## Feds seize more county property

Federal agencies have taken six properties in the Ruidoso area in connection with a 20 ton cocaine bust in Los Angeles, California.

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) have seized six different properties, including

another property owned by George F. Lore in the Glencoe area.

Lore, a long-time Ruidoso area businessman, has not been charged with any crime.

According to public documents filed by the U.S. District Court in Las Cruces and in Carrizozo, all the seizures were made under the jurisdiction of Title 31 statutes regard-

ing money laundering, and U.S. Statute 21 USC881, the civil forfeiture statute.

The civil forfeiture statute allows agents to seize property where reasonable evidence exists suggesting the property was purchased with drug related money.

The momentum shifted to the Sartans during the second half. St. Pius scored two touchdowns before the Warriors began a remarkable comeback.

This football game was exciting from beginning to end, and not over until the last play.

### FIRST HALF HIGHLIGHTS

The Warriors lost the coin toss and kicked off to the Sartans.

Four downs later (and a Jesse Guardiola quarterback sack) the Warrior offense started the first offensive drive.

Gaining only one first down, the Warriors had to punt.


St. Pius returned the ball for 30 yards. The Sartans started on the Warriors 22-yard line, but couldn't score.

On second down and 15, junior Kief Johnson, intercepted a pass.

This time the Warriors were full of steam. On fourth and one, from the Warrior 45, senior Kenny Trapp made the first down. The next play gave sophomore quarterback Manny Guardiola 50 yards of running and a touchdown.

Making the extra point, Ruidoso was in front 7-0 with 5:18 to play in the first quarter.

Jerry Lee Davis, who has been hired as the new executive director of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, spent the weekend in Ruidoso getting acquainted.

"I wanted to get a feel for the kind of things the chamber has been involved in," he said at the chamber offices.

He spent much of Friday visiting with and getting information from staff members and meeting chamber leaders.

"I'll be on the job full time December 4," he said. Davis will move his family here in late December.

Davis is married and has three sons. His wife's name is Gail. Their son, Gabriel, will be in school in Ruidoso next semester. He will be seven years old Christmas Eve.

Watts has two other sons, Dan, 19, who is in the service, and Jason, 13, who lives with his mother in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

"I hope to be able to emphasize membership participation," Watts

said. He said he hasn't set any priorities as yet, adding he first wants to visit with leaders and "see where their priorities are."

Watts has been director of members services for the El Paso Chamber of Commerce for the past two-plus years.

In his resume, he said, "As director, members services ... (I) coordinated efforts to stabilize declining membership, directed dues revaluation program which resulted in increases in excess of \$100,000."

# Municipal judge takes office

They say you can't teach an old dog new tricks. But attorney Charles Hawthorne, after 17 years of law practice, is looking forward to his new job as municipal judge.

"It's kind of exciting to learn something new at this old age," Hawthorne said.

This past week, Hawthorne began a new course in his professional law career when Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. appointed him to fill the Ruidoso municipal judge's position left vacant by the death of Bill Payne.

Judge Hawthorne went right to work Wednesday and Thursday of

last week. He admits he wasn't sure what he was supposed to do, but he said Municipal Court clerk Debbie Floyd and Magistrate Judge Jim Wheeler helped him through it.

Hawthorne was born in Alpine, Texas, but grew up in the Central Texas town of Copperas Cove.

He attended Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas, taught school in Houston, Texas, and did a three-year stint in the Army before attending the Texas Tech Law School.

Following his graduation in 1972, he practiced law in San Angelo, Texas, before moving to Ruidoso in 1978.

Hawthorne is married and has

two sons. His wife, Linda, is a teacher at Ruidoso Middle School. One son, Lantz, is in school at Santa Barbara, California, and the other, Doug, is in the seventh grade.

The new judge practices law in Ruidoso with his brother, Richard Hawthorne.

"Everybody in the family has been supportive," Hawthorne said.

