## Hansen gets the OK to restrict RHS students to school campus

The Ruidoso Board of Education granted permission to close the high school campus, and heard a presentation on how to establish a post-secondary education program in Ruidoso during its regular meeting Wednesday.

Tom Hansen, principal at Ruidoso High School (RHS), requested the board allow him to close the high school campus as a reaction to student littering there.

Litter on the RHS campus is a continuing problem, and there is an apparent feeling among the student body the campus cannot be closed by the principal, said Hansen.

Concerned the threat of campus closure had become meaningless, Hansen requested permission by the board to close the campus for

one week with prior notice.

Hansen also requested he be allowed to re-open the campus on his own.

The board supported Hansen's request unanimously.

Hansen noted there are other responses available to him in the event the students do not take the issue of a clean campus seriously.

"The state says we only have to provide a 30-minute lunch period. They now have 50," he said.

Hansen also said Coke machines and other amenities can be removed if necessary.

The maintenance of the grounds by the school staff should also be a priority if the students are expected to comply with the administration's wish, said board member Rod.

The board also heard a presentation from Everett Frost, vice presi-

dent of planning at Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU), on options for two-year post-secondary education in Ruidoso.

Frost's presentation was similar to one made just prior to the board's meeting to members of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce (RVCC) and the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLC), said Sid Miller, superintendent of Ruidoso schools. No notice was provided to the media about that informal "pre-meeting" get-together.

Frost presented five options, noting the state Commission on Higher Education already made it clear no new programs would be established in the state.

"The commission has said it will address new needs with no new programs," he said.

One option is to establish a community college with a two-year academic and technical-vocational program.

Such an institution would be funded through the collection of tuition fees, as well as a five mill tax levy on the local community, said Frost.

Also, a \$325 to \$650 legislative appropriation could be collected from the state for each student qualifying as a full time equivalent (FTE), he said.

Another option would be a branch community college, similar to the first option, but in connection with a community college already in existence elsewhere.

Funds for this type of program would be collected from tuition, a

## Governor advocates education changes

Governor Garrey Carruthers said Thursday night, education must change to meet the times and society.

"We are in a dynamic society, the world is changing, New Mexico is changing and as a consequence, the education system has to change," he said.

Speaking at the Inn of the Mountain Gods in Mesalero, during the first night of the New Mexico First meeting on education, Carruthers said President Bush made education an issue in this country with his recent education summit.

"The president gave us something we very much need on education, he gave us a vision for what we have to do in this country," he said. "He established education as a primary issue across the United States."

The summit, conducted three weeks ago in Virginia, brought together 53 of the 55 governors from the United States and its territories.

Carruthers said education was something that everyone in America responds to.

"What else is there ... that touches each one of us besides education," he said.

Carruthers said the president and the governors brought out the fact the United States is in competition with the rest of the world to produce educated students.

"We are in a competitive environment," the governor said. "That competitive environment is principally this country against the rest of the countries for the development of bright kids who can think, be creative and innovative in an economic world."

He said, not only will we be competing with other countries, but there will be competition between states.

"We fail to establish with our kids that we are in a world," he said.

The governor told an estimated 120 people in the audience that higher expectations are the key to staying up in the competitive environment we find ourselves in.

"Another thing the president offered to us that we need, is much higher expectations of what we can do with public education," said the former New Mexico State University economics professor. "We need some performance standards, we need higher expectations, higher expectations of our parents, of our

## Santa Cops gets set for Christmas 1989

Once again it's time to gear up for Christmas, and Santa Cops is asking for help to make it a better Christmas for some people in our area.

Local organizers began meeting several weeks ago, planning this year's activities. Organizers say last year, Santa Cops was a resounding success and with the unselfish help from individuals and groups in and around Ruidoso, the group was able to provide food, toys and "little extras" to around 175 families.

This year members of the organizing committee say letters will be sent to schools and churches in the area asking for applications and recommendations for those who might need help. Individual applications may be picked up soon at both Wal-Mart and the Ruidoso

Police Station. The applications will be taken from November 11 through December 11 and all applications will be screened to assure the family is in need.

Toys will only be given to youngsters up to age 18, and adults and senior citizens will receive food items.

Organizers also say letters will soon be sent to service clubs and businesses, asking for donations of money, food or toys. They say they need a response to these letters as soon as possible in order to determine what will be needed most.

