Ski Apache opens for the season

For the first time in a couple of years, area ski shops and employees of Ski Apache had to work Thanksgiving Day.

Packed natural and man-made snow totaling 13 inches was enough to open several runs and draw approximately 1,900 holiday skiers to the Ruidoso area and Ski Apache.

"It's a whole lot better than last year," said Ruidoso Ski Rentals owner Buddy Carter.

Steed's Ski Sports owner Mike Steed was excited about having the business as well as the opportunity to ski.

"It was very far from the worst we've ever had. The people were coming in and asking if there really was anything to ski on, but they were quite happy for what there was to get out on."

The 13-inch base received another inch of very wet snow Sunday night before a steady sleet set in Monday morning. Rain turning to snow is expected for Monday evening and Tuesday morning for Ruidoso, so conditions at the mountain could get a lot better in a hurry.

"That real wet snow makes for good base higher up on the mountain," said Ski Apache manager Roy Parker.

Skiers were pleased with conditions on the mountain, although somewhat disappointed by the limited selection of runs open. One side of the Capitan run was open, as well as Lower Deep Freeze and the novice runs by lifts three and five. Chairs three, four and five were in operation.

"It was surprisingly good snow," said Steed. "There wasn't much available, but conditions were excellent. Capitan was good, too."

Alto Ski, the closest shop to the ski area other than Ski Apache's shop, opened up for Thanksgiving and employees there were most happy.

"At least we were open," one employee said. "Friday and Saturday were busier, of course, and everybody seemed to have a good time."

Area ski shop owners and Ski Apache employees were all excited about being open earlier than the last few years, and the prospect of having a good winter at the resort is encouraging to everybody in the

Ruidoso area, as the sooner the slopes open, the sooner all those tourist dollars get here for the rest of the winter.

"All we need is to get a little snow up on the top of Sierra Blanca," said one ski shop owner.

Sold! O-Bar-O goes for half a million

The huge main house of the O-Bar-O Ranch headquarters complex sits silently and almost ghostly facing a view of Sierra Blanca.

The status of the headquarters complex which includes five houses, two swimming pools, corrals, a pond and helicopter pad changed hands, Friday, when the mortgage holder purchased the property.

The 9,000 acres which make up the sprawling ranch proper were not involved in the purchase. Those acres are in litigation between the former owners and the Internal Revenue Service.

United Bank of New Mexico headquartered in Vaughn and with branches in Carrizozo, Esanica and Moriarty, Friday took over through foreclosure the 640 acres and improvements which make up the headquarters.

Some 20 acres of a mining claim where a spring is located was part of the package acquired by the bid.

The spring supplies water to the improvements on the property.

The main house, built in 1928, is huge. It contains more than 10,000 square feet and reportedly has seven bedrooms and even more bathrooms. It is

constructed mostly of native river rock as is one of the adjacent houses.

The bid matched exactly the amount of a mortgage held by the bank plus a special master fee and notice of sale. The amount was \$511,402.78.

An order of sale was entered by the United States District Court for the District of New Mexico, October 19, 1990.

United New Mexico Bank at Vaughn, a New Mexico banking corporation, is listed as plaintiff.

Defendants were the O-Bar-O Ranch, Inc., The United States of America, Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service, Carol Lietzman, individually and as the personal representative of the estate of Robert Lietzman, deceased.

Carolyn Lietzman Wilcox and her husband, Harry Wilcox, moved from the property to Tularosa a couple of months ago, according to Johnson Stearns, chairman of the board of United Bank of New Mexico. Making the bid Friday was Scott Shafer, president of the bank.

"Carolyn (Lietzman) has the right of redemption for 30 days," Stearns told The Ruidoso News. He said that if the property is not redeemed, the bank will immediately put it on the market.

"We are in the banking business, not the real estate business," said Stearns.

The bank took possession of the property Friday. It was auctioned off on the north steps of the Lincoln County courthouse at 10 a.m. Friday. An Alamogordo attorney, Gail Brownfield, was special master.

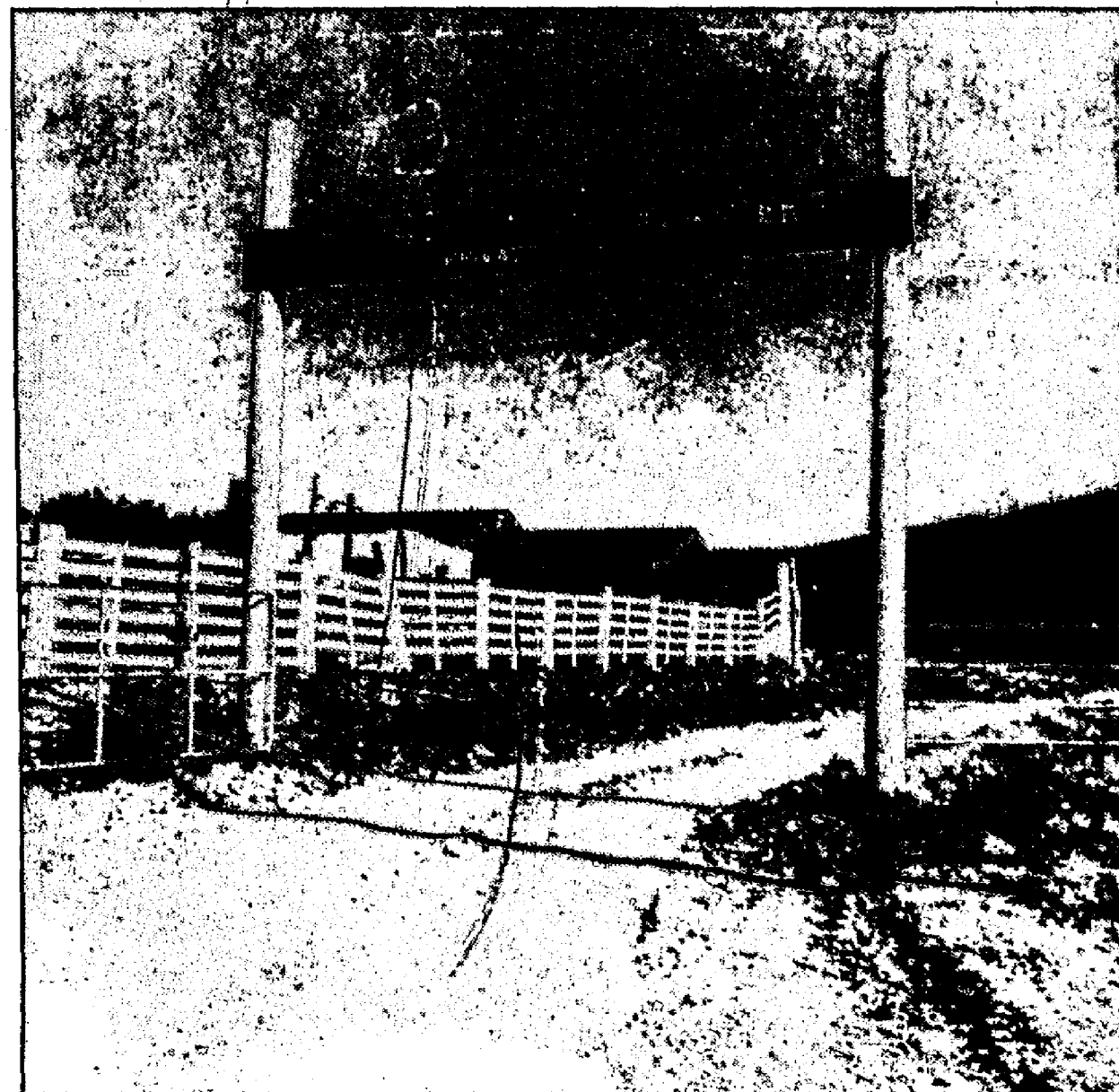
Stearns said Friday that if another bidder had offered \$1 more than the amount owed on the property, "it would have been his."

