meet three times a year, rather than monthly, if the plan is approved. Weber said this will save money, adding this still falls within the guidelines set by the state statute creating Lodgers Tax Advisory boards in communities where the lodging tax is collected. He said they will still be available to hear complaints and oversee what the CVB is doing with the money, although they won't be involved in individual cases.

In past years the LTAB has had recurring problems with achieving quorums for the monthly meetings.

The main purpose of the plan, according to Weber, is to get the most for the money and get the village promoted to the public in the most beneficial way possible.

The village council took the matter under advisement and will look into it further when they get more information.

John Jeffers, executive director of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce said he thinks the CVB will be able to handle the extra duties.

"I think it will be very beneficial to the community," he said. Jeffers said, if the plan is adopted, the advertising committee of the CVB and Phil Price Advertising Agency will handle most of the extra work. He said there might be a possibility later of adding an additional part-time staff member.

Lodgers tax in Ruidoso is set at three percent. When the board es-

Travel agents scope area

Travel agents from New Mexico, Texas, Arkansas and Oklahoma gathered at the Inn of the Mountain Gods this weekend for the annual convention of the Southwest Chapter of the American Society of Travel Agents (ASTA).

Items on the agenda include an appeal of an administrative review and several requests from property owners.

P&Z will conduct a regular meeting and workshop session at 6 p.m. Monday, May 1, in council

chambers. Purpose of that meeting is to hear concerns from commission members and members of the public.

All meetings are open to the public.

Center for the Western Horse to be dedicated May 6

The National Center for the Western Horse (NCWH), phase one, will open next month with a dedication ceremony at 10 a.m. Friday, May 5, on public land near historic Fort Stanton.

The dedication will take place at the newly constructed parking area which can be reached by taking State Road 380 between Capitan and Lincoln, and turning onto State Road 214, the road leading to Fort Stanton. The route will be marked by signs on the day of the ceremony.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony, at 10 a.m., will be followed by a horseback ride on the new trails.

According to a news release pro-

vided by Sid Goodloe, NCWH president, several miles of horse trails and a parking area will be included in the first phase.

In addition to the trails and the parking area, it has been proposed that the actual horse center be located on a portion of the 23,000 acres of Bureau of Land Management (BLM) land surrounding Fort Stanton. Larry Woodard, BLM state director, said more public input will be sought as the development continues.

If the proposal is approved, former President Ronald Reagan, an accomplished horseman and former cavalry officer, is expected to officially open the completed center,

said Goodloe, a Capitan rancher.

Goodloe said the NCWH is designed to pay tribute to one of the most critical and most often overlooked elements in the settlement of the western United States—the horse.

"The western horse was essential to all our forebears here in New Mexico and through the west—to the settlers in their covered wagons, to the pioneers, the soldiers and the native Americans," he said.

If the proposal is accepted, the center will be constructed on federal land well outside the fort grounds and will not interfere in any way with the operation or the

location of Fort Stanton Hospital and Training School, which has occupied the fort since 1966, according to the news release.

Goodloe and Roswell businessman Robert O. Anderson are the co-founders of the National Center for the Western Horse. They have signed a memorandum of understanding the the BLM to study the feasibility of using the area for the project.

Goodloe said the NCWH will be the nation's only monument to the western horse. It is expected to include a museum of the western horse containing cavalry and ranch horse memorabilia and native American exhibits; a western art

gallery; a living history ranch containing authentic ranch houses, corrals, barns and other structures that existed in New Mexico's early ranching days; and the Bonito River riparian area.

Elected officials invited to the dedication ceremonies include governor Garrey Carruthers, Lieutenant Governor Jack Stahl, senators Pete Domenici and Jeff Bingaman and Congressman Joe Skeen.

The dedication ceremony date, May 5, coincides with the 134th anniversary of the founding of Fort Stanton, which was opened in May 1855. The fort was named in honor of Henry Stanton, a U.S. Army of-

ficer killed in the line of duty.

Fort Stanton has been home to or visited by a number of famous people, including Colonel Kit Carson, Billy the Kid, General John J. "Blackjack" Pershing and pioneer cattleman John Chisum. It was an important element in the protection of settlers and ranchers from Indian attacks, was occupied by both Union and Confederate troops during the Civil War and figured prominently in the Lincoln County War.

"The history of the fort and of Lincoln county as a whole make it the natural site for this center," said Goodloe.

established a budget for the current fiscal year, it was estimated the collections will be \$150,000, but village manager Frank Potter said recently he expects collections to fall short of that estimate.

Much of this year's budget already was earmarked to fund the CVB. The budget for the fiscal year that ends June 30 is as follows:

During the year various groups have asked for funds, and the board

granted an additional \$14,000 to the retiree solicitation, a division of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce; \$1,226 for the Lions Club mule races; \$3,500 for the Ironhorse railroad and \$1,779 for the Greeters, also a chamber organization, to promote the Christmas Jubilee.

On Tuesday, Mike Warren told the council that by giving the \$37,500 that has been disbursed on a case by case basis by the volunteer board, the monies will go further.

