Budget woes worry EDCLC

Board members of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County approved a 1990 budget during a regular meeting conducted Thursday in Capitan at the Smokey Bear Cafe.

Meeting Thursday noon, the board also tabled action on a statement of general operating policies of the EDCLC until some questions are answered concerning cost of long-term medical insurance coverage and sick leave.

Receipts in sight total \$54,986 for the calendar year.

Carroll Bundick, noting that there will be a shortfall of \$27,632 during the last quarter of 1990, asked for ideas.

He cited a plan for "more aggressive support." He said maybe the county will increase support for the following year. The county reduced support for this year from \$130,000 the year before to about \$54,000.

George Puckett, executive director of EDCLC, said a corporate gift of \$5,000 may be realized.

Puckett also announced that a volunteer staff member has been added to the EDCLC operation full time.

He is Russ Jones who moved to the Ruidoso area almost a month ago. He comes to the area from Indianapolis, Indiana, and has a background in marketing.

Puckett said Jones will assist potential business and industrial clients find or expand markets. Sometime in the future, it was indicated, through a fee system for assisting industries, Jones' position could become a paid one through commissions.

On another front, board member Dorothy D. Smith of Capitan was presented a certificate of appreciation for her work for EDCLC.

Cited specifically was her work

in assembling demographic material for a brochure and her faithfulness in attending board meetings.

The annual meeting of EDCLC will be conducted January 11. Terms of three directors will expire in January. They are those of Roy Crocker and Ronnie Paulger, both of Ruidoso, and Pat Huey of Capitan.

A nominating committee consisting of Rod Adamson, Herb Brunell and Bill Dean is at work.

Puckett told board members he is negotiating with Ranch Ruidoso people for establishment of a "Research Park" on Rancho Ruidoso property off the airport highway.

An 80-acre tract has been identified for development in two-acre increments, Puckett said. He said he is prepared to work with realtors on

Historic Lincoln adobes shake, rattle and crumble

Heavy truck traffic through Lincoln may be destroying the historic buildings there.

Every time an 18-wheeler rumbles through town, the vibrations from the passing truck can be felt in the historic Lincoln County Courthouse. And one time, after a truck passed by, a chunk of adobe fell off the building, said Jack Rigney of the Lincoln Historic State Monument.

Rigney believes vibrations in the ground caused by passing trucks are literally shaking the old adobe structures in Lincoln to bits.

"The seismic activity from traffic is definitely detrimental to the courthouse," he said.

Thirty-five 18-wheel trucks went through Lincoln between the hours of 8:15 and 11:30 a.m., said Rigney during a telephone interview Thursday.

Concern over the heavy truck traffic led Rigney to ask the Lincoln

County Commission to provide funds to rent a seismograph.

The seismograph measures the intensity of vibrations in the ground and is generally known for its use in measuring earthquakes.

Rigney would like to have a seismograph placed in the courthouse to measure seismic activity transmitted by passing traffic.

"This has far reaching implications," said Rigney.

New fish freeze in icy river

Eleven-year-old Billy Garcia called The News with an interesting question on Wednesday.

He wanted to know why the fish in the river were dying.

Garcia, who lives across from Two Rivers Park in Ruidoso, was playing on the rocks by the river on Wednesday afternoon, like he normally does.

He noticed a number of fish in the frozen river were dead. Some were still alive, but just barely. Most were lying on the bottom of the river. He knew the fish had just been caught in the river on Tuesday. By Thursday afternoon, more

50 fish were dead in a 60-yard stretch of the river along Two Rivers Park.

When asked about the dead fish, Officer Ron Moore of the New Mexico Fish and Game Department said a number of factors could have caused the fish's demise.

Moore said when the Fish and Game Department stocked an area, like they did on Tuesday afternoon, the driver is supposed to get the water in the holding tank as close as possible to the temperature of the water the fish are going to go in.

Moore said if the water temperature was too low, the fish could die from the shock of going into the cold water.

"Trout are not the heartiest of creatures," Moore said.

The temperature in Ruidoso on Tuesday night was five degrees above zero. Many areas of the Rio Ruidoso were frozen, including the area in Two Rivers Park.

Moore went on to say trout can withstand cold water temperatures. He said at the Pecos River Hatchery, workers had to usually break ice formed on the water and the fish survived.

He said since the Fish and Game Department also stocked several other areas of the Rio Ruidoso on Tuesday, other factors besides the cold water might have killed the fish in the Two Rivers Park area.

