Whirling Reb whizzes ahead to surprise favorite Meddlin Dash

Whirling Reb broke well and never looked back on his way to a surprise victory in the Grade III \$22,250 Mr Jet Moore Allowance Stake on opening day Saturday at Ruidoso Downs.

A crowd of 4,112 wagered \$417,566. The attendance and handle were the highest since 1982.

"We are very excited about the opening day," said track owner R.D. Hubbard. "I was very pleased about the way it went."

Whirling Reb, who paid \$45.00, \$15.40 and \$6.40, was making his second start of the year. He was second on May 7 in an allowance at Sunland Park. Raise An Impudent, who was the Quarter Horse of the Meeting this year at Sunland Park was second and paid \$5.60 and

\$3.80.

The even-money favorite, Meddlin Dash, was third and paid \$2.80 to show. The victory came as no surprise to trainer Richard Fry.

"This gelding has held his own against some of the better horses in the country," said Fry, 40, who was the leading trainer at the Albuquerque this spring. "I was surprised he paid that much."

Joe Martinez, last season's leading thoroughbred rider, was aboard for the win. Martinez was tenth in the quarter horse jockey standings.

"He usually breaks well," said Martinez. "Saturday, he got away from them and won. Every time I've ridden him he does well. He's a nice little horse."

Over the winter, Whirling Reb

had surgery on a knee. The operation was done by Dr. Jack Sales.

"He has come back better than ever," said Fry, who has 35 horses at Ruidoso Downs. "The surgery was very successful."

Meddlin Dash broke next to Whirling Reb, but couldn't catch the winner. Meddlin Dash was second in the 1988 All American and Kansas derbies.

"He didn't get away real good," said jockey Luke Myles. "I think he needed that race pretty bad."

The \$700,000 guaranteed Pimlico Special was simulcasted to Ruidoso Downs. Blushing John paid \$20.60 to win at Ruidoso Downs.

Racing wrapup

Brooks qualifies four for the Kansas Derby



Jack Brooks qualified four horses for the final of the Kansas Derby on May 28, including Merganser, the 1988 World Champion Running Quarter Horse.

Arnold Simmons qualified three horses, including Super De Kas whose 20.140 seconds time for the 400 yards was the best of the day. In fact, the top five finishers of the first division of the trials qualified for the finals. All of the trials were run into a head wind.

A crowd of 3,032 wagered \$309,195 on the 13-race card that included a simulcast of the John Henry Handicap at Hollywood Park.

Merganser won his division by a nose in a time of 20.345. The colt had muscle spasms all weekend, and trainer Jack Brooks considered scratching the horse. Merganser paid \$2.80 to win.

"Saturday morning he had a touch of muscle spasms," said Brooks. "This morning it was bad, but his vital signs were good. His whole body quivered and jerked. I'm tickled to death he won. I just want him to be well."

Owner Ronald Shalz said the decision to scratch Merganser was left to jockey Jacky Martin.

"They decided they would wait and see, and maybe hold him out at the last minute," said Shalz. "It's been a tough day."

Brooks also returned to the winners' circle in the final division of the Kansas Derby Trials. My Dash, who was second in the Kansas Futurity last season, won her race with a time of 20.31 seconds. My Dash was making her 1989 debut.

"We kind of thought she'd run well from her works," said Brooks. "At Ruidoso, sometimes you need an out, so we were tickled that she won."

The favorite in the race, Okeydokey Baby, finished fourth.

Brooks also qualified Power Effort who ran second behind Floyd De Great. Rime, who finished fifth in the first division, also qualified.

Super De Kas won the first trial. Simmons was pleasantly surprised that he qualified three horses to the finals.

"We felt we had a possibility for three, and a good chance with two," said Simmons. "They're all three quality horses."

"Super De Kas had to win on class because we weren't prepping him for it," said Simmons.

Super De Kas dead-heated for third in the 1988 All American Futurity and was second in the Rainbow Futurity.

Floyd De Great provided Simmons with his second winner of the day. The 400-yard time was 20.26 seconds. Floyd De Great, \$4.60, was well-beaten in the Graham Farms Derby in his last race. In 1988, Floyd De Great won the second consolation of the All American Futurity last season.

