

## Hospital shows off a new look

The Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) celebrated 40 years of operation Sunday with the completion of its newest remodeling project.

An open house was conducted Sunday that started with a ribbon cutting and included dedicating the new lobby to Lou Horton and her husband, Dr. Horton, who died in 1981. Members of the Ministerial Alliance were on hand to bless the remodeled facility and members of the auxiliary conducted guided tours for the public to see the improvements.

"It's fitting that the lobby should be dedicated to Dr. Horton and Lou," said Dr. R.L. Annala, a close friend of the Hortons.

Lou Horton and Dub Williams, chairman of the hospital board, minutes before had cut a ribbon officially dedicating the remodeled and streamlined facility.

The birthing room, the surgical suite, the records department, the emergency room, personnel department and other departments were open for inspection of the public from 2 to 5 p.m.

In tracing Dr. Horton's service to the community, Annala said the Hortons moved to Ruidoso before the Lincoln County Medical Center was opened in 1949.

Their first son was born in Roswell, but the Hortons' other two children were born in Ruidoso.

Before the hospital opened, Dr. Horton was delivering babies at homes in Ruidoso, Annala said. He practiced medicine in Ruidoso for 34 years.

Horton was a graduate of the Kirksville Osteopathic College in Missouri.

The Hortons were married in Midland, Texas, in 1945. In World War II, Horton was a B-17 pilot and later moved on to the bigger B-29 bombers.

Lou Horton was one of the original members of the hospital auxiliary, and Annala mentioned her unfailing support of her husband.

Horton was a member of the Evening Lions Club and the Ruidoso Board of Education and

served as a director of the Ruidoso State Bank. He worked at Ruidoso Downs Race Track as a physician most of the years he was here.

"They have been an asset all the time," Annala said of the Hortons.

Also recognized Sunday were board members and the architect, W. T. Harris of W. T. Harris and Associates.

Ministers taking part in the "blessing service" were Father David Berg, the Reverend Bob Bellows, the Reverend Charles Hail, the Reverend Jeamsie Price, the Reverend Daniel Link and, from Capitan, the Reverend Gregg Horst and the Reverend Harold Perry.

This newest remodeling project at LCMC began in 1986 when the hospital board directed administrator Steve Keller to investigate options.

At the time the roof was in poor condition and other areas of the building structure were decaying, said Keller. Various departments in the facility had outgrown their space and needed modernizing.

In December 1986, informal meetings took place with various architects, and by mid-1987 an architect was selected and the review process by licensing agencies began.

Keller said the review process was very lengthy because each agency must approve the plans. Any changes requested by one agency must then be reviewed by all the others.

The architect, W.T. Harris and Associates of Hobbs and Las Cruces, did an excellent job in expediting this process, said Keller.

## Ruidoso councillors select civic/events center designer

The Ruidoso Village Council on Thursday selected the Albuquerque architecture firm of Holmes, Sabatini, Eeds to design the village's convention/civic/events center, to be located at the old municipal airport site.

The architecture firm was the top choice of village councillors, who had to choose from 14 different firms that submitted proposals. The second choice of the council was the architecture firm of Leedsbill, Herkenhoff Incorporated, also of Albuquerque.

Councillors began negotiations with

Holmes, Sabatini, Eeds on Thursday and reached an agreement on \$81,000 for total architect fees.

As part of that \$81,000 in fees, Holmes, Sabatini, Eeds will design a center, at least 12,000 square feet, architecturally compatible with the nearby resort hotel which will also be constructed, along with a golf course, at the old airport site.

In its request for proposals, the village specified the building be big enough to handle up to 700 people.

The center is to be designed to be flexible, possibly with movable partitions. The civic center is expected to, eventually, be increased to 40,000 square feet, and the

firm will also design two additional building phases through the schematic design phase.

Village leaders have said if adequate funds become available, it will expand the size of the civic center.

During the initial first design phase of the project, the firm will be coordinating with the hotel and golf course architects in designing the parking, landscaping, surface and subsurface drainage, and parking area lighting through the construction design phase.

The actual construction of the parking, landscaping, surface and subsurface drainage and parking area lighting will be

the responsibility of the Village of Ruidoso.

Village manager Frank Potter has indicated the village will go back to the legislature and ask for more funds, not only for help with the construction, but also to purchase furnishings for the interior.


The firm of Holmes, Sabatini, Eeds has designed a number of office, education, health care, data processing, sports/convention, municipal and government facilities in several states, but most notably in New Mexico and Nevada.

