Leaky gas tanks are excavated

Three underground gasoline tanks at an old 7-Eleven store site at 2105 Sudderth were removed because of evidence of leakage, Carl Stubbs, Ruidoso environmentalist, said Friday.

A benzene health hazard was evident in one of three test wells drilled, Stubbs indicated.

Stubbs, who is with the Environmental Improvement Division (EID), Health and Environmental Department, State of New Mexico, said a test well drilled earlier at the site showed evidence of leakage.

Last week, when the tanks were excavated, soil contaminated with gasoline was discovered, Stubbs said.

He said the tanks were flushed with nitrogen and didn't present a hazard to the public when they were removed.

The UST (Underground Storage Tanks) division of the EID in Santa Fe has been monitoring and directing testing of the Ruidoso site, Stubbs said.

Last summer the Southland Corporation, headquartered in Dallas, Texas, parent company of 7-Eleven stores, sold all the 7-Eleven stores in Ruidoso to Allsup's which is headquartered in Clovis.

Sergent, Hauskins & Beckwith, geotechnical engineers, of Albuquerque, has been doing the testing and monitoring work on the site under EID direction.

A representative of that company contacted Friday wouldn't say who the engineering firm represents, the original owner or Allsup's or who.

Stubbs said, however, that "the original owner" maintained the tanks were safe, while "the purchaser" wanted testing done.

In late July a report sent to the EID in Santa Fe, apparently by the engineering firm, showed minimal traces of gasoline.

Ruidoso environmentalist Jim Edwards said at that time that the report indicated the traces of gasoline might have been caused by surface penetration.

However, other test wells were drilled since then. Three such wells were drilled in all, Stubbs told **The Ruidoso News**.

One of the wells showed 570 parts per billion of benzene, a component of gasoline. Maximum allowable under EID direction is 10

Ruidoso aims for air service

Representatives of the Village of Ruidoso were in Phoenix, Arizona, on Wednesday presenting information about Ruidoso and the surrounding area to the chairman of America West Airlines.

According to village manager Frank Potter and transportation and aviation division head Tim Morris, the group, which also included Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. and Ruidoso Downs Race Track owner R.D. Hubbard, met for about a hour with America West Airlines chairman and chief executive officer Edward R. Beauvais and vice-president for planning Peter J. Otradovec.

The group from Ruidoso was there to try and get America West Airlines to begin scheduled air service to the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

Morris said the Ruidoso group informed Beauvais and Otradovec about the race track and the ski area and what these two major tourist attractions mean to the area. He said they also provided information from the Inn of the Mountain Gods and the Convention and Visitors Bureau.

"We let them know what we have and what we are planning for the future," Morris said.

"They were surprised at the stuff we gave them," said Potter. "They were really impressed with Ruidoso."

Morris said the two executives listened to the group tell about the development of the race track and

the new golf course and hotel project. He said they listened to the proposals and seemed interested.

He said the two groups discussed the cost of the operation, which will vary according to the level of service Ruidoso would like.

Morris said they discussed starting the air service in May 1990, and running it through the summer, and maybe through the winter season.

America West, with headquarters in Tempe, Arizona, is a fairly new airline. The company was started August 1, 1983, and currently serves 46 cities in the United States and Canada, including Albuquerque, El Paso and Lubbock, Texas. It has a fleet of 70 aircraft, including Boeing 737s, 757s and a 747 which the airline plans to use, beginning in November, on nonstop flights to Honolulu, Hawaii.

America West has shown an interest in establishing service to various ski resorts. This year, America West will establish air service to the Vail, Beaver Creek resorts and Steamboat Springs resort in Colorado.

"We achieved what we went to do," said Morris. "I feel positive about things."

The two America West executives told the Ruidoso group they would get back in contact with them in January, following the busy Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons.

Hubbard Museum seeks members

R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard are inviting area residents to join in and become a part of their efforts to make the Ruidoso area the center for realistic art in America.

The Hubbards opened the Hubbard Museum at the Ruidoso Downs Race Track last year, and have enhanced the museum by offering a quarter million dollar art award to be given at the Downs each year.

Hubbard Museum director John V. Hall said the Hubbards want to include the entire community in their project. Memberships are being offered in the Hubbard Museum.

"It's not Dee Hubbard's museum; it's the public's museum," said Hall, noting Hubbard, who has committed more than \$600,000 to the Award for Excellence project, would like to see the community get involved and support the museum.

Hall has been addressing various groups in Ruidoso to acquaint them with the goals and aspira-

tions connected with the Hubbard Museum and the \$250,000 art award.