The board has wrestled in the past with problems of only providing funds for non-profit organizations. After approving the \$3,500 for the Chili Cookoff this year, the board learned that the organizer hadn't received his non-profit

status.

Councillor Al Junge noted Tuesday that by giving all the funds to the CVB the village would "get around the sneaky ruling Mr. (Attorney General Hal) Stratton came out with this year."

Warren said lodgers tax funds not used can't be carried over, and chamber executive director John Jeffers said Tuesday if monies aren't encumbered by April, May or June, then they can be used in the summer advertising campaign.

Warren also recommended taking 33 percent of the \$37,500 portion of the funds and putting them in a building fund to help furnish a proposed community/events center.

The council is expected to discuss the request during budget hearings.

The Greening case is just one of several ongoing lawsuits.


The village is a party to the "friend of the court" brief being filed in the United State Supreme Court on a water case that attorneys say could have an effect on the suit in-

Five New Mexico high schools, dozens of local long distance runners and several special local-oriented relay runs combined to provide a highly entertaining afternoon for community residents.

Lovington captured top honors for the meet winning both the girls and the boys brackets.

The Lovington Wildcat girls topped all schools with 85 points. Goddard finished with 69, Ruidoso 68, Artesia 47 and Socorro 19.

For the Warriors, Jennifer Jimenez fired the discus 100-10 1/2, a personal best and the first time Jimenez broke 100 this year. The toss was good for second place. Linder Rad followed with a 76-6 throw.

Jimenez pushed the shot put 31-3 1/2 for her personal best and third place.

Norma Murillo led all Warriors in the long jump with a 14-6 1/4 leap, good for third. Amy Wishard followed with a 14-6 jump, her best ever for fourth place.

Chantel Bowen cleared the bar at 5-feet for second place in the high jump. Three jumpers cleared five feet, but the winner was selected on fewer jumps.

The 400-meter relay team of Adell Caranta, Rachelle Holstein, Murillo and Missy Gosdin finished in 53.41, good for second place.

Jennifer Parker brought home a third place in the 400-meter dash with a time of 64.18, her personal best. Wishard ran 63.66 in the prelims of the 400-meter for her personal best, but finished sixth in the finals. Wishard ran the finals just after finishing the 800-meter relays.

In the 100-meter dash, Rachelle Holstein ran 13.44 in the prelims. Caranta ran 13.76 in the prelims for her personal best. Sue Bolten was closely behind at 13.79 for her personal best. Yvette Maldonado finished at 14.81.

Missy Gosdin high stepped her way to victory in the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 52.12.

Light snowfall spells dry summer

Department of Agriculture officials say light snowfall this winter might spell trouble for water supplies in some parts of the state this summer.

According to a news release from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Soil Conservation Service, Greg Hausler, local district conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service, reports streamflow prospects for the Rio Ruidoso at Hollywood are projected to be near

the average for the past 25 years.

The snow course measurement near Sierra Blanca Peak shows a 39-inch depth as of March 1 and 10.3-inch moisture content, compared with 16.6-inch moisture content for the same period in 1988.

In other parts of New Mexico, the light snowpack in the west-central and southwest parts of New Mexico are expected to produce less than one-half of the average snowmelt runoff.

The water supply outlook for northern New Mexico is near average to much above average, due to February storms which carried Gulf moisture in the form of heavy snows.

Irrigation water supplies produced by snowmelt runoff should be adequate in the San Juan, Canadian, Pecos and Rio Grande River Basins.







April Showers

This is being sent to you on April 13, just a little before high noon, and the mist that came in from the north early in the morning has turned into light showers of fine drops of rain. The sky is overcast with clouds of gray and light purple, floating overhead very slowly to the west. All up the valley are curtains of falling rain with, here and there, a little gleam of

sunshine breaking through.

During the first of April, we have had weather of all four seasons of the year. First, there was summer weather of 80, followed by spring days with fruit blooms, early flowers and bright new leaves. Surely they received a message and held back from bursting into bloom even during the summer-like weather.

Summer birds

Out at the bluebird tree just west of the flagpole, you can see all the blue mountain bluebirds flying among the branches and then down to the ground, some small ones in the hand. The yellow-breasted flycatcher, or Phoebe, has returned to his home under the eaves of the

house. A piñon jay calls from the pignons on the hillside and the crimson-tinted house finches are feeding at the stations.

I thought the snowbirds would return with the last winter weather, and yet not one showed up. They had gone several days before, and this you can usually take as a sign that the cold weather is over. Robins are chirping down among the river trees, which quickly halted their leaf growth, and are still wary about leaving out the rest of the way.

Now I see a lone snowbird out at the lilacs. I think he is one of the last on his way north from the white mountain, just stopping by to say "so long" 'till next year.

This will reach you on the on-month birthday of little Patricia, the first calf, born on Saint Patrick's Day.

The little brown and white heifer with three spots across her white face is more and more the pride of the herd. She is eating the new grass like a full-grown cow. And at feeding time she comes racing across the knoll, leading the bunch, and at times circling back running all through the cows, much as to say, "Hurry, hurry! This is chow time."

Let us thank the Lord for the blessing of April showers and all our other many blessings.