This year, Santa Cops is asking that all used clothing, except coats and toys, be donated to local churches. Santa Cops volunteers say the cleaning and handling of the used items takes up too much time. They

# Leaders urge flexibility in public education

RUIDOSO (AP)—Flexibility is the key to effectively educating students and measuring their abilities, a discussion group at a meeting on public education said.

"We need to convince principals and teachers that if they experiment and fail, it's not going to ruin (their) career or damage that kid for the rest of his life," Don Whatley, president of the Albuquerque Teachers Federation, said Friday.

Whatley was among 100 business executives, engineers, labor leaders, educators and others who

gathered here for a Town Hall meeting to tackle public education issues and to collaborate on a report for Gov. Garrey Carruthers.

The discussion group agreed that standardized tests should not be the only way educators measure what children have learned.

The four-day Town Hall meeting, which ended Sunday, was sponsored by New Mexico First, a public policy organization founded in 1986 by Senators Pete Domenici, R-N.M., and Jeff Bingaman, D-N.M.

Five groups dealt with issues and questions raised by New Mexico First members.

Santa Fe School Superintendent Eddie Ortiz said elementary schools must be able to group their children according to their skills and not just their ages.

Schools also must start giving parents some ideas about what their children should learn at home to help them before they enter kindergarten, said Charles Stockton, Alamogordo schools superintendent.

Group members agreed reading is the most important skill for young children to learn.

But Ortiz said the state has a large number of students from Spanish-speaking families and illiterate families unable to help their children in that subject and others.

And Dianne Doan, principal of Monterey Elementary School in Roswell, said more disadvantaged children should be placed in federally funded preschool programs to give them that head start.

one-mill levy tax, and \$325 legislative appropriation per FTE student.

An off-campus instructional program is another option, which is considered the most likely, said Frost.

It would require funding through tuition fees, a one-mill levy tax and a legislative appropriation per FTE student as recommended by the Commission on Higher Education (CHE).

A continuing education program, which could provide both undergraduate and graduate classes, is a fourth option.

Such a program would be self-supported, tuition fees paying the entire cost of the program, said Frost.

The fifth option is an instructional television fixed service, or talk-back television, from a sponsoring institution.

The cost of this program would be carried by the sponsoring institution through the collection of tuition fees, plus an adjustment for the service, said Frost.

In all situations, the local board of education must take the first step in the process through the request of assistance in a needs analysis made to the CHE, said Frost.

He also said off-campus instruction in connection with another institution is the only reasonable way to bring a post-secondary program into Ruidoso.

Competition for legislative funds is tremendous and will even affect those programs presently in operation, said Frost.

Because of this competition, the board should not think of Ruidoso as unique among communities and therefore a preferable site of a post-secondary program, said Frost.

"Eastern will have trouble holding their own next year," he said.

To establish any other program, the community must have an overwhelming source of funds, predominantly through mill levy taxes, for capital outlay, and must also have a demonstrably large student base, said Frost.

Discussion centered around the television option, which Frost said would be the easiest to establish.

"TV is not what they were thinking about," said Miller about the EDCLC.

A needs assessment was conducted about five years ago, but did not conclude a clear need for post-secondary education was present in Ruidoso.

"I think the economics have changed, the population has changed, and the needs have changed," said Miller. "I think we have the need (for post-secondary education). We just need to show the people and convince them."

The board appointed Adamson as a representative of the board to work in a committee with the RVCC and the EDCLC to research the project.

Test results from the 1988-89 school year were presented to the board by Karen Tillman and Denise Hawthorne.

An anticipated drop in percentile scores on the Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills (CTBS) was noted.

Publishers of the CTBS said a drop in scores would be realized because the test was renormed, said

Tillman.

Ruidoso students have consistently scored higher than the statewide averages over the years, but because of the renormed test, statewide scores were not available this year for comparison, said Tillman.

For details of the results of the CTBS and testing conducted at the high school, see the related story in today's paper.

Current enrollment in the Ruidoso School District is six students above the 40-day enrollment figure of last year, said Caron Snow, the school district's business manager.

Total enrollment for grades one through 12 is 1,663. Enrollment in kindergarten is 136, because kindergarten students attend only a half day, translates into 68 FTEs.

The enrollment figures are 28 above projected counts, said Snow.

In grades one through three, there are 507 students. In grades four through six, there are 399 students. In grades seven through 12, there are 757 students.

