

## Dash For Speed does it again!

Dash For Speed made a strong bid for the World Champion Running Quarter Horse Sunday winning the Grade 1 \$158,443 All American Gold Cup for her 13th consecutive win at Ruidoso Downs.

The four-year-old mare by Dash For Cash is owned by Bob Blakeman of Fort Worth, and Thomas Bradbury of Byers, Colorado. She is trained by Larry Keiter, who said he was not surprised by the filly's effort.

"She's a true champion," said Keiter, who thought she should have been given the 1988 award for World Champion Running Quarter Horse. "She comes through every time we ask her. It was a disappointment to myself last year, and I think after what she's accomplished this year she deserves it."

Dash For Speed faced her toughest field of the year in the Gold Cup. She beat Cash Legacy by 1 1/4 lengths, and Such An Easy Effort finished third. Genuine Knockout, Meddlin Dash, Elans Special, Reverend Jonah Black, Calling For Cash, Ms Special Secret and Wicked Dash completed the order of finish.

Jockey Steve Fuller, who has been aboard Dash For Speed for all of her six Grade 1 wins at Ruidoso Downs, said the race was easy.

"I never did push her," he said. "I just let her run. I think she's World Champion material. She deserves it, but I'm kind of partial."

Dash For Speed's 440-yard time of 21.32 seconds was a stakes record. Keiter said the mare will be pointed to the Higheasterjet Handicap on September 2 at Ruidoso Downs or the Breeders Championship Classic at Sunland Park on October 21.

"If she's sound and she comes out of it all right, we want to run her in the Higheasterjet Handicap," said Bradbury.

The field broke well with the exception of Wicked Dash who stumbled. Dash For Speed had a half-length lead at the halfway mark, and then drew off.

"Mine got away well, and bobbled on the second jump," said James Lackey, who finished second aboard Cash Legacy. "I can't beat her. I have no excuse. We just couldn't get up to beat her."

So far in 1989, no one else has been able to either.

Dash For Speed dashes into the recordbooks again, winning the All American Gold Cup at Ruidoso Downs Race Track in 21.32. It was the 13th consecutive win for Dash For Speed at the Ruidoso

Downs facility. Blakeman and Bradbury are Ruidoso Downs owners. Dash For Speed, who is trained by Larry Keiter, Jockey Steve Fuller was aboard for the win.

## Brothers charged in money changing scam

Two brothers from Roswell were arrested Thursday by Ruidoso Police and charged in a money changing scam.

Twenty-year-old Charles Peter Bussell and his brother, 19-year-old Frank Joseph Bussell, were arrested Thursday morning when a shop owner, alerted to their scam, called police.

According to Magistrate Court records, the two intentionally misappropriated money from local businesses in a fraudulent money changing scam.

Frank Bussell, in a hearing before Magistrate Judge J.R. "Jim" Wheeler, entered a guilty plea to


four counts of fraud, a petty misdemeanor, and possession of less than one ounce of marijuana. He was sentenced to 364 days in the Lincoln County Jail, fined \$500 and ordered to make \$200 restitution to the businesses, before probation for his jail time and fine would be considered, according to court records.

Charles Bussell entered a plea of not guilty to one count of fraud under \$100, a petty misdemeanor. He was ordered held in the Lincoln County Jail awaiting trial, and was freed Friday on a \$500 bond.

Detective Lanny Maddox of the Ruidoso Police Department credits businessman Herb Brunell, who distributed flyers to merchants, for helping apprehend the pair.

## Workers seal dam

Work is currently under way to reseal the vertical joints on the Grindstone Canyon Dam.

According to John Shaw, consulting engineer for the Village of Ruidoso, the work, which began on August 8, is about 20 percent complete.

The workmen for the company, Seal-Co, Inc. of Albuquerque, have 45 days to complete the resealing of the 75 vertical joints on the dam.

The vertical control joints range from two feet in length to 100 feet in length. The joints are every 16 feet across the face of the dam and six of the joints are designed to control shrinkage and expansion in the concrete dam. Each joint is three inches deep, one and one-half inches across at its widest point and one-half inch wide at its narrowest.

Shaw said the sealing of the joints is different this time from the first time it was done when the dam was constructed in 1956. He said the workmen are preparing

the joints for the sealant better this time than last.

Workmen first use a grinding wheel to grind back the joints to sound concrete. After the dust is removed from the joint, a layer of bond breaker tape is placed inside. This is done so the sealant will not adhere to the roof of the joint, but instead adhere to the sides.

A primer is then placed over the tape and the surface of the joint. This is so any moisture in the joint is pushed back into the concrete and a good bond can be achieved.

