Power Train makes a whistle stop at Ruidoso Downs Racetrack finish line

Power Train, who suffered from a virus as recently as two weeks ago, won the Grade I \$357,172 Kansas Futurity Sunday at Ruidoso Downs in the first jewel of the Quarter Horse two-year-old Triple Crown.

Attendance and handle continued their upward trend with Sunday's attendance of 4212 up over 17% from 1988's figure of 3577 and handle of \$442,322 up over 20% from the last year's \$366,919. Power Train, owned by Phenix

Shaw and Sylvia Shaw Pitman of Jacksonville, Florida, won by a head. Strawberry Silk, who went as the 4-5 favorite, was second by a nose. Third place went to Deadly Dart, who was third by a nose. Power Train, who was the tenth

and final qualifier for the Kansas Futurity, broke from the outside in the tenth post position. It was the first Kansas Futurity win for all of the connections. Power Train was

State plans to widen Mechem Drive

The widening of Highway 48 to four lanes was the subject of several meetings Thursday and Friday in Ruidoso.

Consulting engineers for the State Highway and Transportation Department were in town to brief city officials and local landowners about the highway project.

Leroy Givens, managing engineer of Boyle Engineering of Albuquerque, told village officials the project will be accomplished in two phases. Phase one calls for the four-lane reconstruction of Highway 48 from New Mexico Highway 532 (Ski Run Road) to White

Mountain Drive. Phase two will be the widening of the roadway from White Mountain Drive to Sudderth Drive.

The \$2 million in funds for phase one were approved by the New Mexico Highway Commission in January. Givens said bids for construction will probably begin in March or April of 1990.

Givens said each phase of the construction has two designs. They are known as S-1, S-2, N-1 and N-2. The S-1 and S-2 design are for the southern half of the construction and N-1 and N-2 are for the northern half.

Basically S-1 would call for the roadway to be designed to allow

traffic to flow at 35 miles per hour. The S-2 design would allow traffic to flow at 45 miles per hour. The traffic flow speeds are the same for the N-1 and N-2 designs.

Givens said in all four designs, engineers tried to follow the existing highway rights of way as much as possible. But he said with the increased speeds of the roadway, the highway would have to be straightened out, particularly in the 45 mph design. He said the N-2 design would have the most effect on property owners. He said the N-1 design would require an additional 19 acres of right of way, while the N-2 design would require 35 acres of additional right of way.

Givens said no matter which design is chosen, highway right of way personnel will be contacting property owners by the first of the year.

Givens said engineers tried to design the whole four-lane reconstruction from Sudderth to the Ski Run Road with a maximum grade of eight percent for better traffic flow. He said the current roadway has some places where there is an 11 percent grade.

According to Givens, all the designs call for four lanes of traffic from Sudderth to Ski Run Road. The southern half will have a left turn lane and the northern half will have selective turn-outs for left turns.

Police investigate apparent suicide

Ruidoso police are still investigating the apparent suicide of an Albuquerque man whose body was discovered Thursday in a residence in the Upper Canyon.

Police were called about 3:40 p.m. Thursday to 104 Summit Drive where Ruidoso resident Robert Reddy had discovered the body of 30-year-old Glenn A. Sherman of Albuquerque.

According to Ruidoso Police detective Mike Lovelace, Sherman

was last seen by Reddy on Sunday, and Sherman's roommate indicated to Reddy that Sherman was at the Summit Drive house.

The body was found lying on a bed in a downstairs bedroom of a residence belonging to Sherman's in-laws. A garbage sack was taped around Sherman's head with a hose leading from a propane hot water heater, according to police. All the windows and doors were also taped, police said. Reddy found an appar-

Mescaleros sign mining agreement


The Mescalero Apaches and Molycorp Inc. together will add a new facet to the mining industry in New Mexico through an agreement signed Friday allowing Molycorp to mine for two exotic elements on the reservation.

Molycorp will develop a deposit of yttrium and zirconium, discovered on the reservation in 1985, under a joint leasing-operating agreement, according to an Associated Press report released Sunday.

