Michael Malis gets new liver

Six-year-old Michael Malis is in a Denver, Colorado, hospital this morning recovering from a liver transplant he received early Sunday morning.

According to a group of ham radio operators who are in touch with the Malis family at the hospital, Malis made it through Sunday night and is doing well on Monday morning.

The Malis's received a telephone call at 11:30 p.m. on Saturday night, notifying them a donor liver had been located.

After a flight to Denver, Michael Malis went into surgery at 3:30 a.m. Sunday morning. The surgery lasted more than eight hours. He was placed in the hospital's intensive care unit, but he is expected to be moved to a private room today, if there is no sign of infection or rejection of the new liver.

Doctors had said Malis couldn't survive more than a year without a liver transplant. The Ruidoso child's name was placed on a liver transplant waiting list at the Children's Hospital in Denver, Colorado, but the lifesaving procedure wouldn't take place until his family could guarantee the funds to take care of the amount not covered by insurance.

Residents of Ruidoso and the State of New Mexico rallied to help the family raise the money needed for the transplant.

County shops for a dump site

The Lincoln County Commission is considering state land for a potential landfill site near Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

The site is near the current temporary Fort Stanton landfill operated jointly by the county and the Village of Ruidoso.

A report was compiled for the county by PAJO Technical Services, using existing information. Commissioners are evaluating that report, county manager said Nick Pappas.

Possible landfill sites are being investigated in section 16 and all contiguous sections in township 10, range 14.

The county's research is not connected with the permit application submitted by the Village of Ruidoso Downs asking to operate a landfill on land owned by Kenneth Nosker in the Ruidoso Valley.

The Ruidoso Downs application is a separate process and does not involve the county.

Information on groundwater at the potential county site indicates well depths of between 334 feet and 556 feet in section 16. One well in section 9 was only 55 feet deep.

Requirements established by the Environmental Improvement Board (EIB) for the operation of a landfill state the bottom of a solid waste disposal trench must be a minimum of 50 feet above groundwater

suitable for consumption. A 1963 study prepared for the State Engineer's Office indicates the predominant subsurface formations in the area to be Dakota sandstone and Chinle formation limestone below a loamy clay surface.

Soil surveys published by the U.S. Soil Conservation Service show a soil type of moderate water permeability with a water capacity varying from low to high.

EIB requirements state that measures be taken to prevent leachate from leaking out of trenches into groundwater supplies.

Engineers generally recognize this is done by either locating a landfill above water impermeable soil, such as compacted clay, importing compacted clay to line the trenches, or by using plastic liners to protect the groundwater from leachate.

The use of liners can add as much as \$20,000 to \$50,000 to the start-up costs for a landfill site, according to representatives of Waste Management, the largest solid waste disposal company in the country.

However, these figures are disputed by other engineers and solid waste disposal companies.

The information provided by PAJO also indicate a potential conflict with Federal Aviation Administration regulations that no active

To smoke or not to smoke: School Board ponders policy

The question of whether the Ruidoso Municipal Schools should become a smoke-free environment is an issue with no easy answer.

Members of the Ruidoso Board of Education would like to see more information on tobacco use be available to students, but as more information comes in, new questions arise.

For example, if the schools are made smoke free, is it just for the students, or the faculty as well? How is a smoke-free policy enforced? If you provide an area for smoking, is the school then promoting habits dangerous to physical health? Is there something in between?

The American Lung Association believes if a school environment is made smoke free, smoking must be banned for everyone, staff and students alike, said Gerald Ames, a Ruidoso High School teacher.

Ames attended a workshop in mid-October sponsored by the American Lung Association which discussed tobacco education and policy in the schools.

Another option is to allow smoking, but those who wish to smoke must go through some type of class that informs them of the consequences of tobacco use before they earn the privilege.

"You have to take a stand one way or the other," said Ames.

While tobacco use among adults has shown recent declines, its use

among teen-agers has increased.

Information provided by the American Lung Association indicates teen-agers who smoke are more likely to experiment with other drugs.

Nicotine is a highly addictive drug that is also poisonous. It is used in many insecticides.

Withdrawal symptoms from nicotine are listed as a temporary disorder or syndrome by the DSM III, a diagnostic manual used by mental health professionals to diagnose mental illness.