## Ruidoso Downs trash truck is impounded

The Village of Ruidoso Downs lost a dispute in court recently that led to the loss of a village trash truck.

According to District Court records, District Judge Richard A. Parsons entered a final judgment in favor of former Ruidoso Downs employee Edwin Cleckler in his complaint for wrongful termination against the Village of Ruidoso Downs.

Cleckler was granted a judgment of \$13,279.73, according to court records.

A writ of execution was issued on September 15, which apparently led to the impoundment of the village garbage truck.

Ruidoso Downs Mayor Jake Harris declined to comment on the case, and didn't confirm or deny that the village truck was impounded, however the truck is parked at the Lincoln County Sheriff's Sub-office.

Village attorney Richard Hawthorne was unavailable for comment early today.

The board issued a request for proposal (RFP) for an architect for the building project covered by the bond election, which passed Tuesday.

According to state statute, the specifications of the RFP must be prepared by an independent agent, which is done at no charge, said Miller.

A committee was established to review the replies to the RFP which will use an objective scoring method to select three or four firms to be presented to the board, said Miller.

The board then reviews the top scoring architect and may accept or reject the offer during negotiations. If the offer is rejected, the board then reviews the next architect in line, said Miller.

The board nominated member Lynn Willard to the building committee to review the replies to the RFPs.

The committee is made up of a board member, the principals from White Mountain Elementary and Intermediate schools and the Ruidoso Middle School, the super-

intendent, a teacher, a parent and a patron of the district.

The board also made formal approval and acceptance of the outcome of the bond election.

Presentation of the audit report was delayed until a printed copy was available.

Both Snow and Willard said the audit was good.

In other business, the board:

—Approved the review of journal transactions.

—Approved a budget increase.

—Approved a cash transfer.

—Heard a report on current construction projects from Miller.

—Accepted the recommendation to hire bus personnel, special education teacher at the high school, and cafeteria personnel.

—Accepted the resignation of Suzanne Germany, cafeteria staff.

—Approved the calendar of meetings for the board for the year 1990.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for 7 p.m. November 14.

## Test results are announced

The test results are out on Ruidoso School District students for the 1988-89 school year.

While these scores provide important information, they reflect only one dimension in measuring a student's progress, said Karen Tillman, special education coordinator for the Ruidoso School District.

The interpretation of test scores involves numerous variables which are not addressed in this article.

"I never would put credence in test scores by themselves," said Tillman.

Results from the Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills (CTBS) for third, fifth, and eighth graders indicated a drop in percentile scores for Ruidoso students over previous years.

Tillman said the drop in scores was anticipated because the test was renormed and presented in a new form. Publishers of the CTBS forewarned school districts that drops in percentile scores would occur.

Ruidoso students, in the past, consistently scored higher than the state percentile scores.

A comparison between Ruidoso students and students statewide is not possible at this time because statewide scores are not available, said Tillman. New Mexico students were part of the new normative process which can provide greater interpretive leeway with future scores, said Tillman.

The following CTBS scores are percentiles. A percentile reflects a test taker's ranking in a hypothetical group of 100 similar test takers. If a student has a percentile score of 50, it means the student's score is better than 50 other student scores in a group of 100. The highest percentile score is 99.

In reading, third graders scored in the 54th percentile for 1988-89; the language score was at the 53rd percentile; the math total score was at the 54th percentile; and the total test battery score was at the 54th percentile.

Fifth graders scored at the 53rd percentile in reading; 50th percentile in language; 66th percentile in math; and 55th percentile in the total test battery score.

Eighth graders in reading scored at the 59th percentile; language scores were at the 61st percentile; math scores were at the 54th percentile; and the battery total scores were at the 57th percentile.

Because the test was renormed, comparisons cannot be made between the grades until comparative studies are completed over time.

Test results from the high school indicate

Ruidoso students are scoring at or above national mean scores on the American College Test (ACT), and the preliminary ACT (P-ACT).

Of 52 sophomores tested, Ruidoso students had a composite score on the P-ACT of 15.9, with the national normative groups composite score being 13.0, reported Denise Hawthorne, Ruidoso High School counselor.

Scores obtained by 127 sophomores on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery were all below the test mean of 50 percent, except for the Numerical Operation subtest, which had a score of 52. Hawthorne told the Ruidoso Board of Education in her report the ASVAB scores were not a true reflection of student performance.