Carolyn Wilcox's late husband, Robert Lietzman, bought the ranch in the foothills east of Carrizozo about eight miles in the early 1980s. The ranch property rests against and in the foothills of mountainous terrain.

By 1983, Lietzman attempted to close a county road leading to the national forest and was fighting Lincoln County over the issue. He also was negotiating with the IRS over back taxes.

Lietzman was killed when a helicopter he was piloting crashed atop Carrizo Peak near the ranch about four years ago. He was traveling from Albuquerque to the ranch.

Lietzman lived in Southeast Asia before moving to New Mexico in 1980. He reportedly had become extremely wealthy through business interests abroad. Those interests included hotels, casinos and container ships.

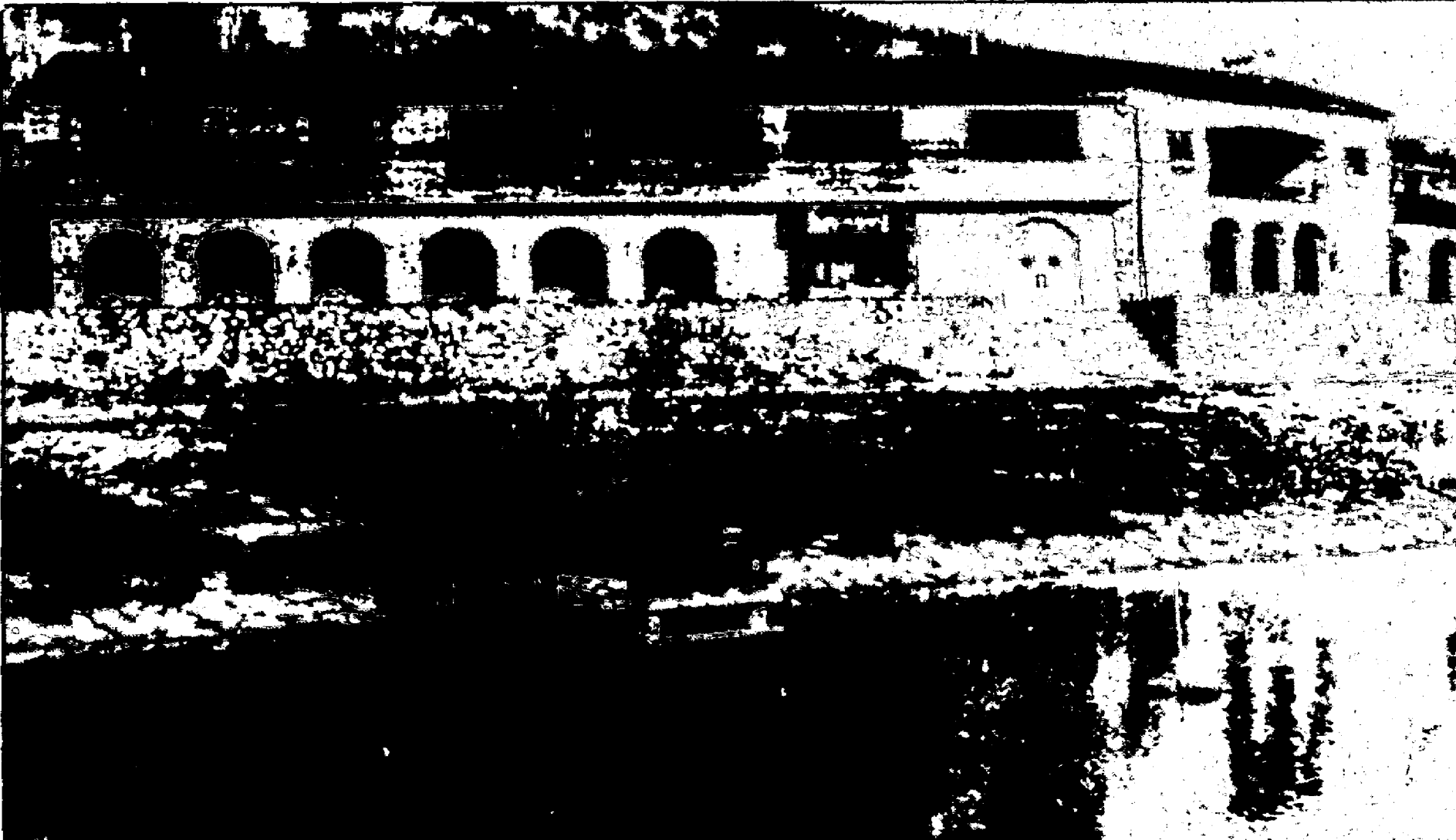


The O-Bar-O ranch headquarters complex is no longer private property. Title went to the United Bank of New Mexico, Friday, when the bank bid what was owed against the 640 acres and five houses which comprise the headquarters, located about eight miles east of Carrizozo and six miles off U.S. 380 toward the Carrizo Peak area.

FBI arrests a local man

Curtis Largo, 26, was arrested Tuesday at his Mechem Drive address and charged with criminal sexual abuse of a minor.

Federal Bureau of Investigation officers made the arrest.

James W. Nelson, special agent in charge of the FBI for New Mexico, said the arrest was the result of Largo's November 5, 1990, federal grand jury indictment for the offense.

Nelson said the arrest took place at the residence of a relative where Largo has been residing.