Hawthorne said, after two recent village controversies he told Davis he wanted to become more involved in village government. Attempts by a group to change the village government and the recent con-

trovery over the airport property development prompted his concern.

"Basically, I'm an unpolitical type person," he said.

He said he told Davis if the occasion arose for him to get more involved and assist, he would appreciate the opportunity.

Hawthorne said Davis and some of the councillors first approached him about the municipal judge's position about two weeks ago.

"At first, it was gratifying they would consider me," he said.

He added that he doesn't do criminal law and has only tried one criminal case, but the opportunity to do something new professionally and learn the criminal process caused him to accept the position.

Hawthorne, just settling into his new office, said being the municipal judge has already been an eye opening experience. He said it has shown him a new side of Ruidoso with things like DWI cases.

During his 17 years in private practice, Hawthorne said he has never really looked at a case from a judge's standpoint. He said a judge has to look at both sides of the issue.

He said he wants to be available 24 hours a day to assist the local police and he wants to make the municipal court a vital part of the village's system.

"I want to take all the responsibilities that the ordinances allow me and make this a fully functioning municipal court," said Hawthorne.


Even though he has not been on the job long enough to set any personal goals, Hawthorne said the judge's position is something new and different.

"It may not be fun later on, but now it is kind of refreshing," he said.

## Strep infection strikes in the area

Ruidoso parents were warned recently of a possible strep epidemic in Ruidoso, but recent reports from a local physician indicate the number of cases is decreasing.

Tests for strep were running 40 a day at Dr. Arlene Brown's office earlier this month, with 90 percent of the tests being positive, said Brown.

The number of cases, along with current information in the medical journals, led Brown to issue a letter of warning to parents through the Ruidoso elementary schools.

"Ruidoso and the rest of the nation are currently experiencing an epidemic of strep throat," said the letter.

Tests showing positive for strep infection at the Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) lab were running less than 10 percent, said Larry DeBeer, LCMC lab department head.

"The numbers I'm getting do not show any epidemic," said DeBeer.

Nationally there is a trend of the more serious complications associated with strep infections, such as rheumatic fever, said Dr. Evan Nelson, district health officer of the State Health Department.

This development led physicians to be more aggressive in efforts to treat strep infections earlier, said Nelson.

This does not mean there is an increase in strep infections, but that symptoms tend to be ignored and develop into more serious cases, he said.

Common symptoms of strep include a very sore throat accompanied with a fever, headache, nausea and/or vomiting. Doctors will treat based on a clinical diagnosis before results of a test are confirmed, said Nelson.

Strep is tested in two ways, one being a "quick screen," and the other the more commonly known throat culture, said DeBeer.

The quick screen is a new development and kits for the test are readily available to physicians. The screen takes only minutes for a result and is highly sensitive to the

positive, said DeBeer.

A throat culture takes 24 to 48 hours before results are available because an attempt to grow the strep bacteria is made in this test.

Cultures are recommended when a quick screen turns up negative, said DeBeer.

So far at the LCMC lab, none of the negative quick screens have turned up positive, he said.

Tests at LCMC cannot be conducted without a physician's order. However, if two tests are required, a flat fee for both diagnostic tests will be charged, rather than two fees, said DeBeer.

The state health clinics at this time cannot run tests for strep. Those suffering from the symptoms will need to see a private physician, said Nelson.

Efforts to even out the cost of diagnosis and treatment are being made by area physicians, said Brown.

The U.S. Marshall's office began today (Monday) to take custodial care of the properties until their final disposition in court, said a spokesperson from the U.S. Marshall's office.

Property descriptions provided by the U.S. District Court on a notice of court action, were used to identify the properties at the county assessor's office.

Legal descriptions used by federal agencies differ slightly from those at the county assessor's office. According to those descriptions, new properties seized last week that were not previously reported include a Lore property in the Glencoe area; a home on lot 17 of Camelot Crown Estate owned by Lore; lot 18 in Camelot Crown

Estates owned by Hector Tapia Anchondo, who was indicted in Los Angeles on cocaine smuggling charges; 2,196 acres outside of Ruidoso Downs and owned by Lore.