In fact, studies have shown heroin addicts have a higher success rate at ending their addiction than smokers.

Alto annexation is NOT on the Village Council agenda

The Village of Ruidoso is not currently attempting to annex Alto Village.

Many concerned citizens called Village Hall and The Ruidoso News this past week saying they heard that Ruidoso's Village Council was going to take steps to annex the Alto Village area on Tuesday night.

The calls apparently were prompted by a legal notice published in The News describing the area the village intends to annex. The village has undertaken the legal steps needed to annex two pieces of property owned by the Village of Ruidoso. Those properties are Wingfield Park and Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

Planning administrator Cleatus Richards said the confusion could have occurred because parts of the airport property are located in the same township and range as part of Alto Village.

Legal steps to begin a process of annexing any other areas anywhere in the county have not been

initiated or announced by the Village of Ruidoso. Those steps would include legal notice to the public as well as public hearings.

Three public hearings announced for Tuesday night's village council meeting will involve zoning code amendments and the annexation of Wingfield Park and the regional airport.

Discussions have taken place at several meetings lately over extending the extraterritorial zoning limit from one to three miles, but that subject is not on the agenda for Tuesday.

The extraterritorial zoning extension, if adopted, would be through an agreement with the county.

Ordinance 89-7, which the council will consider Tuesday night, clearly spells out the Village of Ruidoso is annexing contiguous territory known as the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport, an area containing, more or less, 1,663.1 acres of land. Exact survey marks for the property are listed in the ordinance.

EMS extends health care throughout the area

Last year the Ruidoso Emergency Medical Service (EMS) logged more than 83,000 miles covering an area up to 3,500 square miles.

"Which is enormous," said Jim Stover, director of Ruidoso EMS.

The service's primary area of coverage includes down to Tularosa, Ruidoso, and Ruidoso Downs. But, because the Ruidoso unit has advanced life support capabilities, it is available to support other EMS units throughout Lincoln County.

"We have a very excellent working relationship with EMTs out in the county," said Stover.

The paramedics and EMTs, or emergency medical technicians, of the Ruidoso EMS and the other

county operations are an extension of the total medical services available at Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC).

Ruidoso EMS has three advanced life support units equipped to deal with most every life threatening emergency and one rescue unit.

Because of Lincoln County's wide open spaces, roads made virtually impassable by inclement weather, and wilderness areas, the rescue unit is a four-wheel-drive vehicle.

Even within the village limits of Ruidoso there are areas where roads are dangerous and/or impassable after heavy snows or freezing rain, prohibiting the use of the advanced life support units, said Stover.

The four-wheel-drive rescue unit

provides emergency medical service in these situations with back-up provided by the advanced units.

In such extraordinary circumstances, such as a cross-country skier injured in a wilderness area, or a heart attack victim during a heavy snowfall in Camelot Crown Estates, both units will respond to the call.

The advanced medical unit will go as far as possible until road conditions prevent further progress. The rescue unit will then be loaded with whatever life saving equipment may be needed, and will then proceed to the scene if possible.

Once a victim is brought to the advanced medical unit, the injured person can be moved from the rescue unit if necessary.

"It takes a lot more coordination in a rural hospital," said Stover.

This coordination is particularly necessary in communicating with the emergency room (ER) staff at LCMC.

Victim survivability rates are greatly enhanced with the EMS communications network, which links up the Ruidoso EMS with all law enforcement agencies in the county, in Mescalero, Otero County, and both paid and volunteer fire departments in the area, as well as other EMS units in Lincoln County.

EMS personnel can radio back to the ER at LCMC information prior to arriving at the scene of an emergency, while at the scene, and while in transit to the ER.

"Sometimes we know right at the scene the patient has a critical injury," said Stover.

With a severe head injury, for example, the EMS personnel can notify the ER to be prepared to stabilize this patient for transfer to another facility.

Also, the ER can also notify specialized medical personnel when necessary to react to specific situations.

"We are an extension of the hospital as far as the hospital team," said Stover.

Patient transfers contribute to the mileage logged by the unit in both routine or emergency cases.