Within the past 10 years, the firm's architects have been involved with designing the James R. Dickinson Library, student housing, administration and dining com-

mons at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas. They were part of designing additions to the Hollywood Park Race Track in Inglewood, California.

In the area of convention centers, the firm's architects helped design the Reno Convention Center in Reno, Nevada. Currently, Holmes, Sabatini, Eeds is the architecture firm responsible for designing the \$41 million dollar Albuquerque Convention Center.

The firm has said to have the project ready by July 1991, and allowing one year for construction, the design of the convention/civic events center should begin in early 1990.



## Crimestoppers picks top law officer

Officer Cynthia "Lou" Wardwell of the Ruidoso Police Department was named the 1989 Ruidoso-Lincoln County Crimestoppers Officer of the Year.

Wardwell received the Officer of the Year Award during Crimestoppers' annual Christmas Party, Saturday at Cree Meadows Restaurant.

Along with the Officer of the Year title, Wardwell receives \$50 in cash, a weekend for two in Albu-

querque and a plaque.

As Wardwell was receiving her plaque, Crimestoppers' coordinator Lanny Maddox read her letter of nomination to the crowd of about 85 people. It says:

"Officer Cynthia 'Lou' Wardwell is an officer with many titles with the Ruidoso Police Department. She is the administrator of the police department, she is the training coordinator and she is the intelligence officer. She has been with the department for almost seven years.

"Officer Wardwell, in the past year, has been extremely active in developing a prototype training manual for the Ruidoso Police Department for newly hired officers. This entailed compiling old manuals, reviewing manuals from other agencies and updating all areas of training for the department.

"She has worked closely with the district attorney's office in including information which an officer needs to successfully prosecute cases which that officer has filed.

"She also coordinated the Law Enforcement Academy Training Program for the Ruidoso area. She was instrumental in obtaining this important training function for our area.

"Officer Wardwell also is responsible in compiling statistics for the department in order to analyze trends in crimes, thus allowing the Ruidoso Police to modify law enforcement efforts.

"Officer Wardwell exemplifies the hard working, enthusiastic police officer by spending hundreds of hours of her own time in developing and updating all the information systems within the department.

"Besides her first rate law enforcement efforts, she also was and still is, the driving force behind the tremendously successful Santacops program in Ruidoso. This program has enhanced the image of all law enforcement personnel in the addition to providing less fortunate chil-

dren in the Ruidoso area with a Merry Christmas.

"Wardwell was the coordinator for the Ruidoso area Special Olympics' fundraising activities. The events she organized and orchestrated raised \$3,800 for Special Olympics. This amount was higher than any other area in the state, including Albuquerque.

"Officer Wardwell was instrumental in the past year in assisting investigators develop and file charges against a defendant for brutally raping and beating a young lady in the Ruidoso area. She exhibited a true concern for the victim which led to the victim's agreement to testify and prosecute the defendant.

"The Ruidoso Crimestoppers Officer of the Year Committee is pleased to recommend Officer Lou Wardwell of the Ruidoso Police Department for the 1989 Officer of the Year."

The Ruidoso-Lincoln County Crimestoppers Officer of the Year nominating committee consisted of the chiefs of police, the sheriff and assistant district attorney Scot Key.

Also nominated for the Officer of the Year Award were officer Rick Emmons of the Carrizozo Police Department, officer Ron Moore of the Department of Game and Fish, deputy Charley Engelking of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department, officer Danny Kiper of the

# County, hospital negotiate over 'Zozo clinic operation

The county may have reached agreement with Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) over the administration of the Carrizozo Health Center (CHC).

The county wants to turn administrative responsibilities over to LCMC and its parent organization, Southwest Community Health Services (SCHS).

"It appeared they were agreeable to this proposal," said county manager Nick Pappas.

Pappas and county commissioners Karon Z. Petty and Robert E. Hemphill met with LCMC administrator Steve Keller and SCHS representative Mike Funk Wednesday to discuss the management of CHC, as well as other topics relevant to the two parties.

The Lincoln County Commission was concerned it did not have the expertise to properly supervise or administer CHC and believed it was more appropriate for LCMC to take that role, said Pappas.

The issue also centered on the renewal of a contract between the county and SCHS which had expired in 1984.

Under the present arrangement employees at CHC are considered

county employees. If the new contract is adopted, CHC employees will then be LCMC personnel and directly under LCMC's payroll.

This will not increase LCMC's financial burden because a mill levy is already in place to cover operations at CHC, said Pappas.

Also discussed during the meeting was the impact the Hill-Burton write-offs on the LCMC bottom line, which is none.