The deposit on the reservation is known to contain about 10 million pounds of yttrium and 65 million pounds of zirconium, the company said.

The process of extracting the elements will be through heap leaching rather than through deep or strip mining methods.

Approval of the operating permits, the article said, would come from the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Bureau of Land Management.



Well test results here

The test results for the Eagle Creek well field arrived last week.

The 69-page highly technical report was produced by John W. Shomaker, a geologist and hydrologist, from Albuquerque.

Village manager Frank Potter will report on the tests to the Village Council at the next meeting.

The purpose of the well tests, which were conducted in January and April of this year, was to evaluate the long-term yield of the well field, based on an independent testing of the wells using the existing equipment and without reference to earlier conclusions as to the wells' capacities.

Meanwhile, Eagle Creek water is being pumped into the village distribution system.

Mescalero logging continues

Mescalero forest logging operations, with modified work schedules and special precautions, are continuing despite fire danger warnings marked as "explosive."

Under the watchful eye of Bureau of Indian Affairs forestry officials, Mescalero loggers are operating under a "hoot owl" schedule which allows them to proceed with logging operations from 4 a.m. to noon only.

"They work in the morning with the higher humidities," supervisory presale forester Cameron Martinez said. "We also have equipment out there that can stop a fire."

Martinez said the dark hours of the morning are spent hauling the logs from the forest and the twilight hours are spent falling and skinning the trees.

On the reservation, all access has essentially been cut off to the

general public in the interest of fire safety, Martinez said.

In addition to placing fire fighting equipment near logging operations, aerial reconnaissance is flown twice daily over the Mescalero forest. Residential areas are also patrolled daily, Martinez said.

"We've got the reservation pretty well covered," he added. "If we can just hold off until the rainy season."

Extreme fire danger conditions in the Lincoln National Forest have prompted forest service officials in Lincoln County to request that loggers cease logging operations until the fire danger drops to a lower level.

Lincoln National Forest spokesman Deryl Jevons said White Sands Forest Products, the forest's major logger, is still doing some loading and hauling, but they have been requested to be out of the woods and on paved roads by 2 p.m. Trucks equipped with pumps also

follow the logging trucks to the paved roads.

"All cutting and skidding operations have been shut down," Jevons said.

Jevons said the forest service and the Mescalero reservation have taken different approaches to the problem primarily, because they are under different jurisdictions. The forest service operates under the Department of Agriculture while the forestry in Mescalero and the Bureau of Indian Affairs is governed by the Department of Interior.

"I'm sure they've got some experts over there that have made those decisions," Jevons said. "We all do stuff slightly different, but each one is trying to evaluate our situation and come up with something that will protect the woods but still allow the industry to still do some logging."



A Power Train triumph

Twin-Tri passes the \$45,000 mark

The Twin-Trifecta carryover pool grew Friday to \$45,859. The wager requires fans to select the 1-2-3 in two consecutive races, the third and fourth races. The carryover is the largest this season.

Trials for the Rainbow Silver Cup and the Norgor Derby were held Friday in front of a crowd of 2,270 who wagered \$204,585.

Dash For Speed, who won the Go Together Handicap on May 21, continued her 1989 two-race winning streak in the first division of the Rainbow Silver Cup trials. She won by two and 3/4 lengths in the 440-yard time of 21.625 seconds.

Meddlin Dash, who was third in the Mr Jet Moore Allowance Stake on May 13, was second. Third place went to Eternal Syndrome. The top three finishers in the first trial earned berths in the final. Trainer Larry Keiter was impressed with Dash For Speed's performance.

"When she outruns these horses, that's real good," said Keiter, who won the Kansas Derby, the Rainbow Derby and the All American Derby with this horse in 1988.

Reverend Jonah Black won the second trial with a time of 21.805 seconds. It was his 1989 debut. In 1988, Reverend Jonah Black won the Higheasterjet Handicap and was second in the Rainbow Derby at Ruidoso Downs. Brooks thinks the horse will run well in his four-year-old year.