Properties taken by federal agents previously reported by The News include the 8,100 square foot home under construction by H.C.G. Enterprises, a building company owned by Lore; a home and property owned by Anchondo in the Glencoe area; and a home at 302 Hull Road in Ruidoso owned by James Romero McTague who also was indicted in Los Angeles.

Lore was not arrested in the investigation into the cocaine smuggling operation allegedly led by Anchondo, but his properties were taken because their ownership is in connection with either McTague or

Anchondo, said Tom Smith of the DEA.



"(Lore) may not have been charged but he was doing business with people who were," said Smith.

Federal agents, with the assistance of local law enforcement, searched the seized properties, and others, on October 5. Federal agents used a cutting torch to open a safe in one of the outbuildings at the Lore residence and removed documents, according to a deputy sheriff's report, said Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane.

Further information on what items were listed on the warrant used in the October search is not available because the warrant and attached affidavits were sealed by a federal magistrate judge.







A short kickoff placed the Sartans on their own 44-yard line.

Defensively the Warriors penetrated the back field of the Sartans. Seniors Pete Baca and Kenny Trapp stopped the Sartan running plays and Trapp made a quarterback sack on second and goal for the Sartans.

Missing a field goal on fourth and 10, St. Pius was still behind 7-0.

Without a doubt, the Warriors looked like a championship football team. Keeping a St. Pius offense from scoring from inside the 10 was impressive.

Ruidoso found out how unforgiving the officials were going to be this night on the next offensive play. Guardiola threw a 30-yard pass to junior Rick Ragsdale and it looked to many Warriors fans like he was the victim of interference, but the officials called offensive pass interference.

Now it was second down and 20 for Ruidoso at their own 10. The offense couldn't recover and punted on fourth down.

St. Pius received the ball on the Sartan 44-yard line. After an offensive holding call and a Baca tackle for no gain, the Warriors made two mistakes. The Warrior defense received a late-hit penalty on the Pius 44, and another defensive penalty on second and 10 from the Warrior 21.

Despite the iron defense of Ruidoso, these penalties gave St. Pius the chance to score from the Warrior two-yard line.

Not making the extra point, the Sartans trailed Ruidoso, 7-6.

Fumbling the return, Ruidoso took possession from the 10.

Six consecutive Trapp rushing plays, got Ruidoso one first down.

The Sartans started up their offense after a 30-yard punt by senior Logan Stirman. Passing for 15 yards on the first two plays, St. Pius was on the Warrior 35-yard line. On the next play the Warrior offense scrambled the Pius offense and caused a fumble. Kief Johnson recovered.

The first half was almost over and the Warrior offense took possession on their own 35. The team could only make five yards and had to punt, a Sartan tried to block it and knocked over the punter, roughing-the-punter was called and the Warriors had another chance.

Trapp ran for 20 yards and it was first and ten from the Sartan 15-yard line. Twelve seconds remained in the first half. Guardiola went back to pass and was in-

tercepted on the Ruidoso goal line. The Sartan defender ran the ball back 100 yards for a St. Pius touchdown, with no time remaining in the first half.

The Sartans missed the extra point but the momentum had shifted to St. Pius and the visitors led 12-7.

### SECOND HALF HIGHLIGHTS

Ending the first half with an interception and a score, gave the Warriors an emotional letdown. Receiving the ball was sophomore Jose Marquez, who returned it for 35 yards to the 50-yard line. This was the best Ruidoso did; the Warriors punted on fourth down.

St. Pius ran four rushing plays with star running back, Mike Murphy. He made a first down and then ran 70 yards for a touchdown.

St. Pius failed on a two-point conversion, but led 18-7 with 8:03 to play in the third quarter.