"It's gone really good today," said Simmons. "We think they're nice horses and they proved it today."

Iris Buchanan had the second fastest qualifier with Project Cash, who ran behind Super De Kas. Buchanan also won the fifth division with Ossetra, but was not fast enough to qualify for the finals or consolation. Both of the Buchanan horses prepped at Sunland Park.

"We brought Project Cash and Ossetra here for the derbies," Buchanan said.

Barb's Bounce, one of two supplemental entries, finished third in the first division, and earned a berth in the final. Dashing Baby, who was fourth in that race, also qualified.

The consolation field is led by A Big River, who surprised the crowd with a \$56.20 mutual in the sixth division.

Jockey Fred Watson was thrown from his mount in the sixth race—fourth division of the trials—Sunday and suffered a broken collarbone.

There is a carryover of \$7,764.75 in the twin trifecta for Thursday's racing.

Super De Kas thunders down the track to post the fastest qualifying time in the Kansas Derby trials at Ruidoso Downs Race Track Sunday. The Tommy Hayre Ranches horse covered the 400-yard course in 20.64.



RHS track team wins two firsts at state meet

Ira Sago and Ardena Comanche joined the ranks of New Mexico state champs when they competed Saturday at the AAA State Track Meet in Albuquerque.

In what Coach Ronny Maskew said the most exciting race of the day, Sago took first in the 800-meter run with a time of 1:59.13.

"Sago was third with 50 meters to go, but put on a tremendous finish to nip Derek West (Albuquerque Academy) and Daniel Gutierrez at the tape," said Maskew.

Not only did Sago win state, he also posted a new RHS school record in the 800-meter run.

Ardena Comanche won the girls 800-meter run with a 2:22.01, just missing the state record by 1.3 seconds. But Comanche was able to break her own Ruidoso school record by more than eight seconds.

"The race was almost identical to Ira's," said Maskew. "Ardena trailed Judy Norris of Tucumcari with 50 meters to go, but breezed by her to win by two steps at the finish.

Warriors also brought home a

third and two fourth place wins from the state meet, with Jennifer Jimenez placing third in the girls discus with a throw of 106'11". That's a new personal best for the state-ranked Jimenez.

Chantel Bowen tied for fourth place in the girls high jump clearing 5'2", and Dusty Beavers threw 145'7" to win fourth place in the boys discus.

Maskew took 18 RHS tracksters to the state meet, and was pleased with the good efforts they put in at the intense competition. While many team members failed to

qualify for the finals, Warriors made good showings in all their events.

Sago ran 10:32.08 in the 3200-meter, but failed to place.

"He had too little time to recover after running the tough 800 victory," said Maskew.

The girls 1600-meter relay team of Jennifer Parker, Rachelle Holstein, Catrina Gabaldon and Amy Wishard ran 4:19.16 and finished second in the preliminary heat, but the time was not good enough to make the finals, said Maskew.

The boys 400-meter team of Ira

Sago, Steve Dankert, Chris Torres and Ricky Brazell logged a personal (team) best of 44.38, but fell short of the finals qualifying time.

Other Warriors who made it to state included:

—Linder Rad, who ran 17.11 in the girls 100-meter hurdles,
—Missy Gosdin who ran 50.75 in the girls 300-meter hurdles,

—Luisa Tam who ran 6:05.222 in the 3200-meter,

—Joellyn Comanche with a 6:19.10 in the 3200-meter run,

—Amy Wishard running a 63:09 in the preliminaries of the girls 400-meter run.

—Michael Swanner who threw the javelin 15'6",

—Dusty Beavers who threw the shot put 45'8".

"This was a young Warrior team, with many freshmen and sophomores," said Maskew on Sunday. "(The team) should be a real contender next year in both boys and girls competition."

Golfer Nathan Baudo named to all-district

Ruidoso High School golfer Nathan Baudo was named to the District 4A-AAA All-District team recently.

RHS golfers took ninth place in the state tournament last weekend, putting in two good days of effort. Coach Ridge Bowden said the five golfers were in seventh place after the first day of play, but fell to 10th on day-two, to finish as ninth in the state.