"I had a lot of problems with him as a two-year-old, so we operated on him," said Brooks. "I won over \$100,000 with him as a three-year-old. So, I've got high hopes for him this year."

Second place went to Go Street Music. Mame Smashed, who won the 1988 World's Championship Quarter Horse Classic, was third. The top three finishers in the second trial earned berths in the final.

The third and final trial went to Wicked Dash, who stopped the clock in 21.615, the fastest time of the day. Wicked Dash won the 1988 Horseman's Quarter Horse Racing Association Classic Championship Invitational and the Breeders' Distaff Classic at Los Alamitos. She was second in the Champion of Champions at Los Alamitos and was third in the Kansas Derby at Ruidoso Downs. Trainer C. Dwayne Gilbreath thought the mare would win her trial.

"I'm tickled that she won," said Gilbreath. "She's been working well. I really like the time."

Im Steppin Easy was second, Rule The Sound was third and Miss Attorney was fourth. The top four finishers in the third trial earned berths in the June 11 final. The final will be worth \$112,397, with \$56,198 to the winner.

The Norgor Derby Trials were held in two divisions. Clever Leader, who won the 1988 Norgor Futurity, ran a remarkable race. He broke behind the field, was checked behind a wall of horses on the turn, was sixth entering the

stretch, and rallied to win by a nose. The time for the six furlongs was 1:12 4/5.

"I had to check him once," said winning rider Joe Martinez. "I took a hold of him and started all over. He's got a helluva kick."

It was Clever Leader's second race of the season. He was fifth in an allowance on May 21. Trainer Bill Leach said the horse has rebounded from surgery well and has a good chance for the Norgor Futurity-Norgor Derby double. The second through sixth finishers in the trials earned berths in the final. They are: Bold Warpath, Jae Ego, Bold Ego Raiser, Belle of Bluejeans, Word Is Out.

"If he stays out of trouble, and runs a good race," said Leach of Clever Leader, "he's got a good shot to win it."

Just Like Lace won the second Norgor Derby trial in 1:11. She has won two stakes races this season: the Las Cruces Handicap at Sunland Park and the Las Senoritas Handicap at Albuquerque. Just Like Lace was hand-ridden to victory by Joe Martinez.

"We expect her to run well in the final," said trainer T.E. Davidson. "She grabbed a quarter and didn't run well in the Riley Allison Derby, but we don't have any problems now."

The other qualifiers in the second trial are: Gent Away, Legal Ego, Southern Doyle, Special Royalty, Asymmetrical Angel.





Ruidoso schools sports year fat with memories

Graduation's over, school's out and there's nothing left of Ruidoso High School's 1989 sports program but a long list of great memories.

Cross Country—The Ruidoso Warriors Girls Cross Country Team in their first year of competition won the District 3-AAA championship at Las Cruces. Joelyn Comanche, Ardena Comanche and Luisa Tam starred. Joelyn Comanche was the district 3-AAA champion and placed fifth out of 104 of the states top runners.

Alden Torres was named Most Valuable Runner for cross country boys. Torres was the runner who severely cut his foot within the first quarter of a mile in the state race, but continued to run two and one half miles to finish. The cut required six stitches.

Out of school at the time, Rick Evans was winning the Men's Class A singles of the Fourth Anniversary

Racquetball Tournament sponsored by the Ruidoso Athletic Club.

Football—Perhaps the greatest single game ever played in Ruidoso, the outmanned Warriors rode the winds of a blizzard and the heroics of a dozen players to upset the state's most powerful team, Goddard, and win a berth in the state finals 24-21. It all began with an astonishing 72-yard kickoff return by Dusty Beavers in six-inch deep snow and ended on the final play of the game, a 34-yard field goal that split the uprights by Micah Whitlock. The Warriors had lost to the same Goddard team early in the season 38-0.

Michael Swanner won the year's Golden Helmet Award. Kenny Trapp won the Most Valuable Player.

Basketball—First year coach Jody Hopkins molds a fledgling basketball squad with raw talent into a strong basketball team and

an even stronger program that elevates the school to be a future power.