Again the Warriors had a good return, this time by junior Steve Dankert. Starting on the Ruidoso 40-yard line, the Warrior offense tried to get a first down, but on fourth and one, Kenny Trapp fell short.

The Pius offense exploded again, with the help of another defensive personal foul penalty. This penalty came after a quarterback sack which seemed to drain the returning Warrior momentum.

The penalty gave St. Pius a first and ten on the Warrior 39. Mike Murphy rushed and received on the next few plays, gaining big yardage. St. Pius was now on the Warrior six-yard line. The third quarter had 1:53 remaining and the Sartans scored again, made the extra point and led 25-7.

Marquez returned the ball for 25 yards and Ruidoso gained one first down on the ground. The momentum was changing hands again, but not fast enough, the Warriors punted.

Eating time from fourth quarter play, the Sartans made one first down and then punted.

Starting from the Ruidoso 36, the Warriors reached deep inside themselves and decided to take control. Guardiola took the first step toward building Warrior confidence. Throwing an incomplete pass on first down, Guardiola tucked the ball and ran for eight yards on second down. Trapp was stopped at the line of scrimmage on third down. On the next play Guardiola ran for the Warrior first down.

This was the spark which Ruidoso needed.

Despite the Sartans efforts, Ruidoso converted a fourth and 15-

from the Warrior 40, into a first and ten from the Sartan 30. Guardiola completed a pass to Logan Stirman on fourth down and the Warriors were alive again.

Trapp ran for 10 yards and with 3:38 left to play, senior Alfred Rue caught another Guardiola pass on the Pius five and ran in for a touchdown. A two point conversion failed and the score was 25-13.

A beautiful on-side kick worked for the Warriors and Ruidoso had the football again, on the Sartan 35.

Three incomplete passes later, it was fourth down and 10. Guardiola threw a completion to Stirman on the Sartan 10-yard line.

Three more incomplete passes and it was fourth down on the Sartan 10. Again Guardiola found Stirman, who caught the ball for touchdown!

With no extra points added, the score was 25-19. The Warriors could tie the game with another touchdown; 2:16 remained to play.

An on-side kick attempt failed, not going 10 yards.

St. Pius took possession and ran the clock down to three seconds. Guardiola got another chance to throw a pass, but he was sacked and the game ended.

### WRAPUP

As Doug Ragsdale said, there are no words to explain how St. Pius upset the Warriors on Saturday night. A loss like this might be blamed on the officials or on a few big plays. Football games can be won or lost in a moment, and the best team does not always win.

The Ruidoso Warriors had a successful season and fought their last battle like champions.

Ruidoso gained 10 first downs to the Sartan 13, rushed 32 times for 137 yards, comparing to 31 Sartan rushes for 145 yards.

Kenny Trapp gained 57 yards on 16 carries and Manny Guardiola had 58 yards on eight carries, one touchdown.

Mike Murphy of St. Pius rushed for 103 yards on 16 carries.

The Warriors had 125 yards passing, Guardiola threw 20 passes for eight completions, one interception and two touchdowns, while St. Pius had only 60 yards on nine passes, with four completions and one interception.

Each team fumbled the ball away once.

Ruidoso accumulated 102 yards in penalties, while St. Pius had 55 yards in penalties.

Many of the players on the Warrior football team have been selected as all-district players. These individuals will be announced in the next edition of The News.





# Hospital reports huge deficit during October

Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) is facing a \$229,028 budget deficit so far this year, and that amount is expected to increase.

A loss of \$190,508 during October brings the total deficit LCMC to \$229,028. At this time last year LCMC had a deficit of \$3,659.

Charity care and uncollectable accounts are a factor in the deficit with total charity care in October at \$130,058.

Administrator Steve Keller, during a board meeting Thursday, said the deficit may continue to grow because LCMC has elected to pay back, ahead of schedule, its obligation for a Hill-Burton loan received 20 years ago.

The Hill-Burton program, established in 1946, helped to build hospitals in rural areas, provided the hospitals completed a specific amount of charity care under its jurisdiction.