The team had a two-day score of 687, with 340 for the first day and 347 for the second. Chris Long led the team on day-one shooting an 82, with Toby O'Neil leading his team on the second day with an 84.

Long, Baudo, O'Neil and teammates Eric Eggleston and Ron

Sanders put forth good efforts both at the state tourney and at the district and season play that took them to state, said Bowden.

At district the team placed third with a 344, behind Deming with a team score of 332 and Socorro with a second-place 337.

President Bush sends troops to Panama

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Bush ordered 2,000 combat troops into Panama on Thursday to protect the lives of American citizens. At the same time, Bush urged other Latin American nations to join in diplomatic pressure on military ruler Manuel Antonio Noriega. Bush also recalled the U.S. ambassador, Arthur Davis, and reduced the embassy staff to essential personnel.

The action comes in the wake of Wednesday's bloody attacks by Noriega's supporters and troops against the opposition's presidential candidate and his running mate, whom the United States regards as the winners of Panama's election.

Bush said U.S. government employees and their dependents living outside of military bases would be returned to the United States or relocated for safety reasons from Panama City and other locations in U.S. bases in Panama.

"I'm worried about the lives of American citizens," Bush said in announcing his actions in the White House briefing room.

"I will do what is necessary to protect the lives of American citizens, and we will not be intimidated by the bullying tactics of the United States dictator Noriega," the president said.

Brent Scowcroft, the president's national security adviser, said he doubted Noriega would challenge the U.S. forces. He's a thug but he operates with some prudence when he has to, Scowcroft said.

Congressional leaders, briefed in advance by the president, offered Bush strong support.

Bush said every neutral observer had agreed that Noriega's handpicked candidate, Carlos Du-

que, had been decisively defeated in Sunday's presidential election by the opposition's Guillermo Endara, who was attacked and beaten Wednesday by troops and paramilitary agents loyal to Noriega.

"Efforts to overturn constitutional regimes or steal elections are unacceptable," Bush said. "Yes, he said he had not decided whether to recognize Endara as the legitimate president-elect."

Asked to identify what kind of security threats warranted the increase in troops, Scowcroft said, "It's precautionary as much as anything else."

Secord indicted

WASHINGTON (AP) - Richard Secord, the retired general accused by Oliver North of running arms to Nicaraguan rebels, was accused Thursday of trying to Congress to cover up his profits from the Iran-Contra affair. The indictment alleges that more than \$1 million was involved.

Tornado sighted

(AP) - At least one tornado touched down Thursday south of Carlsbad, N.M., and another may have struck Roswell along with lightning that damaged one house, while high winds toppled livestock pens and a fence in Jalisco, N.M., authorities said.

National Weather Service meteorologist Ed Mortimer said several funnel clouds were reported around Roswell Thursday afternoon.

Min. wage increased

WASHINGTON (AP) - Rep. Bill Richardson, D-N.M., voted with the majority Thursday as the house, on a 347-172 roll call, approved legislation to raise the minimum wage from \$2.95 an hour to \$4.55 an hour by October 1991.

Richardson was among 225 Democrats who voted in favor of passing the bill.

New Mexico Reps. Steve Schiff and Joe Ekeem were among 146 Democrats who sided with 26 Democrats voting against the measure.

Bush extends ban

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Bush has decided to make permanent his ban on importation of assault-type semiautomatic weapons which are not suited for sporting purposes, administration sources said Thursday.

Rose hearing May 25

NEW YORK - Pete Rose will have a hearing May 25 before baseball Commissioner A. Bartlett Giamatti to respond to a special investigation's 225-page report on the Cincinnati manager's alleged gambling activities.

League will file lawsuit

SANTA FE (AP) - More than 60 cities and counties were poised to launch an assault today against a new state landfill regulations because the state has not provided them a way to carry out the new rules.

Top officials of the New Mexico Association of Counties and the New Mexico Municipal League said a lawsuit would be filed today challenging the constitutionality of the solid waste regulations adopted by the Environmental Improvement Board.

"We are not challenging the content of the regulations. We think they are fine. We supported them," said Bill Fulgoni, executive director of the Municipal League.