Volleyball—Star center Jennifer Jimenez was the only Warrior to be selected all-state and all-star in volleyball.

The Under-10 boys Ruidoso Road Warrior Soccer Team completed its season undefeated in the Alamogordo Soccer League. The Road Warriors were 10-0.

McCabe Turner becomes the first Warrior to win the state Class AAA wrestling championship.

Through the hard work of Tim Wishard and Scott Schrader, little league basketball for boys and girls flourished. The four champions were: Parsons Mechanical girls of the fourth and fifth grade, Rainbow Carpet girls sixth and seventh grade; Western Auto fourth and fifth grade boys and K-Bobs sixth and seventh grade boys.

The Ruidoso Warriors basketball squad, stumbling for most of the season, put together a dramatic last game against a heavily favored Silver City, losing in the final 15 seconds 67-63.

Outside of school, adult basketball was experiencing some great games at the White Mountain gym. A team named the Chiefs won it all.

Golf—It was the first time the entire Ruidoso team qualified for the right to play in the state. The competing team was Chris Long,

Nathan Baudo, Ron Sanders, Toby O'Neil and Eric Eggleston.

Outside of school, Reeves McGuire won the first ever Ruidoso City Golf Championship and in the same event, Scott Schrader won a new pickup when heaced the 13th hole.

Tennis—Mike Crocker's girl netters win the district. The Ruidoso girls tennis squad was the first team to defeat the Roswell Goddard netters since Goddard started playing tennis.

Track—The most spectacular accomplishment of any Ruidoso athlete this year has to go to Ardena Comanche who knocked eight seconds off of her previous best 800-meter run, and she did it by winning the state meet.

Ira Sago was the best consistent boys runner and won the state 800-meters by breaking the two-minute barrier for the first time.

There were dozens of personal hero stories on Ronny Maskew's personality filled track team.



ent suicide note, citing possible marital problems, on a table next to the bed, according to police. Sherman had been separated from his wife for quite awhile, police said.

Senior deputy medical investigator Dave Pfeiffer of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department pronounced Sherman dead at 4 p.m. Thursday.

According to Lovelace, the gas was still on when police arrived at the residence. Police and personnel from LaGrone Funeral Home had to let the house air out before they removed the body. The body was already starting to decompose, and Lovelace said he believed the body had been in the house for about 72 hours before it was discovered.

According to police, Sherman, who owned his own company in Albuquerque and was a contract writer for the Michael Martin Murphy concert, broke into the house through a back door. He reportedly ordered a pizza from Domino's Pizza around 2:41 p.m. on Monday afternoon. Police said Sherman was seen alive on Monday afternoon by another witness.

Sherman's friends told police he gave no indication to anyone he might want to kill himself.

The body was sent to the Office of Medical Investigation at the University of New Mexico's School of Medicine in Albuquerque, where a toxicology test will be performed. Deputy Pfeiffer said it will be two or three weeks before the results of an autopsy will be known.

Dry conditions endanger forest

Lincoln National Forest has officially banned all fires in the forest because of tinder dry conditions, according to Deryl Jevons, forest information officer.

Jevons said the ban includes campfires, charcoal broilers, wood and coal stoves within and outside of campgrounds.

Cook stoves or heating devices using kerosene or gas will be allowed. Smoking restrictions remain in effect.

Smoking is permitted only inside vehicles, in developed recreation sites or in areas cleared for flammable materials.

Jevons said the ban was necessary due to extremely dry conditions that have increased the potential for a wild fire.

The latest fire occurrence was May 31, five miles south of Bent. The fire started from an abandoned campfire and consumed 15 acres. Sixty forest service and Bureau of Indian Affairs firefighters fought the blaze.

Air tankers from Alamogordo dropped nearly 9,000 gallons of fire retardant on the fires.

Capitan applies for landfill permit

The Village of Capitan has applied for a permit to continue operating its landfill; and a community recycling drive is under consideration.

Village officials estimate the cost to bring its landfill under full compliance with new state regulations at \$69,000, said Dan Davenport of the village water/wastewater department.

