Early census figures are low

Preliminary U.S. Census figures indicate the Village of Ruidoso's official population after the 1990 accounting is 4,581.

That's barely over the 1980 census figure of 4,260, and down slightly from the special evaluation in 1986, when Ruidoso's population was estimated at 5,260.

Even as conventional indicators point to growth in the Village of Ruidoso, the preliminary census reports show basically no growth, or even a loss of population.

"I had expected the population to go up," said Cleatus Richards, village planning administrator, who also was the official liaison with the Census Bureau.

Besides the preliminary population figure, the Census Bureau's early report showed total housing in Ruidoso at 6,656, vacant housing at 4,769 and group quarters population at 76. Richards said the group quarters number is a count of residents of Ruidoso Care Center.

Those four figures are all that has been provided so far, said Richards, who has responded to the preliminary count with a letter in which he questions the population figure.

"I feel it's understated," said Richards, who has good reason to question the entire census report.

"I was the liaison, and I had trouble getting information," said Richards.

"I called the census contact person and I was never able to get very accurate information," said Richards, recalling all the confusion that surrounded the entire process.

Early on Ruidoso residents were provided with misinformation from the Census Bureau. Residents were told, through news releases and announcements provided by that federal agency that they would be receiving their forms in the mail. They were instructed to fill out the form and mail it back to the Census Bureau.

As it turned out, Ruidoso was scheduled for a house-to-house count, and the forms were delivered to the post office without mailing addresses.

Teens arrested after shooting

A drama that included a stolen pickup, a high-speed chase, a wreck, a hostage, and a shooting, ended when two teens were arrested about 6:30 p.m. Friday in Picacho.

Freddy Baca, 15, of Ruidoso Downs and William Russell Reel, 17, of Hobbs were arrested at the home of Lucas Carrillo outside Picacho. The two are each charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, aggravated burglary and unlawful taking of a motor vehicle.

Baca and Reel, who escaped earlier from the Portales Reintegration Center, were taken into custody after Carrillo held the pair at gunpoint and tied them up.

Another Picacho man was shot in the leg by one of the two escapees earlier in the afternoon as the pair tried to get transportation to leave the area after they wrecked a truck stolen earlier in Ruidoso Downs.

Currently, they are being held at the Otero County Juvenile Detention Center in Alamogordo.

The drama unfolded Friday morning when the pair went to the home of Baca's mother. After leaving there, they went to the home of Baca's uncle and took his pickup truck and headed east on U.S. Highway 70. The fugitives were passing through San Patricio when Pete Baca, the owner of the truck, spotted his truck as he and his wife were returning from Roswell.

"I turned around and headed after them," the older Baca said. "First, I came up behind them and flashed my lights. When

that didn't do anything, I pulled up beside them. They saw me that time and really took off."

Baca didn't try to keep up with the youths as they sped away. "The truck only had about three-quarters of a tank of gas, and from the way they were driving, I knew they wouldn't make it to Roswell," he said.

Pete Baca didn't have to wait so long before they stopped, however.

Traveling at speeds estimated greater than 100 miles per hour, the fugitives were trying to pass a Camaro when they had to swerve back into the east-bound lane and hung the truck's front end up on a guardrail.

"We were just headed back to Texas when they came up real fast behind us," said Oscar Kinnebrugh

of Liberty Hill, Texas. "They tried to pass us on the right, but the guardrail was there, then they tried to pass on the left and another car was coming in quick. I slammed on the brakes to let them by, but they did, too. I stepped on the gas quick and watched them swerve into the guardrail right behind me."

Kinnebrugh and his wife, along with several other witnesses to the accident, pulled over as the escapees ran toward a house about 200 yards off the highway.

According to New Mexico State Police officer Steve Standridge, the youths broke into the house and tried to get the keys to another vehicle so they could continue their flight. The two were armed with a .38-caliber Colt snubnose handgun reportedly taken from the truck

when they ran.