During the last LCMC board meeting it was announced the Hill-Burton write-offs would be accelerated and completed ahead of schedule. This was to avoid the enormous amount of paperwork involved in the Hill-Burton program, said Funk at that meeting.

Keller indicated at that same meeting a budget deficit was in part the result of this accelerated process. However, the \$130,000 in charities in October would have been present whether or not the Hill-Burton write-off process was accelerated.

Pappas said the county was under the impression LCMC needed mill levy funds to cover operational expenses because of Hill-Burton, which led into a discussion of how the mill levy funds are to be used.

In the original mill levy passed in 1984 for eight years, \$350,000

was to go to LCMC with \$175,000 each for operations and for capital outlay, said Pappas.

This agreement was reinforced during a regular meeting of the county commission in which the commission contacted Keller by phone, said Pappas.

LCMC requested this be changed to \$250,000 for operations and \$100,000 for capital outlay. Though the commission has not taken any action on this change, LCMC has already changed its budget to reflect this new use of monies, said Pappas.

Keller is expected to come to the January regular meeting of the county commission to make a formal request for the new split of mill levy funds.

The group also discussed an inventory at LCMC.

Pappas said the county recently completed an intensive department-by-department inventory of all county properties.

LCMC will also conduct a complete inventory and identify all equipment and other properties which belong to the county as required by law, said Pappas.

"It was a terrific meeting," said Pappas.

Ground was broken in May 1988, with a completion date set at December 1988, but unexpected circumstances delayed completion until September of this year.

Some of these delays included the collapse of the sewer from the hospital out to the street and the discovery of plumbing behind a wall that wasn't in the building blueprints.

All in all, the project was completed only slightly over budget, said Keller.

Visitors at the open house saw many of the obvious improvements, such as the new lab facility, the expanded X-ray facilities and emer-

gency room and the new and expanded physical therapy area, as well as other departments.

But many extremely important improvements in the facility were also included in the project which cannot readily be seen, said Keller.

These items include the new roofing with new insulation and new double-pane windows. The facility has already realized savings in energy with these improvements, said Keller.

Also the project included new plumbing work and electrical wiring to accommodate some of the new equipment.

Construction of the present facility began in 1949. The first addition was completed in 1960 and in-

cluded the semi-private rooms and the business offices. In 1972 another addition was completed with the coronary unit and the Pink Shop.

The last remodeling project was in 1974.

"The hospital has grown to meet the needs of the community as it has grown," said Keller.

The project was funded with mill levy monies passed by Lincoln County voters in 1984 with 3.25 mills for LCMC and one mill for the Carrizozo Health Center.

"We could not have done this project without these monies," said Keller. "I want to send thanks for the medical staff to the residents of Lincoln County for their support of the mill levy."

# Judge Parsons convenes a Socorro County grand jury

Twelfth Judicial District Court Judge Richard A. Parsons, whose district is in Lincoln County, will convene a grand jury requested by petitioners in Socorro County for the investigation of their district attorney and city government.

Parsons was also selected by the New Mexico Supreme Court to hear both criminal and civil charges brought against Socorro County Sheriff Felix Saavedra.

A previous grand jury already indicted Saavedra on three criminal and one civil charge.

Parsons will be in Socorro Tuesday, December 12, to pull 100

names for a grand jury selection requested by Socorro County registered voters to investigate District Attorney Lee Deschamps as well as the City of Socorro, its councillors and police.

In the case of Deschamps, the petition asked for a complete investigation.

The other petition prompted a grand jury to investigate the operations of the City of Socorro and the conduct of its officials and councillors of nepotism and conflict of interest, the conducting of illegal meetings, the handling of public funds, and deficiencies in audit and the city police.

Parsons will convene the jury

January 4, 1990, to select 12 regular jurors and six alternates.

The three criminal charges brought against Saavedra allege he knowingly and intentionally permitted a prisoner to escape from the Socorro County Jail, that he failed to arrest an escaped prisoner and that he knowingly harbored a felon. The civil case requests the removal of Saavedra from the position of Socorro County Sheriff.

Media reports said Deschamps is considering filing a motion in the New Mexico Supreme Court to challenge Parsons' designation as the judge in the civil case against Saavedra.

## Wildlife news

Ben Hanson, of the Department of Game and Fish, is encouraging sportsmen in the southeastern part of the state to attend a meeting on the Wildlife Habitat Improvement Program (WHIP) at 9:30 a.m. Friday, December 15, at The Inn, 2600 South Valley Drive in Las Cruces.

WHIP was adopted three years ago and its term will end March 31, 1990, unless action is taken to continue the program.