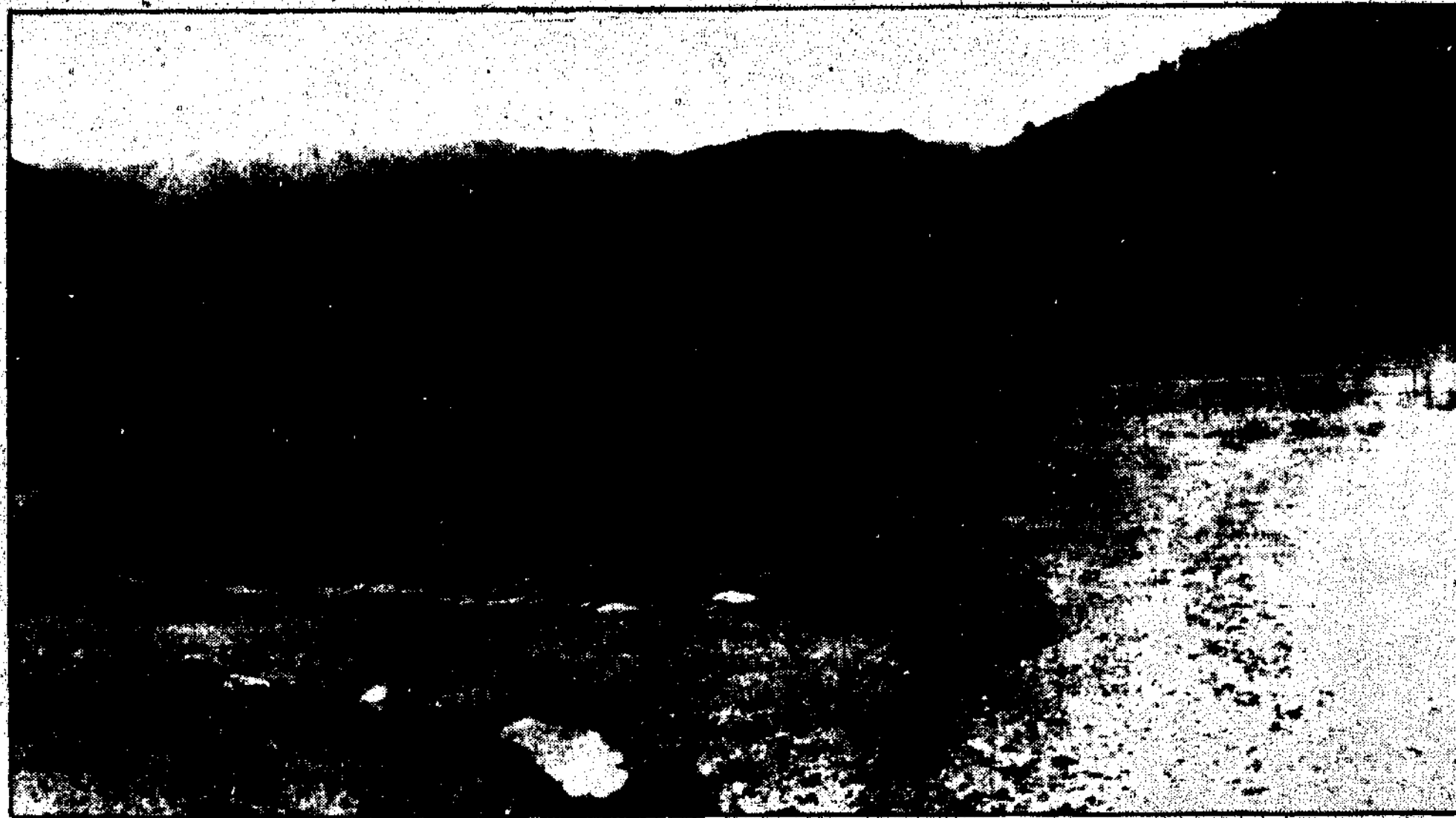
The indictment charges Largo with sexually abusing an 11-year-old Navajo Indian girl between August 1-4, 1989, on the Navajo Reservation at a residence near Ojo Encino, New Mexico.

Largo appeared before U.S. Magistrate John Darden in Las Cruces late Wednesday afternoon for a detention hearing.

Upon motion by defense counsel, the hearing was continued until Monday, November 26.

Largo remains lodged at the Dona Ana County Jail in Las Cruces.

If convicted of the offense charged, Largo faces a maximum of life in prison.

Before he was killed, Lietzman negotiated a \$3 million settlement with the IRS. However, the debt remains unpaid and has grown to between \$6 and \$8 million.

Most of the Wilcox's personal property has been removed from the premises. Several horses belonging to them graze around the headquarters area. A yellow cat roams the lonely premises, while a stuffed mountain lion, looking very

lifelike, stands guard in one of the living rooms of the mansion.

The headquarters complex came into being in 1928, Stearns, who is a history buff, recalls. The ranch was purchased and construction started in 1928 by a Chicago advertising executive, Arthur H. Kudner. Tom James was the foreman.

Stearns said a man by the name of Bill Leach bought the ranch in the late 1940s.

"He had a Rolls Royce ... with cottonseed cake in the back he used

to feed livestock," Stearns said.

The son of the original owner, Arthur Kudner Jr., bought the property back in the 1960s. He now lives in Centerville, Maryland.

He kept the property until the late 1970s. Lietzman reportedly paid \$2.2 million for the total ranch. His brother, Paul, managed the ranch for a time. Mack and Faye King were the long-time operators of the ranch through several owners. They were active from the late 1940s until the 1970s.

The Kudners and their friends were steady patrons of The Carrizozo Country Club, Stearns recalls. Stearns swam in the big over-size swimming pool on the property as a youth. He was invited out by Mrs. Kudner.

The headquarters complex needs a little TLC. A garden area is barren. Looking somewhat like a castle, the main house probably will be standing 200 years from now. And much more history will be written by then.

Council will take one more look at civic center plans

Civic-Events Center plans will be discussed at a special Village of Ruidoso Council meeting today at 2 p.m.

Clerk Tammie Maddox said the council will meet to hear and discuss proposed plans for the Civic-Events Center and any other business that may come before the governing body.

The regular village council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, November 27, at 6:30 p.m. A study session will be held at 5:30 p.m. prior to the meeting.

Tuesday's council items will include a notice of intent to appoint police chief; subsidy estimates for Mesa Airlines; and the Chamber of Commerce/Convention and Visitors Bureau-Revenue and Expenditure Statement.

The council will conduct a public hearing regarding an ordinance repealing and re-enacting section 6-6 and enacting a new section 6-6.1 of the Village of Ruidoso Code of Ordinances which provides for the removal of ruined or dilapidated

buildings and ruins, rubbish, wreckage and debris, and imposing a penalty.

Regular agenda items include a discussion of the convention bureau; a representative on the Water Defense Association Board; A resolution (90-29) setting forth certain procedures to be used in the disposition of surplus personal property of the Village of Ruidoso; and a request for a public hearing date on an ordinance regarding animal control.