A grid map of the site, which has been in operation since 1968, was completed, and a new form was developed to monitor what comes in to the site, said Davenport.

The village also organized a Waste Water Committee to help implement the new regulations, and to consider Capitan's future needs. The committee includes Davenport; Wayne Hobbs, the contractor operating the landfill; and Dr. Bernhard Reimann, a Capitan resident.

Hobbs has monitored federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and state Environmental Im-

provement Division (EID) guidelines since he began operations at the Capitan landfill in 1968.

Many of the practices he adopted then, such as separating garbage according to type, are now required by the EID regulations governing the operation of landfills.

"Thanks to (Hobbs') efforts, we have a chance to meet the new criteria," said a news release issued by the Waste Water Committee.

Reimann said he feels strongly that recycling should be explored, and the village could participate in such a project.

The problems with the "nuts and bolts" of organizing a recycling drive can be overcome, said Davenport.

The process would develop slowly, and could eventually reach a point where residents would not have garbage pick-up services unless their trash was separated, said Reimann.

Municipally organized recycling can be expensive, but can also save communities money over the long

haul. "It's true there's no profit in a recycling drive, and you may even end up paying. But it's what doesn't go into your landfill that saves you money, because that saves you land, and land costs money," said Davenport.

"If nothing else, we want to inspire the residents to recycle on their own," he said.

Capitan had trouble for two days with illegal dumping during the period the Fort Stanton landfill was closed, said Davenport.

Non-village residents had left garbage at the landfill's front gate, on public roadways, and at the front gate of Hobbs' home, said Davenport.

Village officials would like to inform people the Capitan landfill is not a public facility.

"When outside entities bring in solid-waste our landfill fills up much faster than normal, drastically reducing the life expectancy of the landfill," said a news release.

Capitan's 18-acre site has a usable life span of 10 to 12 years if

only Capitan waste is accepted, said Davenport.

"We try to keep our community as environmentally stable as we can. The new regulations have been coming since the early '70s and local government is no stranger to them," said the news release.

Village officials await the application criteria from the state, which will describe the specifications for the Capitan site to comply with the new regulations.

A little luck, as well as good planning, may be involved in preparing the site to comply with regulations, acknowledged Reimann.

One of the guidelines states that a landfill site may not be located on active geological faults. The Capitan site is between two faults that run along Oso and Magado creeks on its east and west sides. These faults run to the north and meet the Capitan fault line.

The hydrological reports required to locate the acquirer have not been done, but Davenport believes this will not be a problem.

MainStreet Ruidoso to review low cost loans

Priority should be given to drawing up guidelines and minimum requirements for approving low-interest loans for business improvements for members of MainStreet Ruidoso.

This was the word from the state architect Ed Boles, who came from Santa Fe to attend a board meeting of MainStreet Ruidoso, Wednesday.

Banks allow low-interest loans, but MainStreet Ruidoso has no

written guidelines on "what's a no-no" in looking at loan applications, said board president Herb Brunell.

Board members also discussed a membership campaign and heard project manager Mary Maul report on committee appointments.

It didn't take long for an abandoned campfire to consume 15 acres of forest land on Wednesday. That moment's thoughtlessness on the part of a forest user cost, not only the loss of forest resources, but also a great deal of time and money to fight the blaze.

Lincoln National Forest officials have banned all fires in the forest because of tinder dry conditions. The ban includes campfires, charcoal broilers and wood and coal stoves with and outside of campgrounds. Smoking is permitted only inside vehicles, in developed recreation or in areas cleared of flammable materials.

We should extend those bans and that extra caution into other areas that are located anywhere near the forest or our town. It's up to each of us to be diligent in preventing a fire to destroy our forest.