In the southeastern part of New Mexico, the program has generated about \$356,000 from stamps purchased by all hunters, trappers and anglers. Matching funds from the Forest Service and BLM produced more than \$680,000.

Improving water resources and foraging areas is the primary focus of the program. Prescribed burns are used to improve browse and forage conditions for wildlife. Sixteen burns covering 67,000 acres were funded through the sale of the WHIP stamp. A dozen projects were completed to restore, improve and protect 12.4 miles of streams and streambeds.

More wildlife projects have been completed in the southeast in three years than would normally have been done in a 10-year period, according to Hanson.

All who are concerned about wildlife improvement, should attend the meeting.

# Ruidoso Care Center is a busy place

## Eddie Byrd is the new administrator

Things are happening at Ruidoso Care Center these days. The staff and residents share a packed calendar of events with everything from a daily "coffee klatch" to a monthly "theme night." New administrator Eddie Byrd said integrating residents and staff, and even drawing in members of the community, are important in long-term care facilities such as the care center.

Everyone is invited to drop by the care center for coffee at 10 a.m. any day. Donuts are provided by Daylight Donuts on some days.

Byrd came here in August from La Siesta Care Center in Hobbs when Ruidoso Care Center's former

administrator accepted a position with another company. The move was a promotion for Byrd, who was already working for Horizon Healthcare Corp., the company that owns and operates Ruidoso Care Center.

A registered nurse, Byrd has worked in several different New Mexico hospitals. He was director of nursing and then assistant administrator at a Lovington hospital before joining La Siesta's staff.

"In smaller facilities you get involved in residential care," said Byrd. That's one reason he likes long-term care. "I'm not sequestered," he added.

Since he is so interested in direct patient care, that's the area where Byrd immediately made some

changes here. He said the state licensing investigators have said the Ruidoso Care Center is excellent, so his changes were just minor.

"They consider our developmentally disabled unit the premier one in the state," said Byrd. That unit is the newest at the care center, which already has an Alzheimer's unit in operation.

Byrd said the care center has specific goals in mind for residents and for developmentally disabled clients, and that is to provide a good quality of life.

He said the center provides someplace to live, not someplace to die.

Byrd is proud of his staff, especially the interaction he sees between the staff and residents.

"We not only care for the residents, we care about them," said Byrd. That staff numbers 76, making Ruidoso Care Center one of the largest employers in the village.

Byrd said he and members of his staff are well aware that their purpose in being at the center is for the residents. He said the residents and their families place the ultimate trust in the center, and that is with their lives.

The center is licensed for 83 residents in all units, and 90 percent of those people and "out and about" interacting with staff and visitors. Byrd said restraints, physical or chemical, are not used at Ruidoso Care Center.

"We allow residents the most independence they can have," he added.

Dr. Michael Hickey, a psychiatrist, is on staff and available for consultation at all times. He visits the center once a month. Byrd said Hickey evaluates every resident's medications, and keeps them at a minimum.

Last month the care center's theme meal was "roaring twenties," and residents made beads and

headbands to wear. Staff members came in costume, and music of the twenties was played.

Activities director Sandee Hagar, who oversees the center's full calendar, put together an Oktoberfest and western days earlier this year. The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce provided decorations for the October event, and the Flying J Wranglers provided live music for western days.

"The community really does support the center," said Byrd. "We're pleased as punch."

That community support was shown in a big way when the Ruidoso Care Center Auxiliary coordinated a Halloween carnival to provide funds to give every care center resident a Christmas gift.

A number of organizations visit the care center and sponsor special events on a regular basis, including the Lions Club which sponsor bingo once a month.

Even more activities are on the calendar for Christmas.

The care center's Christmas party will be at 3 p.m. December 22.

Hagar said the table will be set with white lace tablecloths and residents and their families will share a seated dinner.

The entire center will be decorated for the season. Hagar said Cathy Hairston, a volunteer, donates many hours of time, as well as the decorating materials, to decorate the building, inside and out.

Things may slow a bit after Christmas, but Hagar said 1990 will begin with a New Year's Eve party complete with music and champagne.

Byrd and his staff invite visitors to stop by the Ruidoso Care Center any time, and just about guarantee something will be happening.



Maximum donation to any one organization cannot exceed 25 percent of the solicitor's budget for a project. No contributions will be made to political organizations or


service clubs.

The clearing house recently bought 76 tickets for Ruidoso Care Center residents to attend a benefit spaghetti dinner.



# RHS senior looks to 21st century

Cary Gumbert could be the 21st Century leader for New Mexico.

