Leitzman widow wins out with IRS

ALBUQUERQUE (AP)—An international businessman's widow has won a round with the Internal Revenue Service, which had attempted to seize the Lincoln County ranch she and her late husband held as community property.

But her attorney says the battle will continue.

U.S. District Judge Edwin L. Mechem entered findings of fact Thursday which state that while Carolyn and Robert Leitzman jointly owned the O-Bar-O Ranch near Carrizozo, Leitzman's tax debt was incurred before the couple married and was his alone. A formal judgment is expected within days.

Mechem found that the IRS still holds a tax lien against the 9,000-acre ranch, Campbell said Friday. "but it only covers Bob Leitzman's one-half community property interest in the ranch. She has the other half, and she has it free of the tax lien. The court also found that she doesn't owe any further taxes to the IRS since the taxes owed were Bob

Leitzman's." The District Court, through a special master, eventually will decide how the property should be divided in a foreclosure sale to satisfy Leitzman's debt.

Leitzman was killed in a May 1985 helicopter crash near Carrizozo in which the aircraft ran out of gas because of an improper mixture that caused the fuel to burn too fast. His body was found five days later. Investigators said he lived several hours after the crash.

He had owned bars in Bangkok and a floating hotel in Singapore, held Swiss bank accounts and cattle grazing permits and had lived on a sailboat for seven years, traveling through the Pacific from 1967 to 1973, Mechem's findings said.

Leitzman also was investigated by the Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force, and several federal agencies were represented at the Sept. 21-22 non-jury trial, Campbell said.

Chino told the group gathered at the follow-up meeting last Thursday that he had taken the concept to his tribal council several years ago. Somehow the project got sidetracked, Potter said.

Weighing various aspects of the project Thursday were delegates from the Space Center in Alamogordo, Cloudcroft Chamber of Commerce, Mescalero Apaches, Capitan Chamber of Commerce, Carrizozo Chamber of Commerce, Hondo Valley, Ruidoso Downs Race Track, Ruidoso, Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, National Center for the Western Horse, and Lincoln County Heritage Trust.

Chino said at the Thursday meeting the project would be of "mutual benefit to all communities. I've been trying to sell the idea for a long time."

Funding, routes and signage were major considerations which various sub-groups will be considering until the next meeting of the group at noon Thursday, February 8, at the Ruidoso chamber offices.

It was pointed out that the New Mexico Highway Department has been reluctant to allow varieties of signs on highway rights of way in the state.

The Apache Trail project would be a system of markers denoting historical sites along a prescribed

route or around "loops."

A brochure would outline the stops for visitors who could join the Apache Trail "loops" or routes at any given point.

Stops might even include Gran Quivera but would probably start at Tularosa or Alamogordo, to Cloudcroft to Mescalero, Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Hondo and Hondo Valley, Lincoln, Fort Stanton, Capitan, Carrizozo, Nogal and back to Ruidoso, to Tularosa, etc. A side loop could be from Tularosa to Carrizozo and around the loop in reverse.

Arrowhead markers would delineate the route. The object is to get visitors to the area to stay an extra day or two, according to Jerry Watts, executive director of the Ruidoso chamber.

Chino said each community on the route could list attractions and present them for development of a general brochure.

"I am interested in whatever we can do to promote tourism," said Chino. He said he will be attending a meeting in Santa Fe of the newly conceived Indian tourism association where projects such as the Apache Trail will be considered.

"We have a lot of work to do... a lot of political work to do," said Sid Goodloe of the National Center for the Western Horse.

"One of the major points is going to be funding. Then things will

pretty much fall in line," said Goodloe.

Potter and Chino will work on signage, Watts and Betty Beachum and others will work on financing, and Bob Hart of the Lincoln County Heritage Trust will take on brochure development. Michael Hurd of Picacho will help with brochure development. Other work was allocated.

Chino said that the Indian tourism group did a survey which showed the three main reasons people like to come to New Mexico.

Number one was scenic beauty, number two was historical sites and number three, Indians, said Chino.