With the increased potential of wildfires caused by the dry conditions, let's all heed Smokey's words, and remember that, "only you can prevent forest fires."—fj

DEAR EDITOR:

Last night our Village Council voted unanimously to propose an ordinance to lease all of the old airport land, except the few acres upon which we intend to build a civic/convention center, to a golf course developer and to a motel chain, in spite of the following:

The "concept" which was approved by MAPB provided for 20 acres of land to be set aside for recreational use of the people of Ruidoso, and this is no longer in the plans;

The "concept" which was approved by MAPB suggested that 12-15 acres be set aside for the civic center, not just the 7.2 acres now allotted in the plans;

There is no longer any easement for Warrior Drive through the property;

There have been no more public hearings on this "concept" as was promised us by MAPB at the end of the last public hearing;

There are always many people at the public meetings where this is discussed who are not in favor of the land being used in this manner;

The Airport Master Plan, which the village adopted and paid more than \$25,000 for, explicitly calls for "multiple use" of the land, and it is debatable whether this complex constitutes "multiple use";

The Airport Master Plan suggests that this land be used to create a focal point for this village, and to help stabilize and diversify the tourist-dependent nature of our local economy;

No other proposals for use of this land have been sought by either the MAPB or the Village Council;

The Economic Development Board of Lincoln County has received close to 100 inquiries responding to ads it recently placed in various newspapers from companies desirous of locating a variety of businesses on that land, businesses ranging from high-tech to assembly plants, which would require from 3-10 acres of land apiece, and which would permanently (not seasonally) employ from 10 to 500 people each;

The Village, under this lease, is giving away and is responsible to furnish to the golf course 200 acre feet of water each year;

The lease is written to provide no return to the people of Ruidoso unless the hotel room rents are over 55% annualized occupancy (no return on any other hotel services for which it will charge);

The 500-jobs figure which was bandied about quite promiscuously to obtain "concept" approval has now shrunk to 75 employees of the hotel during the season, and 15-20 employees in the off-season.

We maintain: That Ruidoso still needs to diversify and stabilize its off-season economy;

That we needn't rush headlong into approving any proposal for the use of the old airport land before considering very carefully, and with a spirit of compromise, how this asset is to be utilized to the benefit and interests of us all;

That we sell Ruidoso short by insisting it is always to be "nothing but a tourist town";

That there are other parcels of land around Ruidoso upon which to build this resort complex, including

Moon Mountain which is not conducive to multiple-use development;

That various business/educational enterprises providing yearlong, steady, remunerative employment seek to be conveniently located within the community infrastructure, whereas a resort complex can thrive on being relatively secluded, and that this choice needs to be carefully considered when suitable land is severely limited, as it is here;

That this land is so very valuable to the people of Ruidoso, and the approval of this one and only proposal is foolhardy and unfair to the people;

Our Village Council has consistently refused any compromise with its citizens who have voiced other ideas, preferences, and opinions regarding the use of this land.

Those of you in agreement with our views, please be ready to sign the petition for a negative referendum if this ordinance is passed.

I would like to take this opportunity to state my reasons for opposing the use of the old airport land as a municipal golf course.

First, a golf course is at most a seasonal employer of very few people. I propose that we look for industries that employ as many people as possible in order to halt the outflow of people from this community.

DEAR EDITOR:

I'm getting tired of your apparent attempts to discredit and ridicule those who are attempting to ensure that the citizens of Ruidoso do not get "ripped off" again by another costly project destined to benefit a few at the expense of many. In your Thursday, June 1, "On the Record..." you say you "had to wonder" why Mr. Puckett informed the Village Council that the Economic Development Corporation (EDC) had received inquiries from businesses interested in locating in Ruidoso.

Instead of insinuating that Mr. Puckett was attempting to "bolster (EDC's) request for continuing funding," you should be wondering why the EDC received all those inquiries when the Municipal Airport Planning Board (MAPB) has contended repeatedly that we must be satisfied with the golf course proposal because it's the only one they've received. Could it be that the EDC has been doing the job for which it was created, while the MAPB has not? Or could it be that this particular MAPB has been doing the job for which its members were appointed—possibly to ensure that this is the only proposal which

community.

Secondly, a golf course is not a unique commodity in this community. Four golf courses instead of three hardly seems an enticement to persons wishing to relocate or to visit our village.

Thirdly, I feel that the use of the land should be decided upon by a majority of the residents in this community. The council's approval

will be considered?