Cesar Holquin, 20, was alone in the house of a friend when the pair broke in. The youths took him outside, demanding keys to one of the cars. Reportedly, Holquin was taken back into the house where the pair continued their demand for keys. Before heading back out to the driveway, one of the boys shot Holquin through the upper left leg.

Three more shots were fired into the vehicles before the teens headed for the Rio Hondo. They took flight when they heard the sirens of the approaching State Police.

Holquin reached the highway where he was helped to the bed of a pickup truck to await an ambulance. Holquin was transported to the Lincoln County Medical Cen-

ter where he was admitted and treated. He was released Sunday.

Meanwhile, State Police officers and sheriff's deputies began their search of the river bottom.

"Sal Beltron (New Mexico State Police) and I covered about two miles of the river from the west while three deputies made a sweep from the east," said Standridge. "We gave up the search after we lost their tracks."

Meanwhile, the escapees were hiding in the hills above the Rio Hondo.

"I figured that they were probably watching us," continued Standridge. "Once it got dark and we left the area, they were going to come out of hiding. We warned some of the area residents that the subjects were in the area."

Shortly after 6 p.m., the pair went to the home of Lucas Carrillo and offered to pay him if he would take them into town.

According to Standridge, Carrillo pulled out a rifle and disarmed the gun bearer, then tied the two up out in his yard and notified the State Police.

The two were arrested at approximately 6:30 p.m. Since Lincoln County has no juvenile facilities, the teenagers were taken to the Otero County facilities.

The district attorney will decide whether the youths will be tried as adults or juveniles, as the charges against them are third degree felonies.

Pending the outcome of criminal proceedings, Baca and Reel could be returned to Portales or sent to a higher security prison.

Snows attract lots of visitors

Nothing cures Ruidoso's blues like snow.

Area lodging facilities and ski shops are doing a booming business this holiday season after two years of little Christmas snow and few Christmas skiers.

Ski Apache has received at least 45 inches of snow in the past three weeks, allowing officials at the ski area to open all runs and operate every lift. According to Patricia Morrison at Ski Apache, more than 6,000 skiers hit the slopes from December 21 through Christmas Day.

"We're just delighted about all the snow," said Morrison. "We've been recommending to the visitors that they get up the mountain early if they need to rent equipment. The shop has run out of the more common sizes pretty quick."

Ski area officials are suggesting that late-arrivers to the ski area rent their equipment in town.

That suits the area ski shops just fine, and those shops, too, reported renting out most of their equipment each day this past weekend.

For the last three years, Ski Apache has had to rely on machine-made snow to provide enough of a base to ski on.

After Friday morning's four inches of snow, the ski area was hit by some sleet, but Morrison said that the temperature is dropping and the snow is expected to continue.

Saturday was a good indicator of how busy the resort has been over the holiday. Long lift lines were

common at the base of the mountain despite periodic snowfall and poor visibility higher up the slopes.

"The meteorologists that keep in touch with us have all said we're due to get a bunch more snow."

Down at the bottom of the mountain, area innkeepers are working hard to keep up with the demands of a full house.

At Inn of the Mountain Gods, the Ruidoso area's largest hotel, the occupancy rate since Christmas weekend has been well over 90 percent.

The reservation desk at the hotel said all 250 rooms for Friday and Saturday nights were booked, and that the few rooms left for Sunday and tonight would probably be taken soon.

Dana Bradshaw at the Carrizo Lodge said all rooms were booked through New Year's Day.

And at the Chamber, the phones have been ringing constantly for the last three or four days.

"Some of the motels have contacted us with their availabilities," said Anita Hansen. "But all we've been able to do is steer them in some direction."

Many of Ruidoso's visitors are sporting Texas and Mexico license plates. But a good percentage of the Texas plates are rentals from car

agencies at El Paso's airport.

Lodgers and merchants said a very high percentage of the holiday visitors are from Mexico.

"My Spanish has really improved here in the last week," said Clark Carpenter at Dan Dee Cabins. "Our season started on December 15, and from now until after the New Year we're booked solid. I just can't think of a better Christmas than this one."