Ruidoso Downs board meets today

Ruidoso Downs trustees will be dealing with a zoning matter this evening during a regular meeting at village hall.

Johnny Burke has applied for a zoning map amendment which would allow a mobile home park across from the Sports Arena.

Any protests will be heard tonight. No decision

is expected until the next meeting of the trustees, December 10.

Also on the agenda, according to Maurice Gudgel, village clerk, is a joint resolution which will make Ruidoso Downs part of the comprehensive sanitation district which will encompass the entire county.

Spring cleaning is scheduled for Carrizozo area Superfund site

Cleanup of the Cimarron Mining and Milling site in Carrizozo has been scheduled for the spring of 1991, according to an Environmental Protection Agency report recently released.

The site, which has a contaminated shallow groundwater supply due to improper storage of cyanide solutions in the discharge pit, underwent 10 months of remedial investigation to determine the extent of the contamination.

The groundwater will be pumped to the surface and dis-

charged to the municipal treatment works for treatment. The cyanide in the water will be reduced through natural degradation processes within the treatment plant that includes aeration, photodecomposition and effluent chlorination.

Water discharged from the site as well as treatment plant effluent and sludges will be monitored during the cleanup to ensure that no adverse impacts to the treatment processes.

During the remedial investigation, another nearby milling site

was discovered. Known as Sierra Blanca, the site has undergone a separate investigation. So far, two samples have been taken of well water in the area and tested clean. A third test of the water is scheduled for December.

Soil and air tests are also being conducted in Carrizozo around the site.

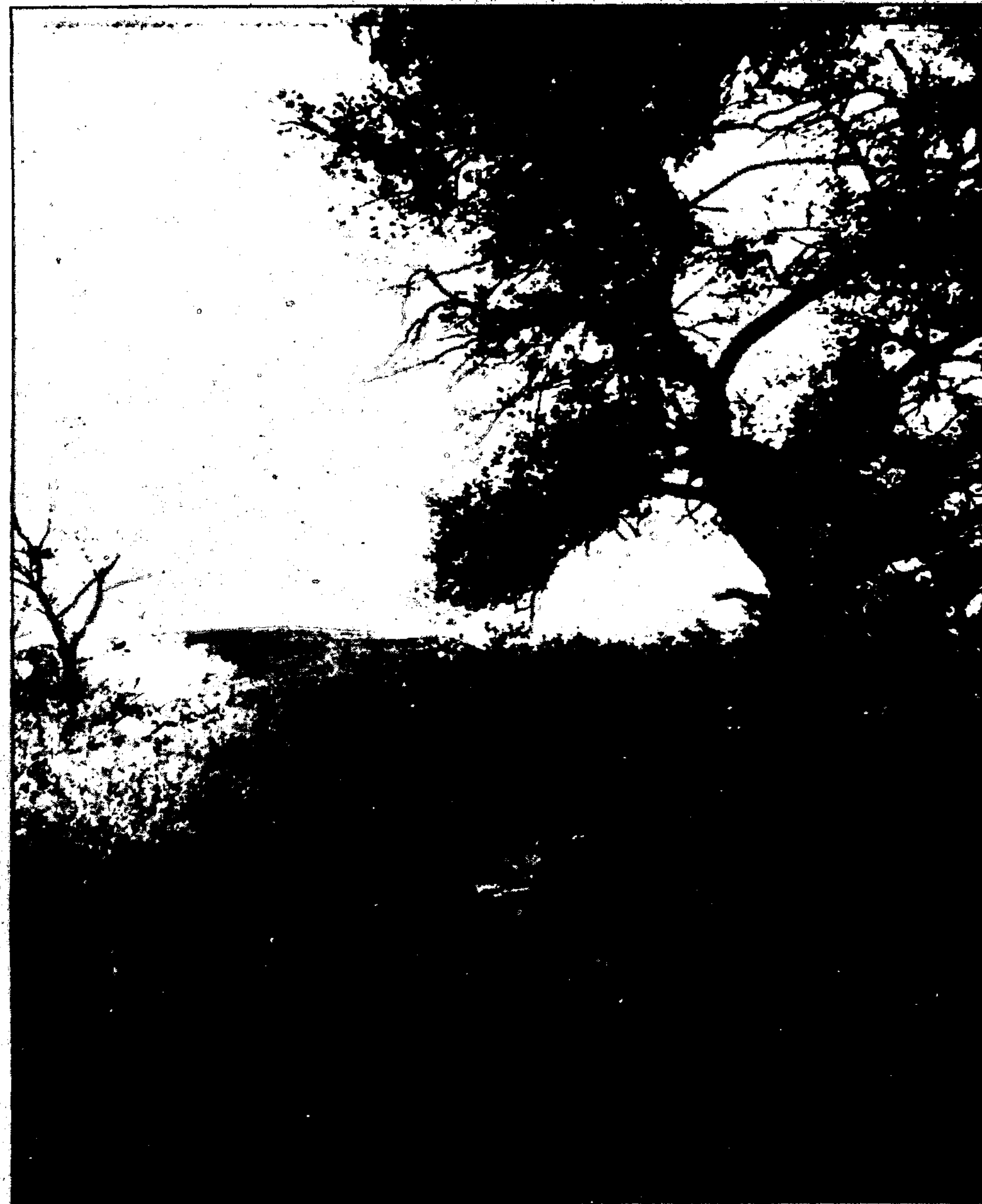
Testing at the Sierra Blanca site is expected to be finished in March or April of 1991.

Wright preserves pieces of the past

A legacy of the American West, guns played an important part in the heritage left by the men and women who helped tame the wilderness.

C.L. "Bones" Wright has preserved pieces of that special heritage right here in Ruidoso Downs.

Wright was given his first rifle 54 years ago at the age of 16.

"Everybody owned one gun back then," he said. But around 1946, he jumped way past the one gun mark. He even traded an old Model T Ford for some guns.

But Wright never imagined in those days that he would eventually amass a collection of more than 200 rifles, shotguns, pistols and specialty firearms as well as other Old West artifacts.

He never consciously decided to become a collector, Wright said. It just happened, and in a big way.

The walls of his lumber and hardware business on Highway 70 have been transformed into exhibits of old Spanish spurs marked by rotating spines as long as three inches.

"They were pretty hard on their horses back then," the soft-spoken Wright understated. More streamline versions, with single stationary spines favored by World War I cavalrymen and by 19th century cowboys, hang nearby.

Below the spurs is a crank telephone used by his wife's grandfather. Sheriff's badges, an assortment of pocket watches, old shaving gear and mother-of-pearl opera glasses also are numbered among his memorabilia.

Wright's preoccupation with collecting is backed by his wife,

Joetyne, who grew up in Lincoln County.

"She used to gripe when I added a gun," he said. "Now she gets mad if I talk about selling one."