This condition was for LCMC to write off \$100,000 of charity care each year for 20 years, said Mike Funk, a representative of Southwest Community Health Services (SCHS), LCMC's parent organization.

LCMC still has \$600,000 of charity care to write off, and it was SCHS's decision to finish this obligation ahead of time because of the enormous bookkeeping task involved.

Completing this obligation doesn't affect the availability of charity care at LCMC, said Funk.

Also Thursday, Lincoln County Commission Chairman Karon Z. Petty joined the board of trustees. She traded board positions with Commissioner Robert E. Hemphill, who is now on the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County board.

During discussions on the Carrizozo Health Center (CHC) Keller

said LCMC is negotiating with the county to place CHC under the complete control of LCMC.

Under a previous contract, Southwestern and LCMC provided certain administrative services to the Carrizozo clinic for \$1,000 a month. Though the contract expired, the services continued, said Keller.

The county stopped making the \$1,000 payments in June.

Petty told Keller the county sent him a new contract in July. She said Keller hasn't returned that contract.

Keller said he did receive that copy, but it had notations in the margins and various words scratched out.

"I asked at least five or six times since October 11 for a clean copy," he said. One was not received until November 8.

Keller said he isn't sure negotiations on the proposal will be completed by the next board meeting.

Keller also announced LCMC will reduce its price of mammogram screenings to \$107 which covers both technical and professional fees.

Research into the costs of mammograms at other facilities indicate the same services in Alamogordo and Roswell vary from \$102 to \$110. Previous reports that mammograms in those communities were only \$60 did not indicate the complete cost for a comprehensive exam.

The new LCMC fee will be competitive with other hospitals.

"It is important for us to have preventive medicine tests," said board president Dub Williams.

Williams encouraged people to speak to legislators and insurance representatives about having preventive tests and scans be covered by insurance.

LCMC has scheduled an open house from 2 to 5 p.m. Sunday, De-

ember 10, to show off the first phase of the hospital remodel. Phase II is under way now.

The physician recruitment committee announced that several doctors will come to Ruidoso to practice medicine.

Dr. Roger Beechie, a board member, will move his practice into a building east of the hospital on December 10.

Dr. Donald Ham is already in Ruidoso and was approved as an associate staff. Other credential approvals include Dr. Carl Bruce Carroll, a Medicus physician and Dr. James Fenimore as active staff who will be arriving in the middle of December.

In January 1990 a surgeon, Dr. Evans, is expected.

During the quality management report, trustee Bob Finley requested a written summary.

In the report, overall compliance was only 72 percent, with a 55 percent compliance rating with nurses.

One of the causes of the low rating is doctors do not write down discharge summaries, but present them verbally to the nurses, who then write the information.

Also, requirements include a summary statement of information that is documented elsewhere for discharge purposes, but this summary is often not completed.

In the nine separate departments, a 98 percent overall compliance rating was reported.

In the auxiliary report, Emadair Jones said volunteers accumulated 1,882 hours in October. Also, 46 pints of blood, with seven deferred, were collected in the blood drive.

Nominations for the medical executive committee were approved by the board. They are Chris Robinson as chief of staff; Ray Lahey as vice chief; Arlene Brown as secretary; Stephen Crowley, member at large.





The Tribal Election Board certainly did not call for a news conference or a reporter, therefore, they have no apology or obligation for not allowing news coverage or a reporter to cover the counting of the ballots.

The Tribal Election Board, in order to do its job correctly in counting the ballots, must have a quiet place; therefore, privacy becomes necessary. The practice of counting ballots in private has been the practice since 1935. We're sorry Frankie, you were misled and got cold!

The paper ballots used by tribal members for tribal voting is completely tamper proof as opposed to voting machines. The tabulation of the ballots must balance with two poll books with all Election Board members participating in the process. The Election Board members were all qualified and confirmed by the Tribal Council.