Following the primer, a three-quarter inch layer of sealant is applied. The sealant is a two-part polysulfide. Shaw said the sealant takes about a week to dry, depending on weather conditions, and will still have a little rubbery feel when dried.

The six expansion joints will receive special treatment. After the tape and primer is applied, a one and one-fourth inch layer of sealant

## Thursday races feature top twos

A full field of ten two-year-old Quarter Horses will be the focus of attention Thursday in the \$4,400 featured allowance race. Run at 440 yards, the race is for horses that are non-winners of two races in their careers.

First post time on Thursday, Friday and Saturday is noon to accommodate the Ruidoso Horse Sales Company's sale of Quarter Horse yearlings.

Streak N Cash is the likely favorite in this race. He was a narrowly beaten fourth in the All American Futurity Trials. In his career, he is 1-for-6 with one second. He ran second, beaten a nose, in a July 13 allowance. Trained by H. Don Farris, Streak N Cash did not have a rider named at entry time, but Jerry Nicodemus has been aboard for all his career starts.

Dos Chivas, who will be ridden

by Jerry Yoakum, was fourth in his last start August 9 in the All American Futurity Trials. Perfect Signa- were a disappointment in the All American Futurity Trials. Sent as the 2/5 favorite, he finished sixth in his division. He broke his maiden in an overwhelming fashion on June 3 by 4 3/4 lengths.

On My Lad is another contender. He was narrowly beaten in the All American Futurity Trials on August 10. In his trial, he was beaten only a half length by Dela Creme Smash, who won the trial. Trainer W. Sasse did not name a rider at entry time.

Two sweet gets jockey Wes McDaniel for this feature. Trained by Arnold Simmons, he was second, beaten a head as the even-money favorite, in a July 27 allowance. He was also third in the Rainbow Futurity Consolation.



## All American Futurity trials are under way

Nine trials will run Wednesday, August 23 to determine the ten horses that will start in the Labor Day \$2 million All American Futurity. The ten fastest times earn berths in the final that will be televised live on ESPN.

Each trial will be run at 440 yards, and will be only the second time in these two-year-old Quarter Horse careers that they will have gone this distance. The top three finishers in each trial during the August 9-10 elimination trials earned berths in Wednesday's trials.

The likely favorite in the fifth race, the first trial, is Reckless Dash, who ran in the Grade I Kindergarten Futurity at Los Alamitos. He won his August 9 trial by a head.

Sun Country Futurity finalist Serve N Notice head the sixth race. Trained by Robert Turner, Serve N Notice also won his trial by a head. Turner also trains 1989 Rainbow Derby winner See Me Do It.

Kansas Futurity Consolation winner Special Show and Flomont, the Lubbock Spring Futurity winner, highlight the seventh race. They face Sweet N Special, who beat Grade I finalist Power Train and Strawfly Special in the trials.

Dela Creme Smash is trained by John Talley, and won the inaugural running of the Remington Park Futurity. In the afternoon's eighth race, she faces multiple winner Alias Luther Smith.

Two of the most impressive elimination trial winners run in the ninth race. Turn Point ran the fastest 440 yards - 21.50 seconds - on August 9, while Graham Farms Futurity winner Suena Eye returned from a four-month layoff to win an August 10 trial. Turn Point won the July 22 Olympic Festival Stakes at Remington Park.

Power Train and Strawfly Special, who lined up side by side in the elimination trials, drew each other again in the time trials. Power Train, who won the June 4 Kansas Futurity; and Strawfly Special, who was a second in the Bay Meadows Futurity, will have Rock in Alene for competition. She was a finalist in the Kansas and Sun Country Futurities.

Strawberry Silk, who won the Sun Country Futurity, and has been second in the Kansas and Rainbow Futurities, faces fellow Rainbow finalist Blinkers Comment in the eleventh race. Blinkers Comment was fourth in the Rainbow Futurity. Both horses won divisions of the elimination trials.

Do No Wrong, who finished fifth in the Sun Country Futurity; and Native Gypsies Jet, who ran ninth in the Rainbow Futurity, looks like favorites in the 12th and 13th races, respectively.

There were six \$50,000 nominations at a cost of \$50,000 to the 1989 All American Futurity. Five of those - Turn Point, Suena Eye, Serve-N Notice, Blinkers Comment, and Dela Creme Smash - earned berths in Wednesday's time trials.

The 11th through 20th best times Wednesday earn berths in the \$290,000 All American First Consolation on Labor Day; the 21st through 30th fastest times earn berths in the \$145,000 Second Consolation run September 3. The 31st through 40th earn spots in the \$65,000 Third Consolation run September 2.