He spoke to the Ruidoso Evening Lions Club Tuesday evening, and Wednesday afternoon he addressed the board of directors of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

Hall explained how memberships will work and how they will offer, and also told of a two-pronged goal in developing the art award.

One, he said, was to create an award which will be as prestigious as the Pulitzer and Nobel prizes.

The other is to broaden the financial base of Ruidoso, bringing people to the village who otherwise might not ever know about this mountain resort.

"We thought \$250,000 would get people's attention," he said. Instant credibility was the goal.

Through getting some 16 prestigious museum directors from across the country to nominate artists for the June show, this was ac-

complished, he said.

Twenty-four carat gold invitations were sent out, and of 105 artists nominated, 55 have been invited.

"We expect the average price for art works entered in the show to be \$50,000," Hall said.

That view was bolstered at the Cowboy Artists show recently when artists who have entered the Hubbard Award for Excellence competition carried more than 31 percent of the \$1.2 million show.

To promote the award and show, Hall said three mailings of 25,000 each are planned. He said some 138 volunteers will be needed the weekend of the art show to take care of the 800 to 1,000 people expected in the area just for the award and show.

Hall admitted the impressive \$250,000 award and the Hubbard Museum may be getting more attention elsewhere than in the Ruidoso area. He said it is important for people who live here to un-

derstand the scope of the big project.

"This will be the most significant art show in the United States in 1990," he said.

The advertising budget alone is from \$165,000 to \$195,000. Full page, four-color advertisements are scheduled for magazines; advertisements will appear in 300 newspapers, he said. Ruidoso will be named in all these ads.

Art work submitted for the show will be judged on excellence only, he said. Some of that art will become a part of the Hubbard Museum collection which, through agreements with other museums, will be a revolving collection.

The June show will attract so many people that just working out transportation and such is somewhat of a challenge, said Hall.

Another facet to take care of the transportation while adding to the excitement of the event, will be bus

tours out of Albuquerque linked to the art show with stops along the way at historic sites, like Gran Quivera.

"It's a big event and a lot of people," he said.

The Hubbard Museum \$15 million show will be in Kerrville, Texas; Palm Springs, California; and Scottsdale, Arizona. It also has been scheduled and confirmed for Moscow, Russia, he said. The show will be permanent at Ruidoso Downs Race Track until it goes to Moscow later in the year.

Regarding the memberships being offered in the Hubbard Museum, Hall said the money is not as important as the show of community support.

"We are seeking community support, not funds," he said.

Memberships are being offered now in the Hubbard Museum.

Hall said those memberships will entitle holders to attend special events at the museum, including a dramatic presentation next year by Joan Stauffer, who portrays Nancy Russell, wife of the famous painter.

Hall said at least three special

events will be planned for members, who will have their choice among various levels of membership ranging from \$40 individual memberships to \$10,000 sponsor/corporate memberships.

"It's for the community," stressed Hall.

"What better way to show your support of Ruidoso?" asks the letter soliciting members.

parts per billion, Stubbs said.

Larry Morgan of Southland's El Paso, Texas, division, said last summer that such testing is routine when a 7-Eleven site is vacated.

Rhino Tank Co. was in charge of excavating the tanks and hauling them away.

EID was closely monitoring removal of the tanks, Stubbs said. He said the tank company was very meticulous in ensuring safety during the operation.

Also sold in the summer were 7-Eleven stores in Alamogordo and Roswell.

Markeeta McNatt, public rela-

tions representative of Southland in Dallas, said in a news story in June that Southland sold 985 stores since a leverage buyout two years previously.

The hole resulting from removal of the tanks will be filled and the whole area paved over, the on-site engineer said.

1989 Bavarian Bash brings in \$2,650

The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce can put \$2,650 in the treasury after the Bavarian Bash at Carrizo Lodge, October 20-21.

The Octoberfest event drew 1,200 people to the lodge, according to Ron Wall, who reported the statistics during a monthly board meeting Wednesday.

Ronnie Paulger, chamber president, said the impressive profit figure was due in large part to the lodgers' organization in Ruidoso which provided free lodging to music groups and such. He especially cited the "graciousness" of Carrizo Lodge.

One complaint about the Bavarian Bash was voiced at the meeting by A.D. Powers who represented the Sertoma Club.

He said the same organizations each year are granted permission to have food booths at the affair.

"It's not democratic," he said. He suggested drawing names from a hat in awarding concession privileges.

"I know where you are coming from," Paulger said, but said the chamber is not likely to give up the beer concession. The beer conces-

sion brought in some \$2,000 this year.

Paulger referred Powers' complaint to the organizational division of the chamber and charged that group with coming back to the board with a policy recommendation on booths for all chamber events.