Moore said the pH level of the water might have been off due to not enough sunshine reaching the water. He said the ice on the river prevented the water from flowing and flowing water has a higher oxygen content than stagnant water.

He added that if there were too many fish in the holding tank, the fish might have become stressed. Moore said he is really not sure what made the fish in the Two Rivers Park area die.

EPA slaps Ruidoso with \$25,000 fine

The Village of Ruidoso is facing a fine from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for violations of the Clean Water Act, which took place before March 10, 1989.

In a proposal to assess a Class 1 administrative penalty under the Clean Water Act, the EPA states the villages of Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs, which own and operate a sanitation facility four miles east of Ruidoso Downs in Lincoln County, discharged pollutants to the Rio Ruidoso, a navigable water of the United States.

The Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant is owned by both villages but is operated by the Village of Ruidoso.

The Region Six EPA office in Dallas, Texas, has proposed to issue a Final Order Assessing Administrative Penalties (FOAAP) to the villages assessing them a penalty of \$25,000.

Ruidoso village manager Frank Potter said the violations listed in the FOAAP all took place before the new drying beds were in place at the Regional Wastewater Plant.

Potter said the discharges happened because the wastewater plant became overloaded and was unable to handle the volume.

He went on to say heavy rains in

August and September 1988, caused the sewer system to flood and overflow into the river. He said this was reported to the EPA, but it was still a violation.

According to Ruidoso meteorologist Bill Hostetter, during the period from August 24 through September 4, 1988, Ruidoso received a total of 4.83 inches of rainfall.

In its FOAAP proposal, the EPA states the two villages were in violation by:

—knowingly bypassing 300,000 gallons of raw sewage from a manhole on March 10, 1989.

—allowing bypass from the primary clarifier and aerobic sludge digester as observed during a New Mexico Environmental Improvement Division inspection on March 1 and 2, 1989.

—discharging effluent in amounts or concentrations in excess of the permit effluent limitations.

—discharging visible floating solids in other than trace amounts on the following dates: March 1 and 2, 1989; September 1 and 2, 1988; August 24 and 26, 1988; August 29, 1988; August 31, 1988; November 16 and 17, 1987; and November 25 and 26, 1985.

—not treating the sludge from the chlorine contact chamber and aerobic digester by a process to sig-

nificantly or further reduce pathogens prior to land application.

—discharging sludge from the chlorine contact chamber and aerobic digester to the plant grounds.

—not controlling grazing by animals used for food for 30 days on the pasture to which sludge was land applied.

—not properly operating and maintaining all facilities as they were designed to function, including the primary clarifier, flow equalization basin, aerobic sludge digester, and the automatic sluice gates in order to achieve and consistently maintain compliance with the conditions of the permit. None of these were operating as designed during the time of the NMEID inspection of March 1 and 2, 1989.

—not maintaining an alarm system which would notify personnel, when they are off site, of problems or bypasses at the plant.

—not maintaining spare parts or back-up equipment for the dechlorination system that caused an exceedance of the Total Chlorine Residual limits.

—failing to submit prior notice to the EPA regarding the anticipated bypass of the clarifier and aerobic digester.

Since the last violation noted by the EPA, the village has taken several steps to help eliminate the

problems. Since sludge is the end result of a treatment plant, it has to be dried before removal.

The Regional Wastewater Plant has 12 additional drying beds in place which it did not have in March or before. They were added because the water treatment plant was not capable of handling large volumes and was falling behind. In May, the village rented a sludge press to further help catch up.

According to Becky Bell-Durham, infrastructure division director for the village, back-up parts and equipment are on hand at the plant. She also said a new alarm system has been ordered. The alarm system would ring the police department in the event a pump were to stop at the plant.

Both Potter and Bell-Durham said village attorney John Underwood has been in contact with the EPA. Bell-Durham said she hopes the EPA will take into account the more than \$400,000 the village has spent in trying to correct the problems.

Underwood said the village has to file a written Notice of Appeal with the EPA by December 22. He said he has been negotiating with the EPA to lower the fine, but no agreement has been reached as of yet.



If the seismograph indicates that seismic activity from traffic is significantly contributing to the deterioration of the historic buildings in Lincoln, the highway department may be forced to re-evaluate its plans to widen U.S. Route 380 through Lincoln.

"The traffic is also a hazard to visitors," said Rigney. "The highway's been our nemesis since day one."