The Apache Trail, if it develops, would encompass all three.

groups would split the profits. He said the circus would be at the racetrack and Bill Hirschfeld would head up the project from the chamber's end.

Several Crimestoppers board members agreed to meet with the chamber and explore the idea further.

In state Crimestoppers news, New Mexico Crimestoppers is asking for the public's help in solving a violent crime which occurred in November.

moving the public utilities, the ones the city owns," said Hall, noting that those sidewalks belong to the state since Sudderth Drive is a state highway.

Current plans for Sudderth, included in the 1991-92 plan, include making the highway four lanes with a continuance turn lane, and eliminating parking in some areas.

Hall said he already has worked out an arrangement for the state to pay for moving the village-owned utility lines that will be affected by the Highway 48 widening project.

While the state has agreed to pay the cost of moving village utility lines, Hall stressed that private companies affected by the state road project will have to pay for moving their lines.

Hall said he'll introduce a joint resolution for a land swap in Lincoln, trading state property for Lincoln Heritage Trust Property. That resolution will have to be approved in both houses since the property involved is appraised at more than \$100,000.

The Wortley Hotel in Lincoln, with an appraised value of \$112,000, is owned currently by the state. Since it was built after 1960, it is not a historic property. The state contracts for an operator for the hotel and restaurant each summer season.

"A lot of people believe the state has no business being in the restaurant business," said Hall, who will propose trading the hotel for the old Montano Store, which is currently owned by Lincoln Heritage Trust.

The Montano Store property has

an appraised value of \$48,000. Hall said the state already owes Lincoln Heritage Trust \$42,000, and with the interest on that money, the trade would be an even deal.

Landfills are a major concern in Lincoln County, and Hall said one landfill bill was introduced this week. He said that proposal has so many problems that it is destined for defeat.

If the Legislature doesn't address landfill problems through legislation this session, then the Environmental Improvement Board will have to do it after the session.

Hall also represents Artesia, and he said that city needs money to improve the road leading into the federal training center, and he'll be introducing some legislation on that request.

Hall sits on the Transportation Committee and the Business and Industry Committee, and said Transportation completed its budget during the first three days. He said Business and Industry doesn't see as much activity in a 30-day finance session as it does in the odd-year 60-day general sessions.

Even though reports of the session are heavy on talks of a tax increase, Hall said no tax increase bills have been introduced yet.

"I'm not saying there's not going to be," said Hall, who has no plans to make any tax increase proposals.

In House Bill 2, the state budget, almost every state agency did ask for more money, said Hall. He said many of those agencies already had vacant slots in their budgets, and will likely be told to fill those positions that are already authorized.

Asked about raises for school

teachers and other public employees, Hall said, "that remains to be seen."

Governor Garrey Carruthers, as well as the Legislative Finance Committee, proposed to spend the entire \$18 billion in expected revenues for 1990-91, but neither provided for salary increases for state, university or school employees. Instead, they tied salary increases to budget tradeoffs or tax increases.

According to Associated Press reports, Democrats have come out in favor of tax increases to fund salary increases and other needed state services, but are unwilling to do it alone and face Republican wrath in November's elections.

If any taxes are increased, they probably won't be the broad-based gross receipts or income taxes.

Instead, a package could include small increases in several taxes, such as cigarettes, liquor, local-option property taxes, elimination of tax exemptions and possibly increasing the motor vehicle excise tax for the general fund.

The state Board of Education has recommended a 7.1 percent raise for teachers. That would require an appropriation of about \$49.8 million statewide.

Another AP story reports that despite warnings that the state's money cupboard is virtually bare, state legislators have introduced capital projects bills totaling nearly \$75 million.

The major capital outlay bill introduced so far would authorize a \$13.5 million general obligation bond issue to finance construction of an optoelectronic materials center at UNM.



The trip will begin at 10 a.m. at the Small Missile Range Gate intersection with U.S. Highway 70/82, 25 miles west of White Sands National Monument headquarters.

Park rangers and military police will brief the group on regulations that apply during the trip.