Money has never really been a factor, Wright said. Many of the pieces on display he acquired from people who lived in the area, or their descendants. As they became aware of Wright's interest in Western history, he ended up with old family diaries, pen sets and pistols. One former teacher gave him a collection of fossils, arrowheads and pottery shards.

"A lot of people bring me things because they know I collect and won't just throw them out," Wright said.

One particularly interesting group of guns in his private collection, Wright purchased in Santa Fe. They are designed with trip wires and other traps to handle poachers, burglars and grave robbers. One is used as a door stop, another can be attached to a window-sill.

Others can be set like traps in burrows or along trails. An 1850 model fires through four rotating barrels, a precursor of the cylinder-type pistol, Wright said.

From an old store being dismantled in Capitan, Wright bought a safe and a box of odds and ends that included an 1849 accounting book and a diary detailing the travels of the ancestors of a local family from Missouri to Oklahoma. Covering the years from 1821 to 1902, it contains descriptions of camping along river banks, of meeting bands of Indians and of buying supplies.

Beef cost the pioneers a hefty 10-cents a pound.

Wedge between the diary's

pages, a slip of paper listed the ingredients for a sore throat home remedy.

A small newspaper clipping suggested goods to be sent to American troops during World War I. Recommended were soap, pencils, playing cards, shoestrings, dental cream, fruitcake, trench mirrors and talcum powder.

One of Wright's prizes is an original, complete set of pre-1940 Ka-bar knives, 43 of them in varying sizes and shapes, pocket knives, Bowie knives and a combination ax-knife.

Next to old tins of ammunition and used shell cartridges eight shotguns are mounted, including a Spencer Pump, crafted in the 1800s. Most came from families in the area.

Wright said they can't be fired with today's powerful ammunition.

"The barrels were made from wire melted together. That's called a Damascus barrel," he explained. "Modern shells could destroy them."

One section on the wall of his private collection is devoted to commemorative rifles, many with brass receivers and decorated with identifying coins embedded in their stocks.

"They only make a certain number of each model, so the older they are, the more expensive they become," Wright said.

Some items give glimpses into the everyday life of the pioneers.

In a display case are two early irons. The smaller was heated on a stove and then used to press clothes. The other, much larger and heavier model, was filled with charcoal and sported a pipe to vent the steam. A Civil War album bound in brass and a faded Log Cabin syrup

tin evoke distinct images.

Probably his oldest firearm is a flint lock called a Charleville. The French musket was used by Napoleon Bonaparte's Grand Army.

Although he has no papers to prove their authenticity, Wright also believes one of his pistols once belonged to Poncho Villa and one of his pocket watches was lifted by Billy the Kid from the body of a mortally wounded companion.

Wright, former mayor of Ruidoso Downs, enjoys sitting back in his office chair and reminiscing about his early years in town.

When he moved to the area in 1946, everybody knew everybody else, Wright said. The road from El Paso was only dirt. The trip took seven hours. But the Texans kept coming all through the summer.

After Labor Day, the town closed down until the next summer season, he said. Saturday night meant dancing at the Navajo Lodge. But just like the lifestyle of the '40s, the lodge is gone today.

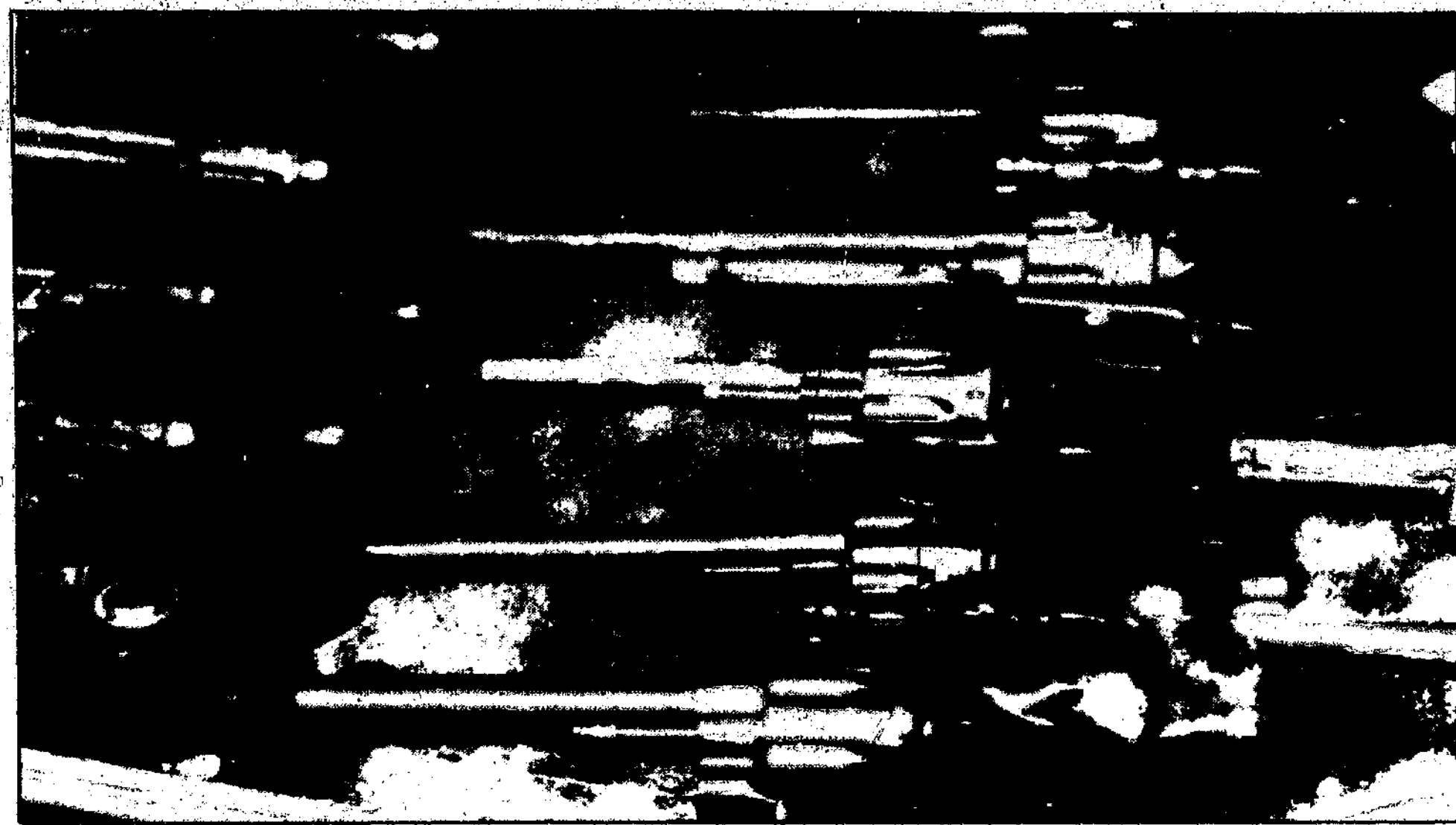
Wright's nickname "Bones" has nothing to do with his penchant for collecting antiques. It was more a reflection of his physique when he

was younger.