County manager Nick Pappas previously suggested a memorial be declared by the legislature for a study of the impact widening 380 would have on Lincoln. That move would stall construction.

Options to be considered besides widening the road could include a by-pass route for truck traffic, leaving the route through Lincoln for tourists to visit the historic town, said Pappas.

Rigney does not think a by-pass in the Bonito Valley itself is a viable solution, but an alternate route may be more attractive.

"I would like to see a reroute, maybe along 214 through Devil's Canyon," said Rigney.

Currently, the New Mexico State Highway Department's five-year plan has no plan for a reroute of 380 or of completion of State Route 214 from the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

"If they widen the highway like they did in Carrizozo and west of Capitan, we're in trouble," said Rigney. "As it is now the courthouse is on the highway right of way."

Rigney hopes the seismograph will provide the information that will require a re-evaluation of highway plans. He also said the highway department is likely to meet resistance from local residents.

"This is not a normal town. People are not going to let the highway department come through here without some flack," said Rigney. "We're on the historic register."

Speeding is another problem in Lincoln, and that poses a considerable hazard to tourists, said Rigney.

"It's a walking tour through town and folks are in the right of way all the time," he said.

Rigney would like to see the speed limit reduced from its current rate of 35 mph to 25 mph, but this idea has been criticized.

County Commissioner Robert E. Hemphill said previously a reduced speed limit would not help because if travelers do not obey the current speed limit, they will not obey a new speed limit.

Hemphill suggested increased law enforcement with speeders ticketed. But enforcement of the speed limit has not been strict.

"We never get it," said Rigney. Truck drivers, in particular, will pay attention to a 25 mph speed limit, more so than a 35, said Rigney.

"We need to have some better notice also on the west side of town," he said. "As soon as the new speed limit is posted, the trucks are coming up on the first crosswalk in front of the courthouse. By the time they slow down they're already half way through town."

The request for the seismograph was made to the county commission because the State Monument budgets is tapped, said Rigney.

The commissioners said if money for the machine, which will cost the county about \$650, can be located in the budget then it will be made available.

the project.

A research park has deed restrictions and masonry construction requirements as opposed to an industrial park, Puckett said.

EDCLC has made a bid to provide Manufacturing Consulting Services to small and medium size companies in New Mexico. The legislature allocated \$225,000 for that purpose.

Puckett said that only one other entity has applied, that EDCLC has a 50-50 chance of being the successful bidder.

The other entity is the Univer-

sity of New Mexico coupled with an industry.

Puckett said that EDCLC has support in the quest from the dean of engineering at New Mexico State University and other support which he said enhances EDCLC's chances.

A decision is expected momentarily, Puckett indicated.

Scott Shafer, Carrizozo member of the board, told the board the Carrizozo has a fixed base operator with two "qualified mechanics." He said the setup should result in four jobs including those of the mechanics. Also, he said many pilots should bring aircraft to Carrizozo for modifications and annual inspections and such.

LCMC to regroup funds

In the Monday, December 11 issue of *The News*, the amount of mill levy funds to be used for operations and for capital outlay at Lincoln County Medical Center was incorrectly reported.

Of the \$350,000 from mill levy funds, it was reported LCMC wanted \$250,000 for operations and \$100,000 for capital outlay. The correct amounts are \$200,000 for operations and \$150,000 for capital outlay.

Currently the county commission has approved the monies be split between the two accounts evenly at \$175,000 each. LCMC will request in January that the change to \$200,000 for operations and the \$150,000 for capital outlay be made via a line-item transfer.

During the Wednesday meeting of the Lincoln County Com-

mission, chairman Karon Z. Petty said the article of December 11 regarding the meeting between county representatives and LCMC representatives, in which the mill levy funds were discussed, was "completely erroneous."

Information regarding what was discussed during the meeting and the content of those discussions was provided to *The News* by county manager Nick Pappas.

That information provided by Pappas was also confirmed in separate conversations by county attorney J. Robert Beauvais and by Mike Funk, vice president of regional operations at Southwest Community Health Services. Both Beauvais and Funk were present at the meeting.

Fireplace ashes blamed for fire

Fireplace ashes and high winds apparently caused the fire that burned more than 10 acres adjacent to the Sierra Mesa Lodge in Alto Thursday afternoon.

Two units each from the U.S. Forest Service and Bonito Volunteer Fire Department responded, as well as a unit from the New Mexico State Forestry Department.