In the needs assessment section of the P-ACT, only 10 percent of those sophomores taking the test said they need a lot of help with written expression. Forty-two percent said they needed little or no help.

Also, only 15 percent said they needed a lot of help with reading comprehension, and 54 percent said they needed little or no help.

Sophomores tested placed the most importance on improvement of public speaking skills (40 percent said they need a lot of help) and making post-secondary plans (44 percent said they needed a lot of help).

A high percentage of the sophomores last year who took the New Mexico High School Competency Exam passed the test, with the lowest overall percent passing the English section at 86 percent.

Of all students, 93 percent passed the reading section, 86 percent passed the English section, 96 percent passed the math section, 94 percent passed the science section, and 93 percent passed the social studies section.

A student must pass the competency exam in order to receive a diploma at graduation. Those not passing receive a certificate of completion.

The test was developed two years ago by the State Department of Education.

National percentile scores for 84 juniors given the CTBS ranged from a low of 53.2 in science, to a high of 73.3 in language mechanics. The total battery percentile score was 65.7.

Fifty-six juniors took the preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) and the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test.

Total group scores for Ruidoso juniors on the PSAT were below New Mexico and national mean scores on both the verbal and math sections.

ACT scores, however, for both those seniors and juniors tested, were above New Mexico mean scores in all but one category, and about the same as the national mean scores.

students, of our faculty members, of everyone in the system. Higher expectations are the key."

He said as part of those higher expectations, the president asked the governors at the summit to help develop a series of national goals in education. He stated at this time in our country we have only one national goal in education, that is that no person will be excluded from school. He said New Mexico and other states have their own goals, but there are really not any national ones.

Carruthers said there were a number of items that he and the other governors told the president the federal government could do to help the states in education.

He said he told the president if the federal government would take total responsibility for a child's prenatal and nutritional needs until age five, and give the states a healthy, bright and alert child, the state's education system could take over. He said the development of too many children is being slowed by poor prenatal care and infant nutrition.

He said the United States needs to deregulate and be more flexible with some federal programs. He said too often federal programs are too restrictive on their uses in schools.

Carruthers said we should not ask our teachers to carry too heavy a load in trying to correct the evils of society.

"It is my belief, and the belief of many others, that we have asked our school teachers to do too many things," Carruthers said.

He said in addition to teaching their disciplines, we are now asking our teachers to teach about teen pregnancy, drug abuse and sex education. He said, why not have the social workers come in and take a load off the teachers.

Governor Carruthers said he feels it is the federal government's responsibility to develop evaluation techniques for the country.

"We need to develop better techniques for evaluating both teaching and learning," he said.

Carruthers said the government needs to redirect some research funds into the schools and the Department of Education needs to develop a data system for comparison of school funding.

He said the education system in New Mexico and throughout the country needs restructuring.

"I can tell you that of the 53 governors there, it is my sense 45 of them would say, and would agree with me, we are not interested in putting a whole lot more money into this system," he said. "We are interested in putting money in a restructured system."

Saying President Bush was big on choice, Carruthers said we need to, not only give parents the power to choose a school, but also schools the power to choose parents. He said this would bring a better connection between the parents and the schools.

"That's one aspect of choice, which is restructuring, it brings an empowerment to the parents," Carruthers said.

He said New Mexicans already have choice, but some of the laws might need cleaning up a bit. He said rich people already practice choice by buying houses in good school districts. But, he said, the same opportunity needs to be available to the poor family.

Carruthers also said the state and nation needs to develop a system to get drop-outs back in school. He said this could be done at the two-year college level. He also said senior students, if they test out, should be allowed to go directly to college instead of being bored in the classroom. He said once a student has sufficient credits, they should be granted a diploma.

He went on to tell the audience about another restructuring concept that is already being tried in Santa Fe, Tatum and Zuni, a re-learning project.

"The way you do re-learning is you make the student be the worker and the teacher be the coach," Carruthers said. "Under re-learning, the students have to participate." He said students learn more when they participate and are part of a discussion.

Carruthers also spoke to the New Mexico First audience about two specific proposals he would like to see implemented in New Mexico.

"It is my belief, we ought to extend the school day to eight hours," he said. "We have too many kids, at too young an age leaving at three o'clock and going directly to the TV set, without any parental supervision. The parents are both working, or it's a single parent and that parent is working, and we have kids for two or three hours doing nothing but watching television and that's not very productive."