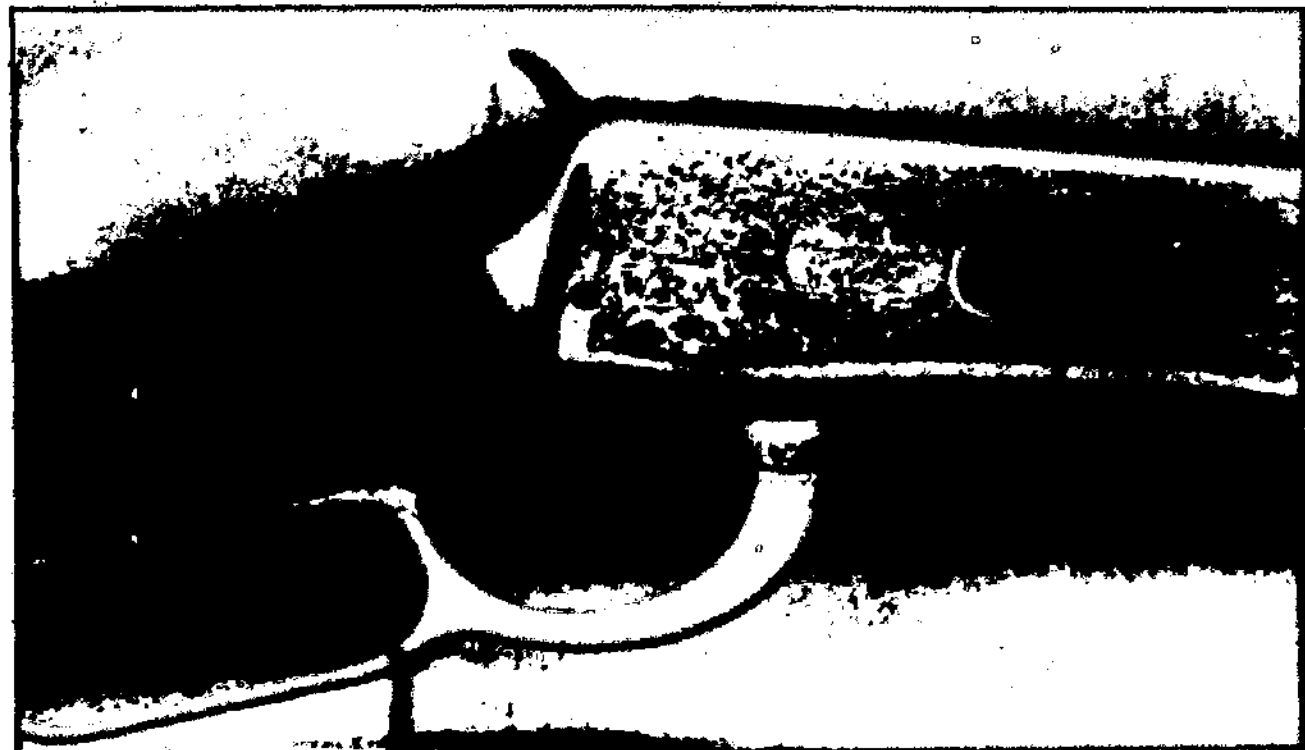
While he was living in Rockwall County, Texas, "A hurricane nearly blew me away," Wright said. "My brother grabbed me. I was always skinny until I went into the Navy (one of nine men in the family in the Armed Forces). I weighed 140 pounds when I joined and when I came out four years later in 1945, I was up to 220 pounds."

But his nickname stuck. And so has his fascination with guns and other throw-backs to the past.

"I just always loved them," he said.

Conference is designed for growers

Hondo Valley apple growers might be interested in an apple growers' conference set for January 11-12 in Albuquerque.

The base of the New Mexico apple grower often is having more apples than he can sell. To help alleviate apple gluts, New Mexico State University's Cooperative Extension Service will sponsor its first such conference in seven years.

What's on the program?

"Marketing, marketing, marketing," said extension horticulturist Estaban Herrera. Michigan and NMSU experts will present information on all aspects of marketing on Saturday morning, January 12.

"Growers need more and better markets," Herrera said. "They also need to produce more per acre at a lower cost."

Orchard management, which chemicals currently are labeled for use in apple orchards and new techniques that either increase yield or efficiency also will be discussed.

"The wise producer will keep up with these, or he won't be competitive anymore," Herrera said.

5 Warriors make All District team

Portraying a team with more balance than stars, the 1990 3AAA all district football selections placed a host of Ruidoso Warriors on the top two teams as well as a number of honorable mentions.

Warrior head football coach Mike Speck said the strong showing in this political arena showed the respect other coaches had for Ruidoso players.

Speck said he was especially proud of this Warrior team because of the courage it showed in overcoming adversity.

"Our ability to overcome every single adverse thing all season long and treat it like a new challenge

was remarkable," he said.

Speck's Warriors bowed out early, but did not go unnoticed in the final Associated Press poll. Lovington received nine first place votes, Ruidoso, ranked 10th in the final polls, grabbed the remaining first place vote.

The Warriors were subjected to a number of early season injuries and were well past the midway point before a totally healthy squad ran on field.

The strength of this year's team was measured again by the AP who had them ranked seventh although the Warriors record was 3-5 after the Oñate win.

After losing the season's first five games, this Warrior team had the district wrapped up after the Silver City win, with no way to lose, except one. That one occurred when a grade ineligible fourth stringer entered the game for three plays during the Silver 52-18 blow out and caused Speck to forfeit the Silver game.

Adversity shaped the destiny of the Warriors in the final game at Cobre. Before the game Speck lost another key player to ineligibility. That must game carried the district on the line. The Warriors roared back from a 27-0 halftime deficit, to lose 34-28. Many thought one more

possession was all that was needed, but time ran out on the game and the season.

"We were the best overall team in the district," Speck said. "Many of our players deserved to be on the first team. I'm so very proud of all of them."

Players on the all district first team defense are Kief Johnson linebacker, Johnson was rated the best linebacker in the district; and Heath Huey who gained the most votes for the best secondary safety in the district.

On the second team, junior Craig Turner was named defensive end; Jamie Candelaria, safety; and

Chris Torres, cornerback.

Honorable mentions were awarded junior Keith Henson at defensive end; Mario Portillo, defensive tackle; Ryan Morgan, defensive tackle; Steve Dankert, linebacker; James Atwood, linebacker; and junior Richard Rippy, linebacker.