The blaze was contained in less than an hour although crews worked for three hours until the scene was safe to leave. High winds helped spread the fire initially.

"When we got there the winds were 10-15 miles per hour," said

one firefighter. "And flames were only about two or three feet high. Then the wind started gusting, and flames were taller than the truck. We were almost trapped. Then the wind suddenly shifted, and the fire blew back on itself."

Flames were contained in an area of grass and brush at the intersection of old Fort Stanton Road and the new Airport Scenic Drive. No structures were involved. Officials said the probable cause of the blaze was live fireplace ashes.

"Although the ashes were allegedly five days old and had been snowed on, they were apparently still glowing when Thursday's wind scattered them, starting the fire," said a Bonito fire department

spokesman. "All it takes is a coal the size of a match."

Proper disposal of ashes is always important, but especially so in dry periods such as this, firefighters warn.

To safely dispose of fireplace ashes, officials recommend placing them in a metal container and soaking them with water until they are completely cold. After a week or more, they can be safely scattered if no live coals remain.

Ashes never should be thrown in a dumpster.

Persons unsure of correct procedures may contact their local fire departments.

"Overall the team improved with each match wrestled and got some great early season matches."

The Warriors started the day with a victory. James Atwood won the first and second rounds and so did Mario Portillo. Atwood was defeated in the third round by Parga of Eastwood El Paso and Portillo also lost a close match in the third round to Oscar Carabasa of Eastwood.

Other Warrior wrestlers didn't fare as well due to poor seating.

David Stephenson lost a tough match to Jacob Garcia then beat Arnold Flores from Las Cruces High. David then had to wrestle Jacob Garcia again to advance and was defeated in a tooth and nail match.

Eliminated in the second round of competition was Craig Sears, who suffered from the flu. Arnold Canter and Scott Strickland also lost their first varsity matches. Fernando Lopez was pinned in a heartbreaker after leading 8-3 and Chris Salas almost beat his opponent after trailing by eight points.

"Pete Baca, Mario Portillo and James Atwood were the only Warriors who had not lost twice," said Ames after the second round.

"Pete Baca began a three-match-winning streak by beating Steve Soto from Deming in the last match of the day at 1:15. The match went into overtime with Pete winning, 9-7," Ames added.

At the beginning of the second day the Warriors had 10.5 points. Baca, Portillo and Atwood climbed their way through the consolation bracket.

Atwood fell after two victories, placing fifth. He lost to an old foe, Ricco Holgin of Deming, 7-6.

Baca also lost on the second day, after making a critical mistake, he also placed fifth in the tournament.

"Mario clawed his way back into contention with two victories," said Ames. "He then faced Jacob Garcia of Eastwood again for third place.

Senior Pete Baca guided the Warriors taking second at the Cobre tournament in the 189 pound division. He has seven wins and three losses this season.

"Pete is the team captain and leader," said Ames.

Junior Mario Portillo placed third in Cobre at 140 pounds. This is his third year and has eight wins and three losses this season.

Freshman Scott Strickland at 119 pounds placed fourth.

"Scott looks better each time he wrestles," said Ames. He is wrestling in a tough weight division and gaining good experience, Ames added.

Sophomore Fernando Lopez placed fourth at 125 pounds and has won three and lost four this year.

Senior R.J. Darden placed fourth in Cobre in the 152 weight division.

"R.J. Darden surprised everyone with two wins at the Cobre invite," said Ames.

Second year wrestler, Craig Sears, senior, earned fourth place while in Cobre. He has three wins and three losses this season and is getting better with each match, according to Ames.



an offering memorandum was distributed to visitors. The open house was co-sponsored by the Lincoln County Economic Development Corporation at corporation offices in the Financial Center of Ruidoso. Also present at the open house was Frank Taylor, the company's contract programmer. He is

responsible for product development and implementation. Warp Speed seeks \$250,000 in new capital. Stock is offered at \$0.64 per share in minimum lots of 1,250 shares (\$800). The offering is 390,625 shares of no par value common stock. The company is assembling light

pens and other electronic products, most of them "boards" which have electronic functions in various types of computers. Warp Speed headquarters at 711 Gavilan Canyon Road.

Sales figures for the last four years show, \$104,299 as of March 1986; \$242,252, March 1987; \$314,330, March 1988; \$408,326, March 1989.

The offering memorandum states that the securities offered involve a "high degree of risk and substantial dilution to the public investors. . ."