## All American Futurity trials are under way

Nine trials will run Wednesday, August 23 to determine the ten horses that will start in the Labor Day \$2 million All American Futurity. The ten fastest times earned berths in the final that will be televised live on ESPN.

Each trial will be run at 440 yards, and will be only the second time in these two-year-old Quarter Horses careers that they will have gone this distance. The top three finishers in each trial during the August 9-10 elimination trials earned berths in Wednesday's trials.

The likely favorite in the fifth race, the first trial, is Rootless Dash, who ran in the Grade I Kindergarten Futurity at Los Alamitos. He won his August 9 trial by a head.

Sun Country Futurity finalist Special Show and trial winner Serve N Notice head the sixth race. Trained by Robert Turner, Serve N Notice also won his trial by a head. Turner also trains 1989 Rainbow Derby winner See Me Do It.

Kansas Futurity Consolation winner Special Show and Plonkoff, the Lubbock Spring Futurity winner, highlight the seventh race. They face Sweet N Special, who beat Grade I finalist Power Train and Strawberry Special in the trials.

Dela Creme Smash is the inaugural running of the Remington Park Futurity. In the afternoon's eighth race, she faces multiple winner Alias Luther Smith.

Two of the most impressive elimination trial winners run in the ninth race. Turn Point ran the fastest 440 yards - 21.50 seconds - on August 9, while Graham Farms Futurity winner Suena Eye

returned from a four-month layoff to win an August 10 trial. Turn Point won the July 22 Olympic Festival Stakes at Remington Park.

Power Train and Strawberry Special, who lined up side by side in the elimination trials, drew each other again in the time trials. Power Train, who won the June 4 Kansas Futurity, and Strawberry Special, who was a second in the Bay Meadows Futurity, will have Rock in the elimination trials.

Strawberry Silk, who won the Sun Country Futurity, and has been second in the Kansas and Rainbow Futurities, faces fellow Rainbow finalist Binkers Comment in the eleventh race. Binkers Comment was fourth in the Rainbow Futurity. Both horses won divisions of the elimination trials.

Do No Wrong, who finished fifth in the Sun Country Futurity, and Native Gyro Jet, who ran ninth in the Rainbow Futurity, looks like favorites in the 12th and 13th races, respectively.

There were six supplemental nominations at a cost of \$50,000 to the 1989 All American Futurity. Five of those - Turn Point, Suena Eye, Serve N Notice, Binkers Comment, and Dela Creme Smash earned berths in Wednesday's time trials.

The 11th through 20th best times Wednesday earn berths in the \$300,000 All American Futurity Consolation on Labor Day, the 21st through 30th fastest times earn berths in the \$145,000 Second Consolation run September 3. The 31st through 40th earn spots in the \$65,000 Third Consolation run September 2.

First post time on Thursday, Friday and Saturday is noon to accommodate the Ruidoso Horse Sales Company's sale of Quarter Horse yearlings.



## All American Futurity trials are under way

Nine trials will run Wednesday, August 23 to determine the ten horses that will start in the Labor Day \$2 million All American Futurity. The ten fastest times earn berths in the final that will be televised live on ESPN.

Each trial will be run at 440 yards, and will be only the second time in these two-year-old Quarter Horse careers that they will have gone this distance. The top three finishers in each trial during the August 9-10 elimination trials earned berths in Wednesday's trials.

The likely favorite in the fifth race, the first trial, is Reckless Dash, who ran in the Grade I Kindergarten Futurity at Los Alamitos. He won his August 9 trial by a head.

Kansas Futurity Consolation winner Special Show and Flomont, the Lubbock Spring Futurity winner, highlight the seventh race. They face Sweet N Special, who beat Grade I finalists Power Train and Strawfly Special in the trials.

Dela Creme Smash is trained by John Talley, and won the inaugural running of the Remington Park Futurity. In the afternoon's eighth race, she faces multiple winner Alias Luther Smith.

Two of the most impressive elimination trial winners run in the ninth race. Turn Point ran the fastest 440 yards - 21.50 seconds - on August 9, while Graham Farms Futurity winner Suena Eye returned from a four-month layoff to win an August 10 trial. Turn Point won the July 22 Olympic Festival Stakes at Remington Park.

Power Train and Strawfly Special, who lined up side by side in the elimination trials, drew each other again in the time trials. Power Train, who won the June 4 Kansas Futurity; and Strawfly Special, who was a second in the Bay Meadows Futurity, will have Rock-in-Alema for competition. She was a finalist in the Kansas and Sun Country Futurities.