Donna Smith, executive director of the Association of Counties, said more than 80 city and county governments will join the league and the association as plaintiffs in the lawsuit.

Meanwhile, Gov. Garrey Carruthers said he was "deeply disappointed" these two groups, representing county and city government officials, would oppose these environmental protection measures.

Bush gets bi-partisan support

WASHINGTON (AP) - Sen. Pete Domenici, R-N.M., said there was strong bipartisan support Thursday for President Bush's order that U.S. military bases in Panama be reinforced.

Bush said about 2,000 soldiers would be added to the 10,000 stationed in Panama to protect the lives of U.S. citizens. About 21,000 U.S. civilians live in Panama.

U.S. military personnel were advised to stay off the Panamanian streets if possible and to wear only civilian clothes in public.

Dependents of the U.S. Embassy staff members were moved to the safety of Fort Clayton in Panama.


"Here is my first child. Isn't he a darling?" The little day-old calf, looking at you calm and trusting seemed to say: "We are ready to celebrate Mother's Day."

warrant for arson and conspiracy to commit arson, in reference to the arson-caused fire at the Madsin residence, said McSwane.

Chavez had also been arrested on May 11 for failure to appear in magistrate's court.

A search of his residence turned up a small quantity of methamphetamines, some drug paraphernalia, as well as some items believed to be stolen property, said McSwane.

Chavez was released Friday on his own recognizance, said McSwane.

The discovery of the burglary operation was the result of the joint efforts of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department, and the police departments in Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs and Capitan.

McSwane said the Sheriff's Department was able to obtain a search warrant in the case based on

evidence through viewing a videotape made by the Ruidoso Police.

Property that had been stolen as long as a year ago was recovered, said McSwane.

On Monday, May 8, a burglary attempt was reported to the Sheriff's Department at the Hondo Valley School.

In that case, an unsuccessful attempt was made at stealing the \$10,000 collected during the Hondo Fiesta.

"They were amateurs," said McSwane, who believes the burglars may have spent as long as four hours in their attempt. The burglary is presently under investigation in conjunction with the State Police, said McSwane.

On Tuesday, Lydia Mays reported the Phillips 66 station in Sun Valley had been broken into. McSwane reported that a dog in the station may have stopped the attempted burglary.

Blood was discovered in the station either caused by a dog bite or a cut that law officers speculate could have happened when the intruder broke a window, said McSwane. The suspect may have lost a lot of blood, said McSwane.

This case is under investigation and officials are looking for a suspect with either a cut or dog bite which may have bled seriously.

Also in Sun Valley, the Sheriff's Department responded to a report of someone cutting wood on private property.

Sheriff McSwane reported that three juveniles were referred to the Juvenile Probation Office in reference to a previous burglary at the Phillips 66 station in the Hondo Valley.

Also, one juvenile was sentenced and transported Friday to Springer for two burglaries at the Carrizozo Country Club on January 6 and 19, said McSwane.

Dudley declines comment on unpaid \$20,000 reward

The brother who posted a reward for the discovery of Tony Dudley's body refused comment as to why he hasn't paid Charles "Cheater" Bella, the man who found the missing body.

Don Dudley, of El Paso, Texas, refused comment on any specifics pertaining to the dispute over the \$20,000 reward that was offered for the discovery of Tony Dudley's body.

Bella said he found the body December 20, 1988, after he was approached by Don Dudley for the task. He claims he earned the posted reward and further claims he hasn't been paid.

Dudley explained in a telephone

interview Friday he would not comment as he has been named as the defendant in a lawsuit filed by attorneys representing Bella.

Dudley said he received notice of the suit on Monday, May 1. Bella was originally interviewed on May 3, but he never mentioned the lawsuit.

In a follow-up interview Sunday, Bella explained he had consulted lawyers, but they did not inform him of the exact date the suit would be filed.

Dudley expressed in his interview he hoped The News had its facts straight.

"That's his normal way of doing things," Dudley said of Bella.

said Dudley.

"We have no problem honoring rewards with those who have legitimate claims," said Dudley.

Dudley said he is the trustee of the new reward of \$50,000 presently offered.