The agenda will also include discussion of a proposed bear and mountain lion pursuit season.

The total number of elk licenses would increase 17 percent, from 22,788 to 27,510, in the regulation drafted by the commission. That would mean 1,478 new licenses on private land and 3,244 on public land.

Changes in deer hunts, designed to cut back on the number of bucks taken in certain areas, will also be up for approval by the commission.

Some deer hunts will be during the week instead of the weekend, and the total number of hunters afield may decrease by about 10,000, because of new restrictions.

Public elk licenses, and other licenses subject to a drawing, would have to be submitted April 27.

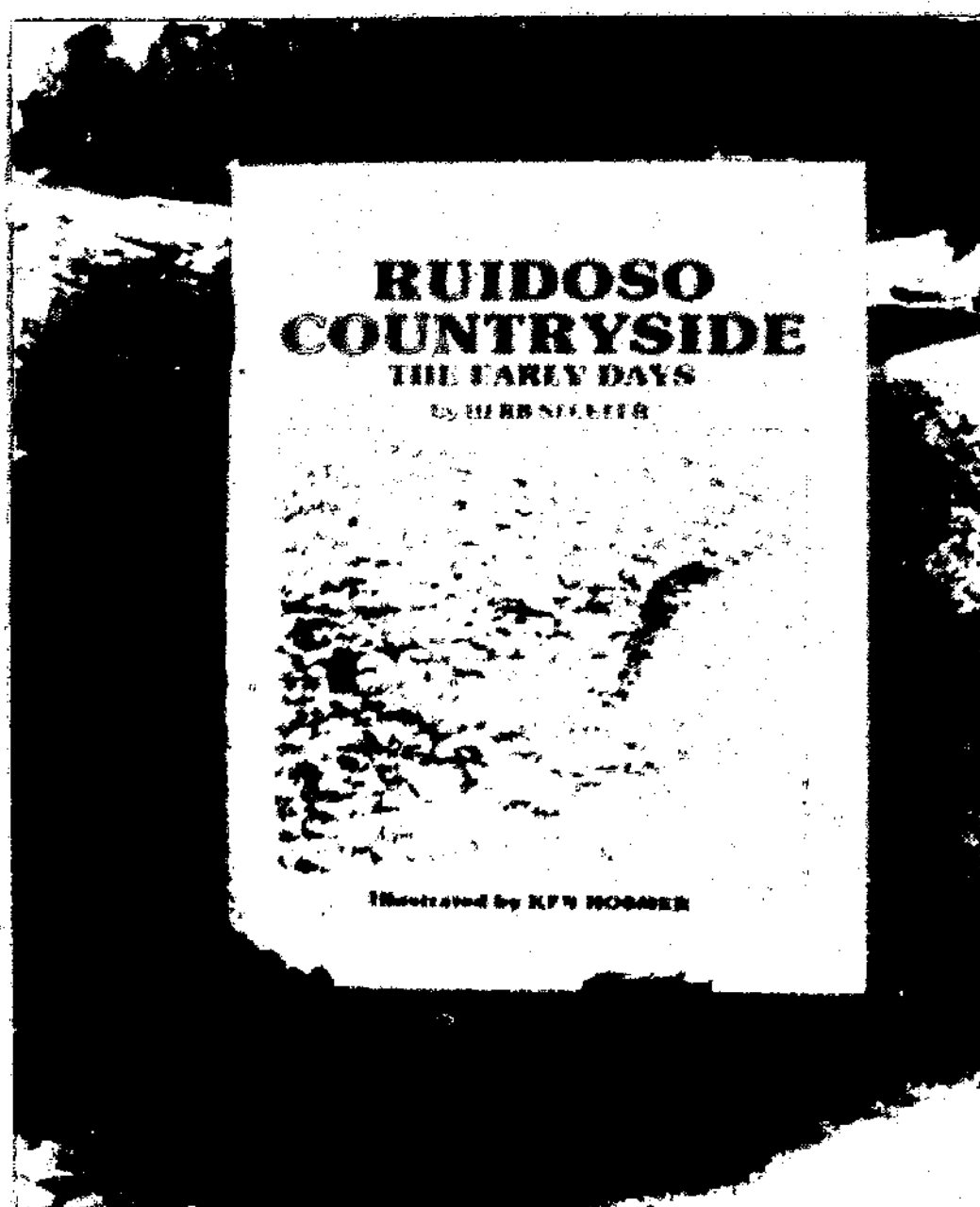

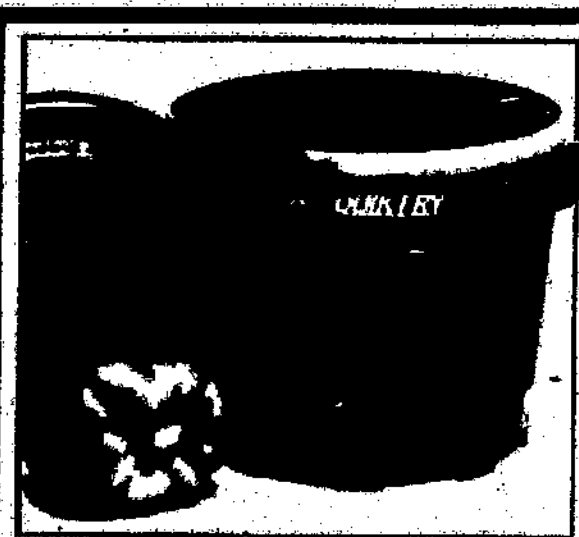
Pursuant to Section 7-31-50 of the New Mexico Property Tax Code, a minimum penalty of five dollars (\$5.00) or one percent per month must be charged on all delinquent accounts.

Pursuant to Section 7-38-53, property taxes are the personal obligation of the owner of the property on January 1 of the tax year and the Sale or transfer of property within that tax year does not relieve the former owner of personal liability for property taxes in that year. Failure to receive a bill is not sufficient cause to ask to have penalty and interest waived, nor does it relieve the owner of responsibility to pay his taxes.

Owners of personal property, such as mobile homes or office equipment, who have allowed taxes to become delinquent more than two years will be served with a demand warrant for collection of these delinquent taxes, pursuant to Section 7-38-53 of New Mexico Statutes Annotated 1978, if delinquent taxes are not paid in full by May 10, 1991.