The caravan will proceed over paved roads through the White Sands Missile Range to the trailhead to Lake Lucero. Approximate-

ly two hours at the lake area allows time for the half-mile (conducted walk to the lake, time for a picnic and photograph taking. The caravan will then be escorted back to the starting point, arriving about 2 p.m.

All vehicles should have a spare tire and sufficient gasoline for the 35-mile roundtrip to the Lake Lucero trailhead. Cameras may not be used while passing through the missile range, but are encouraged for use while at the Monument lake area. No vehicles may join the caravan once

Warriors open district play

If you have to play one of the top-ranked teams in the state, then you might as well get it out of the way early. That's what the Warriors did Saturday.

The Ruidoso High School varsity basketball team opened district play Saturday against Oñate, ranked second in District 3AAA, and ranked among the top five in state. The Warriors fell victim to the slick Las Cruces team, losing 98-52.

Oñate dominated the entire game, leading by 10 points at the end of the first quarter, and by 23 points by halftime, and upping that lead to 39 by the end of the third quarter.

Turnovers plagued the Warriors throughout the contest. Oñate out-fouled, as well as outscored, the hometown boys, racking up 21 fouls, that included five on #40 Scott Doan.

Junior Cody Willard led the Warriors in scoring with 21 points, followed by Brian Gray who made nine points, including one three-point basket. Mashon Swenor score six for the evening.

Oñate had four players who scored in the double digits. O.D. Warner, #00, led the visiting team's scoring efforts with 30 points, followed by #32 Marvin Fielder, who made 15 points, #40 Doan who put in 12 and #30 Tomas Smith who scored 10.

"I thought the week of practice went well," said head coach Dean Hood, disappointed and perplexed

by Saturday's 46-point loss.

"A snowday kind of gets you out of synch," said Hood, wondering if the day off on Friday, and the rearranged schedule could have had something to do with Saturday's loss.

"We just lacked lots of intensity, lots of aggressiveness ... and we didn't play composed," said Hood. "It's a lot easier to stay composed when you're ahead."

Hood said Oñate fielded one of the best teams in the Alamogordo tournament during the Christmas holidays, but then surprised him by losing last week to Mayfield.

The Warriors were scheduled to open district play against the Socorro Warriors on Friday night, but that game was cancelled because of snow.

The Warriors went into district with a record of 4 and 9, and are now 4 and 10 for the season and 0/1 in district. Deming, with a 2-0 district record, is the early 3AAA leader, followed by Oñate, 1-0; Silver City, 1-1; and Socorro, 0-1.

The Warriors will play tomorrow in Tularosa, with the JV game scheduled for 5:30 p.m. and the varsity for about 7:15 p.m.

The Ruidoso Lady Warriors suffered the team's first district loss on Saturday night when the Lady Warriors were defeated at Oñate 43-32.

The varsity Lady Warriors are now 2-1 in district play after Friday night's home game with Socorro was canceled due to the weather.

Poor shooting from the field crippled Coach Jody Hopkins's Lady Warriors all night.

Both Ruidoso and Oñate could only manage five points in the first quarter of Saturday night's game. The Lady Warriors were only one for 17 from the field in the first quarter.

The second quarter, the Lady Warriors still couldn't find the range to the basket. Ruidoso was two for 15 from the field and trailed Oñate 18-13 at the intermission.

The third quarter, Ruidoso came out firing the ball and outscored Oñate 13-10 in the quarter. The Lady Warriors put up 22 shots in the third quarter, but only managed to make four of them. Still at the end of the quarter, the Warriors led the game 28-26.

But, in the fourth quarter, Oñate got hot and outscored Ruidoso 15-6. The Lady Warriors were two for 15 from the field in the fourth quarter.

For the game, Ruidoso was nine for 69 from the field for a shooting percentage of 13 percent.

Senior center Ardena Comanche and junior forward DeAnna Swanner were the top scorers for the Lady Warriors

with nine points each. Nanette Boyd contributed six points in the game.