Carruthers said just because the teachers quit at 3 p.m. doesn't mean the school district stops. He said teachers would not be asked to do more, but during the extra hour and one half, he suggested bringing in the social worker to talk about teen pregnancy or the soccer coach to teach kids about soccer.

"We can use that time with those kids," he said.

The governor also suggested the school year be extended in order to keep the state competitive.

"The time is here in New Mexico to have a 200-day school year," he said.


Carruthers said we are no longer an agrarian society and that many students lose knowledge over the summer. He said Japanese students go to school 243 days a year and test out in science more than our kids. The extended school year would close the unproductive gap in our school system, he said.

The governor said, besides the United States, the State of New Mexico also needs to deregulate. He said the authority needs to be returned to the local school districts and the classrooms need to be turned back over to the teachers.

"We are going to have to pay the teachers more," said Carruthers.

He said students need to be taught to think and not memorize. The private sector, he said, has to encourage people to have a good education. He stated there needs to be more incentives from the state for schools who do well. He also said we need to use more of the technology that is now available.

Governor Carruthers said he would ask for five to 10 million dollars in funds from the legislature for enhancing computers in schools. He said the schools should come up with a volunteer program to use the computers at night to teach literacy.

In closing his speech, Carruthers said New Mexico needs to work on its own state goals and establish new ones.

"I'm asking New Mexico First to help me establish state goals so we can participate actively as a state with a good school system," he said.

In an interview later, Carruthers said he always reads the reports produced by the New Mexico First meetings and the good ideas produced by the people at the meetings are an insightful way to get a perspective on what New Mexicans are thinking and supporting.

"If this group believes in it and supports it, chances are pretty good the legislature will support it, and the rest of the public will support it," he said.

Carruthers said he and his staff began putting together a package five months ago dealing with education for the upcoming legislative session, but he refused to elaborate on specific items in the package.


"We think there are several places we need to do some extra work," Carruthers said.

He said the one thing at the education summit which he did not agree with was a national curriculum. He used the example, it should not be part of a national curriculum that every student should speak two languages. He said he agrees that it needs to be a national goal, but each state should have the right to determine what curriculum is best for its students.

"I have zero tolerance for a national curriculum," Carruthers said. "Education is still a state's right."

Depositors at Pioneer Savings & Trust, F.A. are now protected by a new deposit insurance fund—the Savings Association Insurance Fund (SAIF)—managed by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, George W. Mitchell, Pioneer's president, announced today.

"Customers will soon notice a new seal on our door," said Mitchell, "which represents Pioneer's membership in SAIF." The seal has an American eagle and specifically states that the "full faith and credit" of the U. S. government stands behind all deposits of up to \$100,000.

"It's the customer's guarantee of protection against loss," Mitchell

said.

The new insurance fund was established by the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989 (FIRREA). The legislation abolished the old Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation and made the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation the insurer of savings institutions.

FDIC remains the insurer of commercial banks. The commercial bank fund is called Bank Insurance Fund, or BIF.

"We're pleased that the Congress has reaffirmed the federal government's commitment to stand behind deposits in savings institutions," Mitchell said. "No one has ever lost

a penny within the insured limits at a federally insured S&L, and Congress has made it clear that record will stand."

"Further," Mitchell said, "Pioneer Savings has been in business since 1901—88 years—and no one has lost a penny at Pioneer, even during the depression."

Pioneer Savings and Trust has assets of \$171 million. The association is headquartered in Roswell, with five full service branches in Ruidoso, Hobbs, Carlsbad, Alamogordo and Las Cruces, and three mortgage origination offices in Albuquerque and in Texas, Midland and El Paso.

The Odessa, Texas, Board of Realtors will convene October 20-22.


October 23-27, the New Mexico State University Cooperative Extension Service will be in session here.





## Warriors fall to the Oñate Knights

The Oñate Knights defeated Ruidoso, 10-7, last Thursday night in Las Cruces.

It was a close contest and could have gone either way.

With 1:36 left in the game, on fourth down from the Warriors five yard line, the Knights chipped a 10-yard field goal. The two teams had been in a 7-7 tie since the second quarter.

Straight ahead running was how Oñate beat the Warriors, but each first down gained by the Knights made the battle more intense.

"Kief Johnson played an outstanding game at middle linebacker," head coach Doug Ragsdale said. "Overall defensively, we did a good job," he added.