Bella is involved in two court cases, one where he is accused of flying his helicopter into the grounds at Santa Fe prison in an escape attempt, and the other involving a game and wildlife violation in Texas. His wife said recently he needs the Dudley reward money to help with legal expenses.

Meanwhile, Bella contracted for legal services with the well-known Texas attorney, E. Lee Bailey. He put up one of his helicopters as a guarantee for Bailey.

Ron and Sheila Harris, moved to Albuquerque last year.


Burt Reynolds stars in the feature-length movie.

"B.L. Stryker" was made on location in Florida, and Ruidoso resident Kathy Echols spent three weeks on the set where she tutored Harris.



tion on the site chosen, he said. This includes groundwater studies, and to his knowledge, there are only two companies in the state that are qualified to do these studies, he said.

The entire process can take up to 16 months, said Beauvais.

With the success of the temporary injunction, EID will effectively be restrained from enforcing landfill regulations in Lincoln County for the duration of the lawsuit filed by the Municipal League, he said.

By that time, monies may be available from the state to help counties comply with the new regulations, said Beauvais.

"It won't be cheap," he said, for counties and municipalities to comply with the new regulations.

The estimated cost for Doña Ana County to close all its dump sites is \$3.6 million, said Beauvais.

The costs incurred in operating a new site can greatly depend on the

site's location, he said. At the present site, the cost could be prohibitive because of the area's intermittent water courses, he said.

Beauvais recommended to the Ruidoso Village Council that the site be closed and patrolled until the judge's decision was known. The Fort Stanton landfill is operated by the Village of Ruidoso, but owned by the County of Lincoln.

This way EID can be assured that the site is no longer collecting garbage, which Beauvais described as the salient point in deciding whether or not a site is closed.

"EID is going to have to work with us," said Beauvais, explaining the agency cannot expect a governmental body to close a site in strict accordance to the regulations on such short notice.

"We have been making a good faith effort," he said. "We'll be working as hard as we can, and you can't push it any further than that," he said.

Beauvais said the county had confirmed the joint powers agreement with the Fort Stanton Hospi-

tal landfill, which will allow the county to dispose of refuse collected from the unincorporated municipalities in Lincoln County.

However, the site will not be a public landfill, and will accept refuse brought only in county vehicles, said Beauvais.

This would mean contractors who could not use county dumpsters would not be allowed to use the Fort Stanton landfill.

It also means contractors cannot use the compactor operated by the Village of Ruidoso, which has an agreement to ship the village's trash to Roswell, said village manager Frank Potter.

This could mean the reversal of cleaning up 20 years of avoidance, said Mayor Lloyd Davis.

Beauvais felt confident the temporary injunction will be granted which means it is possible for the site to re-open after May 19.

Infrastructure Division head Becky Bell-Durham, asked Ruidoso and Lincoln County residents to show restraint during the next week in disposing of their garbage.

adopts rules or regulations mandating local governments to engage in any new activity or to provide any new service beyond that required by existing law.

He said he told the EID, "it was too quick, too costly and you have to work with us or we will take you to court and we did."

If a permanent injunction is issued, the village and the county could possibly use a portion of the Fort Stanton site to dispose of trash. However, because of the mineral right and water drainage, there may be problems with the area which might be used.

"If the judge issues an injunction, we could be using the landfill on a temporary basis while looking for another site," said Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. The Mayor did express concern over closing the landfill.

"The problem is, after 20 years, we have just got the arroyos cleaned up and in three months,

they will be full again." Last Tuesday the mayor ordered village staff not to close the landfill, but he apparently changed his mind before Friday's meeting.

According to Beauvais, even if an injunction is issued, it is only a short term solution. "Any solution we work out will be short term," he said. Village attorney, John Underwood said, "I feel both entities should work toward finding a new landfill."

According to Potter, only household trash will be taken to the Roswell landfill.

"We still have a serious problem with the builders," he said. "What are they going to do? We don't know."

Councillor Al Junge asked village officials if there was any chance the village might accommodate the Village of Ruidoso Downs with the agreement with Roswell.

"We should not obligate ourselves to anyone else," said Bell-

Durham. Mayor Jake Harris of Ruidoso Downs said his village would continue to take its trash to Ruidoso's compactor.