Board member Eddie Parker said the Art Festival poses the same problem—the same organizations get food concessions each year.

Sunny Hirschfeld of the chamber staff said a policy is needed quickly, as mailings on the 1990 Art Festival will be going out very soon.

Aspenfest chairperson Joan Bailey had praise for her committee in staging the 1989 event. Tony Wilcoxson was co-chairman and will be the 1990 chairman.

Committee members were Bob Barge, Mary Seelbach, Cynthia Davidson, Jeamsie Price and Mary Maul, along with the chamber staff. Bailey said she would like to see more floats next year from the power company, gas company, Cable TV, schools and such.

One board member said the Ruidoso schools have a policy against students building floats. He

said the reason is that students who were supposed to be working on floats in the past were doing other things "all hours of the night."

It was suggested that the school board be contacted anew.

Roy Crocker, chairman of the retirement services division of the chamber, reported that his organization faces a shortfall of about \$9,000.

He said his group will meet with the advertising committee November 2 to decide "where we are going."

He said there was no response from the county commission to an appeal for more support from the county.

"I take that as a negative reply," he said.

Paulger said the search committee seeking an executive director for the chamber was to interview a candidate, Saturday, October 28.

Steve Keller reported that several sites have been proposed for the 1990 Art Festival, including the Eagle Creek Sports Complex on Ski Run Road, White Mountain schools and the old children's home property near the police station.

A new site is required because the old airport faces massive development over the next two years.

Keller also asked board members to support the Santa Cops program to provide food, blankets and other aid to the elderly and other needy people during the Christmas season.

Board members were asked to assist in meeting medical and personal expenses of a six-year-old Ruidoso boy, Michael Malis, who needs a liver transplant.

Financial reports showed that Aspenfest income over expenses was \$1,690. That does not include \$450 budgeted for long distance calls.

The Art Festival, a major annual fundraiser, showed a \$26,702 profit.

John Hall, director of the Hubbard Museum at Ruidoso Downs Race Track, reported on the magnitude of the Hubbard Art Award program scheduled for next June.

A new board member was seated during the meeting. She is Brenda Buckner representing The Bank of Ruidoso.

Mammogram costs puzzle hospital board

Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) charges more than twice as much for a mammogram as hospitals in either Roswell or Alamogordo.

A mammogram costs \$155 in Ruidoso, and only \$60 in Roswell and in Alamogordo, said LCMC administrator Steve Keller during a meeting of the hospital board Thursday.

Board members questioned Keller about the large difference in cost, and agreed they would like to see the cost of a mammogram reduced in Ruidoso.

Keller said the higher cost was intended, in part, to reflect a truer cost of services to the patient.

Rather than lose money on the mammogram and raise lab fees to correct the difference, the mammogram cost was increased to keep other lab fees low, he said.

Part of the mammogram fee is for the radiologist's reading, said Keller, noting discussion with Dr.

Stephen Crowley would be needed before changing the fee structure.

He also said the new mammogram machine is paid for.

Trustee Dr. Roger Beechie said it is necessary to work on the fee because people will go to Roswell and Alamogordo for mammograms and for other shopping needs.

Trustee James Sanchez asked for a copy of the cost analysis for mammograms.

Sally Avery asked if the hospital would be willing to do a two-day mammogram screening instead of the one-day event recently conducted in partnership with Altrusa. She said many women were turned down by Altrusa because not enough time was available in one day to conduct all the mammograms requested.

Some of these women reportedly had histories of cancer in their families, said Avery.

More than 100 women were screened during the special event earlier this month, that offered low-cost mammogram screenings.

Keller said the hospital is willing to consider more than one day for the reduced-cost screenings.

"It's not just the hospital," said Keller. Cooperation from Altrusa and Crowley would also be necessary, he said.

In the financial report, a deficit of \$47,776 was reported for the month of September, creating an annual deficit of \$38,520 for the first six months of the fiscal year.

Building project monies not yet received from the county, however, would change this to an operational excess and would show a more positive cash flow for the month.

Keller said it was a bad month in part because of low patient load.

Each line item on the income statement for the Carrizozo Health Center for the month of September was exactly the same as the line items on the August statement.

Total patient revenues for September were exactly the same as for August: \$15,026. The net losses were also identical: \$15,143. The net loss for the year is now \$22,730.

In other business, Keller reported:

—Phase I of the building project is for the most part completed. Phase II will begin with work on patient rooms and on physicians' offices next door.

—The new sonogram machine is in place.

—The leadership meeting was successful.

—Physician recruitment continues to go well.