Swiss Chalet Inn is another of the larger hotels in the area that is booked solid with skiers. All 82 rooms have been booked from Christmas Day through tonight.

Most of the lodgings contacted replied that they were booked to at least 90 percent occupancy through New Year's Day, but on January 2, many of the visitors will be headed back home and back to work.

While the lodging figures are one good indicator of the big numbers of visitors in the area, many of those visitors are staying in privately-owned homes and condominiums.

They're boosting business in restaurants, supermarkets, video rental stores and T-shirt and gift shops.

Tourist-industry and related businesses will be looking back on Christmas 1990 as one of the most successful in years.

When workers began the house-to-house count, Ruidoso residents began calling Richards to ask when they would be visited.

"I had tons of calls from people who were not being counted," said Richards, who was only able to give those callers the special number to call. One of those callers informed The News that she was told to mail her form, and was given that address.

Others who called, reported that they were told to leave their forms on their front doors.

"That kind of thing leads me to believe the count was not that good," said Richards.

Over the past, few years, the schools have experienced some

growth, housing starts are up, building activity is on the upswing and there are just a lot of indications that Ruidoso is growing at a greater rate than 300 people over the past 10 years.

Mary Wimberly of the Water Department said that the Village of Ruidoso had 6,710 water customers (meters) as of the end of November. Of that total, 6,237 are residential and 473, commercial.

Those figures aren't necessarily indicative of growth or no-growth, since many homes are owned by part-time residents. Wimberly said 67 to 70 percent of the water bills are mailed outside Ruidoso.

Richards isn't sure when final census figures will be announced.

Recycle that old, dry Christmas tree

Tired of that Christmas tree shedding on the carpet? Recycle it.

The Village of Ruidoso Sanitation Department is making that possible.

This year, the Village of Ruidoso asks that village residents dispose of Christmas trees by taking them to one of five drop-off points located around town.

The Sanitation Department uses different trucks to pick up trees, and for this reason was making two passes through the same area to haul away two different types of waste.

The five drop-off locations are:
—Fire Station #2 on White Mountain Drive.

—The free parking lot on Sud-
derth (near the dumpsters but not in them).

—The parking lot across the

street from the old Whispering Pines Restaurant on Main Road in the Upper Canyon.

—Schoolhouse Park on Sudderth near the dumpsters.

—Village of Ruidoso Sanitation Department on Gavilan Canyon Road.

The trees will be run through a chipper and the mulch will be used in village parks. The public is invited to bring a plastic bag to the department and pick up a bag of chips for use at their own home. There is no charge for the material.

The Sanitation Department is already making the rounds of the pick-up points, and will haul off trees through January 15. Questions or requests for assistance may be directed to the department at 257-4090.

In 1990, 3,503 New Mexico adults and younger Junior Volunteers chose to provide volunteer service to their local hospitals and did so with impressive numbers of hours and funds raised in support of the health care needs of their community.

Albuquerquean Peggy Rueb, president of the New Mexico Hospital Association Auxiliaries, a superior support group of New Mexico hospitals, provides interesting statistics.

She says that 3,503 auxilian members around the state provided 514,345 volunteer hours to their local hospitals and raised \$534,776

for their hospitals the past year.

The Lincoln County Medical Center Auxiliary often has been recognized as being a "top producer" in fund raising to benefit the hospital here.

Most auxiliary income in Ruidoso comes from the Thrift Shop operated by auxiliary volunteers.

At the annual meeting of the New Mexico Hospital Association in the fall, three auxiliaries were singled out for Honor Roll Awards in recognition of the number of hours they had contributed.

They are Mollie Cerny, 21,198 hours, Silver City; Adelaide Glaser, 17,564, Gila; and Thelma Armstrong, 17,019 hours, Farmington.

Inez Tanner of Ruidoso is secretary of the statewide auxilian organization.

Food drive is a big success

Ruidoso optometrist Terry Marquardt said his recent project to benefit the Lincoln County Food Bank was a big success.