Strawberry Silk, who won the Sun Country Futurity, and has been second in the Kansas and Rainbow Futurities, faces fellow Rainbow finalist Blinkers Comment in the eleventh race. Blinkers Comment was fourth in the Rainbow Futurity. Both horses won divisions of the elimination trials.

Do No Wrong, who finished fifth in the Sun Country Futurity; and Native Gypsies Jet, who ran ninth in the Rainbow Futurity, looks like favorites in the 12th and 13th races, respectively.

There were six supplemental nominations at a cost of \$50,000 to the 1989 All American Futurity. Five of those - Turn Point, Suena Eye, Serve N Notice, Blinkers Comment, and Dela Creme Smash - earned berths in Wednesday's time trials.

The 11th through 20th best times Wednesday earn berths in the \$290,000 All American First Consolation on Labor Day; the 21st through 30th fastest times earn berths in the \$145,000 Second Consolation on Labor Day; the 31st through 40th earn spots in the \$65,000 Third Consolation on September 2.



Rick Ragsdale's 65-yard scamp left Red Devils in the dust. Did any-

one know Ragsdale could run that fast?

Manny Guardiola, chased out of the pocket, hit Jamie Candelaria in the end and zone with a perfect bullet. Candelaria made a sensational catch between three defenders.

Big James Gieb cracked the helmet off a Sundevis and then ran off the field complaining he wasn't playing good enough.

R.J. Darden put some punishing hits on their best runner, Rick Branch. So did James Atwood.

"Dickinson has accepted the role of leader on the line," Ragsdale said. "When David does well, the whole line will do well. That was especially evident in the last part of scrimmage when our offensive line kept rolling them back five yards."


Ragsdale looks upon Zach Chavez, a player who makes very few mistakes, as a stabilizing force on the squad.

# Record keeping is a big job at LCMC

Each area at Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) has something new from the building renovation project, and the medical records department is no different.

New, mobile shelves that slide on two tracks have the capability to store up to ten years of medical records, which amounts to about 17,000 individual in-patient records, said Linda Brown, director of medical records at LCMC.

From the moment a patient is admitted, to the time of discharge, notations are made regarding progress, treatment provided, medications given, and medical histories documented, and it is the job of Brown's department to collate and store these records.

With the help of two transcriptionists, a clerk, and a social worker, Brown's department handles third party payments for insurance companies, as well as placement services for certain kinds of patients, and the "Swing Bed Program."

The Swing Bed Programs, started six years ago,

enable certain patients to stay longer in the hospital and still receive paid treatment, said Brown.

The program is used frequently with hip fractures, but is available in any situation when, after acute care has been provided, specialized follow-up care is necessary, said Brown.

When primary care is complete, the patient's status is changed to a different level of care, which allows for third party payments to continue.

Social Worker Betty Testerman plays a large role in the program, as well as making contacts and placements for those patients who may need nursing home care after their stay at LCMC.

Testerman also handles utilization review, and discharge planning.

"She's my right hand," said Brown. The new records department is larger and more isolated than its previous location, said Brown.

"There's no comparison," she said.

Hospital mail boxes were located in the old area, which accounted for a large amount of traffic in the office that was unrelated to the record keeping, she said.

"We can accomplish much more now," said Brown. The major benefit a patient receives from Brown's department is an individual's records are kept at LCMC for ten years after a stay.

Should a patient arrive to the emergency room unconscious, and the attending physician is unfamiliar with the patient, the record department can make the patient's records available to the physician if that patient had a previous stay at LCMC, said Brown.

The record would indicate past treatment, a medical history, and any allergies to medication, as well as any unusual medical conditions, she said.

Just like the other medical personnel at LCMC, staff in the records department are on call, and sometimes must come in at late hours to retrieve records requested by physicians.

Random reviews of the record keeping are conducted on a frequent basis, and any record that falls out of the screening procedure immediately goes to review by a committee, said Brown.

Other requests for records can be made by insurance companies, and also for court proceedings, said Brown.

Though the records themselves are the property of LCMC, the information they contain belongs to the patient, and an individual has the right to see what the records contain, said Brown.

Information is not released without proper authorization and proof of identity.

"Records are not filed and then forgotten," said Brown.

The department is always busy calling up records

for various requests, as well as collating new ones.

The record department is also the one that copies any records available for patient transfers.

Brown has been at LCMC since May of 1973. She came from the hospital in Artesia, and was transferred here through Southwest Community Health Services (SCHS), the parent corporation for LCMC.

Debra Paden, a transcriptionist, also was transferred from Artesia this past May.

SCHS operates a network of 11 hospitals and one nursing home in New Mexico, and one hospital in Colorado.