"As long as that thing is in operation, we will continue to take trash there," said Harris. "It was their proposal to take our trash there, not ours."

Harris said Ruidoso Downs has not made any other arrangements yet, but he will be on the phone Monday morning. "We haven't had time to even think," said Harris.

Village of Ruidoso officials asked the citizens to please help out.

"Because of the restriction and problems, we would like to encourage everyone to hold on to their refuse, other than household trash, till something can be worked out," said Bell-Durham. "Please refrain from putting building materials, tires or metal objects into dumpsters that could cause damage to the trash compactor."

"We were really thrilled and pleased," said Shirlene Fitzner, postmaster at Ruidoso Downs. "People came from Hobbs, Roswell and from all over the state."

The ceremony began with the National Anthem, the Pledge of Allegiance, which was led by Catherine Grantham, a postal worker at Ruidoso Downs and a rendition of "God Bless America" by Nancy Greggins of Ruidoso Downs.

Attending the ceremony were Ruidoso Downs Race Track owners R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard, Mayor Jake Harris of Ruidoso Downs, artist Tom Knapp and his

wife, Dorothy Bell Knapp, and William A. Bardone, MSC manager postmaster.

Bardone was given the honor of unveiling the envelope to the crowd.

The beige envelope shows a horse and jockey accompanied by an outrider. The postmark shows the horse and jockey racing to the finish line with the American flag waving in the breeze.

According to Knapp, he designed the envelope after an old photo he had taken.

"I used a photo of a race horse and pony horse taken a couple of years ago," he said. "You need something to give you a point of reference, it gives you more accuracy. You're out in left field, if you don't follow something."

Knapp said the postmark was easy to design.

"It had to be racing," he said. "I wanted to indicate All American, so it had to have a horse and a flag. It doesn't take much time and it was

fun. It took more time to sign the envelopes." Knapp pre-signed a lot of the envelopes, but he still had to sign some more at the ceremony.

Knapp's cachet envelope and postmark are not the first ones in his family. His wife, Dorothy designed the first special cachet envelope and postmark issued by the Ruidoso Downs Post Office in 1987.

Dorothy Bell Knapp said she felt it was kind of unusual to have two such specially designated artists in one house. "I think it is kind of neat," she said.

The works of both Tom and Dorothy Bell Knapp are currently on display at the Lindavida Gallery on Mechem Drive.

The Millers moved to Ruidoso three years ago. He retired in 1987 from Mel Howard Sales Co. in El Paso, Texas, where he was owner


and president of the company. The deceased was a member of Trinity Methodist Church in El Paso.

EDITORIAL

Members of the Ruidoso Village Council were surprised to learn last week that village staff, working with employees of a state agency, had decided to close the landfill the village operates on Fort Stanton Road. Perhaps that was the only possible action, given the circumstances surrounding the regulations adopted by the EID.

But, perhaps it wasn't.

We believe that closing the landfill and making other arrangements to dispose of village garbage involves an important policy decision.

The mayor and councillors are elected by citizens to make policy decisions and to hire employees to carry out those policies. Elected officials, not their hired staff, are accountable to the voters.

But when the decision on the landfill was made, it was without benefit of discussion among those officials. Since a special meeting wasn't conducted, it would appear that village staff made the decision and implemented the closing plan.

Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. sent his staff a clear message Tuesday when he ordered them to stop taking the landfill, stop looking for another place to take the garbage and continue with business as usual. If there was any doubt as to who's running this village, Davis made it clear Tuesday that he hasn't delegated his share in policymaking to anyone.

Councillors depend on village staff to keep them informed and updated so they can make responsible decisions. They were shortchanged last week.

Communication among elected officials and administrative staff is essential. That's the way this form of government is designed to work.—fj

DEAR EDITOR:

With all the talk of recycling these days, I am really surprised that little or no emphasis is placed on one of the most natural, inexpensive and beneficial methods of recycling certain wastes. This method is known as composting. Composting is a relatively simple and completely natural process of speeding up the natural decomposition of organic wastes (plant, vegetable and fruit); producing soil-enriching compost or humus.

It is reported that thirty percent of our trash is "yard waste," which is only waste when combined with broken glass and plastics. These leaves and grass clippings are an invaluable resource to good soil when regenerated in the form of compost.