Will you be wondering in future dry years why you (and most of the other residents in Ruidoso) are doing without water while these developers are watering their beautiful golf course with the 200 acre-feet of water the Village is planning to give to the developers.

Will you be wondering why residents of Ruidoso are receiving lease payments of only \$2,000 per year, while a couple of developers are grossing millions from the use of 160 acres of prime real estate belonging to those residents? Because it is very unlikely that the hotel will ever achieve 55% annualized occupancy (and it may be unlikely that the golf course grosses over \$1.5 million per year), that's the rent the Village will receive, while its citizens are still paying for the purchase of the land.

Are you wondering how much Mr. Davies is going to pay the private owner of the land in Ruidoso Downs on which he plans to build his other new motel? I'll bet that landowner will not settle for \$2,000 per year.

There are many other aspects of this proposal and the relationships between the developers and Village

officials about which I am wondering. Frankly, Frankie, I am beginning to wonder just what your relationship with this project is.

Your editorials (such as on Thursday, June 1) create the impression that these wonderful developers plan to spend lots of their money out of the goodness of their hearts to revitalize the Ruidoso economy. If that is so, why have they not offered realistic lease terms which will give the Ruidoso residents (who are the real owners of the property) more than \$2,000 per year for use of 160 acres of their land? Sure, they're planning to spend millions in construction costs, but it will be millions of dollars of OPM (Other People's Money), which village residents may end up paying back.

Commissioners wanted to woodshed Lonsberry a bit about his inattention, and about the lapse in budget control that has pushed \$56 million worth of road projects back on the schedule.

Lonsberry apparently learned his lesson. After the meeting, he told me the list of delayed projects exists; that he, in fact, had made the delay decisions himself.

Five minutes later Lonsberry caught up with me to explain that he wouldn't be comfortable giving

me the list just yet—that, uh, the commissioners still had to review and approve it at their next meeting...

Meeting Schedules...

...Have been one source of discontent among the highway commissioners. Sounds like they've been feeling like Rodney Dangerfield where the governor is concerned.

Having Gov. Garrey Carruthers haul their chief highway administrator off to one of his traveling road shows—he calls them "Government Days"—while the commission's meeting hasn't made them feel respected.

At the April 20 commission meeting in Carlsbad, Commissioner Jack Westman of Albuquerque

made a motion that the governor "be advised that the Secretary of Transportation (Lonsberry) is also the secretary of the commission and the commission expects his attendance at commission meetings, and that if the governor wants the secretary to attend 'Government Days,' he (the governor) can schedule on days other than the scheduled meeting dates for the State Highway Commission."

After much discussion, Highway Commission Chairman Willie Ortiz of Santa Fe, ever the conciliator, suggested that if Westman would personally deliver the message to Gov. Garrey Carruthers. So much more polite than a formal, on-the-record motion.

Well, Westman agreed, but Commissioner C. Quentin Ford of Las Cruces refused to withdraw his second. So the motion was voted on -- and passed.

It obviously didn't make much impression. That was in April. At the May 18-19 meeting, the State Highway Commission was in Los Lunas.

Lonsberry, on the other hand,

The Commission Got Carruthers' Attention Finally...

...With its emergency personnel meeting last week. Word is, they were that close to demanding Lonsberry's resignation, and Lonsberry is Carruthers' man.

Afterward, press secretary Don Caviness said the governor had asked the commission and Lonsberry "to communicate better."

Some communication may have reached Carruthers, too. When I asked his aide Eddie Binder if the chief exec has agreed to be more careful about his "Government Days," Binder had the answer at tongue's tip.

"I arrange the 'Government Days' now, and I can assure you that from now on, no 'Government Day' will be scheduled on the same day as a State Highway Commission meeting," Binder told me...

Stylin' at the Middle School

The staccato rhythm of machine-gun, heavy metal guitar filled the air while boys practiced landing their aerials, launching methods, and "riding the wall."

About 30 teen-age "thrashers" turned out for the first organized skateboarding event in Ruidoso, sponsored by Jack and Linda Zornes of Bikes Unlimited, on Saturday.