Dr. Marquardt, who has offices in the Sierra Professional Building, conducted a matching food drive to benefit the non-profit food distribution center that aids families in the Lincoln County area.

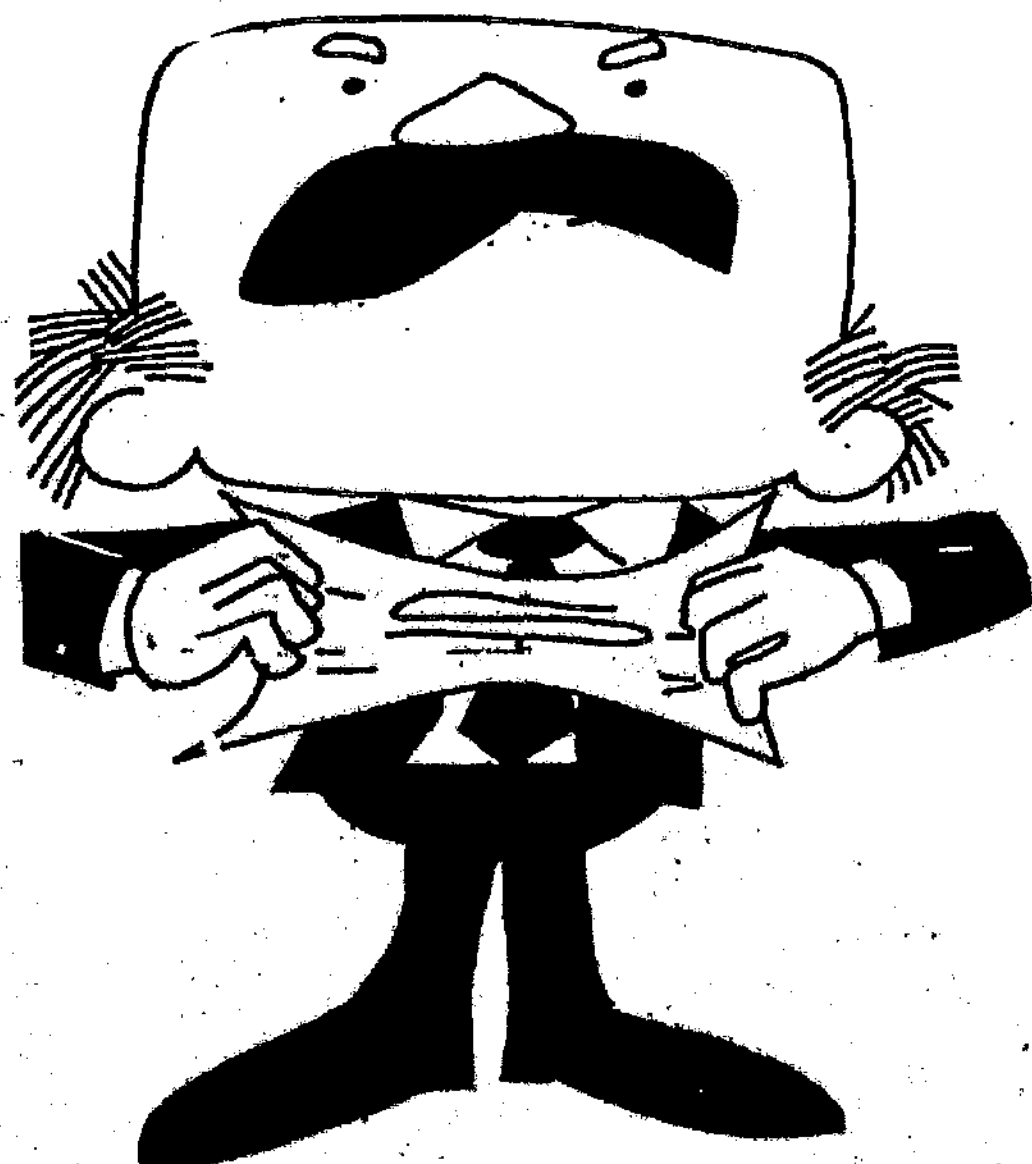

IRS warns of a scam to bilk taxpayers

The Internal Revenue Service warns people about a nationwide scheme involving individuals impersonating IRS employees.