EDITORIAL

Nobody's perfect...we all make mistakes. But some are more costly than others.

When the Ruidoso Village Council, meeting more than two weeks ago, approved a \$6,000 subsidy for a local business to promote Ruidoso using the "Talking Yellow Pages," we believed that was a mistake, and questioned the way the action was taken. Councillors, with no debate and very little discussion, OK'd the proposal presented by Bobby Parsons of Parsons Productions.

Within two days, two members of the council admitted they had made a mistake. "We made a boo boo," said Councillor J.D. James when questioned by a member of The Ruidoso News staff. "It looked like we did make a mistake... we'll have to take another look," said Councillor Elmer Pirelli.

We're still waiting.

Meanwhile, we learned that Business Communications Center, a company with offices in Ruidoso and Roswell, submitted a telemessaging plan to Mike Warren of the Lodgers Tax Advisory Board and the Chamber of Commerce Advertising Committee. According to information in that plan, that company could provide a 24-hour hotline with information about local activities, special events, retirement opportunities and general information for \$15 a month. A toll-free 800 number could be provided for as low as \$20 a month.

It kind of sounds like what we believe Talking Yellow Pages might be. Who knows? Who else might be able to provide those services, and for what price?

We can't help but wonder...what if the council had, upon learning of the benefits of a call-in promotional line, decided to request proposals from any company who could provide such services? We really don't know what's out there and for what price.

Councillors didn't mention the Talking Yellow Pages during Tuesday's meeting. It looks like the two elected officials who think they made a mistake aren't going to bring it up. If, indeed, a mistake was made; apparently we're just going to live with it.—fj

On The Record...

The debate over changing the form of government in the Village of Ruidoso has been going on for a long time.

I've done a lot (I mean a whole lot) of listening to the people who want a change, and a little listening to the people who oppose it. (People who are satisfied with the way things are going, usually don't have as much to say.)

I've done some reading, made some calls and done a lot of thinking.

To use a tired old cliché (sorry, but it keeps running through my head): You don't throw out the baby with the bathwater.

If you don't like the current bunch of village leaders, just wait for another election—every two to four years we get a chance to throw the incumbents out of office. The voters always have the last say—whether through the ballot or a petition process.

I prefer the ballot. It works. Just a few years ago Ruidoso residents became discontented with the village leaders... they petitioned for an election... the change was endorsed by voters who upped the number of councillors to six... And everybody lived happily

ever after.

But wait. Not only are we seeing yet another move to throw out the entire council (and the mayor, too, this time), but we're going to throw out the mayor/council form of government and start all over.

Those who are finding so much fault with the current system, not to mention the present elected and appointed officials, are convinced we'll "get better people" the next go-round.

In case anybody has forgotten, Councillor Al Junge was among the group removed from office in the last petition drive. Whether or not Junge was the target of the last removal, it does prove that voters do return the same people to office.

Not everybody is satisfied with Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr., and some believe he is one of the people targeted by the petition. The voters have elected Davis as mayor more than once.

A few years ago we were told we would be better off with more councillors, now the petitioners tell us there are more advantages to having fewer.

"Because of the normal deterioration in quality of candidates in proportion to the number of elective

vacancies, it is more apt to be beneficial to the village if as few commissioners be elected as is necessary to efficiently direct the administration of the village," reads a paper being circulated by the group who want a change.

The last time the village elected councillors five people registered to run for four slots; and they were joined by a sixth candidate who ran as a write-in. That's six people vying for four positions, and doesn't indicate a huge number of people who want to serve on the council.

I don't think that would change much with a change in form.

Petitioners also want these new commissioners to be paid "proportionate to the importance of the position," saying if the village is truly "big business" then the commissioners are actually directors who should be rewarded for their expertise and time.

Does that mean we should pay them more or less? I guess it depends.

A big difference between the current mayor/council form and the proposed manager/commission form is that the commissioners select a chairman in the second form. Nowadays we elect our own mayor. That's the way I like it.

As for all the extra costs involved in the proposed change, from districting to all the extra elections, I just don't think the benefits match the costs. (You see, I, too, am thinking like big business.)

The International City Managers Association is all for the commission/manager form of govern-

ment. It's easy to see why; because the membership of that group is made up of city managers who know that their power is increased tremendously under that form. People in towns where the commission/manager form is in place say it weakens the mayor, but it strengthens the manager.

I've heard by the grapevine that the people wanting to change Ruidoso's government are not all that happy with our current manager. They may not be getting a new manager, and may even be giving the one we have now more power.

Anybody who reads my editorials and columns knows that I am not oblivious to the mistakes our elected officials make. I certainly don't think they are perfect, but I don't think the local government is in a shambles that calls for tossing the whole thing out and starting all over.

We've got a group of councillors and a mayor that we elected. If we don't like their actions, let's tell them. And, next March, when municipal elections roll around, voters can make some changes on the council if that's what they believe is in the best interests of the town.

Changing the form of government is a reactionary move prompted by some short-range discontent.

The election to consider changing the government is set for June 20. Let's talk about it and make sure we make the right choices for our village's future.