The event was so successful, the Zornes are considering sponsoring an event once each month during the summer, they said.

"Now they know what each competition is like," said Jack. "Next time you're going to see routines they've worked on to fit everything in during three minutes."

Prizes were awarded to four skaters in each of two competitions, plus one overall winner, who was Chad Hairston. He won a Grosse Skate deck from Bikes Unlimited.

Points were awarded for every trick or stunt they performed during a specified time period. Skaters who relied mainly on attempting a few, but spectacular, stunts lost out to the ones who successfully per-

formed a multitude of easier tricks.

The first competition had skaters negotiating a short slalom course, hopping over a plank and attempting to land back on their board, followed by a series of "olleys", in which the skater pops his board into the air while riding it. After the olleys, the skater would go over a small ramp, and then would repeat the whole course as many times as he could in the time limit.

The second competition involved more radical tricks. The time limit was three minutes, and the skaters attempted "methods," or aerial stunts off a quarter-pipe launch which lifted them close to five feet in the air. Or the skater would perform what is called "rock-n-rollin," in which the skater stops at the crest of the launch, then reverses direction.

Some also tried "riding the wall" in which they would skate up a small ramp and onto a vertical wall, attempting to land their board successfully on the ground.

The more fantastic stunts were punctuated by others such as hand-pumps and rail slides (see the photographs for an explanation!).

Winners in the first competition were Mario Salas, first place with a \$10 gift certificate from Big Daddy's; Bryan Branch, second place with a \$5 gift certificate from Big Daddy's; Chris Sanchez, third place and a \$5 gift certificate from Western Auto; Paul Burgess, fourth place and a \$5 gift certificate from Wild West Ski Shop.

In the second competition the winners were Chad Hairston, first place and all-around winner for the most points, winning a Grosse Skate deck; Lance Roe, second place and a \$10 gift certificate from Big Daddy's; Richard Malone, third place and a skate T-shirt from Bikes Unlimited; Randy Sarguy, fourth place and a skate hat from Bikes Unlimited.

All winners received gift certificates from local restaurants in addition to their other prizes.

Certain Public Land Known as the Old Airport Site for the Development of a Golf Course and Resort Motel.

LEASE OF OLD AIRPORT PROPERTY

I. GOLF COURSE LEASE:
A. Term of Lease - the initial term of lease is fifteen (15) years with additional options of fifteen (15) years and twenty (20) years at option of Lessee. At end of lease, golf course, all facilities, and equipment revert back to municipal ownership.

III. Lessee to be responsible for all maintenance and upkeep of golf course and buildings.

IV. Lease to be contingent upon resort hotel lease.

V. Maximum green fee would be a reasonable charge arrived at after costs and revenue projections are done. Residents entitled to twenty-five percent (25%) discount on green fees; resident juniors and seniors entitled to fifty percent (50%) discount.

VI. Lease to include leasehold subordination clause.

2. RESORT MOTEL LEASE:

A. Term of Lease - fifty (50) years. At end of lease term, all improvements and equipment used therein revert back to municipal ownership.

B. Time and Manner of Payments:

II. Years 1-5 Lessee shall pay to the Village two percent (2%) of gross room revenue provided the hotel occupancy rate is sixty-five

percent (65%) or greater annualized.

III. Years 6-10 Lessee shall pay to the Village two percent (2%) of gross room revenue provided the hotel occupancy rate is fifty-five percent (55%) or greater annualized.

IV. Years 11-30 Lessee shall pay to the Village three percent (3%) of gross room revenue provided the hotel occupancy rate is fifty-five percent (55%) or greater annualized.

V. Years 31-50 Lessee shall pay to the Village four percent (4%) of gross room revenue.

C. Identity of Lessee - SWD Motels, Inc., a South Dakota corporation.

D. Additional Terms of Lease:

I. Civic Events Center with a minimum of twelve thousand (12,000) square feet will be built by Village in close proximity of resort hotel, as funding is available. Said center shall be architecturally compatible and shall be managed by the Village of Ruidoso.