Rawlings, in a letter to Lincoln County residents says, in part, "We have achieved full production of our Light Pen and related products, and are shipping at a furious pace trying to catch up on our backlog of orders. We are growing rapidly though, and orders are still piling up."

Light pens are interface devices used in conjunction with personal computers. The pen is actually a light sensing optical device which when pointed at a computer screen, sends information to the software which is then interpreted and in turn executes commands.





Local doctor conducts research

Ruidoso physician Michael Spence is participating in a nationwide study of a particular antihypertensive treatment.

The study is sponsored by Tulane University School of Medicine and will involve up to 25,000 patients.

The drug under study is cateolol, manufactured by Abbott Laboratories. The significance of the drug is that blood pressures stay reduced in patients even after the drug is discontinued.

"The question is, are we any closer to a cure for high blood pressure?" said Spence.

Cateolol already received approval from the federal Food and Drug Administration. The discovery that the reduction in blood pressure continued after suspension of the drug was not made until after approval, said Spence.

Under most circumstances, a

patient's blood pressure goes back up when the medication is stopped. Because of the unique characteristic of cateolol, Abbott Laboratories, together with Tulane University, organized this current nationwide study of the drug.

Spence's participation began in October. His role as a clinical investigator is to record all the necessary lab test results of his patients taking the drug. Each month the data he collects is sent to the Tulane central data base.

"The prospect is just tremendous," said Spence.

Should data show cateolol is effective in reducing blood pressure over the long term after suspension of its use, great gains will be made against a disease responsible for many deaths each year.

The study is scheduled for one year. Final results will then be published by Tulane.

Gov. Carruthers names local man to state board

A Ruidoso man received a board appointment from the governor.

Steven G. Keller was appointed by New Mexico Governor Garrey Carruthers to the Nursing Home Administrators Board.

"It's a real honor for Lincoln County as a whole," said Keller.

The board reviews licensure issues for nursing homes and regularly revises regulations to enforce standards for licensing

home administrators. Keller is the administrator for Lincoln County Medical Center. He joins one other hospital administrator, two nursing home administrators, and a practicing physician on the nursing home board.

Keller replaces Robert Briggs of Santa Rosa. Briggs completed his term. Keller's term is set to expire June 30, 1990.

EPA offers grants

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) offers a citizens' grant for local Superfund sites.

The grant monies are provided to citizens' groups that may be affected by hazardous wastes at a Superfund site, said an EPA release.

Lincoln County has a Superfund site in Carrizozo at the Cimarron Mining and Milling site.

The grant is provided through EPA's Technical Assistance Grant (TAG) program. The TAG funds are to be used by a local citizens' group to secure service from a technical advisor to increase citizen understanding of information that will be

developed during the Superfund process.

Only one grant for a maximum \$50,000 is available for a single Superfund site.

To be eligible for the grant a group must incorporate and must meet a 20 percent matching funds requirement. A group may meet this requirement by providing cash, donated services, or a combination.



New Mexico traffic death figures are up and down

New Mexico traffic fatality counts for 1989 to date are well above the 1988 levels, according to records released last week by the State Highway and Transportation Department.

Preliminary figures for January to November 1989, show 490 deaths on New Mexico roads, compared to 459 for the same period in 1988, and 528 for those months in 1987.

For November alone, there were 49 deaths in 1989, compared to 34 in 1988, and 43 in 1987.

According to the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department, Lincoln County has recorded 11 fatal accidents and 12 fatalities as of the end of November. Otero County has recorded 10 fatal accidents and 11 fatalities as of the end of November.

The Village of Ruidoso has recorded one fatality as of the end of November. On November 21, 30-year-old Lee Roy May of Levelland, Texas, was killed in a motorcycle

collision with a pickup truck across from Ruidoso High School on Warrior Drive.

Discussing the year-to-date increase, Department Secretary Dewey Lonsberry said that although 1988's total was the lowest in two decades, he had hoped that 1989's death toll might be even lower, and he was concerned that things did not turn out so.

"The frustrating part of the problem is that its solution is well known," he said.


"Don't mix alcohol with driving, use occupant restraints and obey the rules of the road. The challenge is getting people to take those simple steps. It took centuries to get everyone to protect themselves by vaccination against smallpox, people are slow to change even when their lives are on the line."