The Warriors defense played with war-like intensity at University Stadium. Ruidoso's goal-line defense did not give the Knights yardage easily. Oñate scored their only touchdown on fourth down and a foot, at Ruidoso's goal-line. The Oñate Knight runner did not run for the touchdown, he crawled, barely passing the ball over into the end zone.

Unfortunately, the Warriors offense could not muster the same determination as the defense.

Steve Dankert was the star on offense. Without a doubt, this young man can run!

The opening kickoff from the Knights went to Dankert and in less than 13 seconds he flashed by everybody, running 85 yards down the sideline and into the end zone.

Ruidoso football fans have seen Dankert's 30 and 40 yard returns, but nothing so graceful as this!

What a morale booster!  
That was the last bit of offensive explosiveness that Ruidoso had.

### FIRST HALF HIGHLIGHTS

After the opening kick off return by Dankert the Warriors defense smothered the Oñate offense. Kief Johnson and John Winans led the pack and kept the Knights from making a first down.

Unfortunately the Warriors offense could not keep the emotional advantage. With two incomplete passes, a penalty and no yards gained on two runs, Ruidoso had to

punt.

Again, the defense kept a firm grip on the Knights. On second down, Oñate threw a pass and junior, Chris Torres, intercepted.

Again the Warriors offense had a chance to keep the tide rolling in their favor. Taking possession on their own 22-yard line, they couldn't make ten yards and had to punt again.

This time the Knights offense took control, from their own 40-yard line. Although there were fourth down plays, Oñate made the first downs and kept the ball rolling in their favor. Keeping the ball on the ground the Knights penetrated

into Warriors territory. When the first quarter ended they had the ball on Ruidoso's 21 yard line.

They pushed their way to the 5. It was fourth down and one yard. They made a first down and inched toward the goal. Another fourth down. Only a foot more and Oñate would score. It was not clear how far the ball went over the goal, but it wasn't more than a foot.

The Knights scored with eight minutes left in the half. Kicking the extra point, the game was tied at 7-7.

Remembering how well number 35 Steve Dankert, ran the last kickoff, the Knights made a short kick. It was time for Ruidoso to get the steam back and go to work offensively.

First and ten at the Warriors own 30 and an option play—the pitch was fumbled and the Oñate Knights recovered. If there was any emotional explosiveness left on Ruidoso's offense, it was gone.

Fortunately, the Warriors defense still had energy and did not let the crawling touchdown bother them.

On first down, Pete Baca ran through the Knights offensive line and sacked the quarterback for a loss. Oñate faced a second down and 22 yards and only made two yards on the next play. Again the "Big-D" had done their job. Not only had they stopped the Knights cold, but had kept Ruidoso from losing confidence.

After receiving the ball on their own 20, the offense kept a drive going.

Mannie Guardiola, sophomore, ran for some good yardage. Making two first downs and leading the Warriors to the Knight 19 yard line. On fourth down and two, Ruidoso attempted a field goal. It was far to the right, no good.

The half ended with Oñate taking possession and running a few plays. Without a doubt the Knights kept the game from getting out of control, or maybe the Warriors were the ones to blame. Whatever the case, Ruidoso would have its hands full in the next half.

### SECOND HALF HIGHLIGHTS

If the Ruidoso Warriors had absorbed some emotion between halves, it was only obvious in their defense.

The Knights offense made one first down after the kickoff and then on third and two Jessie Guardiola, senior, caught a Knight running back for a loss. Oñate had to punt.

Once again Ruidoso couldn't move the football. Getting the ball on their own 28, they couldn't make a first down. Receiving a holding penalty, the Warriors created a third down and 26 for themselves.

This is how it went for seven changes of possession. The Warriors defense getting the ball back for Ruidoso, and then the Warriors offense giving the ball back to the Oñate Knights.

Ruidoso's offensive fuse had been cut, there would be no explosion.

On the eighth change of possession, the Knights began a final march. Taking possession on the Warrior 45 they completed a pass for ten yards and ran for 15.

It was first-and-ten from the Warriors own 10-yard line and number 66, John Winans, senior, tackled the ball carrier behind the line of scrimmage. Oñate couldn't get another first down after that, but

did get the game winning field goal with 1:36 remaining in the game.

Another short kickoff from the Knights and Ruidoso had a final chance to explode.

The offense couldn't make one yard. Throwing four incomplete passes, the Warrior offense had to give the ball back to Oñate for the last time.