When one facility needs consultation, the network provides the help.

"If we have a problem, we do have the support from the system," said Brown.

Brown and Paden will soon be going to Lovington to provide consultation and assistance there, but they are not leaving LCMC permanently.

Other personnel in the department are Angel Perry, clerk/transcriptionist, and Lydia Newman, a half-time transcriptionist.

## Rules defined on sales tax

Anyone, New Mexico resident or out-of-state visitor, who walks into a store or shop in Ruidoso or Lincoln County and buys and pays for merchandise, on the spot, must pay a gross receipts tax.

In Ruidoso, that tax is 6.5 percent.

Carolyn Hutchinson, supervisor of the Tax Information Section, New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department, explains that three criteria determine whether or not a tax is due.

The tax need not be paid if the three following conditions are met:

1. The merchandise is sold to a non-resident of New Mexico.
2. Title must pass to the buyer outside of New Mexico. Generally, title passes when payment is made in full.
3. Risk of loss must pass to the buyer outside of New Mexico.

Risk of loss, Hutchinson said, will stay with the seller if the seller arranges for shipping to out-of-state.

If the merchandise is picked up by the buyer in New Mexico, the tax is due.

If payment is made through the mail from an out-of-state address, the transaction meets the criteria for non-payment.

Catalog sales, when payment is made by mail, meet the three criteria, Hutchinson said.



# Hospital remodel project is delayed

The completion date for the hospital renovation program has been moved again to sometime in September.

"I want everyone to know that we could have had it done by now, but it would not have met our standards," said Steve Keller, hospital administrator at Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC).

The announcement of a new completion date was made during a regular meeting of the LCMC Board of Trustees Thursday.

The completion of the new board room was delayed because of a disagreement between the contractor and some sub-contractors, said Keller.

Several projects in the renovation program needed to be redone at the contractor's expense because they were not done correctly, said Keller.

For example, the wallpaper in the lobby will have to be redone, and in one area, a concrete floor was poured lower than the floor in the adjacent room, requiring some alterations.

Keller said the contractor complied with the requests without problems.

The contractor is John Cornell of Clovis, New Mexico.

The board formally presented two Capitan students with medical scholarships, each for \$500.

Randy Barone and Michael Shanks each received the scholarship, which is renewable each year based on their academic performance and their enrollment in a medical program.

Barone will be attending New Mexico Tech in Socorro, and is considering dentistry.

He said he was very thankful the board even considered both he and Shanks for the scholarships.

"The burden financially in college is very rough," said Barone.

Shanks completed one year already at Abilene Christian, where graduates have a more than 90 percent acceptance rate into medical school, he said.

"I probably would not be going there (Abilene Christian) without scholarship help," said Shanks.

The college sophomore said tuition costs at Abilene Christian are \$189 per credit hour.

Trustee James Sanchez told the students they were an example for the rest of the students throughout the county.

He also requested for the board the students send their report cards

at the end of the year.

In the financial report, Keller said LCMC experienced a good month during July.

Excess revenues for the month were \$16,026. In July of 1988, LCMC had a deficit of \$80,629.

For the four months of the fiscal year, LCMC currently has a deficit of \$52,775. At this time in 1988, there was an excess of \$52,370.

Keller noted the salary line item for July reflected an increase in wages for personnel.

Followup information on the interest from the mill levy was given during the meeting.

The board requested a letter be sent to the Lincoln County Commission asking why interest from the hospital mill levy was put into the general fund, and not into the hospital fund.

Commission Chairman Robert E. Hemphill, who is also an LCMC trustee, said the commission was in possession of the letter, but could not give an answer at that time.

Hemphill said it was being researched when the interest was first diverted into the general fund, because the decision to place the interest there was not made by the present commission.

County treasurer Shirley Goodloe was on vacation, said Hemphill, and the commission is waiting for her return to help with the investigation.

Hemphill also noted that previous commissioners did not know when the interest started to go into the general fund.

The law regarding the interest monies is very vague and contains no clear directions on where the funds should go, said Dub Williams, president of the board.

Keller said LCMC administrators are working closely with the county commission to clear up the contract questions for Ernie Gonzales, the physicians assistant (PA) for the Carrizozo Health Clinic (CHC).

Gonzales has gone to Atlanta, Georgia, to obtain information requested by the county commission from his previous employer.

Hemphill said some of the information was already in hand, but the county was still waiting for more.

Apparently some of the information was lost in the mail, and is now being sent certified mail, said Keller.

Keller hopes the situation will be settled quickly in order to keep Gonzales at CHC.

Physician recruitment is still

continuing, though this is a difficult time of year to obtain doctors, said Keller.