Because Ruidoso has a tourist based economy, many patients are visitors with doctors of their own in their home towns. When their condition warrants, these patients may request to be transferred to a hospital in the home community, and the Ruidoso EMS provides this service.

"We've even gone as far as Phoenix," said Stover.

Certain emergencies must also be transferred to facilities that provide the necessary level of care that is often not found in a rural hospital.

The Ruidoso EMS is staffed with four nationally certified paramedics who have completed a standardized training program of 1,000 to 1,500 hours. The paramedics are also required to be certified in advanced cardiac life support by the American Heart Association.

Each crew has one paramedic, plus an intermediate level paramedic who is capable of starting various procedures and administer certain drugs.

The system also involves volunteer EMTs who may help work a shift, or who respond to assist at the time of an emergency.

Two years ago the Ruidoso EMS was awarded the New Mexico System Excellent award as an outstanding paid service.

Stover said Ruidoso has been very successful with the quality of its personnel and with physician involvement with EMS staff.

The Ruidoso EMS is a separate department of LCMC, which contracted to the Village of Ruidoso for the service.

Whatever costs are not covered by the collection of patient revenues are covered by the village in this contract. Any profits of patient revenues are used to cover future losses.

Coordination with members of the community is also important in response to emergencies, said

Other information provided by the lung association said teen-age girls who smoke exhibit a greater pregnancy rate than non-smokers, the reasoning being girls who smoke are risk takers and are more inclined to take other risks, such as premarital or unprotected sex.

"There needs to be more awareness that nicotine is a drug," said Ames.

The Ruidoso Board of Education is researching how information can be provided to area students, but

it's uncertain when a decision will be made.

Member Lynn Willard suggested during the November meeting that ways be found to provide the information to the students if possible.

Ames said he obtained materials for a smoking course while at the lung association workshop.

In the mean time, students at Ruidoso High School are allowed to smoke in the parking lot on Warrior Drive. Teachers may smoke in the teachers lounge.

A relative of suspects in the world's largest cocaine bust was arrested last week in Juarez.

Aurora Tapia Anchondo, the daughter of Carlos Tapia Ponce was arrested while attempting to cross the border into El Paso after it was discovered she was carrying about \$288,500 in cash. She said the money came from her father's house.

She is the sister of Hector Tapia Anchondo, the alleged kingpin of a cocaine smuggling operation that may have laundered drug money in

Ruidoso, was indicted with another man in Juarez on charges of obstructing justice and possession of an illegal firearm, media reports said.

A man accompanying her, Ricardo Hoyos Perez, was arrested and charged with possession of an illegal firearm. Perez is reputed to be a friend of the Tapia family, said media reports.

The Anchondo woman said she was bringing the money into the U.S. to meet bail for her father.

Reporter's Round

In a game of Trivial Pursuit, geography is my best area. And my knowledge of the subject goes back to the fourth grade. Though my teachers spent a lot of time on English, math and science, a larger time share went to geography and social studies because the subject involved all the others in some form or other.

We also had television on occasion in the classroom, usually to watch a PBS science program or view a demonstration of an art project. In any event, the viewing was limited and never involved commercials.

Do you know where I'm going now? You're right, I'm going to write about Channel 1, the controversial television news program designed for teen-age audiences, complete with two minutes of commercials.

Our local school administration signed a contract to bring Channel 1 into the secondary level classrooms of Ruidoso, and then asked for the blessing of the board of education.

Many positive aspects of Channel 1 were discussed at the November meeting of the board, and the program does have many benefits. Only one negative was briefly discussed: the inclusion of commercials during the broadcast. However, there is a great deal more involved in the negatives of Channel 1 than was publicly discussed.

Being a fair minded reporter, I wish to explain the positives of Channel 1, but I also intend to cover the negatives a bit more thoroughly than was done at the board meeting. After all, even the negative side deserves a fair shake.

What is Channel 1? It is a 12-minute broadcast of news with two minutes worth of commercials intended for a teen-age audience. Following the format of popular television programs such as Entertainment

Tonight and the CNN News, the program chooses various current events, presents a news broadcast of the topic, but will usually focus on the teen-age point-of-view.