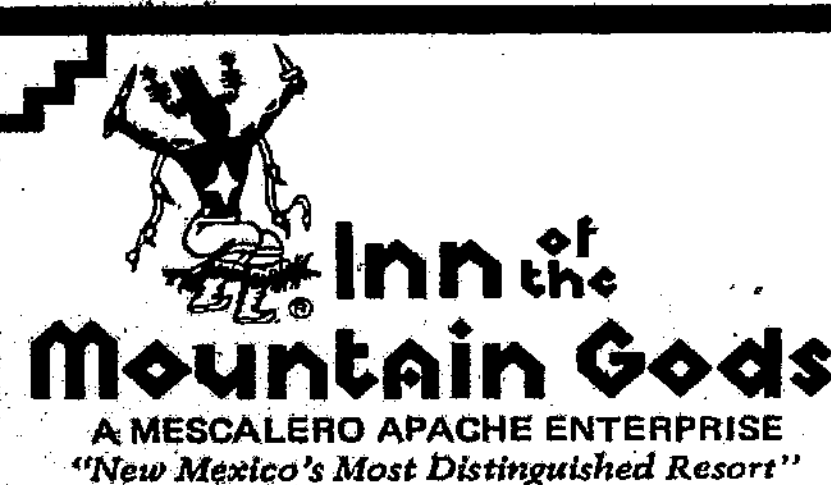

Stratton makes fastest handoff in history

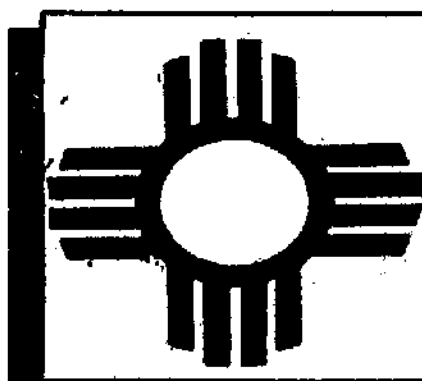
From The Fastest Handoffs in History Department:

By Order dated July 6, 1990, the Court has determined that this litigation shall proceed as a class action with four (4) subgroups defined as all persons or entities who acquired one or more shares of the common stock of Moncor by purchase or exchange before December 31, 1984 through (a) the 1982 First National Bank of Lea County exchange offering, (b) the 1982 Public Offering, (c) the 1983 Bank of the Southwest exchange offering, and (d) the 1983 Public Offering and 1983-84 open market purchases, excluding the following: All Defendants herein, including the former Officers and Directors of Moncor individually named as Defendants; members of the immediate families of any Defendants; any entity in which any individual Defendant has a controlling interest; and the legal representatives, successors, or assigns of any such excluded party. Also excluded is the Moncor Employee Stock Ownership Plan, and any person who settled with Defendants as approved by Court Order dated June 16, 1987. The four subgroups are hereinafter together referred to as "The Class".

A complete and final settlement has been reached in the Actions between the Class, the six (6) individually named former officers or directors of Moncor (hereinafter "Director Defendants"), and all other officers and/or directors of Moncor. This settlement is embodied in a Settlement Agreement dated November 5, 1990 (the "Settlement") on file with the Court. This is a partial settlement only. The case will continue against the remaining defendants: MBank of Dallas, N.A. and Peat, Marwick, Main.

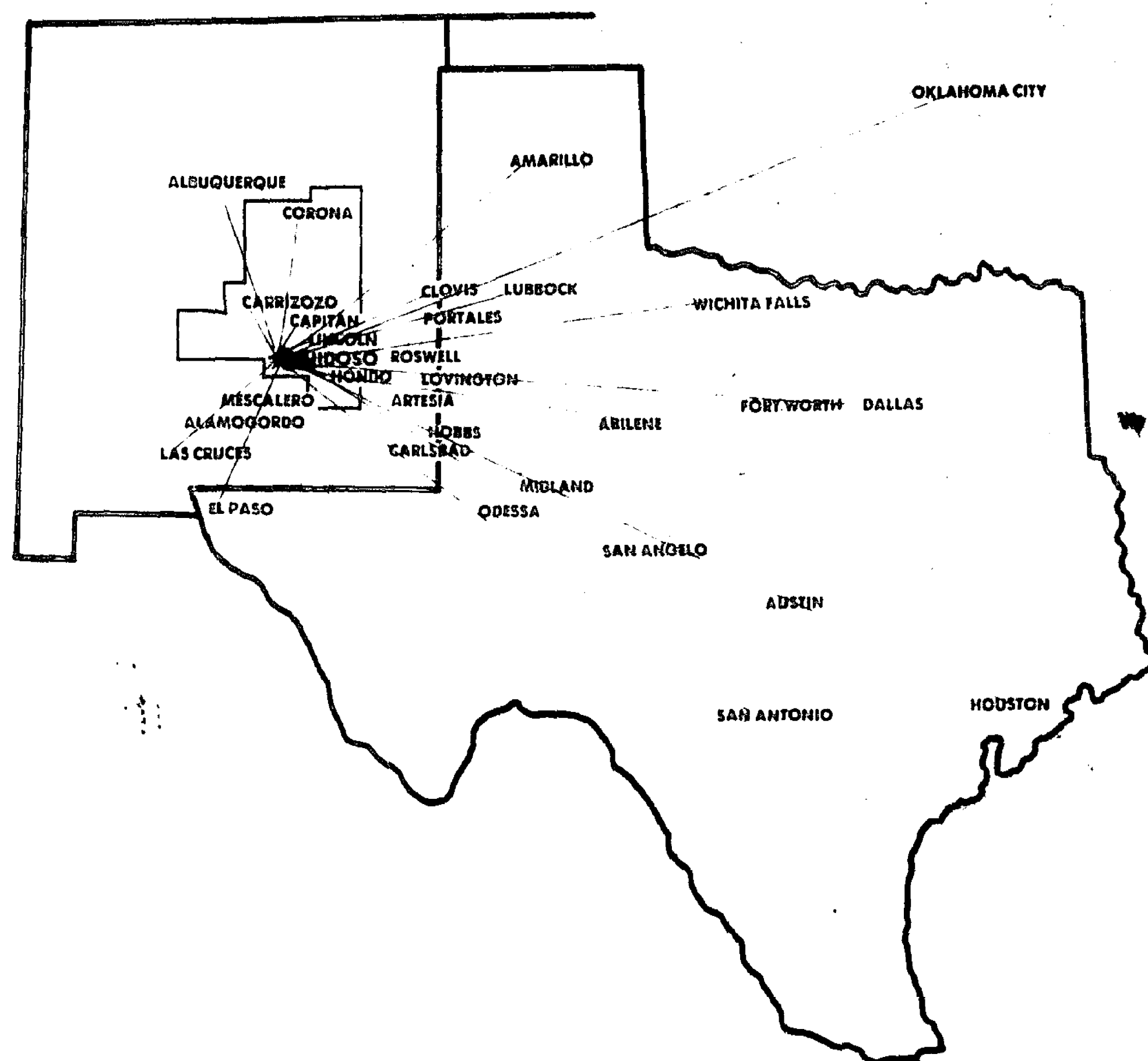