Most residencies are completed on June 30 each year, and the physicians make up their minds where they wish to practice generally by the prior January, said Dr. William Harrison, chief of staff.

"We found out we're probably going to be needing a surgeon," said Keller.

Keller introduced Dr. Herbert Rubin to the board, a surgeon from Tallahassee, Florida, who may be interested in coming to Ruidoso.

Board member Sally Avery asked how recruitment efforts were going for a doctor of internal medicine, a question she has raised during the last three board meetings.

Official recruitment efforts did not begin until three weeks ago, because it was not officially known until then the internist was leaving, said Keller.

Dr. Lance W. Kirkegaard, a doctor of internal medicine, recently announced his intentions to leave Ruidoso.

Kirkegaard has been very critical of LCMC policies, though he cited as his primary reason for leaving a desire for more time with his family.

Southwest Community Health Services (SCHS) provides a great deal of help to LCMC with physician recruitment, and maintains contact with various recruiting firms.

Avery asked Keller if the hospital administration did their own recruitment, or relied solely on SCHS and the recruiting firms.

Keller said prospects come either from direct contact with the physicians, or they are referred by the recruiting firms.

When a good prospect is identified, the doctor is sent a packet and videotape of Lincoln County, said Keller.

Rubin initially contacted Fort Stanton Hospital and Training Center and spoke to Dr. Roger Beechie, an LCMC board member.

Beechie referred Rubin to LCMC to speak with Keller.

Keller said recruitment efforts are directed toward doctors certified by their particular specialty board.

Dawn Kaitfors, nursing administrator, reported two more nurses were hired; one for the emergency room, and one obstetric.

Nursing recruitment efforts are ongoing, said Kaitfors.

Williams said efforts are still being made at improving emer-

gency room (ER) coverage.

"It cannot be done overnight," he said.

Williams also said the hospital recruiter told him the ERs in other hospitals in communities of similar size are covered in the same way.

"We're getting deluged with patients this year," said Keller.

He noted the bugs are still being worked out of the new system of coverage.

Keller also said Nancy Guck, PA, has been doing very well, and the possibility exists for another PA to help fill in some coverage gaps.

"We will continue to pursue this thorn," said Williams.

Inez Tanner reported the Auxiliary to date has spent \$42,583.69 on equipment for LCMC.

Income was in excess of \$9,000 from both the Thrift Shop and the Pink Shop, said Tanner.

Tanner also reported this was her last meeting with the LCMC Board of Trustees, as her term as Auxiliary President is ending.

Emadair Jones will be the new Auxiliary president.

In other business, the LCMC board of trustees:

—Accepted a report from the evaluation committee. The evaluation form will be distributed to all board members to fill out.

—Approved the credentials of Dr. John Clough, a Medicus physician.

—Heard a quality management report which indicated compliance ratings at 87 percent or more.

—Conducted a closed session on personnel matters. No action was taken.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. September 21.

## El Paso man dies in truck crash

An El Paso man was killed early Thursday morning when his semi-truck went off the roadway on U.S. Highway 70 and struck a building.

Thirty-four-year-old Burl Dale Clark Jr. was pronounced dead at the scene by Deputy Medical Investigator Frank Sisneros.

According to State Police

reports, Clark was eastbound on Highway 70 early Thursday morning when he apparently fell asleep.

The semi-truck and trailer left the southbound side of the roadway and went down a 15 foot embankment and then collided with the highway right-of-way. After going down another small embankment, the semi-truck traveled 400 feet through an open field, across a five

foot ditch and collided with the west wall of the old Guadalupe Church, located on Lincoln County Road B-18.

The semi-truck continued on out the south wall of the building and came to rest 60 feet away. Clark was pinned inside the vehicle with his seatbelt still on.

According to the property owner Martin Torrez of Roswell the build-


ing had not been used as a church for several years and was currently being used for storage.

The semi-truck was carrying frozen meat and State Police were called back to the scene to stop people from removing the meat from the truck.

State Police Officer Steve Standridge was the investigator.

is layed in the joint. Another layer of tape is placed on top of that and then a final three-quarter inch of sealant.

According to Shaw, the dam was sealed the first time with a polyurethane sealant which is not designed to be submerged and was not designed to withstand the amount of water pressure at the base of the dam.

Other factors Shaw said which contributed to the first sealant not working was the concrete surface preparations and it appeared the sealant was applied under wet conditions and not to the proper thickness. He also said the sealant was exposed to the ultra violet rays of the sun, which deteriorates

polyurethane, for 18 months before the dam was filled.