Ruidoso High School (RHS) had 32 students competing for the Century III Leaders Scholarship contest, and four made it to the state competition. They were seniors Nicole Beck, Jennifer Brilante, Brian Gray and Cary Gumbert.

Gumbert was the only one who qualified for the national competition. He and nine other competitors from around the state competed Monday in Albuquerque for the Na-

tional Century III Leaders Scholarship.

One student will be chosen from New Mexico as the 21st Century leader. This individual will be awarded a \$1,500 college scholarship and a trip to Williamsburg, Virginia. Once there, the winner will receive the leadership award and attend a national meeting with other high school leaders from around the country.

A state alternate will also be chosen and will be awarded a \$500 scholarship. The alternate will accompany the winner to the national

meeting. The third place student will receive \$100 scholarship.

Locally, the Century III Leaders Scholarship students were selected by achievements in community and school service, academics, a current events objective exam and an essay exam. Teachers also made recommendations.

Gumbert is president of the RHS Student Council and a member of the National Honor Society. Both of these organizations are involved in high school and community activities.

Gumbert, a drum major for the RHS band, plays the alto saxophone in the jazz band as well as in the marching and concert band.

In his spare time, Gumbert helps collect food and clothing for Santacops and other charitable organizations.

He maintains a high academic grade point average, 4.16, well above the 3.2 needed for the scholarship program. Gumbert passed the 50-question current events exam that included questions that ranged from the Academy Awards to the Berlin Wall. The timed test had to be completed in 40 minutes.

Each contestant also wrote an essay predicting 21st Century advancements in the United States.

The essay was judged for the state competition and will be judged in Albuquerque during the national competition.

Gumbert said he wrote on improving the school system and giving more respect to teachers.

"Teachers have an enormous amount of responsibility," he said.

At the national contest students will be tested on their essays and asked personal questions.

"It will be similar to a job interview," said Gumbert.

Most job interviews last about 30 minutes and that's how long each student will have to respond.

There is not much the contestants can study in preparation for the competition. Students seeking scholarship awards usually have thought about the possible careers they might follow. Personal questions about goals and college plans have already been answered.

Gumbert would like to be a mechanical or aeronautical engineer. He would also like to work in space one day. Colleges of choice include Rice University or Massachusetts Institute of Technology.



## EDITORIAL

It's not always easy to stick to a purpose or goal, but any group formed through a public body using public funds has a responsibility to do just that.

The Ruidoso Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) was formed by the Village of Ruidoso to promote this village. That's its purpose, and the only reason it is funded with taxpayers' money. The CVB has a great deal of leeway in how it goes about promoting the village, and makes use of a number of events and activities, including the Connoisseur Classic, a charity fundraiser, in February.

Since the purpose is so clear, we are disappointed to see the Convention and Visitors Bureau take off in a totally inappropriate direction. For, in the name of charity and space, the CVB has scheduled the Connoisseur Classic at the Inn of the Mountain Gods in Mescalero. That's right-Mescalero. Our Convention and Visitors Bureau will promote the Village of Ruidoso with an event in another town.

We're told that planners want to expand the event beyond the scope of Ruidoso facilities in order to raise more money for charity. It sounds good, but then we remember why we have a Convention and Visitors Bureau. Remember the purpose? To promote the Village of Ruidoso. That charity event is just a tool to promote this town.

Picture this: we have a house to sell. In order to draw the biggest crowd possible to an open house, how about having it at a neighbor's bigger and nicer home? We might not get anybody interested in our house, but, boy could we throw a great party.

Before the Connoisseur Classic group announced its decision to have the big Saturday night party in Mescalero, the committee heard proposals on having both the Friday and Saturday night events in Ruidoso. The group voted and made commitments with two local businesses to have the parties in town. Those agreements were later scrapped. Backing out on agreements, as happened here, isn't the way we believe a public group should operate.

Local lodgers and business owners might also question the CVB, funded with their money, encouraging visitors to stay at a neighboring resort, even a high-quality hotel like the Inn of the Mountain Gods at Mescalero. For the Inn of the Mountain Gods, since it is in Mescalero, doesn't (and shouldn't) pay either lodgers taxes or sales taxes in Ruidoso or Lincoln County.

The CVB should be reminded that its whole purpose for being is to promote this village, the Village of Ruidoso, and it just can't be done by sending visitors out of town, whether to Mescalero or to some other neighboring town.—fj

We get some of our best story ideas from callers, and we really appreciate those. For, we can't be everywhere and rely on newsmakers and people out and about.



So, if you just won an award, saw an accident or suspect something odd is going on somewhere in town, please call The News at 257-4001.