John Fenner, Chief of the Department's Traffic Safety Bureau, elaborated on the 1989 traffic safety statistics. Surprisingly, Fen-

ner said, the death toll for New Mexico residents so far this year is slightly under 1988's, and all of the increase in total deaths is attributable to out-of-state visitors who died on our roads. One hundred-twelve non-residents died in January to November, 1989, compared to 78 for that same period in 1988.

Fenner also noted that New Mexico saw big drops in teenage and elderly traffic deaths in 1988, and for 1989 those figures are back to their former levels: 75 teenagers have died in crashes so far in 1989, along with 88 persons age 55 and over, compared to 55 and 75 respectively for 1988.

Seventy-eight percent of the 1989 victims in motor vehicles did not wear safety belts, including 21 of the 24 children who died. Overall, according to Fenner, 56 percent of the 1989 deaths involved drinking and driving.

Business education class surveys area merchants

The Ruidoso High School (RHS) Business Education Department wants to know more about businesses in the community.

"I would really like to have the input in the community, especially pertaining to the machines and computers that are used by Ruidosoans so we can try to meet the needs of the community in the

business education classes," said RHS business educator Judith A. Whitecotton.

One of the ways Whitecotton wants to help business operators is through a business co-op program. She wants to know if there are businesses that could hire students for five or more hours each week to join in her public/private partner-

ship plan.

"This is a real opportunity for the community because those students that train in their office just may stay on after graduation," said Whitecotton. "Look what a resource the community merchants have available to them," she added.

In efforts to find out more about area businesses, Whitecotton has

prepared a business education survey and distributed it to a number of businesses. But, she still needs to hear from more merchants.

The survey includes questions on business classification, number of employees, equipment used and skills required. Also included are questions about what the school is doing or could do to prepare high

school graduates to enter the job market.

Whitecotton asks everyone who received a survey in the mail, to take the time to complete it and return it to RHS. She'll provide copies of the survey for those who didn't receive one or, for whatever reason, didn't return the question-

naire. For more information, or to receive a survey, call Whitecotton at RHS, 258-4910.

"We hope to benefit both the student and the Ruidoso business community by providing a better prepared employee," said Whitecotton.




Capitol Comments

There Isn't Any Money Yet...

...In trash management, only cost. That much is obvious from the folks who showed up for the hearings of the interim Legislative Solid Waste Committee last week.

Who showed up were the entities who'll pay the cost of the new landfill regulations—the cities, counties, utilities, state officials, small business operators...

We're In A Mess...

...In American society, that seems clear. We've created a society in which everything has to be packaged and packaged again—we don't think tomatoes are as "good" somehow if they haven't been cleaned off and shrink-wrapped in plastic.

And we're creating mountains of trash. Add to that the toxicity of many of our household items we think we can't do without—all those solvents to replace the elbow grease—and we've got a helluva mess to dispose of, even without industrial wastes.

Dispose ... such a neat word. But the solutions are anything but neat.

Listening to the committee debating ways to assess liability if trash from one county pollutes the groundwater in another, I realized it's a complicated puzzle, gentle readers...

I Will Say This...

... I can't remember attending a legislative committee meeting with such frank and open discussion of the problems and such an atmosphere of working together—state officials, lobbyists, environmental groups, industry—to try to solve at least some of the problems.

Sometimes it's a great help for folks not to have some vested interest...

Besides Liability, of Course...

...The No. 1 problem is cost. How do we pay for being as careful as we'd like to be with the trash? Unless it's with outright direct appropriations of state money, the local governments are saying, it won't work.

They are resisting better'n a stubborn two-year-old any suggestion of "tipping fees" (i.e., a charge for dumping) that amount to anything. Charge on creaky rural Westerners very much

to dump their trash, the counties and small cities say, and the ornery et ceteras will just go dump it in the nearest mouthpiece.

Or, as committee mouthpiece John Jasper (he's the contract lawyer who keeps re-drafting their suggestions) put it in bureaucrats:

"We have to have the kind of planning that will produce a positive result, not a negative reaction."

Recycling The Trash...

...Is one way the discussion draft bill's author, state Sen. Roman Maes of Santa Fe, thought we could kill three birds with one stone—(1) cut down on landfill space; (2) conserve and re-use natural resources, and (3) bring some revenue into the local governments doing the recycling.

And so we go careening merrily on, up to our you-know-whats in our own trash.

Seems like if we mandated the governments to recycle, some free enterpriser out there would see an opportunity to make some money...