Simply put, compost is a mixture of decomposed organic material. What's so great about compost? Compost strongly affects soil productivity; improves moisture retention; aerates and loosens the soil; increases the soil's ability to hold nutrients; provides trace elements; and controls soil erosion! But, the best part is that compost is a form of humus.

Without humus, most nutrients in soil minerals remain unavailable to plants. Humus tightens sandy soil and breaks up clay soil. Humic acid encourages root growth. The use of synthetic chemical fertilizers is the main cause of problem soil and erosion. These harsh chemicals melt down the hard-to-come-by humus in your soil.

I won't go into great detail about the how-to of composting, because I'm still experimenting with that myself. I will, however, tell you that it is a very simple and nearly cost-free process. A compost pile can be just that—a pile of wastes. If you decide to add kitchen scraps to your pile (peelings from veggies, fruit skins and rinds—no meat or processed foods), you may want to enclose your compost pile with a simple steel frame or cover it with a tarp. There are commercial composters available through most garden supply companies.

Over 500 communities across the country are now composting. France has over 100 composting plants producing 800,000 tons a year. Other European countries are exporting compost to the Arabian peninsula. Aluminum, paper, glass

and plastics get all the press while 24 million tons of leaves, grass and food scraps go to the dump unnoticed.

Compost is a free supply of organic fertilizer, soil conditioner and mulch for healthier, stronger, more disease resistant plants with better flavor, color and reproductive capacity. Perhaps Ruidoso should consider a community-wide composting project. The old airport land would be an ideal site for this. A composting plant would supply jobs, supply a means for residents to recycle their yard wastes, and everyone in the community could share in the profits not only monetarily, but through the enriched drought-resistant soil we could all have. This could lead to an organic farming project which could also be incorporated onto the airport land. Talk about putting Ruidoso on the map! The recent boycott of apples and an escalating concern over pesticides on our food in this country has brought us some inevitable conclusions. Most of us would rather buy chemical-free, organically grown food and so would the rest of the people in the country. The shortage of organic

farmers has made organic farming the fastest growing industry at this time!

Through organic intensive farming and the sale of our compost to other communities and states imagine the income and potential for future growth Ruidoso would have. Perhaps it wouldn't initially bring a flood of people to Ruidoso, but the margin of profit from a compost plant would be enormous. Every household in this town could contribute wastes and share in the profits. That would put money in everyone's pockets and we would all have the satisfaction of knowing we were contributing to the enrichment of the earth and the prevention of soil erosion, water contamination and overflowing landfills.

If nothing else, maybe we could combine our composting facility with the proposed golf course. Ruidoso's claim to fame could be "The World's Only Organic Golf Course."

Gasoline Prices...
...Are hitting \$1.35 per gallon for unleaded—\$1.25 at the self-serve islands—in the City Different. We're always higher than anyone else in New Mexico "because of the tourist trade," the local retailers blandly explain.

Geeking tourists is apparently so acceptable in Santa Fe that one

can admit to it cheerfully. It's kinda hard on us non-tourists, too...

We can't gripe too much about the gasoline prices, although there is the sneaking suspicion that they needn't be quite so high—and a lingering curiosity about why gas prices are always higher in oil-producing New Mexico than in Vermont, say, or Massachusetts.

The American Petroleum Institute says the price increases are not due so much to the Exxon spill as to the restrictions on production that OPEC established last fall. The API can't explain, though, why our gasoline is so much more expensive than that sold in the northeast.

They talk about shipping costs in the vast distances of the West, but that's baloney. We have refineries right here in the state.

I personally think it's a matter of volume. Where you've got lots of customers concentrated in a single area, you're going to lower the prices...

Of Course, a Cynic...
...And I feel cynical today, might say New Mexicans don't die of heart attacks because we don't live long enough to develop bad hearts.

I realize that some New Mexicans do have heart disease, and I'm not trivializing or being flip about their illnesses.

Nevertheless, I may have a point here. Think about it. We have the highest rate of traffic fatalities per capita in the country, after all. And a rate of alcohol-related deaths—accidents, violence, illness—that is six times the national average...