### WRAPUP

"We have a situation where each ball game is like a district championship," athletic director Doug Ragsdale explained. "We need more fire and emotion."

That was the single most noticeable thing that was missing from the offense last Thursday night. The Warriors offense could not explode. Continuing to play without emotion will make it hard to be district champs.

During the game Ruidoso made four first downs, rushed 24 times for 86 yards and threw eight passes for only one completion. They had to punt six times.

Jamie Candalera was the leading rusher for the Warriors, carrying the ball four times for 26 yards. Quarterback Mannie Guardiola was next with 25 yards on five carries. Kenny Trapp had 19 yards on seven carries.

Ruidoso did not make many mistakes, having only two penalties.

The reasons for the loss against Oñate are important because they could give clues on how to win next week. Head coach Ragsdale is correct in saying "Don't dwell on the past."


Going into the match Ruidoso was ranked as number one in their district. Now the Warriors are number two. The Deming Wildcats have defeated Ruidoso twice this season.

Remember that during the warm interlude like today, the weather can change suddenly for a day or so. So when you go into the mountains, have someone with you and be prepared for a cold snap. Let someone know where you are

going.

That was a fine article in The Ruidoso News of October Second about Ruben Sandoval gathering clothing for those in need in Mexico—distributed by Bill Shuerman of El Paso.

Ruben was born December twenty-seven, 1920, in Chimaloy, New Mexico, to Juan and Encarnacion Sandoval. He descended from Captain Sandoval with the early colonization expeditions of De Vargas in the fifteen hundreds.

During World War Two he was four years in service on the battle ship, Massachusetts. In June four, 1949, Ruben was married to the former Adelina Martinez. They have three children: Christina Ferrington, who teaches school in

White Mountain Elementary; Gerald, who works in construction in Ruidoso; and Evelyn Jacquez of Espanola.

Ruben worked for Los Alamos for thirty-three years, moved back to Chimaloy for a while, and then came to Ruidoso in 1983. He is a member of the local American Legion and the Saint Eleanor's Knights of Columbus.

Ruben and Adelina are happy in their home in Ruidoso Downs just up the hill south of the racetrack, glad that they chose Ruidoso for their retirement. Ruben finds his work with the Hospital Auxiliary very rewarding—helping those in need is central to his life.

And he has found what many retirees are learning—that their Golden Years can be full of good works and valuable service to all of us. Keep up the good work, Ruben.

## State offers flu vaccine

Flu vaccines will be available beginning in November in preparation for the winter's flu season.

The vaccines will be available at Public Health Division Field Health Offices and Primary Care Clinic throughout the state.

Persons considered to be high risk are encouraged to receive the vaccine for influenza during November, prior to the peak of the flu season which normally occurs after December, said a release from the Health and Environment Department.

Individuals considered at risk of developing severe complications with influenza are those older than 65 years old, and those with chronic health conditions that require regular medical attention, such as heart and lung problems, asthma, diabetes, kidney disease, anemia,

or those having problems with their immune system, including those receiving treatment for cancer.

"Getting a flu shot in November before the onset of the peak flu season is the most effective way for high-risk individuals to protect themselves from serious, possibly life-threatening complications," said Michael Klatt, immunization program manager for the Public Health Division.

A flu hotline is co-sponsored by HED and the American Lung Association. The toll-free number for the hotline is 1-800-221-5864.

The hotline will operate from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, October 16 to November 30, and will provide information about the vaccine and where it can be obtained.

## County to auction property

If you haven't paid your property tax in more than three years, the state is about to auction your property.

Taxpayers in Lincoln County have until October 25 to bring their property tax payments up to date or the New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department will auction the delinquent properties at the Lincoln County Courthouse, said a news release from the state.

Taxation and Revenue Secretary Gail D. Reese said the sale is being

conducted under Property Tax Code provisions to collect delinquent taxes when owners have failed to pay their taxes for more than three years.

The county will receive the tax, penalty and interest from the proceeds of the sale for funding county and school district operations, said the release.

Money collected in excess of the tax, penalty and interest owed will be returned to the former owners, said Reese.

Potential bidders are encouraged to inspect property before bidding. The Taxation and Revenue Department will publish legal descriptions and bid requirements as legal notices in local newspapers three times before the auction.

A list of delinquent properties is also kept at the county offices.

The auction is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. October 25 at the Lincoln County Courthouse.