Once the vertical joint sealing is complete, Shaw and village employees will place a layer of bentonite along the base of the dam. Bentonite is a high swelling clay which is impervious to water. It will be used to seal the base of the dam from leaks.

Shaw said resealing the dam will not stop all the leaks.

"All dams leak," he said. But he added, the resealing will stop the vast majority of the leaks.

He said the overall structure of the dam is sound and in good shape.

"No engineer has ever questioned the structural integrity of this dam," Shaw said.

## EDITORIAL

In a democracy people have many opportunities to speak ... many chances to have an impact on the future of towns, states and the nation. That's good.

The negative referendum petition over the golf course/hotel/civic center/performing arts center project is a good example of grass roots democracy. Some citizens had concerns over the Village Council decision, and responded by circulating a petition to prompt an election over the proposed lease. We would be the first to stand up for every citizen's right, and even obligation, to take action over such issues.

And the petitioners were successful, acquiring even more than the requisite number of signatures to take the matter to the people for a vote.

Meanwhile, even as the petitions were being signed and circulated, compromises were being made, and the issue was changing. Developers and others have responded to the concerns voiced by many who signed the petition, by adding a biking/hiking trail to the plan. That answers the concerns of some who said they wanted some of the land reserved for the people to use.

For years Ruidoso residents have said the village needs a theater or an amphitheatre. Those items, too, have been added to the entire package, with an \$8 to \$10 million donation by philanthropists A.N. and Jackie Spencer.

Village administrators are working with the State Engineer's Office in Santa Fe over the issue of water for the golf course. That complicated issue will be thoroughly investigated before the final lease agreement is signed.

With all the negotiations and compromises that have gone into this \$20 million economic development project, some people who signed the petition may wish they hadn't. The new package is more in keeping with the airport master plan, with its multi-purpose uses.

While the people always have the right to speak, in this case, the election will set the badly needed project back by as much as a year. Work was scheduled to begin in September and the golf course/hotel/civic center/performing arts center were to open in May or June of 1991. With an election no sooner than November, the opening could be delayed until 1992.

Since the majority of the people seem to favor the entire package, we would urge anyone who signed the petition before the compromises were made, or anyone who has had a change of heart, to go to village clerk Tammie Maddox's office and remove their name.

"People may withdraw their names from a petition at any time prior to final action of the calling of a special election thereon," explained village attorney John Underwood, quoting from New Mexico case law. This can be done through a petition or by appearing in person at Village Hall and signing a statement to that effect.

Underwood explained that Maddox has until August 28 to certify to names on the petition, and the council has 14 days after that to adopt the election resolution. Final action could take place as late as September 11, and names can be removed from the petition until that time.

If, for whatever reason, you want to see the \$20 million golf course/hotel/civic center/performing arts center/fitness trails project back on track, and you want to remove your name from the petition, it's not too late.—fj

## RHS GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Since RHS is undergoing a transition  
period of increased graduation require-  
ments to merge with a seven period  
day, there are different requirements  
for grade level classifications for each  
graduation class. They are as follows:

Class of 1990: 9th-promotion from  
8th grade. 10th-6 credits. 11th-12  
credits. 12th-18 credits. Graduate-24  
credits.

Class of 1991: 9th-promotion from  
8th grade. 10th-6 credits. 11th-12  
credits. 12th-19 credits. Graduate-25  
credits.

Class of 1992: 9th-promotion from  
8th grade. 10th-6 credits. 11th-13  
credits. 12th-20 credits. Graduate-26  
credits.

Class of 1993: 9th-promotion from  
8th grade. 10th-7 credits. 11th-14  
credits. 12th-21 credits. Graduate-27  
credits.

There may be some question as to  
why there are differences. The answer  
is "to meet new state and local require-  
ments for graduation". Careful consid-  
eration has been given. There should be  
no hardship placed on any student be-  
cause they can gain an additional credit  
each year since we are now on a seven  
period schedule.

## RUIDOSO SCHOOLS ATTENDANCE POLICY

The Ruidoso School District is com-  
mitted to excellence in education. Every  
student will have an equal opportunity  
to receive a sound educational program.  
As a District we believe that regular  
school attendance has been shown to be  
the first necessity for success in school.  
Maximum learning cannot occur if a  
child is not in class. Therefore, it is the  
responsibility of the parent and the stu-  
dent to hold absences to a minimum.

**General Policy:** A student may have  
no more than 10 absences per semester.  
When a student has six absences  
his/her parents will be notified. The

parents will be notified again on the  
10th absence. Should an 11th absence  
occur, the parent may be referred to the  
Juvenile Probation Office for violating  
Article XII, Section 5 of the New Mexico  
Children's Code, or Section 10-4-4 of the  
Mescalero Apache Tribal Code.