"The scheme begins with a message that the person has just won a new, expensive car, but they have to pay the tax of varying amounts,

around \$500, to the spokesman on the phone who claims to work for the IRS," said William Wauben, director of the Albuquerque District IRS.

At least one New Mexican has been contacted by this person and

paid the \$500 demanded.

"Payments of taxes are designated to the Internal Revenue Service, not an individual," Wauben said.

If people have doubts about taxes owed or about how or where to make payments, they should con-

tact the IRS. He pointed out they can call toll free 1-800-829-1040.

Anyone suspecting that he or she was contacted by an impersonator should call Internal Revenue Service Inspection at (505) 766-8904.

The recreational facilities in the county are becoming more widely recognized, and we are beginning to see more Arizona and California plates.

The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce advertising initiative to reach the tourism dollars in those states is beginning to have an effect, and continued efforts in that direction will result in an ever increasing market share from those states.

Further, it is clear that the Texans are regaining their economic strength and are returning to play in Texas' favorite playground ... Ruidoso and Lincoln County.

Oil industry analysts are not prognosticating that the price of oil will hold at the \$25 per barrel level, which is sufficient to induce exploration and development of oil resources. Downhole and production of the logging business is up in Texas as much as 50 percent.

And, there are new attractions in the works. The new golf course is completed and ready for play in the spring, and a new resort hotel will be built.

The Village of Ruidoso will construct a new events center which will alleviate existing limitations and allow aggressive marketing to conventions and trade shows.

Thanks to Jackie Spencer, Ruidoso also is scheduled to build a performing arts center. R.D. Hubbard has arranged to relocate the Ann Stradling Museum to the county from its present location in Arizona, and the Hubbard Art Collection is gaining worldwide recognition.

Prediction: Lincoln County will become one of the top cultural centers in the Southwest in the next decade.

We could go on and on, but we believe the above is sufficient to prove a point.

There is plenty of evidence to support significant optimism for the future.

It is time to call a truce to the Lincoln County War and pull together to enhance the boom and the prosperity ahead.

State Game Commission adopts hunting calendar dates for the 1991-92 season

The State Game Commission adopted hunting season and bag limits for 1991-92 at a recent meeting in Albuquerque.

The Commission ordered a change to a drawing system for distributing deer licenses next year.

Significant changes for the 1991 deer season include a bag limit of at least a forked-horn buck for all deer hunts; changes for deer hunt dates; and an increase of about 3,500 elk licenses for public and private land hunts statewide.

Highlights of the meeting include:

Deer

Rifle deer hunts will be split into nine periods for 1991-92. Most of the north and east will have three hunts, as in the past: November 2-3 (Saturday-Sunday); November 6-10 (Wednesday-Sunday); November 13-19 (Wednesday-Tuesday). The north-central area near Taos and Tres Piedras (Region C) will be open September 30-October 2 (Monday-Wednesday) and October 5-9 (Saturday-Wednesday).

Most south-central and south-western regions have rifle hunts November 6-7, November 13-14 (both Wednesday-Thursday), and November 16-18 (Saturday-Monday). Most of the Gila area in Unit 16, except for designated

wilderness, remains closed to rifle deer hunting. The San Mateo and Magdalena Mountains in Unit 17 will be open February 1-5 only.

The commission's stated goal is to decrease the number of deer hunters and thereby increase the number of bucks remaining in the population.

Bow hunts will generally be August 31-September 22 and January 18-February 2. Extended seasons remain in effect in Sugarite Canyon State Park and the Sandia Mountains. Muzzle-loader deer season will be September 14-22.

Bag limit will be a forked-horn buck, rather than a buck with antlers of at least two inches as at present. The Commission felt this move would decrease illegal kills of female deer.

Hunters may still buy a license over the counter in 1991. They will continue to specify their choice of bow, muzzle-loader or rifle, and rifle hunters will continue to choose one hunt period and hunting region. Choices may be changed any time up until the start of the hunting season.