—The programs at the New Mexico Hospital Association Convention were excellent and the speakers were exceptional.

In the Auxiliary report, president Emadair Jones said 1,661.5 volunteer hours were reported during September. The Pink Shop and the Thrift Shop cleared \$4,360.68.

Two closed sessions were conducted by the trustees, each for personnel matters, it was reported.

No action was taken after the closed sessions.


Alan Morel's parents also are Ruidoso residents. His mother,

Also attending the conference from this area were Leonard McCutcheon, Doug Williams, Wendell Chino and Vernon Scott.

Potter said the conference dealt primarily with the Pecos River basin. He said an overview of water issues in southeastern New Mexico was presented and the settlement with Texas over the Pecos River water rights was discussed.

He said the conference also dealt with recreational issues along the Pecos River, like Brantley Dam and its impact on southeastern New Mexico.

The conference also featured dis-

cussions about water quality along the river. The conference was highlighted by a speech from Governor Garrey Carruthers, who spoke on the state's landfill situation and the effect those landfills have on the contamination of ground water.

Potter and Mesalero Tribe President Wendell Chino were on a panel discussing ways local governments in the Pecos River Basin can plan for the future.

Potter said the annual water conference is always a good source of information about water issues.

"At the annual water conference, you learn about federal and state litigations and the effect they have on New Mexico," he said.

Santacops gets set

The Santacops program shifts into full gear this week with a benefit volleyball tournament and a meeting for volunteers.





But, for those families whose children still take part in trick-or-treating, the New Mexico Federation of Teachers has provided a check list on how to enjoy a safe and happy Halloween.

...Had a set-to recently because when I go out of town I still stop at the same station for "full service" that I always have.

They're good people at that station; they check the tires and coolant and oil without having to be asked two or three times, and without sulking.

But it is an Exxon station...

My Mother...

...And plenty of other Americans are self-righteously shunning Exxon stations these days, expressing their disapproval of the Alaskan oil spill caused by an Exxon tanker.

I see it when I stop at that little station. The business there must be, people, about 80 percent. The people, many of them tourists, drive in, look up at the sign and drive on out, their faces tight and smug.

It seems a shame to me. I don't even know the owner's name, but he's always run a good shop. I just can't see how putting him out of business and the men who work for him out of jobs, is going to rehabilitate a single sea otter, going to clean up an inch of shoreline...

It's Just So Much Easier...

...My friend Don comments, to not-do that to do. Exactly. It's so much easier to put the local Exxon

dealer out of business, by just going elsewhere, than to do something that might require some time and effort, like:

— Writing a letter to Manny Lujan and telling him we expect him to hold the corporation's feet to the fire and make Exxon pay for the cleanup.

— Writing letters to Jeff Bingaman, Pete Domenici, Bill Richardson, Steve Schiff and Joe Skeen and telling them the same thing.

— And while we're at it, asking our Congressional delegation and Congress as a whole to make the government enforce double-hull construction on all oil tankers, old as well as new. The can be retrofitted, or they can be scrapped.

— Calling the National Wildlife Federation or Sierra Club and bringing ourselves up to date on what's happened to Prince William Sound's flora and fauna and what needs to be done. Maybe even share a buck or two with them. Maybe even share some volunteer time.

— Writing to Exxon and saying, "You guys screwed up"— we expect a response on how you're going to clean it up as well as you can."

— Following up on all these letters, demanding responses and keeping up on the continuing efforts to reclaim the environment

there.

But it takes time and concentration and a 25-cent stamp to those things. It is easier, by far, to cut up the Exxon cards and drive on by the local station...

We Should Expect...

...Our corporations to be more responsible for their actions, and certainly Exxon has a long way to go in that respect. But we're all responsible for the environment, all living on the only planet we're likely to know.

This is no excuse for the devastation to Prince William Sound, but a dramatic event like that doesn't do nearly the damage we do collectively, every day, just by refusing to stop our cumulative carelessness.

In a recent survey, U.S. News & World Report learned that nearly 75 percent of more than 2,000 persons surveyed believe American

businesses have a "definite" responsibility to clean up their air and water pollution.

In the same survey, the pollsters learned that of the persons surveyed, 40 percent never recycle their bottles and aluminum cans; 50 percent never avoid aerosol products; 56 percent never use biodegradable, low-phosphate soaps; 64 percent never recycle biodegradable plastic garbage bags; 78 percent never use public transportation or car pools; 79 percent never contribute money to environmental group; 80 percent never write letters to politicians expressing opinions on environmental issues, and 86 percent never volunteer for local environmental groups.

As Pogo said more than 20 years ago, "We have met the enemy and it is us."