**Notification to Schools:** Phone calls  
are not accepted. A student must bring  
a note either the first or second day  
back. All parental notes are acceptable  
to matter what the reason for the ab-  
sence. Absences will be "explained" or  
"unexplained." We do not "excuse" stu-  
dents, therefore every absence will  
count toward the limit of 10. All notes  
will be kept on file and will remain with  
the school for a period of 30 days follow-  
ing the end of the semester.

**Consequences:** After missing the es-  
tablished number of days, the student  
will lose credit or be considered for  
retention, depending on the grade level.  
The Administration may grant excep-  
tions in cases of extended illness.

**Special Note:** Three (3) tardies equal  
one (1) absence. School trips or ac-  
tivities are counted as a day of at-  
tendance.

**Specific School Considerations**  
**Ruidoso High School:** Students  
should report to the office the first day  
after the absence to secure an admit  
slip. Students who bring a note as  
specified will be given an opportunity to  
do the work missed. He/She will be  
given the same number of days missed  
to turn in the make up work.

If a student fails to bring a note,

he/she will be considered unexcused,  
will not be allowed to do the make-up  
work, and will receive a "0" if grades  
were taken for those in attendance.

1. A parental conference will be re-  
quired after the sixth absence. If school  
officials have trouble getting a parental  
conference, the student may be  
suspended until such conference is ac-  
complished.

2. After eight absences, the student's  
driving privileges will be revoked. A  
student who continues to drive after the  
eighth absence may be suspended from  
school.

3. After the 10th absence, credit is  
lost automatically. Appeals may be  
made to the principal (only) and must  
be made within 30 days of the end of  
the semester. These appeals may be  
made by either the student or the  
parent. Generally, the only reason for  
reinstatement will be extended illness.

Conditions for reinstatement may be  
set. These conditions must be met dur-  
ing the following semester. Credit not  
reinstated within one semester will  
change to an "F" on the transcript.

4. If a student continues to miss  
school after the 10th absence, he/she  
will be dropped from the rolls at the  
12th absence and will not be permitted  
to re-enroll until the following semester.

5. A committee of teachers is to be  
established yearly to hear the second  
level of appeals. They may decide to  
consider a case or they may decide to  
drop the case without a hearing.

**CHILD FIND**

Child Find is a program of Region IX designed to identify, locate, and evaluate children who are not currently

enrolled in school and who may have special needs.

The focus of Child Find is to make the public aware of the availability of special education services.

New Mexico schools are also providing services to handicapped three and four-year-olds. These children may be physically, mentally, emotionally, speech, hearing, or visually impaired.

If you know of an exceptional child, please call Likis Bowden at 258-3650.

Region IX also coordinates the Special Start Program. With the assistance of several agencies in our community, Region IX is able to offer an intervention/referral and parent training class for parents of infants, birth through two years of age.

Special Start is a program designed to flag infants who are at risk for developmental disabilities, so that their progress can be monitored. At the same time, parent training classes are offered to all families of new born infants.

**LUNCH PROGRAM**

Ruidoso Municipal Schools announced its policy for free and reduced price meals for children unable to pay the full price of meals served under the National School Lunch Program, and/or School Breakfast Program.

Each school and the office of the superintendent has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any inter-

ested party.

Children from households whose income is below levels specified by the program are eligible for either free or reduced price meals.

Application forms were sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians.

To apply for free or reduced price meals, households should fill out the application and return it to the school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the year by school or other program officials.

For school officials to determine eligibility, households receiving food stamps or Aid to Families with Dependent Children must list the child's name, their food stamp or AFDC case number, and the signature and name of an adult household member.

Households not receiving food stamps or AFDC must list the names of all household members, social security numbers of all adult members or a statement that the household member does not possess a social security number, total household income and the amount and source of the income received by each household member and the signature of an adult household member certifying that the information provided is correct.

Applications may be submitted any time during the year. Under the provisions of the policy, principals will review applications and determine

eligibility.

Parents and guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the school official may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis.

Parents and guardians wishing to make a formal appeal may make a request, either orally or written for a hearing on the decision.

In certain cases, foster children are also eligible for school meal benefits. If a household wishes to apply for benefits for foster children living with them, the household should contact the school for more information.

For complete details on the program and rules of application, please contact the superintendent's office, or the principal of the school your child attends.

**JOB TRAINING PARTNERSHIP ACT**

The Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA), was established in 1986 by the Governor's Committee on Concerns of the Handicapped. JTPA provides encouragement, training, and employment of handicapped students.