In 1992, however, the state will move to a system of applications and drawings for deer licenses statewide, as is now being done in Arizona, the commission voted. The

Department of Game and Fish is to begin working implementing the drawing system, including recommending license numbers for all game units, similar to what is done now for elk and antelope.

Following an emotional appeal from friends and relatives of Freeman Davis, a Lindrith man who was killed in November as he tried to halt an alleged deer poacher, the Game Commission voted to ban deer hunting in that area in 1991. Game unit 5 was split into Unit 5 and Unit 5A; national forest lands near Lindrith will remain open to hunting.

Game Department Director Bill Montoya said he is recommending that the Legislature be asked to stiffen penalties for spotlighting and taking big game out of season, including mandatory jail sentences and forfeiture of vehicles used in the crime. Society's attitude toward poaching must change, he said, if significant inroads are to be made.

The commission also voted to request \$500,000 in General Fund monies from the 1991 Legislature, to fund overtime pay for additional game law enforcement in the coming year.

Elk

After hearing many comments opposing a 17 percent statewide in-

crease in elk licenses, the Commission voted to scale back the elk hunting proposal for 1991-92 from its recommended 27,500 to 26,300, maintaining an overall increase of about 3,500 elk licenses over the 22,800 sold in 1990.

Other species

The statewide antelope bow hunt, next August 3-11, will have a new bag limit of one buck, instead of any one antelope. Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep hunts will have a bag limit of one ram, instead of a 3/4 curl ram as in the past. There will be no Siberian ibex hunts; only four licenses have been sold each year recently.

Seasons for turkey, bear, cougar, Barbary sheep, javelina, bighorn sheep, oryx and ibex will not be substantially altered from recent years.

During winter furbearer season, trappers will have to check traps each 24 hours, instead of each 48 hours, for 1991-92.

Applications deadline for special hunts will be next April 27. The exceptions are Valle Vidal spring turkey and depredation hunts, which have a deadline of February 4.

The Commission took no action on a wildlife management proposal on private/public land in the Pinon

and Dunkan areas; turned down a request for a pursuit season whereby dogs could chase bears or mountain lions; and instructed the department to proceed with trail and interpretive projects at the Ladd S. Gordon Wildlife Area.

In other information from the State Department of Game and Fish, a Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep killed by a hunter who paid for his license at auction is a new state record.

Dan Pocapalia, California, hunted the Turkey Creek area of the Gila National Forest in December. The original score of his ram has been corrected and is 185 1/8 Boone and Crockett points. The total is not expected to change much by the end of the 90-day drying period.

The score is the highest ever recorded in New Mexico, and will also make the Boone and Crockett record book, where a minimum sheep score of 180 points is required.

The license was auctioned for \$70,000 on March 3 at the Foundation for North American Wild Sheep conference. The amount was the highest among 13 western states and Mexico. The license was New Mexico's first to be auctioned.

Tracking Sunland

Sunland Park has designated Sunday, December 30, as John Hancock Bowl Day at the Races, and races will include the John Hancock Bowl Purse.

The southern New Mexico racetrack will roll out the red carpet for visiting dignitaries from the John Hancock Sun Bowl on Sunday. About 100 special guests will be in the Turf Club, and will include officials from the Sun Bowl, members of the coaching staffs of the University of Southern California and Michigan State University and game officials.

Racing fans showing a John Hancock Bowl ticket or ticket stub will be admitted free during Bowl Week Friday, December 28, through New Year's Day, January 1.

Also during this five-day racing stretch, Sunland Park will offer a special plan in the Turf Club. As long as the special seats are available, anyone showing a Sun Bowl ticket or stub may purchase Turf Club tickets two for the price of one.

The regular price for each Turf Club admission is \$5.

The John Hancock Sun Bowl will kick off at 12:30 p.m. Monday, December 31, in the Sun Bowl located just 15 minutes from Sunland Park. Racing begins at 12:30 p.m. Friday through Tuesday.