The Ruidoso News welcomes letters to the editor on local issues and items of local and regional concern. These letters are printed on the Opinion Page on a space-available basis.

## Reporter's Round

Every year before the first snow flies I begin to train for the ski season, and every year I continue to find excuses to be a lazy slob. And when I hit the slopes for that first run, I see pink, yellow, blue and green dots before my eyes and my legs turn into Mr. Wiggle. Maybe this year will be different, but I wouldn't count on it.

I learned to ski when I was ten years old on a pair of Northland brand skis. They were made out of wood, seriously. And my boots were the old-fashioned, lace-em-up-and-rip-the-flesh-on-your-fingers type. The bindings? You guessed it—cable. At least I had high-tech aluminum poles.

I believe the rope tow was invented to embarrass the beginning skier in public, and to increase the income of orthopedic physicians. But once the beginner overcomes having his shoulder dislocated four or five times, being dragged along in the snow while everyone yells at once "Let go!", he or she can learn how to gracefully ski backwards up the dang things and feel cool about it.

Speaking of cool, every hip ac-

tivity has its own esoteric vernacular, and skiing, of course, is no different. How many other activities are there where you can speak of consecutive herkies and daffies, followed through with a helicopter, and not be Gheater Bella in a cartoon?

There is a drawback, however. Skiing is not exempt from glorifying idiots. For some stupid reason, the broken leg sustained in a skiing accident is invariably romanticized, in spite of the fact that most ski injuries occur as a result of skiing while under the influence of a mind altering substance, skiing beyond one's control or ability, being out-of-bounds, or just plain being an irresponsible jerk.

Of course there's the old tale that only aggressive skiers get injured, but let's get the nature of the injury straight. The most common injury among advanced skiers is to the thumb. His binding, designed for racing, released prematurely in the deep powder conditions, throwing him into the tree. Ever since then, even on bright, sunny days, I wear goggles whenever I ski the trees.

Everybody has a favorite crash story. Mine happened at Wolf Creek. While riding the triple chair, some kid made a comment about how awesome the comment about Vista Face, looked. I nonchalantly replied it looked worse than it really was, having already successfully run it several times without mishap.

When the chair reached the top, I coolly glided on my fluorescent Volkl Rentigers to the top of Alberta Face, pointed my skis downhill, and before you could say "ha-ha, you pompous jerk," I was down, sliding on my back, bouncing over the tops of icy moguls. I tried to bring my skis to my downhill side, but the tip caught the snow, sending me into a cartwheel that twisted my leg to the brink of cracking. At that time I screamed out loud, "Please God, don't break my leg!" and miracles of miracle, the binding released.

When I finally came to rest, I was at the bottom of the slope, one of my poles was at the top, my other ski halfway, my rear-entry boots were pulled open and full of snow, as were my red-flannel long johns. I waved to someone at the top to please grab my pole, who did, and who cautiously skied their way to my location. Meanwhile, every-

one on the chair was yelling out "Ten!"

When the good person handed me my pole, I recognized the kid who sat with me on the chair. I shrugged my shoulders and said "Oops, but he just shook his head and said 'Rad.'"

One of the neatest things I've tried in a while was snowboarding. With the marginal conditions most of last year, I gave it a try at Santa Fe under the expert guidance of the instructors there, who I happen to know personally. It was great fun, and wasn't that hard to learn, though I must admit, the instructors there are extremely knowledgeable and thorough.

Snowboarding has seemed to have found a niche with skateboarders, but don't think because you're a rad skater that snowboarding will be easy. The two activities are very different. And skiers will find it very different also.

For example, the skateboarder initiates a turn from the back, with the front of the board traversing the turn. The snowboarder initiates the turn at the front, sliding the back around the front foot which becomes a pivot. And while the skier faces the fall line with their chest, the snowboarder leans into the fall line with their shoulders.

Ski Apache and Taos are the only ski areas in New Mexico, as far as I know, that do not allow snowboarding. Cloudcroft does. If you want to try, take a lesson. Don't try to teach yourself because you will get hurt, or you will hurt someone else. One full day lesson should get you on your way.

One last story.

While riding the chair on Thanksgiving at Wolf Creek two years ago, I commented how crowded the area was. Lift lines were 40 minutes. I thought out loud that another chair should be built to help out. The person next to me quietly said, "The only way they'll get rid of these crowds is when they learn how to make snow in Texas."

Sorry folks. It's all in fun, really.