Comanche and Swanner were also the top two rebounders in the game, Comanche grabbing 14 rebounds and Swanner pulling down 11 boards.

The junior varsity Lady Warriors had better luck on Saturday night, winning a close game against the Oñate junior varsity, 32-31.

The junior varsity trailed at the end of the first half by a score of 19-12. But, in the third quarter managed to come alive and outscored Oñate 17-6 in the quarter.

The junior varsity Lady Warriors could only score three points in the fourth quarter, but managed to hold on and preserve the 32-31 win.

The leading scorer in the junior varsity game was Kansas Miranda who put in eight points. Cicelee Makowski and Candace Muniz each added seven points to the victory.

Makowski and Tabatha Parnell were the leading rebounders with seven boards apiece and Muniz contributed four steals in the game.

The junior varsity Lady Warriors continue to be an undefeated 3-0 in district play.

The two Lady Warrior teams will be in action this Friday night, January 27, at home against Deming. The junior varsity game begins at 5:45 p.m. and the varsity game will immediately follow. There is no word at this time when the home game against Socorro will be rescheduled.

"It was a real good victory for them," said Williams.



The silver mist and freezing rain on the north wind



This is being sent to you in mid-morning on January the eighteenth, and since early morning the north wind has been blowing gently through the vale carrying almost every kind of winter weather—freezing mist, raindrops in all stages of freezing, sleet and small flakes of snow. Now the small white pellets of the sleet come flying faster on the wind, rolling and bouncing down the dirt road and landing in the evergreens, and the snowflakes are larger now, beginning to cover the golden fields in a thin blanket of white.

During the recordbreaking warm days with strong west wind, the cows began coming down a few at a time from the hills—a sign that the west wind would soon bring in the east and north wind carrying snow.

There is one favorite cow, black with a white face and black mask that we call "The Bandit." Her calf, the smallest in the herd—black with a white face—is "Bandit

Junior" or "Bandy." Little Bandy loves to run, and comes flying across the field at feeding time on the Knoll, leading the way.

Right now the cows are under the cedars getting ready for the noontime rest. And suddenly out of the thick cedar bushes a little black figure appears, and then goes sprinting across the gold and snowy field. Out of another cedar grove comes a little brown calf, and together they go jumping and pitching, stop, blinking at the snow flakes, and tossing their heads and sniffing at the flying flakes—cow children playing in the blizzard while their mothers watch from the shelter of the evergreens.

And so, as the snow deepens, Mother Earth is saying a prayer of thanks, and we thank the Good Lord for the snow and all our other blessings which we appreciate especially during the winter time.

This will remind us of a verse by the beloved American poet, Henry David Thoreau: "Thank God who seasons thus the year And sometimes kindly slants His rays, For in His winter He's most near, And plainest seen upon the shortest days."




Two Ruidoso judge candidates have their say

Bobby Thomason

Bobby Thomason is a candidate for the position of municipal judge in the March 6 regular municipal election for the Village of Ruidoso.

"I think a lot of people are under the impression you have to be a lawyer to be the judge," he said. "I don't think it takes a lawyer to be the judge."

Thomason said New Mexico state statutes determine what kind of cases the municipal judge can hear. He said fines are set by village ordinances or by the state. He said the only thing you can do with people charged in serious criminal cases is bind them over for trial in District Court.

He said, because he is not a lawyer, he might be more lenient with some people than a lawyer would be. But, he said, when a person receives a ticket, they should receive an appropriate fine, no matter who they are.

Thomason said a person deserves an opportunity to appear before a judge as soon as possible. He said if he is elected municipal judge, he would always try to be at the court or be on 24-hour call. He said the municipal court deserves to meet more than two hours a day, twice a week.

If elected, he said he will perform all the duties the state allows a municipal judge to do.

Thomason acknowledges he was arrested and charged with commercial gambling in 1985, after police raided his house during a party.

Thomason points out he was acquitted of those charges in a jury trial, and he believes the judge who issued the search warrant should have checked out more of the facts before issuing the warrant.