This daily broadcast will cover several topics in its ten minutes, so the student receives "sound-bites" of information. For example, if the Exxon Valdez oil spill were a topic, the broadcast would begin with a color map of Alaska pin-pointed on a world map. With the miracle of television, the student is brought into the map and voila, transported into Valdez, Alaska, where a teen-age reporter interviews a teen-age resident of Valdez regarding the impact of the oil spill.

Using popular music backgrounds, fast pace, and peer level techniques, teen-agers are drawn into the program and ostensibly absorb the information presented. Interest level is high. Hence, as pointed out during the board meeting, not only is the student's awareness of global events enhanced, but so is geographic knowledge, an area in which American high school students perform extremely poorly.

The schools using the system share a great deal of benefit as well. A school subscribing to Channel 1 receives the broadcast free of charge. In addition, the parent company, Whipple Communications, installs all the necessary equipment for the school to receive the program, also free of charge.

The company provides a satellite dish for reception, VCRs for recording the broadcast, all the cable and wiring necessary to hook up one television for every 23 students. Everything, free.

And what's really nice for the school is that it is allowed to use any and all of the equipment for other purposes without restriction.

What a deal! How can all this be free? Now enter

the negative.

Channel 1 is paid for through the inclusion of two minutes of commercial time. Interspersed in the 10 minute news broadcast are commercials hyping products that are generally purchased by teen-agers: Levi's jeans, Pert shampoo, as well as other cosmetic and entertainment products, etc.

Advertising pays for Channel 1 the same way advertising pays for commercial television. There are many problems involved in this.

First, it represents the invasion of corporate America into the classroom. For the half century life time of television, Madison Avenue was excluded from plying its wares to school children for at least six hours each day. Now it has found a way to not only reach that audience, but to captivate it as well.

Anyone who thinks Channel 1 is an education tool first and a commercial one second is kidding themselves. It is obvious to see the motive was to find a way to bring sales pitches into the classroom rather than a method of enhancing the quality of education. Examine these points.

First, the program is for teen-agers and not for the lower grades. Why not for the lower grades? Because teen-agers are the ones with money to spend. The return from elementary-aged children is too small because parents make the purchases directly in most cases. Teen-agers can buy things on their own.

Next, Channel 1 is not available to schools with a secondary level population less than 500 students. Why not? Because a school with less than 500 high school students is not a large enough market to pay for the installation or maintenance of the equipment. Capitan, for example, does not have enough buying power to warrant receiving Channel 1 and its alleged benefits.

This may be good marketing sense, but it is very poor education sense because it continues to perpetuate the inequality of education between various school districts.

Also, the format of Channel 1 is to present brief, fast-paced visually appealing information. This further breaks down the already splintered attention span of our youth, a by-product of the television era.

Whipple uses high pressure sales techniques to get

Channel 1 into the schools. Those from Ruidoso who met with the Whipple representative will undoubtedly say this isn't so. But consider the scenario of how Channel 1 came to Ruidoso.

The Whipple rep came here selling Channel 1, noting this was the only time they would be here. Sign the contract now because the rep cannot come back. Sure it may not be a binding contract and can easily be broken, but the fact it was already signed makes it less likely the consumer will back out. It is simply aggressive marketing and not a matter of convenience.

Hence a contract regarding a curricular addition to the Ruidoso schools was signed prior to the school board having knowledge the representative was even in town.

Schools will also feel pressure to use Channel 1 because they know other schools will. No one, naturally, wants to be left behind in the education race, even though some schools might be based simply on their enrollment size.

The constitution guarantees a free and equal education. To provide this service, education has been controlled largely by the public through the election of school boards and the collection of taxes.

Now suddenly corporate America has an opportunity to make curricular decisions on what happens in our classrooms, even though its only interest is to perpetuate its existence.

Channel 1 may only be 10 minutes now. But what will happen when in a few years the broadcast becomes longer, or includes other programs? What happens when a local school district finds itself making fiscal decisions because free televisions and VCRs are available?

If Channel 1 is not used, Whipple will know because the system sends a signal whenever it is used. And if a school does not use Channel 1, Whipple will come by and take the system out.

And finally, what will our schools do when they discover Channel 1 will do no more for education than a new edition textbook of American history?

The business of education still seems to me to be teaching, and if our students do poorly as a whole with geography, how is a television supposed to repair what a teacher should have done?