Thomason said he has lived in Ruidoso since 1979. He is married, his wife's name is Shirly, and the

couple have two daughters and four grandchildren. He is the owner of Bob's Vending Company and part owner of Seeley Insurance Company and a mobile home park in Hobbs.

He is a member of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Posse, the Elk's Lodge and the Moose Lodge. He said he has been an active fundraiser for those organizations.

Robert Beauvais

Local attorney Robert Beauvais has announced he is a candidate for the municipal judge's position in the March 6 municipal election.

Beauvais said he is running for the office because he wants to serve the community.

"Because I've made Ruidoso my home, I've bought a home here and opened a business, along with that comes a desire to serve the community," Beauvais said.

He said the responsibility of the municipal judge is to enforce village ordinances. He said the municipal judge has to make a commitment to be available 24 hours a day. Beauvais said the judge should make a commitment to hold court at least twice a week.

"You just make the commitment and do it," he said.

Beauvais said if he becomes the

municipal judge, he would like to see at least part of the docket at night or on the weekend. He said it is a burden on some working people to take time off from work to attend court during a workday.

Beauvais said whenever a child or a juvenile appears before the court, he would try and insist on having the parents accompany them.

He said whenever someone is charged with DWI, the laws should be enforced, even to out-of-town tourists. He said the judge must deliver the most appropriate disposition possible in cases. Beauvais said in the case of tourists, there are alternatives to jail and fines, like community service.

Beauvais said it has been a career objective of his to sit on a district court bench, and he feels the experience of being a municipal judge would be beneficial. He said

his experiences with the New Mexico Department of Correction, as an assistant district attorney, as a children's attorney and as the current Lincoln County attorney have all helped him know how the court system works.

"I think I have specific relevant experience," Beauvais said.

Beauvais moved to Ruidoso last May. He is a native of Hobbs and has a bachelor's degree and a master's degree from Eastern New Mexico State University in Portales. He received his law degree from the University of New Mexico.

Letters to the editor

DEAR EDITOR:

This letter is in response to the allegations contained in the January 15, 1990, edition of the Ruidoso News relating to my appointment and candidacy for municipal judge.

The allegation that I was not a resident of Ruidoso when I was appointed as municipal judge is true, but when I accepted the appointment on November 15, 1990, I was not aware of any requirement that I be a resident of the Village. As soon as the Village attorney informed me of the requirement, I began looking for a residence inside the Village limits. I found a residence within a week and negotiated a lease for the house on 129 Rowan Road November 24, 1989. The lease was signed on December

6, 1989, however, because the house was rented to tourists for the Christmas holidays, the term of the lease could not begin until after January 2, 1990. The lease commenced on January 3, 1990.

The allegation that I was not a resident of the Village on January 5, 1990, when I changed my voters registration to reflect my new address at 129 Rowan Road is untrue. The renters left the house on December 31, 1989. After the house at 129 Rowan Road was cleaned on January 2, 1990, my family and I began moving into the house on January 3, 1990. My intent was to live at 129 Rowan Road beginning on January 2, 1990, and my residence on that date was 129

Rowan Road. Under the law of New Mexico "residence" is a question of intent and my intent on November 24, 1990, was to make 129 Rowan my residence. On January 3, 1990, two days before I changed my address on my voter registration, I paid my rent, started moving into the house, and made that my residence.

The last allegation is that I voted in municipal elections using 108 Encanto as my address. The address on Encanto was my residence from 1978 to 1983 when I moved outside the Village limits. I did not change my voters registration address when I moved out of the Village limits, but it was through inadvertence and not bad

faith. I do not recall voting in any municipal elections while living outside the Village limits. I do not have the records of which elections I voted in and I cannot, therefore, verify or deny that allegation.

Some of these allegations were made by Robert Beauvais, an opponent in the municipal judge race. I will not become involved in mud slinging or verbal battles in the newspaper. I will not engage in character assassinations and petty complaints meant to destroy the reputations of my opponents. I will run for municipal judge based upon my record and qualifications.




